#### **SERIES HISTORY**

- lowa leads Mississippi State, 2-1, in the all-time series. This is lowa's first time playing the Bulldogs in Starkville, Miss.
- The Bulldogs won the last meeting between the teams 2-1 in eight innings on May 20, 2004 in NCAA Regional action.
- lowa won the first two meetings, topping the Bulldogs 6-1 on April 3, 1982 and 4-2 on March 5, 1998.

#### A LOOK AT THE BULLDOGS

Southeastern Conference member Mississippi State enters the weekend series undefeated, 11-0. The roster is comprised of seven freshmen, three sophomores, four juniors and seven seniors. The team is led by third-year head coach Vann Stuedeman and assistants Tyler Bratton and Beth Mullins. Five Bulldogs are hitting at a clip above .300 -- Loryn Nichols (.409), Caroline Seitz (.375), Julia Echols (.364), Heidi Shape (.357) and Sam Lenahan (.323). The battery boasts four pitchers with ERAs below 1.00 -- Mackenzie Toler (0.00), Alexis Silkwood (0.38), Jacey Punches (0.38) and Alison Owen (0.68).

#### FRITSCH SHINES IN HOME STATE

Hawkeye infielder Claire Fritsch was named to the Getterman Classic all-tournament team after leading all hitters with a .538 batting average (7-of-13). Of her seven total hits, two were doubles -- the first of her lowa career. She also added an RBI, stolen base, sacrifice bunt and a run scored. The freshman grew up in Round Rock, Texas, just an hour and a half from Waco, and her parents were in the stands to see her excel on the field in an lowa uniform.

### **HEAD COACH MARLA LOOPER**



Marla Looper is entering her fourth season as the head coach for the University of Iowa softball program in 2014. Looper has posted an 84-74 overall and 33-34 Big Ten Conference record in her first three seasons in Iowa City.

Looper led the Hawkeyes to 30 wins in 2013 (30-24) in her third year, marking the most wins for the program since finishing 42-16 in 2009. lowa posted six wins over ranked opponents.

Three Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten honors -- Megan Blank was named to the first team, Johnnie Dowling earned second team honors, and Kayla Massey was named to the Big Ten All-Defensive team at pitcher. Blank earned her second-straight first team accolade, becoming the sixth Hawkeye in program history to earn first team honors in each of her first two seasons.

Blank was also named a 2013 NFCA First Team All-Midwest Region selection, earning her second all-region honor in as many seasons. Blank became the sixth Hawkeye in program history to garner all-region honors in each of her first two seasons.

In the classroom, a school-record 10 Hawkeyes were named to the 2013 spring Academic All-Big Ten team.

During her second season with the Hawkeyes, Looper led the team to a runner-up finish in the Big Ten -- the program's highest finish since winning the league title in 2003. lowa dropped two of its first three conference series before winning five straight to close out the season. It was the first time the team had won five straight series since the 2004 season.

lowa entered the final weekend with a conference title within reach, but it couldn't close the gap with Michigan despite taking 2-of-3 games at Minnesota. The Hawkeyes finished with a 27-26 overall and 16-8 conference record in 2012.

Five players garnered All-Big Ten recognition, including three first team selections. Senior Liz Watkins, sophomore Kayla Massey and freshman Megan Blank earned first team accolades, sophomore Michelle Zoeller was a second team honoree and junior Johnnie Dowling was a third team selection.

Blank also garnered NFCA second team all-region honors during her freshman campaign. She is the ninth Hawkeye to earn first team All-Big Ten and all-region honors during her freshman season.

The Hawkeyes finished second in the Big Ten in pitching (2.31 ERA) and third in fielding (.967). The squad turned 26 double plays during the course of the season to rank sixth nationally in double plays per game (.49).

Looper guided the Hawkeyes to a 27-24 overall and a 9-11 Big Ten record in her first season in lowa City. The first year head coach led the UI to a pair of six game winning streaks in her opening campaign and a tournament title at the Stetson Classic.

lowa opened Big Ten Conference play strong, jumping out to an 8-3 record. Among the victories was a 4-2 triumph at No. 1 Michigan. The win, which pushed the overall mark to 26-16, was lowa's first over a No. 1 ranked opponent since the 2005 season and the first over a ranked foe since 2008.

Looper's Hawkeyes were on the verge of completing a series sweep in Ann Arbor before the Wolverines rallied from a 2-0 deficit in the bottom of the seventh inning to claim the victory and halt lowa's momentum.

A pair of Hawkeyes earned All-Big Ten recognition at the conclusion of the season. Liz Watkins was tabbed as a second team selection, while Katie Keim earned third team accolades.

Looper took over the reigns of the lowa program after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Texas for 11 seasons (1999-2010). Looper helped lead the Longhorns to three College World Series appearances (2003, 2005 and 2006) and nine NCAA Tournament berths. She also helped guide Texas to back-to-back Big 12 regular season and tournament championships in 2002 and 2003 along with regular season championships in 2006 and 2010.

The redshirt sophomore has thrown out 6-of-9 runners attempting to steal a bag on her watch, giving her a 66.7 percent success rate. The second-highest caught stealing total is three, held by eight others.

#### **SUNDAY SLUGFEST**

The Hawkeyes posted a season-high 16 hits and nine runs in the Getterman Classic finale against instate foe Drake. Every Hawkeye starter in the hitting lineup recorded a hit, while six -- Erin Erickson, Michelle Zoeller, Alyssa Navarro, Kayla Massey, Sammi Gyerman and Claire Fritsch -- turned in a multiple-hit performance. Zoeller led the team with two RBIs, while Megan Blank, Whitney Repole, Massey, Michaela Johnson, Gyerman and Fritsch contributed one RBI apiece.

#### **SUNDAY FUNDAY**

UI softball has had stellar Sundays, offensively, so far in 2014. The Hawkeyes boast a .431 batting average, a .569 slugging percentage, and a .456 on-base percentage, and have scored 15 of their 28 total runs and recorded 28 of their 69 total hits in Sunday competition. Eight lowa starters are hitting over .300 on Sundays, including: Sammi Gyerman (.833), Claire Fritsch (.600), Erin Erickson (.571), Holly Hoffman (.500), Alyssa Navarro (.429), Megan Blank (.429), Kayla Massey (.375) and Michelle Zoeller (.375).

#### **EQUAL BATTERY**

Each Hawkeye starting pitcher has tallied a win in the 2014 season. Redshirt freshman Shayla Starkenburg notched her first career win in the season-opener against UNC Greensboro on Feb. 7. She gave up one hit in the 5-0 shutout and held the Spartans hitless until the sixth.

Sophomore Micaela Whitney picked up her first win on Feb. 8 against Presbyterian, 6-3. She struck out four in her 6.2 innings of work.

Senior Kayla Massey earned her first win against Drake, 9-0, on Feb. 16. She struck out three and held the Bulldogs to five hits in six innings.

College Sports Madness also recognized shortstop Megan Blank as a preseason first team All-Big Ten and preseason second team All-American in February.

#### A STELLAR DEBUT

Redshirt freshman Shayla Starkenburg made a successful Hawkeye debut at the Carolina Classic. The right-handed pitcher collected the first start, win, shutout, and onehitter of her Hawkeye career in Iowa's first game of 2014 against UNC Greensboro on Feb. 7. Her no-hit bid held until midway through the sixth, when UNCG recorded a single. She recorded five strikeouts in her seven innings pitched.

Starkenburg made her second appearance of the season in relief against Presbyterian. She entered the contest in a bases loaded situation with two outs and an lowa lead to protect. With the game on the line, Starkenburg ended the threat, forcing a ground out to end the game in lowa's favor 6-3 and record her first career save.

Starkenburg made her third and final appearance against Ohio in relief. She held the Bobcats hitless and scoreless. On the weekend, Starkenburg posted 1-0 record, 0.00 ERA, and five strikeouts. She gave up just one hit, holding her opponents to a .043 batting average.

#### TAKING ON THE BEST

The 2014 UI schedule is full of quality opponents. The Hawkeyes will face No. 11/12 Nebraska three times, No. 25 Texas three times, No. 16/18 Missouri three times, No. 20/21 Minnesota twice, and No. 15 Baylor and No. 14 Arizona once.

The Hawkeyes will also take on Mississippi State and Northwestern three times and Lipscomb, and UAB once -- all of whom are receiving votes in at least one of the polls (USA Today/NFCA Coaches Poll or the ESPN.com/ USA Softball Poll).

In 2013, the Hawkeyes topped six ranked foes, including: No. 11 Louisiana-Lafayette (13-10), No. 15 Stanford (7-6), No. 24 Oregon State (9-3), No. 11 Louisville (6-2), No. 21 Kentucky (3-1), and No. 19 Nebraska (6-2).

#### **MEET THE HAWKEYES**

This year's Hawkeye roster is comprised of seniors Brianna Luna, Kayla Massey and Michelle Zoeller; junior Megan Blank; sophomores Erin Erickson, Micaela Whitney, Whitney Repole, Sammi Gyerman, Haley Hansel, and Holly Hoffman, and freshmen Alyssa Navarro, Claire Fritsch, Kaitlyn Mullarkey, Kara Misel, Shayla Starkenburg, and Michaela Johnson.

lowa is led by fourth-year head coach Marla Looper, assistants Adrianna Baggetta and Stacy May-Johnson, and volunteer assistant Chelsey Carmody.

#### **TOP TIER**

Hawkeye junior Megan Blank appeared on the Top 50 Watch List for the 2014 USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year released on Jan. 29, 2014. The shortstop -making the list for the first time in her career -- is 1-of-7 student-athletes from the Big Ten and 1-of-20 juniors included in the Top 50. The list is narrowed to the top 25 on April 9, the top 10 on May 7, and the top 3 on May 21.

The 2014 Softball Collegiate Player of the Year will be announced prior to the start of the Women's College World Series on May 27.

The award, given by the National Governing Body for softball in the United States, is designed to recognize outstanding athletic achievement by female collegiate softball players across the country.

#### A NEW BATTING LEADER

Megan Blank hit .437 in 2013, setting lowa's single season batting average record. The previous record was .428, set by Kim Davis in 1993. Her career average is .413, also marking the highest in program history. Blank's 59 RBIs in 2013 mark the second-highest single-season total in program history. Debbie Bilbao posted a school record 61 RBIs in 1997. Blank also belted 11 home runs in 2013 -the third-highest single-season total.

#### BLANK INVITED TO 2013 USA NATIONAL TEAM SE-**LECTION CAMP**

Shortstop Megan Blank was invited to the 2013 USA Softball Women's National Team Selection Camp, held in Oklahoma City on June 10-12 at the ASA Hall of Fame Complex following her sophomore season. Blank was one of 32 athletes, and one of six sophomores, invited.

#### **BLANK HONORED BY NFCA**

Shortstop Megan Blank was named a 2013 National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) First Team All-Midwest Region selection, earning her second all-region honor in as many seasons. Blank is the sixth Hawkeye in program history to garner all-region honors in each of her first two seasons. She became the ninth player in program history to earn all-region recognition as a freshman, as she was named to the second team.

#### **HAWKEYES IN 2013**

The University of Iowa softball team finished 30-24 overall in 2013, posting the most wins since finishing 42-16 in 2009. The Hawkeves tied for ninth in the Big Ten with an 8-15 mark.

#### **HAWKEYES JUST MISS 2013 NCAA TOURNAMENT**

The Hawkeyes finished the regular season with an RPI of 33, and just missed the NCAA Tournament. Iowa was 39th in the final RPI -- the fifth-highest mark in the Big Ten.

#### A RECORD ACADEMIC YEAR

Ten student-athletes were named to the 2013 spring Academic All-Big Ten team. The softball program's 10 honorees are a school record. The team's previous best was seven in both 1994 and 1995. Ashley Akers, Johnnie Dowling, Nikki Gentile, Mallorree Grove, Steviee Grove, Tor Hawley, Chelsea Lyon, Sam Valentine, Bradi Wall and Michelle Zoeller were all named Academic All-Big Ten.

The Cy-Hawk Series is in its 10th season in 2013-14, being sponsored for the second time by Iowa Corn.

lowa has won the in-state competition five times, and lowa State has won four, in a series that began in 2004-05. lowa State captured the Cy-Hawk Series a year ago by a 17-11 margin.

lowa captured the inaugural Cy-Hawk Series (13-8) in 2004-05 and won again in 2006-07 (13-8), 2008-09 (21-4) and 2010-11 (15-11). lowa State won the competition in 2005-06 (13-8), 2007-08 (18-9), 2009-10 (16-11) and 2011-12 (17-11).

The 12-event series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, one point is awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA.

A commemorative Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

#### **B1G TOURNEY RETURNS IN 2013**

The Big Ten Tournament returned in 2013 for the first time since 2008. The Hawkeyes have claimed two Big Ten Tournament titles (2001, 2003) and won 21 games in the event all-time -- the second most of any team. The conference tournament was discontinued from 2009-12. lowa fell to Ohio State, 8-4, in the first round at Bowlin Stadium in Lincoln, Neb. The Hawkeyes held a 4-1 advantage moving to the bottom of the fifth before the Buckeyes plated six runs to rally for the victory.

#### HAWKEYE TRADITION

lowa has made four Women's College World Series appearances (1995, 1996, 1997, 2001) and played in 16 NCAA Tournaments in school history. The 16 appearances are the second most in Big Ten history, and the four WCWS appearances equal the second most in conference history. The Hawkeyes have won four Big Ten Conference regular season championships (1989, 1997, 2000, 2003) and two Big Ten Tournament titles (2001, 2003).

#### **MAY-JOHNSON SHINES FOR TEAM USA**

UI assistant coach Stacy May-Johnson was selected as the 2011 USA Softball Female Athlete of the Year. She earned the honor after helping Team USA to gold medals at the World Cup of Softball VII and the Pan American Games. May-Johnson batted a teambest .418 with team highs in home runs (six), runs (26) and RBI (36).

In 2012, May-Johnson helped the USA Softball Team to the gold medal at the 2012 World Cup of Softball presented by Lumber Liquidators. May-Johnson started 5-of-6 games for Team USA, posting a .357 (5-of-14) batting average with three runs, two RBIs and two walks. Her best game came in a 9-0 victory over Canada, where she went 2-for-2 with a run scored. The Americans posted a perfect 6-0 record during the competition, and they outscored their opponents, 41-3, in the five day event.

#### **CARMODY BACK AT IOWA**

Former Hawkeye Chelsey Carmody is back with the lowa softball program, serving as volunteer assistant coach. Carmody started 208 career games in the lowa infield. A career .335 hitter, she was a team co-captain and was the recipient of the Big Ten Sportsmanship Award as a senior. She batted .320 or higher during each of her four seasons in the Black and Gold, totaling 234 career hits, 11 home runs, 87 RBI and 42 stolen bases. Carmody played for UI head coach Marla Looper in 2011 as a senior.

#### **ON DECK**

lowa continues its season on the road at the University of Arizona Tournament, Feb. 28-March 2. The Hawkeyes take on Valparaiso on Friday, Arizona and UT Arlington on Saturday, and Longwood on Sunday.




