- The Hawkeyes play Nebraska-Omaha in a three-game series at Eck Stadium in Wichita, Kan. The series was initially slated to take place at Duane Banks Field in Iowa City, but was moved because of weather and field conditions.
- Game times are set for 1 p.m. (CT) on Saturday and Sunday, and 10 a.m. Monday.

### THE SERIES

The Hawkeyes are 4-1 all-time against Nebraska-Omaha. lowa won the first four meetings between the teams before falling to the Mavericks, 3-1, last season at Duane Banks Field.

### **SCOUTING NEBRASKA-OMAHA**

UNO brings a 2-7 overall record into the series after splitting a pair of games at Minnesota. The Mavs lost the opener, 6-1, before rallying for a 10-9 victory March 13. UNO started the season 0-6 before downing North Dakota, 13-2, for its first win March 9.

The Mavericks are batting .273 as a team with 18 extra base hits and 29 RBIs. Four UNO players are hitting above .300 with Clayton Taylor leading the team with a .600 batting average (9-of-15) with five runs and two RBIs. Caleb Palensky has a team-best six RBIs, but is batting just .125.

UNO's pitching staff has a 5.01 ERA over 79 innings, allowing 46 runs (44 earned) on 78 hits. Tyler Fox is 1-0 with a 0.90 ERA in a pair of starts, allowing two runs on five hits with seven strikeouts. Steven Schoonover is 1-0 with a spotless ERA in two appearances. He was credited with the win over Minnesota

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31.

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at lowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in lowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. lowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. lowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. Iowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his lowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. Iowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

UNO is led by 14th-year head coach Bob Herold. He is the third coach in the 60-year history of the program and has 422 career victories.

### **CHANGE IN SCHEDULE**

Due to the change in the Nebraska-Omaha series, the Hawkeyes will also move the date for its home opener against Coe College. lowa and the Kohawks will meet March 20 at 4:05 p.m. (CT) at Duane Banks Field. The game was originally slated to take place on March 19.

### DAHM COLLECTS 500TH WIN

lowa head coach Jack Dahm won his 500th career game as a collegiate coach in the Hawkeyes 7-3 triumph over Western Illinois on March 2.

Dahm, who is in his 20th season as a head coach, currently has 503 career victories, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 220 games at lowa, beginning in 2004. His 220 wins at lowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

### 1-RUN GAMES UNDER DAHM

During Jack Dahm's 10-year tenure at lowa, the Hawkeyes have played 123 one-run games. lowa is 57-66 in such contests. The Hawkeyes went 10-7 in one-run games in 2012, winning their final five.

### **EXTRA-INNINGS NO PROBLEM**

lowa is 2-0 in extra-inning games. The Hawkeyes downed New Mexico, 6-2, in 10 innings on Feb. 23 and defeated West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on March 10. The Hawkeyes went 2-2 in extrainning games in 2012.

# HAWKEYES SWEEP SNOWBIRD CLASSIC

The Hawkeyes posted a 3-0 record, defeating Maine, 9-2, on March 8, Georgetown, 7-2, on March 9, and West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on Sunday. It is the first time lowa has won three games at a three day tournament since sweeping three games at the Austin Peay Tournament in 2006.

Senior Matt Dermody and sophomores Sasha Kuebel and Nick Hibbing collected wins on the mound, while junior Taylor Zeutenhorst led the offense by hitting .556 (4-of-9) with a double, a triple, four runs, and three RBIs.

### **B1G WINS LEADER**

Senior pitcher Matt Dermody is tied for the Big Ten lead with three wins. Dermody is tied with Michigan State's David Garner. Dermody in 3-0 in four starts this season, picking up wins against Austin Peay (Feb. 16), Western Illinois (March 2), and Georgetown (March 9). The Norwalk, Iowa, native has thrown 26 innings, the seventh most among Big Ten pitchers, and ranks 12th in the conference with a 2.42 ERA.

### **TURNING 2**

The Hawkeyes rank fourth nationally in double plays per game at 1.38. lowa has turned 18 double plays in 13 games, which ranks 12th in the NCAA.

### **NOT ONE, BUT TWO**

Sophomore Eric Toole in the midst of a career-best hitting and reached base streaks. Toole hit safely in six straight games, going 8-for-20 (.400) over the stretch. Toole has reached safely in nine consecutive games, starting the streak Feb. 16 at Austin Peay. Toole missed the Snowbird Classic due to illness.

### **10 AND COUNTING**

Sophomore Taylor Kaufman has reached base in 10 straight games, setting a new career-best. The streak started Feb. 17 at Austin Peay, and included a career-high four game hitting streak.

### FIGURING IT OUT

After struggling in his first seven games of the season, freshman Blake Hickman has started to figure out collegiate hitting in his last five games. Hickman batted .095 (2-for-21) in his first seven games, before going on a season-best five-game hitting streak in which he hit .389 (7-for-18) and raised his batting average by 136 points. The Chicago native has posted the first two RBIs, two multi-hit games, and two doubles of his Hawkeye career over the five games. Hickman's biggest hit of the streak came in the top of the 12th inning against West Virginia on March 10, as he singled to score the game-winning run.

### **ZEUTENHORST STARS AT SNOWBIRD CLASSIC**

Junior Taylor Zeutenhorst hit .556 (5-of-9) to go along with a .714 on-base percentage, a .889 slugging percentage and a 1.603 OPS at the Snowbird Classic on March 8-10. The outfielder also scored four runs and had three RBIs.

Zeutenhorst scored a run and had two walks and a hit-by-pitch in a 9-2 victory over Maine on March 8, before going 1-for-4 with one run, two RBIs and a steal against Georgetown on March 9.

Zeutenhorst closed out the weekend with a career-game in lowa's 6-4, 12-innning victory over West Virginia on March 10. He had a career-best four hits (4-of-4) while matching a career-high with two runs. Among his hits were a double and triple, and he had a walk and stolen base.

### **BRINGING THEM HOME**

Sophomore Jake Yacinich paces the Hawkeyes with 11 RBIs and is hitting .400 (8-of-20) with runners in scoring position. Six of his 11 RBIs have come during a current four-game hit streak in which he is 6-of-17 (.353) at the plate.

Yacinich has tallied 18 hits this season, ranking second on the team. He has recorded six multi-hit games this season, including a careerbest three hits against Western Illinois on March





2.

Yacinich hit safely in the Hawkeyes first five games this season, tying a career-best hitting streak.

### **MANGLER MASHING**

Sophomore Jake Mangler is one of the Hawkeyes hottest hitters. The Clinton, lowa, native is riding a six-game hitting streak in which he is hitting at a .333 clip (9-for-27) with five RBIs. Mangler is 6-of-15 (.400) in his last three games, posting two hits in each of his contest. In addition, he has drove in a run in five of the his last six contests. Mangler's hit streak is four shy of a career-best, as he ended 2012 by hitting safely in 10 games.

### **GOOD(MAN) HITTING**

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been one of the Hawkeyes top offensive threats this season, leading the team in batting average (.389), hits (21), runs scored (10), and total bases (21). His 21 hits are tied for sixth in the Big Ten, while his .389 batting average ranks ninth in the conference. Goodman has been most effective against lefthanded pitchers, hitting .533 (8-of-15) against southpaws. He has posted six multi-hit games, including a career-best three hits on four different occasions. The Apple Valley, Minn., native opened the year with a career-best eight-game hitting streak.

### **TOOLE THE THIEF**

Sophomore Eric Toole is a perfect 6-of-6 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's six swipes are a team-best, and place him in a tie for seventh among Big Ten athletes. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native stole seven bases in 2012, ranking fourth on the team.

# "K"UEBEL

Sophomore pitcher Sasha Kuebel is one of the Big Ten's best strikeout pitchers, ranking in the top-10 in the Big Ten in two categories. The St. Louis native is tied for fourth in batters struck out looking (7) and is tied for ninth in total strikeouts (17). Both marks lead the team.

### DON'T RUN ON SHEPPARD

Senior Dan Sheppard has caught five base runners attempting to steal this season. The mark is tied for third in the conference. Sheppard threw out four base runners in Iowa's season-opening series at Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17).

### **SANDQUIST SHINES OUT OF BULLPEN**

Senior Ricky Sandquist has been the Hawkeyes most consistent pitcher out of the bullpen this season. Sandquist has not allowed an earned run in four relief appearances, throwing 12.0 innings. The Fort Dodge, lowa, native collected his first win of the season March 24 at Texas A&M Corpus Christi after tossing three innings. Sandquist has made one start this season, start-

ing against West Virginia on March 10, throwing five innings and allowing three earned runs.

# **HIBBING WITH THE SAVE**

Sophomore Nick Hibbing leads the Hawkeyes with two saves. Hibbing earned his first save of against Western Illinois on March 2, throwing two scoreless innings in relief of starter Matt Dermody. Hibbing's second save came March 10 against West Virginia, as he pitched the 12th inning and induced a game-ending double play. The Lindenhurst, Ill., native has made four appearances the season, throwing five scoreless innings with five strikeouts.

### OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 29 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. Senior Keith Brand has been plunked seven times, leading the team and the Big Ten and ranking 13th nationally. Brand has been hit three times in a game twice (UALR, Maine).

lowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season.

### **SACRIFICING YOURSELF**

lowa has laid down a Big Ten-best 15 sacrifice bunts this season. Sophomore Eric Toole has delivered four of the sacrifices, leading the team and the conference. He also ranks 37th nationally. Toole's 0.4 sacrifice bunts per game rank 13th in the country.

### **BULLPEN DOES ITS JOB**

The lowa bullpen has been stellar this year, allowing nine earned run in 48 innings and collecting three of the team's six wins.

Three relievers -- senior Rick Sandquist and sophomores Nick Hibbing and Ryan Rumpf -- have not allowed an earned run out of the bullpen, while senior Andrew Hanse has allowed two run in 10.2 innings.

Hanse, Hibbing, sophomore Taylor Kaufman, and freshman Josh Martsching combined to allow one earned run in 10 innings at the Snowbird Classic (March 8-10). Hanse picked up the win in the Hawkeyes 6-4 victory over West Virginia (March 10).

The Hawkeye bullpen allowed seven runs in 18.2 innings during Hawkeyes' recent fourgame trip to Little Rock, Ark.

Hanse, Sandquist, and Kaufman allowed one earned run in nine innings at the Kleberg Bank College Classic on Feb. 22-24, as Kaufman (New Mexico) and Sandquist (Texas A&M Corpus Christi) both picked up wins.

The bullpen did not allow an earned run in the Hawkeyes' three-game series at Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Hanse, Sandquist, Kaufman, Hibbing, Martsching, and sophomore Andrew Hedrick combined to pitch 10.1 innings without allowing an earned run out of the bullpen against the Governors.


