About Oklahoma State

- The Iowa series marks the final non-conference regular season games for the Cowboys, who enter the weekend with a 27-15-1 record. OSU has won five-straight Big 12 Conference series and sits in first place in the Big 12 standings by three games with a 15-3 league mark.
- OSU is coming off a 2017 season in which it made its fifth consecutive NCAA Regional appearance and posted a 30-27 record. The Cowboys went 8-14 in conference play a year ago to finish eighth in the standings but made history as the first-ever team to win the Big 12 Championship title as a No. 8 seed; OSU swept through the tourney field with a 4-0 mark.
- The Cowboys return six position players who started at least 30 games last season, while nine pitchers who combined for 16 wins return to the staff.
- The 2018 season marks OSU's sixth under head coach Josh Holliday, who is 227-121-1 at his alma mater.

About Iowa

- Iowa is 26-15 on the season, including a 15-5 mark on its home field, and in seventh place in the Big 10 standings with a 9-7 conference mark.
- Led by catcher Tyler Cromptley (.375, 8 HR, 38 RBI) and outfielder Robert Neustrom (.321, 8 HR, 26 RBI), the Hawkeyes own a .269 team batting average and are averaging nearly six runs per game.
- Iowa's pitching staff sports a 4.17 ERA and has recorded 379 strikeouts in 363.0 innings.
- Rick Heller is in his fifth season as Iowa's head coach and owns a 166-104 career record, along the way leading the Hawkeyes to two NCAA Regionals and a Big 10 championship. A head coaching veteran of more than three decades, Heller also had stints at Upper Iowa, Northern Iowa and Indiana State and owns a 856-669-4 all-time record.
- Iowa's starting pitching rotation vs. the Cowboys is expected to be:
Friday: LHP Nick Allgeyer — 5-3, 2.18 ERA in 11 starts; 67 K, 21 BB in 70.1 IP
Saturday: RHP Brady Schanuel — 5-6, 5.12 ERA in 11 starts; 57 K, 35 BB in 45.2 IP

Cowboys vs. Hawkeyes

Oklahoma State and Iowa have never met on the baseball diamond.

In The Polls

From March 4, 2013 to April 3, 2017, OSU was ranked in at least one national poll, a streak of 77 consecutive weeks. During that time, the Cowboys spent 18 weeks in the Top 10 and were ranked as high as No. 3 (by the NCBWA in 2014). They have finished in the top 10 in the final national polls twice in the last four seasons — 10th in 2014 and fourth in 2016 — and have ended the season in the top 10 in the national polls 20 times in program history. OSU entered the national rankings for the first time in 2018 on April 23. This week, the Cowboys checked in as high as No. 12 in the *Collegiate Baseball* poll.

High Five

OSU entered the 2018 season as the fifth-winningest team in NCAA history in terms of winning percentage at .663.

Oklahoma State began 2018 as one of only 25 programs in Division I history to reach 2,500 victories, beginning the year with 2,586 all-time wins to rank 15th all time. Of the 25 teams with 2,500 wins, only four have played fewer seasons than OSU's 106 (Florida State - 70; Miami (Fla.) - 73; Fresno State - 89; and Florida - 103).

Omaha

The Cowboys' coaching staff is no stranger to the College World Series, with Josh Holliday and Rob Walton combining for 11 CWS appearances as either a player or coach. Prior to leading his alma mater to Omaha in 2016, Holliday previously played on a pair of CWS teams at OSU (1996 & 1999) and coached in the CWS as an assistant at Georgia Tech (2006), Arizona State (2009) and Vanderbilt (2011). Holliday is one of only 17 people to reach the College World Series as both a player and head coach. Walton spent four seasons as a pitcher at OSU from 1983-86, and each of those teams appeared in the CWS.

HOFFers

Oklahoma State's coaching staff includes three hall of famers. Josh Holliday was inducted into the Cowboy Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003, while Rob Walton joined him in 2018; James Vilade is a member of the the University of Dallas Athletics Hall of Fame Class of 2011. Holliday's playing days for the Cowboys saw him hit .311 with 53 homers and 237 RBIs in 256 games, while Walton was 20-4 with a 3.74 ERA and 10 complete games in 54 appearances. Vilade spent four seasons as the head coach at UD and compiled a 118-52 record.

Josh Holliday

Head Coach,
Sixth Season

Josh Holliday returned home to Stillwater in 2012 poised to lead the Oklahoma State baseball program back to national prominence, and he has done just that over the last five years.

Holliday took over OSU baseball on June 8, 2012, when he was named the 15th head coach in program history. The Oklahoma State alumnus and native of Stillwater had served the previous three seasons as an assistant coach at Vanderbilt and established himself as one of the nation's top assistant coaches over a span of just over a decade.

Holliday's hire has paid huge and immediate dividends as he has led the OSU program back to national prominence in his first five seasons at the helm.

Since taking over the reins, Holliday has guided the Cowboys to five-straight NCAA Tournament appearances, a pair of Big 12 Conference championships, including the program's first-ever regular season title, two NCAA Super Regional berths and a return to the College World Series for the first time since his playing days in 1999. During Holliday's tenure, OSU has won 200 games, the second-highest win total among Big 12 teams during that span, and has finished first or second in the conference standings four times. Holliday began laying a foundation for success immediately and that culminated with the Cowboys returning to Omaha and the College World Series in 2016.

OSU's impressive '16 run saw the Pokes make their 20th College World Series appearance, and Holliday became one of only 17 people in NCAA history to reach the CWS as both a player and head coach after playing for OSU teams in 1996 and 1999 that advanced to Omaha.

Holliday, who was named the 2016 ABCA/Diamond Midwest Regional Coach of the Year, guided OSU to a 43-22 overall record, and the Cowboys finished the season ranked No. 4 in the final national polls.

Holliday is the first former OSU player to serve as the program's head coach. A four-year letterwinner for the Cowboys from 1996-99, Holliday was a starter on Cowboy teams that made four NCAA Tournament appearances and reached the College World Series in 1996 and 1999.

During a career that spanned 256 games, which ranks second all time at OSU, Holliday compiled a career .311 batting average to go along with 53 home runs, 62 doubles and 237 RBIs. He was inducted into the OSU Baseball Hall of Fame in 2003.

Holliday was a three-time All-Big 12 performer, earning first-team honors in 1998 (at catcher) and 1999 (at third base). He was a second-team selection as a utility player in 1997 and was named the Big Eight Conference Freshman of the Year and a Freshman All-American in 1996.

Holliday was selected in the 1999 Major League Baseball Draft by Toronto in the ninth round and spent two years in the Blue Jays organization. Following his professional baseball career, Holliday returned to Stillwater and joined the OSU coaching staff, where he served as an assistant for three seasons. He was a student assistant in 2001 before joining the full-time staff the following year.

Holliday left Stillwater to continue his coaching career in 2004, and over an 11-year span, he served as an assistant coach at some of the nation's top baseball programs, serving stints on the staffs at North Carolina State, Georgia Tech, Arizona State and Vanderbilt. He coached on seven NCAA Tournament teams and three of those advanced to the College World Series (Georgia Tech in 2006, Arizona State in 2009 and Vanderbilt in 2011).

Baseball In Their Blood

Baseball — and Oklahoma State — is a family affair for Josh Holliday.

Josh's father, Tom, served as an OSU assistant coach for 19 years then took over as the Cowboys' head coach from 1997-2003, leading the program to a College World Series appearance in 1999 (and coaching Josh in his final three college seasons). Tom spent four decades as a collegiate coach and was inducted into the OSU Cowboy Baseball Hall of Fame in 2016.

Josh's younger brother, Matt, is a Major League Baseball veteran who has been named to seven All-Star teams in his 13 career seasons.

Josh's uncle, Dave Holliday, was an OSU assistant coach from 1981-87 and has since held a variety of roles in Major League Baseball, including his current spot as a professional scout for the Atlanta Braves.

Home Sweet Home

Allie P. Reynolds Stadium has been home to Oklahoma State baseball since April 4, 1981, and in those 38 seasons, the Cowboys have been nearly unbeatable on their home field.

OSU is 926-236-1 (.797) all time at Reynolds Stadium and has lost more than two consecutive games on its home turf only nine times (six in a row in 2007; five straight in 2017; four in a row in 2016 and 2018; three straight in 2010, 2012, 2013, 2014 and 2017).

The Cowboys are 12-7-1 on their home field in 2018.

On The Road Again and Again and Again and Again and Again and Again and Again and Again and...

As has become commonplace, OSU opened Big 12 Conference play on the road in 2018. The Cowboys have begun league play at Allie P. Reynolds Stadium only twice since 2003 (in 2005 and 2013), with 13 road trips to start conference action during that span.

Since the start of Big 12 Conference baseball in 1997, the Cowboys have opened league play on the road 17 times and just six times in Stillwater.

Building A Winner

In the first five seasons as head coach at his alma mater, Josh Holliday built quite an impressive resume. Among the highlights:

- The Cowboys have earned five NCAA Regional berths, advanced to two Super Regionals and played in the College World Series for the first time since Holliday was a senior for the Cowboys in 1999.
- OSU finished first or second in the Big 12 Conference standings each season from 2013-16.
- The Cowboys finished in the top 10 in the national rankings in 2014 (10th) and 2016 (4th) after ending the 2013 season ranked as high as No. 19. In 2015, they were ranked as high as 17th in the final polls
- In 2014, OSU won its first-ever Big 12 Conference regular season championship, and the 2017 club captured the second Big 12 Championship title in program history.
- OSU hosted NCAA Regionals in 2014 and 2015 and was the top-seeded team both times.
- Holliday has coached 42 All-Big 12 performers, six All-Americans, two Big 12 Pitcher of the Year honorees and a Big 12 Player of the Year.

An All-American Streak

The Cowboys have had a player earn first-team All-American status in each of the last four years. The streak began with pitcher Brendan McCurry (2014), who was followed by pitchers Michael Freeman (2015) and Thomas Hatch (2016). Outfielder Garrett McCain extended the streak in 2017.

OSU has had 25 different players earn first-team All-America status in program history.

Close Calls

OSU is 56-34 in one-run games under Josh Holliday, and 59 of the Cowboys' 121 losses under Holliday have come by two runs or less.

In 2017, 13 of OSU's 22 conference games were decided by two runs or less; the Cowboys were 4-9 in those games with six one-run defeats and three two-run setbacks.

Armed & Dangerous

In five seasons under the direction of coach Rob Walton, OSU's pitching staff has turned in impressive numbers.

The Cowboys' success under Walton from 2013-17 includes 16 All-Big 12 pitchers, two consensus first-team All-Americans, two Big 12 Pitcher of the Year winners and a first-round Major League Baseball Draft pick.

Here's just a sampling of how the Cowboys have performed under Walton, who was named the 2016 ABCA/Baseball America Assistant Coach of the Year:

- Four of OSU's five pitching staffs under Walton recorded an ERA of 3.29 or lower.
- In 2016, the Cowboys led the Big 12 with 574 strikeouts, 10 shutouts and 21 saves, each totals that ranked as the second highest in a single season in school history.
- OSU's pitching staff led the Big 12 in ERA in conference-only games in 2014 (2.43) and 2015 (2.50).
- The Cowboys' 2.84 ERA in 2015 ranked eighth nationally and was the lowest by an OSU pitching staff since 1973.
- OSU recorded seven shutouts in 2013 and 2014 and had 10 in 2016, the second most in a single season in program history. Those totals also marked three of only six times in program history the Cowboys have tallied seven shutouts or more in a season; in the 26 seasons prior to 2013, OSU reached seven shutouts only once.
- Jason Hursh was a first-round pick in the 2013 MLB Draft, Brendan McCurry (2014) and Michael Freeman (2015) were first-team All-Americans and Freeman (2015) and Thomas Hatch (2016) were named Big 12 Pitcher of the Year.
- Freeman's 1.31 ERA ranked sixth in the NCAA in 2015 and was the fifth lowest in a single season in OSU history.
- McCurry set OSU records for single-season saves (19) and career saves (27).

Go Pro

During Josh Holliday's tenure as head coach, Oklahoma State has had 32 players selected in the Major League Baseball Draft. Eleven of those Cowboys were picked in the top 10 rounds, including 2013 first-rounder Jason Hursh.

In 2016, OSU tied a program record with 11 MLB Draft picks. (The 2007 Cowboys also had 11 draftees). The 11 draft picks tied the Cowboys with Mississippi State for the third most of any Division I program in 2016 behind only Texas A&M (13) and Southern California (12). Five of those went in the first 10 rounds, which marked the most top-10-round picks for OSU since five Pokes were taken in the top-10 rounds in 2008. Seven of the OSU players drafted were pitchers.

Like Kissing Your Sister

For the fifth time in program history and first time since 1985, Oklahoma State had a game end in a tie on March 18 against Seton Hall in Stillwater. Knotted at 3-3, the game officially ended with one out in the bottom of the eighth inning due to a weather delay and Seton Hall's travel curfew.

With Cowboy runners on second and third and one out, lightning was detected in the area. The game was delayed for 36 minutes and was just minutes from resuming before the lightning sirens went off again, causing the game to be halted and officially end in a tie due to the Pirates traveling to Oklahoma City to catch a flight.

The game marked the first ever at Allie P. Reynolds Stadium to end in a tie and marked OSU's first draw since the Cowboys tied Western Michigan in Lakeland, Fla., on March 4, 1985, in a contest called due to darkness.

Once In A Blue Moon

The Cowboys' back-to-back series sweeps against TCU and Kansas State marked the first time since 2014 and the second time under Josh Holliday that OSU has posted consecutive Big 12 series sweeps. The Pokes achieved the feat for the third time under Holliday with consecutive sweeps against Kansas and Oklahoma.

OSU also has a pair of seven-game winning streaks in Big 12 play this season, tying for the fourth longest Big 12 win streaks in program history. The streaks tied the 2014 OSU team for the longest ever under Holliday.

Tank Smash

Colin Simpson, aka "Tank", enjoyed a breakout sophomore season for the Cowboys in 2017. The catcher/DH collected honorable mention All-Big 12 honors and led OSU with 11 home runs while ranking third in RBIs (40) and slugging percentage (.492).

Simpson did the majority of his damage against Big 12 competition as in 22 conference games he hit .272 with seven homers and 23 RBIs — no other Cowboy had more than two homers or 19 RBIs in league play. During one stretch, Simpson went deep in four-straight Big 12 contests, including smacking two homers vs. West Virginia on April 2.

Simpson was named to the Big 12 Championship All-Tournament Team after hitting .368 (7-for-19) with two doubles, two homers and five RBIs in four tourney games.

Off to a strong start in 2018, Simpson is hitting .298 and leads the Big 12 with a career-best 14 homers. He also tops OSU in hits (50), RBIs (43), total bases (104) and slugging percentage (.619). He has started all 43 games for the Cowboys — 29 at catcher, eight as DH and six in left field.

Outfield Veteran

A constant in Josh Holliday's lineup card over the last three seasons has been outfielder Jon Littell. The senior is by far the Cowboys' most experienced player, having appeared in 174 games, and his 166 starts is 60 more than the next closest player on the OSU roster.

Littell has experience at both corner outfield spots as he's made 113 starts in left field and 53 in right field in his career.

A big reason why OSU has started Big 12 play with a 15-3 mark is Littell's bat — he's hitting .377 in conference play and has posted a .609 slugging percentage with six doubles, two triples, two homers and 17 RBIs.

At the plate, Littell caught fire in OSU's 2017 run to the College World Series as he was OSU's second-leading hitter in the NCAA tourney with a .379 batting average (11-for-29) in nine games. He carried that into 2017, where he was hitting over .300 with three homers and 21 RBIs before suffering injuries in an outfield collision at TCU on March 26 and missing nine games; the injuries lingered throughout the remainder of the season.

Littell proved a clutch hitter in 2017 as he hit .306 (15-for-49) with runners in scoring position and had 16 two-out RBIs.

What A Week

The sizzling bat of Jon Littell was rewarded with NCBWA National Hitter of the Week honors on April 3 as well as Big 12 Player of the Week accolades on April 2 following a week that saw the Cowboy senior lead the Pokes to a midweek win over Oklahoma and a series sweep of TCU.

Littell was 9-for-15 (.600) at the plate in the four games with three doubles, two triples and four RBIs. He also scored nine runs, drew five walks, stole a base and turned in a 1.067 slugging percentage.

Against a TCU pitching staff that entered the weekend as the Big 12 leader in ERA, Littell was 8-for-11 (.727) with three doubles, two triples and four RBIs. He scored nine runs, collected 15 total bases and posted a 1.364 slugging percentage.

Mr. Versatility

Andrew Rosa is in his fifth season at OSU and is making his final collegiate season his best yet. Rosa's ability to play multiple positions makes him a valuable part of the lineup. He's played in 136 career games, 83 as a starter, and he has been in the starting lineup at first base, second base, third base, left field, center field and DH. Listed as an infielder, Rosa's first three starts of 2018 came at second base, but he was inserted as a starter in center field — a position he had never previously played for the Cowboys — during the two midweek contests against Little Rock. He has started 18 games at second base, six in center field and one at first base this season.

Rosa has missed weekend games vs. Seton Hall and Missouri State as well as the Texas and OU series with a foot injury. He is hitting .296 on the season to go along with a .439 slugging percentage, and his .432 on-base percentage and 10 hit by pitches leads the team.

Teel Time

Carson Teel joined the OSU program as a walk-on in 2015 and spent that season redshirting for his hometown team. Since then, Teel has flourished into a scholarship player with a significant role in the Cowboys' pitching rotation.

In 2017, the southpaw led OSU with 28 appearances, 25 of those in relief, and topped the Pokes with a 3.06 ERA and three saves while ranking second on the pitching staff in wins (5) and strikeouts (77).

In OSU's run to the Big 12 Championship title, Teel appeared in all four games, striking out 10 and allowing only one run in 8.1 innings out of the bullpen.

Teel was a 27th-round draft pick of the Boston Red Sox in last June's MLB Draft but put a professional career on hold to return for his junior season.

In 16 appearances this season, nine of those in relief, Teel is 6-2 with three saves and a 2.86 ERA, which ranks third in the Big 12. He earned his first win of the season with a career-high 7 1/3 innings in relief at Arizona State; in his first start of 2018 against Missouri State, he struck out eight and allowed just three hits in seven scoreless innings to pick up a win.

Teel has twice been named Big 12 Pitcher of the Week in 2018 — on April 9 after tossing a complete game and striking out nine against Kansas State and again on April 30 following a Bedlam Series performance that saw him rack up a career-high 12 strikeouts in eight scoreless innings against No. 18 Oklahoma.

Teel ranks second in the Big 12 in wins and strikeouts (72) and is fourth in opponent batting average (.224).

On The Shelf

OSU is without what was expected to be two-thirds of its weekend starting pitching rotation in 2018 as both Jensen Elliott and Parker Scott are rehabbing from Tommy John surgery.

A Freshman All-American in 2016 after going 9-3 in 17 starts, Elliott was 3-0 through four outings a year ago before undergoing surgery in April. The righty is hopeful to return to the mound for the Cowboys late in the 2018 season.

Scott pitched in six games as a freshman a year ago before an arm injury ended his season. The southpaw suffered another setback when he underwent TJS in November.

Adding to the list, freshman southpaw Mitchell Stone, who started games on the first two weekends of the season, broke his foot on March 2 and has yet to return to action.

Shining In Stillwater

In his third season at the collegiate level, Matt Kroon is showcasing the skills that have made him a two-time Major League Baseball Draft pick.

Kroon, who has started 26 games at shortstop and 17 games at third base this season, came to Stillwater following stints at Oregon and Central Arizona CC, and he has been among the Cowboys' most consistent hitters in 2018.

Kroon leads OSU with 15 doubles, 39 runs and 12 stolen bases and is second with 47 hits. The Arizona native has 14 multi-hit games and had a streak of reaching base safely snapped at 24 games at Wichita State.

Kroon's father, Marc, pitched four seasons in the big leagues for the Padres, Reds and Rockies and was also a Nippon Professional Baseball standout in Japan, where he racked up 177 saves over six seasons.

Saturday Slugger

Carson McCusker played a key role in OSU's Saturday doubleheader sweep of TCU, and in doing so earned recognition as the Big 12 Newcomer of the Week on April 2.

The sophomore entered the day having made just one start on the season and with only one hit, a single, in 11 at-bats. He started both games of the doubleheader in right field and went 4-for-6 with three home runs, all solo shots, while also making several highlight-reel defensive plays in the outfield.

McCusker has made 18-straight starts in right field, and he is hitting .347 with five homers, 10 RBIs and a .735 slugging percentage in Big 12 play.

Boone Goes The Dynamite

Trevor Boone has been on a tear at the plate since the start of Big 12 Conference play. The sophomore outfielder was hitting .192 in 17 games prior to the Texas series but in 24 games since has raised his average to .275.

Boone was named the Big 12 Co-Player of the Week on April 9 after a three-game stretch that saw him go 7-for-12 at the plate with a pair of doubles, a homer and three RBIs. In the series sweep of Kansas State, he was 6-for-12 with two homers and five RBIs, and his go-ahead grand slam in the eighth inning of the series finale lifted OSU to a series sweep.

Boone is hitting .313 with a team-high 19 RBIs in Big 12 play.

RPI Talk

The official NCAA RPI (games through May 2) has OSU at No. 25, while Iowa is No. 187.

Texas Tech is No. 3 in the RPI, while other Big 12 teams are Texas (30), West Virginia (32), Oklahoma (35), Baylor (36), TCU (65), Kansas (102) and Kansas State (134).



THE NEW HOME OF COWBOY BASEBALL — COMING 2020



Oklahoma State will open a new baseball complex in 2020, with preliminary work on the \$75 million project (\$60 million in construction costs) already begun on the site located at the corner of Washington Street and McElroy Road.

Inspired by Boone Pickens Stadium, the new home of the Cowboys has several amenities that cater to fans and players alike. The complex will include approximately 3,500 permanent seats, 13 suites and 400 premium seats in dedicated club and suite areas. Seating can be expanded to 8,000 as needed.

A playground area and an outfield plaza space highlight the new family-friendly concepts incorporated into the design. The concourse area encompasses the entire playing field and features restroom and concession stands down the first-base and third-base lines, plus restrooms and spaces for temporary options such as food trucks in the outfield. Other features of the concourse area are tailgating tents, refreshment areas down both the right field and left field lines, a dedicated student section with special loge seating and terrace seating in the outfield that will serve families with young children and groups looking for space and the ability to move around freely while watching games.

A 2,000-square foot video board allows for top-of-the-line graphics and video content to further enhance the game day experience, and fans will benefit from a large parking lot that accommodates about 600 vehicles beyond center field. Near the right field foul pole is a space built for hosting game day birthday parties and group functions.

The playing surface will be natural grass and features a top-of-the-line drainage system. A second artificial turf infield can be used for practice, and is one-third of a maximum-efficiency "training triangle" area that also includes an indoor facility and a pitching lab that allows the Cowboys to practice year-round, regardless of weather conditions, without having to utilize the ballpark's main playing surface.

There are several notable cutting-edge technology features for swing training and pitching development built into the complex, including the TrackMan system, which measures pitch velocity, exit speed, launch angle, distance and more. Additionally, pitchers will benefit from specialized equipment built for arm care and injury prevention.

Situated along the left-field line, the clubhouse and team room areas provide plush accommodations for the Cowboys, starting with a 7,400-square-foot locker room and player lounge space that has top-of-the-line lockers for each player. In that same area are a nutrition center that includes a sports performance pantry and fueling station and can accommodate the Cowboys' game day nutrition needs, a tiered-seated classroom that seats 50 and a fully modernized grand entrance that leads to the new operations center.

The operations center houses a sports medicine area with state-of-the-art hydrotherapy equipment, a modern weight room and a baseball-specific laundry center and equipment room. Former players have a dedicated space within the operations center that includes lockers they can utilize when returning to campus to continue their professional baseball training while finishing out their academic degree programs.

"Our vision was to build a facility that would allow us to develop players at the highest level, teach leadership concepts and principles, embrace the team concept and provide a

first-class experience for our loyal fans and alumni," said head coach Josh Holliday. "When we set out to do this, we wanted to do it with our Stillwater community in mind and capture the same game day passion we see on display each Saturday at Boone Pickens Stadium and throughout the winter at Gallagher-Iba Arena. The end result was exactly what we wanted. We accomplished our goal, and it is beyond anything I could have envisioned."

The lead architects are Jim Hasenbeck and Joshua Hill of Studio Architecture, who have also worked on the Sherman Smith Center and the Greenwood Tennis Center in the Athletic Village, along with several other facilities on campus. Hasenbeck said two of the most unique features of the new baseball stadium are the 360-degree concourse that wraps around the stadium and a glass batter's eye that allows fans to stand directly behind it and look straight back into the batter's box.

"Similar to Boone Pickens Stadium and Gallagher-Iba Arena, the ballpark was built to let the fans be right on top of the action," Hasenbeck said. "There is only about 30 feet from the back of the batter's box to the first spectator row, which is located right at field level. The student section down the left field line is only about eight feet away from the foul line. The design was influenced by Boone Pickens Stadium and much like it and the Sherman Smith Center, this ballpark uses the same modified Georgian architecture seen throughout campus – it looks like an Oklahoma State building."

Manhattan Construction Company is building the stadium.
