Program Quick Hits

- Iowa is one of 10 teams in the country, and the only Big Ten team, to have appeared in the last eight NCAA Tournaments. There are 349 Division I teams.
- The Hawkeyes made their first Sweet Sixteen appearance since 1996, and their sixth overall, last season.
- Iowa is 1-of-21 teams to advance to the second round of the NCAA Tournament in each of the last two seasons.
- Iowa ended the season with a No. 11 national ranking in the *USA Today* Top 25 Coaches' Poll -- the highest for the program since 1995-96 (No. 7 in AP, No. 9 in *USA Today*). The Hawkeyes appeared in the rankings in all 20 weeks of the season.
- The Hawkeyes finished undefeated at home for the first time since 1995-96 last season, setting a program record with 18 wins. Iowa was one of 13 teams nationally to finish undefeated at home during the regular season and one of four to finish undefeated at home when playing at least 16 home games (Baylor, Tennessee, and Wichita State).
- The Hawkeyes ended the 2014-15 year ranked sixth nationally in scoring offense (79.5), setting a new school record for the second consecutive season. In 2013-14, Iowa finished the season with an average of 78.2 points per game.
- Iowa returns two starters in junior Ally Disterhoft and sophomore Whitney Jennings. The 2015-16 roster is comprised of four freshman, four sophomores, three juniors, and three seniors.
- The 2015-16 squad gained valuable experience this August. The Hawkeyes spent 11 days together on the Italian Tour, which included three games, and benefitted from 10 practice days leading up to the trip.
- Iowa's 2015 recruiting class of Tania Davis (Michigan Miss Basketball), Hannah Stewart (North Dakota Miss Basketball), Megan Gustafson (all-time leading scorer in Wisconsin high school basketball history), and Tagyn Larson (four-time all-state, all-city, and all-conference player) came in with a No. 17 national ranking by ESPN HoopGurlz.
- Junior Ally Disterhoft was named a preseason All-Big Ten player by the coaches in October. As a sophomore, she earned second team All-Big Ten honors from both the coaches and the media. As a freshman, she was named honorable mention All-Big Ten by the coaches and media and to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team.
- Sixteenth-year UI head coach Lisa Bluder has led Iowa to three consecutive 20-win seasons and eight overall. She was the recipient of the WBCA's Carol Eckman Award in 2015.

ON TO THE NEXT ROUND

With a 97-85 victory over No. 8 seed Michigan Thursday morning, No. 9 seed University of Iowa women's basketball advances to face No. 1 seed Maryland in Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals Friday at 11 a.m. (CT).

GAME COVERAGE

- Friday's game will be broadcast live on the Big Ten Network. Kevin Kugler (play-by-play), Christy Winters Scott (color), and Shelley Till (sideline) are on the call.
- Audio of the contest is available on select Hawkeye Radio Network affiliate stations and on Hawkeye All-Access available at hawkeyesports.com. Brent Balbinot and Todd Werner will call the action.
- Balbinot is in his 12th year as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Werner is in his first providing analysis.
- Links to video, audio, and Gametracker (live stats) are available on the women's basketball schedule page at hawkeyesports.com.

BIG TOURNAMENT HISTORY

- Iowa is 22-19 in the Big Ten Tournament since its inception in 1994-95.
- The Hawkeyes have claimed two tournament titles (1997, 2001) and made four championship game appearances.
- In 2014-15, the Hawkeyes, a No. 2 seed, opened tournament action with their third win of the season against Nebraska, 74-65, but were eliminated in the semifinal round by Ohio State, 91-85, in overtime.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE SPREE

- Freshman Megan Gustafson posted her eighth double-double (25 points, 10 rebounds) in the last 11 games against Michigan Thursday.
- Sophomore Chase Coley recorded her sixth career double-double (20 points, 10 rebounds) in the contest.
- Freshman Tania Davis compiled the first double-double of her career with 10 points and 10 assists. The last Hawkeye to distribute 10 or more assists in a Big Ten Tournament game is Samantha Logic (11 vs. Purdue in 2014).

#BIGTOURNEY RECORDS REVIEW

- The Hawkeyes matched Big Ten Tournament records with 28 assists, 37 field goals, and 12 blocked shots.
- Iowa's .667 three-point field goal percentage ties the third-best percentage in Big Ten Tournament history.
- The team's 97 points scored against Michigan is tied for the third-highest total in tournament history.
- The Hawkeyes' .607 field goal percentage is the fourth-best percentage in tournament history.
- Sophomore Chase Coley posted the third-highest block total (6), freshman Tania Davis dished out the eighth-highest assist total (10), and sophomore Whitney Jennings recorded the ninth-highest steal total (9) in tournament history.

A LOOK AT THE TERRAPINS

- No. 5 Maryland enters the Big Ten Tournament with a 26-3 record overall. The Terrapins, Big Ten regular season champions, compiled a 15-2 conference record to secure the top tournament seed.
- Brianna Jones and Shatori Walker-Kimbrough were named first team All-Big Ten, while Brene Moseley was named second team All-Big Ten and Sixth Player of the Year. Walker Kimbrough was also placed on the All-Defensive Team.

2015-16 Team Captains

Iowa co-captains are senior Kali Peschel and junior Ally Disterhoft.

- As a team, Maryland averages 84.3 points and 45.4 rebounds per game.
- Three average in double figures including Walker-Kimbrough (19.6), Jones (15.3), and Moseley (11.6).

SERIES HISTORY

- Maryland leads Iowa, 2-1, in the all-time series.
- The teams have never met in the Big Ten Tournament before.
- The Hawkeyes dropped the lone contest of the year against the Terrapins, 76-56, on Jan. 10 in Iowa City.

SHARP SHOOTING HAWKEYES ADVANCE

- No. 9 seed Iowa defeated No. 8 seed Michigan, 97-85, Thursday morning.
- The Hawkeyes had three players with double-doubles for the first time this year, including freshman Megan Gustafson (25 points, 10 rebounds), sophomore Chase Coley (20 points, 10 rebounds), and freshman Tania Davis (10 points, 10 assists).
- Iowa scored a season-high 97 points. The squad shot a season-best 60.7 percent from the field and a season-high 66.7 percent from three-point range.
- Iowa posted a season-high 12 blocks. Coley led the way, setting a career-high with six stuffs. She ranks third all-time for blocked shots in a single game of the Big Ten Tournament.
- The Hawkeyes scored 52 points in the first half for their best offensive half of the season. In the second quarter alone, Iowa netted 31 points, the highest point total in a quarter this year.
- Several Hawkeyes set career-highs in the contest, including junior Ally Disterhoft (4 three-point field goals, 3 blocks), Coley (6 assists, 6 blocks), Gustafson (25 points), Davis (10 assists), and sophomore Whitney Jennings (6 steals).

BIG DIFFERENCE

- Since altering the lineup to include freshman Megan Gustafson and sophomore Chase Coley, the Hawkeyes have seen an increase in production offensively.
- In the last 12 games, Iowa has had five players average double figures in scoring rather than three in the previous 19 games. Leading the pack is junior Ally Disterhoft (18.3), followed by Gustafson (13.5), Coley (13.3), sophomore Whitney Jennings (10.7), and freshman Tania Davis (10.3).
- Gustafson has seen her rebounds per game average spike from 4.8 to 9.8 in the last 12 games, while Coley has made the jump from 5.0 to 7.4.
- The 6-3 duo accounts for 48 percent of the team's rebounding effort and 36 percent of Iowa's offensive production.

DOUBLE-DOUBLE MACHINE

- In the last 11 games, freshman Megan Gustafson has posted eight double-doubles, the first of her career.
- The stretch began with three consecutive double-doubles against Michigan (12 rebounds, 10 points) on Jan. 28, at Northwestern (15 points, 13 rebounds) on Jan. 31, and at Indiana (12 points, 10 rebounds).
- After recording eight rebounds and seven points against Michigan State on Feb. 7, Gustafson returned to her double-double ways with 13 points and 11 rebounds against Ohio State on Feb. 11.
- The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native secured her fifth double-double at Minnesota on Feb. 15, tallying 14 points and a career-high 19 boards. The last player to record more than 17 rebounds in a game was Samantha Logic (vs. Drake on Dec. 21, 2013). The Iowa record for rebounds in a game is 26 (Jerica Watson vs. Creighton on Dec. 15, 2001).
- After a two-game break, Gustafson returned to her double-double ways with 15 points and a team-high 11 rebounds at Penn State on Feb. 24.
- Gustafson ended the regular season with her seventh double-double, tallying a team-high 16 points and 10 rebounds against Illinois on Feb. 27.
- Gustafson made her Big Ten Tournament debut with her eighth double-double (25 points, 10 rebounds) against Michigan on March 3.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir), the all-time winningest coach in program history, is in her 16th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 32nd season as a college head coach.



Under her direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to 14 postseason appearances (12 NCAA and two WNIT) in 15 seasons, including NCAA Tournament berths in each of the last eight seasons. Iowa is the only team in the Big Ten, and one of 10 in NCAA Division I women's basketball, to qualify for the NCAA Tournament in each of the last eight years. There are 349 Division I teams.

Bluder, the 2015 Carol Eckman Award winner, has posted a 323-186 (.635) record at Iowa and her career record stands at 679-328 (.674). Bluder surpassed Hall of Famer C. Vivian Stringer (269 wins) as the all-time winningest coach in program history on Feb. 10, 2014, as the Hawkeyes defeated Northwestern, 90-84.

Bluder, 1-of-10 active major college coaches with 600 or more wins, is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010) and two-time WBCA Regional Coach of the Year (2001 and 2008). She has guided Iowa to a winning record in 14 of her 15 years at Iowa, including 11 upper-division finishes in the challenging Big Ten Conference. Bluder, who ranks fourth among Big Ten coaches all-time in league victories (152), has led Iowa to nine 20-win seasons in her 15 years, including seven of the last eight years.

Bluder has coached numerous players to different awards in her 15 years in Iowa City. She has mentored 19 players to 46 All-Big Ten honors, including 12 first team picks, 16 second, 11 third and eight honorable mention selections. She has also had two Big Ten Freshman of the Year award winners, two Big Ten Sixth Player of the Year recipients, six members of the Big Ten All-Freshman team and three players named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team, with Kachine Alexander earning the honor twice.

Five players during Bluder's tenure have earned a total of seven Women's Basketball Coaches Association (WBCA) all-region team accolades and six players have earned a total of 11 honorable mention All-American honors. Bluder coached her first consensus All-American in Samantha Logic, who earned the honor after being named a WBCA Division I Coaches All-American, USBWA All-American, ESPN Second Team All-American, and Third Team Associated Press All-American.

With Bluder on the Iowa sidelines, student-athletes have been named Academic All-Big Ten 75 times, including a program-best eight honorees in 2011 and 2012. The 75 honorees equal the third-highest total in the Big Ten during the last 15 years.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five postseason appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, Iowa, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

FUN FACTS

- Iowa recorded its first victory without making a three-pointer (0-for-5) in 18 years against Purdue on Feb. 18. The last win in program history without a three-pointer was against Ohio State in the opening round of the Big Ten Tournament on Feb. 28, 1998. The Hawkeyes went 0-for-2 in three-point field goal attempts and recorded a 72-54 win.
- The Hawkeyes were a perfect 16-for-16 at the free throw line at Minnesota on Feb. 15. A perfect performance at the charity stripe has only happened six times in program history, most recently on Feb. 21, 2015 against Ohio State (13-for-13).
- Iowa is one of just two teams (Northwestern) to outrebound Maryland this season. The Hawkeyes recorded 38 rebounds to the Terrapins' 37 on Jan. 10 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

HAWKEYE FRESHMEN REPORT

- Freshman Megan Gustafson leads all Big Ten freshmen in blocks with 53. Gustafson is one of two freshmen to lead her team in blocks this year (Hallie Thome, Michigan – 37 blocks).
- Gustafson leads league freshmen in blocks per game (1.8), is second in rebounding (208), and fourth in scoring (323). She is one of two freshmen in the conference who lead their team in rebounds.
- Gustafson has blocked three or more shots in nine of her 31 career games.
- Freshman Tania Davis is one of two Big Ten freshmen who lead their team in the assists category. She has distributed 108 this season, bested only by Penn State's Teniya Page (127).
- Davis is second among Big Ten freshmen in steals (31) behind Page (37) and sixth in scoring (252). She has dished out five or more assists in nine of her 31 games played.

CALL ON ME

- Junior Ally Disterhoft, a preseason All-Big Ten selection by league coaches, has been a consistent force for the Hawkeyes all season.
- Disterhoft, who averages 36.4 minutes per contest, is fifth in the conference and ninth nationally with 1,129 minutes played this season.
- The 6-0 forward paces Iowa in points per game (17.1), and is third in rebounds per game (5.5), assists per game (2.7), and steals per game (0.9).
- She has scored double figures in every game of the season and in 76 of her 82 career starts.
- The Iowa City, Iowa, native has led Iowa in scoring in 14 of 31 games this season, scoring 20 points or more in 10 contests.
- Disterhoft owns a .536 field goal percentage, a .385 three-point field goal percentage, and a .720 free throw percentage.

MOVING UP THE CHARTS

- Junior Ally Disterhoft is 11th all-time in scoring (1,507 career points), 13th all-time in three-point field goals made (110), and 18th all-time in rebounding (599 career rebounds) in Iowa women's basketball history.
- Disterhoft, who has played in every game of her Hawkeye career with 82 consecutive starts, has scored double figures in every game this year and in 76 of her 82 career starts. She is the sixth-highest scoring junior in program history with 530 points this season. The record for points in a junior season is 564 (Michelle Edwards, 1986-87).
- Megan Gustafson has compiled 53 blocks through 31 games played this season, which is third on the all-time freshman list at Iowa. The program record of 79 stuffs was set by Morgan Johnson in 2009-10. Gustafson averages a team-leading 1.7 blocks per contest and has compiled three or more stuffs in nine games this season.
- Gustafson owns the sixth-highest rebound total of all freshmen in program history with 208 boards. The record for most rebounds in a freshman season is 252 (Krista VandeVenter, 2004-05).
- Alexa Kastanek has netted 55 three-point field goals so far in her junior campaign, which ties for fourth in her class in program history. The record for three-pointers made in a junior season is 97 (Melissa Dixon, 2013-14).
- Tania Davis is the second-highest rated freshman passer in program history with 108 assists. The record for assists in a freshman season is 136 (Samantha Logic, 2011-12).

SENIOR SALUTE

- The Hawkeyes sent seniors Kali Peschel, Nicole Smith, and Claire Till out of Carver-Hawkeye Arena with a 61-56 victory over Illinois on Feb. 27.
- Iowa outrebounded Illinois, 44-31, and shot 42.1 percent from the floor to record the win.
- Freshman Megan Gustafson led Iowa with 16 points and 10 rebounds for her seventh career double-double. She sunk 8-of-11 field goal attempts and posted a pair of blocks.
- Joining her in double figures were sophomore Whitney Jennings (14), junior Ally Disterhoft (13), and sophomore Chase Coley (10). Coley added four blocks to her line to match her career-high.



AWARDS SEASON

- Three Hawkeyes were honored with Big Ten Conference awards on Feb. 29.
- Junior Ally Disterhoft garnered second team All-Big Ten accolades by coaches and media for the second consecutive season and received Iowa's Sportsmanship Award. The preseason All-Big Ten pick by coaches has scored in double figures in every game this season and in 76 of her 82 consecutive starts.
- Disterhoft, who was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll twice in the regular season, leads the Hawkeyes in scoring, averaging 17.1 points per game.
- Freshmen Tania Davis and Megan Gustafson were named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team. It is the fifth time in 15 years that a conference team has had two players named to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team and the first time since 2008 when Ohio State accomplished the feat (Kalisha Keane, Brittney Thomas).
- Davis is one of two Big Ten freshmen to lead her team in assists per game (3.5) and average at least one steal per game (1.0) this season. She has dished out 108 assists through 31 games played, the second-highest total recorded by a freshman at Iowa. Samantha Logic holds the record for assists in a freshman season at Iowa with 136.
- The point guard has paced the Hawkeyes in assists in 10 games, dishing out five or more in nine contests. Davis posted a career-high 10 assists against Michigan on March 3.
- Gustafson is the only freshman and one of three players in the conference overall to lead her team in field goal percentage (.550), rebounds (208), and blocks (53) this season. She recorded eight double-doubles in the last 11 games and earned Iowa's first Big Ten Freshman of the Week since 2012 on Feb. 22.
- The center has blocked 53 shots, the third-highest total recorded by a freshman in Iowa history. Morgan Johnson holds the record for blocks in a freshman season with 79, followed by Tangelia Smith who tallied 73. Gustafson has posted three or more stuffs in nine games, including a career-high five at Virginia on Dec. 2. She has led Iowa in rebounding in 15 games, including 10 of the last 12 this season.

ACADEMIC ALL-AMERICA OF THE YEAR

- Junior Ally Disterhoft was named Academic All-America of the Year for Division I women's basketball and a CoSIDA first team Academic All-America on March 3.
- She is the only junior to earn first team Academic All-America recognition and owns the top GPA of all Academic All-Americans this year.
- The Iowa City, Iowa, native was the only sophomore to earn Academic All-America honors (third team) in 2015.
- Fellow Hawkeye Jarrod Uthoff earned the Academic All-America of the Year honor for men's Division I basketball. It is the first time players from the same institution were recognized for the award in the same year.

1ST TIME FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

- Megan Gustafson earned Big Ten Freshman of the Week recognition on Feb. 22. It is the first conference honor of her career and first freshman of the week accolade for Iowa since Feb. 28, 2012 (Samantha Logic).
- The center averaged a double-double with 14 points and 10.7 rebounds per game to guide Iowa to a 2-1 record. She shot .563 from the field and averaged 3.3 blocks per contest in the three-game stretch.
- Gustafson recorded a career-high 19 rebounds at Minnesota on Feb. 15, the highest rebounding total in a single game in Iowa women's basketball history since Feb. 16 2012 (Samantha Logic, 18 rebounds, at Michigan). She added 14 points, netting 6-of-12 field goal attempts, to secure her fifth career double-double in a six-game stretch.
- The Port Wing, Wisconsin, native poured in 18 points and led the team for the seventh straight game with seven rebounds against Purdue on Feb. 18. She also recorded a team-high four blocks and shot .778 from the field to lead the Hawkeyes to victory.
- In Iowa's third game in seven days, Gustafson posted 10 points to reach double figures for the fourth consecutive game and six boards against Indiana on Feb. 21. The 6-foot-3 center also added a team-high four blocks to help the Hawkeyes win their second straight Big Ten game.

DISTERHOFT MAKES HISTORY

Junior Ally Disterhoft became the 34th player in Iowa women's basketball history to reach the 1,000 career points mark. The Iowa City, Iowa, native scored 20 points in season-opening action against North Dakota and surpassed the 1,000-point threshold with 11 points against UT Martin on Nov. 15.

2016 Recruiting Class

Bre Cera (Mukwonago, Wisconsin), Makenzie Meyer (Mason City, Iowa), Amanda Ollinger (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), and Alexis Sevillian (Goodrich, Michigan) have inked National Letters of Intent to play basketball at the University of Iowa, UI head coach Lisa Bluder announced on Nov. 11. The class of four is ranked 18th nationally by Blue Star Basketball.

"We are excited about our 2016 recruiting class," Bluder said. "We have signed four tremendous athletes that also succeed academically and are all-around great young women. They will be wonderful additions to our Hawkeye family."

Cera, a 5-10 guard from Mukwonago High School in Mukwonago, Wisconsin, is a Blue Star Basketball Top 300 recruit, ranking as the 83rd-best prospect nationally.

The two-time first team all-state honoree has helped Mukwonago to a trio of top three conference finishes in her high school career, including a conference championship in the 2012-13 season. Cera guided her team to a state runner-up finish that year as a freshman, a semifinal appearance at state as a sophomore, and a regional berth as a junior. The two-time team captain has been named first team all-conference, first team all-area, and first team all-county in consecutive seasons.

Cera became Mukwonago's all-time leading scorer in February of her junior season. She averaged 17 points, five rebounds, three assists, and two steals per game that year. As a sophomore, Cera surpassed the 1,000 career points mark, was named Milwaukee Journal-Sentinel prep athlete of the week, and averaged 14 points, four rebounds, three assists, and two steals per game. She also owns the school record for points in a game with 37.

"Bre is a terrific defensive player, a hard worker, and unbelievable competitor," Bluder said. "She makes her presence known on both ends of the court. Bre is a great athlete who has the versatility to play a variety of positions on the floor."

Meyer, a 5-10 guard from Mason City High School in Mason City, Iowa, is an ESPN HoopGurlz Top 100 recruit, ranking as the 83rd-best prospect nationally and the 23rd-best point guard.

The two-year captain, only the fifth player in Mason City history to join the 1,000 career point club, helped her team to state quarterfinals in 2015 and semifinals in 2013 at the 5A level, and a trio of conference co-championships. As a junior, Meyer averaged 20.5 points, 6.8 rebounds, 3.2 assists, and 2.3 steals per game. She was named first team all-conference, first team all-district, first team all-state, and to the Sports Spotlight Iowa High School Girls Basketball All State Team.

Meyer, the school record holder for points scored in a game with 36, garnered first team all-district, first team all-state, and Mason City Globe Gazette Player of the Year honors as a sophomore. The National Honors Society member also excels academically, earning Principle List and academic all-conference recognition.

"Makenzie has the opportunity to play the point or the off guard for us," Bluder said. "She controls the tempo, but also has a scorer's mentality. Makenzie was our first commitment from this class and got the ball rolling for us. She is a great player who has consistently competed at the highest level, not only within the state of Iowa, but nationally. We are excited to have another native Iowan in Makenzie."

Ollinger, a 6-1 forward from Linn-Mar High School in Cedar Rapids, Iowa, is an ESPN HoopGurlz Top 100 recruit, ranking as the 90th-best player overall and 18th-best forward.

The two-time second team all-state and three-time all-metro and all-conference honoree most recently helped Linn-Mar to a runner-up conference finish, averaging 12.3 points, 4.8 rebounds, and 1.1 blocks per game as a junior. She also earned the team's top free throw percentage award, and is only the second player in program history to net six three-pointers in a game (joining Linn-Mar and Hawkeye women's basketball alum Jaime Printy).

As a sophomore, Ollinger averaged 18.6 points, 7.2 rebounds, and 2.3 blocks per game. She is also a standout volleyball player, who led the state in kills, kills per set, and kills in a season at the 5A level. The two-time team captain is a two-time all-state volleyball honoree.

"She is an all-around athlete that can play either forward position for us," Bluder said. "Amanda is an excellent rebounder, but can also nail the open three. She runs the floor so well for a player her size and will beat people guarding her down the court or off the bounce. It's great to have another Iowa player on our roster, especially one from so close to Iowa City."

Sevillian, a 5-6 guard from Goodrich High School in Goodrich, Michigan, is a Blue Star Basketball Top 300 recruit, ranking as the 91st-best prospect nationally. She has a familiar face on the Hawkeye roster in freshman Tania Davis, also a Goodrich graduate.

The two-time all-state, all-area, and all-conference honoree has guided Goodrich to three consecutive conference championships, two district and regional championships, and a state championship in 2013. As a junior, Sevillian started every game, registered 422 points, 94 rebounds, 62 steals, and 60 assists, and led her team to state semifinals and a 23-2 final record. She tallied 304 points in her sophomore season, helping Goodrich to a 22-3 mark.

Sevillian, a preseason all-state and Miss Michigan Basketball candidate, is a National Honor Society member. She also excels in track and field and was named an All-American in the shot put after placing third nationally in the event.

"Alexis is a great defensive player, who can also shoot the three. She has a tremendous work ethic and competes all the time. Her older sister, Keke, currently plays basketball at Penn State, so she knows Big Ten basketball."

- Sophomore Whitney Jennings compiled the best offensive game of her career at Indiana on Feb. 4, netting a career-high 22 points in her home state. The Hawkeyes dropped a 79-74 decision to Indiana despite her efforts.
- The Logansport, Indiana, native knocked down 9-of-17 field goals (.529) and sunk 3-of-7 three-point field goals (.429) in front of family and friends.
- She also matched her career-high for the second straight game with two blocks, and added two rebounds, two assists, and one steal to her line in 38 minutes played.
- Jennings was named Miss Indiana Basketball as a senior in 2013-14, and has played in every game of her Hawkeye career (64) with 59 career starts at point guard.

B1G OPENER, BIG SUCCESS

- Iowa opened its Big Ten Conference slate on the road with a win at Nebraska, 74-68, on Dec. 31. It is the lone matchup against the Huskers this season.
- The Hawkeyes have won four consecutive games against the Huskers, dating back the 2014-15 season when Iowa topped Nebraska three times.
- Iowa dominated the boards in the contest, outrebounding Nebraska, 51-29.
- Iowa shot 45.6% from field goal range, 35% from three-point land, and 78.9% from the charity stripe in the win.
- Three Hawkeyes scored in double figures, led by junior Ally Disterhoft who netted 17 points. She added 11 rebounds for her first double-double of the year.
- Sophomore Chase Coley and Lincoln, Nebraska, native junior Alexa Kastanek scored 16 and 13 points, respectively.

A QUALITY NONCONFERENCE START

- Iowa compiled a 10-2 record in nonconference action, facing challenging opponents at home and on the road to prepare for Big Ten play.
- The Hawkeyes won seven of 12 nonconference games by 10 or more points.

- Junior Ally Disterhoft was named to the Big Ten Player of the Week Honor Roll on Dec. 28, after helping Iowa defeat intrastate rival Drake, 89-76.
- The 6-0 forward scored a team-high 20 points, tied for the team lead with seven rebounds, and dished out four assists against the Bulldogs.
- The Iowa City, Iowa native, hit 6-of-9 field goals, including a 3-of-6 performance from beyond the arc in the game.
- Disterhoft was also named to the Big Ten Honor Roll on Dec. 7, after guiding the Hawkeyes to a pair of wins at Virginia and against Robert Morris.

DISTERHOFT EARNS PRESEASON HONOR

Junior forward Ally Disterhoft was named a preseason All-Big Ten honoree by league coaches. The two-year starter and team-elected co-captain, was a second team All-Big Ten selection in 2015, and an honorable mention All-Big Ten honoree, Big Ten All-Freshman Team member, and Big Ten All-Tournament Team selection in 2014.

The Iowa City, Iowa, native entered the season 34th all-time in scoring at Iowa with 977 career points. Disterhoft -- the only sophomore to be named a CoSIDA Capital One Academic All-American in 2014-15 -- led the Hawkeyes in points (503) and points per game (14.8) last season.

HAWKEYES IN BIG TEN PLAY

Iowa head coach Lisa Bluder is a three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year (2001, 2008 and 2010). She has guided Iowa to 11 upper-division finishes in the Big Ten in 16 seasons. Iowa won a share of the Big Ten regular season championship in 2008 and finished in a three-way tie for second in 2009. The Hawkeyes clinched a share of the title in 2008 with a win at Wisconsin in the regular season finale (March 2, 2008).

In conference games alone, Bluder owns a 161-106 (.603) record at Iowa. Since the 2008 season, Iowa has finished first once, second three times, third twice, fourth once, seventh once, and ninth once. Iowa finished second in the inaugural 14-team league in 2015.

2 TOURNAMENTS, 2 TEAM TROPHIES

- The Hawkeyes have taken home the hardware in every tournament so far this season, beginning with the Hawkeye Challenge, Nov. 13-15, and continuing at the Lone Star Showcase, Nov. 26-28.

- Iowa topped North Dakota and UT Martin at its annual tournament in Iowa City opening weekend to secure its first team championship with a 2-0 record.

- Ally Disterhoft (MVP), Kali Peschel, and Megan Gustafson earned Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team accolades.

- The Hawkeyes edged out the competition in their bracket at the Lone Star Showcase over Thanksgiving break. The squad recorded wins over Wright State and Houston, but fell to No. 23 George Washington in double overtime.

- Iowa and George Washington both posted 2-1 records, but the Hawkeyes earned the team title by the margin of victory tie breaker.

ACADEMIC PROWESS

- Iowa was the only program to have two Capital One Academic All-Americans, Ally Disterhoft and Samantha Logic, in 2014-15. There were 15 total honorees.

- Disterhoft was the only sophomore in the country to earn Capital One Academic All-American honors. She earned Academic All-America of the Year and Academic All-America First Team recognition as a junior.

- Seven Hawkeyes, Disterhoft, Bethany Doolittle, Alexa Kastanek, Samantha Logic, Kali Peschel, Kathryn Reynolds, and Hailey Schneden, earned Academic All-Big Ten recognition following the 2014-15 season.

- To be eligible for Academic All-Big Ten, student-athletes must be letterwinners and be in at least their second academic year at the institution. They must also carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better.

TOP 15 IN ATTENDANCE

In 2014-15, the University of Iowa ranked 11th in total attendance nationally after drawing 95,417 fans to Carver-Hawkeye Arena. With an average of 5,301 fans per game, the Hawkeyes were 14th in national attendance among Division I teams. It is the sixth-straight season Iowa has ranked inside the top 25 in attendance.

The Hawkeyes were 15th in average attendance (5,213) and 13th in total attendance (83,406) in 2013-14, 22nd in attendance (4,395) in 2012-13, 19th in both 2011-12 and 2010-11, and 13th in 2009-10.

#REDWHITENBLUDER

Sixteenth-year UI head coach Lisa Bluder took her talents to the international stage as head coach of the U.S. Pan American Women's Basketball Team in 2015. She guided the Red, White, and Blue to four consecutive wins in four days to reach the gold medal contest, where Team USA ultimately fell to the Pan American Games host in Canada in day five of competition. It marked the 14th medal all-time (seven gold, five silver, two bronze) for the U.S. and the second for Bluder, who earned a gold medal with the team as an assistant coach at the World University Games in 2001.

BUTTENHAM REPRESENTS CANADA

Sophomore forward Christina Buttenham was one of 12 named to the Canadian Junior Women's National Team for the second consecutive year in 2015. The Hamilton, Ontario, Canada, native was unable to compete with the team, which finished eighth in the competition held in Chekhov, Russia, due to injury. Buttenham was one of just 12 women's basketball players in the Big Ten selected to represent the conference in international competition.

UP NEXT

With a win against Maryland, Iowa would play Saturday at 2 p.m. (CT) against either No. 12 seed Northwestern or No. 4 seed Indiana.

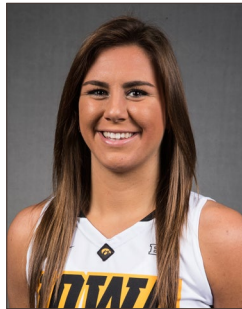
