IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,007 games, since beginning basketball in 1974. Iowa's overall record is 614-393 (.610). That includes a 309-151 (.672) mark in regular season Big Ten contests and a 288-84 (.774) mark in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa is 2-0 all time vs. West Virginia, 1-0 vs. Nevada and has never faced Columbia.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA

The West Virginia Mountaineers are 3-1, after beating Duquesne Tuesday, 73-52. Korinne Campbell registered a double-double with 17 points and 16 rebounds, to along with three blocks and two steals. West Virginia fired a season-best .574 from the floor, including .538 from long distance.

Liz Repella leads the team with 17.3 points per game. She is also the team's leading threepoint shooter, with 11 makes in 31 attempts.

Asya Bussie is also averaging double-figures at 11.8 points per game, with Vanessa House close behind at 9.3. Campbell leads the team with 10.3 rebounds per contest.

Mike Carey is in his ninth season as West Virginia's head coach, and entered the season with a 438-204 record.

SCOUTING COLUMBIA

The Columbia Lions are 3-1 after defeating Manhattan, 69-66 Tuesday night. Senior Sara Yee hit a pair of three-pointers in the final four minutes, and also sank two clutch free throws with 12 seconds remaining to get the win. Judie Lomax finished with her fourth-consecutive double-double (14 points, 15 rebounds). Columbia is off to the program's best start since the 2002-03 season.

Lomax is averaging a double-double, at 15.3 points and 14.0 rebounds per game. Lauren Dwyer (15.0) and Kathleen Barry (12.8) are also scoring in double-figures.

Paul Nixon is in his fifth year at Columbia, and holds a 37-74 record.

SCOUTING NEVADA

The Nevada Wolfpack are 3-1, after defeating Weber State, 50-38 Monday night. Johnna Ward led the way with 13 points, while Marissa Hammond netted 10. Shavon Moore and Kayla Williams grabbed a team-high 10 rebounds. Nevada scored 26 of its 50 points in the paint, but did have 21 turnovers.

Ward leads the team with 15.0 points per game, followed by Hammond at 8.5. Williams is the team's leading rebounder, at 7.3 boards per contest.

Jane Albright is in her second season at Nevada, and her 25th season overall. Entering the year, she held an 18-14 record at Nevada and a 415-325 overall record.

NUGGET CLASSIC NOTES

• West Virginia Assistant Coach Malikah Willis was a member of the Iowa women's basketball team from 1994-98. She helped the Hawkeyes to Big Ten titles in 1995 and 1996. She graduated with a degree in media studies and African American studies from the University of Iowa in 1998.

• Columbia senior Caitlin Stachon is from Urbandale, IA, and prepped at Dowling Catholic High School in Des Moines.

• Nevada Head Coach Jane Albright spent nine seasons in the Big Ten as the head coach at Wisconsin. She is the program's winningest coach.

BIG SECOND HALF LIFTS IOWA PAST WILLIAM & MARY

lowa upped its record to 4-1 with a 78-54 win over William & Mary Tuesday night in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes outscored William & Mary, 44-27 in the second half, and shot .457 from the field, including .500 from distance. Iowa also out-rebounded the Tribe, 30-17 in the second half.

lowa dominated the interior, outscoring William & Mary, 36-26 in the paint. The Hawkeyes also cashed in on 11 second chance points and 13 fast break points.

WAHLIN STAYS HOT

Sophomore Kamille Wahlin followed her career-best performance at Northern Iowa with a 20-point performance against William & Mary Tuesday. Wahlin finished 8-13 from the floor, and 4-8 from distance.

Wahlin filled up the stat sheet, adding six rebounds and five assists in 34 minutes of action. Wahlin only had one turnover against a pressuring Tribe defense.

PRINTY ALL OVER THE COURT

Freshman Jaime Printy continued her impressive start in Black and Gold, with 20 points against William & Mary. She was one rebound away from her first-career double-double, adding nine rebounds and five assists.

TAYLOR SHINES IN FIRST START

Fresh off her first significant action of the season Sunday at Northern Iowa, freshman Theairra Taylor made the most of her first-ever start as a Hawkeye.

Taylor poured in 16 points (7-15 FGs, 2-3 3PT FGs), along with nine rebounds, five assists, three blocks and a steal in 36 minutes of play.

MACHADO GIVES SPARK OFF THE BENCH

With starter Morgan Johnson in early foul trouble, freshman Gabby Machado more than filled the role in the paint against William & Mary.

Machado scored 12 points, grabbed eight rebounds, dished out two assists and tallied two steals in just 19 minutes of action Tuesday night.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her 10th season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 26th season as a college head coach. She is a two-time Big Ten and WBCA Regional Coach of the Year, most recently earning honors a year ago in 2007-08.



Bluder, 47, has a career record of 529-252 (.677), including a 173-110 (.611) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark

(1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to six post-season tournaments (4 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and six upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference, including winning a share of the league championship in 2008 and tying for second place in 2009.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to their first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and was the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in her last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times at Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons, building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

CAREER DAY FOR WAHLIN

Sophomore Kamille Wahlin poured in a career-high 33 points against Northern Iowa. She also notched career-highs in field goals made (11) and attempted (19), three-pointers made (6) and attempted (10) and free throws made (5) and attempted (6). Her five five three-pointers were just one shy of the school record.

Wahlin led Iowa's second-half comeback with 21 points on 6-10 shooting, including 4-5 from three point range and all five free throws in the final half.

Wahlin leads the Big Ten in three-pointers made per game (3), ranks second in average minutes played (35.5) and sixth in scoring (17.5).

JOHNSON TIES SCHOOL RECORD

Freshman Morgan Johnson tied a school record with seven blocked shots against Northern lowa Sunday. Johnson now holds the record with Jerica Watson (vs. Kent State, 12/8/01) and Tangela Smith (at Michigan State, 1/15/95). She currently ranks third in the Big Ten in blocks per game (2.75).

Johnson added 11 points and eight rebounds in the win.

INJURY UPDATE

Senior JoAnn Hamlin is out indefinitely after having a blood clot removed from her right leg.

Junior Kachine Alexander is expected to miss one month with a stress fracture in her right leg.

Sophomore Shante Jones is questionable for the Nugget Classic with a foot injury.

Sophomore Hannah Draxten is probable for the Nugget Classic after being sidelined since the start of the season with a herniated disc in her back.

ALEXANDER'S NUMBERS WILL BE MISSED

Junior Kachine Alexander had a solid start to the season. Alexander has recorded a doubledouble in each of Iowa's first three games, and was averaging 21 points and 15.7 rebounds, before suffering a stress fracture in her right leg.

Alexander currently leads the Big Ten in rebounding (15.7) and offensive rebounds (8.3). She also ranks second in scoring (21) and defensive rebounds (7.3), third in minutes played (34.6) and fifth in assists (4.3).

UNDERCLASSMEN CONTRIBUTING

lowa's freshmen and sophomore class are putting up big numbers for the Hawkeyes this season.

Hawkeye underclassmen are responsible for 83 percent of the team's blocks, 80 percent of minutes played and assists, 79 percent of scoring, 77 percent of steals and 63 percent of rebounds.

ALEXANDER NAMED CO-BIG TEN PLAYER OF THE WEEK

Junior Kachine Alexander was named co-Big Ten Player of the Week Nov. 16 after earning MVP honors at the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

Alexander recorded double-doubles in each of Iowa's first two games. She tied a Hawkeye Challenge tournament record by grabbing 18 rebounds (nine offensive, nine defensive), along with netting 19 points in Iowa's season-opening win over Santa Clara. Both her 19 points and 18 rebounds were game highs.

Alexander followed on Sunday with a 21 point, 12 rebound (nine offensive, three defensive) performance in the championship game against Illinois State. Alexander was clutch down the stretch at the free-throw line, making 13-16 attempts from the charity stripe.

WAHLIN LANDS ON ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Sophomore Kamille Wahlin was named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge all-tournament team after two solid performances to open the season.

Against Santa Clara, Wahlin netted 13 points and added three rebounds.

Wahlin was clutch down the stretch in the championship against Illinois State, scoring seven points during Iowa's crucial 12-2 run in the final three minutes of the second half to give the Hawkeyes the victory. Wahlin drained a three-pointer with 3:46 left to give Iowa a one-point lead at 64-63. She then hit a jumper with 37 second left, extending Iowa's lead to five points at 70-65. Wahlin added two free throws on the next trip down the court to seal the win.

PRESEASON RANKINGS

lowa was picked to finish fifth in the Big Ten by both the league coaches and media. Ohio State was tabbed as the favorite to win the Big Ten, with Michigan State coming in second.

WELCOME TO IOWA CITY

The Hawkeyes welcome five freshmen to the squad this season, one at each position.

Trisha Nesbitt (Ames, IA), will most likely play point guard for Iowa this season. She was a three-time all-conference and two-time first team all-district and all-state selection.

Jaime Printy (Marion, IA) could play both guard positions. She became the youngest player (15) ever to verbally commit to the Iowa Women's Basketball team. She also played high school basketball at Coach Bluder's alma mater (Linn-Mar). She was a three-time consensus first team all-state, all-district, all-metro and all-conference pick.

Theairra Taylor (St. Paul, MN) is a 5-11 guard. She was a finalist for 2009 Miss Minnesota Basketball award and was the 2009 St. Paul City Conference Player of the Year. Taylor also earned Associated Press and Pioneer Press first team all-state honors.

Gabby Machado (Pontiac, MI) ranked in the Top 10 in the state of Michigan's 2009 recruiting class. She was a Detroit News Class "A" all-state honorable mention selection.

Morgan Johnson (Platte County, MO) was the Miss Show Me Basketball Award winner, given to the top prep senior in the state of Missouri. She was also named the 2009 Direnna Award winner, given to top prep in the Kansas City Area, and the Kansas City Star Scholar Athlete of the Year.

HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Four Hawkeyes prepped in the state of Iowa. Those players are junior Kelsey Cermak (Norwalk), sophomore Kelly Krei (Iowa City) and freshmen Trisha Nesbitt (Ames) and Jaime Printy (Marion).

Hawkeyes Ink Talented Recruit

Jade Rogers has signed a National Letter of Intent to attend the University of Iowa next fall.

"We are eager to have Jade Rogers join our team," Bluder said. "Jade is a tremendous kid that loves the game, and has grown up as a Hawkeye fan. Jade will be a versatile player that can play a number of positions. She can post up or she can shoot the long ball. She is also a good rebounder. Jade has had a great career at Cedar Rapids Kennedy, and is looking forward to continuing her career as a Hawkeye."

Rogers, a 5-11 forward, is from nearby Hiawatha, IA, and attends Cedar Rapids Kennedy High School. She led the state in scoring (22.3) and rebounding (13.4) as a sophomore, and was named the Missouri Valley Conference Player of the Year. She also earned first team all-state, all-district, all-metro and all-conference honors.

Rogers suffered an ACL injury during the summer of the 2008, but returned to the court and helped lead Kennedy to the semifinal round of the state tournament. Rogers played in 17 games as a junior and averaged 17.9 points and 10.6 rebounds. She was named first team all-state, alldistrict, all-metro and all-conference, along with being named to the state tournament all-tournament team.

As a freshman, Rogers earned second team all-state honors, along with first team all-district, all-metro and all-conference recognition.

Rogers currently has 1,089 points (18.5 per game average), which is fourth on the all-time scoring list at Kennedy. She also holds school records for single-game rebounds (20), single-season rebounds per game (12.6) and is on pace to become Kennedy's career rebounding leader. Rogers is also a three-time team captain.

Rogers has also lettered in volleyball. She helped lead the Kennedy volleyball team to a state tournament appearance this year.


