#### THE SETTING

Iowa (18-8, 7-8) will look to win its third consecutive game Sunday as it concludes its regular season when the Hawkeyes travel to Bloomington, IN, to face the Indiana Hoosiers (10-16, 3-12). Tip-off is slated for 5:05 p.m. (CST) in Assembly Hall (17,357). Sunday's game will be Indiana's fourth consecutive home contest and will be "Senior Night" for two student-athletes. Iowa has not won three straight contests since December.

Both teams have already secured positions in next week's Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes will be the sixth seed, while the Hoosiers will be the ninth seed.

# **IOWA HISTORY**

Iowa has played 872 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 532-340 (.610). That includes a 283-152 (.651) mark in Big Ten games and a 237-58 (.803) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

### **BIG TEN TOURNAMENT TALK**

Iowa has secured the sixth seed in the Big Ten Tournament, March 3-7, in Indianapolis. The Hawkeyes will play 11th-seeded Michigan, Thursday, March 3 at 7 p.m. (CST). It marks the first time Iowa will be the sixth seed in the conference tournament and the first time the Hawkeyes will meet Michigan in the league tournament.

Five other schools have already locked up positions in the tournament: Minnesota (4), Purdue (5), Indiana (9), Northwestern (10) and Michigan (11). In addition to the Iowa vs. Michigan match-up, there is one other game that has been determined, (4) Minnesota vs. (5) Purdue.

# RPI RANKINGS

Iowa ranks No. 35 in the RPI ranking and No. 40 in strength of schedule. Indiana ranks No. 92 in the RPI and No. 19 in strength of schedule. The Big Ten ranks third in conference RPI, behind the ACC and SEC. Michigan State (5) is the highest Big Ten team ranked in the RPI, followed by Ohio State (7), Minnesota (14), Penn State (22), Iowa (35) and Purdue (43).

#### **RAINING THREES**

# Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her fifth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 20th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 42, has a career record of 447-199 (.692), including a 91-57 (.615) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the



Hawkeyes to four post-season tournaments (3 NCAA, 1 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (7) and Emma (4) and one son, David (2).

Bluder is 7-2 against Indiana and 18-3 vs. Coach Kathi Bennett. Bluder boasted an 11-1 record vs. Bennett when the duo coached against each other in the Missouri Valley Conference (Drake-Evansville).

# HAWKEYES RANK HIGH NATIONALLY

As of games played through Feb. 21, Iowa ranks 11th nationally in least fouls per game (13.8), 14th in field goal percentage (.458), 38th in rebounding margin (+5.3) and 49th in scoring offense (69.6). Individually, Jamie Cavey ranks 17th in field goal percentage (.562).

# NUMBER OF THE WEEK - - 3

Abby Emmert was a perfect 3-3 from 3-point range in Thursday's 24-point triumph over Illinois. The freshman scored a career-high nine points. The nine points are four more points than she had combined in the previous 13 conference games played. In addition, she had only attempted one 3-pointer all season prior to Thursday night's 3-3 performance.

# LAST TIME OUT

Iowa won its second straight conference game for the first time since the Hawkeyes won its first two league contests with a 24-point victory (87-63) over Illinois Thursday night in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The triumph was Iowa's largest during conference play and secured the Hawkeyes the sixth seed in the Big Ten Tournament.

The Hawkeyes were led by a pair of seniors, who played their final regular season home game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Jamie Cavey tallied 15 points and eight rebounds, while Jenna Arnstrong netted 10 points and dished out three assists. The senior duo combined to shoot 78.6 percent (11-14) from the field in helping the Hawkeyes shoot a season-high 61.5 percent (32-52) from the floor. Iowa also drained a season-high 11 triples, including four by junior Crystal Smith who finished with a game-high 22 points.

Both teams exchanged early baskets before the Hawkeyes took command. Iowa led 22-15 with 12:49 left before Iowa went on a 30-10 run to close the first half and start the second to grab a commfortable 27-point cushion (52-25). The Hawkeyes led by as many as 28 points twice in the second half

In addition to Iowa's two seniors, a pair of freshmen also helped propel Iowa to victory. Krista VandeVenter notched her second career double-double, netting 12 points and hauling in a game-high 11 rebounds. Abby Emmert scored a career-high nine points on a perfect 3-3 shooting from beyond the arc. The nine points are four more than she had combined in the previous 13 conference games played. In addition, she had only attempted one 3-pointer all season prior to Thursday night's 3-3 performance.

Illinois was led by Tiffanie Guthrie, who tallied 21 points and seven rebounds. Angelina Williams netted 17 points, but was only 7-24 shooting from the field and 3-10 from beyond the arc.

# **FINAL GAME NOTES**

- Iowa's bench out-scored Illinois by 18 points (21-3).
- Iowa out-rebounded Illinois by six (38-32), despit having only seven offensive rebounds.
- The Hawkeys converted 61.1 percent (11-18) of their 3-point attempts, which ranks second in a single-game percentage behind their 62.5 percent (5-8) performance at Creighton.
- Iowa totaled 20 assists, while Illinois only collected seven.
- The Hawkeyes only turned the ball over 13 times, which is six under their season average.
- Both teams were 12-17 from the charity stripe, marking the first Iowa game this season both squads finished with the exact number of free throws attempted and percentage.
- Walk-on Ebone Pope played in her sixth game of the year. She had one shot attempt in the final seconds, but missed.
- The Hawkeyes improved to 5-0 when Bryan Enterline is one of the three officials. Enterline called Iowa's first four games of the season, including both in the Bahamas. Enterline's daughter, Leah, is a sophomore for Indiana, which is the Hawkeyes' next opponent.

# **ALL-TIME SERIES RECORDS**

Sunday will mark the 47th meeting between Iowa and Indiana. The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series 34-12, including a 12-8 advantage in games played in Assembly Hall.

The Hawkeyes have won the last three overall meetings and 15 of the last 18. Iowa defeated Indiana (62-51) on Dec. 30, in both teams' first conference game of the 2004-05 season. Indiana's last victory over Iowa came on Feb. 13, 2003 in Bloomington when the Hooisers won 89-68. The 89 points were the most Iowa ever yielded against Indiana in Assembly Hall.

There have been two overtime games played in the series, with both teams winning one.

#### ON THIS DATE

Iowa is 2-2 in games played on February 27, including dropping its last two. The Hawkeyes have never played Indiana on this date.

### **SCOUTING INDIANA**

Indiana enters Sunday's game on a three-game losing streak, falling to Texas A&M-CC (59-49), Purdue (62-58, ot) and No. 12 Minnesota (52-35). The Hoosiers' three league wins came over Northwestern (twice) and Wisconsin. Indiana is 7-6 in overall home games and 2-5 in conference home contests.

Indiana will be honoring two seniors before Sunday's game, LeeAnn Stephenson and Jamie Gathing. Jenny DeMuth is also a senior but injured her knee prior to the season and will return as a redshirt-senior in 2005-06.

In its last game, Indiana trailed Minnesota by only three points (27-24) at halftime. The Hoosiers were plagued by poor second half shooting, converting only 11.1 percent (3-27) from the field. For the game, Indiana made only one 3-pointer (1-11, .091). No Hoosier scored double figures in the loss. Jamey Chapman matched season high with eight points, while Anglea Hawkings pulled down a team-high eight rebounds. Minnesota's Jamie Broback recorded a double-double, posting game highs in points (15) and boards (10).

Indiana ranks first in the Big Ten in field goal percentage defense (.362) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.362) and third in scoring defense (55.3). The Hoosiers rank 11th in scoring offense (50.8), field goal percentage (.345), steals (6.46), assists (10.0) and assist/turnover ratio (0.66). Cyndi Valentin ranks 11th in the Big Ten in overall scoring (15.4) and sixth in free throw percentage (.824). Hawkins ranks eighth in rebounding (6.8).

The Hoosiers are coached by Kathi Bennett, who is in her 17th year as a head coach and her fifth at Indiana. Bennett has guided the Hoosiers to a 72-72 (.500) record over the past five seasons.

# **IOWA, INDIANA GAME NOTES**

- Sunday's game is pushed back to a 5:05 p.m. (CST) tip-off due to Indiana hosting Michigan State in men's basketball at 11 a.m. (CST).
- Indiana packed in 10,022 fans in its overtime loss to Purdue last Sunday.
- This year marks the second straight season Iowa closes its regular season on the road. Last season, the Hawkeyes played at Illinois (W, 89-64).
- Indiana senior Jenny DeMuth, who earned pre-season all-Big Ten laurels, suffered an ACL injury at "Midnight Madness" on Oct. 16 and has been sidelined for the entire season. Iowa junior Lindsay Richards suffered her second ACL injury last summer and is also sidelined for the enitre season. Both student-athletes will return next year.
- Iowa's Jamie Cavey netted a then-career-high 25 points (8-15 FG, 9-9 FT), a team-high eight rebounds and a career-best six assists in last year's win at Indiana. Cavey's pefect 9-9 shooting from the foul line was also a career best for free throws made and percentage.
- Head Coaches Lisa Bluder (Drake) and Kathi Bennett (Evansville) both coached in the Missouri Valley Conference. In fact, the coaching duo is two of four Big Ten coaches who formerly mentored in the MVC (Cheryl Burnett -- SMS and Lisa Stone -- Drake).

Crystal Smith scored 24 points and No. 18 Iowa extended its best start in 17 years, beating Indiana 62-51 in the teams' Big Ten opener.

Jamie Cavey added 13 points and 10 rebounds for the Hawkeyes (12-0), while Johanna Solverson finished with 13 points, five rebounds, three assists and three steals.

Only the 1987-88 Iowa team, which won its first 22 games, has started better than these Hawkeyes.

Iowa had trouble shaking Indiana early, then took control with a 29-9 run at the end of the first half and start of the second.

Cyndi Valentin led Indiana (7-4) with 15 points, and Leah Enterline scored 14. The Hoosiers shot just 26.7 percent (8-for-30) in the first half and 31.3 percent overall.

Playing aggressive defense, Iowa came up with 11 steals, including six by Smith.

Smith's driving layup with 8 seconds left in the half made it 35-23, and Iowa outscored Indiana 14-5 in the first four minutes of the second half to increase its lead to 21.

Indiana closed within 51-43 on Valentin's basket midway through the second half, but Tiffany Reedy made four straight free throws and Smith hit a layup to put the Hawkeyes back in control.

# **SCORING BY HALVES**

Iowa has out-scored its opponents 864-792 in the first half, 950-906 in the second half and 14-5 in overtime. The Hawkeyes have led at halftime in 15-of-26 contests. Iowa has out-scored its opponent in the second half in 13-of-26 games.

# **HEAD OF THE CLASS**

Jamie Cavey leads Big Ten seniors in field goal percentage (.567). Crystal Smith leads conference juniors in scoring (16.5) and field goal percentage (.502), while Johanna Solverson leads league juniors in assists (4.15). Krista VandeVenter leads league freshman in rebounding (7.4).

### **HOME, AWAY COMPARISONS**

In 14 home games, Iowa out-scored its opponents 1,031-927 (+7.4 margin), shooting 47.4 percent from the field and holding opponents to a 42.5 shooting percentage. Iowa also posted 244 assists to its opponents' 184 and attempted 98 more free throws (278-180). Iowa converted 75.5 percent of its free throws at home, while only 66.8 percent on the road.

In 12 games away from Iowa City, Iowa has out-scored its opponents 797-776 (+1.8 margin). Opponents have recorded 125 steals to Iowa's 100 (-2.08 margin) on the road. Also, the Hawkeyes have recorded 44 blocks to their opponents 38 away from Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa has posted 4.17 more turnovers per game than its opponents on the road. # WINS, LOSSES COMPARISONS

In Iowa's 18 wins, the Hawkeyes boasted a +12.5 scoring margin. Iowa averaged 73.6 ppg in its victories. The Hawkeyes also shot the ball well from the field (.483), while Hawkeye opponents have not (.376). Iowa out-rebounded its opponents 724-590 in its triumphs (+7.4 margin). Iowa attempted 138 more free throws (+7.67 margin) in its victories.

In the Hawkeyes' eight defeats, Iowa converted only 41.6 percent of their field goal attempts and scored only 63.4 ppg. In addition, Iowa turned the ball over 20.8 times in the eight setbacks. Opponents collected 91 steals to Iowa's 52. Here are the wins and losses comparisons:

### FRESHMAN AMONG ELITE GROUP

Krista Vande Venter leads the Hawkeyes in rebounding (7.4) through 26 games. The last time a true freshman led Iowa in rebounding was Tangela Smith (1994-95). In fact, only four other Hawkeyes have led the team in rebounding as freshman (Tangela Smith, 1994-95; Lynn Kennedy, 1983-84; Cindy Haugejorde, 1976-77; Jenni Mayer, 1975-76).

Furthermore, VandeVenter currently ranks second in rebounding for an Iowa freshman (193). She is 44 rebounds behind Haugejorde for first (237).

VandeVenter has pulled down 193 rebounds in 26 games, which eclipses Iowa's team-leader Jennie Lillis' 180 in 29 games last season.

#### **CAVEY CLIMBS CAREER CHARTS**

Senior Jamie Cavey has amassed 429 points through 26 contests this season. The senior has totaled 1,149 career points, which ranks 14th at Iowa. Cavey is only 12 points from passing Tia Jackson (1990-95) for 13th.

The Mechanicsville, IA, native has also collected 83 career blocks, which ranks fifth on Iowa's career chart. Forty-seven of her 83 blocks have come this season. Jennie Lillis was the last Hawkeye player to collect 40 rejections or more in a season when she blocked 40 during the 2002-03 season. Cavey is only three swats from moving into fourth place.

Cavey also cracked the top 20 in career rebounding at Michigan State. She has totaled 447 rebounds, which ranks 17th. Cavey is 36 boards from passing Michelle Edwards (1984-88) for 16th.

#### **BLOCK PARTY**

Senior Jamie Cavey has rejected 47 shots this season, a total that ranks sixth in a single-season at Iowa. She is only one block from moving past Toni Foster (1991-92) for fifth place.

# ARMSTRONG MAKES MOST OF STARTING OPPORTUNITY

Senior Jenna Arnstrong has started the last eight games and has averaged 8.67 ppg the last six starts, including posting 11 points vs. No. 2 Ohio State and 10 against Illinois.

She started her first collegiate game vs. Michigan on Jan. 27. Armstrong scored three points, grabbed four rebounds and collected two assists in the victory.

She equaled a career high playing 29 minutes at Purdue on Jan. 23. Against the Boilermakers, she scored all 12 Iowa bench points and they all were scored from beyond the arc. Armstrong also hauled in five defensive rebounds against the Boilermakers, four in the first half.

Armstrong has drained 30 field goals the last 12 games, with 23 of the 30 coming from beyond the arc. She tallied eight points at Michigan State, nine vs. Northwestern, 13 vs. Wisconsin, seven at Northwestern, 11 vs. No. 2 Ohio State and netted all eight of her points in the second half in Iowa's comeback victory at Michigan.

The native of Stockton, MO, ranks 10th in Big Ten 3-point field goals made (1.38) and 11th in 3-point field goal percentage (.340).

## CAVEY ON PACE TO BREAK FG PERCENTAGE RECORD

Jamie Cavey is on pace to break the school's career field goal percentage record. Currently, Cavey is shooting .579 (451-779) for her career. Michelle Edwards holds the career mark (.535, 777-1451).

## SOLVERSON CRACKS CAREER LISTS

Johanna Solverson ranks 21st in Iowa career rebounding (383), 14th in career steals (144) and 13th in assists (256). She is only one rebound from moving into 20th place, three thefts from moving into 13th and seven helpers from moving into 12th.

# **ATTENDANCE RANKINGS**

Iowa's home attendance average (4,083) ranks 25th nationally in the latest attendance rankings released Feb. 21. The Hawkeyes are the seventh-highest ranked Big Ten team behind No. 5 Minnesota (8,799), No. 6 Penn State State (8,665), No. 7 Purdue (8,456), No. 14 Wisconsin (6,100), No. 15 Michigan State (5,913) and No. 23 Ohio State (4,369).

The Hawkeyes averaged 4,134 fans for 13 games last season.

#### **VANDEVENTER CLEANS THE GLASS**

Krista VandeVenter has been Iowa's leading rebounder in 14 of its 26 games, including the first five contests of the season. VandeVenter pulled down 11 rebounds vs. Oklahoma (11/27) and Illinois (2/24) and a careerhigh 14 at Creighton (12/10). The freshman averages 7.4 boards per game and ranks sixth in the Big Ten. She also ranks second in the Big Ten in offensive rebounds (2.92). The last time an Iowa player led the team in rebounding five consecutive games was Jerica Watson in the last five games of the 2001-02 season.

The Osseo, MN, native has also done a good job offensively. Vande Venter scored all of her nine points in the second half against the Sooners. She also tallied 10 points vs. Iowa State and at Michigan, 12 vs. Illinois and at Purdue and a career-best 19 on 8-11 FG and 3-5 from the charity stripe at Creighton. Vande Venter averages 7.7 ppg. The post player also ranks fourth in assists (56). She has also recorded two steals in nine games.

## SHARING THE WEALTH

Iowa's triangle offense generates many assists. The Hawkeyes have three players who average 2.27 assists or more. Small forward Johanna Solverson (4.15) leads the team, followed by shooting guard Crystal Smith (2.58) and center Jamie Cavey (2.27).

#### **IOWA'S BIG TEN SCHEDULE**

Iowa's Big Ten portion of its schedule includes home-and-away contests against Illinois, Indiana, Michigan, Michigan State, Northwestern and Ohio State.

The Hawkeyes had single games with Penn State, Minnesota, Purdue and Wisconsin. Iowa traveled to Minneapolis and West Lafayette, while the Lady Lions and Badgers visited Iowa City. Iowa went 0-4 vs. the teams it played only once.

# Iowa Signs Five

Head Coach Lisa Bluder received National Letters of Intent from Megan Skouby, Lindsey Nyenhuis, Wendy Ausdemore, Nicole VanderPol and Kristi Smith to attend the University of Iowa.

"We feel this is a tremendous class that will add depth and height to our team," said Bluder about her fourth Iowa recruiting class.

Megan Skouby is a 6-6 center from Mentor, Ohio. As a junior, she led Mentor High School to a 24-2 record, averaging 17.9 points and pulling down 12.0 rebounds per contest, while shooting 63 percent from the field and 78 percent from the foul line. In her three years, the Cardinals posted a 66-10 record, including two district Division I championships. Skouby was an AP all-state honorable mention her freshman year. She was a *Street & Smith* all-America honorable mention and AP third team all-State her sophomore season. Last year, Skouby earned AP first team all-State laurels.

Wendy Ausdemore is a 6-2 forward from Neola, Iowa. She was named MVP of Tri-Center High School's basketball and volleyball teams the last three years. Ausdemore earned 2003 first team all-state and all-conference laurels in basketball. She was named the Southwest Iowa Volleyball Player of the Year, earned second team all-state and first team all-conference accolades in 2003. Ausdemore was named the 2004 AAU 17-and under Outstanding Amateur Athlete.

Kristi Smith, a 5-6 point guard from Thornton, Colorado, competes for Horizon High School. She has been a three-year starter and earned first team all-conference accolades. Last year, Smith was named to the Class 5A all-tournament team and also was recognized on the all-state team. As a junior, she helped advance her high school team to the Class 5A Final Four.

Lindsey Nyenhuis, a 5-7 guard from Grand Rapids, Michigan, competes for Forest Hills Northern High School. A two-year team captain and all-conference selection, she became the first girl to reach 1,000 points at her high school. Nyenhuis was also an all-state and all-area honorable mention selection. She also played for the Western Lakers AAU team for eight years. The Lakers won six-of-seven AAU state championships and finished in the "Sweet 16" three times at AAU nationals.

Nicole VanderPol is a 6-1 forward from Grundy Center, Iowa. Competing for Grundy Center High School, VanderPol is a three-time all-conference selection and was named Most Valuable Player in her conference as a sophomore and junior. As a junior, VanderPol averaged 19.1 ppg and 9.7 rpg in leading the Spartans to a runner-up finish at the Class 2A state tournament, where she earned all-tournament accolades. She was named first team all-State by the *Des Moines Register*, the Iowa Newspaper Association and North Central District.

This is the second time Bluder has put together a five-player recruiting class. Bluder inked Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson, Morgan Kasperek, Crystal Smith and Tiffany Reedy in the fall of 2001, which was her first recruiting class at Iowa.

# COMEBACK KIDS

Iowa has posted two substantial second half comebacks this season and nearly pulled off a third.

The Hawkeyes trailed by 17 points with 16 minutes remaining vs. Northwestern on Jan. 16. Iowa rallied to win 81-76 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa erased a 15-point second half deficit with 13 minutes left in regulation at Creighton on Dec. 10. The Hawkeyes won 91-82 in overtime in the Omaha Civic Auditorium.

The Hawkeyes trailed by as many as 20 points with 11:30 remaining vs. Penn State on Jan. 6. Iowa trimmed the Lady Lion advantage to two points with 3:30 left, but were unable to tie or take the lead down the stretch. Penn State won the contest 77-71 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes' biggest comeback under Coach Bluder was a 19-point second half rally with 19 minutes remaining to bounce Indiana (81-76) from the 2001 Big Ten Tournament quarterfinals in Grand Rapids, Michigan.

#### **IOWA BENCH PRODUCES**

Iowa's bench play has been one of the keys to its 18-8 record. Iowa's bench has outscored and out-rebounded its opponents 400-334 and 262-175, respectively. The Hawkeyes average 15.3 ppg and 10.1 rpg from their bench players. Iowa has out-scored 14-of-26 opponents in bench points.

- Iowa has controlled the opening tip in 17-of-26 games.
- Iowa yielded a school record two offensive rebounds the entire game to No. 2 Ohio State on Feb. 13.
- The Hawkeyes have out-rebounded three of their last five opponents (Michigan, +21; Ohio State, +11, Northwestern, +9, Illinois +6).
- Iowa's record vs. teams ranked 1-25 in the RPI is 0-6, 26-50 is 3-1, 51-100 is 5-1, 101-150 is 5-0 and 151-321 is 5-0.
- The Hawkeyes have attempted 501 free throws compared to their opponents' 332. Iowa has attempted 169 more free throws than its opponents, attempting 6.5 more free throws per game than its opponent.
- Iowa's single-game season high in attendance is 5,753 (Northwestern).
- Jamie Cavey has scored double figures in 24-of-26 games this year and 50 of the last 52 contests dating back to last season.
- Iowa has held four teams to 51 points or less (Indiana -- 51; UW-Milwaukee -- 51; Southern Illinois -- 50; Northern Iowa -- 50; Oklahoma -- 47; Northwestern -- 40).

- The victory over No. 21 Oklahoma marked Iowa's first win over a ranked opponent on a neutral floor since dropping Minnesota (80-77) on March 3, 2003 in the Big Ten Tournament.
- Iowa is 3-5 in overtime games under Coach Bluder.
- Iowa's 54-47 victory over then-No. 21 Oklahoma in the championship game of the Junkanoo Jam marked the first time the Hawkeyes won a game scoring 54 points or less since a 50-47 triumph over Michigan State on Feb. 22, 2001, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

### CAVEY REACHES THE CHARITY STRIPE

Senior Jamie Cavey has attempted at least one free throw in 65 of her last 67 games, dating back to the 2002-03 season. She failed to reach the free throw line vs. Indiana (1/15/04) and vs. Marquette (12/8/04).

### **BIG TEN RANKINGS**

As a team, the Hawkeyes rank third in Big Ten field goal percentage (.464), offensive rebounds (13.31), scoring offense (70.3) and assists (16.08), fourth in rebounds (38.0), rebounds allowed (32.7) and rebounding margin (+5.3).

Individually, Crystal Smith ranks sixth in league scoring (16.5), eighth in field goal percentage (.502) and 3-point field goals made (1.46), fourth in steals (2.23), seventh in free throw percentage (.814). Jamie Cavey ranks seventh in scoring (16.4), ninth in rebounding (6.7), third in field goal percentage (.567) and fourth in blocked shots (1.81). Krista VandeVenter ranks sixth in rebounding (7.4) and second in offensive rebounds (2.92). Johanna Solverson ranks fifth in steals (2.19), fourth in assists (4.15) and 24th in scoring (10.8).

### **FAST START**

Iowa enjoyed its best start in 17 years. The Hawkeyes' 13-0 is their second-best start in school history. Only the 1987-88 Iowa team, which won its first 22 games, started better than these Hawkeyes. In addition, Iowa was the last Division I team to be beaten.

Iowa's 13-0 start, matched Coach Bluder's best start at a Division I school. The native of Marion, Iowa, guided the Drake Bulldogs to a 13-0 start in 1994 and eventually advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament.

# THUNDER AND LIGHTNING

Guard Crystal Smith has been one of league's top offensive and defensive player through nine games. The junior was named MVP of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and Junkanoo Jam. Smith ranks first on the team and eighth in Big Ten in scoring (16.3), first on the team and eighth in conference free throw percentage (.815) and first on the team and seventh in league steals (2.24). The native of Haughton, LA, has netted 20 points or more seven times, which ranks seventh in the Big Ten. She netted a career-high 33 points at Drake on Dec. 18. Smith's performances has turned some heads around the nation.

"Crystal is just an outstanding player," said Iowa State Head Coach Bill Fennelly. "She's an impact player on both ends of the floor. I hope we don't have to play a guard as good as her the rest of the season."

"I've been around the game a long time and Crystal is as good a player I've ever seen," said Northern Iowa Head Coach Tony DiCecco. "She has a lot of tools. She's extremely difficult to defend because at a split second she's at full speed. She's lightning quick and I tip my hat to her."

"She's so lighting fast. She has to be the most improved player in the Big Ten," said Penn State Head Coach Rene Portland.

Center Jamie Cavey has been a force down in the post. The senior tricaptain, ranks second on the team and seventh in the Big Ten in scoring (16.5) and first on the team and third in the conference in field goal percentage (.562).

Cavey has scored double figures in 23-of-25 contests. Furthermore, she has scored double digits in 65 of her last 67 games, dating back to the 2002-03 season. Cavey has led Iowa in scoring eight of the last 10 contests. She was named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge and Junkanoo Jam all-Tournament teams.

# HAWKEYES CAPTURE MYTHICAL STATE TITLE

Iowa captured its second mythical state title in three years. The Hawkeyes first defeated Iowa State (89-80) on Dec. 1, followed by victories over and Northern Iowa (77-50) on Dec. 8 and Drake (80-69) on Dec. 18.

# **EMMERT MAKES HISTORY**

Abby Emmert became only the second Iowa freshman to start at point guard. Prior to this season, Cara Consuegra was Iowa's only freshman to start at point guard (1997).

### FRESHMEN START FOR HAWKEYES

Power forward Krista VandeVenter has started all 26 games, while point guard Abby Emmert started 14 contests.

Emmert and VandeVenter became the first Iowa freshmen duo to start since the 1994-95 season where newcomers Tiffany Gooden and Tangela Smith started 17 and 15 games, respectively.

## RICHARDS TO REDSHIRT

Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder on Jan. 11, announced that junior point guard Lindsay Richards will redshirt this season.

"Lindsay has decided to take the redshirt this year," said Bluder. "I think it's a great decision. For us to have her healthy for two full years will be a great benefit to our program."

The junior has recovered and has been participating in practices.

"There's a big difference between being able to participate and being able to compete," commented Richards. "At this time I don't feel I'm at the level I need to be at."

Richards underwent successful surgery on July 7 to repair a torn anterior cruciate ligament in her right knee. The native of Barrington, IL, sustained the injury during practice with the Big Ten All-Stars before the team left for Australia in June, 2004. This was the second time in as many years she underwent surgery to repair a damaged ACL in her right knee. Richards' first ACL injury came in a home game against Denver on December 12, 2002.

Richards started all 29 games for the Hawkeyes last year. She ranked fifth on the team in scoring (5.4 ppg) and free throw percentage (39-51, .765), second in assists (85) and fourth in steals (27). Her 2.93 assists average ranked 11th in the Big Ten. Richards was also an academic all-Big Ten selection last year.

Before injuring her knee as a freshman, she played in eight games as a reserve, averaging 4.5 ppg, 1.6 rpg and dishing out 29 assists. Richards will not receive a medical redshirt for her freshman season.

#### NCAA TOURNAMENT PROJECTIONS

Projections have begun for the NCAA Tournament and <a href="www.collegerpi.com">www.collegerpi.com</a> does not have the Hawkeyes listed in its third projection. The web site lists Iowa as "Close But Not In The Tournament".

The Big XII and ACC is projected to have seven teams each in the "Big Dance". The Big East, Big Ten, Pac 10 and SEC are projected to have five teams each.

The web site projects a new bracket every Friday night.

# HAWKEYES ADD WALK-ON

Head Coach Lisa Bluder announced that Ebone Pope (Ottumwa, IA) has been added to the 2004-05 roster as a walk-on. The 5-9 guard will wear No. 15.

Pope was a two-year starter at Marshalltown Community College. Pope averaged a team-best 11.3 ppg, 6.0 rpg and 2.7 apg last year. She was team captain, earned first team all-conference and first team all-tournament honors last season. She averaged 9.0 ppg and earned all-region honorable mention accolades her freshman year.

She graduated from Ottumwa High School in 2002, where she averaged 14.5 ppg, 3.5 apg and 3.3 rpg. Pope earned second team all-conference laurels her junior and senior years. Her high school team competed in the state tournament her senior season.

Pope joins Kristi Faulkner (2001-04) as the only walk-ons to make a Hawkeye roster under Coach Bluder.

### HAWKEYES WIN TOURNAMENTS

Iowa won two holiday tournaments this season. The Hawkeyes opened the season with wins over Southern Illinois (66-50) and Missouri (75-54) to claim its 16th KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge championship.

One week later, the Hawkeyes defeated Florida (65-62) and then-No. 21 Oklahoma (54-47) to capture the Junkanoo Jam in the Bahamas.

Crystal Smith was named MVP of both tournaments. Smith averaged 12.0 ppg and was the defensive star of the Junkanoo Jam. The junior averaged 17.5 ppg and 3.5 spg in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge. The native of Haughton, LA, scored 26 points in the championship game vs. Missouri, shattering her previous career high (10 points). Furthermore, Smith was a perfect 7-7 from the foul line, setting new career highs in free throws made and attempted.

Jamie Cavey joined Smith on both all-tournament teams. Cavey averaged 15.5 ppg and 5.0 rpg in the Junkanoo Jam and 12.5 ppg in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge. Johanna Solverson joined Smith and Cavey on the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge all-tournament team. Solverson averaged 12.5 ppg in the two games and was a perfect 6-6 shooting from the field, including 4-4 from beyond the arc in Iowa's first round 66-50 win over Southern Illinois. The four 3-pointers is a career high, as is her game-high six steals against the Salukis.

# CAVEY NAMED TO "WATCH LIST"

Senior Jamie Cavey is one of 36 female student-athletes named to the Collegiate Basketball Award of Excellence "Watch List".

The award honors college seniors for their athletic and academic achievement as well as their community involvement. The award will be presented at the end of the 2004-05 season on April 12, in Albuquerque, NM.

# **Game Summaries**

Game 1 Iowa 66, Southern Illinois 50 Nov. 19, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY** - - Iowa opened its 2004-05 season on a high note, winning its first round game 66-50 over Southern Illinois in the KCRG-TV 9 Hawkeye Challenge.

Ten of Iowa's 11 players scored two points or more en route to a season opening victory. Leading by 10 at halftime (26-16), the Hawkeyes went on a 23-8 run in the first seven minutes of the second half to stretch their lead to 25 points (49-24). The Salukis outscored the Hawkeyes 19-7 in the final 6:30 to close the gap to 16 (66-50) by games end.

Iowa was led by Johanna Solverson. The native of Lake Zurich, IL, shot a prefect 6-6 from the field, including 4-4 from three-point range. The 4-4 shooting from beyond the arc tied a Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for 3-point field goal percentage. Solverson also collected four assists and a career-high six steals. Tri-captain Jamie Cavey tallied 12 points and four assists. Tri-captain Crystal Smith recorded nine points, five rebounds and three assists. Morgan Kasperek posted career highs in points (8) and rebounds (6), while Jenna Armstrong dished out a career-high six assists.

Iowa's defense didn't allow for many easy baskets down low for Southern Illinois. The Salukis scored only 10 points in the paint and were forced to score a majority of their points from the perimeter. In fact, Southern Illinois converted 7-29 three-pointers, which broke the arena record for three-point attempts.

Iowa improved to 5-0 in season opening games under Coach Bluder.

**IOWA CITY** -- Iowa won its 16th Hawkeye Challenge with a dominating performance in a 75-54 victory over Missouri in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Crystal Smith, Johanna Solverson and Jamie Cavey were named to the all-tournament team, while Smith was tabbed as the MVP.

Smith had a career day scoring 26 points, shattering her previous career high by 16 points. The Haughton, LA, native converted a career-high 7-7 from the foul line and also collected a game-high four steals. Solverson scored nine points, grabbed five rebounds and collected three steals. Cavey tallied 13 points and two steals. Cavey was the only Iowa player to score in double figures in both tournament contests.

The Hawkeyes led from start to finish to claim their second win of the season. Iowa built a 12-point halftime lead and extended its lead to a gamehigh 21 in the second half. Iowa dominated the paint, out-scoring the Tigers 42-16 in the paint. The Hawkeyes also took advantage of 25 Missouri miscues, turning them into 29 points. Iowa also out-scored Missouri 19-7 at the charity stripe.

Another bright spot for the Hawkeyes was the play of freshman Krista VandeVenter. VandeVenter, who replaced all-Big Ten performer Jennie Lillis, tallied five points, but collected game highs in rebounds (9) and assists (6).

# **Game Summaries**

Game 3 Iowa 65, Florida 62 Nov. 26, 2004, St. Georges HS Gym

**FREEPORT, BAHAMAS - -** Iowa travelled to the Bahamas for the first time and opened the Junkanoo Jam with a 65-62 victory over Florida of the Southeastern Conference.

Jamie Cavey scored a team-high 19 points, Crystal Smith added 13 --including seven in the final seven minutes, and Jenna Armstrong 11 for the Hawkeyes. Krista VandeVenter grabbed a team-high six reounds.

Iowa's defense was outstanding for the third straight game. Florida shot just 37 percent from the field. Danielle Santos scored a game-high 23 points for the Gators, who also got 18 points from Bernice Mosby.

Iowa took an eight-point lead into the lockerroom at intermission. The Hawkeyes stretched that margin to 14 when Cavey dropped a free throw to complete a traditional three-point play.

The Hawkeyes then watched Florida trim their lead to just one at 53-52 when Santos sank a 3-pointer. It was then, however, that Smith took over for Iowa. The Hawkeyes' senior point guard scored seven of Iowa's final 13 points to secure the victory.

Iowa's bench was terrific, outscoring the Gators, 23-12. Freshman Stacy Schlapkohl tallied a season-high eight points on a perfect 4-4 shooting from the field.

The Hawkeyes out-scored the Gators, 12-5 at the foul line. In addition, nine of Iowa's 10 players scored two points or more en route to victory.

The victory was Iowa's first over Florida in two tries.

# Game 5 Iowa 89, Iowa State 80 Dec. 1, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** The Hawkeyes jumped on intra-state rival Iowa State early and it was too much to overcome as Iowa defeated the Cyclones 89-80 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Solid defense and good shooting enabled the Hawkeyes to build a 19-point (45-26) halftime advantage. The 45 points are the most Iowa has scored in a half this season.

Five players scored in double figures for the first time this season. Jamie Cavey fueled the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 19 points, bolstered by a perfect 9-9 shooting from the foul line. Crystal Smith tallied 17 points and grabbed a career-high eight rebounds. Jenna Armstrong came off the bench and posted career highs in points (15) and 3-pointers made (5) and attempted (12). Johanna Solverson contributed 12 points and six rebounds, while Krista Vande Venter added 10 points and eight rebounds.

Iowa's depth proved to be a factor as the Hawkeye bench out-scored the Cyclones 28-19. Iowa also dominated in transition, out-scoring Iowa State 14-0 in fast break points.

Anne O'Neil paced the Cyclones with 17 points and four assists. The Cyclones were out-scored 24-11 at the charity stripe in the loss.

Game 6 Iowa 77, Northern Iowa 50 Dec. 5, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY** - - After a slightly sloppy first half of play that saw the home team play perhaps a little too generous a host, Coach Lisa Bluder's Iowa Hawkeyes got serious about protecting their home court and their unblemished record, and ran away from the Northern Iowa Panthers en route to a 77-50 victory at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The win pushed the record for Bluder's Bunch to a perfect 6-0 -- the best start for the Iowa Hawkeyes since the 1995-96 season when Iowa won its first seven games.

The Hawkeyes turned a 40-28 halftime lead into a 21-point margin by outscoring Northern Iowa 14-5 during the first 10 minutes of the second stanza. Iowa never led by less than 20 during the last 10 minutes of the second half. That was in sharp contrast to the first half when Iowa built a double-digit lead only to see UNI trim it to six, 27-21, when Tara King dropped a jumper with 6:10 to play.

Iowa was led in scoring by Crystal Smith who scored a game-high 21 points. Stacy Schlapkohl added 18 and Jamie Cavey 14. Hawkeye guard Abby Emmert paced Iowa's rebounding attack with eight - all coming on the defensive end of the floor.

Defense again proved big for the Hawkeyes. In addition to outrebounding their visitors by nine, Iowa limited the Panthers to just 38 percent shooting from the field and forced 21 turnovers.

Iowa also again enjoyed big-time contributions from its bench, getting 31 points from its non-starters.

Game 7 Iowa 78, Marquette 72 Dec. 8, 2004, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY** - - Iowa recorded its fifth consecutive victory over Marquette with a 78-72 triumph in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The Hawkeyes have started the season 7-0 and matches their best start in nine years.

Marquette jumped out to a quick 7-0 lead. However, Iowa erased the early deficit with sharp-shooting from the perimeter. The Hawkeyes drained 7-15 from beyond the arc in the first half. Iowa out-scored Marquette the final two minutes of the half.

The Hawkeyes were led by Johanna Solverson. The junior had one of the best games of her career. Solverson tied a career high with 21 points, bolstered by 4-8 shooting from 3-point range. Game 8 Iowa 91, Creighton 82 (OT) Dec. 10, 2004, Omaha Civic Auditorium

**OMAHA**, **NE** - - Forget about what happened in the first 27 minutes of Iowa's first true road game of the season at Creighton. It's what happened in the final 13 minutes of regulation and overtime that's important. The Hawkeyes went from being left for dead and handed its first loss of the season to registering a thrilling 91-82 victory over the Bluejays.

The home team took its largest lead of the game (15 points) at the 13:19 mark of the second half. Iowa responded by going on a 28-12 run over the next nine minutes to take a 71-70 lead.

Leading the charge for the Hawkeyes was Crystal Smith, who scored seven of her team-high 23 points during the run. Iowa also got six points from Krista VandeVenter and four points and a handful of rebounds from Jamie Cavey.

The lead changed hands three times and there were three ties in the final four minutes. The last tie came after Smith gave Iowa a 77-75 lead on a lay-up with 41 seconds to play. Creighton's Laura Spanheimer made a pair of free throws with 25 ticks left to play to send the game into overtime.

Supercharged by their comeback, the Hawkeyes out-scored Creighton 11-5 in the first three minutes of overtime thanks to six points by Solverson. Iowa successfully snatched victory from the jaws of defeat.

Iowa scored a season-high 91 points, 58 of which coming in the paint where Iowa claimed a slim 42-37 edge on the glass thanks to huge nights by VandeVenter and Cavey, who took down a career-high 14 and 10 rebounds, respectively.

Smith was one of four Hawkeyes to score in double-figures. Cavey added 20, VandeVenter a career-high 19, and Solverson 13 for the victors, who shot a blistering 70 percent from the field in the second half and 83 percent in overtime.

# **Game Summaries**

Game 9 #23 Iowa 80, Drake 69 Dec. 18, 2004, Knapp Center

**DES MOINES, IA (AP)** -- Crystal Smith scored a career-high 33 points and Jamie Cavey added 16 points, 13 rebounds and seven blocks, leading No. 23 Iowa to an 80-69 victory over Drake in the Knapp Center.

Iowa, who joined the Top 25 for the first time prior to this game, scored the first six points and never trailed. The Hawkeyes led by as many as 20 in the second half before going scoreless for nearly six minutes.

Iowa coach Lisa Bluder picked up her third straight victory over Drake, where she coached for 10 years before taking the Iowa job in 2000.

Erin Dohrmann led Drake with a career-high 25 points, Lindsay Whorton scored 14 and Linda Sayavongchanh 13.

Drake trailed 54-34 midway through the second half, then went on a 19-6 run to cut the lead to 60-53 on Dohrmann's 3-pointer with 5:05 remaining. Another 3 by Dohrmann brought the Bulldogs to 69-61 with 1:33 left, but they got no closer.

Smith, who was 12-for-16 from the field, answered with a layup, then made 7-of-8 free throws in the final 51 seconds. Smith's performance garnered her co-Big Ten Player of the Week accolades.

Also contributing for the Hawkeyes was freshman Krista VandeVenter and senior Tiffany Reedy. VandeVenter netted eight points and pulled down nine rebounds, while Reedy collected all three rebounds and her seasonhigh nine points in the first half.

Iowa outrebounded Drake 46-24, including grabbing more offensive boards (18) than Drake's defensive rebounds (17).

**MILWAUKEE**, **WI (AP)** - - Johanna Solverson led the way with a career-high 23 points as 18th-ranked Iowa wiped out a five-point halftime deficit and beat Wisconsin-Milwaukee 59-51.

The Hawkeyes shot only 28.1 percent in the first half, which ended with the Panthers leading 30-25.

But the Hawkeyes made 53.3 percent after the break while holding the Panthers to 29.2 percent for the half and 30.4 percent for the game.

Game 14 Penn State 77, #17 Iowa 71 Jan. 6, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Jess Strom and Penn State saw to it that Iowa's stint as the nation's only unbeaten team was short.

Strom scored nine of her career-high 29 points in the final 2:18 and Penn State held on after blowing most of a 20-point lead to beat Iowa 77-71.

Iowa had been left as the nation's lone unbeaten Division I team after top-ranked LSU lost at Rutgers on Jan. 5. But the Hawkeyes couldn't quite make it all the way back after trailing 59-39 with less than 12 minutes to

Tanisha Wright and Jennifer Harris each scored 18 points for Penn State, which has played a brutal schedule and pulled off its third major upset. The Lady Lions also knocked off then-No. 2 North Carolina and No. 9 Ohio State, both at home.

Iowa got 18 points from Johanna Solverson and a huge lift from reserves Jenee Graham and Morgan Kasperek, with each finishing with 11 points.

With Graham and Kasperek providing the spark, Iowa outscored Penn State 10-3 to cut the lead to 62-49. Solverson's 3-pointer capped a 13-0 run that drew the Hawkeyes to 64-62 with 3:50 to play and they trailed 66-64 after Kasperek's layup with 2:47 remaining.

But Iowa couldn't get the defensive stop it needed to tie or take the lead and Strom took over down the stretch, scoring on a driving layup and making seven of eight free throws to keep Penn State on top.

Penn State kept Iowa's leading scorer, the ultra-quick Crystal Smith, bottled up most of the game. Smith was scoreless in the first half and finished with nine points, half her average. Iowa center Jamie Cavey, averaging 15.7 points, scored only six on 3-for-10 shooting.

Penn State finished with a season-high 10 3-pointers in 21 attempts.

# Game 15 #6 Michigan State 68, #17 Iowa 56 Jan. 9, 2005, Breslin Center

**EAST LANSING, MI (AP)** - - Victoria Lucas-Perry scored seven points during a 19-0 run late in the first half that helped the No. 6 Spartans avoid consecutive Big Ten losses with a 68-56 win over Iowa.

The Spartans trailed 15-12 before Lucas-Perry got them going on both ends. Michigan State forced 20 turnovers and Lucas-Perry had four of the Spartans' 15 steals. She finished with 13 points.

Lindsay Bowen had 17 points and Liz Shimek added 16 points and 10 rehounds

Before 8,512 fans, the fourth-largest home crowd in the program's history, the Spartans out-shot and out-scrapped the Hawkeyes for most of the final 32 minutes.

The Hawkeyes were led by Jamie Cavey, who returned to the game after suffering a bloody nose. Cavey finished with a season-high 21 points before fouling out with 4:02 left. The senior also posted team highs in blocks (6) and rebounds (8). Crystal Smith added 11 points and three rebounds.

The win was Michigan State's fourth in five matchups with ranked opponents and prevented an 0-2 week, following a 68-54 loss at No. 9 Ohio State.

The Hawkeyes, who entered the game with their best start in 17 years, have lost two straight.

Iowa shot a season-low 39.6 percent (21-53) from the field and also converted only 50 percent (10-20) from the foul line in the loss.

# Game 16 #5 Ohio State 80, #21 Iowa 57 Jan. 6, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

COLUMBUS, OH (AP) - - Two overlooked players finally got some attention for fifth-ranked Ohio State.

Marscilla Packer and Michelle Munoz -- the Buckeyes' ninth- and seventh-leading scorers -- had all of the points in an 11-0 first-half run to power Ohio State to an 80-57 win over Iowa.

Jessica Davenport led Ohio State, which won its fifth consecutive game, with 19 points. Matter and Brandie Hoskins each had 13 points, and Munoz scored 12. Packer hit her first three 3-pointers and finished with nine points.

Jamie Cavey had 17 points, Johanna Solverson added 15 and Crystal Smith had 10 for the Hawkeyes, who had as many turnovers (21) as field goals.

Ohio State led 15-13 midway through the half before going on an 8-3 run, with Davenport scoring the first four points in the spurt.

After the Hawkeyes' Smith hit a layup to end a two-minute scoring drought, the Buckeyes ran off 11 points in a row. Packer, just in from the bench, hit two 3-pointers and Munoz scored on a layup and a three of her own to push the lead to 34-18.

Down 39-24 at halftime, Iowa drew to 54-42 with a 9-2 run -- the last five points by Solverson. But Ohio State pounded the ball inside to Davenport and her three-point play at the 11:31 mark preceded another 3-pointer by Packer, touching off a 12-0 streak.

Iowa was scoreless for more than four minutes as the lead climbed.

The Buckeyes hit 54 percent of their shots from the field and were 9-of-19 from behind the arc. They converted Iowa turnovers into 25 points.

# Game 18 #23 Purdue 79, #22 Iowa 75 Jan. 23, 2005, Mackey Arena

**WEST LAFAYETTE, IN - -** Iowa dropped its seventh straight game to Purdue and its seventh consecutive contest in West Lafayette, with a heart-breaking 79-75 loss in Mackey Arena.

The game was a back-and-forth affair that saw 26 lead changes and eight ties. Iowa took a three-point halftime advantage (34-31) into the locker-room, holding Purdue to 39.4 percent (13-33) shooting from the field.

The Boilermakers were a different team in the second half. Purdue shot a blazing 73.1 percent (19-26) in the second stanza to lift the home team to its 11th victory of the season. Iowa led 51-50 with 9:37 to play in the game and then Purdue scored on 10 of its next 11 possessions to take the lead and hold on down the stretch.

The Hawkeyes allowed 42 points in the paint and 21 points off turnovers. Iowa almost collected as many turnovers (22) as field goals made (23).

Jamie Cavey and Crystal Smith fueled Iowa's offense. Cavey, who netted career point No. 1,000 in the first half, tallied a game-high 22 points (7-12 FG, 8-8 FT), while Smith amassed 21 points (7-17 FG, 5-6 FT). Jenna Armstrong scored all 12 Iowa bench points on 4-6 shooting from beyond the arc, while Krista VandeVenter netted eight of her 12 points at the foul line in defeat.

Purdue's Katie Geralds scored 17 of her team-high 19 points in the second half. She converted 6-9 from the field, including 3-3 from 3-point range and 2-2 from the charity stripe in the second stanza. Lindsay Wisdom-Hylton also netted 19 points, while Aya Traore added a career-high 16 points.

Iowa converted 84.6 percent from the foul line (22-26) in the loss.

In addition, the loss was Iowa's first when leading at the half this season (11-1) and first in 20 games dating back to last season. The 75 points Iowa scored were the most the Hawkeyes scored in Mackey Arena since 1987.

# **Game Summaries**

Game 19 Iowa 71, Michigan 63 Jan. 27, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY** -- After losing four of their previous five games, the Hawkeyes got back on the winning track with a 71-63 victory over Michigan in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Iowa led start-to-finish to claim its ninth home triumph of the season.

Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes, scoring a team-high 19 points (8-15 FG, 0-2 FT) and collecting a game-high four steals. Jamie Cavey tallied 14 points (6-8 FG, 2-2 FT) and four rebounds, while Tiffany Reedy came off the bench and scored a season-high 12 points (4-8 FG, 2-2 FT). Morgan Kasperek did not score, but did haul in a career-high eight rebounds.

Iowa led by just eight points (26-18) with 7:30 remaining in the first half before a 10-0 run ballooned the Hawkeyes' lead to 18 (36-18) with 4:29 left in the half. The Hawkeyes would take a 16-point (39-23) advantage into the lockerroom.

Michigan's Tabitha Pool tallied 15 or her game-high 21 points in the second half, to lead the Wolverines on a late rally. Pool drained her third 3-pointer of the night with 47 seconds left to trim Iowa's lead to five (68-63), but Michigan would get no closer. Kelly Helvey contributed 14 points on 7-8 shooting from the field in defeat.

Iowa's bench out-scored Michigan (23-11) and the Hawkeyes out-scored the Wolverines in the paint (32-22).

For the first time this season, all 10 Hawkeyes that played saw double digit minutes of action.

Jamie Cavey led all Iowa scorers with 18 points and also grabbed a team-high seven rebounds. Crystal Smith added 12 points, while Johanna Solverson distributed a game-high six assists.

Jamie Broback paced the Golden Gophers posting game highs in points (21) and rebounds (9). McCarville scored 12 of her 16 points in the second half and also hauled in eight boards. Shannon Schonrock tallied 12 of her 14 points on the first half on 4-5 shooting from beyond the arc. As a team, the Golden Gophers drained eight triples to the Hawkeyes' two.

# Game 21 Wisconsin 88, #25 Iowa 78 Feb. 6, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Close wasn't good enough for the Hawkeyes Sunday as Wisconsin downed the Hawkeyes (88-78) inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The same storylines repeated themselves for the Hawkeyes, who felt they needed a win to stay competitive in the Big Ten. They've won two of their last eight games in a difficult stretch of the schedule.

But Iowa's defense let go of the perimeter, its offense had 22 turnovers, and two starters fouled out while two more were perilously close with four by the end of the game.

Iowa took early control of the contest building up a 15-point lead in the opening eight minutes with strong post play by Krista VandeVenter and Jamie Cavey. VandeVenter, an all-Big Ten freshman contender, scored the Hawkeyes' first eight points and had 11 for the game.

But the Badgers answered with a 13-0 charge of their own, getting the score to within three with nine minutes to play in the half. Kjersten Bakke tied the game (26-26) on a 3-point play.

While Iowa benefited from the Badgers' poor defense in the opening minutes, Wisconsin struck back at the perimeter, taking advantage of Iowa's weakness. For the game, Wisconsin hit 8-of-12 triples.

Ashley Josephson nailed 5-of-6 from beyond the arc and scored a careerhigh 29 points for the Badgers.

Iowa came out of the intermission and rallied with a 13-2 run that gave the Hawkeyes their largest lead since the 15-pointer they gave up in the first, 53-47.

The Badgers answered and after they tied the contest, they held the Hawkeyes scoreless for the next 7 minutes and 14 seconds. Wisconsin out-scored the Hawkeyes by six in the stretch.

The Hawkeyes closed the game by sending Anderson and Rich to the line, who turned around four straight free throws.

EVANSTON, IL - - Iowa cruised to a 60-40 triumph over Northwestern in Welsh-Ryan Arena. The 40 points are a season low for an Iowa opponent this season. The Hawkeyes led by as many as 31 points and led start-to-

The Hawkeyes were led by junior Johanna Solverson, who played prep ball at nearby Lake Zurich High School. Solverson, who had been in a funk her previous five games, snapped out of it by scoring 14 points, collecting three rebounds, two steals and posting only one turnover. Senior Jamie Cavey led all scorers with 15 points, while a pair of freshmen led the Hawkeyes in rebounding. Krista VandeVenter and Jeneé Graham each pulled down seven boards.

Iowa jumped out to a quick 10-0 advantage and stretched its lead to 26-9 with 7:05 left. However, the Hawkeyes made only one field goal the rest of the half and the Wildcats closed the half on an 8-2 run to trim Iowa's lead to 11 points (28-17).

Northwestern would get no closer as Iowa's offense and defensive intensity increased and the Hawkeyes opened the second stanza on a 26-6 run to build their lead to 31 points (54-23). Iowa led 60-30 with 4:12 left before Northwestern scored the contest's last 10 points.

The Wildcats were led by Sara Stutz and Suzanne Morrison. Stutz tallied a team-high 10 points, while Morrison netted six points and seven rebounds. Sarah Kwasinsky, who entered the game as Northwestern's leading scorer (12.6), was limited to only six points (3-9 FG, 0-1 FT).

Iowa out-rebounded Northwestern by nine (42-33) and held the Wildcats to 33.3 percent (18-54) shooting from the field.

After posting 20 turnovers or more the previous seven games, Iowa recorded 16 at Northwestern, with four of the 16 coming in the final 2:30 minutes with Iowa's reserves on the floor.

Game 23 #2 Ohio State 67, Iowa 60 Feb. 13, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Jessica Davenport scored 21 points and converted a key 3-point play late in the game that enabled No. 2 Ohio State to hold off Iowa 67-60 for its 13th straight victory.

Caity Matter added 18 points for the Buckeyes and hit a 3-pointer with just under five minutes left to break the game's final tie. Ohio State used a 16-0 run to erase a 12-point Iowa advantage in the first half, then went on a 13-2 second-half run to take the lead for good.

Iowa led 53-47 when Krista Vande Venter scored on a putback with 11:47 remaining, then made only two baskets the rest of the way. Jamie Cavey led the Hawkeyes with 22 points, 14 in the second half and 10 rebounds.

Beth Howe started Ohio State's decisive rally with a jumper and Davenport, who had been scoreless the first 13 minutes of the half, hit consecutive shots inside to tie it at 53. Then, with the score tied at 55, Iowa's Jenna Armstrong lost the ball driving into the lane and Kim Wilburn hit Matter for a wide open 3 on the right wing. Tamarah Riley followed with a basket inside to complete the run, making it 60-55.

Cavey's final basket cut the lead to three with four minutes to play, but the Hawkeyes came up empty on their next three possessions and the Buckeyes finally got the ball to Davenport on the low block.

The 6-foot-4 sophomore was fouled by Cavey as she hit a turnaround and sank the free throw, making it 63-57 with 1:15 remaining.

Brandie Hoskins added 14 points for Ohio State, while Wilburn finished with eight steals and six assists. Crystal Smith scored 12 for Iowa and Armstrong had 11.

Iowa made seven 3-pointers, three by Armstrong, and got four baskets inside from Cavey in zooming to its early lead. Iowa went on a 14-2 run to open a 34-22 lead with 6:07 left in the first half.

Game 24 #9 Michigan State 67, Iowa 60 Feb. 17, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) - - Michigan State posted 23 turnovers, but the ninthranked Spartans survived, beating Iowa 67-60 on Thursday night behind Liz Shimek's 20 points and 13 rebounds.

The other half of Michigan State's inside duo, Kelli Roehrig, hit two key baskets during a late 12-2 run that wiped out Iowa's only lead and gave the Spartans their seventh straight victory.

Iowa played its second consecutive strong game against a top-ten opponent but couldn't stay with the Spartans down the stretch. The Hawkeyes lost to Ohio State 67-60 last Sunday.

Crystal Smith led Iowa with 19 points and Jamie Cavey scored 16, though Cavey shot just 5-for-15. She was a 57.7 percent shooter coming in.

Roehrig was limited to 15 minutes because of foul trouble but still contributed 10 points for Michigan State, including six in the final 4:34. She fouled out with 47.8 seconds remaining.

Michigan State trailed for a total of 24 seconds during the first six games of its winning streak and was behind for just 19 seconds in this one. That happened when Smith hit back-to-back 3-pointers to give Iowa a 50-48 lead with 5:19 to play.

Shimek sank two free throws to tie it at 50 with five minutes remaining; after Smith missed a jumper, Roehrig scored on a follow to put Michigan State back in the lead. Iowa then threw the ball away and the 6-foot-4 Roehrig beat the defense down the floor for a layup, making it 54-50.

The Spartans built their lead to 60-52 before Iowa made a final run, drawing to 62-58 on Smith's two free throws with 47.8 seconds left. But Michigan State made five-of-six free throws to secure the win.

Michigan State led 40-29 early in the second half before Iowa rallied, getting a 3-pointer from Tiffany Reedy and the two from Smith to take its brief lead.

# Game Summaries

Game 25 Iowa 78, Michigan 59 Feb. 19, 2005, Crisler Arena

ANN ARBOR, MI - - Iowa scored 51 second half points en route to a comeback victory at Michigan Saturday night in Crisler Arena.

The Hawkeyes trailed by as many as 13 points in the first half (29-16), but rallied and closed the half on an 11-2 run to trim their deficit to four (31-27).

The second half featured 11 lead changes and the Hawkeyes grabbed the lead for good on a Jenna Armstrong 3-pointer (57-55) with 5:28 left in the game. The Hawkeyes finished strong, closing the game on a 26-4 run. The Wolverines missed their last seven field goal attempts and their last four points came at the foul line.

Iowa had four players score double figures. The Hawkeyes were led by Jamie Cavey, who posted her fifth double-double of the season. The senior scored a team-high 19 points and grabbed a game and career-high 14 rebounds. Johanna Solverson scored 15 of her 18 points in the second half, pulled down seven rebounds and also dished out a game and careerhigh 10 assists. The 10 assists tie three other Big Ten players for the most in a game this season. Crystal Smith contributed 12 points, while Krista VandeVenter added 10.

Iowa was only 1-13 (.077) from 3-point range in the first half, but heated up from beyond the arc in the second. The Hawkeyes made 6-11 (.545) triples in the second stanza, including four of their last five attempts during the final eight minutes of the contest.

The Hawkeyes dominated the boards, out-rebounding the Wolverines by 21 (50-29). Iowa yielded only three offensive rebounds in the second

Michigan was led by seniors Tabitha Pool and BreAnne McPhilamy. The duo celebrated their senior night's by scoring 20 and 11, respectively.

Game 26 Iowa 87, Illinois 63 Feb. 24, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

**IOWA CITY - -** Iowa won its second straight conference game for the first time since the Hawkeyes won its first two league contests with a 24point victory (87-63) over Illinois in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The triumph was Iowa's largest during conference play and secured the Hawkeyes the sixth seed in the Big Ten Tournament.

The Hawkeyes were led by a pair of seniors, who played their final regular season home game in Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Jamie Cavey tallied 15 points and eight rebounds, while Jenna Arnstrong netted 10 points and dished out three assists. The senior duo combined to shoot 78.6 percent (11-14) from the field in helping the Hawkeyes shoot a season-high 61.5 percent (32-52) from the floor. Iowa also drained a season-high 11 triples, including four by junior Crystal Smith who finished with a game-high 22 points.

Both teams exchanged early baskets before the Hawkeyes took command. Iowa led 22-15 with 12:49 left before Iowa went on a 30-10 run to close the first half and start the second to grab a commfortable 27-point cushion (52-25). The Hawkeyes led by as many as 28 points twice in the second

In addition to Iowa's two seniors, a pair of freshmen also helped propel Iowa to victory. Krista VandeVenter notched her second career doubledouble, netting 12 points and hauling in a game-high 11 rebounds. Abby Emmert scored a career-high nine points on a perfect 3-3 shooting from beyond the arc. The nine points are four more than she had combined in the previous 13 conference games played. In addition, she had only attempted one 3-pointer all season prior to her 3-3 performance.

Illinois was led by Tiffanie Guthrie, who tallied 21 points and seven rebounds. Angelina Williams netted 17 points, but was only 7-24 shooting from the field and 3-10 from beyond the arc.
