THE SETTING:

Iowa hits the road to East Lansing, MI, to open Big Ten play against Michigan State in a three-game series. The Spartans lead the conference thus far in overall record (17-4) and are unbeaten on their home turf with a perfect 5-0 record. Iowa enters this weekend winners of five of its last six games.

ON THE NET:

Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be posting the stats.

The three-game Michigan State series will be broadcast on the radio and online.

SCOUTING MICHIGAN STATE:

The Spartans are 17-4 and are currently riding an 11-game win streak, including five straight at home.

Michigan State, as a team, is hitting .326 and leads the league in walks, hit by pitches and stolen bases. Offensively, the Spartans are led by Jeff Holm and Eli Boike. Holm leads the team in batting average (.405), doubles (6), walks (20), on base percentage (.520) and stolen bases (16), while Boike leads the team in hits (35), triples (3), homers (3), slugging percentage (.625).

Michigan State's pitching staff is led by starter AJ Achter. The Friday night starter has a 1.52 ERA and a perfect 3-0 record with six starts. The righty has a complete game under his belt and opponents are hitting .216 off him. Closer Kurtis Frymier is equally as tough. In nine relief appearances he has earned a 2-0 record with four saves. Opponents are hitting .185 off him.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

The Hawkeyes rank sixth or higher in these Big Ten offensive statistical categories: triples (6th), home runs (6th), hit by pitches (3rd), sacrifice bunts (1st) and stolen bases (4th).

The Iowa pitching staff ranks in the top five in: opposing batting average (4th), hits allowed (4th) and home runs allowed (3rd).

THREE-GAME SWEEP:

The Hawkeyes swept Western Illinois in three in their home opening series last weekend. With two come from behind ninth inning thrillers the Hawkeyes got their first sweep since 2007. (Iowa swept Indiana in a three-game home series.)

In the series, **Kurtis Muller** went a stellar 5-for-11 with five runs scored, three RBI and a perfect 6-for-6 on the base path.

'Z-ROB' IMPRESSES:

Left-handed hurler **Zach Robertson** had a career-best outing in the series-finale win against South Dakota State Wednesday night.

The starter went a career-long seven innings and struck out a career-high 10 Jackrabbits. He allowed only one earned run on four hits. Robertson got a no decision.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** is on a nine-game hit streak to lead the Hawkeyes, he also has amassed a team-best 11 multi-hit games, including four three-hit performances.

Junior **Kurt Lee** has a season-best six-game hitting streak. The nine hole hitter leads the team with four multi-RBI games.

'Q' GETS GOING:

After getting banged up a bit in Texas **Mike McQuillan** is starting to get back in the groove of things, offensively.

The sophomore led Iowa's offense in the two-game series against South Dakota State. He went 5-for-8 with three runs scored, a double and a whopping .750 slugging percentage.

MULLER IS BACK:

Junior leadoff hitter **Kurtis Muller** is back to his freshman all-American form. After a sophomore season of injuries Muller is leading the Iowa offense.

Muller leads the Hawkeye offense in batting average (.407), at bats (81), runs (20), hits (33), doubles (7), triples (2), total bases (44), slugging percentage (.543), walks (11), on base percentage (.489), stolen bases (15) and fielding percentage (1.000).

PITCHING PACHA:

After pitching one and one-third innings total in three contests in 2009 and allowing four earned runs in the process, junior **Jeff Pacha** has excelled in 2010.

Pacha has the second lowest ERA on the staff (2.61) with six appearances tallying for 10.1 innings pitched and allowing three earned runs on seven hits with seven Ks.

COMEBACK KIDS:

The Hawkeyes showed some life in the final innings throughout their five-game homestand. Iowa came back with fashion in three of the five contests, rallying to win.

Iowa came back in the ninth inning in both a 4-3 and a 10-9 victory over Western Illinois. The first win was due to a **Ryan Durant**, who was hitless in his first four at-bats, clutch game-winning RBI with the bases loaded.

The second was off the bat of **Mike Corbeil**. Corbeil came up with a game-winning pinch-hit two-RBI single with the bases loaded in the bottom of the ninth to top the Leathernecks. It was only Corbeil's second hit of the season.

The Hawkeyes also got a 6-5 'W' against South Dakota State in the bottom of the eighth Wednesday night.

Iowa tied and recaptured the lead in the bottom half of the eighth, thanks to throwing errors by the pitcher and shortstop and an infield single.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. **Kevin Lee** has four saves, which ties three others for first in the Big Ten.

2. **Phil Keppler** and **Kurt Lee** have heated up, offensively, for the Hawkeyes. Against South Dakota State the pair combined to go 6-for-16 with five RBI.

3. Reliever **Jeff Pacha** has had a great start to the season. The southpaw has been most effective against lefties, who are hitting .077 (1-for-13) against him.

KEPPLER SWINGS IT:

Phil Keppler has the second-highest batting average on the team (.350). The redshirt sophomore went 3-for-7 with a double and two RBI against SDSU in Iowa's mid-week series. He also slugged a whopping .571 and played solid defense at first base for the Hawkeyes.

LEE 'SAVES' ANOTHER:

Closer **Kevin Lee** picked up his conference-leading fourth save against South Dakota State Wednesday evening.

In the Hawkeye's five-game homestand, the righty appeared in three games, allowing no runs on two hits in two innings.

THE HAWKEYES STEAL:

In the past five games, Iowa has stolen 16 bases. (16-for-21). On the year, the Hawkeyes have 41, which ranks third in the Big Ten.

Leading the Hawkeyes is leadoff **Kurtis Muller** (15). Muller stole a perfect 6-for-6 against Western Illinois and **Kurt Lee** (7) went 4-for-4 in the three-game series.

So far, 13 different Hawkeyes have recorded a theft.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Iowa trails the all-time series with Michigan State, 69-56-1.

The last time the two teams faced off was in Iowa City, April 24-26. The Spartans swept the Hawkeyes in a three-game series. The series finale was a 14-5 Michigan State victory.

To lead the Black and Gold, offensively, **Sean Flanagan** went 3-for-4 with a two-run homer. This was the first three-hit game of his short college career. **Mike McQuillan** and **Ryan Durant** each went 3-for-5 with one RBI. **Dallas Burke** went 2-for-4. The Hawkeyes scattered 16 hits in the loss.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current Iowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

SDSU SERIES RECAP:

The Iowa baseball team split with South Dakota State in a two-game series at Duane Banks Field Tuesday and Wednesday.

Iowa scored three runs in the bottom of the eighth inning to rally and beat South Dakota State, 6-5, Wednesday.

Starter **Zach Robertson** had his best outing in a Hawkeye uniform, but got a no decision. Robertson went a career-long seven innings, striking out a career-high 10 batters, scattering only four hits, while only allowing one earned run. The 10 strikeouts is a season high for any Hawkeye pitcher, besting Jarred Hippen's nine against Western Illinois last Friday.

Three late runs propelled South Dakota

State to a 12-10 victory Tuesday night over the Iowa Hawkeyes. The loss snapped the Hawkeyes' four-straight winning streak. Both teams collected 16 hits in the contest. Iowa's 16 hits tied for the second-most of the season.

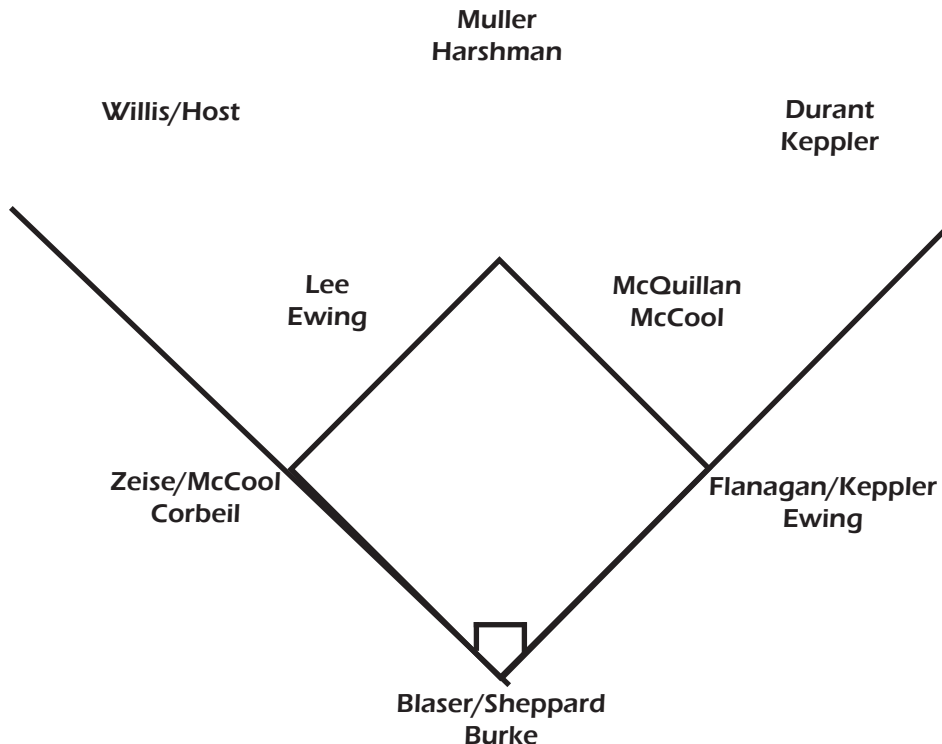

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

Kurtis Muller and several Hawkeyes making a splash in conference statistics. Muller ranks in the top ten in; batting average (5th), on base percentage (6th) and stolen bases (3rd). **Sean Flanagan** ranks second in hit by pitches and **Mike McQuillan** ranks fourth in sac bunts.

Jarred Hippen ranks in the top ten in the following statistical categories: ERA (8th), innings pitched (4th), batters struck out looking (2nd) and games started (2nd).

Phil Schreiber ranks sixth in opposing batting average and second in starts. **Kevin Lee** ranks first in saves and seventh in games finished. **Michael Jacobs** ranks third in games in relief in seven in games finished.

Kurt Lee ranks fifth in assists while **Phil Keppler** and **Kurtis Muller** are tied for first in fielding percentage (1.000).

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying two other Big Ten players.)

Senior **Michael Jacobs**, red shirt junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Kurtis Muller**, sophomore **Patrick Brennan** and freshman **Dan Sheppard**.

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "**Whistlin'**" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 875-823-3 (.516).

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
