THE SETTING

Iowa (21-9) will play its first Sportsview.tv WNIT road game in its history when the Hawkeyes travel to Lincoln, NE, to play Nebraska (18-13) Monday in second round action. The game is slated for a 7:06 p.m. tip-off in the Bob Devaney Sports Center. The winner will advance to play the winner of the Arkansas at Arkansas State game in the third round.

Tickets are \$9 for lower-level reserved seats and \$7 for upper-level reserved seating. General admission tickets are \$5.

ON THE AIR

All Iowa WNIT games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. Listen to Monday's women's basketball game on KXIC-AM 800 in Iowa City, WHO-AM 1040 in Des Moines and WMT-AM 600 in Cedar Rapids. Brent Balbinot and Karen Schulte call the action.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 876 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 535-341 (.611). That includes a 284-152 (.651) mark in Big Ten games and a 238-58 (.804) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

RPI RANKINGS

Iowa ranked No. 44 in the RPI and No. 63 in strength of schedule at the conclusion of the regular season. Nebraska ranked No. 71 in the RPI and No. 54 in strength of schedule. The Big Ten ranks third in conference RPI, behind the ACC and SEC. Michigan State (4) is the highest Big Ten team ranked in the RPI, followed by Ohio State (10), Minnesota (14), Penn State (20), Iowa (44) and Purdue (45).

RAINING THREES

Iowa has made at least one 3-pointer in 207 consecutive contests. It is a streak that has occurred over a span of seven seasons. The last time the Hawkeyes did not make a 3-pointer was against Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament on March 1, 1998.

ON THIS DATE

Iowa is 0-3 in games played on March 21. The Hawkeyes lost to Louisiana Tech (66-65) in 1987, Vanderbilt (74-63) in 1996 and Virginia Tech (89-76) in 2004. All three games were in the NCAA Tournament.

NUMBER OF THE WEEK -- 12

Freshman Krista VandeVenter is only 12 rebounds shy of matching Cindy Haugejorde's Iowa single season freshman rebounding record of 237. VandeVenter has pulled down 225 boards this season and has led the Hawkeye rebounders since the first game of the season.

Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her fifth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 20th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 42, has a career record of 450-200 (.692), including a 94-58 (.618) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to four post-season tournaments (3 NCAA, 1 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (7) and Emma (4) and one son, David (2).

Bluder is 3-1 in Sportsview.tv WNIT games. Bluder is 1-3 vs. Nebraska and 12-7 against Husker Coach Conni Yori.

IOWA VS. THE WNIT FIELD

Iowa holds a 14-9 all-time record against the 15 remaining teams in the Sportsview.tv WNIT. The Hawkeyes have never faced Texas A&M, Texas A&M-CC, Arkansas State, Xavier, Chattanooga, South Florida, St. John's.

The Hawkeyes are 6-4 vs. Nebraska, 2-3 vs. SMS, 2-0 vs. West Virginia, 0-2 vs. Arkansas (0-2) and 1-0 vs. Gonzaga, Kentucky, Wake Forest and Indiana State.

HAWKEYES IN THE NATIONAL RANKINGS

As of games played through March 14, Iowa ranks sixth nationally in least fouls per game (13.6), 12th in field goal percentage (.466), 40th in assists (15.8), 44th in scoring offense (69.7) and 50th in rebounding margin (+4.5). Individually, Jamie Cavey ranks 19th in field goal percentage (.559).

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season include senior Jamie Cavey and juniors Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

LAST TIME OUT

Iowa held off two second-half comeback runs to cruise past defending WNIT champion Creighton, 67-52, Friday night inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena in the first round of the Sportsview.tv WNIT.

The Hawkeyes shut out the Bluejays' second-leading scorer, Laura Spanheimer, who had been averaging 15 points a game, for just the fourth time in her career.

And Crystal Smith, who had 13 points and four rebounds in the game, capitalized off of five steals to spark the defensive game.

Iowa got off to a 6-0 start but then let Creighton, the defending WNIT champion, get as close as a point before turning in a 15-2 run. The Hawkeyes kept control the rest of the first half and went into a break with a 35-21 lead.

Senior Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes' inside game and recorded 23 points, four rebounds and two steals. She was helped in the posts by Krista VandeVenter who helped out with 10 rebounds.

Creighton, which ends its season at 19-10, came out of the break with back-to-back layups by Angie Janis en route to a 10-2 run which narrowed the Hawkeye lead to six with 17 minutes to play.

Kristi Woodard led the Bluejays with 19 points on 9-of-18 shooting. Janis had 17 points for the game.

Iowa called a timeout during the first comeback spurt, and a very animated Bluder gave her team a pep talk.

The Hawkeyes responded with a 19-7 run which gave themselves a 16-point lead, the largest of the game.

Creighton's tenacity came back to bite Iowa again, though, and the Bluejays were able to score eight straight points in 1 1/2-minutes to cut the Hawkeyes' lead back to seven with seven minutes to play.

But the Hawkeye defense came through again and kept Creighton scoreless until 38 seconds were on the clock and Ally Thrall came off the bench for her only 3-pointer of the night.

Cavey put in six points and Smith had three in the same stretch. Johanna Solverson also had a jumper and finished with 11 points for the game.

FINAL GAME NOTES

- Iowa has now posted 21 victories this season, which equals the highest number of wins for the Hawkeyes in Coach Bluder's five-year tenure (21 in 2000-01).
- Junior Morgan Kasperek matched a career-high with eight rebounds.
- Freshman Jenee Graham collected a career-high three steals.
- Iowa improved to 13-0 when collecting more steals than its opponent, 19-1 when having a higher field goal percentage than its opponent, 12-0 when holding opponents to 59 points or less, and 17-2 when leading at halftime.
- Jamie Cavey netted 20 points or more for the seventh time this season.

SCOUTING NEBRASKA

Nebraska advanced to the second round of the Sportsview.tv WNIT with a 66-57 triumph at Marquette on March 17. The Huskers took an 11-point lead into halftime (39-28) and never looked back. Nebraska assisted on 19 of its 24 field goals and drained seven 3-pointers compared to only three by Marquette. Nebraska's Kiera Hardy scored a game-high 21 points, bolstered by 4-9 shooting from beyond the arc. Jelena Spiric tallied 13 points and eight rebounds, while Chelsea Aubry added 11 points and six boards.

Like Iowa, Nebraska finished its conference season with an even 8-8 record. Nebraska tied Oklahoma for sixth in the Big 12.

Nebraska is a very balanced basketball team. Hardy ranks first on the team in scoring (18.8 ppg), followed by five players averaging between 5.9 and 9.2 ppg. Seven of its players average between 3.1 and 5.2 rpg, with Aubry serving as the Huskers' top rebounder, averaging 5.2 rpg.

Nebraska is coached by Ankeny, IA, native Conni Yori, who is in her second season as head coach of the Huskers.

IOWA, NEBRASKA GAME NOTES

- Iowa's game at Nebraska will be the Hawkeyes' first Monday game of the season.
- Jamie Cavey has netted 502 points this season, while Crystal Smith has scored 497. Only once before (2002-03) in Iowa history has two players scored 500 points or more in a single season (Kristi Faulkner, 539; Jennie Lillis, 523).
- Nebraska Head Coach Conni Yori was a four-year letterwinner at Creighton (1982-86), then served as an assistant coach for the Bluejays for three seasons (1986-89). Yori spent two seasons as head coach at Loras College (1990-92) before rejoining Creighton as its head coach. Yori coached 10 seasons at Creighton, before current Bluejay Head Coach Jim Flanery took over the head post.
- Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder has coached against Husker Head Coach Conni Yori 19 times before when both coaches mentored in the Missouri Valley Conference. Bluder owns a 12-7 advantage over Yori in games pitted against each other when Drake and Creighton played each other.
- Iowa started its season 13-0, but went 8-9 over its last 17 games. Nebraska began its season 11-4, but finished 7-9 in its last 16 contests.
- Nebraska boasts a 12-3 home record, including posting quality wins over Baylor, Oklahoma and Iowa State. The Huskers lost their last two home games to Kansas State and Colorado. Iowa is 7-4 in road contests.
- Nebraska has one Iowans on its roster: sophomore forward Jessica Gerhart (Fenton). The Huskers also have five foreign players on its roster, three of which are starters (Chelsea Aubry, Jelena Spiric and Elena Diaz).
- Nebraska, which advanced to the second round of the 2004 Sportsview.tv WNIT knocked off Drake before falling to Oregon State, also played in the 2004 SportsView.TV Preseason WNIT. The Huskers defeated Western Illinois in the opening round, before losing at Notre Dame in the second round.
- Both Iowa and Nebraska have corralled 1,122 rebounds. The Huskers have played 31 games, while the Hawkeyes have played 30.
- Johanna Solverson recorded her 150th career steal vs. Creighton Friday night. The junior is two rebounds from collecting career board No. 400.
- Iowa and Nebraska have played seven common opponents: Western Illinois, Iowa State, Missouri, Creighton, Ohio State, Marquette and Oklahoma. The Hawkeyes compiled a record of 7-2 against the before mentioned teams, while the Huskers posted a 5-4 mark.
- Jamie Cavey scored 21 points on a perfect 9-9 shooting from the field to establish a new school record for field goal percentage vs. Marquette in the 2003 WNIT Second Round.
- Nebraska is 1-1 in overtime games this season, while Iowa is 1-0.

ALL-TIME SERIES RECORDS

Monday will mark the 11th meeting between Iowa and Nebraska, with the Hawkeyes owning a 6-4 advantage. The series is tied 2-2 in games played in Lincoln, NE.

The Huskers won the last game against the Hawkeyes (73-67) played on Dec. 8, 1996 in the Big Kona Classic in Kona, Hawaii. Nebraska won its seventh straight contest to start the season, a feat that was accomplished only once before at Nebraska when it upset then-No. 9 Iowa.

The last time Iowa visited Nebraska was in a 64-59 victory over the Huskers on Dec. 11, 1991.

Iowa is 37-29 (.561) all-time against current members of the Big 12 Conference, including a perfect 3-0 mark this year (Iowa State, Missouri and Oklahoma).

Iowa has out-scored its opponents 991-888 in the first half, 1,082-1,025 in the second half and 14-5 in overtime. The Hawkeyes have led at halftime in 19-of-30 contests. Iowa has out-scored its opponent in the second half in 15-of-30 games.

HEAD OF THE CLASS

Jamie Cavey leads Big Ten seniors in field goal percentage (.557). Crystal Smith leads conference juniors in scoring (16.6) and field goal percentage (.504), while Johanna Solverson leads league juniors in assists (4.0). Krista Vandeventer leads league freshman in rebounding (7.5).

HAWKEYES IN CRUNCH TIME

Iowa boasts a 20-1 record when Iowa leads with five minutes remaining in regulation -- with the Hawkeyes' only loss coming vs. Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa is only 1-8 when trailing or tied with five minutes left -- with the Hawkeyes' lone win coming at Creighton.

THREE HAWKEYES EARN BIG TEN HONORS

Senior Jamie Cavey, junior Crystal Smith, and freshman Krista Vandeventer were named to all-Big Ten teams. Cavey was selected to the all-Big Ten second team by the media and the third team by the coaches. Smith was a third team selection by both the media and coaches, while Vandeventer was named to the all-Freshman team.

HOME, AWAY COMPARISONS

In 15 home games, Iowa out-scored its opponents 1,098-979 (+7.9 margin), shooting 47.4 percent from the field and holding opponents to a 42.2 shooting percentage. Iowa also posted 256 assists to its opponents' 194 and attempted 108 more free throws (294-186). Iowa converted 75.5 percent of its free throws at home, while only 66.9 percent on the road. The Hawkeyes' free throw percentage is 8.6 percent better at home than on the road.

In 15 games away from Iowa City, Iowa has out-scored its opponents 989-939 (+3.3 margin). Opponents have recorded 156 steals to Iowa's 126 (-2.0 margin) on the road. Also, the Hawkeyes have recorded 53 blocks to their opponents 41 away from Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa has posted 3.27 more turnovers per game than its opponents on the road. Here are the home and away comparisons:

WINS, LOSSES COMPARISONS

In Iowa's 21 wins, the Hawkeyes boasted a +12.9 scoring margin. Iowa averaged 72.1 ppg in its victories. The Hawkeyes also shot the ball well from the field (.481), while Hawkeye opponents have not (.376). Iowa out-rebounded its opponents 829-687 in its triumphs (+6.8 margin). Iowa attempted 175 more free throws (+8.33 margin) in its victories.

In the Hawkeyes' nine defeats, Iowa converted only 42.8 percent of their field goal attempts and scored only 63.7 ppg. In addition, Iowa turned the ball over 20.7 times in the nine setbacks. Opponents collected 105 steals to Iowa's 62. Here are the wins and losses comparisons:

FRESHMAN AMONG ELITE GROUP

Krista VandeVenter leads the Hawkeyes in rebounding (7.5) through 30 games. The last time a true freshman led Iowa in rebounding was Tangela Smith (1994-95). In fact, only four other Hawkeyes have led the team in rebounding as freshman (Tangela Smith, 1994-95; Lynn Kennedy, 1983-84; Cindy Haugejorde, 1976-77; Jenni Mayer, 1975-76).

Furthermore, VandeVenter currently ranks second in rebounding for an Iowa freshman (225). She is only 12 rebounds behind Haugejorde for first (237).

VandeVenter has pulled down 225 rebounds in 30 games, which eclipses Iowa's team-leader Jennie Lillis' 180 in 29 games last season.

CAVEY CLIMBS CAREER CHARTS

Senior Jamie Cavey has amassed 502 points through 30 contests this season. The senior has totaled 1,224 career points, which ranks 13th at Iowa. Cavey is only seven points from passing Lisa Long (1983-87) for 12th.

The Mechanicsville, IA, native has also collected 90 career blocks, which ranks fourth on Iowa's career chart. Fifty-four of her 90 blocks have come this season. Jerica Watson was the last Hawkeye player to collect 50 rejections or more in a season when she blocked 59 during the 2001-02 season.

Cavey also cracked the top 20 in career rebounding at Michigan State. She has totaled 476 rebounds, which ranks 17th. Cavey is only seven boards from passing Michelle Edwards (1984-88) for 16th.

BLOCK PARTY

Senior Jamie Cavey has rejected 54 shots this season, a total that ranks fourth in a single-season at Iowa. She is five blocks from tying Jerica Watson (2001-02) for third place (59).

ATTENDANCE RANKINGS

Iowa's 14-game home attendance average (4,078) ranks 26th nationally in the latest attendance rankings released March 14. The Hawkeyes are the seventh-highest ranked Big Ten team behind No. 5 Minnesota (8,799), No. 6 Penn State (8,665), No. 7 Purdue (8,484), No. 14 Michigan State (6,143), No. 15 Wisconsin (6,047) and No. 19 Ohio State (5,143).

The Hawkeyes averaged 4,134 fans for 13 games last season.

SOLVERSON CRACKS CAREER LISTS

Johanna Solverson ranks 18th in Iowa career rebounding (398), 13th in career steals (150) and 12th in assists (268). She is four thefts from moving into 12th and 11 helpers from moving into 10th.

CAVEY ON PACE TO BREAK FG PERCENTAGE RECORD

Jamie Cavey is on pace to break the school's career field goal percentage record. Currently, Cavey is shooting .574 (481-838) for her career. Michelle Edwards holds the career mark (.535, 777-1451).

CAVEY REACHES THE CHARITY STRIPE

Senior Jamie Cavey has attempted at least one free throw in 70 of her last 72 games, dating back to the 2002-03 season. She failed to reach the free throw line vs. Indiana (1/15/04) and vs. Marquette (12/8/04).

VANDEVENTER CLEANS THE GLASS

Krista VandeVenter has been Iowa's leading rebounder in 15 of its 30 games, including the first five contests of the season. VandeVenter pulled down 11 rebounds vs. Oklahoma (11/27) and Illinois (2/24) and a career-high 14 at Creighton (12/10). The freshman averages 7.5 boards per game and ranks fifth in the Big Ten. She also ranks third in the Big Ten in offensive rebounds (2.73). The last time an Iowa player led the team in rebounding five consecutive games was Jerica Watson in the last five games of the 2001-02 season.

The Osseo, MN, native has also done a good job offensively. VandeVenter scored all of her nine points in the second half against the Sooners. She also tallied 10 points vs. Iowa State and at Michigan, 12 vs. Illinois and at Purdue and a career-best 19 on 8-11 FG and 3-5 from the charity stripe at Creighton. VandeVenter averages 7.1 ppg. The post player also ranks fourth in assists (59). She has also recorded two steals in nine games.

SHARING THE WEALTH

Iowa's triangle offense generates many assists. The Hawkeyes have three players who average 2.23 assists or more. Small forward Johanna Solverson (4.0) leads the team, followed by shooting guard Crystal Smith (2.8) and center Jamie Cavey (2.23).

HAWKEYES CAPTURE MYTHICAL STATE TITLE

Iowa captured its second mythical state title in three years. The Hawkeyes first defeated Iowa State (89-80) on Dec. 1, followed by victories over and Northern Iowa (77-50) on Dec. 8 and Drake (80-69) on Dec. 18.

FAST START

Iowa enjoyed its best start in 17 years. The Hawkeyes' 13-0 is their second-best start in school history. Only the 1987-88 Iowa team, which won its first 22 games, started better than these Hawkeyes. In addition, Iowa was the last Division I team to be beaten.

Iowa's 13-0 start, matched Coach Bluder's best start at a Division I school. The native of Marion, Iowa, guided the Drake Bulldogs to a 13-0 start in 1994 and eventually advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster features five players from the state of Iowa (Jamie Cavey, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy and Stacy Schlapkohl). The Hawkeyes also have four players from the state of Illinois (Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson, Jeneé Graham and Morgan Kasperek). Iowa's 12-person roster also features players from Missouri (Jenna Armstrong), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Louisiana (Crystal Smith).

Iowa Signs Five

Head Coach Lisa Bluder received National Letters of Intent from Megan Skouby, Lindsey Nyenhuis, Wendy Ausdemore, Nicole VanderPol and Kristi Smith to attend the University of Iowa.

"We feel this is a tremendous class that will add depth and height to our team," said Bluder about her fourth Iowa recruiting class.

Megan Skouby is a 6-6 center from Mentor, Ohio. As a junior, she led Mentor High School to a 24-2 record, averaging 17.9 points and pulling down 12.0 rebounds per contest, while shooting 63 percent from the field and 78 percent from the foul line. In her three years, the Cardinals posted a 66-10 record, including two district Division I championships. Skouby was an AP all-state honorable mention her freshman year. She was a *Street & Smith* all-America honorable mention and AP third team all-State her sophomore season. Last year, Skouby earned AP first team all-State laurels.

Wendy Ausdemore is a 6-2 forward from Neola, Iowa. She was named MVP of Tri-Center High School's basketball and volleyball teams the last three years. Ausdemore earned 2003 first team all-state and all-conference laurels in basketball. She was named the Southwest Iowa Volleyball Player of the Year, earned second team all-state and first team all-conference accolades in 2003. Ausdemore was named the 2004 AAU 17-and under Outstanding Amateur Athlete.

Kristi Smith, a 5-6 point guard from Thornton, Colorado, competes for Horizon High School. She has been a three-year starter and earned first team all-conference accolades. Last year, Smith was named to the Class 5A all-tournament team and also was recognized on the all-state team. As a junior, she helped advance her high school team to the Class 5A Final Four.

Lindsey Nyenhuis, a 5-7 guard from Grand Rapids, Michigan, competes for Forest Hills Northern High School. A two-year team captain and all-conference selection, she became the first girl to reach 1,000 points at her high school. Nyenhuis was also an all-state and all-area honorable mention selection. She also played for the Western Lakers AAU team for eight years. The Lakers won six-of-seven AAU state championships and finished in the "Sweet 16" three times at AAU nationals.

Nicole VanderPol is a 6-1 forward from Grundy Center, Iowa. Competing for Grundy Center High School, VanderPol is a three-time all-conference selection and was named Most Valuable Player in her conference as a sophomore and junior. As a junior, VanderPol averaged 19.1 ppg and 9.7 rpg in leading the Spartans to a runner-up finish at the Class 2A state tournament, where she earned all-tournament accolades. She was named first team all-State by the *Des Moines Register*, the Iowa Newspaper Association and North Central District.

This is the second time Bluder has put together a five-player recruiting class. Bluder inked Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson, Morgan Kasperek, Crystal Smith and Tiffany Reedy in the fall of 2001, which was her first recruiting class at Iowa.

IOWA FAST BREAKS

- The Hawkeyes won their final four regular season games after going 3-8 during the middle portion of their difficult Big Ten schedule.
- Iowa and Michigan State were the only schools to have two student-athletes rank in the top ten in overall rebounding in the Big Ten (MSU: Liz Shimek and Kelli Roehrig; IOWA: Krista VandeVenter and Jamie Cavey).
- The Hawkeyes are one of only four conference teams to have three or more players average double figures in scoring (Michigan State, Ohio State, Penn State and Iowa).
- Iowa has controlled the opening tip in 18-of-30 games.
- Iowa ranks third in the Big Ten in overall games scoring (69.7), field goal percentage (.466) and rebounds allowed (32.9) and fourth in 3-point field goal percentage (.341), rebounding margin (+4.5) and assists (15.83).
- All 11 Iowa players scored at least one point for the first time this season in Iowa's big win over Michigan on 3/3/05.

- Iowa's bench was unable to score any points for the first time this season in the Hawkeyes two-point defeat vs. Penn State in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals. Additionally, the bench only produced two rebounds, two assists and four turnovers. The bench played only 17 minutes.
- Iowa is 12-0 when yielding 59 points or less, 19-1 when the Hawkeyes have a higher field goal percentage than their opponent and 13-0 when collecting more steals.
- Iowa yielded a school record two offensive rebounds the entire game to No. 2 Ohio State on Feb. 13.
- Indiana only attempted one free throw in Iowa's 56-63 victory in Bloomington on Feb. 27. The one attempt from the foul line is a school record for an Iowa opponent in a single game.
- Iowa is 21-9, marking the 13th time in school history that the Hawkeyes have posted 20 victories or more. Furthermore, it also is the second time Iowa has reached the 20-win plateau under Coach Bluder (21 in 2000-01).
- Iowa has recorded eight top 100 wins, including three top 50 victories. Twelve of the Hawkeyes' 20 triumphs have come vs. teams over 100 in the RPI.
- Iowa stopped Michigan's seven-game Big Ten Tournament opening game winning streak with a 28-point triumph (70-42) in the first round. The 28-point victory is the Hawkeyes' largest margin of victory this year.
- Junior Ebone Pope scored her first career point vs. Michigan on 3/3/05, converting 1-2 free throws in the final minute of the game.
- The Hawkeyes have attempted 566 free throws compared to their opponents' 356. Iowa has attempted 210 more free throws than its opponents, attempting 7.0 more free throws per game than its opponent.
- Iowa's single-game season high in attendance is 5,753 (Northwestern).
- Jamie Cavey has scored double figures in 28-of-30 games this year and 54 of the last 56 contests dating back to last season.
- Iowa has held six teams to 53 points or less (Indiana -- 51; UW-Milwaukee -- 51; Southern Illinois -- 50; Northern Iowa -- 50; Oklahoma -- 47; Northwestern -- 40, Indiana -- 53, Michigan -- 42, Creighton -- 52).
- Twenty-five of Iowa's 30 opponents have shot less than 50 percent from the field. Ohio State shot 54.2 percent on Jan. 13 and 57.1 percent on Feb. 13 against the Hawkeyes.
- Iowa has had more assists than its opponents in 22-of-30 games and have shot more free throws in 27-of-30 contests.
- The Hawkeyes posted season highs in field goal percentage (.615, 32-52) and 3-pointers made (11) vs. Illinois on Feb. 24.
- Iowa was 3-0 against teams from the Big XII (Iowa State, Missouri, Oklahoma) and 4-0 vs. Missouri Valley Conference teams (Drake, Southern Illinois, Creighton, Northern Iowa).
- The victory over No. 21 Oklahoma marked Iowa's first win over a ranked opponent on a neutral floor since dropping Minnesota (80-77) on March 3, 2003 in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Iowa is 3-5 in overtime games under Coach Bluder.
- Iowa's 54-47 victory over then-No. 21 Oklahoma in the championship game of the Junkanoo Jam marked the first time the Hawkeyes won a game scoring 54 points or less since a 50-47 triumph over Michigan State on Feb. 22, 2001, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

COMEBACK KIDS

Iowa has posted two substantial second half comebacks this season and nearly pulled off a third.

The Hawkeyes trailed by 17 points with 16 minutes remaining vs. Northwestern on Jan. 16. Iowa rallied to win 81-76 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa erased a 15-point second half deficit with 13 minutes left in regulation at Creighton on Dec. 10. The Hawkeyes won 91-82 in overtime in the Omaha Civic Auditorium.

The Hawkeyes trailed by as many as 20 points with 11:30 remaining vs. Penn State on Jan. 6. Iowa trimmed the Lady Lion advantage to two points with 3:30 left, but were unable to tie or take the lead down the stretch. Penn State won the contest 77-71 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes' biggest comeback under Coach Bluder was a 19-point second half rally with 19 minutes remaining to bounce Indiana (81-76) from the 2001 Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

IOWA BENCH PRODUCES

Iowa's bench play has been one of the keys to its 21-9 record. Iowa's bench has outscored and out-rebounded its opponents 441-390 and 292-213, respectively. The Hawkeyes average 14.7 ppg and 9.7 rpg from their bench players. Iowa has out-scored 16-of-30 opponents in bench points.

THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

Guard Crystal Smith has been one of league's top offensive and defensive player through nine games. The junior was named MVP of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and Junkanoo Jam. Smith ranks second on the team and fifth in Big Ten in scoring (16.6), first on the team and eighth in conference free throw percentage (.787) and first on the team and fourth in league steals (2.4). The native of Haughton, LA, netted 20 points or more nine times, which ranks seventh in the Big Ten. She netted a career-high 33 points at Drake on Dec. 18. Smith's performances turned some heads around the nation.

"Crystal is just an outstanding player," said Iowa State Head Coach Bill Fennelly. "She's an impact player on both ends of the floor. I hope we don't have to play a guard as good as her the rest of the season."

"I've been around the game a long time and Crystal is as good a player I've ever seen," said Northern Iowa Head Coach Tony DiCecco. "She has a lot of tools. She's extremely difficult to defend because at a split second she's at full speed. She's lightning quick and I tip my hat to her."

"She's so lightning fast. She has to be the most improved player in the Big Ten," said Penn State Head Coach Rene Portland.

Center Jamie Cavey has been a force down in the post. The senior tri-captain, ranks first on the team and sixth in the Big Ten in scoring (16.7) and first on the team and third in the conference in field goal percentage (.558).

Cavey has scored double figures in 28-of-30 contests. Furthermore, she has scored double digits in 70 of her last 72 games, dating back to the 2002-03 season. Cavey has led Iowa in scoring 12 of the last 17 contests. She was named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and Junkanoo Jam all-Tournament teams.

EMMERT MAKES HISTORY

Abby Emmert became only the second Iowa freshman to start at point guard. Prior to this season, Cara Consuegra was Iowa's only freshman to start at point guard (1997).

FRESHMEN START FOR HAWKEYES

Power forward Krista VandeVenter has started all 30 games, while point guard Abby Emmert started 14 contests.

Emmert and VandeVenter became the first Iowa freshmen duo to start since the 1994-95 season where newcomers Tiffany Gooden and Tangela Smith started 17 and 15 games, respectively.

RICHARDS TO REDSHIRT

Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder on Jan. 11, announced that junior point guard Lindsay Richards will redshirt this season.

"Lindsay has decided to take the redshirt this year," said Bluder. "I think it's a great decision. For us to have her healthy for two full years will be a great benefit to our program."

The junior has recovered and has been participating in practices.

"There's a big difference between being able to participate and being able to compete," commented Richards. "At this time I don't feel I'm at the level I need to be at."

Richards underwent successful surgery on July 7 to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee. The native of Barrington, IL, sustained the injury during practice with the Big Ten All-Stars before the team left for Australia in June, 2004. This was the second time in as many years she underwent surgery to repair a damaged ACL in her right knee. Richards' first ACL injury came in a home game against Denver on December 12, 2002.

Richards started all 29 games for the Hawkeyes last year. She ranked fifth on the team in scoring (5.4 ppg) and free throw percentage (39-51, .765), second in assists (85) and fourth in steals (27). Her 2.93 assists average ranked 11th in the Big Ten. Richards was also an academic all-Big Ten selection last year.

Before injuring her knee as a freshman, she played in eight games as a reserve, averaging 4.5 ppg, 1.6 rpg and dishing out 29 assists. Richards will not receive a medical redshirt for her freshman season.

HAWKEYES ADD WALK-ON

Head Coach Lisa Bluder announced that Ebone Pope has been added to the 2004-05 roster as a walk-on. The 5-9 guard will wear No. 15.

Pope was a two-year starter at Marshalltown Community College. Pope averaged a team-best 11.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 2.7 apg last year. She was team captain, earned first team all-conference and first team all-tournament honors last season. The native of Ottumwa, IA, averaged 9.0 ppg and earned all-region honorable mention accolades her freshman year.

She graduated from Ottumwa High School in 2002, where she averaged 14.5 ppg, 3.5 apg and 3.3 rpg. Pope earned second team all-conference laurels her junior and senior years. Her high school team competed in the state tournament her senior season.

Pope joins Kristi Faulkner (2001-04) as the only walk-ons to make a Hawkeye roster under Coach Bluder.

JANE MEYER APPOINTED TO NCAA BASKETBALL COMMITTEE

University of Iowa Senior Associate Athletic Director Jane Meyer has been appointed by the NCAA Championships/Competition Cabinet to the 10-member Division I Women's Basketball Committee. Meyer's five-year term begins Sept., 2005 and continues through Sept., 2010. Meyer joins Jacki Silar of Duke and Tina Cheatham of the Southland Conference as new additions to the committee.

The basketball committee is responsible for the administration of the NCAA Basketball Championship Tournament. One of its primary functions is the selection of teams and creation of the bracket for the annual tournament. The committee also selects sites for future tournaments and assigns crews of officials.

"With my background in basketball, I have always had an interest in serving on this committee," said Meyer. "This is a good opportunity to represent our institution and conference."

Meyer's appointment marks the first time an Iowa athletic director has been chosen to the Women's Basketball Committee. Bob Bowsby has been on the Men's Basketball Committee the past five seasons, serving as chair the last two.

HAWKEYES WIN TOURNAMENTS

Iowa won two holiday tournaments this season. The Hawkeyes opened the season with wins over Southern Illinois (66-50) and Missouri (75-54) to claim its 16th KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge championship.

One week later, the Hawkeyes defeated Florida (65-62) and then-No. 21 Oklahoma (54-47) to capture the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas.

Crystal Smith was named MVP of both tournaments. Smith averaged 12.0 ppg and was the defensive star of the Junkanoo Jam. The junior averaged 17.5 ppg and 3.5 spg in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge. The native of Haughton, LA, scored 26 points in the championship game vs. Missouri, shattering her previous career high (10 points). Furthermore, Smith was a perfect 7-7 from the foul line, setting new career highs in free throws made and attempted.

Jamie Cavey joined Smith on both all-tournament teams. Cavey averaged 15.5 ppg and 5.0 rpg in the Junkanoo Jam and 12.5 ppg in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge. Johanna Solverson joined Smith and Cavey on the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge all-tournament team. Solverson averaged 12.5 ppg in the two games and was a perfect 6-6 shooting from the field, including 4-4 from beyond the arc in Iowa's first round 66-50 win over Southern Illinois. The four 3-pointers is a career high, as is her game-high six steals against the Salukis.

HY-VEE CY-HAWK SERIES

Iowa leads the inaugural Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series 9-8. Iowa has recorded victories in football (17-10), women's basketball (89-80), women's swimming and diving (214-85) and men's basketball (70-63). Iowa State won in women's soccer (6-1), wrestling (19-16) and women's gymnastics twice (195.575-192.4 and 195.85-194.15).



A point system will track each institution's performance and will culminate in one institution winning the annual trophy for the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series. Intercollegiate athletic teams from Iowa and Iowa State will square off in head-to-head competition nine different times during the 2004-05 academic year. The competition this year is in men's basketball, women's basketball, wrestling, women's gymnastics, women's soccer, softball and women's swimming and diving. Additional points will be available for each school to secure based on successful performance in the classroom by its student-athletes. Listed below is the upcoming competition schedule:

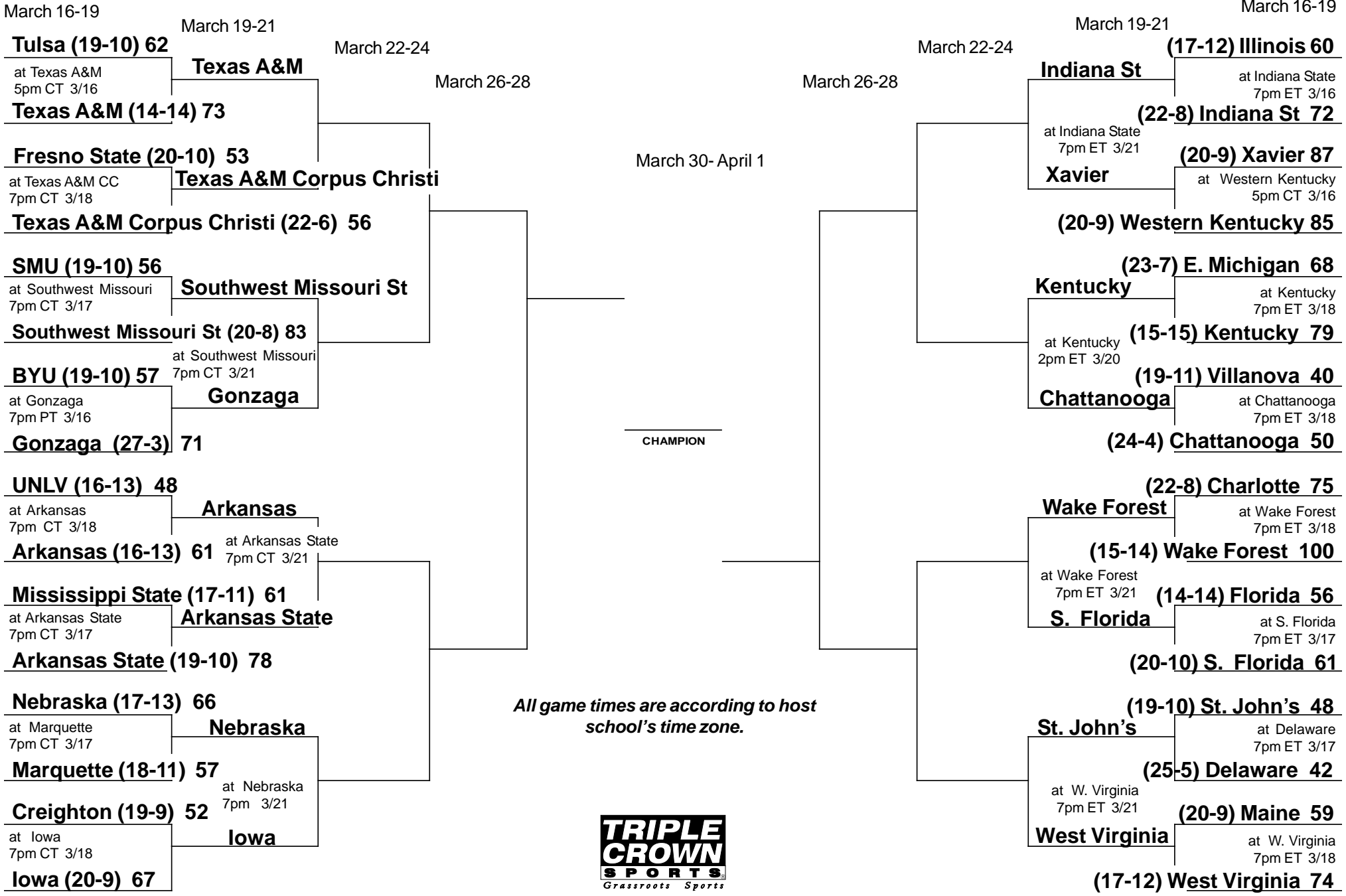

Game 1

Iowa 66, Southern Illinois 50

Nov. 19, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY -- Iowa opened its 2004-05 season on a high note, winning its first round game 66-50 over Southern Illinois in the KCRG-TV 9 Hawkeye Challenge.

Ten of Iowa's 11 players scored two points or more en route to a season opening victory. Leading by 10 at halftime (26-16), the Hawkeyes went on a 23-8 run in the first seven minutes of the second half to stretch their lead to 25 points (49-24). The Salukis outscored the Hawkeyes 19-7 in the final 6:30 to close the gap to 16 (66-50) by games end.

Iowa was led by Johanna Solverson. The native of Lake Zurich, IL, shot a perfect 6-6 from the field, including 4-4 from three-point range. The 4-4 shooting from beyond the arc tied a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for 3-point field goal percentage. Solverson also collected four assists and a career-high six steals. Tri-captain Jamie Cavey tallied 12 points and four assists. Tri-captain Crystal Smith recorded nine points, five rebounds and three assists. Morgan Kasperek posted career highs in points (8) and rebounds (6), while Jenna Armstrong dished out a career-high six assists.

Iowa's defense didn't allow for many easy baskets down low for Southern Illinois. The Salukis scored only 10 points in the paint and were forced to score a majority of their points from the perimeter. In fact, Southern Illinois converted 7-29 three-pointers, which broke the arena record for three-point attempts.

Iowa improved to 5-0 in season opening games under Coach Bluder.

IOWA CITY -- Iowa won its 16th Hawkeye Challenge with a dominating performance in a 75-54 victory over Missouri in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Crystal Smith, Johanna Solverson and Jamie Cavey were named to the all-tournament team, while Smith was tabbed as the MVP.

IOWA CITY - - After a slightly sloppy first half of play that saw the home team play perhaps a little too generous a host, Coach Lisa Bluder's Iowa Hawkeyes got serious about protecting their home court and their unblemished record, and ran away from the Northern Iowa Panthers en route to a 77-50 victory at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The win pushed the record for Bluder's Bunch to a perfect 6-0 -- the best start for the Iowa Hawkeyes since the 1995-96 season when Iowa won its first seven games.

The Hawkeyes turned a 40-28 halftime lead into a 21-point margin by outscoring Northern Iowa 14-5 during the first 10 minutes of the second stanza. Iowa never led by less than 20 during the last 10 minutes of the second half. That was in sharp contrast to the first half when Iowa built a double-digit lead only to see UNI trim it to six, 27-21, when Tara King dropped a jumper with 6:10 to play.

Iowa was led in scoring by Crystal Smith who scored a game-high 21 points. Stacy Schlapkohl added 18 and Jamie Cavey 14. Hawkeye guard Abby Emmert paced Iowa's rebounding attack with eight - all coming on the defensive end of the floor.

Defense again proved big for the Hawkeyes. In addition to outrebounding their visitors by nine, Iowa limited the Panthers to just 38 percent shooting from the field and forced 21 turnovers.

Iowa also again enjoyed big-time contributions from its bench, getting 31 points from its non-starters.

Iowa 91, Creighton 82 (OT)

OMAHA, NE - - Forget about what happened in the first 27 minutes of Iowa's first true road game of the season at Creighton. It's what happened in the final 13 minutes of regulation and overtime that's important. The Hawkeyes went from being left for dead and handed its first loss of the season to registering a thrilling 91-82 victory over the Bluejays.

The home team took its largest lead of the game (15 points) at the 13:19 mark of the second half. Iowa responded by going on a 28-12 run over the next nine minutes to take a 71-70 lead.

Leading the charge for the Hawkeyes was Crystal Smith, who scored seven of her team-high 23 points during the run. Iowa also got six points from Krista VandeVenter and four points and a handful of rebounds from Jamie Cavey.

The lead changed hands three times and there were three ties in the final four minutes. The last tie came after Smith gave Iowa a 77-75 lead on a lay-up with 41 seconds to play. Creighton's Laura Spanheimer made a pair of free throws with 25 ticks left to play to send the game into overtime.

Supercharged by their comeback, the Hawkeyes out-scored Creighton 11-5 in the first three minutes of overtime thanks to six points by Solverson. Iowa successfully snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.

Iowa scored a season-high 91 points, 58 of which coming in the paint where Iowa claimed a slim 42-37 edge on the glass thanks to huge nights by VandeVenter and Cavey, who took down a career-high 14 and 10 rebounds, respectively.

Smith was one of four Hawkeyes to score in double-figures. Cavey added 20, VandeVenter a career-high 19, and Solverson 13 for the victors, who shot a blistering 70 percent from the field in the second half and 83 percent in overtime.

MILWAUKEE, WI (AP) - - Johanna Solverson led the way with a career-high 23 points as 18th-ranked Iowa wiped out a five-point halftime deficit and beat Wisconsin-Milwaukee 59-51.

The Hawkeyes shot only 28.1 percent in the first half, which ended with the Panthers leading 30-25.

But the Hawkeyes made 53.3 percent after the break while holding the Panthers to 29.2 percent for the half and 30.4 percent for the game.

Jamie Cavey added 18 points and six rebounds and Crystal Smith had 13 points and a career-high six steals for Iowa. Like Smith, Solverson also totaled six assists to equal a career high.

Aubrey Hampton scored 11 points and Teri Huff 10 to lead the Panthers.

The Hawkeyes did not yield a single point in the final 3:08 and scored the final nine points en route to victory.

Iowa dominated the post, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 44-6 in the paint. Ten of the Panthers's 17 field goals were 3-pointers. UW-Milwaukee out-score the Hawkeyes 30-6 from beyond the arc. Iowa shot a season-low 11.8 percent (2-17) from 3-point range. The Hawkeyes forced 22 turnovers and scored 24 points off the miscues.

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Jess Strom and Penn State saw to it that Iowa's stint as the nation's only unbeaten team was short.

Strom scored nine of her career-high 29 points in the final 2:18 and Penn State held on after blowing most of a 20-point lead to beat Iowa 77-71.

Iowa had been left as the nation's lone unbeaten Division I team after top-ranked LSU lost at Rutgers on Jan. 5. But the Hawkeyes couldn't quite make it all the way back after trailing 59-39 with less than 12 minutes to play.

Tanisha Wright and Jennifer Harris each scored 18 points for Penn State, which has played a brutal schedule and pulled off its third major upset. The Lady Lions also knocked off then-No. 2 North Carolina and No. 9 Ohio State, both at home.

Iowa got 18 points from Johanna Solverson and a huge lift from reserves Jeneé Graham and Morgan Kasperek, with each finishing with 11 points.

With Graham and Kasperek providing the spark, Iowa outscored Penn State 10-3 to cut the lead to 62-49. Solverson's 3-pointer capped a 13-0 run that drew the Hawkeyes to 64-62 with 3:50 to play and they trailed 66-64 after Kasperek's layup with 2:47 remaining.

But Iowa couldn't get the defensive stop it needed to tie or take the lead and Strom took over down the stretch, scoring on a driving layup and making seven of eight free throws to keep Penn State on top.

Penn State kept Iowa's leading scorer, the ultra-quick Crystal Smith, bottled up most of the game. Smith was scoreless in the first half and finished with nine points, half her average. Iowa center Jamie Cavey, averaging 15.7 points, scored only six on 3-for-10 shooting.

Penn State finished with a season-high 10 3-pointers in 21 attempts.

IOWA CITY - Senior Jamie Cavey scored 29 points and Iowa overcame a 17-point second half deficit to beat Northwestern (81-76) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win snapped a three-game losing streak for the Hawkeyes.

The Hawkeyes rallied to score 54 second half points, one point shy of the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record set vs. Western Illinois in 2000.

Cavey scored 16 of her team-high 29 points in the second half, 12 in the first 10 minutes, to tie the game at 54 with 9:33 to play. Junior Crystal Smith added 18 points and Krista VandeVenter contributed eight points and nine rebounds for Iowa.

WEST LAFAYETTE, IN - Iowa dropped its seventh straight game to Purdue and its seventh consecutive contest in West Lafayette, with a heart-breaking 79-75 loss in Mackey Arena.

The game was a back-and-forth affair that saw 26 lead changes and eight ties. Iowa took a three-point halftime advantage (34-31) into the locker-room, holding Purdue to 39.4 percent (13-33) shooting from the field.

The Boilermakers were a different team in the second half. Purdue shot a blazing 73.1 percent (19-26) in the second stanza to lift the home team to its 11th victory of the season. Iowa led 51-50 with 9:37 to play in the game and then Purdue scored on 10 of its next 11 possessions to take the lead and hold on down the stretch.

The Hawkeyes allowed 42 points in the paint and 21 points off turnovers. Iowa almost collected as many turnovers (22) as field goals made (23).

Jamie Cavey and Crystal Smith fueled Iowa's offense. Cavey, who netted career point No. 1,000 in the first half, tallied a game-high 22 points (7-12 FG, 8-8 FT), while Smith amassed 21 points (7-17 FG, 5-6 FT). Jenna Armstrong scored all 12 Iowa bench points on 4-6 shooting from beyond the arc, while Krista VandeVenter netted eight of her 12 points at the foul line in defeat.

Purdue's Katie Geraldts scored 17 of her team-high 19 points in the second half. She converted 6-9 from the field, including 3-3 from 3-point range and 2-2 from the charity stripe in the second stanza. Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton also netted 19 points, while Aya Traore added a career-high 16 points.

Iowa converted 84.6 percent from the foul line (22-26) in the loss.

In addition, the loss was Iowa's first when leading at the half this season (11-1) and first in 20 games dating back to last season. The 75 points Iowa scored were the most the Hawkeyes scored in Mackey Arena since 1987.

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Jessica Davenport scored 21 points and converted a key 3-point play late in the game that enabled No. 2 Ohio State to hold off Iowa 67-60 for its 13th straight victory.

Caity Matter added 18 points for the Buckeyes and hit a 3-pointer with just under five minutes left to break the game's final tie. Ohio State used a 16-0 run to erase a 12-point Iowa advantage in the first half, then went on a 13-2 second-half run to take the lead for good.

Iowa led 53-47 when Krista VandeVenter scored on a putback with 11:47 remaining, then made only two baskets the rest of the way. Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes with 22 points, 14 in the second half and 10 rebounds.

Beth Howe started Ohio State's decisive rally with a jumper and Davenport, who had been scoreless the first 13 minutes of the half, hit consecutive shots inside to tie it at 53. Then, with the score tied at 55, Iowa's Jenna Armstrong lost the ball driving into the lane and Kim Wilburn hit Matter for a wide open 3 on the right wing. Tamarah Riley followed with a basket inside to complete the run, making it 60-55.

Cavey's final basket cut the lead to three with four minutes to play, but the Hawkeyes came up empty on their next three possessions and the Buckeyes finally got the ball to Davenport on the low block.

The 6-foot-4 sophomore was fouled by Cavey as she hit a turnaround and sank the free throw, making it 63-57 with 1:15 remaining.

Brandie Hoskins added 14 points for Ohio State, while Wilburn finished with eight steals and six assists. Crystal Smith scored 12 for Iowa and Armstrong had 11.

Iowa made seven 3-pointers, three by Armstrong, and got four baskets inside from Cavey in zooming to its early lead. Iowa went on a 14-2 run to open a 34-22 lead with 6:07 left in the first half.

Iowa didn't score again in the half, missing eight straight shots.

#9 Michigan State 67, Iowa 60

Feb. 17, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Michigan State posted 23 turnovers, but the ninth-ranked Spartans survived, beating Iowa 67-60 on Thursday night behind Liz Shimek's 20 points and 13 rebounds.

The other half of Michigan State's inside duo, Kelli Roehrig, hit two key baskets during a late 12-2 run that wiped out Iowa's only lead and gave the Spartans their seventh straight victory.

Iowa played its second consecutive strong game against a top-ten opponent but couldn't stay with the Spartans down the stretch. The Hawkeyes lost to Ohio State 67-60 last Sunday.

Crystal Smith led Iowa with 19 points and Jamie Cavey scored 16, though Cavey shot just 5-for-15. She was a 57.7 percent shooter coming in.

Roehrig was limited to 15 minutes because of foul trouble but still contributed 10 points for Michigan State, including six in the final 4:34. She fouled out with 47.8 seconds remaining.

Michigan State trailed for a total of 24 seconds during the first six games of its winning streak and was behind for just 19 seconds in this one. That happened when Smith hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give Iowa a 50-48 lead with 5:19 to play.

Shimek sank two free throws to tie it at 50 with five minutes remaining; after Smith missed a jumper, Roehrig scored on a follow to put Michigan State back in the lead. Iowa then threw the ball away and the 6-foot-4 Roehrig beat the defense down the floor for a layup, making it 54-50.

The Spartans built their lead to 60-52 before Iowa made a final run, drawing to 62-58 on Smith's two free throws with 47.8 seconds left. But Michigan State made five-of-six free throws to secure the win.

Michigan State led 40-29 early in the second half before Iowa rallied, getting a 3-pointer from Tiffany Reedy and the two from Smith to take its brief lead.

IOWA CITY - - Iowa won its second straight conference game for the first time since the Hawkeyes won its first two league contests with a 24-point victory (87-63) over Illinois in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The triumph was Iowa's largest during conference play and secured the Hawkeyes the sixth seed in the Big Ten Tournament.

The Hawkeyes were led by a pair of seniors, who played their final regular season home game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Both teams exchanged early baskets before the Hawkeyes took command. Iowa led 22-15 with 12:49 left before Iowa went on a 30-10 run to close the first half and start the second to grab a comfortable 27-point cushion (52-25). The Hawkeyes led by as many as 28 points twice in the second half.

In addition to Iowa's two seniors, a pair of freshmen also helped propel Iowa to victory. Krista Vandeventer notched her second career double-double, netting 12 points and hauling in a game-high 11 rebounds. Abby Emmert scored a career-high nine points on a perfect 3-3 shooting from beyond the arc. The nine points are four more than she had combined in the previous 13 conference games played. In addition, she had only attempted one 3-pointer all season prior to her 3-3 performance.

Illinois was led by Tiffanie Guthrie, who tallied 21 points and seven rebounds. Angelina Williams netted 17 points, but was only 7-24 shooting from the field and 3-10 from beyond the arc.

BLOOMINGTON, IN - - In their final Big Ten regular season game, the Hawkeyes defeated the Indiana Hoosiers, 56-53. Iowa used a clutch 9-0 run late in the second half to finish 19-8 overall. Additionally, for the first time in school history the Hawkeyes finish league play with an even 8-8 record.

Indiana went on a 10-2 run late in the first half to give them a 24-22 lead. The Hawkeyes responded with a Jamie Cavey layup and a 3-pointer by Jenna Armstrong with four seconds left in the half. Iowa led 27-24 at halftime.

In the second stanza, Crystal Smith and Tiffany Reedy combined to score 11 points in 6:50 to give Iowa a 39-35 lead. After an Indiana layup at the 5:53 mark, Smith nailed a triple from the deep corner to put the Hawkeyes up 44-42 and they never looked back.

Iowa out-scored the Hoosiers 8-0 at the charity stripe. The Hawkeyes attempted 12 more free throws than Indiana (13-1). In fact, the one free throw attempt by Indiana is an Iowa school record for fewest free throw attempts by an opponent in a single game.

Indiana was led by Jamie Gathing and Jamey Chapman. Gathing tallied 13 points, while Chapman posted a double-double with 12 points and a game-high 11 rebounds.

The Hawkeyes made two less field goals than the Hoosiers, but still came away with the win. The last time an opponent made more field goals than Iowa and still lost was February 15, 2004, also at Indiana (28-26).

INDIANAPOLIS, IN - - Iowa's streaking women's basketball team registered its fourth straight victory with a 70-42 win over Michigan in first-round action of the 2005 Big Ten Conference Women's Basketball Tournament at Consecro Fieldhouse.

The Hawkeyes rode the horses that have led Iowa's charge from the start of the 2004-05 campaign - junior guard Crystal Smith and senior center Jamie Cavey - to their 12th all-time victory in Big Ten Tournament action. Smith scored a game-high 23 points on 9-of-15 shooting from the field - a mark that included a career-high four three-point buckets in eight tries - four steals and four rebounds. Cavey scored 15 points and grabbed four rebounds.

Abby Emmert added six points and Jenna Armstrong and Krista VandeVenter five each. Johanna Solverson paced Iowa with seven rebounds.

BreAnne McPhilamy paced Michigan with 12 points. Tabitha Pool grabbed a game-high nine rebounds.

Iowa shot 51 percent from the field for the game, hitting 25-of-49 field goal attempts including six three-pointers. The Hawkeyes limited Michigan to just 33 percent success from the field and allowed the Wolverines only four attempts from the charity stripe.

Michigan trimmed Iowa's lead to nine at 35-26 when Ta'Shia Walker sank a pair of free throws at 14:47. Iowa responded with an 8-2 run sparked by a pair of three-point buckets by Smith to push margin to 43-28.

Nine minutes later - a period marred by fouls and sloppy play on both ends of the court - Iowa held a 18-point advantage at 57-39 thanks to nine straight points by Smith. Iowa rolled from there and closed the door by scoring the game's last eight points.

Iowa shot a blistering 65 percent from the field in the second half while totally shutting down the Wolverine offense.

#23 Penn State 68, Iowa 66

INDIANAPOLIS, IN (AP) - Tanisha Wright scored 17 points to help Penn State rally in the second half and beat Iowa 68-66 in a Big Ten tournament quarterfinal.

Jess Strom had 21 points and Ashli Schwab added 10 points and 12 rebounds for the third-seeded Lady Lions, who advanced to play Michigan State in the semifinals.

The Lady Lions looked to be in trouble trailing by eight points with less than nine minutes left, but Wright took over. She scored six points during an 8-0 run to put Penn State ahead 60-59 with 3:10 left.

Following an Iowa free throw to tie the game at 60, Wright hit a jumper and Schwab grabbed an offensive rebound and scored to put Penn State up 64-60.

The Hawkeyes got within 68-66 after Crystal Smith's runner with nine seconds left. They had a chance to win it, but Smith's heave from beyond halfcourt fell short.

Jamie Cavey had 21 points, 10 rebounds and blocked an Iowa Big Ten Tournament record five shots for the Hawkeyes. Johanna Solverson scored 20 and Smith added 16 points, four assists and four steals.

Penn State took control of the game midway through the first half after building a 28-17 advantage. But the Hawkeyes used a 13-0 run to take a 30-28 lead with 2:30 left. The Lady Lions missed eight straight shots and went nearly six minutes without a basket.

Iowa quickly built its lead to 42-33 early in the second half after Cavey's jumper. Penn State battled back, getting six straight points from Strom to cut the deficit to 49-46 with 9:35 left.

Cavey responded with an off-balance jumper and Jenna Armstrong's 3-pointer pushed Iowa's lead back to 54-46.

IOWA CITY - Iowa held off two second-half comeback runs to cruise past Creighton, 67-52, Friday night inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena in the first round of the Sportsview.tv WNIT.

The Hawkeyes shut out the Bluejays' second-leading scorer, Laura Spanheimer, who had been averaging 15 points a game, for just the fourth time in her career.

Crystal Smith, who had 13 points and four rebounds in the game, capitalized off of five steals to spark the defensive game.

Iowa got off to a 6-0 start but let Creighton, the defending WNIT champion, get as close as a point before turning in a 15-2 run. The Hawkeyes kept control the rest of the first half and went into a break with a 35-21 lead.

Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes' inside game and recorded 23 points, four rebounds and two steals. She was helped in the posts by Krista VandeVenter who helped out with 10 rebounds.

Creighton, which ends its season at 19-10, came out of the break with back-to-back layups by Angie Janis en route to a 10-2 run which narrowed the Hawkeye lead to six with 17 minutes to play.

Iowa called a timeout during the first comeback spurt, and a very animated Bluder gave her team a pep talk.

The Hawkeyes responded with a 19-7 run which gave themselves a 16-point lead, the largest of the game.

Creighton's tenacity came back to bite Iowa again, though, and the Bluejays were able to score eight straight points in 1 1/2-minutes to cut the Hawkeyes' lead back to seven with seven minutes to play.

But the Hawkeye defense came through again and kept Creighton scoreless until 38 seconds were on the clock and Ally Thrall came off the bench for her only 3-pointer of the night.

Cavey put in six points and Smith had three in the same stretch. Johanna Solverson also had a jumper and finished with 11 points for the game.
