SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

Northern Illinois finished the 2009 season 5-11-3 overall and 1-7-3 in the Mid-American Conference. The Huskies' leading scorer, Kelsey Passaglia, returns for her junior season after scoring three goals and recording one assist during her sophomore campaign.

At the helm for NIU is Carrie Barker. The Wisconsin graduate is entering her third season as head coach.

Central Michigan went 17-4-3 in 2009 under second-year head coach Tom Anagnost. The Chippewas recorded a near perfect 9-0-2 season in their Mid-American Conference regular season and conference championship bids, the first MAC championship in school history.
