THE SETTING

Iowa (13-12, 3-9) returns home Saturday, Feb. 14 for an afternoon contest with Purdue (18-6, 7-4). Game time is 3:05 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500). Purdue defeated Iowa 75-53 Jan. 18 at West Lafayette, IN.

Iowa dropped a 69-52 decision at Wisconsin Wednesday. Purdue stopped a two-game losing streak Wednesday with a 61-47 home win over Penn State.

ON THE AIR

Radio: Iowa games are broadcast on the Hawkeye Radio Network. The network includes more than 40 stations that blanket the state of Iowa and include portions of Illinois, Nebraska, Minnesota, Missouri and Wisconsin. Gary Dolphin handles the play-by-play, along with color commentator Bob Hansen.

Television: The Big Ten Network will carry the game to a national cable audience. In its second year of operation, the Big Ten Network reaches over 70 million homes. The game can also be viewed on DIRECTV (channel 220) and the DISH Network (channel 439). Wayne Larrivee, Greg Kelser and Charissa Thompson will call the action.

IN THE RANKINGS

Purdue is ranked 20th in the Associated Press rankings and 23rd in the ESPN/USA Today Coaches' poll.

IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 2,465 games since beginning basketball in 1902. Overall Iowa's record is 1,464-1,001 (.594). That includes a 923-318 (.744) record in home games, a 541-683 (.442) record in games away from Iowa City, a 693-686 (.503) mark in Big Ten games and a 329-92 (.781) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Coach Todd Lickliter

Todd Lickliter is in his second season as the head basketball coach at the University of Iowa and his eighth year overall as a college head coach. Lickliter spent six seasons (2001-07) as the head coach at Butler University.

Lickliter holds a career mark of 157-92 (.631). He is 26-31 (.456) at Iowa, including 9-21 (.300) in Big Ten games. Lickliter posted a 131-61 (.682) record as Butler's head coach. He led Butler to four post-season



tournament berths, including trips to the NCAA Sweet 16 in 2003 and 2007.

Lickliter was named the 2006-07 Division I Coach of the Year by the National Association of Basketball Coaches (NABC) and was recognized as the High-Major Coach of the Year by collegehoops.net. He was also named 2007 Horizon League Coach of the Year for the second consecutive year after guiding the Bulldogs to a school and league-record 29 victories.

He led Butler to the regular season co-championship in the Horizon League in 2007. The Bulldogs advanced to the Sweet 16 in the NCAA Tournament before falling to eventual national champion Florida (65-57).

Butler won three games over top 25 opponents (Tennessee, Gonzaga, Maryland) in 2006-07 and recorded eight victories over teams that participated in the NCAA Tournament.

Butler averaged 22 wins per year under Lickliter, winning league titles in 2002, 2003 and 2007 while winning at least 20 games in four of six seasons.

Lickliter led the Bulldogs to an unbeaten home record (12-0) in 2002-03, and mentored Butler to a 70-12 (.854) home mark in his six seasons. His Bulldog teams were 6-5 against teams ranked in the "Top 25" and compiled four of the top 10 winning streaks in Butler history.

In his first season as Butler's head coach, Lickliter guided the Bulldogs to a then school-record 26 victories and a third consecutive Horizon League regular season title.

Lickliter guided the 2003 Bulldogs to an even more impressive season in his second year as head coach. He led Butler to a 27-6 record, breaking the single-season mark for victories for a second consecutive year.

Lickliter served as an assistant coach at Butler and Eastern Michigan and was a high school head coach in Indianapolis and Danville, IL.

In his final two seasons as a Butler assistant coach, the Bull-dogs compiled a 47-16 record, including "Top 25" wins over 10th-ranked Wisconsin and 23rd-ranked Wake Forest. The win over the Demon Deacons in the 2001 NCAA Tournament was Butler's first NCAA Tournament victory in 39 years.

Lickliter played his final two collegiate seasons at Butler, where he earned a B.S degree in secondary education in 1979.

Lickliter is 2-3 vs. Purdue and 1-3 vs. Boilermaker Coach Matt Painter.

<u>IOWA IN CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA</u>

Iowa has compiled a 329-92 (.781) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena since the facility opened in January, 1983. Iowa is 154-75 (.672) in Big Ten games and 175-17 (.911) in non-Big Ten games.

HAWKEYES ARE TOUGH AT HOME

Iowa has won 53 of its last 65 games (.815) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500) over the last three-plus seasons, including win streaks of 21 straight overall and 12 straight Big Ten Conference wins. Iowa has won 10 of its last 15 home games against ranked opponents and is 11-2 at home this season.

Iowa was a perfect 17-0 at home in 2006 and 14-2 in 2007 before posting a 10-8 home record a year ago. Iowa has compiled a 21-8 Big Ten Conference record in that time.

TICKET DISCOUNT FOR HOME GAMES

The University of Iowa is selling reserved seat tickets for \$10 to all remaining home games.

The price reflects a \$17 savings on tickets for the three weekend games and a \$12 savings on tickets for Iowa's game against Ohio State, which is scheduled for Tuesday, Mar. 3.

IOWA TO HOST OHIO STATE MARCH 3

Iowa's home game against Ohio State will be played Tuesday, March 3. The game will have an 8 p.m. start time and will be televised to a national cable audience on the Big Ten Network.

PETERSON INJURED AT WISCONSIN

Sophomore guard Jeff Peterson is not expected to play Saturday against Purdue due to injury.

Peterson suffered an injury with nine minutes left in Wednesday's contest at Wisconsin and did not return.

Peterson is one of two Hawkeye players to start all 25 games. He leads the team in assists (4.2), steals (1.2) and minutes played (33.0) and is second in scoring (10.6).

Junior Jermain Davis will likely start in Peterson's place.

TATE HAMPERED BY INJURY

Senior forward Cyrus Tate has been hampered since an ankle injury occurred Jan. 8 against Minnesota. Tate missed seven games before returning to action in the 56-51 win over Northwestern on Feb. 7, but he sat out the Feb. 11 contest at Wisconsin. Tate started against the Wildcats, contributing two points and five rebounds in 13 minutes.

Tate leads Iowa in rebounding (6.2) and is averaging 7.1 points per game. He is shooting 67.2% from the field and 75.6% from the foul line.

TUCKER TO MISS SECOND SEMESTER

Freshman guard Anthony Tucker will miss the second semester due to being ruled ineligible in accordance with Big Ten Conference academic requirements.

Tucker (6-4, 200) joined the Iowa program after a prep career at Minnetonka, MN HS. He started eight of the 14 games he played. Tucker averaged 10.4 points and three rebounds per game, shooting 43.8% from the field, including 42.7% from three-point range.

Tucker scored a career-high 24 points in a loss to West Virginia and recorded his only double-double with 14 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Southeast Missouri State. He scored in double figures in eight games.

IOWA IN NCAA STATS

Iowa ranks 15th nationally in scoring defense (59.3). The Hawkeyes are 15th in free throw percentage (.743), 20th in three-point field goals per game (8.3) and 32nd in three-point field goal percentage (.382).

NOT AT FULL STRENGTH

- Iowa has played a number of games over the past two seasons without being at full strength. Following are the reasons several key players have missed significant action in the last two years.
- Guard Tony Freeman suffered a stress fracture in his foot during an exhibition game prior to the start of the 2007-08 season. Freeman missed the first nine games of the season and 10 games overall. When playing, Freeman led Iowa in scoring (13.8) and assists (3.2).
- Forward Jarryd Cole suffered a major knee injury in 13th and final non-conference game of the 2007-08 season. Cole underwent surgery and missed the entire Big Ten season and the Big Ten Tournament. Cole had started six of 13 games prior to his injury, averaging 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds.
- Guard Jake Kelly suffered a broken middle finger on his left hand in pre-season practice this year. Kelly missed Iowa's exhibition game, but then elected to not have surgery and has played in every game.

- Guard Jeff Peterson discovered a broken navicular bone in his left wrist following Iowa's opening Big Ten game at Ohio State. Peterson has not missed any games and will have surgery after the season. Peterson missed the last 9:31 of Wednesday's loss at Wisconsin after suffering an injury and is not expected to play Saturday against Purdue.
- Forward Cyrus Tate suffered a sprained right ankle against Minnesota (Jan. 8) and played just eight minutes in a three point loss. Tate missed seven games before returning to action in a home win over Northwestern, but he was unable to play in the most recent loss at Wisconsin. Tate was averaging 7.4 points and a team-best 6.3 rebounds at the time of his injury.
- Freshman guard Anthony Tucker was Iowa's leading scorer in non-conference action at just over 11 points per game. Tucker contracted mononucleosis in late November and his production began to trail off after a season-best 24 points in a loss to West Virginia. Tucker has been ruled academically ineligible for the second semester and will sit out the remainder of the season.

IOWA TWO-POINT FIELD GOALS

In a 56-51 win over Northwestern, Iowa attempted just 10 two-point field goals, and made just two of those attempts. Iowa made 12-30 three-point attempts and 16-18 free throws in the win. The two made field goals are the fewest two-point field goals for Iowa since the Hawkeyes had just six in a 43-36 home win over Michigan State last season. The 10 two-point attempts are the fewest since Iowa had 13 two-point attempts in a home win over Penn State a year ago.

The two made and 10 attempted two-point field goals against Northwestern are the fewest ever for Iowa, in both categories, since the inception of the three-point field goal.

HAWKEYES WORK OVERTIME

Iowa defeated Wisconsin Jan. 21 at home in its only overtime game of the season. The victory gives Iowa a 47-51 record in all overtime games, including a 38-38 record in single overtime games. Iowa had not played an overtime game since a loss in single overtime to Louisiana-Monroe on Nov. 30, 2007. Iowa is 1-1 in overtime under Coach Todd Lickliter, collecting its first overtime win since a 76-72 triple overtime win over Minnesota on Jan. 18, 2006.

CLOSE GAMES ARE THE NORM

Twelve of Iowa's 25 games have been decided by 10 points or less, with Iowa posting a 6-6 record in those games:

- Iowa held off Texas-San Antonio (73-67) in the second game of the season by making 14-15 free throws in the second half, including its final 14 attempts.
- Iowa led for 39 minutes in taking a 66-57 win over Oakland, but the Hawkeyes led by just two points with 2:54 remaining before pulling away in the final two minutes
- Iowa collected a 65-63 win over Kansas State in the consolation game of the Las Vegas Invitational. Cyrus Tate scored from the lane as time expired for the winning basket. Kansas State had tied the score with an offense rebound with 14 seconds remaining.
- Iowa trailed at Boston College by 11 points with 4:45 to play before a 10-1 scoring run closed the final margin to 57-55 in the ACC/Big Ten Challenge. Iowa had a chance to force overtime, but missed the front end of a one-and-one free throw opportunity with no time left on the clock.

- Iowa dropped a 68-65 decision at Ohio State in the first Big Ten Conference game of the season. Iowa made a season-high 14 three-point baskets, but missed two three-point shots in the final seconds that could have forced overtime.
- Iowa defeated Indiana 65-60 in Iowa City, surviving a late Indiana rally that saw the Hoosiers trim the Iowa advantage to two points with 22 seconds remaining. Iowa added three free throws to clinch the win.
- Iowa led Minnesota by as many as 13 points in the first half before the Gophers rallied for a 52-49 win in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes lost the services of senior forward Cyrus Tate eight minutes into the game due to an ankle injury. Iowa cut the deficit to one point with seven seconds to play, then missed a long, desperation three-point attempt after two Minnesota free throws.
- Iowa rallied from a seven point deficit, in the second half, to defeat Wisconsin 73-69 in overtime in Iowa City. The Badgers forced the overtime on a deep three-point basket in the final second before Iowa won in its first overtime of the season.
- Iowa led by 14 points in the second half at Penn State before the Nittany Lions rallied for a 63-59 win. The Hawkeyes missed three attempts to tie the score in the final two minutes before a Penn State free throw with four seconds left secured the win.
- Iowa led by three points at halftime in a 62-54 loss at Illinois, but the Illini shot 65% from the field in the second half to earn the win in Champaign.
- Iowa cut a 20-point second half deficit to just three with 44 seconds remaining at Indiana, but two turnovers in the final minute proved costly as the Hoosiers won 68-60.
- Iowa outscored Northwestern 11-5 in the final 1:05 to earn a 56-51 win in Iowa City. Devan Bawinkel gave Iowa a 48-46 advantage with 1:05 to play and Jeff Peterson came up with a steal on Northwestern's next possession. Iowa made all 10 of its free throw attempts in the final minutes to earn the victory.

WELCOME TO CONFERENCE ACTION

Iowa played seven of its first nine conference games against teams that were ranked at the start of conference play. Iowa opened conference play with a 68-65 loss at No. 23 Ohio State. Following a 65-60 win over Indiana, Iowa dropped a 52-49 decision to No. 19/22 Minnesota at home and a 64-49 decision at Michigan. Iowa lost 75-53 at No. 19/19 Purdue and defeated Wisconsin 73-69 in overtime. Iowa lost 71-56 to No. 9/9 Michigan State and 62-54 at No. 19/20 Illinois.

A year ago Iowa began Big Ten play with games against Indiana (11th), Wisconsin (24th), Ohio State (receiving votes) and Michigan State (6th).

HAWKEYES FACE STRONG SCHEDULE

The 12 teams that have defeated Iowa this season are having good results against other teams as well. As of Thursday, the teams with wins over Iowa have a combined record of 180-87 (.674). Nine of the 12 have been in the national rankings. Six of Iowa's defeats have been by eight points or less, including a two-point decision at Boston College, three-point losses at Ohio State and to Minnesota and a four-point loss at Penn State.

HAWKEYES FEATURE YOUNG SOUAD

Following is statistical information on the youngest teams in Division I basketball, with figures provided by Stats, Inc.

- Based on a point system that gives one point for freshmen and four points for seniors, Iowa ranks as the 21st youngest team in Division I basketball.
- Matt Gatens is one of 21 freshmen in Division I basketball who has started every game this season.
- Iowa is one of 28 Division I teams that has a true freshman as its leading scorer, as Matt Gatens leads with an 11.2 scoring average.
- Iowa ranks 43rd among Division I schools with freshmen playing 33.3% of all minutes.

PURDUE COACH MATT PAINTER

Matt Painter, a former Boilermaker player under Gene Keady, is in his fourth season as the head coach at Purdue after serving as associate head coach for one season. Painter holds a record of 74-46 at Purdue. He is in his fifth season as a head coach with a 99-51 record. He led Purdue to a 9-18 mark in his first season after posting a 25-5 record in one season at Southern Illinois.

Painter was the Missouri Valley Conference Coach of the Year in 2004, leading the Salukis to a 17-1 league record and a No. 15 national ranking. He previously served as an assistant coach at Eastern Illinois (1995-98) and Southern Illinois (1998-2003).

Painter was a four-year (1990-93) letterman at Purdue and served as a team captain as a senior. He earned all-Big Ten honorable mention recognition and helped Purdue earn four straight post-season invitations, including three NCAA Tournament invitations.

Painter is 4-2 vs. Iowa and 3-1 vs. Hawkeye Coach Todd Lickliter.

LICKLITER VS. THE BOILERMAKERS

Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter collected two wins over Purdue during his tenure as Butler head coach. Butler defeated Purdue 74-68 early in the 2001-02 season in West Lafayette in Lickliter's fifth game as a college head coach.

Butler scored a 68-65 win over Purdue in the John Wooden Tradition at Conseco Fieldhouse at Indianapolis in 2006-07. Purdue defeated Iowa twice in 2008.

THE SERIES

Purdue holds a 79-70 advantage in the series that began with a 17-11 Boilermaker win in 1909. Purdue has won four straight games over Iowa, including a 75-53 win Jan. 18 at West Lafayette. The Boilermakers won both meetings last season, 67-62 at Iowa City and 51-50 at West Lafayette. The teams split two games in 2007. Iowa won 78-59 at Iowa City during the regular season. Purdue later scored a 74-55 win in the quarter-finals of the Big Ten Tournament. Iowa has won six of the last 11 meetings. Iowa scored a 77-68 win at Purdue in the only meeting in 2006. Iowa won two of three meetings in 2005 and both meetings in 2004, while Purdue won the only meeting in 2003.

Iowa and Purdue have met four times at a neutral site, with three of the four meetings taking place in the Big Ten Tournament and two of the four taking place in Indianapolis. Iowa defeated the Boilermakers 71-52 in the 2005 Big Ten Tournament in Chicago and 87-72 in the 2002 Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis. Purdue defeated Iowa in the 2007 event in Chicago.

In addition, the Hawkeyes and Boilermakers both advanced to the 1980 Final Four at Market Square Arena in Indianapolis, and both lost in the semi-finals. A consolation game was played at that time and Purdue defeated Iowa 75-58.

Iowa holds a 47-24 advantage in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes have won seven of the last 10 meetings in Iowa City and hold a 13-9 advantage in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Boilermakers hold a 53-21 advantage in games played in West Lafayette. Iowa has won three of the last seven meetings in Mackey Arena.

IOWA, PURDUE NOTES

- The Iowa roster includes two players from Indiana, senior J.R. Angle (Franklin) and sophomore Jake Kelly (Carmel).
- Iowa freshman John Lickliter also attended high school in Indianapolis before joining his father in Iowa City and graduating from Iowa City HS. Prior to his senior season Lickliter was a prep teammate of Purdue's JaJuan Johnson
- Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter is an Indianapolis native who played at Butler and later was the Bulldog head coach for six seasons before taking over at Iowa.
- Iowa assistant coaches LaVall Jordan and Joel Cornette also are Butler graduates and former Bulldog players. Jordan played at Butler when the Bulldogs dropped a 63-54 contest to Purdue at Market Square Arena in Indianapolis in 1998-99. Cornette played for the Bulldogs when they scored a 74-68 win at Purdue in 2001-02.



- Purdue posted a 4-3 record vs. Iowa during the playing career of Boilermaker Coach Matt Painter (1990-93).
- Purdue assistant Paul Lusk began his college career at Iowa. Lusk, who had followed his uncle's footsteps to Iowa, suffered a broken leg early in his Iowa career and completed his career at Southern Illinois. Lusk scored over 1,000 points in his three seasons at Southern Illinois. Lusk was also the head coach at the University of Dubuque for one season (2002-03).
- Purdue Assistant Coach Rick Ray attended Grand View College in Des Moines.
- Iowa and Purdue played one common opponent during the non-conference season. Iowa lost at Boston College (55-57) and Purdue defeated Boston College (71-64) at a neutral site.

PURDUE WON FIRST MEETING

Purdue hit four consecutive three-point baskets in a span of less than two minutes, breaking open a close game on the way to a 75-53 win at West Lafayette. Iowa played its second straight game without senior forward Cyrus Tate, who suffered an ankle injury in the Jan. 8 loss to Minnesota.

The Hawkeyes trailed by seven, 35-28, at the 16:04 mark of the second half after David Palmer converted a pair of free throws. The Boilermakers took over from there, as four different players connected on a three-point basket as the Purdue lead expanded to 49-28 before Iowa scored again at the 13:34 mark.

Purdue shot 53.6% from the field in the second half, connecting on 7-9 (77.8%) three-point attempts and 9-10 free throws. The Boilermakers shot 49% overall, including 10-15 (66.7%) three-pointers and 15-18 (83.3%) from the free throw line.

Iowa fell behind by six in the early going before scoring six straight to tie the game after six minutes. Iowa rallied again late in the first half, cutting a nine-point deficit to just four, 26-22, in the final minute. Purdue closed the half with a three-pointer at the buzzer for a 29-22 advantage at the break.

Purdue's aggressive defense forced Iowa into 19 turnovers, which the Boilermakers turned into 17 points. Iowa shot just 25% (8-25) from the field in the opening half before improving to 36% for the game. Iowa made 9-20 (45%) three-point shots and hit just 57.1% (8-14) from the foul line.

Iowa was led by Palmer, who scored 19 points and added eight rebounds, both career highs for the junior forward. Palmer hit 7-14 field goals and 3-4 free throws while starting for the first time in his career. Freshman Matt Gatens added 11 points and five rebounds and Jeff Peterson contributed eight assists and two steals.

E'Twaun Moore led Purdue with 13 points, Keaton Grant scored 12 and Nemanja Calasan had 10. Robbie Hummel contributed nine points and eight rebounds.

IOWA PROGRAM REACHES 1,400 WINS

The Iowa basketball program reached 1,400 wins (now at 1,464) with a 79-46 victory over Texas-San Antonio on Nov. 26, 2005. Iowa ranks 36th on the all-time list for victories and is one of 40 NCAA Division I programs with as many as 1,450 wins. Iowa's basketball history includes 73 winning

seasons and 24 years in which the Hawkeyes have won 20 or more games. Iowa (with 22) is one of 31 programs to earn more than 20 invitations into the NCAA Tournament.

IOWA FALLS AT WISCONSIN

Wisconsin scored seven points in the last 23 seconds of the first half to take a 36-24 halftime advantage and the Badgers went on to a 69-52 win over Iowa in Madison.

Iowa trailed by just five, 24-29, in the final minute of the half when the Badgers got a steal and a lay-up. Wisconsin added two free throws following a technical foul and closed the half with a three-point shot just before the buzzer. The last 23 seconds erased an Iowa rally that saw the Hawkeyes cut a 27-17 deficit to three points, 27-24, with two minutes remaining in the half. Iowa was guilty of 10 turnovers in the first half, which Wisconsin turned into 22 points.

Wisconsin used an 8-3 scoring advantage in the opening four minutes of the second half to increase its advantage to 44-27. Iowa cut the deficit to 12 points with eight minutes to play, but could get no closer.

Wisconsin shot 53.1% from the field in reversing an overtime loss to the Hawkeyes in Iowa City. The Badgers added 7-12 (58.3%) three-point shots and held a 27-21 rebounding advantage. Iowa ended the contest with 14 turnovers, as Wisconsin held a 29-8 margin in points off turnovers and an 18-6 advantage in second chance points. The Hawkeyes shot 50% from the field.

Jake Kelly led Iowa with 17 points, hitting 7-9 field goal attempts. Jeff Peterson added 10 points before leaving the game midway through the second half with an injury. Jarryd Cole led Iowa with eight rebounds.

PURDUE STOPS PENN STATE

Purdue stopped a two-game losing streak Wednesday night with a 61-47 win over Penn State at West Lafayette. The Boilermakers held a two point lead, 28-26, at intermission before holding Penn State to 32% shooting in the second half. Purdue shot 50% from the field in the final 20 minutes in leading by as many as 18 midway through the half.

Purdue's reserves combined to score 25 points. The Boiler-makers forced 12 turnovers to overcome a 33-28 Penn State rebounding advantage. Purdue also held PSU's Talor Battle, the Big Ten's leading scorer, to no points.

JaJuan Johnson led Purdue with 14 points, 13 rebounds and four blocked shots. Reserves Bobby Riddell and Nemanja Calasan added 13 and 12 points, respectively, and E'Twaun Moore scored 10. Riddell and Calasan combined to make 9-13 field goal attempts, including 4-6 treys.

LICKLITER VS. RANKED TEAMS

Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter holds a 7-15 record when coaching against nationally ranked opponents, including a 1-10 mark at Iowa and a 6-5 record in six seasons at Butler.

Iowa, this season, dropped a 68-65 contest at No. 23 Ohio State Dec. 31, lost a 52-49 decision to No. 19/22 Minnesota Jan. 8 in Iowa City and was defeated 75-53 Jan. 18 at No. 19/19 Purdue. In its last two outings, Iowa lost 71-56 to No. 9/9 Michigan State at home and lost 62-54 at No. 19/20 Illinois Sunday.

In 2007-08, Iowa defeated sixth-ranked Michigan State (43-36), while dropping decisions to 11th-ranked Indiana (76-79), 24th-ranked Wisconsin (51-64), seventh-ranked Indiana (43-65), eighth-ranked Wisconsin (54-60) and 17th-ranked Michigan State (52-66).

Lickliter's Butler teams defeated ranked opponents Louisville (14th), Maryland (18th), Mississippi State (20th), Ball State (21st), Tennessee (22nd) and Gonzaga (23rd). His teams are 0-3 vs. top five opponents, including losses to third-ranked Oklahoma in 2003, third-ranked Florida in 2007 and fifthranked Duke in 2003.

GATENS AMONG TOP BIG TEN FRESHMEN

Iowa freshman Matt Gatens ranks among Big Ten freshman leaders in several categories. Gatens is first in three-point percentage (.465), free throw percentage (.923), three-point field goals per game (1.8) and minutes played (32.5), second in scoring (11.2) and third in field goal percentage (.463).

HAWKEYES FROM THE LINE

- Iowa is shooting 74.3% from the free throw line to rank second in the Big Ten and 15th in the nation.
- Iowa made all eight free throw attempts in a win over Northern Iowa. The perfect performance against Northern Iowa is the best for an Iowa team since Nov. 19, 2004 when the Hawkeyes established a school record by hitting all 20 of their free throw attempts in a win over Western Illinois.
- Iowa connected on 20-22 attempts (90.9%) in a win over Texas-San Antonio, including its last 14 attempts over the final 13 minutes.
- Iowa made 16-18 (88.9%) free throw attempts in a 56-51 win over Northwestern. The Hawkeyes hit 13-14 in the second half, including all 10 attempts in the final 3:08.
- Jermain Davis led Iowa vs. UTSA, making all 10 of his attempts. He is the 24th Iowa player ever to shoot 100% from the free throw line in a game, with a minimum of 10 attempts. Davis is the seventh player (sixth Hawkeye) to make as many as 10 free throws in a game without a miss, in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.
- Iowa single-game free throw bests also include 88.9% (8-9) in a loss at Boston College, 90.9% (10-11) in a loss to Minnesota, 90% (9-10) in a loss at Michigan and 93.8% (15-16) in a loss at Penn State and 88.9% (16-18) in a win over Northwestern.
- Iowa had a season low in made free throws (three) and free throw attempts (four) in a loss at Illinois.
- Iowa's accuracy from the free throw line is led by freshman Matt Gatens, who is shooting 92.3% (60-65) to lead all players in the Big Ten. His percentage would rank third nationally, but he is just under the minimum of 2.5 made per game. Gatens made 26 straight free throws over a 16-game span, from a win over Texas-San Antonio on Nov. 17 to missing his first attempt against Wisconsin on Jan. 21.
- Jake Kelly made 9-10 free throws in a loss to West Virginia, Jeff Peterson made 11-12 free throws in a win over Kansas State and Cyrus Tate made 10-11 in a home win over Indiana.



Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series

Iowa has clinched the fifth annual Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series, holding a 16-4 advantage through 10 events. Iowa defeated Iowa State 17-5 in football to win the only three-point event. The Cyclones beat the Hawkeyes 3-0 in volleyball (Sept. 12) to earn two points. Iowa also downed the Cyclones in women's soccer, 3-2, in Ames. In cross country, the Iowa women placed ahead of Iowa State in the NCAA Regional to gain two points, while the ISU men topped Iowa in the men's event. Iowa defeated the Cyclones in wrestling (20-15), women's basketball (66-46), men's basketball (73-57), women's swimming and diving (196-104) and women's gymnastics (194.375-193.825).

There are two events remaining, with the next competition slated for Feb. 16 when the teams meet again in women's gymnastics

Iowa now holds a 3-2 advantage in the in-state competition that began in 2005, winning in 2005 and 2007, along with this year.

The 12-event series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, two points are awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA.

A commemorative Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

Academic Opportunities

Two points for an institution if the student-athlete graduation rate for all student-athletes is greater than the national average for all student-athletes, according to the annual graduation rate report issued each September/October by the NCAA.

<u>IOWA FROM THREE-POINT RANGE</u>

- Iowa is averaging 8.3 three-point field goals per game and 21.8 attempts per game. Iowa is shooting 38.2% from three-point range overall and 35.9% in Big Ten play. The Hawkeyes are third in the Big Ten in three-point field goals per game.
- Overall, 48.1% (545-1,132) of Iowa's field goal attempts have been of the three-point variety. Iowa attempted a season-high 30 three-pointers against Southeast Missouri State (13 made) and Northwestern (12 made).
- Iowa made a season-high 14 three-point baskets in a 68-65 loss at Ohio State to open Big Ten play. The 14 three-point baskets tie as the second highest total in school history. Iowa has made 15 in two games, the most recent against Northwestern on Jan. 3, 1998. Iowa shot an even 50% (14-28) against the Buckeyes. The Hawkeyes made 14 three-point baskets in five games prior to this season.
- Iowa has made 13 three-point field goals in two games (at The Citadel and vs. SE MO State). The 13 three-point field goals ties as the 10th most by an Iowa team in a single game.
- Iowa had a season-low four three-point baskets in a 63-59 loss at Penn State, shooting just 23.5% (4-17).

IOWA SHOOTING ON TARGET

- Iowa is shooting 45.1% from the field through 25 games and 42.8% in 12 Big Ten Conference games.
- Overall, the Hawkeyes have made at least 50% of their field goal attempts in seven games. Iowa has single-game bests of 57.1% from the field in a win over Texas-San Antonio and 52% (13-25) from three-point range in a win at The Citadel. Iowa shot 52.3% from the field at Ohio State, its best performance in Big Ten action, and 50% in a loss at Wisconsin.
- A year ago Iowa shot as well as 50% from the field in just four of 32 games, with a best of 57.5% at Penn State.

IOWA GETS DEFENSIVE

- Iowa's defensive play has been a constant throughout the season, as the Hawkeyes rank 15th nationally in scoring defense, allowing 59.3 points per game.
- Iowa opponents are shooting 43.1% from the field, including 35.6% from three-point range. Iowa's non-conference opponents shot 32.8% from three-point range, while Big Ten opponents are shooting 38.3%.
- Iowa held Bryant University to just 36 points in a 61-36 win and allowed Northern Iowa just 24 points in the second half of a 65-46 win. The 36 points by Bryant match the fewest allowed by Iowa under Coach Todd Lickliter. Iowa held Michigan State to just 36 points in a 43-36 win over the Spartans last season in Iowa City. Bryant shot just 29.7% from the field, including 33.3% from three-point range. The 14 points scored by Bryant in the first half mark the fewest Iowa has allowed under Lickliter as well.
- The Hawkeyes have held six opponents to less than 50 points. Iowa held No. 19/22 Minnesota to 52 points and 33.9% shooting from the field in a 52-49 loss. Iowa's nonconference opponents averaged 54.6 points and league foes are averaging 64.3 points.



Iowa Signs Two In-State Recruits

Guard Eric May of Wahlert HS in Dubuque and forward/center Brennan Cougill of Heelan HS in Sioux City have signed national letters in intent to join the Hawkeye basketball program next season.

May (6-5, 220) has excelled in both basketball and football during his prep career. He led Wahlert to the Class 3-A state basketball title as a junior, hitting a 35-foot shot at the buzzer to lift his team to a 70-67 win. In three games at the state tournament he averaged 18.7 points and 4.3 rebounds, shooting 50% from three-point range and 87.5% from the free throw line. He was named captain of the Class 3-A all-tournament team.

May averaged 18.5 points, 6.5 rebounds, three assists and 2.5 steals as a junior for Coach Tom English as Wahlert posted a 24-3 overall record. His last second basket led Wahlert to a win at Iowa City High, the only loss of the season for the Class 4-A state champion Little Hawks.

May earned first team all-state and all-conference honors as a junior. This past football season he earned first team allconference recognition as one of the top prep quarterbacks in the state.

May also started for the Wahlert basketball team as a sophomore, averaging 14 points and 7.2 rebounds in helping the Golden Eagles post a 16-7 overall record.

Cougill (6-9, 260) became the first in-state player to commit to Lickliter's program when he gave the Hawkeyes his verbal commitment in September, 2007. He averaged 19.5 points, 11 rebounds and two blocked shots per game as a junior. He earned first team all-state honors a year ago after earning third team recognition as a sophomore. Cougill was invited last summer to the invitation-only NBA Top 100 camp in Virginia.

As a junior, Cougill led Heelan to a 20-4 overall record, including a return trip to the Class 3-A state tournament. Heelan was defeated in the quarter-finals by eventual champion Dubuque Wahlert. Cougill collected 10 points and 10 rebounds in the quarter-final loss.

As a sophomore he averaged 15.5 points and nine rebounds a game as Heelan placed second in the state tournament. His tip-in basket in the semi-finals allowed Heelan to advance to the title game.

• Iowa ranked fifth in the nation in scoring defense last season (58.0) and held opponents under 50 points in nine games. Iowa opponents shot 40.4% from the field.

SOLID IN THE SECOND HALF

- Iowa's defense was solid in the second half in several games earlier in the season, but not as effective in the second half recently.
- At Boston College, Iowa allowed just seven field goals in the second half of a two-point loss. Iowa held Bryant University to just six field goals and 22 points in the second half in expanding a 26-14 halftime advantage to a 61-36 win.

- Iowa led Northern Iowa 23-22 at halftime of a 65-46 win, limiting the Panthers to 10 field goals in the final 20 minutes. In a win over Iowa State, the Hawkeyes expanded a 34-32 halftime margin to a 73-57 win. Iowa led by as many as 26 points while holding the Cyclones to 10 field goals and 25 points in the second half. In a loss at Drake, Iowa held the Bulldogs to six field goals and 25 points in the second half. Iowa allowed Western Illinois just 20 points in the second half, as the Leathernecks made just seven field goals (25%) and 1-5 (20%) three-point attempts.
- In conference play, Purdue scored 46 second half points, the most scored against Iowa in the second half in 57 games under Coach Todd Lickliter. Purdue shot 53.6% overall in the half, including 77.8% from three-point range, and added 90% from the free throw line.
- In Iowa's overtime win over Wisconsin, the Badgers shot 51.9% (14-27) in the second half, but just 33.3% (3-9) in the overtime period. Penn State's rally in Iowa's 63-59 loss was aided by 51.9% shooting from the field as the Nittany Lions scored 41 points in the second half.
- Michigan State shot 54.2% in the second half of a 71-56 win in Iowa City. Illinois shot 65% (13-20) while scoring 40 points in the second half and Indiana shot 50% in the second half, including 57.1% from three-point range.
- In a recent win over Northwestern, Iowa held the Wildcats to 37.5% shooting overall. Northwestern shot just 26.9% (7-26) from three-point range and had only 10 free throw attempts. Iowa held a 33-26 rebounding advantage.

TAKING CARE OF TURNOVERS

During the non-conference portion of the schedule, Iowa averaged 11.5 turnovers in 13 games. In 12 Big Ten Conference games, Iowa is averaging 14.2 turnovers.

A year ago, Iowa averaged 17.2 turnovers in its 13 non-conference games before reducing that number to 14.8 during the 18-game conference schedule.

NO TREYS FOR OPPONENT

Iowa held Southeast Missouri State without a three-point basket in a 75-41 win, as the Redhawks missed all 11 attempts from behind the arc. SE Missouri State became the first Iowa opponent in 125 games not to make at least one trey. The last time that happened was Dec. 10, 2004 when Iowa State missed all six three-point attempts in Iowa's 70-63 win in Iowa City. Iowa allowed Kansas State just three treys in seven attempts in a 65-63 Hawkeye win. Boston College made just 2-10 three-point attempts in its 57-55 win over Iowa and Western Illinois was 2-7 in its 58-43 loss to the Hawkeyes.

BALANCED SCORING LEADS IOWA

Iowa has featured a balanced scoring attack, with at least three players scoring in double figures in 10 games and four reaching 10 points or more in four games.

Eight different players have led Iowa in scoring and four are averaging more than 9.3 points per game.



Senior Cyrus Tate is shooting 67.2% from the field and sophomore Jarryd Cole is shooting 69.4% in a more limited role. Guards Matt Gatens (46.3%) and Jeff Peterson (45%) and forward David Palmer (50%) are also near 50%. Cole recently had a streak of 12 straight made field goals before his first miss in a loss at Indiana.

Tate shot 66.7% from the field last season, including 70.2% to lead all players in Big Ten games only.

VALUABLE POSSESSIONS

Iowa is averaging 12.1 assists and 12.8 turnovers per game. Through 25 games last season those averages were 12.5 assists and 16.2 turnovers per game.

HAWKEYE GAMES NOTES

- Iowa is 8-5 when controlling the opening tip and 5-7 when not controlling the tip.
- Iowa is 3-1 when four players reach double figures, 6-3 when three score in double figures, 4-5 when two score 10 or more points and 0-2 with just one player in double figures. In 32 games last season, Iowa had more than three players score in double figures just four times.
- Iowa was guilty of five turnovers in a win over Northern Iowa, the fewest for the Hawkeyes under Coach Todd Lickliter. Iowa had six turnovers in a win at The Citadel, seven in wins over Charleston Southern and SE Missouri State. Iowa had nine in an overtime win over Wisconsin and 11 in a loss at Illinois. Iowa was guilty of 19 turnovers against Texas-San Antonio, 16 vs. Oakland and 21 vs. West Virginia, (including 17 in the first half). More recently, Iowa had 17 turnovers vs. Minnesota, Michigan and Northwestern and 19 at Purdue. The Hawkeyes had less than 10 turnovers in just two of 32 games a year ago and had 20 or more turnovers in seven games.
- Iowa is 5-0 when scoring between 70-79 points, 6-3 when scoring between 60-69 points and 2-9 when scoring less than 60 points.
- Iowa is 6-0 when holding its opponent to less than 50 points, 3-2 when the opponent scores between 50-59 points, 4-7 when the opponent scores between 60-69 points, 0-2 when the opponent scores between 70-79 points and 0-1 when the opponent scores over 80 points.
- Iowa is 12-3 when collecting more assists than the opponent, 0-8 when the opponent has more assists and 1-1 when assists are even.
- Iowa is 8-0 when having fewer turnovers than its opponent, 3-10 when the opponent has fewer turnovers and 2-2 when turnovers are even.
- Iowa is 9-1 when collecting more steals than its opponent, 4-10 when the opponent has more steals and 0-1 when steals are even. Iowa allowed The Citadel no steals in taking the 70-48 road win.
- Iowa is 11-3 when leading at halftime and 2-9 when trailing at halftime.
- Iowa is 6-6 in games decided by 10 points or less, including 4-4 in games decided by five points or less and 1-0 in overtime.

HAWKEYE PLAYER NOTES

- Along with scoring the game winning basket vs. Kansas State, Cyrus Tate ended the game with 10 points and seven rebounds, just one night after failing to score in a loss to West Virginia. Tate turned in solid defensive performances in wins over Northern Iowa and Iowa State, adding 10 points and eight rebounds against the Cyclones. He leads Iowa in rebounding (6.2) and is scoring 7.1 points per game. He recorded the sixth double-double of his career with 22 points and 11 rebounds in a win over Indiana. He played just eight minutes in a loss to Minnesota due to injury and missed seven games. Tate returned to play 13 minutes against Northwestern before not playing at Wisconsin.
- Jeff Peterson leads Iowa is assists at 4.2 per game, including 4.9 in Big Ten games, and also leads the team with 30 steals. Peterson scored a season-high 18 points in wins over Kansas State and Northern Iowa and is averaging 10.6 points per game. He added 16 points and seven assists in a win over Wisconsin. He is shooting 45% from the field and leads the team in free throws (80) and attempts (97), shooting 82.5%. Peterson led Iowa in assists (3.1) last season as a true freshman and had a career-best four steals vs. Northwestern. Peterson suffered an injury at Wisconsin and is not expected to play against Purdue.
- True freshman Matt Gatens has scored in double figures in 17 games, with a season-best of 22 in road games at Ohio State and Indiana. He recorded his first career double-double with 11 points and 10 rebounds in a win over Western Illinois. He ranks third on the team in assists (53) and leads the Big Ten in free throw percentage (92.3%, 60-65) and is second in three-point percentage (.465). He made 26 straight free throws over 16 games before missing his first attempt in a win over Wisconsin.
- Junior Devan Bawinkel had a season-best 15 points in a loss at Ohio State, hitting 5-8 three-pointers. He added 12 points against Boston College and Iowa State, connecting on 4-7 three-pointers at Boston College and 4-5 vs. Iowa State. Through 25 games, 90 of his 95 field goal attempts are three-point attempts. He also has not attempted a free throw and has committed just six turnovers. His three-point basket with 1:05 to play gave Iowa a 48-46 advantage in the 56-51 win over Northwestern.
- Junior Jermain Davis had his best game against Iowa State, recording season-bests in points (16), rebounds (six), assists (five) and steals (one). Davis had 10 points in the loss at Boston College and added 13 points and eight rebounds in a win over Western Illinois. He had nine points and eight rebounds in a win over Indiana, eight rebounds in a loss to Minnesota and nine points vs. Michigan State.
- Sophomore Jake Kelly, still shaking off the effects of a broken middle finger on his shooting (right) hand, contributed 19 points, five rebounds, four assists and two steals in a win over Northern Iowa. Kelly matched his career-high with 19 points in a loss at Penn State and had a career-best six rebounds in a win over Northwestern. He scored 17 points (7-9 FG's) in the loss at Wisconsin. He ranks second on the team in steals (27) and assists (66) and is averaging 9.4 points. Kelly scored 12 points, all in the last 15 minutes of action, in a win over Wisconsin.



- True freshman Aaron Fuller had a season-best seven rebounds and seven points against Kansas State, and he added seven points in a win over Bryant. Fuller had a career-best 16 points, along with four rebounds, in a loss at Penn State. Fuller has started 13 games.
- Junior forward David Palmer started for the first time in his career at Purdue and responded with 19 points and eight rebounds. He added 21 points (8-12 FG's) and seven rebounds in a win over Wisconsin and had eight rebounds and six points at Penn State. He is shooting 50% from the field and 44.4% from three-point range. In five games as a starter he averaged 11 points and 5.2 rebounds.
- Sophomore Jarryd Cole had his most productive game of the season against Michigan State, hitting all five of his field goal attempts while scoring 10 points and collecting eight rebounds and two blocked shots. Cole returned to the starting line-up at Indiana and had seven points and six rebounds. Cole added 10 points in the loss at Illinois, again making all of his five field goal attempts. Cole made 12 straight field goal attempts before a miss at Indiana and is shooting 69.4% from the field. He had seven rebounds in a win over Northwestern and eight at Wisconsin.

HAWKEYES FEATURE YOUNG LINE-UP

Iowa's starting line-up in its first eight games included three true freshmen, including forward Aaron Fuller and guards Matt Gatens and Anthony Tucker. Iowa then started one senior, one junior, two sophomores and one freshman in seven games before sophomore Jarryd Cole replaced senior Cyrus Tate in the starting line-up at Michigan. In its most recent contest Iowa's line-up included one freshman, three sophomores and one junior.

Iowa's starting line-up included three freshmen in four games last season, included Jarryd Cole, Jeff Peterson and Jake Kelly. Cole later missed the final 19 games due to injury. Kelly started 25 games and Peterson 11 as the three combined for 42 starts. Iowa freshmen this season have earned 46 starts.

Iowa had not started three freshmen in a game since the 2000-01 season. That season, Brody Boyd, Jared Reiner and Glen Worley started in a game at Illinois. Boyd, Worley and Sean Sonderleiter started in a game at Michigan State and Boyd, Worley and Cortney Scott started in a game at Michigan.

NEWCOMERS CONTRIBUTE

With seven new players on a 13-man roster, Iowa is relying on newcomers this season. Three newcomers, all freshmen, started Iowa's first eight games. Four of the newcomers have led the team in scoring in at least one game.

The Hawkeye newcomers have scored 40 or more points in six games, with a high of 48 vs. Texas-San Antonio. In Big Ten play, the newcomers had 40 points at Ohio State and 38 at Indiana. The first-year Hawkeyes had a season-best 23 rebounds in a win over SE Missouri State and 21 in a win over Western Illinois and a loss at Michigan.

Freshman Matt Gatens led the newcomers with 15 points in the opening game and freshman Anthony Tucker led Iowa's scoring in five games. Gatens' total matches the most points scored by a freshman in their first game since Jeff Horner had 15 points in the first game of the 2002-03 season. Tucker scored 24 points vs. West Virginia, 21 points at The Citadel and 19 vs. Oakland. Gatens leads Iowa in scoring at 11.2 points per game.

OVERCOMING DEFICITS

The biggest deficit Iowa has overcome to earn a victory this season is seven points. In the season opening contest, Iowa trailed 7-0 before taking a 68-48 win over Charleston Southern.

Iowa trailed 22-15 in the first half of a 65-46 win over Northern Iowa and the Hawkeyes trailed Wisconsin by seven points with 12 minutes left in the game Jan. 21 before winning in overtime.

In Iowa's losses, Minnesota trailed by 13 points in the first half before earning a 52-49 win. Penn State trailed by 14 points in the second half before winning 63-59.

Last season Iowa rallied from a 14-point deficit in two games, while two opponents defeated Iowa after trailing by 16 points.

STARTING LINE-UPS

Iowa has been outscored 670-679 in the first half, but holds an 848-794 advantage in the second half and a 13-9 margin in one overtime period. Iowa has led at halftime in 14 games, and has outscored its opponent in the second half 14 times.

IOWA FROM THE FREE THROW LINE

Iowa has made over 70% of its free throws in 17 games, including 100% (8-8) vs. Northern Iowa, 93.8% (15-16) at Penn State, 90.9% (20-22) vs. Texas-San Antonio and Minnesota (10-11), 90% (9-10) at Michigan, 88.9% (8-9) at Boston College and 88.9% (16-18) vs. Northwestern. Iowa made at least 70% of its free throws in 12 games last season, with a season-best 88.9% (8-9) at Northern Iowa.

Iowa is 10-7 this season when shooting over 70% from the foul line, but just 2-3 when shooting 90% or better. Iowa shot a season-low 44.4% (4-9) in a home loss to Michigan State and had season low marks for made free throws (three) and attempts (four) at Illinois. AMONG SINGLE SEASON BESTS

Iowa made 222 three-point field goals while attempting 640 three-point shots a year ago, averaging 6.9 made treys and 20 three-point attempts. Both of those figures rank second best at Iowa for a single season. The Hawkeyes set single season records in 1995 when they made 274 of 743 three-point attempts.

Through 25 games this season, Iowa is averaging 8.3 made three-point field goals and 21.8 attempts.

NATIONAL COACH OF THE YEAR

Iowa Coach Todd Lickliter was named the 2007 Division I national Coach of the Year by the National Basketball Coaches (NABC) after leading Butler to 29 wins and a spot in the NCAA Sweet Sixteen.

With Iowa football Coach Kirk Ferentz earning national Coach of the Year in 2002, Iowa is one of seven Division I institutions to have a former football and men's basketball national Coach of the Year currently coaching their respective team. The others are Florida, Florida State, Kansas, Maryland, SMU and Tennessee.

Four current Big Ten Conference head coaches have earned national Coach of the Year honors.

BIG TEN CELEBRATES BLACK HISTORY MONTH

In a continued effort to commemorate the achievements of African-Americans on Big Ten campuses, 22 student-athletes will be recognized on the Big Ten's Black History Month website. Throughout February, the website will feature stories on current and former student-athletes from each institution. The site can be accessed at www.bigten.org.

The distinguished group includes: Illinois' Willie Williams (men's track and field) and Jonelle Polk (women's basketball), Indiana's Mike Woodson (basketball) and Danielle Carruthers (women's track and field), Iowa's Andre Tippett (football) and **Tia Jackson** (women's basketball), Michigan's Scooter Vaughn (hockey) and Tiffany Ofili (women's track and field), Michigan State's Charles Thornhill (football) and Lauren Aitch (women's basketball), Minnesota's Jim Brewer (men's basketball) and Corinne Bolder (women's soccer), Northwestern's Rohan Gardner (wrestling) and Katrina Savage (women's tennis), Ohio State's Michael Redd (men's basketball) and Tracey Hall (women's basketball), Penn State's John Amaechi (men's basketball) and Nadia Edwards (women's volleyball), Purdue's Forest Farmer (football) and Cheryl Flowers (women's volleyball) and Wisconsin's Marcus Landry (basketball) and Chavon Robinson (women's track and field).

Iowa's Tippett was featured on Monday, Feb. 9 and Jackson will be featured Thursday, Feb. 26.

The Black History Month website also features stories on the conference's first African-American student-athlete - - Moses "Fleetwood" Walker - - and arguably the most famous track and field athlete of all-time in Jesse Owens. The website also includes archived stories on student-athletes previously recognized on the Big Ten's Black History Month website. In addition, the site features information on the Big Ten's contributions through the Advisory Commission, the SCORE (Success Comes Out of Reading Everyday) program and the C.D. Henry internship.



IOWA IN TOURNAMENT PLAY

Iowa has fared well while taking part in regular-season tournaments over the past 22 years. In that time Iowa has won the Great Alaska Shootout (1986-87), the Cal-Irvine Anteater Classic (1986-87), the Maui Classic (1987-88), the San Juan Thanksgiving Shootout (1992-93), the San Juan Christmas Shootout (1997-98), the Big Ten Conference Tournament in 2001 and 2006 and its own invitational 24 times.

In addition, Iowa was runner-up in the 1985-86 Far West Classic, the 1987-88 All-College Tournament, the 1988-89 Chaminade Classic, the 1991-92 Tampa Tribune Holiday Invitational, the 1994-95 Rainbow Classic, the 1995-96 Great Alaska Shootout, the 1999-00 Coaches vs. Cancer Classic, the 2001-02 Guardians Classic, the 2005-06 Guardians Classic, the 2002 Big Ten Conference Tournament and the 2004 Maui Invitational.

IOWA ON THE BIG TEN NETWORK

The majority of Iowa games throughout the 2008-09 season can be seen on the Big Ten Network, a national cable television network that now reaches over 70 million homes in its second year. The Big Ten Network is available on Mediacom, which provides cable service to over 400,000 customers throughout Iowa and the Midwest.

Iowa games telecast on the Big Ten Network are also available through the nation's two satellite television companies, DirectTV and Dish Network.

BTN CLASSIC GAMES INCLUDES IOWA

The Big Ten Network, for the second straight season, will televise a series of "Greatest Games" of the Big Ten Conference throughout the season. Iowa games featured include an overtime win over Oklahoma in the Sweet 16 of the 1987 NCAA Tournament and a double overtime win at Indiana during the 2003-04 season. The victory over Indiana aired Feb. 3 and the win over Oklahoma can be seen at 7 p.m. on Feb. 24. An Iowa loss at Northwestern during the 2004-05 season can be seen again at 11 a.m. CT on Feb. 28.

TATE & COLE ARE IOWA CAPTAINS

Senior forward Cyrus Tate and sophomore forward Jarryd Cole are serving as Iowa's captains.

Tate averaged 8.3 points and 5.4 rebounds a year ago while starting 19 of the 31 games he appeared in. Tate shot 66.7% from the field for the season and 70.2% in Big Ten games. He led the conference in field goal percentage and was third in rebounding in conference games. He has started every game this season and is averaging 7.6 points and 7.5 rebounds.

Cole started six of the 13 games he played before a knee injury in Iowa's final non-conference game forced him to miss the final 19 games. Cole averaged 6.6 points and 4.8 rebounds, shooting 66.7% from the field. He has played in all 11 games this season.

THE RETURNING CAST

Iowa returns two starters and six lettermen from a year ago. The returning starters include senior forward Cyrus Tate (6-8, 255) and sophomore guard Jake Kelly (6-6, 185). Tate started 19 games as a junior, averaging 8.3 points and 5.4 rebounds. Kelly started 25 of 32 games in his first season, averaging 7.3 points while shooting 43.5% from three-point range.

The four additional returning lettermen include junior center David Palmer (6-9, 240), senior guard J.R. Angle (6-7, 215), sophomore guard Jeff Peterson (6-0, 192) and sophomore forward Jarryd Cole (6-7, 250).

Iowa's returning players, last season, played 44.9% of all minutes in 32 games, scoring 44.9% of Iowa's points and grabbing 37.3% of Iowa's rebounds. The group also had 45.5% of the assists and 50% of the steals last season. They combined to shoot 45.8% from the field, 35.7% from three-point range and 63.1% from the free throw line.

LICKLITER TO REDSHIRT

Freshman guard John Lickliter, who joined the Iowa program as a walk-on to play for his father, Coach Todd Lickliter, plans to use the 2008-09 season to redshirt.

Lickliter started every game at year ago at Iowa City High, helping the Little Hawks claim the Class 4-A state title.

A YOUNG SOUAD

Iowa's roster of 13 players includes five freshmen, three sophomores, three juniors and two seniors. The sophomores are Jarryd Cole, Jake Kelly and Jeff Peterson. The freshmen include forward Andrew Brommer (6-9, 235), forward Aaron Fuller (6-6, 210), guard Matt Gatens (6-5, 215), guard John Lickliter (5-11, 175) and guard Anthony Tucker (6-4, 200).

In addition, junior guards Devan Bawinkel (6-5, 210) and Jermain Davis (6-4, 200) are both in their first year at Iowa after attending junior colleges a year ago.

Along with two players from the state of Iowa, the roster includes two players from Illinois and Indiana, three from Minnesota, two from Missouri and one from Arizona and Tennessee.

HAWKEYE SCHEDULE NOTES

- During the non-conference portion of the schedule, Iowa traveled roughly 7,640 miles during a 13-day stretch to play games in Charleston, SC (at The Citadel), Las Vegas (Las Vegas Inv.) and Boston (at Boston College). Iowa also played two home games during that stretch.
- Along with an opening win over Charleston Southern, Iowa traveled to The Citadel on Nov. 20. Both Charleston Southern and The Citadel are located in Charleston, South Carolina.
- Iowa's schedule includes 17 home games, including nine Big Ten Conference games and home dates with in-state opponents Northern Iowa and Iowa State. In conference play, Iowa does not play at Minnesota, while Illinois does not visit Carver-Hawkeve Arena.
- Iowa's Big Ten schedule includes five weekend home dates and four games during the week. The Iowa schedule included four straight weekend road games. The Hawkeyes play at home each of the next two weekends.



- After playing a number of games a year ago with a start time of 8 p.m., Iowa's March 3 contest against Ohio State is the only home game with an 8 p.m. start time this season. Two home games started at 7:30 p.m.
- Iowa's schedule includes at least three neutral site games, including two games in the Las Vegas Invitational. Iowa defeated Kansas State to split its two games in Las Vegas as the Hawkeyes earned their first neutral site win since a 78-65 win over Toledo on Nov. 17, 2006 at the Paradise Jam.
- Iowa could play between one and four neutral site games while taking part in the Big Ten Conference Tournament in Indianapolis, IN at the end of the season.

POST-SEASON OPPONENTS

Fifteen of Iowa's 31 games during the regular season are against teams that advanced to post-season play last season. That includes 11 games against teams that participated in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa will play eight games against four Big Ten opponents that appeared in the 2008 NCAA Tournament, along with a single game at Drake and games against West Virginia and Kansas State.

During the non-conference portion of the schedule Iowa faced teams from the Big East (West Virginia), Atlantic Coast (Boston College), Big 12 (Iowa State and Kansas State) and Missouri Valley (Drake and Northern Iowa) conferences.

Iowa, in 2007-08, played 14 of 32 games against teams that advanced to post-season play. That included five teams that advanced to the NCAA Tournament (1-8), three opponents who competed in the NIT (1-3) and one opponent who participated in the initial College Basketball Invitational (0-1).

NO THREE-POINTERS

Since the three-point shot became part of the college game, Iowa has played 14 games in which it has failed to make a three-point attempt. Iowa had made at least one three-point basket in 53 straight games before missing all five attempts in a 71-61 home win over Purdue in 2004. Iowa's current streak includes at least one three-point basket in 175 straight games.

IOWA IN THE NCAA TOURNAMENT

Iowa made its 22nd appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 2006. Iowa earned the Big Ten Conference's automatic bid by virtue of claiming the league's tournament title.

The Hawkeyes hold an overall record of 27-24 in the tournament, advancing to the Final Four in 1955 (fourth), 1956 (second) and 1980 (fourth). Iowa reached the regional championship in 1987 and lost in the regional semi-final in 1988 and 1999.

2008-09 Game Summaries

(1) IOWA 68, CHARLESTON SOUTHERN 48 November 14, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa trailed 7-0 in the early going before using a 20-4 scoring run to gain control on the way to a 68-48 season-opening win over Charleston Southern in Iowa City. Freshman Matt Gatens hit a three-point basket at the 17:24 mark for Iowa's first points of the season, and Iowa added nine more points over the next four minutes before the visitors would score again. The Hawkeyes increased the advantage to 11 points with six minutes remaining before CSU closed the gap to 29-25 at halftime. Gatens and fellow freshman Anthony Tucker combined to score Iowa's first 15 points.

Iowa scored the first four points of the second half and led by six or more the rest of the way. Iowa's biggest margin was 23 points in the final minutes. The Hawkeyes shot 56% from the field in the second half, while holding the visitors to just 26.7%.

Iowa shot 51.1% for the game, including 36% from three-point range. The Hawkeyes also shot 73.3% from the free throw line and held a 32-30 rebounding advantage. Charleston Southern shot just 33.3% for the game.

Gatens led Iowa with 15 points and five assists, hitting 4-6 field goals, all three of his three-point attempts and all four of his free throw attempts. Tucker and sophomore guard Jake Kelly each added 10 points, while senior forward Cyrus Tate collected nine points and 12 rebounds and sophomore guard Jeff Peterson added nine points and three assists. Kelly saw his first action of the season, as he missed Iowa's exhibition win over Wayne State due to injury.

(2) IOWA 73, TEXAS-SAN ANTONIO 67 November 17, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa let a 12 point halftime advantage slip away before making 14-15 free throws in the second half in earning a 73-67 win over Texas-San Antonio. Iowa shot 65.2% from the field in the opening half, building a 40-28 advantage at the break. Iowa connected on 15-23 field goal attempts and 6-7 free throws in the first half and had 11 assists.

UTSA used full court pressure to get back in the game, forcing 11 Iowa turnovers in the final 20 minutes. The Roadrunners took a 57-54 advantage with 7:49 to play, their first lead since the opening minutes of play.

Iowa responded by scoring eight straight points, six of those on free throws by Jermain Davis. UTSA stayed in the game, closing the deficit to two points twice in the closing minutes, the last at 67-65 with 33 seconds remaining. Matt Gatens hit two free shots to increase the advantage and Cyrus Tate blocked a UTSA shot attempt as the Hawkeyes held on.

Iowa shot 57.1% (24-42) from the field and 90.9% (20-22) from the free throw line, compared to 44.4% field goal shooting and 83.3% shooting from the line for the visitors.

Tate led Iowa's balanced attack with 18 points, hitting 8-9 field goals and both of his free throws. Anthony Tucker added 15 points, Gatens contributed 10 points and seven assists and Davis ended with game with 10 points on 10-10 shooting from the line. Tate and Gatens led Iowa with five rebounds apiece and Tate collected three blocked shots and two steals.

(3) IOWA 70, THE CITADEL 48 November 20, 2008, McAlister Field House, Charleston, SC

Iowa used a 16-4 scoring run over the final seven minutes of the first half to gain control and the Hawkeyes went on to post a 70-48 win at The Citadel. The teams traded baskets in the opening minutes before The Citadel tied the game at 16-16 with seven minutes left in the half. Iowa's Anthony Tucker hit back-to-back three-points to spark an 11-0 scoring run as Iowa built a 32-20 advantage at the break.

Cyrus Tate scored on a rebound basket to start the second half, giving the Hawkeyes a 14 point cushion. The Citadel rallied, closing the margin to six points four minutes into the half. The Bulldogs added a three-point play at the 13 minute mark to cut the deficit to five, 39-34, with 13 minutes remaining.

Another three-pointer by Tucker and a three-point play by Aaron Fuller increased Iowa's advantage to 45-34 and Iowa was not threatened the rest of the way.

The Hawkeye were efficient in gaining their first road win over the season. Iowa shot 47.5% from the field, including 52% (13-25) from three-point range. Iowa had just six turnovers, the low mark for a Hawkeye team in 35 games under Todd Lickliter, and had nine steals, which led to 23 points off turnovers.

Tucker led Iowa with 21 points, hitting 7-11 three-point attempts. Matt Gatens added 13 points, six assists and four steals and three rebounds, Jeff Peterson had 12 points and three assists and Fuller added eight points and five rebounds. Iowa won the rebounding battle 28-23 and forced 13 turnovers.

(4) IOWA 66, Oakland 57 November 23, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa built a 10 point advantage in the second half before holding off a late rally in securing a 66-57 win over Oakland University in Iowa City. With the win the Hawkeyes improved to 4-0 for the second straight season under Coach Todd Lickliter.

The Hawkeyes held a 30-24 advantage at the break and increased the margin to 53-43 with 4:35 remaining. But Oakland hit two three-point baskets within the next minute and two free throws with 2:54 left to play to cut the deficit to two points. Iowa increased its margin on a three-point basket by Anthony Tucker and two free throws each by Jeff Peterson and Jake Kelly, taking a 60-51 advantage with 1:05 to play. Iowa hit 10-13 free throw attempts in the final two minutes.

The Hawkeyes shot 55% from the field, including 57.1% in the first half. Iowa made 12-15 two point attempts and 10-25 three-point shots in the game, collecting 19 assists on 22 field goals. Oakland's full court pressure and trapping zone defense forced 16 Iowa turnovers.

The Iowa defense held Oakland to 43.1% shooting from the field and the Hawkeyes held a 31-24 rebounding advantage.

Freshman Anthony Tucker hit 5-10 three-point shots and led Iowa in scoring with 19 points. Cyrus Tate added his fifth career double-double with 11 points and 13 rebounds, and Kelly added 16 points, four rebounds and four assists. Tucker contributed six rebounds, Peterson had eight points and matched his career-best with nine rebounds.

(5) IOWA 75, SE MISSOURI STATE 41 November 25, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used a solid defensive effort to take control early in a 75-41 win over Southeast Missouri State in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes led 13-3 in the early going, holding the visitors to just one field goal in the first nine minutes. Iowa led 20-5 at the midway point in the first half and built the advantage to 35-19 by intermission.

Southeast Missouri State scored the first three points of the second half, but was never able to get closer than 13. Iowa led by as many as 35 points in the late going, securing its most lopsided win since early in the 2006-07 season.

Iowa held the Redhawks to 22.4% shooting from the field, as the visitors misfired on all 11 of their three-point attempts. SE Missouri State did connect on 19-25 (76%) free throws. Iowa also forced 11 turnovers and held a 41-33 rebounding advantage.

Ten of the 12 Hawkeyes who saw action got into the scoring column, as freshmen Anthony Tucker (14) and Matt Gatens (12) led the scoring. Devan Bawinkel added nine points and Jeff Peterson scored eight. Tucker added 10 rebounds to collect his first career double-double, while David Palmer added six points and five rebounds. Peterson led the Hawkeyes with five assists.

As a team Iowa shot 48.3% from the field, including 43.3% (13-30) from three-point range and 66.7% (6-9) from the foul line. Iowa collected 17 assists on its 28 field goals and was guilty of just seven turnovers.

(6) WEST VIRGINIA 87, IOWA 68 November 28, Orleans Arena, Las Vegas, NV

West Virginia used a 20-0 scoring run over a five minute stretch in the first half to take control as the Mountaineers defeated Iowa in Las Vegas. The teams traded baskets in the early going, with a three-pointer by Iowa's Anthony Tucker giving the Hawkeyes an 11-9 advantage at the 13:42 mark. West Virginia took over from there, using a solid pressure defense to force a number of turnovers while scoring 20 straight points.

Iowa was guilty of 17 turnovers in the first half as West Virginia led 48-28 at the break. The Mountaineers shot 55.4% from the field in the opening half, scoring 29 points following Iowa mistakes and 24 points in the paint.

Iowa shot the ball well in the game, shooting 54.1% overall, including 50% from three-point range and 69% (20-29) from the free throw line.

West Virginia ended the game shooting 55.4% from the field and 55.6% from three-point range. The Mountaineers also held a 32-25 rebounding advantage, including 15 offensive rebounds.

The Hawkeyes were able to protect the ball in the second half, committing just four turnovers in the final 20 minutes. Still, Iowa was not able to get any closer than 14 points in the second half.

Tucker led the Hawkeye scoring attack with a career-best 24 points, hitting 8-12 field goals and 6-9 three-pointers. Jake Kelly adding 15 points, hitting 9-10 free throws, and Jeff Peterson had 11 points. Cyrus Tate led Iowa with five rebounds and Kelly added three assists.

(7) IOWA 65, KANSAS STATE 63 November 29, 2008, Orleans Arena, Las Vegas, NV

Iowa forward Cyrus Tate scored from just on front of the basket just before the final horn sounded to lift Iowa to a 65-63 win over Kansas State in the consolation championship of the Las Vegas Invitational, earning Coach Todd Lickliter career win No. 150.

Tate's basket came after Kansas State had tied the score with seven seconds remaining. Jake Kelly found Tate near the basket for the game winner, which replays showed took place with less than one second remaining.

The Wildcats had rallied from an 11-point halftime deficit, taking their first lead of the game (53-52) with 5:12 remaining. The lead changed hands eight times and the game was tied five times in the final five minutes, with neither team leading by more than two points. Tate's free throw gave Iowa a 61-59 advantage with 1:52 left before Kansas State tied the score on a pair of free throws with 31 seconds to play. Kelly hit a jumper to give Iowa a 63-61 advantage before Kansas State knotted the score for the final time on a rebound basket.

Iowa got off to a good start in the first half, leading by as many as 13 points in the opening period before settling for a 36-25 halftime advantage. The Hawkeyes shot 41.7% from the field in the first half, including 54.5% (6-11) from three-point range. For the game Iowa shot just 36.4% from the field, but the Hawkeyes hit 26-37 (70.3%) free throws and were guilty of just 11 turnovers.

Jeff Peterson led Iowa with 18 points (11-12 free throws) and six assists, as he was named to the all-tournament team. Tate added 10 points and joined Anthony Tucker and Aaron Fuller with seven rebounds.

(9) IOWA 61, BRYANT 36 December 5, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa returned home after three straight games away from Iowa City, defeating Bryant University 61-36. The 36 points match the lowest total allowed by the Hawkeyes in 41 games under Coach Todd Lickliter.

The Hawkeyes started fast against Bryant, leading 6-0, 15-6 and 22-8 in the early going. Iowa led 26-14 at halftime, allowing the fewest points in a first half under Coach Lickliter. Iowa held Bryant to just 5-19 (26.3%) field goal shooting in the opening 20 minutes.

Bryant closed to within eight points in the first four minutes of the second half, but Iowa responded with a 12-0 scoring run over a six minute span to gain complete control, leading 43-23 with just under 10 minutes remaining. The final 25 point margin matched Iowa's biggest advantage of the game.

Iowa shot 48.8% from the field, including 73.3% (11-15) in the second half. Iowa was a perfect 3-3 from inside the three-point line in the second half. Iowa made 12-28 (42.9%) three-point attempts and 7-9 (77.8%) free throws in the game.

Both teams shot 48% from the field in the opening 20 minutes. Iowa scored the first six points of the game for its biggest advantage, while the Cyclones led by four on three occasions.

Iowa scored the first eight points of the second half before Iowa State got a field goal at the 17:42 mark, leaving Iowa with a 42-34 advantage. The Hawkeyes used a 16-3 run to take a 63-37 lead at the 8:55 mark and Iowa State was never closer than the final margin.

Iowa's defense held the Cyclones to 38.5% shooting in the second half, including just 4-12 (33.3%) three-point attempts. Iowa shot 48.1% from the field overall, including 43.8% from three-point range, and connected on 16-21 (76.2%) free throws. Both teams had 12 turnovers, but Iowa collected nine steals and held a 25-12 scoring advantage off turnovers.

Jeff Peterson led Iowa with 17 points as four Hawkeyes scored in double figures. Jermain Davis scored Iowa's first eight points in getting the Hawkeyes off to a fast start. Davis ended the night with career-bests in points (16), rebounds (six) and assists (five), hitting 5-10 field goals and 6-7 free throws. Bawinkel matched his season-best with 12 points (4-5 treys) and Cyrus Tate added 10 points, eight rebounds and two steals while holding Iowa State's leading scorer 11 points below his average.

Iowa struggled in nearly all phases in dropping a 60-43 contest to Drake in Des Moines. The Hawkeyes had their poorest shooting performance of the season (31.3%), made just 8-29 (27.6%) three-point attempts, were outscored 23-5 from the free throw line and lost the rebounding battle by a 41-24 margin.

The score was tied for the final time at 7-7 when Iowa hit a cold spell, scoring just three points over the next 10 minutes. Drake held a 19 point advantage (29-10) before the Hawkeyes narrowed the gap to 32-18 at intermission.

Iowa trailed by 15 points midway through the second half before Anthony Tucker hit a pair of three-point baskets to cut the deficit to nine. Tucker had another three-point attempt to cut the margin to six points with 6:35 to play, but his shot was off target, Drake rebounded and added a pair of free throws to pull away for the final time.

Drake's penetrating offense kept Iowa off balance and led to 29 free throw attempts for the Bulldogs, while Iowa made 5-7 free throws. Drake's rebounding totals included a 12-4 advantage in offensive rebounds as Drake held a 13-3 margin in second-chance points and an 18-12 points in the paint margin.

Tucker led Iowa with 12 points, but he was the only Hawkeye to score in double figures. Jeff Peterson added eight points, five assists and three steals, Jermain Davis added seven points and Jarryd Cole led the Hawkeyes with five rebounds.

2008-09 Game Summaries

(13) IOWA 58, WESTERN ILLINOIS 43 December 27, 2008, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used another strong second half performance to defeat Western Illinois 58-43 in Iowa City to conclude non-conference action with a 10-3 record. The Hawkeyes trailed by as many as five points in the early going (13-8) and the score was tied six times in the first half. The visiting Leathernecks held a 23-22 halftime advantage.

Iowa scored the first five points of the second half and led the rest of the way. Iowa still led by just one, 36-35, with 11 minutes remaining before a basket by Jeff Peterson and two free throws each by David Palmer and Matt Gatens expanded the margin to seven at the 10 minute mark. Iowa led by six or more the rest of the way, with the 15-point final margin representing Iowa's biggest margin of the game.

Iowa held Western Illinois to 20 points in the second half, as the visitors shot just 25% (7-28) in the final period. For the game the Leathernecks shot 34% from the field and made just 2-7 (28.6%) three-point attempts.

Iowa improved its shooting to 50% from the field in the second half and the Hawkeyes made 13-16 (81.3%) free throws in the final 20 minutes. For the game Iowa shot 46.2% from the field, 33.3% from three-point range and 77.3% from the foul line.

Iowa was guilty of 11 turnovers and Western Illinois collected nine steals and won the rebounding battle 30-28. The Hawkeyes matched a season-high with five blocked shots.

Jermain Davis and Jake Kelly led Iowa's scoring with 13 points each. Gatens ended the game with 11 points and 10 rebounds, collecting his first career double-double. Davis added eight rebounds, Kelly had four assists and Peterson collected three steals as Iowa improved to 8-0 in the all-time series against Western Illinois.

Iowa rallied from a 15-point deficit in the first half, but came up just short in a 68-65 loss at Ohio State in the opening conference game of the season.

The Hawkeyes started slow as Ohio State scored the first eight points of the game and went on to build a 30-15 advantage after 15 minutes. Iowa rallied in the closing minutes of the half and trailed by just eight, 36-28, at halftime.

Iowa continued its rally to start the second half, pulling even at 38-38 with 16 minutes to play. Iowa would go on to lead by as many as four points with 11 minutes to play before Ohio State would rally. The teams traded baskets over the next several minutes, with Iowa holding a 65-64 lead on a basket by Jake Kelly with 3:31 remaining. Ohio State took the lead with 3:17 remaining on a pair of free throws and the Buckeyes maintained their advantage from there.

Iowa missed a pair of three-point attempts in the final minute, once when trailing by two points and then again in the final seconds when trying to tie the game. The Buckeyes were able to get control of a loose ball rebound and run out the clock following Iowa's final missed shot.

Iowa shot 52.3% from the field in the contest, including 50% from three-point range. The Hawkeyes made 14 three-point shots, falling one shy of matching the school record for three-point baskets in a game. Iowa had 16 assists, the rebounding was even at 23-23 and the Buckeyes held a 13-5 scoring advantage at the free throw line.

Freshman Matt Gatens led the Hawkeyes with 22 points, hitting 8-12 field goals and 4-7 treys. He added five rebounds and two steals. Devan Bawinkle contributed 15 points and Kelly scored 11. Jeff Peterson led Iowa with eight assists and added nine points.

(15) IOWA 65, INDIANA 60 January 3, 2009, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa used scoring spurts midway through each half and then held off the Hoosiers at the end in recording a 65-60 win in Iowa City.

The score was tied five times and there were six lead changes in the opening 10 minutes. A basket and free throw by Cyrus Tate gave Iowa an 18-15 advantage and the Hawkeyes led the rest of the way. Iowa led by as many as 10 in the closing minutes of the half before Indiana rallied to trail by just six, 33-27, at the break.

Iowa then scored the first five points of the second half to increase the advantage to 11 points. The teams played even over the next 12 minutes, with Indiana staying within striking distance and Iowa unable to close the door.

The Hoosiers still trailed by 10, 60-50, at the four minute mark before one final rally. Indiana closed to within four points with 1:57 left before Jeff Peterson hit two free throws. The Hoosiers closed to within two points with 22 seconds remaining before Peterson connected on two additional free shots. Andrew Brommer collected a steal in the final seconds and hit one of two free throws with six seconds to play to conclude the scoring.

Iowa shot 46.5% from the field and 74.1% from the free throw line, including 55.6% from the field in the opening half. The Hawkeyes held Indiana to 43.2% shooting, including just 37.5% over the final 20 minutes.

Tate led the Hawkeyes with 22 points and 11 rebounds, collecting the sixth double-double of his career. He made all six of his field goal attempts and 10-11 free throws. Peterson added 16 points and five assists, Jake Kelly had 10 points and two steals and Jermain Davis contributed nine points and eight rebounds.

Iowa built a 13-point advantage in the first half, but suffered from cold shooting in the second half in dropping a 52-49 decision to Minnesota in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes controlled the first 15 minutes, building a 23-10 advantage late in the first half. Iowa suffered a blow when forward Cyrus Tate incurred an injury with 12:08 left in the first half and missed the remainder of the game.

The Gophers began their comeback in the final five minutes of the period, cutting Iowa's advantage to 26-20 at intermission.

Iowa led 31-24 with 17 minutes to play, but Minnesota gained control from there. The Gophers outscored Iowa 17-2 over the next 12 minutes, turning the deficit into a 41-33 advantage.

Matt Gatens then hit back-to-back three-point baskets to keep Iowa close, before Al Nolen hit a long three-pointer for a 46-39 advantage with 3:32 to play. Minnesota led by six points with 24 seconds left, but Jake Kelly scored from the lane and Jeff Peterson hit a three-pointer with seven seconds left to cut the margin to one. Lawrence Westbrook hit a pair of free throws with five seconds to play for the final margin as a final desperation three-point shot by Iowa was off the mark.

Minnesota controlled the action for most of the second half, collecting 12 offensive rebounds in the period and forcing 11 Iowa turnovers. Minnesota had 18 offensive rebounds in the game and held a 16-2 advantage in second chance points. Iowa was guilty of 17 turnovers overall and shot just 29.4% from the field in the second half.

Peterson led Iowa with 16 points, while Gatens added 11 points, five rebounds and three assists. Davis led Iowa with eight rebounds.

Iowa Purdue

(17) MICHIGAN 64, IOWA 49 January 11, 2009, Crisler Arena, Ann Arbor, MI

Michigan used a strong shooting performance in the first half and a solid defensive effort to defeat Iowa 64-49 in Ann Arbor. Iowa played without the services of senior forward Cyrus Tate, who missed the game due to an injury suffered in the previous loss to Minnesota.

The Wolverines shot 52% from the field in the opening half and held Iowa without a field goal for over seven minutes, building a 32-16 halftime advantage. Jake Kelly's basket with 9:44 left in the period left Iowa trailing by just five, 17-12, but the Hawkeyes did not make another field goal until a basket by Matt Gatens cut the deficit to 28-16 two minutes before the break.

Iowa cut the margin to 14 points on four occasions early in the second half before the Wolverines pulled away again, building the margin to as many as 28 points with seven minutes to play. A 14-3 Iowa scoring run cut the final margin to 15.

Iowa shot just 27.3% from the field in the first half before improving to 52.4% in the second half. Iowa hit 6-17 (35.3%) three-point attempts overall and made 9-10 (90%) free throws. Michigan shot 42.9% from the field and won the rebounding by a 31-29 margin. Iowa was guilty of 18 turnovers, as Michigan collected 12 steals and scored 16 points following Iowa miscues and 15 second chance points.

Gatens led Iowa with 11 points and eight rebounds. Jarryd Cole started for the first time this season and joined Anthony Tucker with eight points, while Jermain Davis added six rebounds and Jeff Peterson had four assists and two steals.

(18) PURDUE 75, IOWA 53 January 18, 2009, Mackey Arena, West Lafayette, IN

Purdue hit four consecutive three-point baskets in a span of less than two minutes, breaking open a close game on the way to a 75-53 win at West Lafayette. Iowa played its second straight game without senior forward Cyrus Tate, who suffered an ankle injury in the Jan. 8 loss to Minnesota.

The Hawkeyes trailed by seven, 35-28, at the 16:04 mark of the second half after David Palmer converted a pair of free throws. The Boilermakers took over from there, as four different players connected on a three-point basket as the Purdue lead expanded to 49-28 before Iowa scored again at the 13:34 mark.

Purdue shot 53.6% from the field in the second half, connecting on 7-9 (77.8%) three-point attempts and 9-10 free throws. Purdue shot 49% overall, including 10-15 (66.7%) three-pointers.

Iowa fell behind by six in the early going before scoring six straight to tie the game after six minutes. Iowa rallied again late in the first half, cutting a nine-point deficit to just four, 26-22. Purdue closed the half with a three-pointer at the buzzer for a 29-22 advantage at the break.

Purdue's aggressive defense forced 19 turnovers, which the Boilermakers turned into 17 points. Iowa shot just 25% (8-25) from the field in the opening half before improving to 36% for the game. Iowa made 9-20 (45%) three-point shots and hit just 57.1% (8-14) from the foul line.

Iowa was led by Palmer, who scored 19 points and added eight rebounds, both career highs for the junior forward. Palmer hit 7-14 field goals and 3-4 free throws while starting for the first time in his career. Freshman Matt Gatens added 11 points and five rebounds and Jeff Peterson contributed eight assists and two steals.

(19) IOWA 73, WISCONSIN 69 (OT) January 21, 2009, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Iowa controlled the action in overtime and defeated Wisconsin 73-69 in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes outscored the visitors 13-9 in the extra session after the Badgers had tied the score with a long three-point basket at the buzzer.

Jeff Peterson gave Iowa the advantage with the first basket in overtime. He later broke the final tie of the game with a three-point basket with 1:42 to play. Peterson earned an assist on a three-point basket by Devan Bawinkel with 1:01 to play, giving Iowa a 70-64 advantage. Peterson added one free throw and Matt Gatens hit a pair of free shots with seven seconds remaining to secure the win.

The teams traded baskets in the first half, with Iowa leading 20-18 on a David Palmer basket with 7:24 remaining. Iowa did not score again as the Badgers built a 24-20 advantage at the break.

(20) PENN STATE 63, IOWA 59 January 24, 2009, Bryce Jordan Center, State College, PA

Penn State rallied in the closing minutes for a 63-59 win over Iowa at State College. The Hawkeyes scored the first points of the game and led until just 2:14 remained when Penn State took its first lead, 60-59, on a three-point basket by Talor Battle. That basket was part of a Penn State scoring run that saw the Nittany Lions rally from a 54-41 deficit with eight minutes remaining. Iowa held that same margin with 5:51 to play when Jake Kelly was called for a foul on a three-point shot by Penn State, and the three free throws by Battle changed the momentum of the game.

Iowa held a 59-55 lead on a free throw by Jeff Peterson with 3:07, but that was Iowa's final point, and, the last foul committed by the Nittany Lions. Penn State increased its lead to 61-59 on two free throws following an Iowa turnover. Iowa had chances to tie the score in the final minute, but three-point attempts by Matt Gatens and David Palmer were off the mark and a final three-point attempt by Peterson was blocked. Penn State added one free throw with four seconds remaining to secure the win.

Iowa controlled the action throughout the first half, leading by as many as 12 points. A basket by Jake Kelly just before the buzzer gave Iowa a 29-22 advantage at the break.

Iowa increased its margin to 14 points on a jumper by Peterson with 12:35 to play. Penn State's rally was led by a 9-0 scoring run that was stopped by an Aaron Fuller lay-up at the 4:17 mark.

Iowa shot 47.8% from the field and 93.8% (15-16) from the foul line, but made just 4-17 (23.5%) three-point attempts. The four treys marked a season low through 20 games. Iowa also held a 28-27 rebounding advantage.

Kelly led Iowa in scoring with 19 points, matching his career scoring high. Fuller added a career-best 16 points and Peterson and Gatens each added nine. Palmer led Iowa with eight rebounds.

(21) MICHIGAN STATE 71, IOWA 56 January 29, 2009, Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Iowa City, IA

Michigan State scored the first eight points and never trailed in taking a 71-56 win in Iowa City. Iowa trailed by nine in the early going before back-to-back three-point baskets by Matt Gatens closed the deficit to 13-8. The Spartans led by six at the midway point in the half before pulling away to a 38-25 halftime advantage. MSU shot 50% from the field in the first half, compared to 40% for Iowa.

Michigan State started the second half with a 12-2 scoring run to open its biggest advantage of the game, 50-28 with 15 minutes remaining. Iowa kept battling, eventually closing the gap to nine points, 61-52, with six minutes remaining following a three-point basket by Jermain Davis. The Spartans responded with five straight points to seal the win.

Iowa shot just 42.3% from the field, including 30.8% (8-26) from three-point range. The Hawkeyes also shot just 44.4% (4-9) from the foul line, their lowest percentage of the season. Michigan State ended the game shooting 51.9% from the field, including 55.6% (5-9) from three-point range. The Spartans also held a 35-28 rebounding advantage, scored 14 fast break points and held a 28-22 scoring advantage in the paint.

Jeff Peterson led Iowa with 14 points and five assists. Matt Gatens added 13 points, four rebounds and three steals. Iowa's reserves scored 22 points, with Jarryd Cole scoring a season-high 10 points and Davis adding nine. Cole led Iowa with eight rebounds and Aaron Fuller had five.

Northwestern's zone defense forced the Hawkeyes into 30 three-point field goal attempts, matching a season high. Iowa made 14 treys and connected on just 2-10 field goal attempts from two-point range. Iowa did not make its first two point basket until just 14:55 remained in the game. The Hawkeyes connected on 16-18 (88.9%) free throw attempts, including 13-14 in the second half.

Iowa built an early 18-7 advantage by hitting 6-10 three-point shots, but Northwestern got back in the game and trailed just 24-21 at halftime. Iowa led throughout most of the second half before Northwestern converted a three-point play at the 1:29 mark for a 46-45 advantage. Bawinkel answered with his third trey of the game and Iowa led the rest of the way. Matt Gatens added four straight free throws before Peterson concluded the scoring with two free throws with five seconds to play.

Iowa held the Wildcats to 37.5% shooting overall, including just 26.9% (7-26) from three-point range.

Iowa was aided by the return of senior forward Cyrus Tate, who had missed the previous seven games due to an ankle injury. Tate contributed five rebounds and two points in 13 minutes.

Peterson led Iowa with 16 points, five assists, four steals and four rebounds in 40 minutes. Gatens battled through foul problems to add 13 points. Jake Kelly had eight points and a career-high six rebounds and Jarryd Cole added a game-high seven rebounds.

2008-09 Game Summaries

(25) WISCONSIN 69, IOWA 52 February 11, 2009, Kohl Center, Madison, WI

Wisconsin scored seven points in the last 23 seconds of the first half to take a 36-24 halftime advantage and the Badgers went on to a 69-52 win over Iowa in Madison.

Iowa trailed by just five, 24-29, in the final minute of the half when the Badgers got a steal and a lay-up. Wisconsin added two free throws following a technical foul and closed the half with a three-point shot just before the buzzer. The last 23 seconds erased an Iowa rally that saw the Hawkeyes cut a 27-17 deficit to three points, 27-24, with two minutes remaining in the half. Iowa was guilty of 10 turnovers in the first half, which Wisconsin turned into 22 points.

Wisconsin used an 8-3 scoring advantage in the opening four minutes of the second half to increase its advantage to 44-27. Iowa cut the deficit to 12 points with eight minutes to play, but could get no closer.

Wisconsin shot 53.1% from the field in reversing an overtime loss to the Hawkeyes in Iowa City. The Badgers added 7-12 (58.3%) three-point shots and held a 27-21 rebounding advantage. Iowa ended the contest with 14 turnovers, as Wisconsin held a 29-8 margin in points off turnovers and an 18-6 advantage in second chance points. The Hawkeyes shot 50% from the field.

Jake Kelly led Iowa with 17 points, hitting 7-9 field goal attempts. Jeff Peterson added 10 points before leaving the game midway through the second half with an injury. Jarryd Cole led Iowa with eight rebounds.
