SCOUTING MINNESOTA:

The Hawkeyes will host the Golden Gophers this weekend, Friday-Sunday, at Duane Banks Stadium, in a four-game series.

The Golden Gophers are 16-27 overall after a loss Wednesday against South Dakota State (6-4).

Iowa and Minnesota are in a three-way tie for eighth place in the conference, so a series win could take Iowa out of the basement of the Big Ten.

As a team, the Golden Gophers are hitting .295 and are led by Matt Nohelty, offensively, with a .393 average and 19 stolen bases.

The Gopher rotation features Tom Buske and Kyle Carr who together have a 6-10 record. They have struck out 94 of the team's 270 batters.

The all-time series between the two schools is led by the Golden Gophers, 163-103.

DIAMOND THIEVES:

This season Iowa has out-run its opponents, going 100-for-129. Leading Iowa in steals is **Caleb Curry** (29), followed by **Justin Toole** (18) and **Kyle Riffel** with 15.

Iowa ranks first in the Big Ten and third nationally in thefts per game and sixth as a team.

Last weekend, Iowa out-ran the Spartans 13 thefts to five.

SUCCESSFUL WITH RUNNERS:

Several Hawkeyes have taken advantage of base runners this season.

Caleb Curry is hitting .484 (44-91) with runners on to lead the Black and Gold. **Justin Toole** is hitting .800 (20-25) when runners are on third and less than two outs, while **Kurtis Muller** is 51-for-86 (.593) in advancing runners. **Kevin Hoef** is hitting .500 (5-10) with the bases loaded.

JT'S STREAKIN':

Justin Toole has caught fire since the coaching staff decided to move him to shortstop. Not only has his defense been solid, but balls have been exploding off his bat, having recorded at least one hit in every game since switching sides of the infield.

He currently has a 16-game hitting streak, a career and team best and has put up huge numbers.

During the streak, Toole is hitting .500 with six doubles and a triple. He has drove in 13 RBI and has a .611 slugging percentage with eight stolen bases. He is the only Hawkeye to walk more than strikeout so far this season. (12-11)

A HIGH FIVE FOR HITTING FIVE:

Justin Toole tied a school record going a perfect 5-for-5 in the win against Northern Iowa Wednesday.

The last time a Hawkeye hit five was in 2007 against Northern Iowa. It was **Travis Sweet** who went 5-for-6 in the Iowa victory.

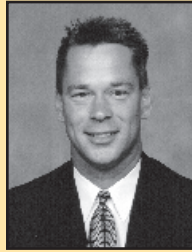

The Iowa Hawkeyes have signed eight recruits for next year. **Nick Brown**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Cory Glieden**, **Jarred Hippen**, **Mike McQuillan**, **Zach Robertson**, **Phil Schreiber** and **Chett Zeise** all signed national letters of intent.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



Jack Dahm is in his fifth season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball team. He has compiled an 402-421-2 overall record and is 119-145 at Iowa. Dahm coached in his 800th career game on March 30th this year at Michigan.

Last season, Iowa took another step forward by recording its best record in 14 years with a 31-23 mark. The Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13. Iowa earned its second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

In Dahm's 14 years as a head coach, he has produced 23 first team all-conference performers, seven freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his four years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 19 all-Big Ten selections, including seven first teamers.

Before coming to Iowa City, Dahm spent 18 years as a member of the Creighton Bluejays baseball program. He left the Bluejays as the winningest coach in school history, having compiled 283 wins against 276 losses in 10 seasons as a head coach.

Twenty-seven of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues. In the past three years, nine Hawkeyes have inked contracts with professional teams, including three last spring.

In the classroom, Iowa is in the 90th-percentile in the NCAA's Academic Progress Report, placing them in the top 30 baseball programs, academically. During his Iowa tenure, Dahm has seen 33 players named academic all-Big Ten, including a team-record ten players in 2006. That is the best four-year total in the history of the program.

The 41-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married 14 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey.

BY THE NUMBERS IN THE BIG TEN:

Caleb Curry has taken the Big Ten by storm, when compared with the league's players he ranks in the top ten in: batting average (.393), slugging percentage (.553), hits (59), runs batted in (48), hit-by-pitches (9), sac flies (5) and stolen bases (29).

Justin Toole has also emerged as a huge Big Ten threat, being in the top ten in: batting average (.402), hits (68), doubles (14), total bases (86), stolen bases (18), at bats (191) and runs scored (46). Other Hawkeyes who rank well in the conference include: **Kevin Hoef** leads the league in hit-by-pitches (16), is seventh in runs scored (41) and is ninth in stolen bases (12). **Kyle Riffel** leads the league in sac bunts (9) and is seventh in stolen bases (15), and **Kurtis Muller** is seventh in the league in sac bunts (6) and third in sac flies (5). **Andrew Porter** is first in appearances (26) and sixth in saves (4) and **Kyle Heim** is third (22) in appearances.

HAWKEYES TAKE CLASSIC:

Iowa won their its straight Corridor Classic vs. UNI, 10-6, Wednesday night. Iowa's offense had 14 hits. The Hawkeye offense exploded in the win and eight different Hawkeyes recorded a hit. Iowa was led by **Justin Toole** who went a perfect 5-for-5 with two RBI, two runs scored and a stolen base. The outstanding offensive effort by Toole was his 16th straight game with a hit, which is a career high. **Wes Freie** also swung the bat well, going 2-for-5 with four RBI and a home run. **T.J. Cataldo** went 2-for-5 with an RBI triple.

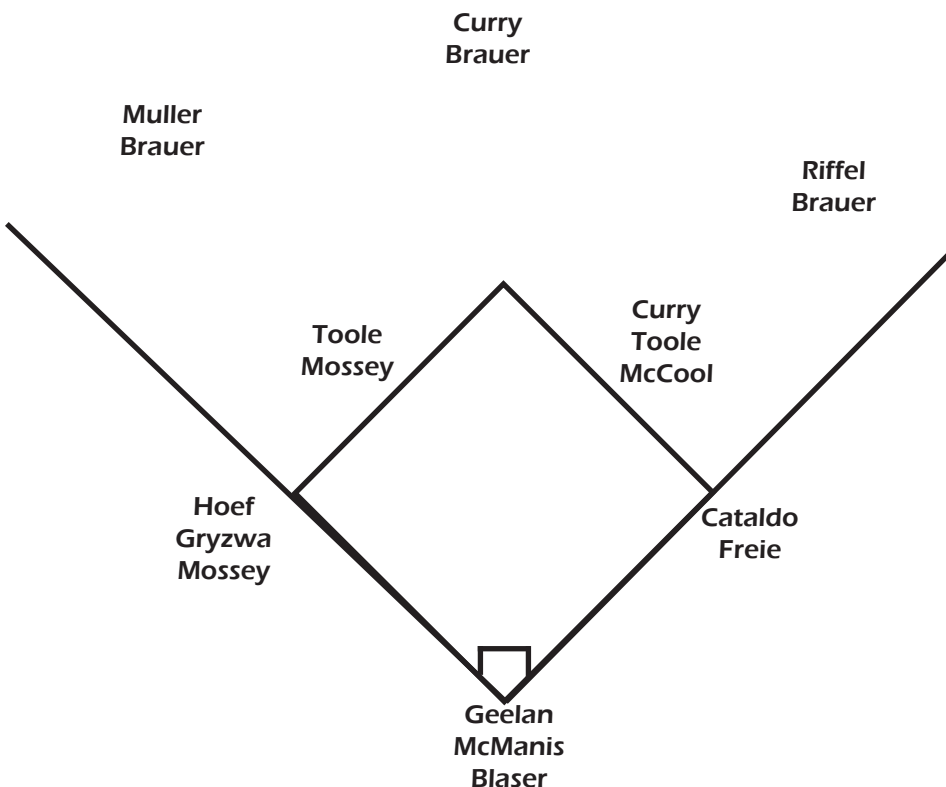
Iowa sent 12 batters to the plate in the bottom of the first, recording seven runs on seven hits. The seven plated are the second most, in one inning, Iowa has scored this season.

Matt Mossey got the start, allowing one run on two hits before being taken out with an injury. The Hawkeye bullpen featured five pitchers. The Iowa pitching staff held the Panthers scoreless in six innings. Manville earned his first win of the season.

IOWA OFFENSE IS STREAKING:

Justin Toole's five-hit game Wednesday was his 16th consecutive game with a hit, which is a Hawkeye season best. **Wes Freie** has been swinging the bat well, having gone the last nine contests with a hit.

Toole leads Iowa in seven offensive categories. Curry leads the team in multi-RBI games with 13, followed by Toole (11). Toole also leads the team with 21 multi-hit games to lead Iowa, while Curry has 19 multi-hit contests this year.

DAHM CAPTURES MILESTONE:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** captured his 400th career victory the last time the two team's faced off. Dahm recorded 283 victories at Creighton and has won 119 at Iowa.

Dahm started in 1994 with his alma mater, Creighton University, and moved on to coach the Hawkeyes in 2003.

WEARING PITCHES:

Iowa has no problem taking one for the team. The Hawkeyes have 67 hit-by-pitches on the year, which is more than any other team in the Big Ten and enough to rank them 25th in the country in the category.

To lead the Black and Gold is **Kevin Hoef** with 16 who has the 7th most in the country, followed by **Kurtis Muller** (11).

ERRORLESS BALL:

The Hawkeyes only committed one error last weekend in Lansing, MI. The Hawkeyes have had eight errorless games prior to their weekend at Oldsmobile Park, now the grand total is at nine.

TRIPLING T.J.:

T.J. Cataldo hit his third triple of the season against Northern Iowa Wednesday. The three-bagger ties him with **Kevin Hoef** with the most on the team. It is his second triple in consecutive games.

HAWKEYES GO YARD:

Iowa added another home run to their Big Ten total vs. Michigan State last weekend. The Hawkeye total has now swelled to 16.

Against Northwestern, **Kevin Hoef** hit his third career homer, **Caleb Curry** hit a shot for his second one this week and **Wes Freie** hit a bomb to give him his third this season.

Twelve of Iowa's 16 homers this season have been in Big Ten play (five at Indiana, three vs. Purdue and Northwestern and one at Michigan State).

UTILIZING THE SAC BUNT:

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten in sacrifice bunts this season in the conference (37). Leading the Black and Gold is **Kyle Riffel** with nine, followed by **Kurtis Muller** with six.

SCHEDULE STRENGTH:

Iowa will play one of its toughest schedules in 2008 as it will face nine teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament last season. The Hawkeyes will welcome NCAA Tournament teams Minnesota, Nebraska and Ohio State to Iowa City and will take on Albany, Creighton, Michigan, Rutgers, Stetson and Vanderbilt on the road. Iowa will face three teams in conference action that advanced to the NCAA Tournament.

CURRY RECEIVES HONOR:

Senior **Caleb Curry** received *CollegeBaseballHub.com's* Heartland Hitter of the Week honor for his performance against Rutgers.

Curry went 8-for-13 with seven RBI, two walks and three runs scored in the series.

HAWKEYES HIT THE CLASSROOM:

In October, the Iowa baseball team was awarded the 2007 NCAA Public Recognition Award for being in the 90% percentile of Academic Progress Report (APR) for baseball.

BIG TEN NETWORK SCHEDULE:

Three Hawkeye games will be televised on the Big Ten Network (HD) this season. Iowa's doubleheader at Indiana April 12 was broadcast on the network. Only one game remains to be televised.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Nick Zumsande**, along with volunteer coach **Kris Welker** and Director of Baseball **Matt Haddy**.

Ryan Brownlee enters his fifth season as Iowa's hitting, infield instructor and recruiting coordinator.

As hitting coach, Brownlee saw the team's batting average vault 55 points from 2005 to 2007 (.269 to .324). Additionally, the team also scored more runs (273 to 401) had more RBIs (249 to 345) and walks (152 to 245) during that time span. **Nick Zumsande** enters his fifth year as the Iowa pitching coach.

Under Zumsande's guidance, the Hawkeye pitching has had a pitcher named first team all-Big Ten three of the last four years, and a pitcher named all-conference in each of his four years.

Kris Welker is in his second year as the team's volunteer assistant. Welker works with the Iowa catchers and outfielders, prepares scouting reports and coaches first base.

As a senior, Welker earned third team all-Big Ten honors, helping Iowa to a third-place finish in the Big Ten and a trip to the conference tournament. He led the team with a .354 batting average, 46 RBIs and 16 doubles. Welker also received the Bob Oldis, Jr MVP Award

Matt Haddy is in his third season as the Director of Baseball Operations for the University of Iowa.

He assists the coaching staff with the day-to-day operations and administrative areas of the program. Haddy also serves as the travel coordinator and director of Hawkeye Baseball Camps.

LAST SEASON:

Iowa posted a 31-23 record in 2007, the Hawkeyes placed fourth in the Big Ten Conference at 17-13, and earned their second trip to the conference tournament in the last three years -- this after going just once the previous 15 years.

During the season, Iowa defeated five teams (Nebraska, Fresno State, Ohio State, Minnesota and Michigan) that reached the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes also posted a 12-game winning streak, which is the second-longest in school history. Included in the streak was a school-record 10-game Big Ten winning streak.

BIG TEN PLAYERS OF THE WEEK:

Wes Freie was named Big Ten Player of the Week on March 4. In addition, **Brock Alberts** earned co-Pitcher of the Week accolades, sharing the honor with Phil Isaksson.

Freie had a stellar weekend helping lead Iowa to a 2-1 record, including a 6-3 upset win over fifth-ranked Vanderbilt, at the Music City Classic in Nashville, TN. The first baseman, who was named tournament MVP, was 9-for-12 with a double, home run, two RBI and two walks. The junior led the Black and Gold against No. 5 Vanderbilt, going a perfect 4-for-4 with an RBI.

Alberts had a great season debut in Iowa's come-from-behind win over Xavier Feb. 29. The senior right hander threw five and one-third innings in relief for the win. He allowed no runs, scattered five hits with no walks and struck out a career-high 10 of the 21 batters he faced.

Senior **Caleb Curry** moved to center field from left field and also has taken on shortstop and second base. Junior **Justin Toole** also will move from second to shortstop on occasion.

2008 MUSIC CITY CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

After going 2-1 at the tournament and upsetting Vanderbilt, the Hawkeyes received six of the 12 spots on the all-tournament team, including the MVP.

Hawkeyes honored were: **Justin Toole** at second, **Kevin Hoef** at shortstop, **Kyle Riffel** in the outfield, **Caleb Curry** in the outfield and **Wes Freie** as utility and MVP.

THE 30-WIN CLUB:

The Hawkeyes' 31 wins in 2007 were the most under Coach Jack Dahm, in his career at Iowa, and the most at Iowa since 1993. The 1993 squad posted a 32-20 record under Duane Banks.

O'ROURKE OUT:

Senior pitcher **Casey O'Rourke** has ended his collegiate career for medical reasons following his bout with testicular cancer in 2006. He will remain on the squad as a student assistant.

O'Rourke had 11 appearances and seven starts last season. He pitched 32.2 innings and had an 8.54 ERA. The native of Williamsburg, IA, was named to the academic all-conference team last year.

2008 UNITY COUNCIL:

The Unity Council is a group elected by their teammates to communicate internally with the coaches on behalf of their teammates. This year's council includes: senior **Ben Geelan**, junior **Kevin Hoef**, junior **Justin Toole**, sophomore **Tyson Blaser**, sophomore **Michael Jacobs** and freshman **Kurtis Mueller**.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 848-772-3 (.523).

IN MEMORY OF ROSE GILMORE:

Iowa Baseball lost a true Hawkeye January 23, 2008. Long time supporter **Rose E. Gilmore** (mother of Ray Gilmore) lost her battle with cancer at the age of 77.

Rose was an Iowa City native who retired from the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics in 1996 after 19 years of dedication.

Rose also served as a Captain in the US Army and was an avid Hawkeye and Cubs fan.
