DIERCKX OFF TO STRONG DOUBLES START

Junior Jonas Dierckx has been lights out so far in doubles action this spring. Dierckx holds a 10-3 record in doubles, having played in both the No. 1 and No. 2 doubles slot. Dierckx went 2-1 over spring break during the Hawkeyes trip to California. Dierckx first took down Knowlman and Bucalem of San Francisco, 9-8. Dierkcx fell in his next doubles match against the University of Pacific in the No. 2 doubles slot, but rebounded in a big way against Fresno State, defeating DeLaubenfels and MacNeil in the No. 1 doubles slot, 8-5. Dierckx looks to continue his strong start in doubles this weekend against Big Ten foes Penn State and Ohio State.

HAWKEYES END SPRING TRIP ON HIGH NOTE

After falling in their first two matches over spring break, Iowa took down Fresno State, 5-2, in Fresno, Calif.
