- In a tradition that started at the University of Iowa football team's season opener in 2017, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital will exchange waves at the end of the first quarter.
- QB Nate Stanley has 10 touchdown passes over the last three games, Iowa's best three-game stretch since Chuck Hartlieb threw 11 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1987. Chuck Long threw 12 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1985.
- The Hawkeyes have won four straight night games at Kinnick Stadium (9/19/15 vs. Pitt 27-24; 11/14/15 vs. Minn. 40-35; 9/10/16 vs. Iowa State 42-3; 11/12/16 vs. #2 Michigan 14-13).
- Iowa has won five straight Big Ten openers. Its last conference opening loss was in 2011 at Penn State (13-3). The Hawkeyes are chasing their fifth 4-0 start under head coach Kirk Ferentz (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015).
- The Hawkeyes are opening the Big Ten Conference season at home for the first time since 2012 (31-13 win vs. Minnesota).
- The Hawkeyes have won 399 games at home since becoming a varsity football team in 1889. The Hawkeyes are 399-216-16 (.645) at home, including a 117-36-1 (.763) mark at Iowa Field and a 282-180-15 (.607) record at Kinnick Stadium.
- Iowa is 3-0, but has trailed each game (3-0 vs. Wyoming; 31-21 at Iowa State; 7-0 vs. North Texas).
- RB Akrum Wadley ranks No. 3 in the Big Ten and No. 13 nationally averaging 170.0 all-purpose yards per game. Through three games, he has 258 yards rushing, 152 yards receiving, and 100 yards on kick returns. He has 2,681 career all-purpose yards, 18th most in program history.
- The Hawkeyes have won six of the last 10 against Penn State and hold a 9-8 advantage since 1993 when the Nittany Lions joined the Big Ten Conference.
- Iowa had 29 first downs at Iowa State, tied for second most in Kirk Ferentz era, and 28 first downs against North Texas, tied for fifth in the Kirk Ferentz era. The 57 combined first downs is the highest total in back-to-back games in the Kirk Ferentz era.

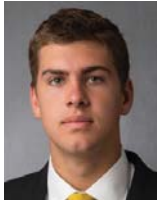

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,223 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 636-548-39 (.535). That includes a 399-216-16 (.645) record in home games, a 237-332-23 (.418) record in games away from Iowa City, a 320-369-25 (.464) mark in Big Ten games and a 282-180-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

399 AND COUNTING

The Hawkeyes have won 399 games at home since becoming a varsity football team in 1889. The Hawkeyes are 399-216-16 (.645) at home, including a 117-36-1 (.763) mark at Iowa Field and a 282-180-15 (.607) record at Kinnick Stadium.

Iowa's first win at home was 64-6 victory vs. Cornell in 1891 at Iowa Field.

Kinnick Stadium opened in 1929 as Iowa Stadium. It was renamed Kinnick Stadium in 1972 in honor of 1939 Heisman Trophy winner Nile Kinnick. Prior to 1929 Iowa played its home games at Iowa Field, located on the east bank of the Iowa River (now a parking lot between the English Philosophy Building and UI Main Library).

A PLEASANT RESOLUTION TO THE CASE OF THE UNKNOWN

QB Nate Stanley is the 14th quarterback to start a game under Kirk Ferentz. Since 1999, both of Kirk Ferentz's Big Ten championships have been with a first-year starting quarterback. Brad Banks led Iowa to a share of the conference title in 2002, and Drew Tate did the same in 2004. In 2015, first-year starter C.J. Beathard was given the keys to the offense and drove Iowa to the Big Ten championship game and Rose Bowl.

Ferentz teams have also finished in the Associated Press top-10 on five occasions, and in four of those seasons the Hawkeyes were led by a first-year starter -- Banks in 2002, Nathan Chandler in 2003, Tate in 2004, and Beathard in 2015.

TACKLE BY JOSEY JEWELL

LB Josey Jewell leads the team and ranks third in the Big Ten with 28 tackles. He has led the team in tackles in each of the last two seasons (126 in 2015, 124 in 2016). Jewell was named Walter Camp, Lott IMPACT, and Bednarik Award national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 24-3 win over Wyoming on Sept. 2. Jewell led Iowa with 14 tackles, including seven solo stops. His totals included two sacks, 2.5 tackles for loss, and one pass break-up. His QB pressure late in the game led to Iowa's second interception. The Big Ten Player of the Week recognition was the first for Jewell.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 19th season as head football coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is sixth with 138 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 82 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 129-71 (.645) overall mark and a 78-49 (.614) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 11 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 138-92 (.600) and an 82-63 (.565) mark in Big Ten games. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 150-113 (.570). He had an overall record of 12-21 at Maine from 1990-92.
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's first-year offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ AMONG B1G LEADERS, CLOSING ON FRY

Kirk Ferentz has 138 overall wins and 82 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 82 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz's 138 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank sixth in league history and second all-time at Iowa. He is five wins from tying Hayden Fry as the Hawkeyes' all-time winningest football coach.

Both Ferentz (138, 82) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top seven in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 19th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State, and 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title.

Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

THE SERIES

Saturday will be the 27th meeting between Iowa and Penn State, and the first meeting in Iowa City since 2012. The Nittany Lions have won the last three meetings and hold a 14-12 advantage in the series.

- Prior to the Hawkeyes' loss at #12 Penn State last year, Iowa had won four straight meetings when Penn State entered the game ranked (2010, 24-3 vs. #22 PSU; 2009, 21-10 at #5 PSU; 2008, 24-23 vs. #3 PSU; 2002, 42-35 OT at #12 PSU). Iowa is 6-12 all-time when playing a ranked Penn State team. The Hawkeyes are 1-1 when playing the Nittany Lions under the lights at Kinnick Stadium (W, 24-3 in 2010; L, 38-14 in 2012).
- The Hawkeyes have won six of the last 10 and hold a 9-8 advantage since 1993 when the Nittany Lions joined the Big Ten Conference. Iowa is 5-8 in games played in Iowa City.
- The teams first met Nov. 15, 1930, with Iowa winning 19-0 in Iowa City. PSU won five in a row, as Iowa didn't defeat PSU again until 1976.
- Both teams have had a five-game winning streak in the series. Penn State won each game played between 1971 and 1975. Iowa's longest streak in the series began with a double-overtime win in 2000 and included wins from 2000-04. The teams did not meet in 2005 and 2006.
- The teams have played two overtime games, both at Penn State. Iowa won in two overtimes in 2000 (26-23) and in single overtime in 2002 (42-35).

LAST MEETING - Nov. 5, 2016 (University Park, Pennsylvania)

Iowa lost its first road game in nearly two years, falling to No. 12 Penn State, 41-14, at Beaver Stadium. Penn State's win snapped Iowa's school-record nine-game road win streak.

Iowa was unable to slow down a Penn State offense that totaled 599 yards and 24 first downs.

The Hawkeyes, who entered the game averaging 168 yards rushing per game, were limited to 30 yards rushing on 26 attempts. RB Akrum Wadley was Iowa's leading rusher with 28 yards on nine carries.

Penn State scored on four of its six first-half possessions. The home team scored the only points of the first quarter on a Saeed Blacknall 19-yard touchdown reception from quarterback Trace McSorley.

The Nittany Lions threatened again on their second offensive possession, but Hawkeye LB Josey Jewell got a hand on Tyler Davis' 30-yard field goal attempt to block the kick. The block was the first of Jewell's career.

Penn State stretched its lead to 21-0 following a Saquon Barkley 57-yard scoring run and a McSorley 1-yard run.

Iowa trimmed the deficit to 21-7 on its final drive of the first half. QB C.J. Beathard connected with Wadley for a 12-yard touchdown on a screen pass.

The Nittany Lions drained the final 4:13 of the second quarter, which culminated with a 30-yard field goal as time expired to give the home team a 24-7 halftime advantage.

Penn State scored a field goal in the third quarter and added two touchdowns in the fourth period.

Beathard tossed his second touchdown of the contest with 6:30 remaining, finding Jemini Smith over the middle for a 36-yard touchdown.

Smith matched a career high with five catches for 85 yards and a score, while Beathard completed 16-of-24 for 204 yards and two touchdowns.

Defensively, FS Brandon Snyder led the Hawkeyes with a game-high 12 tackles, including two for loss. Jewell had 10 stops, his fifth double-digit tackle effort of the season.

HAWKEYES AT NIGHT

Iowa has hosted 14 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 10-4 record in those contests. The Hawkeyes have won four straight night games in Kinnick Stadium, including two games in both 2015 and 2016. Below is a list of night games in Kinnick Stadium:

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

In a tradition that started at the University of Iowa football team's season opener in 2017, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital will exchange waves at the end of the first quarter.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southwest grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

The wave highlights the relationship between the football team and the hospital. The Hawkeyes' "Touchdowns for Kids" campaign has long been a fundraiser and during every game, a "Kid Captain" from the hospital receives special recognition from the Hawkeye football program.

STANLEY MAKING HISTORY

QB Nate Stanley has 10 touchdown passes over the last three games, Iowa's best three-game stretch since Chuck Hartlieb threw 11 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1987. Chuck Long threw 12 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1985.

Stanley threw three touchdowns in his first career start Week 1. The last quarterback to do that was Ricky Stanzi (3, vs. Florida Atlantic in 2008). Since, 1999, the only other quarterback to throw three or more touchdowns in his first career start under Ferentz was Jon Beutjer (4, at Indiana in 2000).

Stanley threw for five touchdowns and 333 yards against Iowa State in Week 2, becoming the first Iowa quarterback with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus touchdown passes since Chuck Hartlieb vs. Northwestern in 1987.

Stanley had zero career completions when he was intercepted on his third pass attempt of the season. He has since completed 51-of-80 (63.8) attempts for 10 touchdowns and zero interceptions

HAWKEYES RETURN NATION'S TOP OFFENSIVE LINE UNIT

Seniors Ike Boettger (LT, LG, RT), Boone Myers (LT, LG), and Sean Welsh (RG, RT); juniors James Daniels (C), Lucas LeGrand (C), and Keegan Render (LG, RG); and sophomore Levi Paulsen (RG) all started at least one game for an offensive line that won the Joe Moore Award in 2016. The Joe Moore Award honors offensive line units that display a high level of toughness, effort, teamwork, consistency, technique, and "finishing". It is the only major college football award to honor a unit.

The Hawkeyes were selected over national runner-up Alabama and third-ranked Ohio State. Iowa was selected by a voting committee comprised solely of people who played or coached the offensive line position, including all of the current offensive line coaches at the Division I/FBS level as well as former players, coaches and colleagues of Coach Moore, and select media. Iowa's offense averaged 171.8 rushing yards per game -- averaging 4.5 yards per carry, and more than two yards before contact -- and 325 yards total offense per game.

1,000-YARD RUSHERS

The Hawkeyes are the only FBS team with two players that rushed for 1,000-plus yards in 2016. Senior RB Akrum Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) in 2016, and senior RB James Butler rushed for 1,336 yards as a junior at Nevada in 2016.

In 2017, Wadley leads the Hawkeyes with 258 yards on 60 carries. Butler ranks second on the team with 158 yards on 36 carries.

FRESH LEGS

Running backs Toren Young and Ivory Kelly-Martin carried the ball for the first time in their careers Week 3 when RB Akrum Wadley and RB James Butler each left the North Texas game with injuries.

Young, a redshirt freshman, finished the game with a team-high 19 carries for a team-best 78 yards. Kelly-Martin, a true freshman, finished with 74 yards on 11 carries and two touchdowns (2, 6). Kelly-Martin is the first Iowa true freshman with two-plus rush TD in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (vs Missouri).

The rookies combined for 152 yards on 30 carries and two rushing touchdowns. Iowa's seniors, Wadley and Butler, had 98 yards rushing on 24 carries.

WADLEY PURSUES RARE FEAT

Senior RB Akrum Wadley has 258 yards rushing in 2017. He rushed for 1,081 yards in 2016, and with another 1,000-yard campaign he could become the fourth Hawkeye in program history to produce back-to-back 1,000-yard rushing seasons, and the first since Fred Russell went back-to-back in 2002 (1,355) and 2003 (1,264). The other Hawkeyes with back-to-back 1,000-yard seasons include Sedrick Shaw (1,002 in 1994, 1,477 in 1995, 1,116 in 1996) and Ladell Betts (1,090 in 2000 and 1,060 in 2001). Wadley is tied for 19th in career scoring with 144 points.

BRIAN FERENTZ IMPACT ON OFFENSE

Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye football team captain and three-year letterman for the University of Iowa football team, was named Iowa's offensive coordinator on Jan. 9, 2017. He also coaches Iowa's running backs.

In his first three games as offensive coordinator:

- QB Nathan Stanley has thrown 10 touchdown passes, the best three-game stretch since 1987.
- Iowa has scored in 11 straight quarters plus one overtime period. The only quarter Iowa was shutout this season was the first quarter of the season opener against Wyoming.
- Iowa has five touchdown drives 87 yards or longer. Iowa had two scoring drives 87 yards or longer in 2016.
- Iowa has nine touchdown drives of 10 plays or more. Iowa had six such drives in 2016.
- Iowa's second-year tight ends, sophomore Noah Fant and redshirt freshman T.J. Hockenson, have 12 combined receptions, each resulting in a touchdown (4) or first down (8).
- Iowa's time of possession against North Texas was 40:45, the second highest under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa ranks sixth in the country averaging 35:35 in time of possession.
- Iowa had 29 first downs at Iowa State, tied for second most in Kirk Ferentz era, and 28 first downs against North Texas, tied for fifth in the Kirk Ferentz era. The 57 combined first downs is the highest total in back-to-back games in the Kirk Ferentz era.

Ferentz, the eldest son of UI head coach Kirk Ferentz, was an Iowa offensive lineman from 2011-15. He joined the Iowa coaching staff in 2012, serving as offensive line coach and adding the title of run-game coordinator in 2015.

In 2016, Iowa's offensive line was the recipient of the Joe Moore Award, which goes to the best offensive line in college football. Due to injuries, Iowa was forced to use seven starting combinations on the offensive line, but the Hawkeyes were able to produce two 1,000-yard rushers in the same season for the first time in program history. The Hawkeyes were also a finalist for the Joe Moore Award in 2015.

Under Ferentz's direction, left tackle Brandon Scherff won the 2014 Outland Trophy, was the Rimington-Pace Offensive Lineman of the Year in the Big Ten; and earned unanimous consensus All-America honors. Scherff was the fifth player selected in the 2015 NFL Draft (Washington Redskins), while right tackle Andrew Donnal was selected by the St. Louis Rams in the fourth round. Center Austin Blythe was selected in the 2016 NFL Draft (Indianapolis).

Ferentz joined the Hawkeye staff after spending four years with the NFL's New England Patriots. He has been recognized by ESPN.com as one of the top assistant coaches in the Big Ten Conference under the age of 40. Prior to joining the Hawkeyes staff, Ferentz worked under Patriots head coach Bill Belichick and current Houston Texans head coach Bill O'Brien, serving as New England's tight ends coach in 2011, helping the Patriots win the AFC championship and a spot in the 2012 Super Bowl. He was an offensive assistant coach in 2010, working exclusively with the tight ends.

WALLACE, WOODS ADD COORDINATOR TITLES

Tight ends coach LeVar Woods added the title of special teams coordinator in 2017. Woods had assisted with special teams since joining the coaching staff in 2012.

Linebackers coach Seth Wallace added the title of assistant defensive coordinator in 2017. Wallace was defensive coordinator at Valdosta State before joining the Hawkeye coaching staff in 2014. He was recruiting coordinator his first two seasons. He coached defensive backs in 2015 and has coached linebackers since 2016.

COPELAND, O'KEEFE, POLASEK JOIN COACHING STAFF

Iowa has three new faces on the 2017 coaching staff. Kelton Copeland coaches the Hawkeye receivers after spending the past four years at Northern Illinois. Ken O'Keefe is back on staff as quarterbacks coach. O'Keefe was Iowa's offensive coordinator from 1999-2011 and Iowa's quarterbacks coach from 2000-11. Tim Polasek, Iowa's offensive line coach, spent the past three seasons as North Dakota State's offensive coordinator.

RB Akrum Wadley is the 15th player in program history to rush for 2,000 career yards. He has 344 career carries for 2,021 rushing yards. Among the 15 career 2,000 yard rushers in program history, Wadley ties Tavian Banks and Shonn Greene for best average yards per carry (5.9).

THIS, THAT AND THE OTHER

RB Akrum Wadley ranks No. 3 in the Big Ten and No. 13 nationally averaging 170.0 all-purpose yards per game. Through three games, he has 258 yards rushing, 152 yards receiving, and 100 yards on kick returns. He has 2,681 career all-purpose yards, 18th most in program history (2,021 rush, 560 receiving, 100 KO returns).

ANOTHER HYPHEN OUT WIDE

In his first career start on Sept. 9, true freshman WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette had four receptions for 36 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winning five-yard touchdown reception in overtime. He is 170 receptions from tying Kevonte Martin-Manley's all-time receptions record (174).

Smith-Marsette is the fourth true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at wide receiver. Jerminic Smith started two games in 2015, Matt VandeBerg started two games in 2013, and Dominique Douglas started 11 games in 2006.

GRADUATE NEWCOMERS

Graduate transfers RB James Butler and WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes in fall training camp after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

Butler has 36 carries for 158 yards in 2017. He rushed for 1,336 yards and 12 touchdowns as a junior in 2016, and was a two-time All-Mountain West honorable mention selection. The senior has one year of eligibility remaining. He is a native of Bloomingdale, Illinois.

Quarells has not seen action in 2017. He played in 13 games in 2016, catching 11 balls for 180 yards and one touchdown in the Lobos' triple option offense. The junior has two years of eligibility remaining. He is a native of St. Louis.

WADLEY NAMED TO PAUL HORNUNG AWARD HONOR ROLL

RB Akrum Wadley was named to the Paul Hornung Award Honor Roll following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State Saturday. Wadley was one of five players nationally to earn the recognition. The Hornung Award is presented annually by the Louisville Sports Commission to the most versatile player in major college football.

Wadley accounted for 260 all-purpose yards against the Cyclones. He is averaging 170 all-purpose yards per game, third best in the Big Ten and 12th nationally.

Wadley rushed for 118 yards and one touchdown on a career-best 28 attempts, and had four receptions for 72 yards and one touchdown. He also added three kickoff returns for 70 yards. Wadley scored on a one-yard run to give Iowa a 21-10 advantage in the third quarter. He later hauled in a short pass from quarterback Nate Stanley and turned the play into a 46-yard scoring play that tied the game in the final two minutes of the fourth quarter.

STANLEY NAMED BIG CO-OFFENSIVE PLAYER OF THE WEEK

QB Nate Stanley was named Big Ten Conference co-Offensive Player of the Week following Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. He was also one of eight quarterbacks nationally named the Manning Award "Star of the Week." Stanley completed 27-of-41 pass attempts for 333 yards and five touchdowns, with no interceptions. His scoring passes covered 10, 17, 15, 46 and 5 yards, as nine Hawkeyes had at least one reception.

Stanley led the Iowa offense on four scoring drives of at least 89 yards. Iowa's final scoring drive in the closing minutes of the fourth quarter covered 89 yards in just seven plays as the Hawkeyes tied the game with 1:52 remaining. Stanley then completed 2-of-3 passes for 15 yards in overtime, including the game-winning touchdown after Iowa State had scored a field goal on its overtime possession.

Stanley established career highs in completions (27), attempts (41), yards (333), and touchdowns (5). He had eight touchdown passes in his first two career starts (10 in three

games), more than any other quarterback in the Kirk Ferentz era. Stanley became only the second Big Ten quarterback in the last 20 years with 300-plus passing yards, five-plus touchdown passes and no interceptions in a road game.

The Big Ten honor was the first career honor for Stanley.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 17 players in its 2017 Leadership Group. The group includes five seniors, four juniors, four sophomores, two redshirt freshmen, and two true freshmen. The Leadership Group will vote on the weekly gameday captains, be involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provide feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors DL Nathan Bazata, LB Josey Jewell, LB Ben Niemann, WR Matt VandeBerg, OL Sean Welsh, juniors OL James Daniels, DE Parker Hesse, DB Brandon Snyder, and QB Tyler Wieggers, sophomores LB Amani Jones, DE Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nathan Stanley, redshirt freshmen LB Nick Niemann and RB Toren Young, and first-year freshmen DE A.J. Epenesa and OL Tristan Wirfs.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2017. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his sixth year on staff and first as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, is in his 10th year on the Iowa staff, his third coaching tight ends after coaching linebackers for three seasons. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. Woods rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13 before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with the Hawkeye special teams.

VANDEBERG RETURNS FOR 5th YEAR

Senior WR Matt VandeBerg missed Iowa's final nine games of 2016 due to a foot injury sustained in practice on Sept. 26. VandeBerg (6-1, 190), played in the first four games of the season, leading the team in receptions, receiving yards, and receiving touchdowns (19-284-3 TDs) before the injury.

On Dec. 21, the Big Ten Conference granted the University of Iowa's medical hardship waiver request on behalf of VandeBerg and granted the wide receiver a fifth year of eligibility.

VandeBerg has 114 career receptions, 13th most in program history. He has 1,382 career receiving yards, 25th in program history.

RUN AFTER HANDOFF, RUN AFTER CATCH, RETURN FOR SENIOR SEASON

Senior RB Akrum Wadley announced on Jan. 5 he would return to Iowa for his senior season. Wadley led the Hawkeyes in rushing yards (1,081) and all-purpose yards (1,396), and ranked second in receptions (36) in 2016. All three totals were career highs. He scored 13 touchdowns, tied for sixth in the Big Ten, and was named third team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranks 15th in career rushing yards (2,021) and is tied for 19th in career scoring (144 points).

He combined for 25 catches, 199 yards receiving, and two receiving touchdowns the final six weeks of 2016. He posted career bests in receptions (7) and receiving yards (72) in Week 8 against Wisconsin, and shared the team lead with five receptions in Week 9 at Penn State (32 yards, TD). He led Iowa with five catches, 52 receiving yards, and scored the team's only touchdown (3-yard reception) against Michigan.

Wadley rushed 22 times for 115 yards against Florida at the 2017 Outback Bowl, exceeding the 1,000-yard mark for the first time in his career.

NEW JERSEY PREPS LEAVE MARK ON CY-HAWK SERIES

Senior RB Akrum Wadley and true freshman WR Iimir Smith-Marsette, both graduates of Weequahic (WEEK-way) High School in Newark, New Jersey, combined for four touchdowns in Iowa's 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. Wadley turned a short crossing route into a 46-yard touchdown reception in the final minutes of the fourth quarter to tie the game, 38-38, and Smith-Marsette caught a five-yard touchdown pass in the first overtime to win the game, 44-41.

Wadley completed the game with 118 rushing yards on a career-high 28 attempts, four receptions for 72 yards and three KO returns for 70 yards. Smith-Marsette finished his first career start with four receptions, 36 yards, and two touchdowns, including a 15-yard diving score in the fourth quarter, and one rushing attempt for seven yards.

GRADUATE STUDENT-ATHLETES

Eight Hawkeyes completed their undergraduate degrees prior to the 2017 season. Seniors OL Ike Boettger, DL Daniel Gaffey, FB Drake Kulick, WR Matt VandeBerg, and TE Jon Wisnieski, and junior DL Parker Hesse all earned undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. Senior RB James Butler and junior WR Matt Quarells joined the Hawkeyes after earning their degrees from Nevada and New Mexico, respectively.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 15 of the last 16 seasons.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 312 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had eight individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 57-37 (.606) since 2010.
- Part of the Hawkeyes' long term success is due to the stability in the program. Iowa has had just two head coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is leading the program for the 19th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.

BLACK FRIDAY

Iowa and Nebraska will meet on Black Friday, the day after Thanksgiving, for the seventh consecutive season. The teams have split the last six meetings on Black Friday. The schools have played on Black Friday every year since Nebraska joined the Big Ten Conference. This season, for the first time since the rivalry was resumed, the game will kickoff at 3 p.m. (CT) and be televised on FS1.

The two teams meet on Black Friday in 2018 and 2019, but the Big Ten Conference announced Sept. 12 that the teams will move off of their Black Friday date in 2020 and 2021. Iowa will close both seasons against Wisconsin, while Minnesota will close the regular season against Minnesota.

TROPHY GAMES

The Hawkeyes have four trophy games on the schedule in 2017. Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk trophy with a 44-41 overtime win at Iowa State on Sept. 9. The Hawkeyes will defend the Floyd of Rosedale trophy against Minnesota at Kinnick Stadium on Oct. 28, and the Heroes Trophy on Nov. 24 at Nebraska. Iowa will try to regain possession of the Heartland Trophy at Wisconsin on Nov. 11.



HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 26 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 26 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- Since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach, 120 former Hawkeyes have played in the NFL.
- Five former Hawkeyes are playing offensive tackle in the NFL in 2017, tying for the most of any school at that position (Florida).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa's streak of 40 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- Over the past 15 years, 137-of-154 (89 percent) of Iowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 10 years, Iowa has had 33 NFL Draft picks, second only to Ohio State (49) and tied with Penn State and Wisconsin.
- Since 2010, Iowa has had 30 players drafted in the NFL. Among Big Ten teams, only Ohio State has had more draft picks in that same time span (46). Michigan has also had 30 players selected in the NFL draft since 2010.
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last eight NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015. Only Ohio State (7) and Wisconsin (5) have more among Big Ten schools.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Entering the 2017 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team.
- All 11 members of Iowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the drafts.
- Six senior members of Iowa's 2016 team are on NFL opening day rosters, including, QB C.J. Beathard, OL Cole Croston, DL Jaleel Johnson, DB Desmond King, TE George Kittle and DB Greg Mabin.



FIND THE NFL-ER

Cole Croston, a free agent signed by the New England Patriots following the 2017 NFL draft, made the team's 53-man roster, meaning the Hawkeyes have had a future NFL player on their offensive line in each of Kirk Ferentz' 18 completed seasons. Croston split time at both tackles positions for the Hawkeyes in 2016.

Austin Blythe, a four-year Iowa starter and seventh-round selection of the Indianapolis Colts in 2016, was the 15th offensive linemen selected in the NFL draft since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as UI head coach.

From 2007-14, an eventual NFL first-round draft pick started on the Iowa offensive line. Brandon Scherff, selected by the Washington Redskins fifth overall in 2015, was Iowa's left tackle from 2012-14. Riley Reiff, selected 23rd overall by the Detroit Lions in 2012, started at left tackle from 2010-11. Bryan Bulaga, selected 23rd overall by the Green Bay Packers in 2010, started at left guard in 2007 before moving to left tackle in 2008-09.

From 2005-06, Baltimore Ravens All-Pro Marshal Yanda shared time at tackle and guard for the Hawkeyes. Mike Elgin, a seventh round selection of New England, was Iowa's starting center in 2004. Pete McMahon, drafted by Oakland in 2005, was Iowa's right guard in 2003. Oakland's first round pick in 2004, Robert Gallery, was Iowa's left tackle from 2001-03. Eric Steinbach (Cincinnati) started at guard for Iowa from 2000-02, and Bruce Nelson (Carolina) was a four-year starter from 1999-02. Steinbach and Nelson were second round draft picks in 2003.

KIRK FERENTZ RADIO SHOW

Iowa Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 14th season in 2017.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to 11 a.m. kickoffs, and four hours prior to the start of afternoon and night games. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's 2017 roster of 121 players includes 57 players from the state of Iowa. The roster includes 21 players from Illinois; nine from Wisconsin; six from Michigan; four from Maryland; three from Florida, New Jersey, South Dakota, and Texas; two from Missouri, Nebraska, and Ohio; and one from Georgia, Indiana, Kansas, Minnesota, Mississippi, Missouri, North Carolina, and Pennsylvania.

IOWA GAME DAY INFORMATION

The University of Iowa has implemented changes intended to improve the safety and game day experience for fans attending Iowa football home games at Kinnick Stadium this fall. Changes include, but are not limited to, a partial closure of Hawkins Drive, a postgame two-lane traffic pattern on Melrose Avenue, single-game ADA parking, and information regarding the UI Hawkeye Marching Band pregame performance in the Recreation Building. CHAD GREENWAY IS ANF HONOREE

The Iowa Farm Bureau and University of Iowa are teaming up to celebrate Iowa's farmers for the seventh annual America Needs Farmers (ANF) Game Day Saturday when Iowa hosts Penn State.

Former Iowa linebacker Chad Greenway is the sixth recipient of the ANF Wall of Honor, which salutes former University of Iowa football players who exemplify the tenacity, work ethic, and character of the Iowa farmer. Previous recipients include Casey Wiegmann (2012), Jared DeVries (2013), Bruce Nelson (2014), Robert Gallery (2015), and Dallas Clark (2016). ANF was launched during the Hawkeyes' 1985 Rose Bowl season by head coach Hayden Fry, when the Farm Crisis of the 1980's was hitting the Heartland exceptionally hard. A gold ANF decal on the Hawkeye helmets is the effort's signature. This year marks the 32nd anniversary of ANF, a longstanding tribute to America's farmers. GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the final 24 points in a 24-3 season-opening victory over Wyoming in Kinnick Stadium. The Hawkeyes improved to 3-0 all-time against the Cowboys.

Wyoming scored the first points of the game on a Cooper Rothe 49-yard field goal. The Cowboys forced four Hawkeye turnovers, however the field goal was the only points of the day the Iowa defense surrendered.

Iowa closed the half with touchdown passes of two and 27 yards from QB Nate Stanley to TE Noah Fant.

Stanley threw his third touchdown in the third period, connecting with WR Nick Easley on a 45-yard strike to extend Iowa's advantage to 21-3. Easley finished the game with a game-best 77 catches on four receptions.

Miguel Recinos split the uprights from 44 yards in the fourth quarter.

Stanley's three touchdown passes are the most by a Hawkeye in a season opener since Drew Tate had six against Montana in 2006. The sophomore signal caller finished the contest completing 8-of-15 passes for 125 yards.

RB Akrum Wadley rushed 24 times for a game-high 116 yards. The senior tailback topped the 100-yard rushing plateau for the 10th time in his career. Wadley is the second player in the Kirk Ferentz era to rush for 100-plus yards in back-to-back season openers (Fred Russell, 2002-03).

Iowa's defense held Wyoming to 233 total yards, including 59 yards rushing, sacked quarterback Josh Allen seven times, and intercepted him twice. CB Josh Jackson and DL Brady Reiff each recorded their first career interceptions in the fourth quarter. Wyoming did not run a single play in the red zone and was just six of 20 on third and fourth down conversion attempts.

Iowa's linebacking trio of Josey Jewell, Ben Niemann, and Bo Bower combined for 38 tackles. Niemann's 13 stops are a career high, while Jewell had a game-best 14 tackles, including two sacks, and Bower had 11. Jewell was named Walter Camp national and Big Ten Conference Defensive Player of the Week for his efforts.

Iowa used nine first-time starters in the season opener, six on offense and three on defense.

GAME RECAP

Iowa rallied from a 10-point fourth quarter deficit to edge in-state rival Iowa State 44-41 (OT) for the third straight time at Jack Trice Stadium. The Hawkeyes retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy.

Trailing 38-31, QB Nate Stanley drove the Hawkeyes 89 yards in seven plays for the game-tying score with 1:09 remaining in the fourth quarter. Stanley connected with RB Akrum Wadley, who dodged five defenders before reaching the end zone from 46 yards to even the score, 38-38.

Iowa's defense held the Cyclones to a 30-yard field goal on the first possession of overtime before Stanley threw a dart to WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette for a 5-yard TD and the win.

Stanley completed 27-of-41 passes to nine different targets for 333 yards with five touchdowns and no interceptions. He is the first Iowa QB with 300-plus passing yards and five-plus TD passes since Chuck Hartlieb versus Northwestern in 1987. Stanley engineered four touchdown drives over 89 yards, three of which covered 91 yards or more. His efforts earned the sophomore signal caller Big Ten Co-Offensive Player of the Week honors.

Wadley amassed a game-best 260 yards of total offense, rushing the ball 28 times for 118 yards and a score and catching four passes for 72 yards and a touchdown. He added 70 yards on three kickoff returns.

In his first career start, Smith-Marsette had four receptions for 36 yards and two touchdowns, including the game-winner. He also had one rush for seven yards. WR Nick Easley is the first player under Kirk Ferentz to have a TD reception in each of his first two career games. He had a career and team-high seven receptions for 48 yards and one touchdown. WR Matt VandeBerg had three receptions for 42 yards and one touchdown. He is the only player in the Ferentz era to have a receiving TD in three different games against the Cyclones.

Five Hawkeyes set career highs in tackles: DE Parker Hesse (7), FS Jake Gervase (6), DB Josh Jackson (6), DB Michael Ojemudia (4), and DE Sam Brincks (3). Josey Jewell shared the team lead in tackles with seven. In addition to his seven tackles, Hesse intercepted his second career pass at the line of scrimmage, which led to a field goal to tie the game, 31-31, with 5:16 left in the fourth period.

The game featured three ties and three lead changes. A combined 31 points were scored in the fourth quarter (17 by Iowa; 14 by Iowa State).

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored 21 unanswered second-half points in registering a 31-14 victory over North Texas inside Kinnick Stadium to remain unbeaten. The Hawkeyes begin the season 3-0 for the seventh time under head coach Kirk Ferentz.

The Hawkeyes' ground attack stifled the Mean Green; Iowa rushed 59 times for 238 yards. Iowa maintained possession for 40:45, the second most under Ferentz (Kent State, 2004).

North Texas capitalized on two Iowa personal foul penalties on its final drive of the first half, resulting in a 13-yard TD pass to take a 14-10 advantage over the home team at half.

It was all Hawkeyes in the second half as Iowa scored touchdowns on its first three possessions, while its fourth possession ended with the Hawkeyes in victory formation at the 2-yard line. All four of Iowa's touchdown drives were 10 plays or more, with its third score covering 87 yards in 8:50.

QB Nate Stanley completed 16-of-27 passes for 197 yards and two touchdowns. The sophomore signal caller has thrown 10 touchdowns over the first three games, the best three-game stretch in the Ferentz era. It is Iowa's best three-game stretch since Chuck Hartlieb threw 11 touchdowns over a three-game stretch in 1987.

Iowa had three players rush for 70 yards or more: Toren Young (19 carries, 78 yards), Ivory Kelly-Martin (11 attempts, 74 yards, 2 TDs), and James Butler (16 carries, 74 yards). Kelly-Martin and Young each carried the ball for the first time in their careers. Kelly-Martin is the first true freshman with two rushing touchdowns in a game since Marcus Coker in 2010 (Missouri).

RB Akrum Wadley had two catches for a team-best 80 yards and rushed eight times for 24 yards. His 3-yard rush in the first quarter pushed the senior tailback over 2,000 career yards. Wadley left the game in the second period and did not return due to injury.

Tight ends T.J. Hockensen (8 yards) and Noah Fant (23 yards) caught Iowa's first two touchdowns.

Defensively, Josh Jackson blocked a field goal, intercepted his second pass of the season, had two pass break-ups and was credited with three tackles.
