THE SETTING

Iowa (20-8, 9-5) begins its final home stand of the season Wednesday, March 1, hosting Penn State (14-12, 6-9). Game time is 7:05 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500). Iowa hosts Wisconsin Saturday (3:40 p.m.) to close the regular season. Iowa dropped a 71-59 decision at Illinois last Saturday. Penn State defeated Northwestern 68-55 Saturday in State College.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play with color commentator Bob Hansen. The Hawkeye Radio Network coverage includes a 60-minute pre-game show.

Television: ESPN Regional will carry the game to a network of stations that includes KGAN Cedar Rapids, KDSM Des Moines, KWQC Quad Cities, KYOU Ottumwa and cable systems in Mason City, Sioux City, Council Bluffs-Omaha, Denver, Kansas City and St. Louis. Larry Morgan and Shon Morris will call the action.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 2,371 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Overall Iowa's record is 1,416-955 (.597). That includes an 886-306 (.743) record in home games, a 529-649 (.449) record in games away from Iowa City, a 673-658 (.506) mark in Big Ten games and a 292-80 (.785) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa, in the Feb. 20 rankings, was ranked 20th by the Associated Press and 22nd in the ESPN/USA Today coaches poll. Iowa has been ranked as high as 12th (AP, 12/5/05), its highest ranking since early in the 2001-02 season. Iowa, that season, moved as high as seventh (Nov. 26) in the Associated Press rankings and eighth (Nov. 19) in the coaches poll.

IOWA IN CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

Iowa has compiled a 292-80 (.785) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa is 138-67 (.673) in Big Ten games and 154-13 (.922) in non-Big Ten games. Iowa has drawn over five million fans for men's basketball since the arena opened in 1983. Iowa has posted an 84-25 (.771) home record under Coach Steve Alford, including a 51-4 (.927) mark in non-conference home games.

Iowa's current streak of 23 consecutive non-conference home wins ranks 14thlongest among Division I programs. That streak dates back to the final home game of the 2002-03 season, an NIT loss to Georgia Tech.

Coach Steve Alford

Steve Alford (pronounced ALL-ford) is in his seventh season as the head coach at the University of Iowa and his 15th season as a college head coach. Alford holds a career record of 286-168 (.630), including a 130-91 (.588) record at Iowa, a 78-29 (.729) record in four seasons (1992-95) at Div. III Manchester College and a four-year record (1996-99) of 78-48 (.619) at Southwest Missouri State. He has led Iowa to six straight winning seasons and three seasons of 20 or more wins.



Alford ranks fourth among Iowa's head basketball coaches in total wins. He is 50-60 (.455) in Big Ten games. Alford is 8-6 in the NCAA Tournament (3-3 in Division I and 5-3 in Division III) and 2-4 in the NIT. His record in the Big Ten Tournament is 10-5 in six seasons and his 10 wins rank as the most among all Big Ten coaches in the event. Iowa won the tournament in 2001, returned to the title game in 2002 and just missed the championship game in 2005.

Alford led Iowa into the second round of the 2001 NCAA Tournament in his second season and the Hawkeyes returned to the NCAA Tournament in 2005. Iowa advanced to the NIT in 2002, 2003 and 2004.

Alford led Southwest Missouri State to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 1999 and in 1995 Manchester advanced to the NCAA championship game before suffering its first defeat of the season.

Alford is a 1987 graduate of Indiana, where he led the Hoosiers to the 1987 NCAA title. Alford was a member of the 1984 U. S. Olympic team that earned the Gold Medal and he was the 26th player selected in the NBA Draft following his senior season. Alford played four seasons in the NBA before beginning his coaching career.

At Indiana, Alford started 120 of 125 games in four seasons. He served as team captain in 1987 when the Hoosiers were 30-4. Steve concluded his college career as Indiana's all-time scoring leader with 2,438 points and he holds the Indiana record for career steals with 178. He was a consensus first team All-American and the Big Ten MVP as a senior.

Alford is a member of the Manchester College M Association Hall of Fame and the Indiana University Athletics Hall of Fame. In 2001 he was named one of the "Top 50 Athletes" in the history of the state of Indiana and was selected as a member of the 15man Indiana University all-Century team. In 2004 he was one of five players selected to ESPN's Big Ten Conference Silver Anniversary team.

Alford is 9-3 vs. Penn State and 3-0 vs. PSU Coach Ed DeChillis.

IOWA STRENGTH OF SCHEDULE

Iowa is 13th in the RPI Index and 21st in the Sagarin Ratings. Iowa's strength of schedule is 24th in the RPI Index and 19th by Sagarin. Iowa has posted an 8-5 record while playing 13 games against top 50 teams in the RPI Index.

Iowa is one of six teams nationally with as many as 13 games against top 50 teams, with only Duke and Connecticut having more than eight wins against top 50 teams.

IOWA SETS ARENA WIN STREAK

Iowa has won 16 straight games in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, setting a school record for consecutive wins in the facility, which opened in 1983. Iowa won its final home contest last season vs. Ohio State and all 15 home dates this season. Iowa's last home loss was a 75-65 decision to Illinois on Feb. 19, 2005.

Iowa's initial 15-game win streak in the arena began Jan. 25, 1986 with a 79-69 win over Indiana and ended with an 80-76 loss to Ohio State on Jan. 24, 1987. The streak began with Coach George Raveling and ended with Coach Tom Davis. The current 16-game win streak includes nine non-conference and seven conference wins.

Iowa's current streak ranks as the longest in the Big Ten and fifth-longest in the nation. Iowa's record of 24 consecutive home wins began in the 1946-47 season and ended during the 1948-49 campaign.

HOME WIN STREAK IS BEST EVER

For the only time in its basketball history, Iowa has posted 15 consecutive home wins in a single season. Iowa's last undefeated home season was in 1965-66 when the Hawkeyes won all 12 home games. Iowa has won 15 home games or more in four seasons, and never the initial 15 games. The record of 16 home wins in a single season was set in 1985, while Iowa also won 15 home games in 1989 and 1993.

Iowa has never completed a perfect record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, which opened in January, 1983. The Hawkeyes lost just one home game in 1993 (15-1) and 1996 (14-1).

PSU COACH ED DECHILLIS

Ed DeChillis is in his third season as Penn State's head coach and his 10th year overall as a college head coach. DeChillis is 30-54 at Penn State and his career mark stands at 135-147. He posted a 105-93 record in seven years as the head coach at East Tennessee State. A Penn State graduate, DeChillis led East Tennessee State to the Southern Conference Tournament championship in 2003, earning a spot in the NCAA Tournament. East Tennessee State then lost to No. two seed Wake Forest by a narrow 76-73 margin.

DeChillis began his coaching career as a graduate assistant at Penn State, and later was an assistant coach at Salem College in West Virginia. He returned to Penn State as an assistant coach for 10 seasons before taking over at East Tennessee State. As a PSU assistant, DeChillis helped the Nittany Lions advance to post-season play in four straight seasons (1989-92), while posting an 87-40 record in that time. DeChillis is 0-3 vs. Iowa and Hawkeye Coach Steve Alford

DECHILLIS AS AN ASSISTANT

Ed DeChillis served as a Penn State assistant coach from 1986-96, during the time that Penn State moved from the Atlantic 10 Conference to the Big Ten. During his last two seasons as an assistant there, PSU posted a 42-18 record, advancing to the NIT in 1995 and the NCAA Tournament in 1996. During his time as a Penn State assistant DeChillis helped PSU post a 4-3 record against Iowa.

ALFORD MOVES TO FOURTH

Coach Steve Alford has collected 130 victories as Iowa's head coach, a total that ranks fourth on Iowa's list of coaches in career wins. Alford, earlier this season, moved past Bucky O'Connor, Iowa's head coach from 1952-58 (he also was Iowa's head coach for 11 games in 1950), who earned 114 wins as Iowa's basketball coach.

Iowa's top three coaches in career wins are Tom Davis (269), Lute Olson (168) and Rollie Williams (139). Following is a list of Alford's significant career victories:

HAWKEYE, LION NOTES

- Iowa has won 16 straight home games, establishing a school record for Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa's current streak ranks as the fifth best in the nation. When the Hawkeyes won at Penn State in 1997 in marked PSU's first defeat in the Bryce Jordan Center and ended the longest home court winning streak in the nation at the time.
- Penn State assistant Kurt Kanaskie is no stranger to the Iowa basketball program, as he served as the head coach at Drake University in Des Moines for seven seasons. He held a 0-7 record vs. Iowa and a 0-10 record vs. Iowa Coach Steve Alford.

• Penn State assistant Dan Earl is a former Nittany Lion player. Earl began his playing career in 1993-94 and ended his career in 1998-99. He missed the 1996-97 season due to a back injury and missed all but five games in 1997-98 due to a knee injury, earning a medical hardship and a sixth season. In the games he played, Earl helped Penn State post a 4-2 record vs. Iowa, including a 67-64 win in Iowa City in the quarter-finals of the 1995 NIT.

THE SERIES

Iowa holds a 17-8 advantage in the series that began with an 82-53 Iowa win in 1955. The Hawkeyes have won the last five meetings, nine of the last 11, 10 of the last 13 and 12 of the last 16.

Iowa defeated the Nittany Lions 80-76 in State College on Jan. 14 and won the only meeting last season, 78-56 in State College. Iowa scored a 77-58 win in Iowa City in 2004, and won both meetings in 2002-03. The teams split two games in 2002 and Iowa won two of three meetings in 2001, including a 94-74 win in the semi-finals of the Big Ten Conference Tournament.

Iowa holds an 8-3 advantage in games played in Iowa City, with all 11 meetings taking place in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The Hawkeyes have won six of the last seven meetings in Iowa City.

Three of the 25 meetings in the series have been in postseason action. The first meeting in 1955 was in the first round of the NCAA Tournament in Evanston, IL, with Iowa winning 82-53. Penn State won 67-64 in Iowa City in 1995 in the semi-finals of the NIT and Iowa won in the Big Ten Tournament in 2001. Iowa's 67-48 win in 1962 took place in the first round of the Quaker City Tournament in Philadelphia, PA.

IOWA WON FIRST MEETING AT PSU

Despite holding the upper hand throughout most of the contest, Iowa had to come from behind in the closing minutes to take an 80-76 win at Penn State on Jan. 14. Iowa shot 51.9% from the field in the first half, leading by as many as 10 points. The Hawkeyes led 40-34 at intermission after Adam Haluska scored 21 points in the opening half. Iowa made 9-18 threepoint attempts in the opening 20 minutes.

I lowa maintained control in the early portion of the second half, holding a 66-59 advantage with six minutes to play. From there Penn State scored nine straight points to take a 68-66 advantage with 3:52 left. The teams traded baskets until Erek Hansen converted a rebound basket and added a free throw, giving Iowa a 72-70 advantage with 1:51 to play. Two free throws by Greg Brunner gave Iowa a 74-73 advantage with 48 seconds remaining and Jeff Horner added a pair of free shots after a Penn State turnover. Hansen came up big on the defensive end, collecting his sixth blocked shot of the game with 25 seconds left and Iowa leading by three points. Haluska added a pair of foul shots and Horner hit a free throw in the final seconds to secure the road win.

Haluska ended the game with a career-best 29 points, surpassing 1,000 career points. He hit 6-10 treys and 5-6 free throws. Horner added 17 points and nine assists and Brunner had 13 points. Hansen, who made key plays at both ends in the closing minutes, had seven points, six rebounds and six blocks. Doug Thomas led Iowa with seven rebounds.

Iowa's History and Record Book, the supplement to the 2005-06 basketball media guide, is available online at hawkeyesports.com, the official website of the University of Iowa athletic department. After opening the Iowa website, click on Men's Basketball on the left side of the page. Once at the basketball site, click on the History and Record Book on the right side of the page under the Stats and More heading. Copies of the History and Record Book are also available through the UI Sports Information office.

Jamelle Cornley had 20 points to leads Penn State's balanced attack, while Travis Parker added 19, Mike Walker 14 and Geary Claxton 12. Parker also added 10 rebounds and Ben Luber had six assists.

HAWKEYES VS. RANKED FOES

Iowa has posted an 8-4 record against teams in the top 25 rankings at the time of the game, including a 2-2 mark against top 10 teams. The eight wins vs. ranked foes are the most ever for a Hawkeye basketball team in one season.

The eight wins is the highest total for a Steve Alford-coached Hawkeye team and the most since Iowa posted a 6-2 record vs. ranked teams in 1990-91.

With wins over 21st-ranked Indiana and 16th-ranked Michigan State in the last two weeks, Iowa has defeated ranked teams in consecutive games on four occasions under the direction of Coach Steve Alford. Earlier this season, Iowa defeated No. 11 Indiana and No. 16 Ohio State in consecutive games. A year ago, Iowa defeated 11th-ranked Louisville and 13th-ranked Texas in the first two rounds of the Maui Invitational. In 2002-03, Iowa recorded back-to-back wins over 20th-ranked Michigan State and 8th-ranked Illinois.

HAWKEYES IN NATIONAL STATS

In NCAA statistical rankings, Iowa is 10th in field goal defense (39.0), 12th in fouls per game (15.4), 26th in scoring defense (60.4) and 35th in blocked shots (4.9).

Individually, Jeff Horner is 15th in assists per game (6.0), Erek Hansen is 17th in blocked shots per game (2.7) and Greg Brunner is 18th in rebounds per game (9.9).

LOFTY POSITION FOR FEBRUARY

Iowa was in first place in the Big Ten standings from Jan. 28 to Feb. 25. This marks the first time Iowa has been in first place in February since 1981-82. Iowa began that season with a 10-1 league record before suffering its second conference loss on Feb. 11. Minnesota (14-4) won the 1982 Big Ten title, while Iowa (12-6) tied for second.

Iowa's 20-8 record through 28 games marks the best start for a Hawkeye team under Steve Alford, as the Hawkeyes were 18-9 in 2001. This is Iowa's best record through 28 games since the 1996 Hawkeyes started the season with a 21-7 mark. Feb. 14 is the earliest date Iowa has reached the 20-win plateau since 1987, when win No. 20 took place on Feb. 4. Iowa's recent four-game win streak is its longest in Big Ten regular season games since the Hawkeyes won their first four league games in 1999. Iowa won five straight games against Big Ten teams last season, including the final three regular season games and two in the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa won four straight games against Big Ten teams in 2001 when it won the Big Ten Tournament.

In Big Ten play, Iowa is the only team to remain undefeated at home. Ohio State has four road wins, while Iowa and Penn State have three.

The University of Iowa's men's basketball program is one of five college programs to be featured on ESPN2's acclaimed series, The Season: College Basketball presented by Capital One.

During the 10 week series, fans will get an inside look into the lives of the players and the team dynamics of Iowa, Bucknell, Florida Atlantic, Memphis and Washington. The current series marks the third season in which selected college basketball programs have been featured.

During the taping of these shows, The Season captured Iowa as the Hawkeyes defeated previously undefeated Illinois, won at Penn State and defeated Minnesota in three overtimes.

HORNER AMONG BIG TEN BEST

Senior Jeff Horner ranks among the best in the Big Ten Conference in three statistical categories. Horner ranks seventh in career three-point field goals (246) and attempts (667) and eighth in career assists (586).

IOWA DEFENSIVE SO FAR

Iowa's defense has led the way in winning 20 of 28 games. Iowa opponents are averaging just 60.4 points per game, shooting 39% from the field and 32.5% from three-point range. Iowa has collected 185 steals and forced 421 turnovers while collecting 137 blocked shots. The Hawkeyes have held 21 opponents under 70 points and have won the rebounding battle in 19 games. Iowa ranks high nationally in scoring defense, field goal defense and fewest fouls per game.

IOWA PROGRAM REACHES 1,400 WINS

The Iowa basketball program reached 1,400 wins (now at 1,416) with a 79-46 victory over Texas-San Antonio on Nov. 26. Iowa is one of 34 NCAA Division I programs with as many as 1,400 wins. Iowa's basketball history includes 72 winning seasons and 23 years in which the Hawkeyes have won 20 or more games. Iowa (with 21) is one of 31 programs to earn more than 20 invitations into the NCAA Tournament.

SI.COM LIKES IOWA BACKCOURT

SI.com, in a vivid online photo gallery, has named Iowa's backcourt of Jeff Horner and Adam Haluska as one of the best, ranking the Hawkeye duo ninth best in the nation.

Haluska averages 14.1 points and 4.6 rebounds per game, while Horner averages 13.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.8 rebounds. Horner is one of 16 finalists for the 2006 Bob Cousy Award.

BRUNNER & HALUSKA EARN ACADEMIC HONOR

Senior forward Greg Brunner and junior guard Adam Haluska have been selected to the CoSIDA/ESPN The Magazine District VII academic all-America team. Both players will now be placed on the national ballot for academic all-America honors.

Haluska is a finance and marketing major with a 3.41 grade point average. He has been named to the District team for the second consecutive season. The Carroll, IA native has started all 28 games, scoring double figures in 23 games. He is averaging 14.1 points and 4.6 rebounds, shooting 41.4% from the field and 83.9% from the foul line.

Brunner, a Charles City native, is a communications studies major with a 3.25 GPA. He is a two-time academic all-Big Ten selection.

NABC RECOGNIZED BRUNNER & HALUSKA

The National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) has recognized senior Greg Brunner and junior Adam Haluska. Brunner was named to the District 12 first team, while Haluska was a second team selection.

Brunner leads Iowa and the Big Ten Conference with an average of 9.9 rebounds per game. He is scoring 14.7 points and has recorded 11 scoring and rebounding double-doubles this season.

Haluska is averaging 14.1 points and 4.6 rebounds per game. He had a career-high 29 points at Penn State and has scored in double figures in 23 of 28 games.

Brunner and Haluska were both recently named to the CoSIDA Distrct VII academic all-American team.

HORNER IS COUSY FINALIST

Senior guard Jeff Horner is one of 16 players named as a finalist for the 2006 Bob Cousy Award. The list of finalists includes 12 Division I players and two each from Division II and III. The winner will be announced at the Final Four in Indianapolis.

Horner, a native of Mason City, IA, has played in all but four games throughout his career, missing four games earlier this season with a knee injury. Horner is averaging 13.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.8 rebounds per game. He has scored over 1,400 career points and has over 500 career assists and 500 rebounds, the only player in Iowa history to surpass those totals.

Horner and his teammates have posted a 20-8 record, securing a winning season for the fourth time in his career.

BRUNNER NAMED NAISMITH CANDIDATE

Senior forward Greg Brunner is one of 30 players named as a mid-season candidate for the Naismith Trophy, presented annually to the Player of the Year. The winner of the award will be named at the Final Four in Indianapolis.

Brunner is averaging 14.7 points and 9.9 rebounds per game and recently became Iowa's career rebounding leader.

HAWKEYES HOT IN WIN OVER MICHIGAN

In Iowa's 94-66 win over Michigan, the Hawkeyes shot a season-best 65.3% from the field, including 68.4% from threepoint range. Iowa started slow, hitting just seven of its first 17 field goal attempts. That all changed midway through the first half. Over the final 7:14 of the first half and the first 7:15 of the second half, Iowa connected on 14 straight field goal attempts. Iowa trailed 25-20 when the streak began and led 61-43 when it ended with 12:45 left in the game. Iowa made 13-19 treys in the contest, including eight straight during one stretch.

The 68.4% shooting from three-point range ranks as the sixth best single game effort for Iowa and the best for the Hawkeyes under Steve Alford. The overall field goal percentage is the best for Iowa since shooting 67.5% (27-40) in a win over Air Force early in the 2004-05 season. The 94 points is the most by Iowa during a regular season Big Ten game under Steve Alford.

IOWA SECURES WINNING SEASON

Iowa has clinched its sixth consecutive winning season. The current streak ranks as the second longest in the history of Iowa basketball. Iowa's record for consecutive winning seasons is seven, from 1950 through 1956. Pops Harrison, Bucky O'Connor and Rollie Williams all coached the Hawkeyes during those years. Only a 10-10 record in 1949 kept Iowa from 13 consecutive winning seasons (1944-56).

Harrison coached Iowa to five straight winning seasons from 1944-48, Lute Olson coached Iowa to winning seasons from 1979-83, George Raveling and Tom Davis combined to coach Iowa to winning seasons from 1985-89 and Davis coached Iowa to winning seasons from 1995-99. Iowa had five consecutive winning seasons on three occasions, 1979-83, 1985-89 and 1995-99.

Iowa is one of four Big Ten teams to post a winning season in each of the last six seasons, joining Illinois, Michigan State and Wisconsin. Iowa advanced to post-season play for the fifth straight season a year ago, returning to the NCAA Tournament.

HORNER IS CAREER ASSIST LEADER

Senior guard Jeff Horner became Iowa's career assist leader in the win over Michigan State, collecting 15 points and six assists against the Spartans. Horner's pass to Erek Hansen for Iowa's first basket of the second half moved Horner past Andre Woolridge (575, 1995-97) on Iowa's career list. His career total now stands at 586.

With seven three-point field goals in Iowa's 77-68 win at Purdue, Horner became Iowa's career leader in made threepointers. Horner has 246 treys, moving past Chris Kingsbury, who had 226 during his career (1994-96). Horner is also first in three-point attempts (667). Horner made 7-10 treys while scoring a career-high 32 points against the Boilermakers. The seven three-pointers tie as the third best single-game performance in school history. Horner's previous scoring high of 27 points came a year ago vs. Texas in a semi-final win at the Maui Invitational. Horner added 14 points in a home win over Michigan, 10 points at Northwestern and 17 points in the win at Indiana.

He was named co-Player of the Week in the Big Ten for his play vs. Purdue and Michigan. The Big Ten honor is the first for Horner this season and the fourth of his career.

BRUNNER IS CAREER REBOUND LEADER

Senior forward Greg Brunner has raised his career rebounding total to 952 to become Iowa's all-time leading rebounder. With 11 rebounds at Northwestern, Brunner moved past Kevin Kunnert (914 rebounds, 1971-73).

Among the career leaders at each of the Big Ten Conference schools, Brunner joins Michigan State's Greg Kelser, both listed at 6-7, as the shortest players in the league to lead their school in career rebounds.

Brunner has 31 career double-doubles, most among active players in the Big Ten Conference and sixth most ever at Iowa. Brunner has 11 scoring and rebounding double-doubles this season while scoring in double figures in 21 games and collecting 10 or more rebounds in 14 outings. He leads the Big Ten in rebounding (9.9) and is averaging 14.7 points per game.

Brunner established a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record with 23 rebounds in a win over Minnesota. The previous mark of 21 was set by Dwayne Scholten of Washington State on 12/6/86. The previous best in the Arena by an Iowa player was 19 by Ryan Bowen vs. Long Island on 11/29/98.

The 23 rebounds are the most by any player in the Big Ten Conference and the second most in Division I this season. Rashad Jones of Arkansas-Little Rock had 30 rebounds earlier in the year.

The Iowa record for single game rebounds is 30, set by Chuck Darling vs. Wisconsin on 3/3/52. Brunner's 23 rebounds tie as the fourth highest total in school history and it is the most by a Hawkeye player since Kunnert had 23 rebounds vs. Drake on 12/27/72.

HAWKEYE TIDBITS

- Iowa's field goal percentage of 65.3% (32-49) against Michigan is the second best for an Iowa team in 221 games under Steve Alford. Iowa shot 67.5% (27-40) in a win over Air Force in 2004-05 and 60% (27-45) in a win over Northwestern in 2001-02 in the only other contests in which Iowa has shot at least 60% from the field under Alford.
- Iowa recently shot over 60% from the field in each of three consecutive halves. Iowa shot 64% in the second half of a 77-68 win at Purdue, rallying from a 33-25 half-time deficit. The Hawkeyes then shot 61.5% in the first half against Michigan and 69.6% in the second half of the 94-66 win over the Wolverines. In those 60 minutes, Iowa also made 21-30 (70%) three-point attempts, including 8-11 (72.7%) in the second half at Purdue, 7-9 (77.8%) in the first half vs. Michigan and 60% (6-10) in the second half. Iowa has shot 60% or better from the field in five different halves this season, including 68.8% in the second half of a 73-60 win over Indiana and 60% in the second half of an 86-41 win over Maryland-Eastern Shore.
- Iowa scored 52 points in the second half of wins over Purdue and Michigan. The 52 points are the most scored by Iowa in a half this season. Iowa trailed 33-25 at halftime at Purdue before using a 52-35 advantage in the second half for the 77-68 win. Iowa held a 42-34 advantage at halftime of the 94-66 win over Michigan. Iowa then scored just 48 total points in the 51-48 loss at Northwestern in the most recent outing.
- Iowa has posted an 8-4 record vs. ranked teams. The Hawkeyes defeated 7th-ranked Kentucky (67-63), 21st-ranked North Carolina State (45-42), 6th-ranked Illinois (63-48), 11th-ranked Indiana (73-60), 16th-ranked Ohio State (67-62), 20th-ranked Michigan (94-66), 21st-ranked Indiana (70-67) and 16th-ranked Michigan State (66-54). Iowa has lost to 2nd-ranked Texas (59-68), 24th-ranked Wisconsin (52-66), 11th-ranked Michigan State (55-85) and 8th-ranked Illinois (59-71).
- Iowa's 70-67 win at Indiana marks Iowa's first win on the home floor of a ranked opponent since a 67-63 win at 20th-ranked Tulsa on Dec. 28, 2002.
- Iowa has made nearly as many free throws (422) as its opponents have attempted (425).
- Iowa is 3-0 when scoring 80 points or more, 9-0 when scoring between 70-80 points, 7-1 when scoring between 60-70 points and 1-7 when scoring less than 60 points.
- Iowa is 11-1 when holding its opponent to less than 60 points, 7-3 when holding its opponent between 60-70 points and 2-4 when the opponent scores over 70 points.
- Iowa is 14-1 when collecting more assists than the opponent, 3-7 when the opponent has more assists and 3-0 when assists are equal.
- Iowa is 12-2 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent, 8-5 when the opponent has fewer turnovers and 0-1 when turnovers are even.
- Iowa is 6-1 when collecting more steals than its opponent, 13-7 when the opponent has more steals and 1-0 when steals are equal.

Iowa Adds Three Recruits

Iowa has signed three student-athletes who will join the men's basketball program for the 2006-07 season.

Players announcing their plans to attend Iowa include Cyrus Tate, Justin Johnson and Jamie Vanderbeken.

Tate is a 6-8, 240-pound forward attending Northeast Community College in Norfolk, NE. Tate is in his first season at Northeast and will have three years of eligibility at Iowa. In three games this season he is averaging 19 points and eight rebounds.

Tate is a native of Homewood, IL. As a prep senior at Homewood-Flossmoor HS he averaged 15 points and nine rebounds per game.

Johnson is a 6-6, 190-pound guard who attends Tyler Community College in Tyler, TX. He averaged 14.5 points as a freshman and will have two years of eligibility at Iowa. Johnson has started this season on a positive note, averaging 22 points, six rebounds, three assists and four blocked shots per game.

Johnson, a native of Tyler who attended John Tyler HS, received pre-season All-America recognition in the October issue of *Basketball Times*. His coach at Tyler is Mike Marquis.

Vanderbeken, 6-10, 235, attends Quinte Secondary School in Belleville, Ontario, Canada. As a prep junior he averaged 25 points, 12 rebounds and five blocked shots per game. He played well this past summer at the Nike All-American Camp and the Las Vegas Main Event.

"We feel this is an excellent start to a good recruiting class," said Alford. "We've added size and athleticism. We hope to finish strong during the spring period. It's a plus that two of these three players will join our program with junior college experience."

Along with the three additions, Iowa plans to redshirt forward Kurt Looby, a 6-10 junior who is in his first year with the Iowa program after attending Tyler Community College. Iowa has five seniors on its 2005-06 roster and two scholarships remaining for next season.

- Iowa has had four players or more score in double figures in nine games, with a season-best five players in wins over Maryland-Eastern Shore and Michigan. Iowa is 2-0 when five players score 10 points or more, 8-0 when four reach double figures, 7-2 with three in double figures and 3-6 when two are in double figures.
- Iowa is 19-4 when leading at halftime, 1-4 when trailing at intermission and 0-0 when tied at halftime. Iowa has trailed at halftime in road games at Iowa State, Michigan State, Purdue, Minnesota and Illinois.
- Iowa is 16-3 when controlling the opening tip and 4-5 when not controlling the tip.
- Iowa is 9-3 in games decided by 10 points or less, 7-2 in games decided by five points or less and 1-1 in overtime.

- Iowa has held six opponents to 50 points or less and 11 to under 60 points. Only 14 Iowa opponents have shot as well as 40% from the field.
- Iowa has won at least 11 games before the start of Big Ten play four times in seven years under Coach Steve Alford. Along with the 11 wins this season, the Hawkeyes won 12 games prior to Big Ten play last season and 11 games in both 2001 and 2002.
- Under Steve Alford, Iowa is 37-6 when shooting at least 50% from the field, including 4-0 in 2005-06.
- Michigan State (away), Purdue (away) and Minnesota (away) are the only Iowa opponents to shoot 50% or better from the field, and Iowa was 1-2 in those games. Iowa allowed just four opponents to shoot at least 50% from the field last season, and Iowa was 3-1 in those games. Iowa was 0-5 when its opponent shot at least 50% from the field in 2004.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

The biggest deficit Iowa has overcome to get a victory is 11 points. The Hawkeyes trailed at Purdue by 11 points late in the first half before collecting a 77-68 win. The Purdue game marks the only contest Iowa has overcome a double figure deficit to record a victory.

Three Iowa opponents have overcome nine point deficits to defeat the Hawkeyes. Iowa led by nine points in the first half against Texas before falling 68-58 and the Hawkeyes lost at Northern Iowa (67-63) in overtime after leading by nine points in the first half. Northwestern defeated Iowa 51-48 after the Hawkeyes held a nine point lead in the second half.

IOWA FALLS AT ILLINOIS

Illinois used a scoring spurt late in the first half to gain the advantage and went on to a 71-59 win over Iowa in Champaign. The Hawkeyes played well in the early going, taking a six point advantage after six minutes. Illinois took the lead for good with nine minutes to play in the half and led by as many as seven before holding a 34-29 halftime advantage.

Illinois held the advantage throughout the final 20 minutes, building a 16 point lead with six minutes to play. Iowa closed to within 10 points, but could get no closer as the Illini avenged an earlier loss in Iowa City. Illinois shot 45.1% from the field and held a 32-24 rebounding advantage. The Illini had 13 offensive rebounds, committed just eight turnovers and collected 16 assists on 23 field goals.

Iowa shot 44.7% from the field, including just 25% (4-16) from three-point range. Greg Brunner led Iowa's attack with a season-best 27 points, hitting 9-15 field goals and 9-10 free throws. Jeff Horner added 11 points and led the Hawkeyes with eight rebounds. Brunner added seven rebounds and Horner had four assists.

Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series

Iowa State leads the second annual Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series 11-4. Iowa State recorded a 2-1 victory in women's soccer and a 23-3 win in football, while Iowa defeated Iowa State 20-15 in wrestling.

Iowa State won the women's basketball contest 77-61 and the men's game by a 72-60 margin. Iowa won the women's swimming and diving meet, 156-144 before ISU won the first women's gymnastics meet, 195.70-193.375.

Iowa claimed the initial Cy-Hawk Series (13-8) in 2004-05.

A point system will track each institution's performance and will culminate in one institution winning the annual trophy for the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series. Intercollegiate athletic teams from Iowa and Iowa State will square off in head-to-head competition eight different times during the 2005-06 academic year. The competition this season is in men's basketball, women's basketball, wrestling, women's gymnastics (2), women's soccer and softball. Additional points will be available for each school based on successful performance in the classroom by its studentathletes.

PENN STATE DEFEATS NORTHWESTERN

Penn State closed its home season with a 68-55 win over Northwestern as the Nittany Lions have doubled their win total (14) from a year ago. Penn State shot 51.3% from the field, including 52.9% in the first half in building a 35-25 advantage. Penn State held a 26-21 rebounding advantage, collected 11 steals while forcing 16 Wildcat turnovers and had 16 assists on 22 field goals.

The biggest advantage came at the free throw line, where Penn State made 20-26 (76.9%) attempts. Northwestern missed all three of its free throw attempts.

Northwestern closed to within six points, 49-43, in the second half before PSU went on an 18-5 scoring run to ice the win, it's 11th home victory this season.

Travis Parker and Geary Claxton each had 14 points to leads Penn State's scoring, while Jamelle Cornley added 11 points. Parker led PSU with six steals, Cornley and Claxton each had seven rebounds and Ben Luber and David Jackson both had five assists.

ASU HELD TO A DOZEN

Iowa held Arizona State to just 12 first half points in a 62-43 win in Iowa City. That marks the lowest first half total scored by an Iowa opponent in 207 games under Coach Steve Alford. The previous low of 15 points was scored by Northwestern in Iowa's 72-55 win in the first round of the 2001 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago.

Arizona State made 6-23 (26.1%) field goal attempts in the first half, missing three three-point attempts and two free throws.

LOW TOTAL FOR A WIN

The 45 points scored by Iowa in a win over North Carolina State marks the fewest points scored by Iowa since the Hawkeyes scored 49 in a 49-51 loss at Northwestern on March 3, 2004.

The point total is the lowest for Iowa in a winning effort since a 50-49 win at Drake on Nov. 11, 2002. The 45 points are the fewest by an Iowa team in a winning effort in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since a 42-39 win over Northwestern on Jan. 12, 1984. The 45 points match the lowest total scored by Iowa under the direction of Steve Alford, as the Hawkeyes lost a 45-54 contest at Wisconsin on Feb. 23, 2000.

HAWKEYES STEAL THE SHOW

In its season opening win over Maryland-Eastern Shore, Iowa collected 17 steals while forcing 25 turnovers. The 17 steals are the most by a Steve Alford coached Hawkeye team. Iowa had not had as many as 17 steals in a game since collecting 18 steals in an 84-74 win over Penn State on Jan. 27, 1999, a string of 205 games. Tony Freeman, Adam Haluska, Jeff Horner and Doug Thomas led the way with three steals each, while eight of the 12 Hawkeyes who played collected at least one steal. Iowa added eight steals in the win over Colgate.

Iowa's record for steals in a game is 23. The 25 turnovers are the most by an Iowa opponent since Liberty University was guilty of 24 turnovers on Dec. 22, 2002. Iowa forced 23 turnovers by Texas-San Antonio in a recent 79-46 win and North Carolina State was guilty of 24 turnovers.

OVERTIME NOTES

- With the 76-72 triple overtime win over Minnesota in January, Iowa is now 2-4 all-time in triple overtime games, with three of the six games being played vs. Minnesota.
- Iowa had lost four straight triple overtime games and had not won a triple overtime game since a 112-111 win over Purdue on Feb. 11, 1974.
- Iowa has played just one four overtime game (83-80 win over Cal in 1960-61) and its overall record in all overtime games now stands at 46-50. Iowa lost at Northern Iowa in single overtime earlier this season.
- The win over Minnesota was the first triple overtime game ever in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, where the Hawkeyes began playing home games during the 1983 season. Iowa's most recent triple overtime game in Iowa City was a 57-55 loss to Minnesota on Feb. 27, 1982 in the last Big Ten Conference game played in the Iowa Fieldhouse.

BRUNNER & HORNER SEE DOUBLE, AGAIN

Forward Greg Brunner and guard Jeff Horner both registered double-doubles in Iowa's home win over Minnesota. Brunner collected 17 points and 23 rebounds and Horner had 10 points and 10 rebounds. The Minnesota game marks the fourth time during their careers that Brunner and Horner have posted a double-double in the same game.

Iowa to Recognize "Heros"

"Our basketball staff feels the "Heroes Among Us" program is an easy way to salute the friends and neighbors of ours who are making a different in the lives of their friends and neighbors."

Nomination forms for the "Heroes Among Us" program are available online at hawkeyesports.com, the official web site of the Iowa Hawkeyes. Fans can print their nomination form by visiting the men's basketball home page and clicking on the "Heroes Among Us" line under the "Features" heading.

The UI will select one here to be saluted at each Hawkeye home game throughout the remainder of the season. The hero, and the individual who nominated them, will be provided pairs of tickets to the game and a \$10 gift certificate to the Official Iowa Hawk Shop. The hero will also be recognized when they are in attendance.

Earlier this season, Brunner had 23 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Fairfield, while Horner added 12 points and 10 assists. In an 88-75 win over Western Carolina on 12/18/04, Brunner had 11 points and 11 rebounds and Horner collected 20 points and 10 assists. In an 84-82 double overtime win at Indiana on 2/7/04, Brunner had 23 points and 13 rebounds and Horner had 17 points and 10 rebounds.

HORNER HITS 500, AGAIN

Senior guard Jeff Horner, just the fourth Iowa player ever to total over 500 assists, collected career rebound No. 500 in Iowa's home win over Indiana. Horner is Iowa's career assist leader with 586 and he has 530 career rebounds. Horner ranks 11th in career scoring (1,407). In other career stats, Horner is Iowa's career leader in three-point field goals (246) and three-point attempts (667) and he is seventh in steals (155).

Horner missed four games in December with a partially torn posterior cruciate ligament in his left knee, stopping his consecutive games streak at 102. The injury occurred during Iowa's game at Northern Iowa Dec. 6. He is averaging 13.0 points, 6.0 assists and 3.8 rebounds per game.

HALUSKA OVER 1,000 POINTS

Junior guard Adam Haluska surpassed 1,000 career points with his career-high 29-point performance in a win at Penn State. He has 1,147 points in his career, with 284 of those coming in his freshman season at Iowa State, and joins teammates Jeff Horner and Greg Brunner as 1,000-point scorers.

Haluska hit 6-10 three-pointers at PSU and 5-6 free throws and he had 12 points and four rebounds in a home win over Minnesota, scoring Iowa's first four points in the decisive third overtime. He added 19 points at Michigan State, 20 points and 10 rebounds vs. Indiana (home) and 18 points and seven rebounds vs. Ohio State. The double-double vs. Indiana is the first for Haluska as a Hawkeye. He did record one doubledouble during his freshman season at Iowa State, collecting 10 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Arkansas-Pine Bluff. He added 11 points in a win at Purdue and 18 points in the home win over Michigan. Against the Wolverines, he hit 5-6 FGs, 4-5 treys and 4-5 free throws, while also collecting five assists. Haluska had 13 points and seven rebounds in the win at Indiana, hitting 3-4 free throws in the final 11 seconds to assure the win, and he added 11 points, five rebounds, three rebounds and two steals in a win over Michigan State.

He has scored in double figures in 23 of 28 games and was named co-Big Ten Player of the Week for his play in wins over Indiana and Ohio State. He is averaging 14.1 points and 4.6 rebounds and he has led Iowa in steals in 10 games.

Haluska has started all 92 games he has played in his career. His consecutive starts streak ranks 10th longest among all Division I players, according to STATS — Chicago.

HANSEN CONTRIBUTES AT BOTH ENDS

Center Erek Hansen is making key plays on both offense and defense in his senior season. Hansen scored a careerhigh 20 points in a home win over Minnesota, hitting 7-12 FGs and 6-6 free throws. He connected on two free throws to tie the score at the end of the second half and added two more to force a third overtime. Hansen also had six rebounds and five blocked shots while playing a career-high 38 minutes. Hansen added 11 points (4-5 FGs) and six blocks in Iowa's home win over Indiana and he had six rebounds and five blocks in the win in Bloomington. Hansen had eight points vs. Ohio State, including two free throws to give Iowa the lead for good late in the contest. In the win over Michigan State he contributed 13 points, five rebounds, three blocks and two steals.

Hansen matched his career-high with seven blocked shots in a win over Fairfield and he had 14 points at Iowa State. He has collected three blocked shots or more in 15 games. Hansen had seven points, six rebounds and six blocked shots at Penn State, converting a three-point play on offense and a key blocked shot on defense in the final minutes.

Hansen is averaging 6.6 points and 3.8 rebounds. He leads the Big Ten and ranks 14th nationally with 2.7 blocked shots per game and he is shooting 57.7% from the field.

HENDERSON NUMBERS IMPROVED

Junior guard Mike Henderson has played a key role in Iowa's success, as he has improved his numbers in several categories from a year ago. Henderson matched his career scoring high with 17 points in the win at Purdue. He sparked an 11-0 scoring run in the second half that led to Iowa's win as he hit 7-10 field goals and added three steals. He added 11 points and four assists against Michigan, hitting all three of his three-point attempts, and he had 10 points in the win at Indiana. He scored 10 points vs. Arizona State and had 12 points, eight rebounds and four assists vs. Drake. Henderson

played a solid defensive game in Iowa's home win over Illinois and also had 10 points and eight rebounds.

Henderson is averaging 7.6 points and 4.1 rebounds per outing, improving his shooting to 47.7% from the field and 70.1% from the free throw line. Henderson has scored in double figures in nine games this year after scoring 10 or more points just three times in his first two seasons.

TWO NOMINATED FOR SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Iowa seniors Greg Brunner and Jeff Horner are two of 30 seniors from Division I basketball programs around the nation who have been named as candidates for the Bayer Advantage Senior CLASS Award. The award, now in its fifth year, is presented annually to the nation's senior player-of-the-year.

CLASS is an acronym for Celebrating Loyalty and Achievement for Staying in School. The award was launched during the 2001-02 season in response to the trend of college players leaving college early to turn professional.

The nomination of Brunner, from Charles City, and Horner, from Mason City, make Iowa one of seven programs to have two candidates among the list of 30 players.

1,000 POINT CLUB ADDS MEMBERS

Seniors Greg Brunner and Jeff Horner joined Iowa's 1,000 Point Club as juniors a year ago and junior Adam Haluska surpassed 1,000 career points in Iowa's win at Penn State.

Brunner ranks 10th in career scoring with 1,447 points, while Horner is 11th with 1,407. Brunner has ranked second in Big Ten rebounding in each of the past two seasons. He was named second team all-Big Ten last season and earned a gold medal at the World University Games last summer.

Horner is the only Iowa player ever to score over 1,000 points, grab over 500 rebounds (530) and distribute over 500 assists (586). Horner was honorable mention all-Big Ten a year ago.

Haluska has 1,147 career points, with 284 of those coming during his freshman season at Iowa State. He has scored 863 points at Iowa. He is averaging 14.1 points and has scored in double figures in 23 of 28 games.

This is the fifth time Iowa has had three 1,000 point scorers on the same team, but the first time they have all three been native Iowans. In happened in 2005 (Brunner, Horner and Pierre Pierce), 1996 (Jess Settles, Kenyon Murray and Chris Kingsbury), 1989 (Roy Marble, B.J. Armstrong and Ed Horton) and 1988 (Marble, Armstrong and Jeff Moe).

SHARING THE HONORS

Iowa's players have shared the honors. Senior forward Greg Brunner was named the Most Outstanding Player as Iowa opened the season with two wins in the regional rounds of the Guardians Classic. At the Classic finals, where Iowa defeated Kentucky before losing to Texas in the championship game, junior guard Adam Haluska was named to the all-Tournament team after scoring 23 points vs. the Longhorns.

Senior guard Jeff Horner was named MVP of Iowa's Hawkeye Challenge, while Brunner and Haluska were named to the all-tournament team. Horner recorded a scoring and assist (12-10) double-double vs. Fairfield and added 19 points against Valparaiso. Brunner had 23 points and 11 rebounds vs. Fairfield and nine points and 13 rebounds vs. Valparaiso. Haluska, in the two games, had 25 points and 11 rebounds.

Haluska was co-Player of the Week in the Big Ten on Jan. 30 and Horner earned the award Feb. 6.

IOWA EARNS KEY NOVEMBER WINS

Iowa Coach Steve Alford has led five of his Hawkeye teams to key wins over ranked opponents in November. Those victories have included:

- Iowa defeated top-ranked Connecticut 70-68 in the semifinals of the 1999 Coaches vs. Cancer event in New York's Madison Square Garden in Alford's first game as the Hawkeye head coach. The Huskies were the defending NCAA national champions. The Hawkeyes fell to Stanford in the title game.
- Iowa defeated 12th-ranked Memphis 75-71 in the semifinals of the 2001 Guardians Classic at Kansas City's Kemper Arena. After losing to fifth-ranked Missouri (77-78) in the finals, the Hawkeyes later that season defeated the Tigers (ranked second at the time) 83-65 in Columbia.
- Iowa defeated 16th-ranked Louisville 70-69 in overtime in the 2003 Wooden Classic in Indianapolis.
- Iowa defeated 11th-ranked Louisville (76-71) and 13thranked Texas (82-80) on back-to-back days at the Maui Invitational a year ago. The Hawkeyes fell to North Carolina, the eventual NCAA champion, in the finals.
- After two opening round wins in Iowa City, Iowa defeated seventh-ranked Kentucky 67-63 in the semi-finals of the 2005 Guardians Classic in Kansa City. The Hawkeyes fell to second-ranked Texas in the finals.
- As part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge, Iowa defeated 21st-ranked North Carolina State 45-42 Nov. 30, 2005 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena, giving the Hawkeyes their second win over a ranked opponent in the first six games of the season.

IOWA VS. RANKED FOES

Steve Alford has posted a 26-34 record against ranked opponents as Iowa's head coach, including an 8-4 mark in 2005-06. The Hawkeyes defeated seventh-ranked Kentucky (67-63), 21st-ranked North Carolina State (45-42), sixth-ranked Illinois (63-48), 11th-ranked Indiana (73-60), 16th-ranked Ohio State (67-62), 20th-ranked Michigan (94-66), 21st-ranked Indiana (70-67) and 16th-ranked Michigan State (66-54). Iowa dropped a 68-59 decision to second-ranked Texas, fell 66-52 at 24th-ranked Wisconsin, was defeated 85-55 at 11th-ranked Michigan State and lost at eighth-ranked Illinois, 71-59.

Alford's Hawkeye teams are 8-14 when playing teams ranked in the top 10, including wins over top-ranked Connecticut (70-68 in 1999-00), second-ranked Missouri (83-65 in 2001-02), fifth-ranked Ohio State (67-64 in 1999-00), sixth-ranked Illinois (63-48 in 2006), seventh-ranked Kentucky (67-63 in 2005-06), seventh-ranked Illinois (78-62 in 2000-01), eighth-ranked Illinois (68-61 in 2002-03) and 10th-ranked Michigan State (71-69 in 2005).

The 14 losses to top 10 teams have been three times to No. 1 (Duke, 2001-02 and Illinois twice in 2004-05), once to second-ranked (Texas, 2005-06), once to third-ranked (Illinois, 2000-01), twice to fourth-ranked (Michigan State, 1999-00 and 2000-01), twice to fifth-ranked (Tennessee, 2000-01 and Missouri, 2001-02), once to eighth-ranked Illinois, 2005-06), once to ninth-ranked (Kentucky, 2000-01) and three times to 10th-ranked (Michigan State, 2005).

In the 60 games against ranked teams, Alford and his Iowa team are 12-9 in home games, 10-11 at neutral sites and 4-14 when playing ranked teams in their home arena.

SCORING BY HALVES

Iowa has outscored its opponents 915-769 in the first half and 940-898 in the second half. Iowa has led at halftime in 23 games and the Hawkeyes have outscored their opponent in the second half in 16 games. The second half scoring was even (20-20) vs. NC State. Iowa and its opponents have both scored 25 points in two overtime games, a single overtime loss at Northern Iowa and a triple overtime win vs. Minnesota.

IOWA FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Iowa had made over 80% of its free throws in four games and at least 70% of its free throws in 18 of 28 games, with a season-best 83.3% (20-24) in a win over Fairfield. Iowa has posted a 13-5 record when shooting at least 70% from the free throw line. Following is Iowa's won-loss breakdown based on free throw percentage:

IOWA WINS OWN CHALLENGE

Iowa won its own Hawkeye Challenge in early December with victories over Fairfield (75-59) and Valparaiso (72-59). The Hawkeyes have won their own tournament 23 times in the 24-year history of the event. Seniors Greg Brunner and Jeff Horner, along with junior Adam Haluska, were named to the all-tournament team, with Horner earned the Most Valuable Player award.

IOWA SECOND IN GUARDIANS CLASSIC

Iowa made its second appearance in the Guardians Classic and was runner-up for the second time in five seasons. This season the Hawkeyes defeated Maryland-Eastern Shore, Colgate and Kentucky before falling to Texas in the title game. Junior Adam Haluska was named to the all-tournament team in Kansas City, while senior Greg Brunner was named the Outstanding Player in the Iowa City regional portion of the event.

2006 CAPTAINS

Iowa's captains are seniors Greg Brunner and Jeff Horner. Brunner, a native of Charles City, has started 109-121 games in his career and ranks among Iowa's career leaders in scoring, rebounds, free throw attempts and blocked shots. He earned second team all-Big Ten honors in 2005 and placed second in the league in rebounding in each of the past two seasons.

Horner, a Mason City native, has started 116 of 117 games in his career, missing four games in December due to an injury. He has led the team in assists in each of the last three seasons and ranks among Iowa's career leaders in scoring, assists, three-point field goals, three-point attempts and steals.

IOWA IN TOURNAMENT PLAY

Iowa has faired well while taking part in regular-season tournaments over the past 24 years. In that time Iowa has won the Great Alaska Shootout (1986-87), the Cal-Irvine Anteater Classic (1986-87), the Maui Classic (1987-88), the San Juan Thanksgiving Shootout (1992-93), the San Juan Christmas Shootout (1997-98), the Big Ten Conference Tournament in 2001 and its own invitational 23 times.

In addition, Iowa was runner-up in the 1985-86 Far West Classic, the 1987-88 All-College Tournament, the 1988-89 Chaminade Classic, the 1991-92 Tampa Tribune Holiday Invitational, the 1994-95 Rainbow Classic, the 1995-96 Great Alaska Shootout, the 1999-00 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, the 2001-02 Guardians Classic, the 2002 Big Ten Conference Tournament, the 2004 Maui Invitational and the 2005 Guardians Classic.

IOWA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Iowa made its 21st appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2005, falling to Cincinnati in the opening round at the RCA Dome in Indianapolis. Iowa earned the bid after posting a 21-win season, including wins over Purdue and 10th-ranked Michigan State in the 2005 Big Ten Tournament.

The Hawkeyes hold an overall record of 27-23 in the tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1955 (fourth), 1956 (second) and 1980 (fourth). Iowa had advanced to at least the second round in its last 10 tournament appearances before last season. Iowa reached the regional championship in 1987 and lost in the regional semi-final in 1988 and 1999.

ANOTHER STRONG SCHEDULE

Iowa's non-conference schedule saw the Hawkeyes meeting teams from nearly every major conference in the nation. The Hawkeyes participated in the Guardians Classic to begin the season, advancing to the championship game, defeating seventh-ranked Kentucky before falling to second-ranked Texas.

Iowa's non-conference home schedule was highlighted by games vs. Arizona State of the Pac 10 Conference and North Carolina State of the Atlantic Coast Conference. Iowa also hosted Fairfield, Tulane and Valparaiso in the Hawkeye Challenge and Maryland-Eastern Shore, Colgate and Utah Valley State in the first round of the Guardians Classic. Additional non-conference home games were against Drake and Robert Morris. The schedule included non-conference road games at Northern Iowa, Iowa State and Saint Louis.

Iowa's schedule includes 16 games against teams that advanced to post-season play a year ago, including 14 games against teams that were in the NCAA Tournament. That includes two games against Illinois (NCAA), Indiana (NIT), Michigan State (NCAA), Minnesota (NCAA), and Wisconsin (NCAA), single games vs. Arizona State (NIT), Iowa State (NCAA), North Carolina State (NCAA), Northern Iowa (NCAA), Kentucky (NCAA) and Texas (NCAA).

IOWA ON THE TUBE

Every Iowa game throughout the 2005-06 season will be televised. Iowa will appear on national cable television (ESPN and ESPN2) as many as 11 times. Hawkeye games not selected for national coverage will be televised regionally by ESPN Plus, while several conference games will be televised throughout the Big Ten Conference viewing area as part of the Big Ten regional network agreement with ESPN Plus.

HORNER NEAR TRIPLE FIGURES, AGAIN

Senior guard Jeff Horner is the only player in Iowa basketball history to record over 200 points, 100 rebounds and 100 assists in three different seasons. Horner is one of two players to accomplish the feat as a freshman and he is closing in on that feat for the fourth straight season. NO THREE-POINTERS

Since the three-point shot became part of the college game, Iowa has played 14 games in which it has failed to make a three-point attempt. Iowa had made at least one three-point basket in 53 straight games before missing all five attempts in a 71-61 home win over Purdue in 2004. The five three-point attempts are the fewest attempted by a Steve Alford team at Iowa. Iowa's current streak includes at least one three-point basket in 81 straight games.



2005-06 Iowa Game Summaries

(1) IOWA 85, MARYLAND-EASTERN SHORE 41 November 14, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa had too much experience and too much depth for a young Maryland-Eastern Shore team as the Hawkeyes opened the season with an 86-41 win over the Hawks. UMES, with three freshmen and a transfer in the starting line-up, never led and trailed 44-20 at half-time. Iowa jumped to a fast start, shooting 45% from the field in the first half while holding UMES to 33.3% shooting.

Iowa improved its shooting touch to 60% in the second half and ended the night shooting 50.8% from the field and 71.4% from the free throw line. The Hawkeyes also held a 47-36 rebounding advantage and forced 25 turnovers while collecting 17 steals.

Five Iowa players scored in double figures, with seniors Greg Brunner and Jeff Horner leading the way with 16 points each. Adam Haluska added 12 points and Mike Henderson and Seth Gorney each scored 10. Doug Thomas led Iowa with 10 rebounds and Brunner had seven. Gorney was 5-5 from the field and added five rebounds.

(2) IOWA 85, COLGATE 41

November 15, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used a 24-4 scoring run midway through the second half to regain control in taking a 73-51 win over Colgate in the second round of the Guardians Classic. After leading 42-24 at halftime, Iowa saw the Raiders close to within six points, 49-43 with 13 minutes, before regaining control. Jeff Horner scored on a lay-up and added two free throws to start Iowa's scoring spurt, while Greg Brunner added a lay-up and a pair of free throws to stretch the margin to 57-45 with nine minutes remaining.

The Hawkeyes shot 51.5% from the field in the first half, racing to a 23-6 advantage in the opening nine minutes. Iowa shot 49.1% for the game, compared to 42% for Colgate. Iowa held a 36-29 rebounding advantage and forced 18 turnovers.

(3) IOWA 67, KENTUCKY 63

November 21, 2005, Municipal Auditorium, Kansas City, MO

Iowa converted six of eight free throws in the final 40 seconds to defeat seventh-ranked Kentucky 67-63 in the semi-finals of the Guardians Classic in Kansas City.

Senior forward Greg Brunner converted a three-point play with 3:55 remaining to give Iowa a 59-56 advantage and junior guard Mike Henderson scored from the lane to give Iowa a 61-58 lead with 1:29 to play. After a three-point basket by the Wildcats, junior guard Adam Haluska made one of two free throws to put Iowa on top for good (62-61) with 40 seconds remaining. Henderson came up with a key rebound in the final minute and freshman guard Tony Freeman came up with a steal to help protect Iowa's advantage as Horner, Henderson and Haluska all added free throws in the final seconds.

The game was close throughout, as Iowa shot 43.3% from the field in the opening half in taking a 34-31 halftime advantage. Iowa shot 38.3% for the game, but connected on 17-23 (73.9%) free throws. Iowa also forced 17 Kentucky turnovers and held the Wildcats to 32.8% shooting from the field.

Brunner led Iowa with 17 points and 12 rebounds, while Henderson added 15 points, seven rebounds and four steals.

Iowa led for the majority of the contest, but second-ranked Texas rallied in the final 10 minutes to defeat Iowa 68-59 in the champion-ship game of the Guardians Classic in Kansas City.

Iowa led 31-24 at halftime, controlling the tempo and keeping the Longhorns off balance on offense. Texas used a zone defense in the second half to slow Iowa's offense as Iowa's shooting suffered in the final 20 minutes. Texas rallied for a three-point advantage with just over six minutes to play, but a tip-in basket by Greg Brunner and two free throws by Jeff Horner put the Hawkeyes back on top with 5:29 to play. November 26, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

After a sluggish start, Iowa dominated the final 30 minutes in taking a 79-46 win over Texas-San Antonio in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Leading by a single point midway through the first half, Iowa used a 15-1 scoring run over the final seven minutes of the half to take a 36-21 lead at intermission. Iowa dominated the second half by a 43-25 margin to put the game away midway through the second period. The Hawkeyes shot 47.4% from the field, held a 42-34 rebounding advantage and made 22-31 (71%) free throws.

The Iowa defense had another strong outing, as UTSA shot just 35.7% from the field and 28.6% from three-point range. The Hawkeyes forced 23 turnovers while collecting 11 steals while no Iowa player saw more than 27 minutes of action.

Iowa used a 10-0 scoring run over a six minute period late in the game to defeat 21st-ranked North Carolina State 45-42 in Iowa City as part of the Big Ten/ACC Challenge. Trailing 35-31 with 9:52 to play, Iowa began its scoring run with a jumper by Erek Hansen and tied the game on two free throws by Mike Henderson. Iowa took the lead for good on a basket by Greg Brunner with five minutes to play. Adam Haluska scored two baskets after turnovers to increase the advantage to 41-35 with 3:55 remaining. NC State cut the margin in half on a three-point basket before Brunner added another basket and Jeff Horner scored Iowa's final points on a jumper with 1:17 to play. The Wolfpack cut the margin to 45-42 with 56 seconds left and got the ball back after an Iowa miss with 20 seconds to play. A final three-point attempt by NC State in the last two seconds was off target and Iowa had the hard fought win.

IOWA 75, FAIRFIELD 59
 December 2, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Greg Brunner recorded his second double-double of the season to lead Iowa's offensive attack in a 75-59 win over Fairfield in the first round of the Hawkeye Challenge. Brunner connected on all eight of his field goal attempts and 7-8 free throws, scoring a season-high 23 points and grabbing 11 rebounds. Jeff Horner joined Brunner in the double-double column, adding 12 points and 10 assists, while also gabbing eight rebounds and leading the team with two steals.

Fairfield stayed in the game by connecting on 12-29 three point attempts and forcing 20 Hawkeye turnovers. Iowa shot 52% from the field in each half and led 32-29 at the break. The Hawkeyes led throughout the final 20 minutes, but a pair of three-pointers allowed Fairfield to cut the Iowa advantage to five points with 3:32 remaining. Iowa then scored the next 12 points over the final three minutes to secure the win.

The Hawkeye defense held Fairfield to 26.9% shooting from the field, as the Stags made just 6-38 (15.8%) of their two-point field goal attempts. Iowa also blocked 11 shots, just one shy of the school record for blocks in a game.

Iowa won the rebounding battle by a 42-35 margin and shot 52.1% from the field and 83.3% from the free throw line. Adam Haluska scored 11 points to join Brunner and Horner in double figures and he added five rebounds. Center Erek Hansen led Iowa's interior defense, matching his career-best with seven blocks while also add-ing eight points and six rebounds.

(11) IOWA 62, ARIZONA STATE 43

December 17, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used another solid defensive performance in taking a 62-43 win over Arizona State, snapping a two-game losing streak. The Hawkeyes held the Sun Devils to just 12 points in the first half, building a 28-12 halftime advantage. ASU shot just 26.1% from the field in the opening 20 minutes and just 34% for the game. ASU entered the game as one of the top three-point teams in the nation, but Iowa held the visitors to 23.1% (3-13) from behind the line.

Iowa started slow on offense as well while playing its second straight game without senior guard Jeff Horner. Iowa led 13-8 when Adam Haluska, Mike Henderson and Carlton Reed each hit a threepoint basket during a three minute stretch that saw Iowa increase the margin to 24-10 with four minutes left in the half.

ASU was able to close the margin to 10 points at just one point in the second half, but Iowa responded with a 14-2 scoring run and eventually led by as many as 22 points in the closing minutes. Iowa won the rebounding battle 41-35 and forced 17 ASU turnovers.

Haluska led Iowa's scoring attack with 17 points, as he hit 4-8 field goals, 3-6 treys and 6-6 free throws. Greg Brunner added 12 points and a career-high 15 rebounds and Henderson scored 10. Freshman Tony Freeman added a career-best seven assists, Carlton Reed had a season-high nine points and Alex Thompson had six rebounds.

(12) IOWA 65, DRAKE 60

December 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa rallied from a three-point deficit in the final three minutes to score a 65-60 win over Drake in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The Hawkeyes got off to a slow start, trailing 11-2 after five minutes. The Hawkeyes were able to settle down and finally moved ahead with nine minutes left in the first half. Iowa used a 9-3 scoring spurt in the final five minutes of the half for a 29-25 lead at intermission.

The Hawkeyes started fast in the second half, moving to a 34-25 advantage in the first minute of the period. Drake rallied from there, finally taking a one-point lead with 7:41 remaining. The teams remained even the rest of the way before Drake took a 58-55 advantage with 3:10 remaining. Doug Thomas scored on a dunk with three minutes to play and Adam Haluska hit a three-pointer to give Iowa a 60-58 advantage with 1:36 remaining. After Drake again tied the score, Haluska hit a second three-point basket with 32 seconds to play. Greg Brunner grabbed a defensive rebound on Drake's next miss and added one of two free throws with 17 seconds left. Following another Drake miss, Thomas scored the final point of the game on a free throw and Iowa had its 27th straight win over the Bulldogs.

Brunner led Iowa with 17 points and 12 rebounds, collecting his fourth consecutive double-double. Mike Henderson added 12 points and eight rebounds and Thomas had 11 points, eight rebounds and four blocked shots. Haluska scored 11 points and led Iowa with six assists and three steals. Iowa held Drake to 37.1% field goal shooting and won the rebounding battle 39-35.

December 22, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used an 18-5 scoring run over the final eight minutes of the first half to take complete control, and the Hawkeyes went on to a 73-51 win over Robert Morris in their final non-conference home game of the season.

Leading 23-17, Iowa picked up the pace late in the first half to build a 41-22 margin by intermission. Iowa shot 45.7% from the field in the first half, while Robert Morris shot just 25%. The visitors improved to 36.7% shooting over the final 20 minutes as Iowa picked up in the second half where it ended the first. Robert Morris was never able to get closer than 15 points, and that came with just under four minutes left to play.

Iowa used a balanced attack and strong play from its reserves to win its third straight game. Iowa closed the non-conference portion of the schedule with a 60-50 win at Saint Louis, earning its fourth straight win. The Hawkeyes used a 15-5 scoring run over the final five minutes of the first half to take a 36-28 advantage at the break. Iowa maintained its advantage throughout the second half, but led by just five after two Billiken free throws with two minutes remaining. Jeff Horner connected on a three-point basket to beat the shot clock with 1:22 remaining to give Iowa some breathing room. Saint Louis was never closer than six the rest of the way. (15) WISCONSIN 66, IOWA 52 January 5, 2006, The Kohl Center, Madison, WI

Poor shooting from the field in the second half proved to be the difference as Iowa dropped a 66-52 decision at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes shot 46.2% from the field while building a 34-32 halftime advantage, including 57.1% (4-7) from three-point range. But that changed in the final 20 minutes. The Hawkeyes misfired on their first 13 field goal attempts of the second half before Jeff Horner connected on a three-pointer with 11:46 to play. By that time, the Badgers had built a seven point advantage and, after Wisconsin answered with a three-pointer with 11:04 remaining, Iowa was never closer than 10 points the rest of the way.

The Hawkeyes made just 5-30 (16.7%) of their field goal attempts in the second half and shot 30.4% for the game. The 18 points in the second half is the lowest second half total for a Steve Alford coached Iowa team. Iowa made just 1-10 treys in the second half.

Iowa stayed in the contest by hitting 13-17 free throws, by holding a 41-36 rebounding advantage and by committing just 11 turnovers. Wisconsin shot 46.7% from the field in the game, becoming just the fifth Iowa opponent to shoot 40% or better from the field.

Horner and Adam Haluska led Iowa's scoring attack with 11 points each, while Doug Thomas came off the bench to add 10 points and eight rebounds. Greg Brunner scored eight points and led both teams with 10 rebounds.

(16) IOWA 63, ILLINOIS 48

January 7, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa shot 52.6% from the field in the second half and used a solid defensive performance to take a 63-48 win over sixth-ranked Illinois. Both teams struggled to score in the first half, as Illinois shot 29.6% and Iowa just 25% from the field. The Hawkeyes held Illinois scoreless for the final four minutes of the period and scored the final four points to take a 21-19 lead at the break.

The Hawkeyes scored the first basket of the second half and never trailed in the final 20 minutes. Iowa led by 10 with 12 minutes to play before Illinois rallied within three points with 8:18 remaining. Two free throws by Adam Haluska and a basket by Mike Henderson gave Iowa a 45-38 cushion with six minutes remaining and Illinois could get no closer than six points the rest of the way. Iowa made all eight of its free throw attempts in the final minute to secure the win over the team that advanced to the 2005 NCAA title game.

Iowa ended the contest shooting 35.3% from the field and the Hawkeyes made 24-32 (75%) of their free throw attempts. The Hawkeyes also held a 45-32 rebounding advantage. Illinois shot just 34.6% from the field and made just 5-26 (19.2%) three-point attempts and 7-15 (46.7%) free throws.

Jeff Horner led Iowa with 16 points, six rebounds, six assists and three steals. Haluska added 15 points and Henderson scored 10. Greg Brunner led all players with 12 rebounds and he scored eight points. Erek Hansen added eight points, four rebounds and two blocked shots.

(17) IOWA 80, PENN STATE 76

January 14, 2006, Bryce Jordan Center, State College, PA

Despite holding the upper hand throughout most of the contest, Iowa had to come from behind in the closing minutes to take an 80-76 win at Penn State. Iowa shot 51.9% from the field in the first half, leading by as many as 10 points. The Hawkeyes led 40-34 at intermission after Adam Haluska scored 21 points in the opening half. Iowa made 9-18 three-point attempts in the opening 20 minutes.

Iowa maintained control in the early portion of the second half, holding a 66-59 advantage with six minutes to play. From there Penn State scored nine straight points to take a 68-66 advantage with 3:52 left. The teams traded baskets until Erek Hansen converted a rebound basket and added a free throw, giving Iowa a 72-70 advantage with 1:51 to play. Two free throws by Greg Brunner gave Iowa a 74-73 advantage with 48 seconds remaining and Jeff Horner added a pair of free shots after a Penn State turnover. Hansen came up big on the defensive end, collecting his sixth blocked shot of the game with 25 seconds left and Iowa leading by three points. Haluska added a pair of foul shots and Horner hit a free throw in the final seconds to secure the road win.

Haluska ended the contest with a career-best 29 points, surpassing 1,000 career points. He hit 6-10 treys and 5-6 free throws. Horner added 17 points and nine assists and Brunner had 13 points. Hansen, who made key plays at both ends in the closing minutes, had seven points and six rebounds to go with his six blocks. Reserve Doug Thomas led the Hawkeyes with seven rebounds.

(18) IOWA 76, MINNESOTA 72 (3 OT)

January 18, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa outlasted Minnesota 76-72 in three overtimes to win its 12th straight home game and improve to 3-1 in Big Ten play. The Hawkeyes controlled most of the first half, leading 30-20 with three minutes left in the period. Minnesota used a 16-2 scoring run from late in the first half to early in the second, taking a 36-32 advantage with 17 minutes to play. The game was tied seven times in the second half, the last at 58-58 with 1:34 remaining on two free throws by Erek Hansen. Minnesota had a shot to win at the end of regulation and at the end of the first extra session. (19) MICHIGAN STATE 85, IOWA 55 January 21, 2006, Breslin Center, East Lansing, MI

Michigan State shot 50% from the field for the game, including 60.7% in the second half, in handing Iowa an 85-55 defeat in East Lansing. Despite early foul problems, Iowa stayed close and trailed by a 37-28 margin at intermission. Greg Brunner had 11 points and eight rebounds in the opening half and Adam Haluska added 10 points to keep Iowa within striking distance. Starting center Erek Hansen and reserve center Doug Thomas each collected two quick fouls, with Hansen playing three minutes and Thomas five in the first half.

(20) IOWA 73, INDIANA 60

Iowa featured one of its most balanced attacks of the season in taking a 73-60 home win over 11th-ranked Indiana. The Hawkeyes never trailed and led by as many as 10 points in the first half before holding just a 30-27 margin at the break. Iowa started fast in the second half, using a 14-3 scoring run in the first five minutes to increase the advantage to 44-30. (21) IOWA 67, OHIO STATE 62

January 28, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa held Ohio State to a single free throw over the final 6:34 and went on to take a 67-62 win over the Buckeyes in Iowa City in the only meeting of the season between the two teams.

Iowa trailed 61-58 after Ohio State connected on a three-pointer with 6:34 remaining. Greg Brunner scored on a lay-up with six minutes remaining to move Iowa within a point and Erek Hansen gave Iowa a 62-61 advantage with two free throws at the 5:32 mark. Both teams converted one of two free throws to leave Iowa's margin at 63-62 with 33 seconds remaining. Two free throws by Adam Haluska gave Iowa a 65-62 margin with 24 seconds to play before OSU turned the ball over on its next possession. OSU led by as many as four points midway though the second half before Iowa rallied. Iowa held OSU to 35.1% shooting from the field. Both teams shot over 80% from the free throw line and both were guilty of less than 10 turnovers.

Haluska led Iowa with 18 points, with 16 of those coming in the first half, and Brunner scored 17 points for the fourth straight game. Brunner led Iowa with nine rebounds and Haluska had seven. Reserve Doug Thomas gave the Hawkeyes a big lift with 10 points, five rebounds and two steals, while Horner and Mike Henderson each added five assists.

(22) IOWA 77, PURDUE 68

February 1, 2006, Mackey Arena, West Lafayette, IN

Iowa rallied from a 33-25 halftime deficit to defeat Purdue at West Lafayette. The Hawkeyes trailed the entire opening half and were down by as many as 11 points before Jeff Horner converted a three-point play in the final seconds of the half to cut the deficit to eight. Iowa shot just 34% from the field in the first half, compared to 50% for the Boilermakers, and Iowa had 10 turnovers at the break.

The Hawkeyes found their shooting touch at halftime and responded by scoring a season-high 52 points in the second half. Iowa shot 64% from the field in the final 20 minutes, including 72.7% (8-11) from three-point range. The Hawkeyes were guilty of just one turnover in the second half.

Trailing 46-39 with 15:52 to play, Iowa used an 11-0 scoring run over a five minute period to take a 50-46 advantage. Mike Henderson keyed the rally, hitting a three-pointer and a lay-up while collecting two steals. Once the Hawkeyes led at 47-46, they never trailed again. Iowa led by as many as nine points, but didn't seal the win until Horner gave his team a 72-66 lead on a three-pointer with 1:29 to play.

Horner scored a career-high 32 points, hitting 7-10 treys while becoming Iowa's career leader in that category. Henderson matched his career-high with 17 points and Henderson and Horner each collected three of Iowa's 12 steals. Adam Haluska added 11 points and six rebounds and Greg Brunner had 10 points and seven rebounds.

2005-06 Iowa Game Summaries

(23) IOWA 94, MICHIGAN 66 February 4, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used its best shooting performance of the season to take a 94-66 home win over 20th-ranked Michigan. After a slow start that saw the Hawkeyes trail by as many as eight points in the first seven minutes, Iowa found its touch and never looked back. Two three-point baskets by Mike Henderson got Iowa back in the game and Greg Brunner's lay-up with three minutes left in the half gave Iowa a 30-29 advantage.

Iowa made 14 consecutive field goal attempts over a 14-minute span in the middle of the game. The Hawkeyes trailed 25-20 when the streak began and led 63-41 with 11:45 left in the game when the consecutive streak ended. Iowa, which also made eight straight three-point attempts, shot a season-best 65.3% from the field, including 68.4% from three-point range. Iowa made a season-best 13 three-point field goals and added 17-24 (70.8%) free throws.

After Michigan shot an even 50% in the first half the Iowa defense controlled the action in the second half. Michigan shot just 32% in the second half and 41.5% for the game. Iowa held a 34-27 rebounding advantage and the Hawkeyes had a season-high 27 assists.

Iowa featured a balanced attack as five Hawkeyes scored in double figures. Adam Haluska led the way with 18 points, hitting 5-6 field goals (4-5 treys) and 4-5 free throws. Brunner had 17 points for the fifth time in six games, Jeff Horner scored 14, Henderson 11 and Tony Freeman a career-best 10. Brunner led Iowa's rebounding efforts with nine, while Doug Thomas added six rebounds and Horner collected six assists.

Northwestern used a 17-6 scoring advantage over the final minutes in taking a 51-48 win over Iowa in Evanston, snapping Iowa's four-game win streak.

The Hawkeyes led by six points (42-34) with 6:26 to play before the Wildcats used some hot shooting down the stretch to earn the win. Northwestern, which had just two field goals in the first eight minutes of the second half, shot 62.5% (10-16) over the final 20 minutes, including 85.7% (6-7) from three-point range.

Greg Brunner's free throw gave Iowa a 48-46 advantage with 50 seconds remaining before Vedran Vukusic converted a three-point play with 29 seconds left to give the Wildcats their first lead since the six minute mark of the first half. Iowa's Adam Haluska missed a baseline jumper in the closing seconds before the Wildcats added a pair of free throws with six seconds left for the final margin.

Iowa shot just 35.1% from the field and was guilty of 17 turnovers. The Hawkeyes held a 31-25 rebounding advantage.

Brunner led Iowa with 13 points and 11 rebounds, collecting his 10th double-double of the season. Brunner raised his career rebounding total to 920 to become Iowa's all-time rebounding leader. Jeff Horner added 10 points and five assists.

(25) IOWA 70, INDIANA 67 February 11, 2006, Assembly Hall, Bloomington, IN

Iowa led from start to finish and made just enough free throws down the stretch in taking a 70-67 win at Indiana. The Hawkeyes started fast, leading 15-7 in the first five minutes. The Hawkeyes got a three-point basket from Greg Brunner in the final seconds of the period to hold a 38-30 margin at halftime. Iowa shot 48.3% from the field, 54.5% from three-point range and 80% from the free throw line in the opening 20 minutes.

Iowa increased its advantage in the early stages of the second half and held its biggest advantage, 57-41, with 8:21 remaining after a driving lay-up by Mike Henderson. The Hoosiers stayed in the game and made a run at the end, thanks to Iowa's failure to put the game away from the free throw line.

Iowa led by nine, 62-53, with 1:54 to play. From there the Hawkeyes made just eight of their final 14 free throw attempts. Iowa led 67-65 with 11 seconds to play before Adam Haluska hit two free shots for a four point lead. After an Indiana basket Haluska hit one of two free throws for a 70-67 advantage with five seconds to play. The Hoosiers missed a hurried three-point attempt in the final seconds and Iowa had its second straight win at Assembly Hall.

Iowa ended the game shooting 45.3% from the field, compared to 41.1% for Indiana. The rebounding was even at 35 and the Hawkeyes collected nine steals and eight blocked shots.

Brunner led Iowa's balanced attack with 19 points and eight rebounds. Jeff Horner added 17 points, Haluska 13 and Henderson 10. Haluska added seven rebounds, Brunner collected a careerbest five steals and Erek Hansen added six rebounds and five blocked shots.

Iowa rallied from a seven point deficit in the early stages of the game and went on to defeat Michigan State 66-54 in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes trailed 15-7 as MSU hit its first five shots from the field. Iowa rallied to lead by seven (28-21) later in the first half before maintaining a 30-26 margin at the midway point.

Trailing 37-35 in the second half, Iowa used an 8-0 scoring run to take the lead for good. Erek Hansen and Greg Brunner each scored four points in that stretch. Jeff Horner then hit three of his four three-pointers over a three minute stretch as Iowa improved its lead to 58-47 with eight minutes to play. Michigan State closed within eight points (58-50) with five minutes left before Iowa expanded the margin to as many as 15 in the final minutes.

2005-06 Iowa Game Summaries

(27) MINNESOTA 74, IOWA 61 February 18, 2006, Williams Arena, Minneapolis, MN

Minnesota shot 51% from the field and held an advantage in nearly all statistical categories as the Gophers took a 74-61 win over Iowa, earning a season split. Minnesota used its inside scoring strength to take a 38-29 advantage at halftime, scoring the most point allowed by Iowa in the first half this season. The Hawkeyes trailed 28-27 with 3:16 left in the half before the Gophers used a 10-2 run to end the period. Minnesota shot 60.7% from the field in the first half, compared to 40.9% for Iowa.

The Gophers led by nine points with 12:47 remaining when Iowa used a 10-0 scoring run to take the lead. Three free throws by Adam Haluska gave Iowa a 51-50 advantage with 10 minutes to play. Minnesota led by three points with 3:13 remaining when free throw shooting took over the game. Iowa missed the front end of consecutive one and one opportunities as Minnesota built a seven point advantage. The Gophers then connected on 11-13 free throws in the final two minutes to keep a comfortable margin.

Along with shooting 51%, Minnesota held a 36-25 rebounding advantage and was guilty of just 10 turnovers. Iowa shot 41.3% from the field and 75% from the foul line, despite missing three of four free throws in the final four minutes.

Greg Brunner led Iowa with 17 points and seven rebounds, while Jeff Horner added 13 points and five assists. Mike Henderson scored eight points and led the Hawkeyes with three steals.

Illinois used a scoring spurt late in the first half to gain the advantage and went on to a 71-59 win over Iowa in Champaign. The Hawkeyes played well in the early going, taking a six point advantage after six minutes. Illinois took the lead for good with nine minutes to play in the half and led by as many as seven before holding a 34-29 halftime advantage.

Illinois held the advantage throughout the final 20 minutes, building a 16 point lead with six minutes to play. Iowa closed to within 10 points, but could get no closer as the Illini avenged an earlier loss in Iowa City. Illinois shot 45.1% from the field and held a 32-24 rebounding advantage. The Illini had 13 offensive rebounds, committed just eight turnovers and collected 16 assists on 23 field goals.

Iowa shot 44.7% from the field, including just 25% (4-16) from three-point range. Greg Brunner led Iowa's attack with a season-best 27 points, hitting 9-15 field goals and 9-10 free throws. Jeff Horner added 11 points and led the Hawkeyes with eight rebounds. Brunner added seven rebounds and Horner had four assists.
