- Saturday marks the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell. Iowa has played 1,255 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 656-560-39 (.538).
- K Keith Duncan is tied for first in the country with 22 field goals made. Duncan kicked three field goals at Wisconsin to set lowa's single-season school record. His 86.1 field goal percentage is the best ever among lowa kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts.
- DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks in the top 20 in scoring, rushing, passing, and total defense. Iowa is fourth in the country in scoring defense (11.7 ppg), 10th in passing defense (177.6), 11th in total defense (288.9 ypg), and 20th in rushing defense (111.3 ypg).
- lowa's scoring defense (11.7 ppg) is the lowest total of the Ferentz era (next best is 13.0 in 2008), and the lowest by any Hawkeye team since 1959 (11.1). lowa's total defense is the lowest by any Hawkeye team since 2009 (276.5).
- lowa has allowed 12 touchdowns in nine games, third fewest in the country (Ohio State 8, Georgia 10). Iowa has four shutouts in its last 12 Big Ten Conference games (Rutgers and Northwestern in 2019, Maryland and Illinois in 2018). No other Big Ten team has more than one shutout since the start of 2018.
- The Hawkeyes are playing their third trophy game of the season: Cy-Hawk Trophy, W, 18-17 at Iowa State; Heartland, L, 24-22, at Wisconsin. The Hawkeyes are 14-4 in their last 18 rivalry trophy games (Iowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all four losses coming to Wisconsin.
- QB Nate Stanley has started the last 35 games at quarterback (23-12). He ranks second in school history in passing touchdowns (64), and third in passing yards (7,509). He ranks second in the Big Ten this season in passing yards (2,158) and passing yards per game (239.8).
- WR Tyrone Tracy set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yards (130) last week at Wisconsin. It was his first career 100-yard receiving game, and the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye wide receiver since Marvin McNutt had 8 receptions for 130 yards against Michigan State in 2011.
- lowa's three losses are to #10 Penn State (8-1), #19 Michigan (7-2), and #16 Wisconsin (7-2), who have a combined record of 22-5. All three losses were one possession games.
- Kirk Ferentz has 94 Big Ten Conference wins, one shy of tying Joe Paterno for No. 5 all-time in conference history. Iowa is bowl eligible for the 18th time in the last 19 seasons.



FLOYD OF ROSEDALE

As a result of a bet between the governors of the two states in 1935, possession of Floyd of Rosedale is at stake Saturday. The trophy is currently in possession of Iowa. Minnesota holds a 42-40-2 advantage in the series with Floyd of Rosedale on the line. Iowa has won 14 of the last 18 meetings. Saturday is the first meeting since 2003 that both team enter the game ranked: #20 Iowa defeated #19 Minnesota, 40-22, in Iowa City on Nov. 15, 2003.

The Floyd of Rosedale contest is one of four trophy games on Iowa's 2017 schedule. Iowa is 1-1 in Trophy Games this season (W, 18-17 at Iowa State; L 24-22 at Wisconsin).

IN THE RANKINGS

Iowa is ranked No. 23 in the AP poll and No. 22 in the coaches poll. Iowa's schedule includes four opponents ranked in the AP top 25 (#7 Minnesota, #9 Penn State, #14 Michigan, #15 Wisconsin). Those four opponents have a combined 31-5 record.

lowa is 0-3 against ranked teams this season, falling 10-3 at #19 Michigan on Oct. 5, 17-12 at home to #10 Penn State on Oct. 12, and 24-22 at #16 Wisconsin on Nov. 9. The Hawkeyes' last win over a ranked opponent was against No. 18 Mississippi State, 27-22, on Jan. 1 at the 2019 Outback Bowl.

Iowa defeated Iowa State, 18-17, on Sept. 14. The Cyclones were the first team outside the AP Top 25 when the teams met.

lowa has played 1,255 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 656-560-39 (.538). That includes a 409-222-16 (.645) record in home games, a 247-338-23 (.425) record in games away from Iowa City, a 332-381-25 (.467) mark in Big Ten games and a 293-187-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium. Oct. 5, 2019 marked the 90th anniversary of the first game in Kinnick Stadium, a 46-0 win over Monmouth.

When lowa hosts Minnesota on Saturday, it will mark the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell.

TROPHY COLLECTION

The Hawkeyes are playing their third trophy game of the season. Iowa defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy with an 18-17 win at Iowa State on Sept. 14, and fell to #16 Wisconsin, 24-22, on Nov. 9 in a battle for the Heartland Trophy.

HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 21st season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
 Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 158 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 94 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 149-83 (.642) overall mark and an 90-61 (.596)
 Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 13 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 158-104 (.603) and a 94-75 (.556) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 158 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 170-125 (.576).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
 Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
 Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz has 94 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 94 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games. He is one win tying Joe Paterno for fifth place in all-time Big Ten Conference wins.

Ferentz's 158 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (158).

Ferentz (158-103) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 21st season in 2019.

Both Ferentz (158, 93) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 21st seasons on Iowa's staff. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

WIN, GRADUATE, DO IT RIGHT

Ten Hawkeyes wear a decal on their helmets indicating they have received their undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. The graduates include Drew Cook, John Milani, Landan Paulsen, Levi Paulsen, Colton Rastetter, Brady Reiff, Brady Ross, Ryan Schmidt, Jackson Subbert, and Nate Wieting.

Saturday will be the 113th meeting between lowa and Minnesota. The Hawkeyes have won four straight, and 14 of the last 18. Saturday is the first meeting since 2003 that both team enter the game ranked: #20 lowa defeated #19 Minnesota, 40-22, in lowa City on Nov. 15, 2003.

Minnesota holds a 62-48-2 advantage in a series that began with a 42-4 Gopher victory in 1891. The Golden Gophers won the first 12 games in the series before lowa earned a 6-0 win in 1918. The Hawkeyes are 30-23-1 against Minnesota in games played in lowa City.

STANLEY CLIMBS SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE CHARTS

QB Nate Stanley ranks second in the Big Ten in passing yards (2,158) and passing yards per game (239.8). He has 12 touchdown passes this season and 64 in his career, second all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) on the all-time list.

Stanley is one of 10 finalists for the Johnny Unitas Golden Arm Award, which is presented annually to the top senior or fourth-year quarterback in the nation. He is the only Big Ten quarterback o the list. He has started the last 35 games at quarterback (23-12), and the Hawkeyes have averaged 28.0 points per game in those starts. That average ranks seventh in school history. His streak of 35 consecutive starts at quarterback ranks second in history to Long (47).

Stanley has 18 career multi-touchdown games, including four this season. He completed three touchdown passes in the season opener against Miami, Ohio, three more in Week 2 against Rutgers, two against Middle Tennessee in Week 4, and two against #16 Wisconsin in Week 9. He has 10 career games with at least three passing touchdowns. Only Long has more in program history (11).

Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes in 2018, second most in the Big Ten, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for the most in single season school history, and tied for second most all-time in single season history. Stanley also threw 26 touchdown passes in 2017. Stanley's 52 touchdown passes from 2017-18 are the most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley threw for a career-high 2,852 yards in 2018, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. He ranks third in career passing yards (7,509) and third in career total offense (7,377).

Stanley was named to six preseason watch lists and listed on the preseason Big Ten third team by Phil Steele.

MOVE THE CHAINS

The Hawkeyes set a Ferentz-era record in their 48-3 win over Middle Tennessee in Week 4. Iowa had 644 yards of total offense, the most in the Ferentz era (previous best was 613 vs. Minnesota in 2005), and the most by any Hawkeye team since 1997 (658 vs. Northern Iowa). Iowa rushed for 351 yards against Middle Tennessee, a mark that ranks fourth in the Ferentz era.

POCKET PRESSURE

DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks in the top 20 in scoring, rushing, passing, and total defense. Iowa is fourth in the country in scoring defense (11.7 ppg), 10th in passing defense (177.6), 11th in total defense (288.9 ypg), and 20th in rushing defense (111.3 ypg). Iowa's scoring defense is second in the Big Ten to Ohio State, who leads the country with 8.6 ppg.

lowa's scoring defense is the lowest total of the Ferentz era (next best is 13.0 in 2008), and the lowest by any Hawkeye team since 1959 (11.1). Iowa's total defense is the lowest by any Hawkeye team since 2009 (276.5).

The Hawkeyes have allowed just 135 first downs (15.0 per game), tied for eighth fewest in the country and third in the Big Ten.

lowa has allowed 12 touchdowns in nine games, third fewest in the country (Ohio State 8, Georgia 10). Iowa is one of five schools in the country to allow just three rushing touchdowns or fewer (Georgia 0, Iowa 3, Ohio State 3, Oregon 3, Utah 3).

lowa's defense allowed just five first downs against Rutgers in Week 2. That ties for the fewest allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era (Syracuse, 2007). Rutgers' 125 yards of total offense ranks as the fifth lowest total in the Ferentz era.

In its Week 7 win against Purdue, Iowa allowed 33 yards rushing, its lowest total against a Big Ten opponent since 2013.

Epenesa leads lowa with 4.5 sacks and eight quarterback hurries. He led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018. His running mate, DE Chauncey Golston, has a team-high 7.5 tackles-for-loss (21 yards).

Epenesa is a quarterfinalist for the Lott IMPACT Trophy. He was named to four preseason All-America first teams, listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.com.

Epenesa recorded at least one sack in nine of 13 games last season and was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media, and second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches.

He ranked second in the conference and 16th nationally in forced fumbles (4), and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss. He totaled 37 tackles, four pass breakups, eight QB pressures, and a blocked punt in 2018. He recovered his own forced fumble and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown at Illinois.

The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten last season with 35 sacks, the second highest single-season total in the Ferentz era (2002, 40).

1,062 kickoff return yards, eighth all-time in program history.

Smith-Marsette leads the team in receiving yards (490) and all-purpose yards (754). He is tied for second on the team with 33 receptions. He rushed for a touchdown (14 yards) in Week 4, and is tied for the team lead with four touchdowns. He set a career high with 113 receiving yards in Week 2.

Smith-Marsette has 1,038 career receiving yards, 40th all-time in program history. He has 2,274 all-purpose yards. Only 19 players in school history have 2,500 or more.

In 2018, Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He was named Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year in the Big Ten Conference. He had 23 receptions for 361 yards and three touchdowns. His 15.7 yards per catch led the Hawkeyes (minimum 20 receptions).

SARGENT LEADS RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE

RB Mekhi Sargent leads the team in carries (102) and rushing yards (464). He was named on the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.

RB Toren Young (71) and RB Tyler Goodson (69) rank second and third, respective, in rush attempts. Young has 401 yards, averaging 5.6 yards per carry, best on the team and ninth in the Big Ten. He rushed for a career-high 131 yards in Week 4. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game.

Goodson has 364 yards rushing, and 20 receptions for 143 yards. His 89 combined touches ranks second on the team to Sargent (115).

Young has 1,231 career yards on 252 attempts, 34th all-time. Sargent has 1,209 yards on 261 attempts, 35th on Iowa's all-time list.

Seven different Hawkeyes have combined to rush for 10 touchdowns. Seven of those touchdowns have come from inside the 2-yard line, eight from inside the 4-yard line. Sargent leads the team with four rushing touchdowns (2, 4, 14, 2). Six more Hawkeyes have one rushing touchdown: Young (2), QB Nate Stanley (1), FB Brady Ross (1), WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette (14), QB Spencer Petras (1), Goodson (1).

Young (131) and Goodson (97) rushed for career highs against Middle Tennessee. The Hawkeyes rushed for 351 yards in the game, the fourth highest total in the Ferentz era.

Juniors Ivory Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young shared the workload in 2018. The trio combined for 392 carries, 1,723 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns (nine by Sargent, five by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin). Sargent had 40.6 percent of the carries (159-745), Young had 34.7 percent of the attempts (136-637), and Kelly-Martin has 24.7 percent of the carries (97-341).

YOUNG, SARGENT SURPASS 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS

Junior running backs Toren Young and Mekhi Sargent each surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in Iowa's win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 28.

Sargent entered the game with 953 rushing yards and moved past 1,000 for his career on a 12-yard run late in the first period. He ended the contest with 91 rushing yards. His career totals include 1,209 yards on 261 attempts. He was the 48th lowa running back to surpass 1,000 career yards and currently ranks 35th on the all-time list.

Young entered Week 4 with 950 career yards and surpassed 1,000 on a 15-yard run early in the second quarter, becoming the 49th lowa running back to surpass the century total. He led the Hawkeyes with a career-high 131 rushing yards against Middle Tennessee. Young now has 1,231 career yards on 252 attempts to rank 34th on the career list.

Sargent moved over 1,000 career yards on career attempt 207, while Young went past 1,000 yards on career attempt 209.

GRAND THEFT SECONDARY

lowa ranks 10th in the country and fifth in the Big Ten in passing defense (177.6 yards per game).

DB Michael Ojemudia is tied for sixth in the Big Ten with two interceptions. He intercepted a pass in each of the first two weeks. LB Djimon Colbert recorded the first interception of his career in Week 2. SS Geno Stone had one interception in Week 5. CB Riley Moss had an interception in Week 7. DE Chauncey Golston intercepted a pass in

The Hawkeyes have seven interceptions this season. Iowa led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last three seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 48 interceptions since 2017, two more than Boston College, who has the second most over the same period.

Entering this season, lowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

DUNCAN GETTING HIS KICKS

K Keith Duncan is tied for first in the country with 22 field goals made. He is 22-of-25 on field goal attempts and 19-of-19 on PAT attempts. He leads the team and ranks second in the Big Ten, 20th in the country, in scoring with 85 points. Duncan has connected on 11-of-13 kicks of at least 40 yards, and is 10-of-11 on the road. He kicked a career-long 49 yard field goal against Middle Tennessee in Week 4. He kicked four field goals at lowa State and four field goals against Purdue.

Duncan kicked three field goals at Wisconsin to set Iowa's single-season school record. Rob Houghtlin (1987), Nate Kaeding (2002), and Kyle Schlicher (2004) shared the previous record with 21 made field goals. His 86.1 field goal percentage is the best ever among Iowa kickers with at least 30 field goal attempts.

Duncan is seeing his first action since 2016, when he made 9-11 field goal attempts and 38-39 PAT attempts (one was blocked). That year he kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to lift lowa over #2 Michigan, 14-13.

Duncan was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award Star of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at lowa State. Duncan connected on a career-best four field goals at lowa State. His final kick from 39 yards provided the margin of victory with 4:51 remaining in the fourth quarter. He also connected from 25 yards on lowa's first drive of the game and from 40 yards on the final play of the first half. He nailed a 42-yarder late in the third quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor was the second of his career. He was previously recognized in 2016, earning the weekly honor following lowa's 14-13 win over Michigan. Duncan contributed two field goals in that win, including the game-winner from 33 yards on the final play of the game.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 16th season in 2019.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. All passengers must have a ticket. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program includes 19 student-athletes – 18 seniors and one junior. The Leadership Group assists in formulating team policies and is involved in team decision-making throughout the year. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors Drew Cook, Wes Dvorak, Amani Jones, Cedrick Lattimore, John Milani, Michael Ojemudia, Landan Paulsen, Levi Paulsen, Colten Rastetter, Brady Reiff, Brady Ross, Ryan Schmidt, Nate Stanley, Jackson Subbert, Nate Vejvoda, Kristian Welch, Nate Wieting, and Devonte Young, and junior Toren Young.

BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his eighth year on staff, his third as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 12th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the lowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has seven players on its 2019 roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: TE Drew Cook (Marv, 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa, 1997), DE Joe Evans (Spence, 1989), DB Thomas Hartlieb (Jim, 1989-92), WR Henry Marchese (John, 1985), DE Nathan Nelson (Jeff, 1990-92), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick, 1984-85).

Iowa has two sets of the brothers on the team: OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, and TE Bryce Schulte and WR Quinn Schulte.

Iowa has three players whose brothers played at Iowa: LB Nick Niemann (Ben in 2014-17), FB Johnny Plewa (Macon in 2013-15), and DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11).

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for lowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl games.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

SEEING DOUBLE

Senior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen started Weeks 1-4, becoming the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

The Paulsens are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

HAWKEYES IN THE NFL

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 37 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 32 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 180 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (70 draft picks/110 free agents).
- Iowa lost seven defensive starters following 2018. Five of those players are currently
 with NFL teams, including DB Jake Gervase, DE Parker Hesse, DB Amani Hooker, DE
 Anthony Nelson, DT Matt Nelson. Anthony Nelson and Hooker left Iowa following their
 junior seasons.
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (42 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 17 years, 150-of-175 (86 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 12 years, Iowa has had 44 NFL Draft picks, fourth most in the Big Ten

 Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (45), and Michigan (45). Since 2010, Iowa has had 37 players drafted in the NFL, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten Ohio State (62), Penn State (39), and Wisconsin (37).
- Iowa has had six first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010;
 DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a seven-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Former DL Adrian Clayborn (active), OL James Ferentz (inactive), WR Riley McCarron (injured reserve), and OL Cole Croston (practice squad) earned Super Bowl rings as members of the New England Patriots in Super Bowl LIII.
- Entering the 2019 season, every lowa senior starting tight end (14) under Kirk Ferentz
 has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 16 lowa tight
 ends since 1999 (11 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of lowa's starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 18 of the last 19 seasons. Iowa is 8-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (9) and Wisconsin (8) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 16-15-1 in 32 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (156-102) replaced Fry and is in his 21st season in 2019. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 330 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had 10 individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT), T.J. Hockenson (2018, Mackey, Top Tight End).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 69-46 (.596) since 2010.

LG Landan Paulsen and RG Levi Paulsen became the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was Iowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was Iowa's starting running back.

K Keith Duncan scored 8 points (1 FG, 5 PAT). Duncan had not played in game since January 1, 2017 at the Outback Bowl.

WR Oliver Martin made his Hawkeye debut and caught a 9-yard touchdown. Martin had one receiving touchdown for Michigan in 2018.

MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa is 97-32-2 (.740) in season-opening games, including a 18-3 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won six straight season openers and are 18-1 since 2001. Iowa has won nine straight nonconference games over the last two seasons.

Iowa opened the season under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the first time in program history. Iowa has hosted 19 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 13-6 record in those contests.

Miami won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 254 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 190 times (117-73). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 64 times (36-28).

INDIVIDUAL NOTES

K Keith Duncan connected on three field goals today (24, 40, 39). He has 22 made field goals this season, a new single-season school record. The record of 21 was previously shared by Rob Houghtlin (1987), Nate Kaeding (2002), and Kyle Schlicher (2004). Duncan is 22-25 on field attempts this season, and 12-14 on field goal tries of 40-yards. Duncan has 29 career made field goals, tying Miguel Recinos for eighth all-time.

WR Tyrone Tracy's 75-yard touchdown reception in the fourth quarter was Iowa's longest play of the season, the longest reception of Tracy's career, and ties for the longest pass of QB Nate Stanley's career (Nick Easley, 2019 Outback Bowl).

WR Tyrone Tracy set career highs in receptions (5) and receiving yard (130). It is his first career 100-yard receiving game, and the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye since Jake Duzey had 6 receptions for 138 yards against Ohio State in 2013. It is the most receiving yards by a Hawkeye wide receiver since Marvin McNutt had 8 receptions for 130 yards against Michigan State in 2011.

QB Nate Stanley threw for 208 yards, raising his career total to 7,509 and passing Ricky Stanzi (7,377) for third all-time in program history. Stanly had 205 yards total offense, raising his career total to 7,377 and passing Stanzi (7,373) for third all-time in program history.

QB Nate Stanley threw two touchdowns today (3, 75). He has 64 career touchdown passes in his career, No. 2 all-time in program history (Chuck Long, 74). Stanley has 18 career multi-touchdown games, including four this season. Stanley made his 35th consecutive start, the second longest streak by a Hawkeye QB in program history (Long, 47).

Two true freshmen made their first career starts. TE Sam LaPorta is the first true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at tight end, and LB Jack Campbell is the fourth true freshman in the Ferentz era to start at linebacker (James Morris, 2010; A.J. Edds, 2006; Fred Barr, 1999). Since 1999, 27 true freshmen have started for the Hawkeyes.

LB Barrington Wade made his first career start.

CB Matt Hankins' interception in the fourth quarter was the first of his career, and lowa's seventh of the season. Hankins had a game-high eight tackles.

WR Nico Ragaini caught a 3-yard touchdown in the fourth quarter, the first touchdown of his career.
