THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa soccer team will start the 2009 season by hosting the Missouri Tigers. The match will begin at 7 p.m. at the Iowa Soccer Complex. The match is the first of three consecutive home matches for the Hawkeyes, who host Montana (Aug. 28) and South Dakota State (Aug. 30).

SCOUTING MISSOURI

Missouri finished the 2008 season with a 16-5-2 record, including a Big-12 Conference championship. The Tigers advanced to the NCAA tournament, where they fell to Illinois in a second round, double-overtime battle, 1-0.

Head Coach Bryan Blitz is in his 14th season at Mizzou. He welcomes first year assistant coaches Todd Shulenberger and Shaunna Daugherty.

Missouri returns their leading scorer, Alysha Bonnicks, who recorded 11 goals last season. Also returning for the Tigers is goalkeeper Tasha Dittamore, who made 80 saves in 2008.

Iowa fell to Mizzou 2-1 in Columbia. Friday's match marks the eighth all-time meeting between the Hawkeyes and Tigers, with Missouri leading 7-0.

LAST SEASON

The Hawkeyes are returning to action after a second-straight appearance in the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa finished the season with a 9-11-1 record. Iowa returns nine starters and 22 letterwinners.

Hawkeye Soccer Notes

COMING BACK

Seniors **Alex Seydel** and **Jackie Kaeding**, both of whom have started every match in the careers at Iowa, return for their final season to lead the Hawkeyes. Combined, the duo has played and started 102 games at Iowa.

Also returning for the Hawkeyes are leading scorers **Alyssa Cosnek** and **Keli McLaughlin**. Cosnek scored seven goals and McLaughlin had nine which accounted for over half of Iowa's goals in 2008.

In goal, **Emily Moran** is back after a great freshman campaign, recording 74 saves and two shutouts. **Kali Feiereisel** is back for the Hawkeyes after suffering a season-ending injury last year. In 13 games played, Feiereisel recorded 25 saves and four wins.

POSTSEASON PLAY

Iowa returned to the Big Ten Tournament last year for the second-straight year. The Hawkeyes hosted the conference championship in November, where Penn State defeated Iowa 2-1 in first round action.

BIG TEN TOURNAMENT

The Big Ten Conference has decided not to hold a tournament this year. The Big Ten Conference and the coaches decided to add games to the regular season schedule and omit a post season tournament in hopes of advancing more teams to the NCAA tournament.

LOCAL STANDOUTS

This year's squad includes nine players from Iowa, including eight from eastern Iowa (Cedar Rapids, Coralville and Iowa City).

Freshmen **Rachel Spellerberg**, **Jade Grimm** and **Katherine Lewis** played for the same high school, Kennedy, in Cedar Rapids.

Sophomores **Suzu Levett** and **Morgan Showalter** were also high school teammates at Xavier high school in Cedar Rapids.

Jackie Kaeding and **Gabrielle Ainsworth** are natives of Coralville, while **Kelsey Sandon** and **Jenny Kahler** are from Des

Moines.

Head Coach **Ron Rainey** came to Iowa in 2006 when the team only had four lowans on the roster.

The nine lowans on the roster are the most since the 2003 squad, which also had nine lowans.

HAWKEYES ON THE BTN

The Hawkeyes will make it's lone appearance on the Big Ten Network on October 4 when they entertain Wisconsin at 1 p.m.

NEWCOMERS

Gabrielle Ainsworth, a defender from Coralville. Ainsworth attended Shattuck-St Mary's Academy in Faribault, MN, and played for Shattuck's U-18 team.

Stefani Campbell, a forward from Arlington, TX. Campbell was a captain her senior year and all-around District MVP as a midfielder.

Dana Dalrymple, a midfielder from Cincinnati, OH. Dalrymple was a three-time first team all-conference selection.

Jade Grimm, a forward from Cedar Rapids. Grimm was the Iowa High School Player of the Year as a sophomore and senior.

Emiy Jaffe, a midfielder from Ann Arbor, MI. Jaffe was a team captain her junior and senior season.

Katherine Lewis, a defender from Cedar Rapids. Lewis was on a state championship team three times in her high school career.

Alyscha Mottershead, a midfielder from Brampton, Ontario. Mottershead was captain of the Canadian National Team at 2008 FIFA U-17 World Cup.

Rachel Spellerberg, a goalkeeper from Cedar Rapids. Spellerberg was named to the all-tournament team at the state tournament all four years of her high school career.
