- QB Nate Stanley has eight touchdown passes and no interceptions in 2019. He has 60 career touchdowns passes, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list. (pages 6-7)
- QB Nate Stanley has started the last 30 games (29-1) and the Hawkeyes have averaged 30.2 points per game in those starts. Stanley has attempted 136 passes without throwing an interception, the sixth longest active streak in the country. (pages 6-7)
- DE A.J.Epenesa leads a defense that ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring defense (8.5) and total defense (251.0). Iowa has allowed four TDs in four games. Among Big Ten schools, only Penn State (3) has allowed fewer. (page 7)
- WR Smith-Marsette leads the team in receiving yards (254) and is tied for the team lead in receptions (15) and receiving touchdowns (3). He rushed for a touchdown (14 yards) in Week 4, his team-best fourth touchdown of the season. (page 7)
- lowa has three running backs averaging over 50-yard per game: Mekhi Sargent (74.8), Toren Young (62.8), and Tyler Goodson (50.5). Sargent leads the team in carries (54) and rushing yards (299), and ranks fourth in receptions (9) and receiving yards (102). His 401 all-purpose yards lead the team. (page 8)
- Then-true freshman K Keith Duncan converted a 33-yard field goal as time expired to propel the Hawkeyes to a 14-13 victory over #2 Michigan the last time these teams met (Nov. 12, 2016). The loss was the first of the season for Michigan, who entered the game a perfect 9-0.
- Saturday is Michigan's Homecoming. The Hawkeyes have won on their last two trips to Michigan on Homecoming (2002, 30-27; 2010, 38-28).
- Since 2001, Iowa has 152 wins and five top 10 finishes nationally. Michigan has 151 wins and four top 10 finishes.
- Kirk Ferentz (156, 92) and Hayden Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only lowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81). (page 5 & 12)
- The Hawkeyes are 4-0 for the fifth time under head coach Kirk Ferentz (2003, 2006, 2009, 2015, 2019). Iowa went on to win 10 or more games in 2003, 2009, and 2015. Iowa opened the season 5-0 in 2009 and 2015.

#### HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,250 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 654-557-39 (.539). That includes a 408-221-16 (.645) record in home games, a 246-336-23 (.426) record in games away from Iowa City, a 330-378-25 (.467) mark in Big Ten games and a 292-186-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

When Iowa hosts Minnesota on Nov. 16, it will mark the 130th anniversary of Iowa football. The Hawkeyes played their first football game on Nov. 16, 1889, against Grinnell.

#### **THE SERIES**

lowa has won two straight and five of the last six meetings against Michigan.

Saturday is Michigan's Homecoming. The Hawkeyes have won on their last two trips to Michigan on Homecoming (2002, 30-27; 2010, 38-28).

Michigan holds a 41-15-4 advantage in the series that began with a 28-5 lowa win in 1900. The first meeting between the two teams was played in Detroit and the second in Chicago.

Iowa is 7-25-3 all-time in games played in Ann Arbor, Michigan. Here are the series results:

#### **MOVE THE CHAINS**

The Hawkeyes set a Ferentz-era record in its 48-3 win over Middle Tennessee in Week 4. Iowa had 644 yards of total offense, the most in the Ferentz era (previous best was 613 vs. Minnesota in 2005), and the most by any Hawkeye team since 1997 (658 vs. Northern Iowa). Iowa rushed for 351 yards against Middle Tennessee, a mark that ranks fourth in the Ferentz era



# **HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ**

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 21st season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.

- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015).
   Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 156 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 92 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- lowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- lowa has played in 11 January bowl games with five January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl, 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, 2019 Outback Bowl).
- lowa has posted a 147-80 (.648) overall mark and an 88-58 (.603)
   Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 13 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At lowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 156-101 (.607) and an 92-72 (.561) mark in Big Ten games. He is lowa's all-time winningest football coach with 156 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 168-122 (.579).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college.
   Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013.
   Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

### FERENTZ MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz's 156 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. He is one of five coaches in Big Ten Conference history to win at least 150 games as a member of the Big Ten Conference. The top five includes Woody Hayes (202), Amos Alonza Stagg (199), Bo Schembechler (194), Joe Paterno (162), and Ferentz (156).

Ferentz has 92 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 92 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Ferentz (156-101) became lowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as lowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached lowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 21st season in 2019.

Both Ferentz (156, 92) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

lowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

#### **FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY**

Kirk Ferentz is in his 21st season as lowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named lowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 21st seasons on Iowa's staff. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), enters his eighth season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

# WIN, GRADUATE, DO IT RIGHT

Ten Hawkeyes wear a decal on their helmets indicating they have received their undergraduate degrees from the University of Iowa. The graduates include Drew Cook, John Milani, Landan Paulsen, Levi Paulsen, Colton Rastetter, Brady Reiff, Brady Ross, Ryan Schmidt, Jackson Subbert, and Nate Wieting.

## STANLEY CLIMBS SCHOOL AND CONFERENCE CHARTS

QB Nate Stanley has eight touchdown passes and no interceptions in 2019. He has 60 career touchdowns passes, third all-time in program history. He trails Chuck Long (74) and Drew Tate (61) on the all-time list.

Stanley has started the last 30 games at quarterback, and the Hawkeyes have averaged 30.2 points per game in those starts. That average ranks fifth in school history, and 10th nationally among active quarterbacks.

Stanley has attempted 136 passes without throwing an interception, the sixth longest active streak in the country.

Stanley has 17 career multi-touchdown games, including three this season. He completed three touchdown passes in the season opener against Miami, Ohio, three more in Week 2 against Rutgers, and two against Middle Tennessee in Week 4. He has 10 career games with at least three passing touchdowns. Only Long has more in program history (11).

Stanley threw 26 touchdown passes in 2018, second most in the Big Ten, one shy of tying Chuck Long (1985) for the most in single season school history, and tied for second most all-time in single season history. Stanley also threw 26 touchdown passes in 2017. Stanley's 52 touchdown passes from 2017-18 are the most ever in school history over a two-year span. Long tossed 49 touchdown passes from 1984 (22) to 1985 (27).

Stanley threw for a career-high 2,852 yards in 2018, the seventh-highest single-season total in school history. He ranks seventh in career passing yards (6,316) and sixth in career total offense (6,244).

Stanley is named to six preseason watch lists and listed on the preseason Big Ten third team by Phil Steele.

#### **POCKET PRESSURE**

DE A.J. Epenesa leads a defense that ranks third in the Big Ten in scoring defense (8.5) and total defense (251.0). Iowa has allowed four touchdowns in four games. Among Big Ten schools, only Penn State (3) has allowed fewer. The Hawkeyes rank fourth in the conference in opponent third-down conversions (.255).

lowa's defense allowed just five first downs against Rutgers in Week 2. That ties for the fewest allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era (Syracuse, 2007). Rutgers' 125 yards of total offense ranks as the fifth lowest total in the Ferentz era.

Epenesa had one sack and four quarterback hurries in Week 2. He led the Big Ten and ranked ninth in the country with 10.5 sacks in 2018.

Epenesa is named to four preseason All-America first teams, is listed on six preseason watch lists, and is preseason Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year by CollegeFootballNews.

Epenesa recorded at least one sack in nine of 13 games last season and was named first-team All-Big Ten by league media, and second-team All-Big Ten by league coaches. He ranked second in the conference and 16th nationally in forced fumbles (4), and ranked fourth in the Big Ten in tackles for loss. He totaled 37 tackles, four pass breakups, eight QB pressures, and a blocked punt in 2018. He recovered his own forced fumble and returned it 19 yards for a touchdown at Illinois.

The Hawkeyes ranked third in the Big Ten last season with 35 sacks, the second highest single-season total in the Ferentz era (2002, 40).

### **RETURN TO SENDER**

WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette is named on the Paul Hornung Award watch list, an honor bestowed to the most versatile player in college football.

Smith-Marsette leads the team in receiving yards (254) and is tied for the team lead in receptions (15) and receiving touchdowns (3). He rushed for a touchdown (14 yards) in Week 4, his team-best fourth touchdown of the season. He set a career-high with 113 receiving yards in Week 2.

Smith-Marsette averages 29.2 yards on 32 career kickoff returns. The Big Ten record of average kickoff return yardage (minimum 40 returns) is 28.8, set by Stan Brown of Purdue (1968-70).

In 2018, Smith-Marsette led the Big Ten and ranked No. 2 in the country, averaging 29.5 yards on 24 kickoff returns. He was named Rodgers-Dwight Return Specialist of the Year in the Big Ten Conference. He had 23 receptions for 361 yards and three touchdowns. His 15.7 yards per catch led the Hawkeyes (minimum 20 receptions).

## SARGENT LEADS RUNNING BACK BY COMMITTEE

Iowa has three running backs averaging over 50-yard per game: Mekhi Sargent (74.8), Toren Young (62.8), and Tyler Goodson (50.5).

Sargent leads the team in carries (54) and rushing yards (299), and ranks fourth in receptions (9) and receiving yards (102). His 401 all-purpose yards lead the team. He has started the last eight games and is named on the Doak Walker Award Preseason Watch List.

Young (33) and Goodson (34) both have 30-plus carries. Young leads Iowa and ranks fourth in the Big Ten with 7.6 yards per carry. He rushed for a career-high 131 yards in Week 4. It was his first career 100-yard rushing game.

Goodson has 34 carries and nine receptions. His 43 combined touches ranks second on the team to Sargent (63). Iowa averages 173.0 rushing yards per game, sixth in the Big Ten.

Young (131) and Goodson (97) rushed for career-high Week 4 against Middle Tennessee State. The Hawkeyes rushed for 351 yards in the game, the fourth highest total in the Ferentz era.

Juniors Ivory Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young shared the workload in 2018. The trio combined for 392 carries, 1,723 rushing yards and 16 rushing touchdowns (nine by Sargent, five by Young, and two by Kelly-Martin). Sargent had 40.6 percent of the carries (159-745), Young had 34.7 percent of the attempts (136-637), and Kelly-Martin has 24.7 percent of the carries (97-341).

# **YOUNG, SARGENT SURPASS 1,000 CAREER RUSHING YARDS**

Junior running backs Toren Young and Mekhi Sargent each surpassed 1,000 career rushing yards in Iowa's win over Middle Tennessee on Sept. 28.

Sargent entered the game with 953 rushing yards and moved past 1,000 for his career on a 12-yard run late in the first period. He ended the contest with 91 rushing yards to raise his career total to 1,044 yards on 213 attempts. He is the 48th lowa running back to surpass 1,000 career yards.

Young entered the contest with 950 career yards and surpassed 1,000 on a 15-yard run early in the second quarter, becoming the 49th lowa running back to surpass the century total. With a career-high 131 rushing yards against Middle Tennessee, Young now has 1,081 career yards on 214 attempts. Young ranks 39th on the career list, while Sargent is 45th.

Sargent moved over 1,000 career yards on career attempt 207, while Young went past 1,000 yards on career attempt 209.

In four games this season, Sargent has 54 attempts for 299 yards and two scores, while Young has 251 yards and one score on 33 attempts.

# **GRAND THEFT SECONDARY**

DB Michael Ojemudia is tied for second in the Big Ten lead with two interceptions. He intercepted a pass in each of the first two weeks. LB Djimon Colbert recorded the first interception of his career in Week 2.

The Hawkeyes have three interceptions this season. Iowa led the Big Ten and tied for second in the country in 2018 with 20 interceptions. Over the last three seasons, no school has more interceptions than Iowa. The Hawkeyes have 44 interceptions since 2017, tied for the most with Boston College.

Entering this season, lowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 11 seasons, and 16 of the last 18 seasons.

#### D.J. JOHNSON NAMED CO-BIG TEN FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

DB D.J. Johnson was named Big Ten Co-Freshman of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. In his second career start, Johnson recorded a career-high eight tackles, including six solo tackles and two assists, and added two pass break-ups. The Big Ten weekly honor is the first of his career.

K Keith Duncan has made 10-of-11 field goal attempts and 14-of-14 PAT attempts. He leads the team in scoring with 44 points. Duncan has connected on all six kicks of at least 40 yards. He kicked a career-long 49 yard field against Middle Tennessee in Week 4.

Duncan is seeing his first action since 2016, when he made 9-11 field goal attempts and 38-39 PAT attempts (one was blocked). That year he kicked a 33-yard field goal as time expired to lift lowa over #2 Michigan, 14-13.

Duncan was named Big Ten Special Teams Player of the Week and Lou Groza Award Star of the Week on Sept. 16 following his performance at Iowa State. Duncan connected on a career-best four field goals at Iowa State. His final kick from 39 yards provided the margin of victory with 4:51 remaining in the fourth quarter. He also connected from 25 yards on Iowa's first drive of the game and from 40 yards on the final play of the first half. He nailed a 42-yarder late in the third quarter.

The Big Ten weekly honor is the second of his career. He was previously recognized in 2016, earning the weekly honor following lowa's 14-13 win over Michigan. Duncan contributed two field goals in that win, including the game-winner from 33 yards on the final play of the game.

# **SEEING DOUBLE**

Senior offensive linemen Landan and Levi Paulsen started Weeks 1-4, becoming the first set of twin brothers to start for the Hawkeyes since SS Kent Ellis and CB Kevin Ellis in 1980. The last brothers to start in the same game for the Hawkeyes were James and LeShun Daniels. James was lowa's starting center in the 2016 season opener against Miami (Ohio), and LeShun was lowa's starting running back.

The Paulsens are the sixth set of twins to play football at the University of Iowa. The offensive linemen from Woodbury High School in Northwest Iowa join the company of Leo and Lloyd Jensvold (1929-30), Harold and Herbert Shoener (1946-47), Kent and Kevin Ellis (1977-80), Aaron and Evan Kooiker (1992), and Shane and Shaun Prater (2008).

#### TROPHY COLLECTION

lowa defended the Cy-Hawk Trophy with an 18-17 win at lowa State on Sept. 14. The Hawkeyes are 14-3 in their last 17 rivalry trophy games (lowa State, Minnesota, Nebraska, Wisconsin), with all three losses coming to Wisconsin. lowa has also won its last two bowl games, claiming trophies at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl and 2019 Outback Bowl. The Hawkeyes have won 11 straight non-conference games.

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchange waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

## **IOWA PROGRAM NOTES**

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 17 of the last 18 seasons. Iowa is 8-8 in bowl games since 2001. Only Ohio State (9) and Wisconsin (8) have more bowl wins among Big Ten teams since 2001. The Hawkeyes are 16-15-1 in 32 bowl games. Iowa has won five January bowl games under Ferentz.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took
  over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record
  of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz (152-101) replaced Fry and completed his 20th
  season in 2018. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under
  Fry.
- lowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. lowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. lowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 324 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- lowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, lowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- lowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- lowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 69-46 (.596) since 2010.

## **HAWKEYES IN THE NFL**

Iowa football players have a long tradition of being well prepared for professional football following their college playing careers. Since 2010, 37 Hawkeyes have been selected in the NFL Draft. Today, 31 Hawkeyes are on NFL rosters.

#### **IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL**

- The Hawkeyes have had 180 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz's first year as head coach (70 draft picks/110 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978 (42 consecutive years).
- TE T.J. Hockenson (eighth overall, Detroit) and TE Noah Fant (20th overall, Denver) became the first tight ends from the same school to be drafted in the first round of a single NFL Draft.
- DB Desmond King (Los Angeles Chargers), LS Casey Kreiter (Denver), TE George Kittle (San Francisco), and OL Marshal Yanda (Baltimore) were named All-Pro in 2018.
- Over the past 17 years, 150-of-175 (86 percent) of lowa's senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 12 years, Iowa has had 44 NFL Draft picks, fourth most in the Big Ten

   Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (45), and Michigan (45). Since 2010, Iowa has had 37 players drafted in the NFL, tied for fourth most in the Big Ten Ohio State (62), Penn State (39), and Wisconsin (37).
- Iowa has had six first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010;
   DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015, TE T.J. Hockenson, TE Noah Fant.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a seven-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16, 2018) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, 2016, and 2018.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his seventh year on staff and first as Iowa's offensive coordinator, was New England's tight ends coach.

# ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 16th season in 2019.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. All passengers must have a ticket. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

# **BACK ON CAMPUS**

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2019. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his eighth year on staff, his third as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 12th year on the lowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13. He was named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016, and was named defensive line coach in 2019.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

WR Oliver Martin made his Hawkeye debut and caught a 9-yard touchdown. Martin had one receiving touchdown for Michigan in 2018.

## MISCELLANEOUS

Iowa is 97-32-2 (.740) in season-opening games, including a 18-3 mark under coach Kirk Ferentz. The Hawkeyes have won six straight season openers and are 18-1 since 2001. Iowa has won nine straight nonconference games over the last two seasons.

Iowa opened the season under the lights at Kinnick Stadium for the first time in program history. Iowa has hosted 19 night games in Kinnick Stadium's history, holding a 13-6 record in those contests.

Miami won the toss and elected to defer. The Hawkeyes have played 254 games under head coach Kirk Ferentz. Iowa has opened the game on offense 190 times (117-73). The Hawkeyes have opened the game on defense 64 times (36-28).

Ten different Hawkeyes had at least one reception. Including career firsts from TE Sean Beyer, WR Oliver Martin (first as a Hawkeye), and RB Tyler Goodson.
