Iowa Returns to NCAA Tournament • A season that was filled with numerous knee injuries did not keep the 2005-06 Iowa Hawkeyes from achieving success. Three starters suffering season-ending ACL injuries and two reserves missing substantial time due to knee injuries only propelled the freshman class to contribute and help lead the Hawkeyes to a first-division finish in the Big Ten and receive an at-large berth to the NCAA Tournament.

Iowa finished the season 17-12 overall and placed fifth outright in the Big Ten with a 10-6 mark. Playing in its 16th NCAA Tournament, Iowa lost to 20th-ranked BYU (67-62) in the first round in Denver.

The Hawkeyes were led by senior Crystal Smith, who was a consensus all-Big Ten first team selection, and Big Ten Freshman of the Year Megan Skouby. The inside-outside punch of Skouby and Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, which was tops in the Big Ten.

Iowa has advanced to the postseason all six years under Head Coach Lisa Bluder, including four NCAA Tournament appearances, and has guided the Black and Gold to four first-division finishes in the Big Ten.

Iowa History • Iowa has played 908 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 554-354 (.610). That includes a 277-131 (.679) mark in Big Ten games and a 249-61 (.803) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Trifecta • Iowa, Ohio State and Florida are the only schools to have played in a January football bowl game and have both its men and women's basketball teams compete in the NCAA Tournament in 2005-06. Additionally, Iowa, Michigan State and Ohio State are the only Big Ten teams to have both its men and women in the 2006 NCAA Tournament.

Underclassmen Step Up • Iowa's freshman class of Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith, Wendy Ausdemore, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis stepped up and accounted for 42.5 percent of Iowa's offense. Iowa's sophomore class of Krista Vandeventer, Abby Emmert and Stacy Schlapkohl was responsible for 20.6 percent of Iowa's offense. Combined, the underclassmen accounted for 63.1 percent of Iowa's offense, which bodes well for the future.

Hawkeyes Sustain Numerous Knee Injuries • The Hawkeyes had five players suffer knee injuries during the 2005-06 campaign. Below is a timeline of the injuries.

Smith Named Region 6 All-American • Senior Crystal Smith was named a Region 6 WBCA All-American. Smith becomes Iowa's first regional all-American since Cara Consuegra was recognized in 2001.

Trio of Hawkeyes Earn All-Big Ten Honors • Megan Skouby was named Big Ten Freshman of the Year by both the media and coaches. She earned all-freshman team recognition and was selected to the all-Big Ten second team by the media and third team by the coaches. Senior Crystal Smith was a consensus first team selection and was also selected to the all-defensive team. Sophomore Krista Vandeventer earned honorable mention laurels by the media and is a nominee for the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award.

Skouby becomes the third Hawkeye to earn Big Ten Freshman of the Year honors, joining Franthea Price (1987) and Tiffany Gooden (1995). The 6-6 center is also the sixth Big Ten post-player to earn the award since 1983 and the first since Ohio State's Jessica Davenport in 2004.

Smith earned all-Big Ten recognition for the second-straight year after being named to the third team by the coaches last year. Vandeventer also earned conference recognition for the second consecutive year, as the sophomore was named to the all-freshman team last season.

Gold on the Road • Iowa was forced to wear its gold uniforms in all road games in 2005-06 after it had its black uniforms shrunk at the Odwalla Classic, Nov. 25-26. After the Hawkeyes played nationally-ranked Oklahoma on Nov. 25, the San Francisco Athletic Department, who hosted the tournament, accidentally overheated Iowa's road uniforms while washing the uniforms for the Iowa's consolation game vs. Rider.

In the Rankings • Iowa ranked ninth in the nation in free throw percentage, 16th in assists, field goal percentage and fewest fouls and 24th in scoring. Megan Skouby ranked 24th nationally in field goal percentage.

Iowa vs. Ranked Teams • Iowa has recorded at least one victory over a ranked opponent in each of the six years under Coach Bluder. Iowa was 2-8 against ranked foes in 2005-06. These are Iowa's most recent wins vs. nationally ranked opponents:

At Home: 77-71 (OT) over 8th-ranked Purdue, 2/2/06
On the Road: 78-67 over 18th-ranked Michigan State, 2/1/04
Neutral Court: 54-47 over 21st-ranked Oklahoma, 11/27/04

Giant Killers • Iowa recorded two victories over top-ten opponents in 2005-06 (No. 9 Michigan State 75-64 and No. 8 Purdue 77-71, ot). The last time the Hawkeyes recorded two wins against top-ten teams in the same season was Head Coach Lisa Bluder's first season on the Hawkeye sidelines (2000-01). Iowa picked up two victories over Purdue that year, first when it was ranked fifth (96-87 at Iowa City) and second when the Boilermakers were ranked seventh (75-70 at Grand Rapids).

Bluder Garners Win No. 300 at Division I Level • After garnering her 300th Division I victory in Iowa's regular season finale vs. Indiana on Feb. 26, Bluder will reach two additional coaching milestones in 2006-07. She will coach in her 700th career game and her 200th on the Iowa sidelines during conference play. The Marion, IA, native has coached in 682 career games (469-213, .688) and 184 contests (113-71, .614) on the Hawkeye sidelines.

Bluder Returns to NCAA Tournament • This year marked Coach Bluder's eighth trip to the NCAA Tournament. Before mentoring the Hawkeyes, Bluder coached the Drake Bulldogs to four NCAA Tournaments in her 10 seasons on the Drake sidelines. Bluder is 3-8 all-time in NCAA Tournament games, 2-4 with Iowa and 1-4 with Drake. Two of Bluder's victories came in overtime. In 2001, Iowa bounced Oregon (89-82) in Salt Lake City and in 1995, Drake defeated Mississippi (87-81) in Washington, D.C.

Graham Returns to Action • After an injury filled season, Jenee Graham played one of her best games of the year in Iowa's NCAA first round loss to BYU. Graham played 20 minutes, the most she played in a game since the season opener, and contributed six rebounds, three assists and two points.

RPI Ratings • Iowa ranked 55th in final regular season RPI rating released by the NCAA. All 11 regular season Iowa losses came to opponents with an RPI of 100 or better, including four in the top 10. The Hawkeyes were credited with two top-25 victories (Purdue and Michigan State).

Hawkeyes Crack History Books • Iowa made 29 free throws in its regular season finale vs. Indiana to establish a new Carver-Hawkeye Arena in a Big Ten game. The 29 free throws also tied the school record previously set against Missouri State on December 5, 1993.

The 2005-06 Iowa Hawkeyes rank second in school annals in single-season free throw percentage (.760), sixth in assists (16.8), seventh in 3-point field goal percentage (.359) and tenth in scoring (72.3). Additionally, Iowa opponents' 288 free throws made are the second-lowest in school history, second only to 273 converted in 1992-93. Also, Iowa opponents in 2005-06 attempted only 415 foul shots, which rank second behind the 393 attempted in 2004-05.

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the 2005-06 season were seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

Hawkeye Fast Breaks • This season marked the first time Iowa has ever placed fifth in the Big Ten standings.

- Krista Vandeventer started her 62nd game in Iowa's NCAA Tournament game vs. BYU, becoming the first Hawkeye to start 62 games her first two years.
- Krista Vandeventer finished the 2005-06 season with 52 fouls, the exact number she totaled in 2004-05.
- Crystal Smith was only one point from netting her 500th point in 2005-06. Smith nearly became only the fourth Hawkeye to collect 500 points in two seasons in a Hawkeye uniform. Michelle Edwards, Lindsey Meder and Cindy Haugejorde are the only Hawkeyes to accomplish the feat.
- Crystal Smith and Ohio State all-American Jessica Davenport were the only Big Ten players to be named to the all-Big Ten defensive team and a consensus first team honoree.
- Iowa, playing in its 16th NCAA Tournament, had the seventh highest number of NCAA Tournament appearances among the teams competing.
- Iowa was one of five Big Ten squads that played in the NCAA Tournament. The Hawkeyes joined, Ohio State, Michigan State, Minnesota and Purdue in the 64-team field. Indiana and Illinois competed in the WNIT. The Big Ten Conference boasted the fourth-most teams in the tournament. The ACC and Big East had the most (7), followed by the SEC (6).
- Eight of Iowa's 12 losses came to ranked opponents. The four losses to unranked foes came on the road at Louisiana Tech (2ot), Iowa State, Indiana and Penn State. Iowa was 11-3 in home games this season, with its three defeats coming to No. 6 Rutgers, No. 8 Ohio State and No. 12 Minnesota.
- Krista Vandeventer finished the season with 61 steals, the most ever by a Hawkeye sophomore. The 61 thefts topped Toni Foster's 56 established in 1990-91.
- Kristi Smith finished the season with 82 assists, the most ever for a Hawkeye freshman. Smith bested Necole Tunsil's 78 set in 1990-91. Smith also ranks fourth in 3-pointers made (22).
- Wendy Ausdemore made 20 triples in 2005-06, which ranks fifth for a Hawkeye freshman.
- Iowa was out-rebounded in its 12 losses. The Hawkeyes boasted a 14-3 record when holding opponents to 69 points or less and were 15-2 when having a higher field goal percentage than their foes.
- Iowa was 1-4 in games decided by six points or less.
- Hawkeye senior Tiffany Reedy had a higher shooting percentage from 3-point range than inside the arc. Reedy shot 39.6 percent (36-91) from behind the arc and 37.2 percent (35-94) from two-point range.
- Iowa freshman Megan Skouby ranked third in conference scoring, averaging 16.8 points. She is the highest ranking freshman in scoring, since Penn State all-American Kelly Mazzante ranked first in 2000-01, averaging 19.7 points.
- Skouby's 414 points ranks second in Iowa single-season freshman scoring, only two points from matching Lisa Becker's school freshman record of 416. She also ranks second in freshman single-season blocks (47).

17-Plus • Crystal Smith's 17.2 scoring average in 2005-06 is Iowa's highest in six years. Sophomore Lindsey Meder paced the Hawkeyes with a 19.1 scoring average in 1999-00. Smith's 17.2 scoring average ranks ninth in a single-season at Iowa.

DE-FENSE! • Iowa's perimeter defense was stellar in 2005-06. The Hawkeyes ranked first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.296). In 2004-05, Iowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

Another First • Iowa never had a regulation lead in its thrilling 77-71 victory over Purdue on Feb. 2. The Hawkeyes' first lead came one minute into overtime. It is believed to be the first time in Iowa women's basketball history that the Hawkeyes won a game without holding the lead in regulation.

Skouby Joins Elite List • Megan Skouby was Iowa's scoring leader in conference games only, averaging 16.8 points. Only two other freshmen Hawkeyes have ever finished the season leading the team in scoring in league games only (Lisa Becker, 1984 and Tiffany Gooden, 1995).

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) completed her sixth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 469-213 (.688), including a 113-71 (.614) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to six post-season tournaments (4 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and four upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2005, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

Some could argue that Bluder did her best coaching job in 2005-06. Five players suffered knee injuries, including three season-ending ACL setbacks to starters. Bluder guided Iowa to an outright fifth-place Big Ten finish and an at-large berth to the NCAA tournament.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Smith Invited to WNBA Pre-Draft Camp • Senior Crystal Smith is one of 40 athletes invited to participate in the WNBA Pre-Draft Camp, April 3-4 in Boston, MA. All 14 WNBA teams will be scouting players in preparation for the draft, which will be held April 5.

Reedy Set Go • Tiffany Reedy played the best basketball of her career at No. 7 Ohio State and No. 14 Michigan State. Reedy scored 36 points, bolstered by 10-16 shooting behind the arc on the two-game road trip. She posted personal bests in scoring (20), field goals made (7) and attempted (13), 3-pointers made (6) and attempted (11) and matched career bests in blocks (2) and minutes (38) in the two-point loss at No. 14 Michigan State. Her new career high in scoring bests her previous best (18) established in her first game vs. IUPUI -- a span of 117 games. The native of Dysart, IA, ranked fourth in team scoring (7.1) and steals (22) and third in rebounding (3.9). She ranked fourth in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.396).

Last Time Out • Iowa's second half comeback came up short as the Hawkeyes dropped a 67-62 decision to 20th-ranked BYU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the Pepsi Center in Denver. The loss dropped Iowa's first round tournament record to 7-2. Iowa was seeded 10th, while BYU was seeded seventh.

Iowa led 12-9 with 10 minutes left in the first half, but BYU went on a 14-4 run to build a seven-point advantage (23-16) with 6:22 left. The Cougars took a five-point lead (30-25) at the half.

BYU's lead swelled to 16 (54-38) with 8:33 left in the game and appeared to have the game in hand. However, Iowa mounted a furious comeback, first cutting the deficit from 16 to seven with a 9-0 run. The Hawkeyes were able score in the paint down the stretch after BYU's top two post players, Dani Kubik and Lauren Riley, fouled out at the 7:14 and 5:14 mark, respectively.

The Hawkeyes ultimately trimmed the deficit to only three with 30 seconds remaining and had possession. Crystal Smith attempted a difficult 3-pointer with two defenders in her face and had the game-tying shot blocked. BYU sank two free throws in the final seconds to seal the win and advanced to play second-seeded Oklahoma in the second round.

Freshman Megan Skouby paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 19 points and grabbed six rebounds. Senior Crystal Smith contributed 17 points, four assists and two steals, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

Senior Ambrosia Anderson, who was named co-Mountain West Player of the Year, posted game highs in points (20) and rebounds (9). Anderson was the only Cougar to score in double figures.

Iowa was only 1-6 (.167) from behind the arc, while BYU was 10-23 (.435) from 3-point range. The 10 triples were a season best for an Iowa opponent.

Movin' On Up • Crystal Smith ranks fifth in Iowa career steals (213) and 3-pointers made (116) and 14th in scoring (1,193). Krista VandeVenter (489) is tied with Jerica Watson for 16th in career rebounding.

Crystal Smith Nets Career Point No. 1,000 • Crystal Smith became the 22nd Iowa player to amass 1,000 career points when the senior netted 26 points vs. No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 12 to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau. Smith ranks 14th in Hawkeye career scoring (1,193), 1,055 of which came her last 62 games (17.0 ppg). She also ranks fifth in career triples (116) and steals (213).

Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith averaged 17.2 points her senior campaign. Smith's scoring average ranked fifth in the Big Ten. She led Iowa in scoring 15 times in 2005-06.

Skouby Leads Big Ten Freshmen • Megan Skouby raised her game to a new level since taking over the starting center position for injured sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl. Skouby, who was the Big Ten freshmen scoring leader, averaged 16.8 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.69 blocks in conference play. The 6-6 standout ranked 10th in overall scoring (14.3) in the Big Ten, fourth in blocks (1.62) and field goal percentage (.551). She ranked fourth in conference scoring (16.8) and blocks (1.69) and 16th in rebounding (5.8).

Skouby led Iowa in scoring 11 of the last 19 contests, including eight of the last 13. She posted 20 points or more five times in 2005-06. The native of Mentor, OH, netted double figures 16 consecutive games -- a streak that ranks second-best in the Big Ten only behind Wisconsin's Jolene Anderson.

Kristi Smith Matured Into Starting Role • Hawkeye freshman Kristi Smith did a fantastic job directing the Iowa offense since taking over the starting role. In Big Ten play, Smith averaged 7.9 points, 3.19 assists and 1.06 steals. Smith dished out a personal-best eight assists at No. 7 Ohio State. She ranked 13th in Big Ten assists.

Cashing in at the Free Throw Line • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore became the first Hawkeye to start the season making her first 19 free throw attempts. She made 38-40 (.950) from the charity stripe in 2005-06 to lead all Big Ten freshmen.

Senior Crystal Smith made her first 18 attempts from the foul line in Iowa's first three conference contests, including draining all 11 attempts vs. Illinois. Smith's 11-11 performance tied a school and arena record for free throw percentage in a game. She shot a blistering 91.0 percent (61-67) from the free throw line in conference games, which ranked second in the league. Smith attempted at least one free throw in all but two games in 2005-06.

Making the Freebies When They Count • Iowa converted 77.2 percent (129-167) from the foul line in the last five minutes of games.

The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 85.2 percent clip at the free throw line in the final five minutes in conference play. The Hawkeyes converted 75-88 free throw attempts down the stretch.

Big Ten Rankings • Iowa ranked first in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.296), free throw percentage (.760) and scoring offense (72.3), second in field goal percentage (.456) and assists (16.76) and third in 3-point field goal percentage (.359), assist/turnover ratio (+1.01) and 3-pointers made (4.9).

Senior Crystal Smith ranked third in league steals (2.41), fifth in scoring (17.2), sixth in free throw percentage (.850), seventh in assist/turnover ratio (1.44), eighth in 3-pointers made (1.72) and 12th in assists (3.38). Freshman Megan Skouby ranked fourth in blocks (1.62) and field goal percentage (.551) and 10th in scoring (14.3). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranked third in rebounding (8.2) and second in defensive rebounds (5.9) and seventh in steals (2.1).

Smith Ranked Fifth in Big Ten in Scoring • Senior Crystal Smith ranked fifth in Big Ten scoring (17.2); Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (18.7) ranked first, followed by Indiana's Cyndi Valentin (18.5), Michigan State's Liz Shimek (17.6) and Wisconsin's Jolene Anderson (17.3). Smith led Iowa in scoring in 15 of Iowa's 29 contests.

Smith and Indiana State's Melanie Boeglin scored an NCAA single-game-high 46 points. Both amassed their scoring totals in double overtime as Smith recorded 46 points at Louisiana Tech, while Boeglin tallied 46 at Drake.

Vandy is Dandy • Sophomore Krista VandeVenter is one of the top all-around threats in the Big Ten. VandeVenter, who has started every game (62) as a Hawkeye, ranked third in Big Ten rebounding (8.2) and seventh in steals (2.1). She led the Hawkeyes in rebounding 21 times in 2005-06. The 6-2 forward recorded three double-doubles (Iowa State, Minnesota and Northwestern) and six in her career.

VandeVenter fouled out of her first career game at Ohio State Feb. 12.

Attendance Rankings • Iowa ranks 25th (3,920) nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings. Eight Big Ten teams ranked in the attendance top 25, which is the most among conferences.

Triple Play • Tiffany Reedy made 19 triples in each of her first three seasons. The senior drained a personal-best six 3-pointers at Michigan State to raise her total to 31, which is a new single-season best. She shot at a 39.6 percent clip from behind the arc, which ranked fourth in the Big Ten.

Iowa ranked third in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.359) after ranking fourth last year (.343). The Hawkeyes shot a Big Ten-season-best 69.2% (9-13) from behind the arc at Northwestern on Jan. 15. Iowa also converted 53.3% (8-15) from 3-point range at Ohio State on Feb. 12. The Hawkeyes also ranked third in Big Ten 3-pointers made (4.9).

Underclassmen Started for Hawkeyes • Iowa's starting lineup included two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter). The last time Iowa had two freshmen starters was during the 1998-99 campaign (Lindsey Meder and Leah Magner).

VandeVenter started all 62 games as a Hawkeye, including all 29 in 2005-06. The power forward ranked third in team scoring (8.9) and first in rebounding (8.2). She has pulled down 489 rebounds, which ranks 16th on Iowa's career rebounding chart.

Smith started the last 21 games at point guard for Iowa. The native of Thornton, CO, ranks fourth in team scoring (7.1) and third in assists (82).

Skouby started 18 contests. The 6-6 center ranked second in team scoring (14.1), first in blocks (47) and field goal percentage (.551) and second in rebounding (5.0).

Iowa was one of two Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan started three.

Home, Away Comparisons • In 14 home games, Iowa out-scored its opponents 1,046-887 (+11.4 margin), shooting 47.1 percent from the field and holding opponents to a 41.2 shooting percentage. Iowa also collected 245 assists to its opponents' 165 and attempted 130 more free throws (324-194). Iowa converted 76.2 percent of its free throw attempts at home in 2005-06.

In 15 games away from Iowa City, Iowa out-scored its opponents 1,051-1,026 (+1.7 margin). Iowa had a better 3-point shooting percentage on the road (38.3%) than at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (32.7%). Here are the home and away comparisons:

Wins, Losses Comparisons • There were big differentials in the stats between Iowa's wins and losses. The Hawkeyes shot 8.1 percent better from the field, including 10.2 percent from 3-point range in their victories. Iowa averaged 5.9 more rebounds in wins than losses. The Hawkeyes made more free throws (286) than its opponents have attempted (212) in its 17 wins. Iowa held opponents to only 26.8 percent shooting from behind the arc in their wins. The Hawkeyes averaged only 14.8 assists in its 12 defeats. Here are the wins and losses comparisons:

Dishing the Rock • Iowa ranked second in Big Ten assists, dishing the ball 16.76 times per game. Three Hawkeyes averaged 2.83 assists or better: Crystal Smith (3.38), Krista VandeVenter (2.9) and Kristi Smith (2.83).

High Octane • Iowa, who ranked first in Big Ten scoring offense (72.3), scored 80 points or more seven times. The Hawkeyes were 14-3 when scoring 70 points or more; the three losses came in double overtime at Louisiana Tech (95-91), at No. 7 Ohio State (88-77) and No. 14 Michigan State (73-71).

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class (Megan Skouby, Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis) averaged 30.8 points, including a 35.0 average the last 13 contests. The trio of Ausdemore, Skouby and Smith tallied a freshmen season-best 57 points vs. No. 8 Purdue on Feb. 2.

Skouby ranked second in team scoring (14.3) and second in rebounding (5.0), while Smith (7.1) ranks fifth and Ausdemore (6.8) sixth in scoring. Smith also ranked third in assists (2.83).

Iowa Ties Arena Mark • Iowa's 55 second-half points scored in its 84-65 triumph over Illinois on Jan. 1, matched the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for most points in a second half. The Hawkeyes also netted 55 vs. Western Illinois on Nov. 25, 2000.

All-Tournament Selections • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

Five Spot • Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in Iowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.



More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USC's Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

Making the List • Iowa recorded two victories by 40 points or more in 2005-06. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in Iowa history.

Iowa posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

Young Guns • Iowa tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes had four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) led the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) tied for 31st.

Century Club • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, when she collected her 100th victory as Iowa Head Coach in the 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 113-70 (.617) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Jane Meyer Named WBCA Administrator of the Year • Iowa Senior Associate Athletic Director Jane Meyer was named the 2006 Women's Basketball Coaches Association's Administrator of the Year Award for her excellence in athletic administration. This award is presented annually to an administrator, athletic director, associate or assistant athletic director or senior woman administrator who has excelled at encouraging the growth and quality of women's basketball programs and women's athletic programs overall. The candidate must also have served as a professional role model for student-athletes.

Recently, Meyer began a five-year term on the 10-member Division I Women's Basketball Committee and will serve on the committee until September 2010.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • Iowa's 2005-06 roster featured six players from the state of Iowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also had four players from Illinois (Jenee Graham, Morgan Kasperek, Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson). Iowa's 15-person roster also featured players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • Iowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

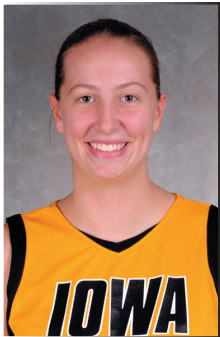

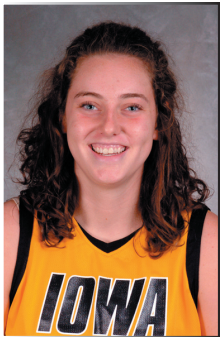

Game 1

Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42

Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Iowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. Iowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of Iowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight Iowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, Iowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista Vandeventer and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

Iowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes.

Iowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With Iowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is Iowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

Game 2

Louisiana Tech 95, Iowa 91

Nov. 22, 2005, Thomas Assembly Center

RUSTON, LA - - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast Iowa 95-91 in a double overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled Iowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

Iowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and out-score the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight Iowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, Iowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given Iowa the win at the end of regulation. Conversely, Louisiana Tech's Eboni Mangum missed a short jumper at the end of the first overtime that would have given the Lady Techsters the victory. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat.

Iowa lost only its third game in its last 21 contests when leading at the half.

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - Oklahoma's Paris twins combined for 44 points and 21 rebounds to propel the 22nd-ranked Sooners to an 85-68 victory over Iowa in the first round of the Odwalla Classic in War Memorial Gym.

Iowa opened the game with an 18-11 advantage, but Oklahoma closed the half on a 32-11 run to take a commanding 43-29 lead into half. Sooner junior Erin Higgins, who was 1-6 from 3-point range in last year's contest against the Hawkeyes in the Bahamas, scored all of her 14 points in the first half on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Courtney Paris posted her third double-double of the season (30 points, 14 rebounds), while her sister Ashley collected 14 points and seven rebounds en route to victory in front of their hometown family and friends.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring Iowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista Vandeventer tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

Iowa 88, Rider 41

Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - The Iowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lopsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced Iowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

Iowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to Iowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer collected five.

Iowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

Rider was led by Monica Welborn, who netted 13 points. Iowa's defense limited the Broncs to only 24.5 percent (13-53) from the field for the game.

IOWA CITY -- Iowa had five players score double figures for the second-straight game as the Hawkeyes cruised to an 81-57 victory over UW-Green Bay at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes used the long ball to stretch its lead over the Phoenix in the first half. Iowa converted a blistering 7-12 (.583) from behind the arc, while UW-Green Bay was only 3-13 (.231) in the first period to enable Iowa to build a 45-30 halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith ignited Iowa's offensive attack for the fourth-straight contest. Smith netted a team-high 14 points and also collected four rebounds, four assists, two blocks and two steals. Tiffany Reedy contributed 13 points, including 11 in the first half and posted team highs in rebounds (9) and steals (3). Stacy Schlapkohl pulled down a career-high seven rebounds, including five defensive boards.

Iowa's four freshmen that played amassed 33 points, nine rebounds and five assists en route to victory. Megan Skouby collected 13 points and six rebounds. Wendy Ausdemore scored a season-high 10 points and collected one rebound and one assist. Kristi Smith recorded 10 points and dished out four assists, while Nicole VanderPol registered two points and two rebounds.

The Hawkeyes dominated the glass, out-rebounding the Phoenix by 20 (46-26). Iowa converted 14 offensive rebounds into 15 second chance points. The Hawkeyes also forced 16 turnovers and converted the miscues into 17 points.

Nicole Soulis led UW-Green Bay, posting game highs in scoring (15) and blocks (3). She also grabbed four rebounds in defeat.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played scored at least one point. Additionally, the Hawkeye bench out-scored the Phoenix's bench 39-17.

Iowa 79, Vermont

Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead Iowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving Iowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in Iowa City.

After taking the Iowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured Iowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 Iowa run.

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals.

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

IOWA CITY (AP) - Cappie Pondexter scored 22 points and No. 6 Rutgers held off Iowa 57-51 to win the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

The victory also capped an emotional weekend for Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer, who coached against her old team for the first time since leaving Iowa City to take the Scarlet Knights' job.

Pondexter, who scored 26 points in the tournament's opening round, was voted MVP. But Rutgers also relied on its size and strength inside to wear down the Hawkeyes inside and cut short each rally.

Seven of Pondexter's points came at key moments late in the game.

After Iowa pulled to 46-44 on a short jumper by Krista VandeVenter, Pondexter answered with a long 3-pointer.

In the final minute with Rutgers leading by four, Pondexter milked the clock on all alone on the perimeter before driving an Iowa defender into the paint and swishing a short jumper.

Five times Iowa crept within two points in the second half, only to see Rutgers, which never trailed in the game, respond and stretch their lead by controlling the boards.

Led by Mariota Theodoris' 16 rebounds, Rutgers outrebounded Iowa 40-31, including 17-8 on the offensive end, outscored Iowa 28-16 on points in the paint and blocked six shots.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. VandeVenter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

AMES, IA - The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The loss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

Iowa freshman Megan Skouby made a 10-foot jumper with 7:00 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes a 25-24 advantage. The Cyclones responded in a big way, scoring 13 of the final 15 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. Iowa only made only three of its last 18 field goal attempts in the first period.

Iowa was led by Tiffany Reedy, Crystal Smith and Krista VandeVenter. Reedy scored 11 of her 13 points in the first 12:13 of the first half. The 13 points matched a season high. Smith also tallied 13 points and grabbed four rebounds. VandeVenter netted all 12 of her points in the second period. She also equaled a career high with 14 rebounds, collecting her fourth career double-double.

After failing to make any 3-pointers in its last game for the first time in 217 games, Iowa converted 7-23 (.304) from behind the arc.

Iowa 92, Drake 72

IOWA CITY -- Iowa returned to action after a 10-day layoff and cruised to a 92-72 victory over Drake in front of a season-high 5,556 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa dominated the undersized Drake squad, out-scoring the Bulldogs 44-32 in the paint. Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. Iowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

Iowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. Iowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against Iowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

The Hawkeyes answered with a 12-4 run the next four minutes to rebuild their lead back to eight (43-35) with 11:20 left.

Northern Iowa continued to fight back and trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to six with 2:15 remaining, but back-to-back triples by Hawkeyes Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert helped seal Iowa's second-straight win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. Iowa converted 4-6 from the foul line the final minute to secure the 11-point victory.

Smith scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half, including netting Iowa's final first half points. The native of Haughton, IA, attempted and made Iowa's first 3-pointer of the game at the 15:40 mark of the second half to halt a 9-0 Northern Iowa scoring run. Smith has tallied 20 points or more five times already this season.

Northern Iowa limited Hawkeye starters Krista VandeVenter and Stacy Schlapkohl to a combined three points on 0-8 shooting from the field and 3-5 from the foul line. However, Iowa's bench stepped up to fill the scoring void as the Hawkeye reserves out-scored the Panthers 24-8. Freshman Megan Skouby scored eight, while freshman Wendy Ausdemore and sophomore Abby Emmert each added seven.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed seven of her 10 points in the second half and also corralled five rebounds.

Northern Iowa was led by senior Cassie Hager, who scored 17 points and blocked a game-high six shots. Iowa's stifling 2-3 zone defense made it difficult for the Panthers to have open looks. Northern Iowa converted only 31.1 percent (19-61) from the field, including only 17.2 percent (5-29) from behind the arc.

Iowa 74, Creighton 64

IOWA CITY - - Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 18 points and a career-high six steals en route to a 74-64 victory over Creighton at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was Iowa's third straight over the Bluejays.

After Creighton jumped out to an early 7-1 lead to start the game Skouby drilled five straight jumpers to tie the contest at 13-13. Iowa took its first lead with 8:29 left in the first half after a layup from freshman Wendy Ausdemore, but the Bluejays regained the lead after a Kristi Woodard bucket and did not trail the rest of the half.

Iowa trimmed the Creighton lead to two at the start the second half, but Ally Thrall sank a 3-pointer with 17:18 left to stretch the Bluejay lead to seven. The Hawkeyes responded with a 7-0 run to regain a 44-43 lead with 13:29 left.

After Creighton's Angie Janis hit a jumper to put the Bluejays up by three, VandeVenter swiped one of her six steals for a layup to give Iowa a 50-49 lead with 9:48 left and the Hawkeyes never relinquished the lead. A 3-pointer by senior Tiffany Reedy gave Iowa a 54-49 lead and a 3-point play by freshman Nicole VanderPol with 5:59 left gave the Hawkeyes a comfortable advantage. Four free throws by Ausdemore down the stretch sealed the win for Iowa.

Starting center Stacy Schlapkohl suffered a season-ending ACL injury early in the first half. The Iowa post players responded very well in Schlapkohl's absence, outscoring Creighton 36-22 in the paint. Skouby scored 12 of her 22 points in the first half, while VandeVenter scored 16 of her 18 points in the second period.

Creighton was able to gain an advantage on the boards and out-rebounded Iowa 36-30, including 16 offensive rebounds. Angie Janis led Creighton with 19 points, while Kristi Woodard grabbed nine rebounds.

Crystal Smith had 13 points for Iowa, which marked the first time since the season opener vs. UW-Milwaukee she did not lead the team in scoring.

BLOOMINGTON, IN - - Iowa opened the Big Ten season with a 65-53 loss to Indiana at Assembly Hall. Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 14 points, while Krista VandeVenter grabbed eight rebounds in the loss.

After a back-and-forth first half, Indiana used a 14-0 run in the final 6:47 of the half to gain a 27-16 advantage. Wendy Ausdemore nailed a 3-pointer as time expired to cut the halftime deficit to 27-19. Ausdemore's triple was Iowa's first bucket in the half since the 7:05 minute mark.

IOWA CITY -- A big second half lifted Iowa to an 84-65 victory over Illinois inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win is Iowa's fifth-straight over the Fighting Illini. A crowd of 3,439 watched Iowa's first-ever New Year's Day game.

Crystal Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 27 points on 7-13 shooting from the field and a perfect 11-11 from the foul line. Smith tallied 19 of her 27 points in the second period. Smith also collected seven rebounds, four steals and two assists.

Smith's perfect 11-11 shooting performance from the charity stripe tied a school record for free throw percentage in a game.

Krista Vandeventer had another big game for the Hawkeyes, scoring all 13 of her points in the second period and also posting game bests in rebounding (7) and assists (6). The six assists matched a career high for Vandeventer. Nicole VanderPol added four points and four rebounds.

The Hawkeyes started the contest ice-cold from the floor, missing six of their first seven field goal attempts. Iowa regained its shooting touch later in the half, as a Wendy Ausdemore 3-pointer capped an Iowa 11-0 run to tie the contest at 23 with 3:59 left. Ausdemore netted 11 of her career-high 14 points in the first stanza.

Iowa silenced Illinois starter Janelle Hughes for the first 17 minutes, but the senior scored the Fighting Illini's final nine points on four-straight possessions of the half to propel Illinois to a six-point (34-29) halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith sparked a 17-2 scoring run in the second half to help give the Hawkeyes a 55-45 advantage with 11:30 left in the game. Smith scored nine of the 17 points during the scoring run.

Illinois' Erin Wigley and Hughes each scored 20 points to lead Illinois. Audrey Tabon pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Fighting Illini.

ANN ARBOR, MI -- Four Hawkeye starters scored in double figures as the Iowa Hawkeyes won its sixth-straight game over Michigan 77-63 inside Crisler Arena.

Megan Skouby had a career night as the 6-6 center posted career bests in points (20), rebounds (8) and blocks (5). Krista Vandeventer, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 13 points en route to victory. In addition to her 13 points, Smith collected seven rebounds, four steals and a career-high nine assists.

Iowa's frontcourt duo of Megan Skouby (7) and Krista Vandeventer (7) scored 15 of Iowa's 17 points as the Hawkeyes jumped out to a 17-10 advantage in the first eight minutes and would never look back.

The Hawkeyes built their lead to 10 by half (42-32), but Michigan opened the second period on a 10-3 run to trim Iowa's advantage to three (45-42) with 16:46 left. Iowa's lead swelled back to nine (53-44) after an 8-2 run with 11:20 remaining. The Wolverines tried to mount one last comeback in the final minutes, but Iowa drained three 3-pointers in the final three minutes to secure the victory.

Iowa's aggressive play generated 11 more free throw attempts than Michigan. The Hawkeyes made 16-20 (.800) from the foul line, while the Wolverines only made nine trips to the charity stripe - making eight (.889).

Iowa only attempted two triples in the first half - missing both, but found its shooting touch in the second stanza, sinking 5-9.

Michigan were led by reserves Ta'Shia Walker and Katie Dierdorf. Walker netted a game-high 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Dierdorf added 10 points and four rebounds.

Through 14 games, Iowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. Iowa's defense held the Wolverines to 37.9 percent (25-66) from the field and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. Iowa converted 49.1 percent (28-57) of its field goals, including 45.5 percent (5-11) from 3-point range.

Iowa 75, #9 Michigan State 64

Jan. 9, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Iowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an Iowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

Iowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved Iowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but Iowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded Iowa's lead to 22-19.

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Jessica Davenport scored a season-high 34 points, grabbed 16 rebounds and had six assists to lead No. 8 Ohio State past Iowa 72-62 inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, the Buckeyes' sixth win in seven games.

Debbie Merrill added 15 points for Ohio State, which never trailed as the Buckeyes' post players dominated play. Led by Davenport's seventh double-double of the season, Ohio State outrebounded Iowa 39-30 and outscored the Hawkeyes 52-30 in the paint.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 26 points and Megan Skouby added 11. Smith became the 22nd player to amass 1,000 career points in an Iowa uniform late in the first half.

Iowa trailed by as many as 16 points before staging a rally midway through the second half. The Hawkeyes went on a 21-11 run and got within 55-49 on a 3-pointer by Smith with 11:22 left.

The teams traded baskets for the next five minutes before Davenport converted a 3-point play with 6:00 left to push Ohio State's lead to 66-55.

Iowa - which upset No. 9 Michigan State three days earlier - never got closer than 68-59 after that.

Davenport scored the Buckeyes' last nine points. She broke the game open with 11 straight points during a 15-1 run midway through the first half that gave the Buckeyes a 39-21 lead. Iowa was unable to stop Davenport from establishing position inside, and she took advantage with five baskets from inside 10 feet during a 3:33 span.

Iowa recorded a season-low 13 turnovers in defeat, including only three by its guards. Abby Emmert came off the bench and directed the Hawkeye offense for most of the second half. The sophomore finished with seven points and three assists.

Iowa 80, Northwestern 48

EVANSTON, IL -- Iowa built a 21-point first-half lead and cruised to an 80-48 triumph over Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The win was Iowa's largest conference win since recording a 40-point win over Northwestern on Jan. 25, 2001 in Evanston. The victory was also Iowa's 10-straight over the Wildcats, all under Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Megan Skouby and Crystal Smith were Iowa's offensive catalysts today. Skouby netted a game-high 18 points (8-16 FG, 2-2 FT), marking the 11th time this year she has scored double figures. The Big Ten's leading freshman scorer, has tallied double digits four-straight contests and five of Iowa's six league games. Smith added 13 points in only 18 minutes of action.

Tiffany Reedy had a solid all-around game, converting 3-4 from 3-point range for nine points and collecting seven rebounds, four assists and three steals.

Iowa had a better 3-point shooting percentage (.692, 9-13) than Northwestern did free throw percentage (.615, 8-13). Reedy and Lindsey Nynehuis drained three triples each, Smith nailed two, while Abby Emmert made one.

Leading 16-7, Iowa went on a 12-0 run to expand its advantage to 28-7. Iowa converted 10 of its first 13 field goal attempts, while Northwestern made only three of its first 19. The Hawkeyes made only two field goals the last nine minutes of the first stanza. Iowa led by 16 at the half (36-20).

Northwestern was led by reserve forward Lauren Roberts and Nadia Bibbs. Roberts tallied a team-high 10 points, while Bibbs recorded a career-high eight rebounds.

Eleven of Iowa's 12 players scored, including 33 points from the Hawkeye bench. Also, Iowa's freshmen netted a season-high 43 points.

The Hawkeyes outrebounded the Wildcats by 11 (49-38) and collected 24 assists to Northwestern's 14.

WISCONSIN, WI -- Iowa converted 11 of its last 12 free throws in the final minutes as the Hawkeyes held off a surging Wisconsin Badger squad 68-59 Thursday night at the Kohl Center. Freshman Megan Skouby poured in a game-high 23 points, while seniors Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 15 points.

Iowa was forced to make its foul shots down the stretch as Wisconsin held the Hawkeyes to only one field goal the last 7:18. The Badgers cut the Iowa advantage to four (61-57) with 57 seconds remaining, but the Hawkeyes made five of their last six free throws en route to victory.

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Down at halftime for the first time in Big Ten play, Minnesota used a second-half scoring surge and another dominant performance from its bench to put away pesky Iowa in an 80-68 victory in front of a season-high 7,005 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The 12th-ranked Gophers used a 22-6 run to start the second half and a 30-15 advantage in bench scoring for their third straight win.

STATE COLLEGE, PA -- Amanda Brown and Kam Gissendanner each netted 24 points to propel Penn State to a 71-61 triumph over Iowa at the Bryce Jordan Center. The win was the Lady Lions' fifth-straight over the Hawkeyes.

The loss is Iowa's second-straight defeat and also snapped a three-game road winning streak in the Big Ten.

Penn State's lead swelled to 11 by halftime as the Lady Lions concluded the first period on a 12-5 run. Penn State dominated Iowa on the boards in the first stanza, out-rebounding the Hawkeyes by 10 (22-12). The Lady Lions out-rebounded Iowa by eight (33-25) for the game. The 25 rebounds is a season-low for the Hawkeyes.

Iowa 77, #8 Purdue 71 (OT)

Feb. 2, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - A trio of Iowa freshmen combined for 57 points en route to a thrilling 77-71 overtime win over eighth-ranked Purdue at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The 77 points are the most scored by a Purdue opponent this year.

The victory snapped the Hawkeyes' seven-game losing streak to the Boilermakers. Iowa's triumph also halted Purdue's 13-game overall winning streak and nine-game streak in Big Ten play.

The Hawkeyes trailed the entire game, as much as 11 points in the second half, but a Wendy Ausdemore baseline jumper with 17 seconds left concluded a 6-0 Iowa run to tie the game at 65 and send the contest to overtime.

Iowa scored the first four points of the extra session and never looked back as the Hawkeyes out-scored Purdue 12-6 in overtime.

Hawkeye freshmen Megan Skouby, Kristi Smith and Ausdemore sparked Iowa. Ausdemore tallied a game and career-high 23 points. Smith contributed a career-high 15 points, while Skouby added 19 points. Skouby also posted career bests in rebounds (9) and blocks (5).

Crystal Smith, who entered the game as the Big Ten's second-leading scorer, only scored four points. In fact, the Boilermakers held Smith scoreless until the 2:09 left in the second half. Although Smith did not score her usually double figures, she did collect seven assists and six rebounds.

Purdue was led by Aya Traore, Erin Lawless and Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton. Traore netted a team-high 19 points, Lawless added 16 points and Wisdom-Hylton chipped in with 13. Lawless fouled out of the contest with 1:05 remaining in regulation. The Boilermakers blocked a season-high 10 shots in defeat.

Iowa out-scored Purdue 19-7 at the foul line. The Hawkeyes converted a season-high 90.5 percent (19-21) from the charity stripe.

The win was Iowa's second over a top-ten ranked opponent in 2005-06.

IOWA CITY - Iowa won its 11th-straight game over Northwestern with a 76-61 triumph at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa's frontcourt of Megan Skouby, Krista VandeVenter and Morgan Kasperek sparked the Hawkeyes. The trio combined for 37 points on 16-26 shooting from the field (61.5%) and 5-6 from the foul line (83.3%) and also grabbed 24 rebounds. VandeVenter posted her third double-double of the season and sixth of her career, collecting 13 points and 13 rebounds. She also dished out four assists. Skouby netted a game-high 16 points, while Kasperek added eight points.

Iowa jumped out to a quick 9-0 advantage in the first 4:30. Northwestern missed its first nine field goal attempts during the scoring drought. The Hawkeyes had an eight-point cushion (34-28) at the half.

Northwestern opened the second half on a 12-7 run to close the Iowa advantage to three (41-38) with 15:30 remaining. The Hawkeyes answered the Wildcats' surge and re-established a double digit lead by the eight-minute mark. Iowa's lead swelled to as many as 23 points in the closing minutes.

For the second-straight game, Iowa shot a blistering percent from the free throw line. The Hawkeyes converted 21-23 from the charity stripe for a 91.3% shooting percentage. The Wildcats only managed to get to the foul line 12 times, converting nine.

Northwestern had two players post double-doubles. Ifeoma Okonkwo tallied 14 points and 10 rebounds, while Kristin Cartwright registered 13 points and 11 rebounds in defeat.

Iowa's leading scorer, Crystal Smith, struggled from the field again, scoring only six points (1-10, FG, 4-4 FT). Her defensive skills shined as she collected a game-high four steals.

#7 Ohio State 88, Iowa 77

Feb. 12, 2006, Value City Arena

COLUMBUS, OH - Ohio State won a battle between the conferences' top two scoring offenses as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes held on for an 88-77 win over Iowa at Value City Arena.

Both teams started the game on fire as Ohio State made its first 11 field goal attempts (100%), while Iowa made eight of its first 11 (72.7%) in the first 7:30 of the game. The Buckeyes finished the game shooting a Big Ten-season-best 65.4% (34-52), including 53.8% (7-13) from 3-point range. Iowa shot the ball well too, but not good enough as the Hawkeyes made 56.3% (27-48) of their field goals, including 53.3% (8-15) from behind the arc.

Iowa trailed 40-25 late in the first half, but closed the period on a 14-2 run to only trail by three (42-39) at the break. The Hawkeyes tied the game at 50-50 at the 15:41 mark, but the Buckeyes answered with an 18-6 run to build a 12-point advantage and never looked back.

Ohio State all-American Jessica Davenport netted a game-high 24 points, while senior transfer Debbie Merrill collected 15 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith, who struggled in Iowa's previous two games scoring a combined 10 points, erupted for 21 points and dished out four assists. Freshman Megan Skouby returned to her home state and scored 18 points in front of family and friends. Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 16 points, bolstered by 4-5 shooting from behind the arc, while freshman Kristi Smith dished out a game-high eight assists.

The 77 points are the most points Ohio State has allowed this season, besting Oklahoma's 71 scored on Jan. 9.

The win extended Ohio State's home-conference winning streak to 15, dating back to a 57-54 loss to Purdue on Feb. 8, 2004.

CHAMPAIGN, IL - - Iowa's Crystal Smith scored a game-high 23 points to lead Iowa to a 71-60 victory over Illinois at Assembly Hall. The win is Iowa's six-straight over the Fighting Illini, including winning the last three at Assembly Hall.

Iowa nearly took an eight-point advantage into the half, but Illinois freshman Lori Bjork drained an off balance 3-pointer at the buzzer to trim the Hawkeye advantage to five (40-35). Iowa improved to 12-2 when leading at the break.

Illinois scored the second half's first four points to cut Iowa's advantage to one (40-39). The Hawkeyes countered by scoring the next 10 points to rebuild their lead to 11 (50-39) with 14:03 left. Iowa did a good job coveting the basketball and feeding its post, as the Hawkeyes out-scored Illinois 22-6 in the paint and posted a season-low 10 turnovers. Iowa also converted 14 Illinois turnovers into 19 points; out-scoring the Fighting Illini 19-2 in points off turnovers.

A Crystal Smith free throw at the 3:49 mark of the first stanza, marked her 1,000th combined point the last two years.

Iowa's win snapped a three-game road losing skid for Iowa. The Hawkeyes' last triumph away from Iowa City came at Wisconsin (68-59) on Jan. 19. Iowa also picked up its ninth conference win, besting last year's total of eight.

Iowa 78, Indiana 70

Feb. 26, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - All five Iowa starters scored in double figures to lead the Hawkeyes to a crucial 78-70 triumph over Indiana at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The victory secured the Hawkeyes fifth place in the Big Ten standings and gives Iowa a first round bye at the Big Ten Tournament.

A pair of freshmen sparked the Hawkeyes on "Senior Night." Megan Skouby and Kristi Smith tallied 19 and 18 points, respectively. Skouby recorded 11 of her team-best 19 at the foul line, while Smith scored eight of her career-high 18 at the charity stripe. The duo combined for 19-21 (.905) from the foul line.

Skouby also pulled down five rebounds, while Smith dished out a team-best four assists. Smith scored in double figures for the fifth time in seven games, while Skouby posted double figures for the 14th-straight contest.

After only going to the free throw line five times in the earlier loss at Indiana on Dec. 29, the Hawkeyes marched to the charity strip 36 times, converting a season-high 29. Iowa out-scored Indiana 29-14 at the free throw line.

Trailing 8-4 early in the contest, Iowa went on an 18-0 run to grab a commanding 22-8 advantage at the 12:00 mark of the first period. Indiana kept chipping away at the Hawkeye lead and closed within two points (32-20) with 37 seconds left in the half. A Reedy triple with 10 seconds remaining gave the Hawkeyes a five-point edge (35-30) and momentum going into the half.

Iowa's lead again swelled to double digits after five minutes of play in the second half, but again Indiana kept fighting and closed the Hawkeye advantage back to two (49-47) with 11:33 left. Iowa responded by scoring the next six points. Iowa maintained its lead the rest of the way, sinking 12 of its last 13 fouls shots the final six minutes.

Indiana was led by seniors Cyndi Valentin and Jenny DeMuth. Valentin poured in a game-high 30 points, while DeMuth recorded a double-double (19 points, 11 rebounds).

INDIANAPOLIS, IN (AP) - - Liz Shimek scored a career-high 31 points and Lindsay Bowen added 12 as they traded the title of Michigan State's career scoring leader Friday, leading the Spartans to a 79-58 rout over Iowa in the Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals.

Michigan State, the defending tourney champion and last year's national runner-up, reached the semifinals for the third straight year.

As well as Shimek and Bowen played, it was Michigan State's defense that proved the difference. The Hawkeyes were led by Megan Skouby with 13 points and seven rebounds, but could not overcome 23 turnovers, 19 in the first half, as their seven-game winning streak ended.

The Spartans showed no rustiness after an eight-day layoff, winning for the eighth time in nine games.

Shimek passed Bowen for the school's career scoring lead, breaking a tie with a strong second-half performance. Bowen had held the title since Feb. 16, but now trails Shimek (1,713 points) by 16 points.

Michigan State finished with 17 steals, the third most in tourney history.

Michigan State jumped to an early 13-6 lead, closed the half on a 18-2 run and built a 42-20 halftime lead.

Not much changed in the second half. Iowa threw the ball away on its first possession, drew a foul on Michigan State's first possession and got into deeper trouble when Shimek went on a personal 10-0 run to make it 52-22.

Iowa only got as close as 21 the rest of the way.

Freshman Wendy Ausdemore contributed 12 points, while senior Crystal Smith added 10. Senior Tiffany Reedy equaled career highs in assists (5) and blocks (2) for the Hawkeyes in defeat.

#20 BYU 67, Iowa 62

DENVER, CO -- Iowa's second half comeback came up short as the Hawkeyes dropped a 67-62 decision to 20th-ranked BYU in the first round of the NCAA Tournament at the Pepsi Center. The loss dropped Iowa's first round tournament record to 7-2. Iowa was seeded 10th, while BYU was seeded seventh.

Iowa led 12-9 with 10 minutes left in the first half, but BYU went on a 14-4 run to build a seven-point advantage (23-16) with 6:22 left. The Cougars took a five-point lead (30-25) at the half.

BYU's lead swelled to 16 (54-38) with 8:33 left in the game and appeared to have the game in hand. However, Iowa mounted a furious comeback, first cutting the deficit from 16 to seven with a 9-0 run. The Hawkeyes were able score in the paint down the stretch after BYU's top two post players, Dani Kubik and Lauren Riley, fouled out at the 7:14 and 5:14 mark, respectively.

The Hawkeyes ultimately trimmed the deficit to only three with 30 seconds remaining and had possession. Crystal Smith attempted a difficult 3-pointer with two defenders in her face and had the game-tying shot blocked. BYU sank two free throws in the final seconds to seal the win and advanced to play second-seeded Oklahoma in the second round.

Freshman Megan Skouby paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 19 points and grabbed six rebounds. Senior Crystal Smith contributed 17 points, four assists and two steals, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter added 10 points and a team-high eight rebounds.

Senior Ambrosia Anderson, who was named co-Mountain West Player of the Year, posted game highs in points (20) and rebounds (9). Anderson was the only Cougar to score in double figures.

Iowa was only 1-6 (.167) from behind the arc, while BYU was 10-23 (.435) from 3-point range. The 10 triples were a season best for an Iowa opponent.
