CRAFT IN TOP 20 FOR COUSY AWARD

Sophomore Aaron Craft is among 20 candidates for the Bob Cousy Award after the list was trimmed from an initial pool of 60 candidates. The annual honor, named for Hall of Famer and former Boston Celtic Bob Cousy, recognizes the top point guards in college basketball. This current list of candidates will be narrowed down to a final 10 by Feb. 1 and final five by March 1. Craft currently leads the Buckeyes in assists (83) and steals (43).

THE BUCKEYES IN THE BIG TEN

The Buckeyes rank No. 2 in both scoring offense (78.1 ppg.) and scoring defense (55.4 ppg.) after a 14-2 overall start. Ohio State's scoring margin of 22.8 ppg. leads the league while the .495 field goal shooting percentage rates in the No. 2 spot. Led by Jared Sullinger, Ohio State is among the Top 2 teams in rebounding offense (37.7 rpg., No. 2) and rebounding defense (28.9 rpg., No. 1). Overall, the Buckeyes are No. 2 in rebound margin (+8.7 rpg.). Behind Aaron Craft, Ohio State is the leader in assists (17.2 apg.) and turnover margin (+6.4) on the year among Big Ten teams. The Buckeyes also have the highest attendance in the league with 15,657 attending on average this season.

100 YEARS IN BIG TEN

Ohio State celebrates 100 years as a member of the Big Ten Conference in men's basketball in 2012. The Buckeyes finished in the No. 6 spot in the 1913 conference standings, the first season of league play. Over the 99 previous seasons, Ohio State has earned 19 Big Ten regular-season titles with 23 NCAA tournament appearances, one national championship (1960) and nine trips to the Final Four. Eight former coaches and players are members

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BUCKEYES ACHIEVE 2ND PERFECT HOME SEASON UNDER MATTA

Thad Matta has won at least 15 home games in each of his seven seasons in Columbus. The 2006-07 squad finished with a perfect 18-0 record while the 2005-06 (16-1) and 2009-10 teams (17-1) squads each finished with a single loss at home. Matta is 131-10 overall in Columbus during his tenure after finishing the 2010-11 season 20-0 at home.

HOMECOURT ADVANTAGE

Since Thad Matta took over Buckeye program in 2004-05, Ohio State is 132-10 in Columbus, the most home wins among Big Ten schools. Over the last three seasons Ohio State is 50-1 in Columbus.

MATTA HAS BEST RECORD SINCE 2004-05

Since taking over the Ohio State program for the start of the 2004-05 season, Thad Matta has the Big Ten's best overall record with a winning percentage of 78 percent. He also has directed the Buckeyes to the most regular-season conference wins with 86 and most overall wins with 204.

OHIO STATE VS. IOWA

Iowa leads the all-time series with the Buckeyes 73-69. Ohio State has closed the gap of late with a six-game win streak, including three-consecutive victories in Iowa City and eight wins in the last 10 overall meetings with the Hawkeyes. All-time, Ohio State is 22-47 in games at Iowa. The matchup this year is the lone regular-season contest with the Hawkeyes. Ohio State enters the game ranked No. 6 nationally in the *Associated Press* Poll. Ohio State

is 21-10 all-time as a ranked team in the series. The Buckeyes have won the last six games in the series as a ranked team. Jared Sullinger is the leading scorer and rebounder for the Buckeyes in the Iowa series. He has averaged 25 points and 10.5 rebounds while connecting on 17 of 33 FGs (.515). William Buford averages 10.8 points in six career games vs. Iowa. He has made 12 of 14 foul shots (.857) against the Hawkeyes.

THOMAS NAMED BIG TEN PLAYER OF WEEK

Ohio State sophomore Deshaun Thomas made 17-consecutive shots from inside the 3-point line in games vs. South Carolina Upstate (Dec. 14) and at South Carolina (Dec. 17). He made his last six attempts against S.C. Upstate and then all 11 2-pointers in the road win at South Carolina. For the season he is shooting 63 percent from 2-point range (64-102). He was 19-21 from short range the week of Dec. 12 while shooting 74 percent overall (23-31), including a 13-16 shooting effort at South Carolina, where he tallied a career-high 30 points. He averaged 26.5 points in the two games. His efforts earned him the Big Ten Player of the Week honor. The last Ohio State player to earn the honor was Jon Diebler March 7, 2011. Thomas was named the league's freshman of the week once last season.

MATTA REACHES 300, 200 AT OSU

Thad Matta has a career record of 306-90 (396 career games) over 12 years as a head coach, which includes a 204-59 record in eight seasons at Ohio State. Matta coached for one season at Butler and

three at Xavier before taking over the Ohio State program for the 2004-05 season. In his time with the Buckeyes, Matta has four Big Ten regular season titles and three Big Ten tournament crowns. The Buckeyes have been to five NCAA tournaments with Matta at the helm. He has taken nine teams to NCAA tournament play and won the 2008 National Invitational Tournament with Ohio State.

THE THIRD TO 200 AS A BUCKEYE

Two previous coaches have reached the 200-win plateau at Ohio State. Thad Matta became the third with the 74-66 win at South Carolina Dec. 17. Fred Taylor recorded 297 career victories from 1959-1976 while also earning 158 Big Ten Conference regularseason victories. Harold G. Olsen tallied 259 all-time wins from 1923-46. He accumulated 154 Big Ten victories. Matta has 204 wins as a Buckeye over eight seasons with 87 wins in Big Ten regular-season play. His winning percentage of 77.6 overall and 70.5 in conference play are tops among the 13 head coaches in Ohio State history.

LAST TIME VS. IOWA

David Lighty scored 18 points and Ohio State defeated Iowa in Columbus 70-48 in the first game as the No. 1 team in the AP poll last year (1/19/11). William Buford had 15 points and Jared Sullinger added 13 for the Buckeyes. Andrew Brommer had 12 points and Bryce Cartwright added 10 for Iowa. Up 40-23 at halftime, the Buckeyes reeled off seven of the first nine points of the second half to push the lead to 22. The Ohio State attack was spread out, with four players with four assists. Aaron Craft set an Ohio State freshman record with seven steals, tying for the second-most at the school behind Troy Taylor's eight against Saint Joseph's in 1983. Dallas Lauderdale set the tone early for the Buckeyes. He had seven points in the opening 5:37 as Ohio State opened a 12-4 lead. After that, the Buckeyes got going in transition. Buford, who had 11 points in the first half, and Lighty, who added eight, hurried the ball down the court or whipped it around the perimeter for baskets. In the last meeting in Iowa City, Jared Sullinger had 24 points and 12 rebounds and No. 2 Ohio State rallied to overtake Iowa 73-68. Jon Diebler added 14 points for the Buckeyes. Iowa cut Ohio State's 13-point lead to 71-68 on Zach McCabe's 3-pointer with 24 seconds left. But Aaron Craft made two free throws and forced a turnover to secure the win. Ohio State had some trouble early with Iowa and trailed 35-29 at halftime. But the

MATTA'S BUCKEYES ON 35-GAME HOME WIN STREAK

The Buckeyes have won the last 35 games at home dating back to a 66-55 victory over Michigan Feb. 27, 2010 through the most recent win over Nebraska Jan. 3 (71-40). The current streak is the second longest in Ohio State history. Legendary head coach Fred Taylor guided the Buckeyes to 50-consecutive victories from 1960-64 at St. John Arena. Randy Ayers put together a 30-game home streak from 1990-1992. Harold Olsen and William Dye combined to win 20-consecutive victories over the 1944-47 seasons. Thad Matta has three home winning streaks of 17 games or more at Ohio State.

ROSS RETURNS TO OHIO STATE ROSTER

LaQuinton Ross, a 6-foot-8-inch freshman forward from Jackson, Miss., was been added to the Ohio Stare roster for the remainder of his freshman season. Ross attended classes and worked out with the Buckeyes over the summer before leaving the team just prior to the start of official practice in October to work on meeting NCAA academic qualification requirements. He met those requirements and joined the team Dec. 11. He officially became eligible Dec. 9. He dressed for the first time in his No. 10 Ohio State uniform vs. South Carolina Upstate. His first game action came against Miami (Ohio) at Nationwide Arena Dec. 22. He knocked down his first career field goal attempt, a 3-pointer, and finished with 5 points in four minutes of court time.

NCAA STATS UPDATE (AS OF 1/1/12)

Ohio State rates among the Top 10 in several NCAA statistical categories after 15 games. The Buckeyes are No. 3 in scoring margin (+22.8 ppg.), No. 3 in turnover margin (+6.3), No. 5 in assist/turnover ratio (+1.5) and No. 8 in assists per game (17.2). Aaron Craft is No. 8 in steals per game (2.7 spg.). The Buckeyes have the third longest home win streak in the country at 35. Kentucky (44, next vs. South Carolina Jan. 7) and Duke (43, Virginia Jan. 12) are lead the nation.

OHIO STATE MOVE TO NO. 6

Ohio State dropped to No. 6 in the Associated Press poll released Jan. 2. The Buckeyes are 17-8 all-time as the No. 6-ranked team in the AP poll and 34-30 when both teams are ranked in the Top 15 after the loss to No. 13 Kansas. In the most recent poll seven Buckeyes' opponents are among the Top 25.

BUFORD 17TH TO REACH 1,500 CAREER PTS.

With 23 points against VMI Nov. 23, senior William Buford surpassed 1,500 career points to become the 17th Buckeye in history to reach that mark. Over 122 career games, Buford has averaged 13.8 points for a total of 1,678. He also became the 16th player all-time to reach both 1,500 points and the 500-rebound mark (541) with five boards vs. Duke Nov. 29.

SULLINGER MOVING UP CAREER DOUBLE-DOUBLE CHARTS

Sophomore Jared Sullinger has recorded at least 10 points and 10 rebounds in three of the last five games he has played for a career total of 26. He tied the Ohio State freshman record with 18 double-doubles a season ago. His career total is 13th all-time. Evan Turner was the most recent Buckeye to reach 20 or more career double-doubles with 27 from 2008-10. That total is tied for No. 11 all-time with John Havlicek (1960-62). Through 14 games, Sullinger is averaging 16.7 points and 9.7 rebounds a game. He tallied 17.2 points and 10.2 rebounds a game as a freshman.

BUCKEYES OPENED WITH EIGHT AT HOME

The Buckeyes played the last of their first eight games at home, the longest streak of home games to start a season since the 1909-10 team began the campaign with 10-consecutive games in Columbus, vs. UTPA Dec. 3. That run was the longest to start a season since the opening of Value City Arena for the 1998-99 season. The Buckeyes opened with six at home (6-0) in 2006-07 at VCA and seven games (5-2) at St. John Arena in 1997-98. The Buckeyes made their first road trip of the season this year to Kansas Dec. 10.

NOTING THE NEBRASKA GAME (JAN. 3)

• The win vs. Nebraska was the 35th-consecutive victory at home for Ohio State dating back to the game vs. Michigan on Feb. 27, 2010. The streak is the third-longest in the country behind Duke and Kentucky.

• The 35-consecutive home game win streak is the second-longest in Ohio State history. The Buckeyes won 50 in a row from 12/1/59 - 12/11/64.

MATTA EXTENDS STREAK VS. **NON-CONFERENCE FOES**

Thad Matta has directed Ohio State to at least 10 wins during non-conference play in each of his eight seasons in Columbus. Matta is 104-19 vs. non-conference competition at Ohio State and 100-40 vs. Big Ten foes (regular season and Big Ten tournament games) for an overall record of 203-59. In 12 seasons as a head coach (1 at Butler, 3 at Xavier and 8 at Ohio State) Matta is 104-42 vs. the Big Ten. He has winning records vs. 10 league teams (10-3 vs. ILL, 9-6 vs. IND, 9-4 vs. IOWA, 14-2 vs. MICH, 8-5 vs. MINN, 12-1 vs. NW, 15-0 vs. PSU, 11-6 vs. PUR, 7-6 vs. Michigan State, 1-0 vs. Nebraska and is 8-9 vs. Wisconsin

MATTA OWNS TOP WIN PERCENTAGE AMONG OHIO STATE COACHES

Thad Matta, now in his eighth season as head coach of the Buckeyes, has an overall win percentage of 77.6 (204-59) at Ohio State. That winning mean is the highest among the 11 head coaches in the history of the Ohio State men's basketball program with three or more seasons on the sidelines. Matta's 87-36 (123 games) record in Big Ten regular-season play (.707) also has produced the highest winning pct. in conference play among any previous Ohio State coach. Fred Taylor (1959-76) is second in both overall win percentage (.653/297-158) and Big Ten win percentage (.608/158-102) in 18 seasons.

OHIO STATE STREAKS

• The game between Ohio State and Nebraska was the first meeting between the two schools as members of the Big Ten.

• The Buckeyes move to 5-2 all-time vs. Nebraska, having now won the previous four meetings. The last meeting took place 3/20/89 in the second round of the NIT tournament, with Ohio State winning 85-74.

• As a ranked team, the Buckeyes are 2-0 vs. the Cornhuskers.

• Ohio State moves to 726-663 overall in the Big Ten. They are 35-6 in their last 43 Big Ten matchups, dating back to 3/8/09.

• The last time Ohio State defeated two Big Ten teams by 25 or more points in the same season was the 2009-10 season. Ohio State defeated Indiana 79-54 (1/6/10) and Minnesota 90-61 (3/14/10) in the Big Ten tournament final. The Buckeyes previously defeated Northwestern 87-54 (12/28/11).

• The last time the Buckeyes defeated two Big Ten teams by 30 or more points in the same season was during the 1960-61 season, where Ohio State beat Northwestern 79-45, Purdue 92-62, Wisconsin 100-68 and Indiana 100-65.

 Ohio State has won 107 of its last 108 games against unranked opponents in Columbus, including 56 in a row, the longest active streak in the nation.

• The Buckeyes own a 116-2 record vs. unranked opponents at home since the 2004-05 season.

• Ohio State is 51-1 in its last 52 games at Value City Arena, dating back to Feb. 24, 2009.

• The Buckeyes have now won by double figures in 12 of their 14 victories this year. Eleven of their wins have been by 22 or more points. Ohio State's 22.2 average margin of victory is No. 3 nationally.

• As a ranked team, Ohio State is 409-110 overall and when ranked in the AP Top 10, the Buckeyes are 288-61.

• As the *AP* No. 6 ranked team in the nation, Ohio State moves to 17-8 overall.

• In their last 69 games, the Buckeyes are 62-7.

• Since the start of the 2008-09 season, Ohio State has accumulated 96 victories, which is the fifth-most during that period (Duke-108, Kansas-105, Syracuse-100, Kentucky-100, Ohio State-99, UNC-96).

• This is the 278th-consecutive game Ohio State has made at least one 3-point field goal (1/10/04 vs. Penn State was the last game with zero made).

• Three players scored in double figures for Ohio State. So far this season, seven Buckeyes have scored in doubles figures a total of 52 times.

• The starting lineup of Buford, Craft, Smith, Jr., Sullinger and Thomas is 12-1 this season.

• Ohio State has had a player record a doubledouble in 832 games. The Buckeyes are 573-259 in those contests (.688). Jared Sullinger had a doubledouble (19 points, 12 rebounds) vs. Nebraska, the 26th of his career.

• The Buckeyes outshot Nebraska from the freethrow line 13-6. On the year, Ohio State is +128 (+8.1 per game) in free throw attempts.

• The Buckeyes had 11 team assists vs. Nebraska. They are averaging 17.6 apg, which places them No. 8 in the country.

SULLINGER CLOSING ON 1,000 POINT CLUB

Jerry Lucas reached the 1,000 point total in just 38 games. It took Michael Redd 49 contests. Jared Sullinger has played in 51 games to date with 864 points to his credit for an average of 16.9 a game. Only six players in history have reached 1,000 career points in fewer than 60 games played. Sullinger needs to average just under 16 points a game over the first 23 games of the 2011-12 season to become the seventh Buckeye to accomplish the feat.

MATTA JOINS SELECT BIG TEN GROUP

Ohio State clinched its fourth Big Ten title in the last six years under the direction of Thad Matta after the win at Penn State March 1, 2011. The Buckeyes have 19 Big Ten titles in history (1925-33-39-44-46-50-60-61-62-63-64-68-71-91-92-06-07-10-11) with 13 of those being outright titles (1925-39-44-46-50-60-61-62-71-92-06-07-11). Matta is one of five coaches in the history of the Big Ten to win four league regular-season championships over the first seven seasons as coach of the Big Ten school.

• The 21 rebounds allowed by Ohio State are the second fewest given up this season (20 at South Carolina, 12/17/11).

• The win vs. Nebraska was Thad Matta's 204th win at Ohio State and his 100th Big Ten victory since beginning his Ohio State career.

• Matta's career record improves to 306-90 overall and 204-59 at Ohio State.

• With the win, Matta moves to 104-42 vs. the Big Ten during his 12-year career. It was Matta's first meeting with Nebraska.

• Matta's .778 winning percentage at Ohio State is the best among Big Ten coaches since Matta became the Buckeyes' head coach in 2004.

• Ohio State is now 154-23 overall at Value City Arena and 124-10 under Matta.

• Matta is now 171-20 overall vs. unranked teams and 116-2 in Columbus.

• Ohio State is 42-19 in January under Coach Matta.

• The Scarlet and Gray are 123-18 when grabbing more rebounds than the opponent, including 11-1 this season (OSU outrebounded Nebraska 44-21).

• When shooting a better percentage than the opponent, Ohio State moves to 181-19 under Matta, including 14-1 this season.

• When shooting 50 percent or better from the field, Ohio State is 6-0 this season and 100-7 under Matta.

• The Buckeyes are 171-20 overall and 13-0 this season when leading at the half.

• Ohio State is 189-5 under Matta when leading with five minutes to play, including 14-0 this year.

• Ohio State is 12-1 this season and 140-12 when scoring 70 or more points in a game under Matta. The Buckeyes had 71 points in the win over Nebraska.

• The start was William Buford's 114th donning the Scarlet and Gray, tying Herb Williams for eighth place in career games started at Ohio State.

• Buford is just the fourth Buckeye in recorded history to reach 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists. Buford's current totals are 1,678/541/314.

Buford scored 13 points for the Buckeyes, improving his career total to 1,678, which is eighth all-time in Ohio State career scoring. He is 78 points behind Jay Burson (1,756) for seventh place.
Buford has scored in double figures 13 times this season.

• Buford had five rebounds to push his career total to 541. He is one of 17 former Buckeyes in the prestigious 1,500 point and 500 rebound club.

• Buford had four assists. He now has 57 this season and 314 for his career.

• Buford finished 1-1 from the free-throw line and has made 26-consecutive shots from the stripe. He posts a career free-throw percentage of 81 percent.

• Buford is on pace to become the fifth player in Ohio State history to join the 400 (made field goals) and 4,000 (minutes played) Club. After the Nebraska win, Buford has now tallied 633 made field goals and 3,911 minutes played in 121 career games (J. Diebler, D. Lighty, J. Butler and H. Williams are the other Buckeyes to achieve this feat).



• Jared Sullinger had 19 points for the Buckeyes. It is the 13th time this season and 47th time in his career he has scored in double figures.

• Sullinger had 12 rebounds, pushing his career total to 513.

• With 19 points and 12 rebounds, Sullinger earned his eighth double-double of the season and 26th of his career. It was his 13th double-double vs. a Big Ten opponent.

• Sullinger's had the same number of offensive rebounds as the entire Nebraska team with six.

• Deshaun Thomas finished with 15 points. It is the 25th time in his career he has scored in double figures.

• Thomas has scored in double figures in 14 of his last 15 games played. The 14 times this season are a team high.

• Thomas had four rebounds. He needs four to reach 200 for his career.

• Aaron Craft had three steals. He has 116 for his career. He has had at least one steal in all 13 games this season. He has had at least three steals or more in nine games this season.

• Craft had four assists to push his season total to 93 and his career total to 259. He has had at least three in every game this season and eight games with five or more.

BUCKEYES WIN GLOBAL SPORTS EVENT

The first four games of the regular season made up the Global Sports Shootout on the Ohio State schedule. Home games vs. Wright State (W 73-43, Nov. 11), Florida (W 81-74, Nov. 15), Jackson State (W 85-41, Nov. 15) and North Florida (W 85-50, Nov. 21) made up the event. Ohio State won a similar event a year ago with a 4-0 record beating North Carolina A&T, Florida on the road, UNC Wilmington and Morehead State in the Global Sports Invitational.

MATTA LOOKS FOR ANOTHER 20-WIN SEASON

Only Mark Few, among active coaches, has more consecutive 20-win seasons to start a career (12). Matta set the Ohio State record for consecutive 20-win campaigns in 2008-09 with a 22-11 record and extended it with a 34-3 campaign in 2010-11, the seventh-consecutive Ohio State season with 20+ victories. The previous record was four held by the 1960-63 teams under legendary head coach Fred Taylor. Matta also has won at least 10 Big Ten regular-season games in each of the last six seasons. That effort eclipsed Taylor's mark of 10+ league wins in each of the seasons from 1960-64. Those were during 14-game regular-season slates. The Big Ten played a 16-game schedule in Matta's first three seasons (8, 12, 15 league wins) and an 18-game schedule the last four (10, 10, 14, 16). Ohio State also is the two-time defending Big Ten regular-season champion. The last time the Buckeyes won three or more consecutive titles was from 1960-64, a string of five-consecutive conference crowns.

BUCKEYES SET RECORD FOR HOME WINS

Ohio State finished 20-0 at home after its win vs. Wisconsin March 6, 2011. The win total set the school record for home wins and a Value City Arena record with a 19-0 record. The 2006-07 squad previously set the VCA record with 18 wins in a season. The Buckeyes played one game last year at St. John Arena. Ohio State currently is on a 34-game home win streak, tied for the second-longest home win streak in school history. The Buckeyes again have 20 scheduled home games in 2011-12 with 19 played at VCA and one at Nationwide Arena (Dec. 22 vs. Miami (Ohio)). The game at Nationwide satisfies an NCAA requirement for the host school

Senior William Buford has scored 633 career field goals and logged 3,911 career minutes in 122 games. He is on pace to join a small group of former Buckeyes with more than 400 field goals and 4,000 minutes played. David Lighty was added to an exclusive club following the game vs. Illinois Jan. 22, 2011. The former Buckeye reached 4,000 minutes played with more than 400 field goals in the Illinois win in Champaign. Lighty made 516 career field goals and logged 4,582 career minutes during his 157-game career. Lighty's classmate Jon Diebler had 473 made baskets (374 of which are 3s) while playing a total of 4,687 minutes in 144 games. He reached 400/4,000 with a triple and 36 minutes vs. Iowa Jan. 19.

Herb Williams and Jamar Butler also logged 4,000+ minutes at Ohio State. Williams made 834 career field goals over 114 games and 4,216 minutes. Butler connected on 420 FGs (242 3FGs) over 139 games and 4,213 minutes played.

BUFORD JOINS TURNER, JACKSON, LIGHTY

Evan Turner (1,517 pts., 682 rebs., 414 asts.) became just the second player in recorded history to reach 1,000 points, 500 rebounds and 300 assists with eight helpers vs. Northwestern Jan. 19, 2010. Jim Jackson was the only other Buckeye to do so with 1,785 career points, 552 career rebounds and 372 career assists from 1990-92. David Lighty joined the duo last season. He finished with 1,458 points, 577 rebounds and 374 assists to his credit. Only 22 players in Ohio State history have scored more than 1,000 points and collected 500+ rebounds. Lighty was added to the list with five rebounds vs. Iowa Jan. 19. William Buford currently has 1,678 points, 541 rebounds and 314 assists. He handed out four assists vs. Miami (Ohio) to join the quartet.

DOUBLE DIGIT 3S

Ohio State has made 10 or more 3-pointers in a game 79 times since the shot was instituted for the 1986-87 season. The Buckeyes are 68-11 in those games after knocking down 10-of-20 treys vs. Northwestern Dec. 28. Opponents have made double-digit 3s 91 times and are 36-55 in those games vs. the Buckeyes. Matta's Ohio State teams are 53-9 when making 10



or more 3s in a game. Opponents are 8-29 against Matta-coached teams when making 10 or more treys.

BUFORD ON PRESEASON LIST FOR 2012 LOWE'S SENIOR CLASS AWARD

Senior William Buford follows David Lighty (2011) as a candidate for the Lowe's Senior CLASS Award in 2012. Lighty was among the Top 10 finalists a year ago. Buford is one of 30 senior men's college basketball student-athletes on the 2012 preseason list. The field will be narrowed to 10 finalists midway through the 2011-12 regular season. The finalists, recognized for excellence in community, classroom, character and competition, will travel to the 2012 Final Four in New Orleans, where the winner will be announced.

SULLINGER EARNS ALL-AMERICA HONORS

The Associated Press is the latest (Oct. 31) to select Ohio State sophomore Jared Sullinger as a 2011-12 preseason first team All-American. The Columbus, Ohio, native was a 2011 All-American as well after averaging 17 points and 10 rebounds as a rookie. Those numbers helped earn Sullinger the 2011 National Freshman of the Year award following Ohio State's 34-3 overall record a year ago.

BIG TEN MEDIA PICK BUCKEYES, SULLINGER

Ohio State was picked as the preseason favorite to win the league regular-season title by a vote of the conference media (Oct. 27). Sophomore Jared Sullinger also was tabbed as the favorite to earn conference player-of-the-year accolades. He also was selected to represent Ohio State on the preseason all-conference squad. Ohio State has won back-to-back league titles and is in position to win a third-consecutive title for the first time since the Buckeyes won five-consecutive titles from 1960-64. The last Buckeye to enter the season as the player of the year selection was guard Scoonie Penn before the 1999-2000 campaign.

JENT RETURNS TO OHIO STATE SIDELINE

Chris Jent left the professional ranks to return to his alma mater as an assistant basketball coach. Jent, who played and coached at the NBA level, played for the Buckeyes from 1988-92 and coached most recently for the Cleveland Cavaliers. As an Ohio State player, he helped the Buckeyes to back-to-back Big Ten titles and three-consecutive appearances in the NCAA tournament. He spent 10 seasons in the professional ranks overseas, in the CBA and NBA. He was an assistant and interim head coach with the Orlando Magic before most recently coaching with the Cavaliers.

2011-12 SCHEDULE AMONG BEST NATIONALLY

Several Ohio State non-conference games have garnered national attention this season there is more to come in the always rugged Big Ten slate of 18 regular-season contests. Ohio State faced Florida (W 81-74, 11/15/11) and Duke (W 85-63, 11/29/11) at Value City Arena with key non-league games at Kansas (L 78-67, 12/10/11) and South Carolina (W 74-66, 12/17/11). With the addition of Nebraska to the conference schedule, league teams will play seven foes twice and four teams once during regular-season play. Ohio State plays host to Penn State and Purdue and will travel to Iowa and Minnesota. The rest of the league will compete against the Buckeyes both home and away.

BUFORD WORKING ON RECORD SEASON

William Buford is the lone senior on the Ohio State roster this season. In fact, he is just one of two upperclassmen and the only player with more than a year of experience in an Ohio State uniform. After transfer Evan Ravenel, who transferred to Ohio State from Boston College and sat out the 2010-11 campaign, there are 11 freshmen (5) and sophomores (6) on the Ohio State roster. Buford has 1,678 career points over 122 career games (13.8 ppg.). Dennis Hopson (1984-87) is the all-time leading scorer in Ohio State history with 2,096 points over 125 career games played (16.8 ppg.). Buford is currently No. 8 spot on the Ohio State all-time scoring list.

PAULUS LEAVES NAVY TO WORK FOR MATTA

Greg Paulus, who served as an assistant coach at Navy during the 2010-11 season, joined the Buckeyes last May to handle the program's video needs. He replaced Kevin Kuwik, who left Thad Matta's staff to become an assistant coach at Dayton. Paulus played basketball at Duke from 2006-09 and then a year of football at Syracuse.

TITLES MOUNTING FOR MATTA, BUCKEYES

Thad Matta's teams have won four Big Ten regularseason titles and three league tournament crowns during his seven-year tenure at Ohio State. Ohio State has won each of the last two regular-season and tournament titles. The Buckeyes have not posted three-consecutive Big Ten Conference crowns since winning a conference record five-consecutive titles from 1960-64 under the direction of head coach Fred Taylor. Taylor led Ohio State to seven league championships from 1959-76. Harold G. Olson win five Big Ten titles as coach between 1923-46.

BUCKEYES RETURN PLENTY

Despite the loss of three senior starters, the Buckeyes return the majority of the offensive production from a year ago. Seven 2010-11 letterwinners return nearly 63 percent of the team's points (1,783 of 2,854), rebounds (805 of 1,277), assists 370 of 587 and steals (169 of 263) entering this season. Five incoming freshmen along with increased roles of the returning Buckeyes will attempt to make up for the losses of David Lighty (12.1 ppg.), Jon Diebler (12.6 ppg.) and Dallas Lauderdale (4.2 ppg, 54 total blocks). Four of the top six offensive players return in Jared Sullinger (17.2 ppg.), William Buford (14.4 ppg.), Deshaun Thomas (7.5 ppg.) and Aaron Craft (6.9 ppg.). Sullinger added 10.2 rebounds a game while Buford tallied 61 3-pointers while making 84 percent of his foul shots (59-70). Craft led the team in assists (177) and steals (73). Thomas was solid off the bench a year ago and is expected to have an increased role both offensively and defensively this year.

SCOTT, WILLIAMS ADD TO OHIO STATE'S 17-PLAYER MCDONALD'S LIST

Ohio State incoming freshmen Shannon Scott and Amir Williams were selected Feb. 10, 2011 to represent the East (Scott) and West (Williams) teams in the 2011 McDonald's All-America game. The game was played March 30 at the United Center in Chicago. Scott led both teams with five steals. The East won the game 111-96. Scott also had four points, two rebounds and two assists over 12 minutes. Williams had six points, three rebounds and a steal in 11 minutes for the West squad. The Buckeyes will have five All-America game participants on their roster in 2011-12 in Jared Sullinger (2010), Deshaun Thomas (2010), William Buford (2008), Scott and Williams. Four McDonald's All-Americans were a part of Ohio State's 2006-07 squad that finished 35-4 overall, 15-1 in Big Ten Conference play, won the league regular-season title outright and played for the NCAA national title vs. Florida in April of 2007. Ivan Harris (2003), Greg Oden (2006), Mike Conley Jr. (2006) and Daequan Cook (2006), all former McDonald's All-Americans, played for the Buckeyes in 2006-07. Previously, B.J. Mullens (2008), Kosta Koufos (2007), Clark Kellogg (1979), Perry Carter (1987), Treg Lee (1987), Jim Jackson (1989), Charles Macon (1992) and Greg Simpson (1992) all played for Ohio State after playing in the McDonald's All-America game before joining the Ohio State program, a total of 17 all-time.

FIVE MR. BASKETBALL HONOREES ON OHIO STATE ROSTER

Ohio State's contains four players who have combined to win five Mr. Basketball awards in their respective home states. Jared Sullinger leads the team with two Mr. Ohio Basketball accolades, achieving the distinction both in 2009 and 2010, while playing at Northland High School. Deshaun Thomas, a native Fort Wayne, Ind., and Bishop Luers High School, captured Mr. Indiana Basketball in 2010. Senior William Buford claimed 2008 Mr. Ohio Basketball with his performance at now-closed Libbey High School in Toledo. Freshman Shannon Scott brings the recognition of being named 2011 Mr. Georgia Basketball to Columbus after starring at Milton High School in Alpharetta, Ga. Freshman Amir Williams finished third in the 2011 Mr. Michigan Basketball voting.

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Game 1 No. 3 Ohio State 73, Wright State 42 Nov. 11, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Preseason All-America Jared Sullinger had 19 points and nine rebounds to lead Ohio State to a 73-42 victory over Wright State in the Global Sports Shootout. William Buford had nine of his 13 points to lead a second-half charge for the Buckeyes. Point guard Aaron Craft had 10 points and just one turnover in 28 minutes in the opener for both teams. A.J. Pacher had 13 points and Reggie Arcenaux added 11 for Wright State. Ohio State was 26 of 38 at the free-throw line compared to Wright State being 10 of 15. Up by 14 at halftime, the Buckeyes pulled away on field goals by Buford, Deshaun Thomas and Sullinger to push the lead to 40-20. Buford, the Buckeyes' second-leading scorer last season, added two more field goals in the 10-0 run. The lead hovered around 30 points for most of the second half as both teams emptied their benches. The Buckeyes led 34-20 at halftime with Sullinger picking up nine of his 13 points at the line. Wright State had 16 turnovers at halftime and finished with 25. Ohio State never trailed from the moment Craft hit a 3-pointer from the right corner to open the scoring. Ahead just 19-14 after the Raiders' John Balwigaire hit a 3-pointer at the 8:26 mark, the Buckeyes went on a 13-3 run over the next 6 minutes with Sullinger scoring six points. The loudest roar of the game from a crowd of 15,645 at Value City Arena came on a backdoor, alley-oop dunk by J.D. Weatherspoon off a pass from Buford.

Notes:

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• The Buckeyes are 91-18 in home openers and 87-22 in season openers all-time after defeating Wright State.

 Ohio State is now 3-0 vs. Wright State and is 55-11 all-time vs. members of the Horizon League. The most recent meeting between the Buckeyes and Raiders took place Dec. 16, 1992 in Columbus; a 76-55 Ohio State victory. Ohio State has faced all 10 current Horizon League members.

Game 2 No. 3 Ohio State 81, No. 7 Florida 74 Nov. 15, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-William Buford scored 21 points and No. 3 Ohio State weathered Florida's fast start to beat the seventh-ranked Gators 81-74. Jared Sullinger added 16 points, Deshaun Thomas had 15 and Aaron Craft 13 points and seven assists for the Buckeyes, who forced 16 turnovers and hit 27 of 34 free throws to pull away in the second half. Freshman Bradley Beal had 17 points, Kenny Boynton 15 and Patric Young and Erik Murphy 14 apiece for the Gators, who have never beaten a top-3 team in a true road game. Down as much as 16 points, they got as close as five with under a minute left before Buford sealed it with two foul shots. The game matched teams that won their conferences a year ago but were trying to replace three lost starters. By scoring 13 of 18 points at the end of the half, the Buckeyes took a 35-32 lead. With Sullinger controlling the lane, Buford scoring from both outside and inside, and Craft seeming to get a hand on every Florida pass and have a hand on every Ohio State assist, they pulled away. They scored the first five points of the half for an eight-point edge and never let the Gators cut into the lead. Still, Sullinger picked up his third foul with 13:58 left and soon after headed to the bench. With Evan Ravenel filling in and Buford and Craft setting the pace on offense, the Buckeyes didn't blink at the loss of their preseason All-American.

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Game 3 No. 3 Ohio State 85, Jackson State 41 Nov. 18, 2011, Columbus

COLUMBUS-Jared Sullinger had 20 points and 11 rebounds in little more than a half and No. 3-ranked Ohio State used an 18-0 blitz to roll to an 85-41 victory over Jackson State. Deshaun Thomas, William Buford and Jordan Sibert each had 11 points for the Buckeyes. All 12 players on the roster saw action, with 11 scoring and all 12 grabbing at least one rebound. Kelsey Howard scored 17 points for Jackson State, which had 26 turnovers. Down 11-10 in the first half, the Buckeyes scored the next 18 points and never looked back. The Tigers are being outscored by 36 points a game so far this season. The Buckeyes scored 32 of the first 45 points in the second half while substituting liberally. Sullinger had 16 points and 10 rebounds at the break as the Buckeyes built a 29-point lead. He finished 7 of 9 from the field and 6 of 7 at the line. The Tigers still led by a point after 6 minutes, but then the Buckeyes turned the game into a dunk-a-thon. With the Buckeyes picking up 23 points off of Jackson State's turnovers, they took control and never looked back to build a 46-17 lead at the half. The turning point was the 18-0 run covering a 5-minute span with Sullinger scoring nine points and Jordan Sibert adding five. Aaron Craft only had two points in the spurt, but the Buckeyes' guard forced five turnovers and had two assists. He finished with four assists, five steals and one bucket in 17 minutes, and helped turn the game into a rout.

Aaron Craft had 13 points and eight assists, Deshaun Thomas 11 points and J.D. Weatherspoon 10 points for the Buckeyes, who shot 68 percent from the field. Buford, the only senior on Ohio State's roster, had hit just 8 of 23 field-goal attempts in Ohio State's last two games and was shooting just 41.7 percent from the field on the season. He made 10 of 16 shots from the field, including both 3-point attempts and his only foul shot. Keith Gabriel led VMI with 21 points, with Ron Burks adding 19 and Stan Okoye 12. The Keydets were playing their first ranked opponent since a 107-69 loss to then-No. 4 Ohio State Nov. 10, 2006. That Buckeyes team went on to the national championship game before falling to defending NCAA champion Florida, 84-75. Buford had four points in Ohio State's 19-2 surge right after the break. Ohio State had just six turnovers and scored 24 points off of Valparaiso's 18 miscues. William Buford scored 20, Deshaun Thomas 18 and Aaron Craft17 for the Buckeyes. Craft also had eight assists and five rebounds for the Buckeyes, who built a double-digit lead in the first half and were never really threatened the rest of the way. Sullinger left in the first half after getting kicked in the left foot, X-rays showed no fracture. Thomas hit 13 of 16 shots and surpassed his previous high of 24 points set last season against North Carolina A&T. William Buford added 17 points for Ohio State. Malik Cooke led South Carolina with 21 points. Matta, in his ninth season with Ohio State, became just the third coach in school history to reach 200 wins, joining Fred Taylor (279 wins 1959-76) and Harold G. Olsen (254 from 1923-46). COLUMBUS-Jared Sullinger bounced back from his latest injury to score 18 points and grab 11 rebounds, leading No. 2 Ohio State past Lamar 70-50. Deshaun Thomas, chosen as the Big Ten's player of the week, added 16 points for the Buckeyes. Devon Lamb and Stan Brown each had 10 points for Lamar. The win was Ohio State's 32nd straight at home, extending the second-longest streak in school history. Lamar coach Pat Knight's father, Hall of Fame coach Bob Knight, was honored at halftime with an alumni award. A 1962 graduate of Ohio State, he was a member of the 1960 team that won the school's only national championship. The Buckeyes trailed just once, 4-3, and slowly took over the game. A 3-pointer by Lenzelle Smith Jr. made it 6-4 and touched off an 11-2 run that put the Buckeyes in command to stay. Thomas hit a 3 from the left corner late in the half to give Ohio State a 34-21 lead. They maintained a double-figure lead the rest of the way while mixing in subs. Aaron Craft had his usual all-around game for Ohio State with four points, six assists and three steals. The Buckeyes improved to 77-2 against nonconference opponents in Columbus in coach Thad Matta's tenure. Bob Knight received a University Ambassador Medal, presented by the president and CEO of Ohio State's alumni association, two-time Heisman Trophy winner Archie Griffin.

Deshaun Thomas added 15 points and Jared Sullinger 11 for the Buckeyes, who won their 33rd straight at home. The game was played at Nationwide Arena, home of the NHL's Blue Jackets. The building will host second- and third-round NCAA tournament games in March. Julian Mavunga led the RedHawks with 19 points and 10 rebounds. Craft had just four points but set the tempo at both ends with eight assists, two steals, three rebounds and several other plays that led to points. The Buckeyes ran off the first 11 points and never trailed. BLOOMINGTON -- Victor Oladipo scored the go-ahead basket on a fast-break layup with 36 seconds left and Indiana defeated No. 2 Ohio State 74-70, the first time Indiana has defeated the nation's top two teams in the same season. The Hoosiers forced 17 turnovers and, even with Cody Zeller sitting out with foul trouble, somehow managed to outscore the bigger Buckeyes 38-34 in the paint. Aaron Craft led the Buckeyes with 16 points. Jared Sullinger had 15 points and nine rebounds, and William Buford finished with eight points but missed a possible go-ahead 3-pointer with about 5 seconds to play. Ohio State, which spent most of the game in foul trouble, never really looked like itself. Sullinger, Buford and Deshaun Thomas combined to play only 29 minutes in the first half after each picked up their second fouls. Buford picked up two more in the first 3:32 of the second half, and Thomas picked up his third with 17:21 left in the game. That forced coach Thad Matta to mix-and-match his rotations in hopes of keeping a five-game winning streak alive Jordan Hulls who had 17 points and Verdell Jones, who had 14 points, just wouldn't let Ohio State pull away. When the Buckeyes rallied from a 33-32 halftime deficit to take a 44-41 lead, it looked like they might get rolling. Instead, the Hoosiers fought back. And when Lenzelle Smith Jr. made Ohio State's first 3-pointer of the game, to give the Buckeyes a 51-47 lead with 10:39 to go, Indiana answered with four straight points to tie it.

Deshaun Thomas added 15 points and William Buford had 13 for the Buckeyes, who won their 35th consecutive home game. Toney McCray had 13 points and Bo Spencer 10 for Nebraska, which was playing its first Big Ten road game. The Cornhuskers were outrebounded 44-21 and had more turnovers (17) than field goals (16). Spencer came in leading the Cornhuskers in scoring at 15.1 points a game. Already up big at the break, Ohio State flexed its muscles in the opening minutes of the second half before coach Thad Matta emptied his bench. In the opening 2 minutes, Sullinger was fouled while releasing a 15-foot baseline jumper - and it went in.
