

Head Coach, LISA BLUDER

University of Iowa Head Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder cannot be solely defined by the praises usually reserved for a successful basketball coach. Yes, Bluder has lead the Hawkeves to numerous winning seasons with six post-season tournament appearances, has been named National College Coach of the Year in 2001 by Women's Basketball News Service, and is the most senior head coach within Big Ten Women's Basketball. However, Coach Bluder also sets a great example as an advocate for women's athletics, humanitarian for the community, teacher, mentor, friend, mother, and leader.

One of the most respected and admired coaches in collegiate basketball, Lisa Bluder is in her eighth season as head women's basketball coach at the University of Iowa. Under Bluder's direction, the Hawkeyes have advanced to six post-season appearances (4 NCAA and 2 WNIT), and two-time Big Ten Tournament Champions. Her 127 wins at Iowa are the second-most of any Hawkeye women's basketball coach. Last season, Coach Bluder reached three large milestones: coaching in her 700th career game, her 200th on the Iowa sidelines, and garnering her 300th DI victory. Coach Bluder also has international experience as an assistant coach for Team USA at the 2001 World University Games in Beijing, China, where Team USA took home the gold medal.

Associate Head Coach, JAN JENSEN

Jan Jensen is in her eighth season with the Iowa Hawkeves and nineteenth as a collegiate player and coach. A nationally known presence on the recruiting scene, Jensen serves as the recruiting coordinator and also works with the post players. As a player in her senior year, Jan led the nation in scoring with 29.6 ppg, was the Gateway Conference Most Valuable Player, a Kodak Honorable Mention All-American, a member of the All-Gateway team and the GTE Academic All-American Player of the Year. In March 2007, Jensen was named the United Way of Johnson County Volunteer of the Year for her leadership of the Emerging Philanthropists Society and the Healthy Kids School-based Clinics Initiative.

Assistant Coach, JENNI FITZGERALD

Jenni Fitzgerald is also in her eighth season as an assistant coach at Iowa. Fitzgerald is responsible for coaching the perimeter players for the Hawkeyes. Fitzgerald was the starting point guard for the Drake

Bulldogs from 1986-1991. As a senior, Fitzgerald served as her team's captain and was named to the All-Gateway Conference First-Team. Under Fitzgerald's coaching, Iowa's perimeter players had an outstanding 2006-07 season, breaking twelve school records. This past year, the Hawkeyes ranked second in the country in 3-point field goal percentage and fifth in free throw percentage.

Assistant Coach, SHANNON GAGE

Shannon Gage is in her first year as an assistant coach at Iowa. She has served as an assistant coach at the University of Michigan for two years prior to returning to the Hawkeyes' Coaching Staff, where she held the role of Director of Basketball Operations from 2003 to 2005. Coach Gage is responsible for wing player development and off-campus recruiting. Gage was a four-year letter winner (1995-98) and team captain at Southwest Missouri State (now Missouri State). As a player, Gage was part of three Missouri Valley Conference championship teams and three NCAA Tournament teams.
