ON THE MAT

The University of Iowa wrestling team wrapped the 2012-13 season with a Big Ten regular season dual title, one national champion and four All-Americans. The Hawkeyes owned an overall dual record of 20-3, and won the Big Ten dual title with an 8-0 conference record. The Big Ten title was lowa's fifth regular season conference championship in the last six years, and their perfect Big Ten record marked the fifth time in six seasons lowa finished the conference regular season with an 8-0 record.

lowa placed third at the Big Ten Championships, placing nine wrestlers in the top four, more than any other school. With their performance at the conference tournament, nine Hawkeyes earned automatic berths to the NCAA Championships in Des Moines, Iowa. Four Hawkeyes earned All-America honors at the national tournament, including Derek St. John, who won the 157-pound NCAA championship. Tony Ramos finished runner-up (133), Ethen Lofthouse earned fifth place (184), and Mike Evans placed sixth. The Hawkeyes finished fourth in the team race.

ST. JOHN WINS NCAA TITLE

Derek St. John became the 52nd national champion in program history following a 3-2 decision over Northwestern's Jason Welch in the finals of the 2013 NCAA Championships. St. John, a threetime All-American and 2012 NCAA runner-up, put together five-straight wins to climb to the top of the 157-pound bracket and claim his first career national crown. His title is the 80th individual NCAA wrestling championship in school history. He finished the season with a 31-2 record.

ALL-AMERICAN STREAK

The Hawkeyes have crowned at least one All-American every year since 1972, a span of 42 seasons. Iowa has totaled 245 All-America honors during that stretch. The Hawkeyes will return all four All-Americans to next year's squad. Tony Ramos (2nd-133), Derek St. John (1st-157), Mike Evans (6th-174) and Ethen Lofthouse (5th-184) will join 2012 All-American Bobby Telford (5th-285) in the 2013-14 lineup.

40 YEARS OF DOMINANCE

Since 1974, only seven schools have captured the NCAA Championship. During that 40-year span, the Hawkeyes have won 23 team titles, including nine straight from 1978-86. The other schools include Oklahoma State (7), Minnesota (3), Penn State (3), Iowa State (2), Arizona State (1) and Oklahoma (1).

HAWKEYE WRESTLING HISTORY

Iowa's overall dual meet record is 926-222-31 (.799) in 103 seasons. The Hawkeyes have won 23 national titles and 34 Big Ten titles. Iowa's 52 NCAA Champions have won a total of 80 NCAA individual titles, crowning six three-time and 16 two-time champions. The Hawkeyes' 105 Big Ten champions have won a total of 190 conference titles. There have been seven four-time, 18 threetime and 28 two-time Iowa winners. Iowa's 148 All-Americans have earned All-America status 301 times, including 17 four-time, 32 three-time and 38 two-time honorees.

ATTENDANCE LEADERS AT IT AGAIN

The seventh-largest dual crowd in NCAA history saw Iowa defeat top-ranked Penn State on Friday, Feb. 1. The Hawkeyes drew a sellout crowd of 15,077, the sixth-largest wrestling crowd in Carver-Hawkeye Arena history.

In seven home dates this season, Iowa averaged 8,764 fans per dual. This season marked the fifth straight year Iowa averaged over 8,000 fans, and the seventh straight season the Hawkeyes led the nation in attendance. The dual wrestling attendance record for Carver-Hawkeye Arena is 15,955, set when Iowa defeated Iowa State (20-15) on Dec. 6, 2008.

CARVER-HAWKEYE ARENA

lowa finished the 2012-13 home schedule with a 9-0 record inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,077). The perfect record marked lowa's 20th undefeated season at Carver-Hawkeye Arena since moving from the UI Fieldhouse in 1983. Iowa has a 205-19 (.915) all-time record in the arena. The Hawkeyes have also won five tournament titles on their home mat, including the 1983 and 1994 Big Ten Championships, and the 1986, 1991 and 1995 NCAA Championships.

HAWKEYES EARN BIG TEN DUAL TITLE

Iowa captured its fifth Big Ten regular season title in the last six years when it defeated Nebraska, 31-7, Feb. 10 at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The perfect conference record marked the fifth time in six seasons the Hawkeyes finished the Big Ten regular season with an undefeated mark.

NINE IN THE TOP 4

Though they were held without a conference champion for the first time in seven years, the Hawkeyes placed nine wrestlers in the top four at the 2013 Big Ten Championships. No other school placed more than seven wrestlers inside the top four.

ACADEMIC ALL-BIG TEN

Seven members of the Hawkeye wrestling were named to the 2013 Big Ten Winter Academic All-Conference team. Joe DuCharme, Josh Dziewa, Mike Evans, Brody Grothus, Josh Haug, Kris Klapprodt and Matt McDonough were recognized by the conference. To be eligible for academic All-Big Ten, student-athletes must be letterwinners and be in at least their second academic year at the institution. They must also carry a cumulative grade point average of 3.0 or better. Since Tom Brands was named head coach in 2006, the Hawkeyes have earned 53 Big Ten academic honors.

B1G WRESTLER OF THE WEEK

Four Hawkeyes combined for five Big Ten weekly honors this season, more than any other school. Sophomore Nick Moore earned Big Ten honors Jan. 29, junior Derek St. John was recognized Dec. 11, junior Tony Ramos earned the award Feb. 5, and senior Matt McDonough was honored on two occasions, Nov. 20 and Feb. 5. McDonough has earned the award four times, more than any other Hawkeye in school history. The conference began awarding weekly honors in 1998-99.

HAWKEYES RETAIN DAN GABLE TRAVELING TROPHY

The Hawkeyes won nine of 10 matches to defeat Iowa State, 32-3, and retain the Dan Gable Traveling Trophy. The 29-point victory was the largest margin of victory since Iowa won 33-4 in 1996. Since the inception of the Dan Gable Traveling Trophy in 2010, the Hawkeyes have won all three meetings against the Cyclones. Iowa has won nine straight in the series overall.

HAWKEYES SWEEP IN 'GARDEN' DEBUT

The Hawkeyes defeated Hofstra and Bucknell at the inaugural "Grapple at the Garden" on Dec. 16. The "Grapple at the Garden" was the first-ever college wrestling event held at Madison Square Garden. Individually, more than 65 nationally ranked wrestlers competed in the event, which drew a crowd of 9,034.

MCDONOUGH EXITS AS ONE OF THE ALL-TIME GREATS

Two-time NCAA and Big Ten champion Matt McDonough finished his career with a record of 122-9 and the 11th best winning percentage in school history (.931). McDonough advanced to the NCAA finals in each of his first three seasons, and is one of 32 Hawkeyes in school history to earn three All-America honors. He was named the Mike Howard Most Valuable Player in each of his first three seasons, and was named academic All-Big Ten as a junior and senior. McDonough also earned Big Ten Wrestler of the Week honors four times in his career, more than any other Hawkeye in school history.

RAMOS RACKS UP THE NUMBERS

Two-time All-American Tony Ramos finished the season as NCAA and Big Ten runner-up, compiling a 30-2 overall record and 23-0 mark in duals. Ramos led Iowa with 114 dual points scored, the most by a Hawkeye since Brent Metcalf scored 123 points while posting a 23-0 dual record in 2009-10. Ramos won 33 matches last season. He is the first Hawkeye to post back-to-back 30-plus win seasons since Brent Metcalf and Ryan Morningstar in 2009-10. Ramos also led Iowa with 14 falls, and began the season with a 26-match win streak.

LOFTHOUSE FINISHES STRONG

Two-time All-American Ethen Lofthouse entered the 2013 national tournament as the No. 12 seed, and proceeded to race through seven ranked opponents en route to a fifth-place finish. Lofthouse went 5-2 at the NCAA Championships, scoring wins over Nos. 4, 7, 9, 11 and 15. His only two losses of the tournament were to the Nos. 2 and 3 ranked wrestlers in the country. He also wrestled above his seed at the conference tournament, finishing third for the third straight season after entering as the No. 5 seed.

EVANS REACHES THE MEDAL STAND

Sophomore Mike Evans earned his first All-America honor following a sixth-place finish at the NCAA Championships. Evans finished the season with a 23-7 record, and was Big Ten runner-up for the second straight season.

TELFORD TOURNAMENT CUT SHORT

Sophomore Bobby Telford's run at a second All-America honor was cut short after the opening round of the NCAA Championships. Telford, who placed fifth in 2012, was forced to injury default from the tournament after winning his first match, 8-1.

BURAK KNOCKS ON THE DOOR -- BOOKENDS SEASON WITH A PAIR OF FALLS

Freshman Nathan Burak's run to the All-America stand stalled in the round of 12 at the NCAA Championships. Burak entered the tournament unseeded, and after an opening round loss to top-seeded Dustin Kilgore (Boise State), he advanced to the round of 12 with wins over No. 17 Brandon Palik (Drexel) and No. 8 Nathan Schiedel (Binghamton). He was eventually bounced from the tournament by No. 4 Alfonso Hernandez (Wyoming). Burak pinned Schiedel (2:34) to earn his 20th win of the season. It was his second pin of the year. He also earned a fall in his first win of the season (1:30). He finished his rookie year with a 20-17 record.

BRANDS MOVES UP A RUNG

Tom Brands' 131 dual victories is the third-highest total in program history. Iowa's 25-12 win over Illinois on Feb. 8 was Brands' 128th dual victory as Iowa's head coach. The win pushed him past Jim Zalesky for third all-time. Brands owns a career record of 131-13-1 at Iowa. His .907 winning percentage ranks second to Dan Gable (.938).

Tom Brands Head Coach (University of Iowa, 1992)

Three-time Big Ten Coach of the Year, Tom Brands, recently completed his seventh season as head wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. A 1996 Olympic gold medalist and member of wrestling's Hall of Fame, Brands is only the eighth wrestling coach at the University of Iowa. The former Hawkeye wrestler was a four-time All-American and three-time national champion (1989-92) at Iowa. He has a 131-13-1 (.907) overall and 51-5 (.911) Big Ten coaching record at Iowa, and a 148-32-1 (.820) career mark.

In seven seasons as lowa's head coach, Brands has led the Hawkeyes to three NCAA and Big Ten team titles, crowning eight NCAA champions, 10 Big Ten champions and 38 All-Americans. Iowa has had 53 academic all-Big Ten honorees, including a school-record 12 in 2011-12. The Hawkeyes have qualified 62 wrestlers for the NCAA Championships in the last seven years, sending the entire 10-man lineup in 2009-10. Iowa has also won five of the last six Big Ten regular season titles.

During Brands' tenure, Iowa set school records for longest dual unbeaten (84) and winning streaks (69), longest dual road unbeaten (51) and winning streaks (44), most Carver-Hawkeye Arena victories (11) and most dual shutouts (8).

lowa also made another entry in the record books, setting the national collegiate dual meet attendance record of 15,955 when it hosted Iowa State Dec. 6, 2008, at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The previous record of 15,646 was set Feb. 1, 2002, when Minnesota hosted Iowa at the Target Center in Minneapolis. The Hawkeyes won the Iowa State dual, 20-15. Iowa has led the nation in attendance in each of Brands' seven seasons, setting an NCAA all-time attendance average of 9,014 in 2011-12.

Brands was named 2008 NWCA Coach of the Year after leading the Hawkeyes to their first NCAA team title since 2000 and their first Big Ten team title since 2004. He was named Big Ten Coach of the Year in 2008, 2009 and 2010, becoming the first coach in conference history to earn the honor in three consecutive seasons.

Brands served as head coach at Virginia Tech University for two seasons (2005-06), recording a 17-20 dual mark. In his first season with the Hokies, Brands led the team to the 2005 regular season Atlantic Coast Conference title, set a school record for dual meet wins (16) and had a school-record five wrestlers qualify for the NCAA Championships. During his tenure, Virginia Tech crowned five ACC champions and had two All-Americans. Senior heavyweight Mike Faust was named 2006 ACC Wrestler of the Year.

Prior to taking the helm at Virginia Tech, Brands was an assistant coach at Iowa for 12 seasons (1993-2004). He helped the Hawkeyes to a 177-27 dual record, seven NCAA and eight Big Ten titles, while crowning 23 NCAA champions, 73 All-Americans and 36 Big Ten champions. He was named the National Wrestling Coaches Association Assistant Coach of the Year in 2000.

In 2004, he was one of three coaches for the U.S. Olympic freestyle wrestling team, participating in Athens. Brands also served as assistant coach for the 2002 and 2003 U.S. Freestyle World Teams, earning Freestyle Coach of the Year honors from USA Wrestling both years. He was also a member of the U.S. coaching staff at the 2001 World Championships, and has coached a number of other U.S. teams in international competition.

As a competitor, Brands won the 1996 Olympic freestyle gold medal at 136.5 pounds in Atlanta, GA. He also won a gold medal at the 1993 World Freestyle Championships in Toronto, two World Cup gold medals (1994, 1995) and was the 1995 Pan American Games champion. He won four U.S. National titles (1993-96) and made four straight U.S. World or Olympic teams (1993-96). Along with his twin brother, Terry, Tom was named 1993 USA Wrestling Athlete of the Year, the 1993 John Smith Outstanding Freestyle Wrestler and 1993 Amateur Wrestling News Man of the Year. He was inducted into wrestling's Hall of Fame in 2001.

Brands was a four-time All-American at lowa (1989-92). During his Hawkeye career, he won three NCAA titles and was named Outstanding Wrestler of the 1992 NCAA Championships. Also a three-time Big Ten champion, Brands won 95 percent of his matches at lowa. His career mark of 158-7-2, included an undefeated season in 1991 (45-0).

The Sheldon, Iowa, native was born April 9, 1968. He earned his B.S. degree in physical education from Iowa in 1992. He and his wife, Jeni, have three children, Madigan, Kinsee and Tommy.
