THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa softball team opens its 2011 season on the road at the Black and Red Showcase in Athens, Ga., Feb. 11-13. The Hawkeyes square off against Lipscomb and Maryland on Feb. 11, East Carolina and host Georgia on Feb. 12 and Illinois State on Feb. 13. All five games will be contested at Jack Turner Stadium.

THE OPPONENTS

Iowa will be provided a stiff challenge in its opening weekend of play, as all five opponents qualified for the NCAA Regionals a season ago. The host Bulldogs advanced to the final four of the 2010 Women's College World Series.

Lipscomb is receiving votes in the top 25 rankings after winning the Atlantic Sun regular season and tournament titles in 2010. The Lady Bisons are picked to repeat as A-Sun regular season champions. Whitney Kihul, the 2010 A-Sun Pitcher and Player of the Year, was tabbed as the 2011 A-Sun Preseason Pitcher of the Year after posting 33 victories and a 0.95 ERA a season ago.

Maryland returns eight starters and 15 letterwinners from a team that posted a 34-24 overall record last year. The Terrapins are picked to finish fifth in the Atlantic Coast Conference in 2011.

East Carolina returns four starters and 11 letterwinners from its 2010 squad that went 44-18 overall and claimed the Conference USA regular season and tournament titles. Toni Paisley is back to lead the Pirate pitching staff after finishing with a 31-11 record, 1.09 ERA and 356 strikeouts last season. Paisley was named to the ASA Top-50 Watch List.

Georgia, the tournament host, is ranked in the top-five of both preseason polls, coming in at No. 3 in the USA Today/NFCA and No. 4 in the ESPN.com/USA Softball rankings. The Bulldogs return eight starters and 16 letterwinners in 2011, which includes Alisa Goler and Taylor Schlopy, who are both on the USA Softball Collegiate Player of the Year Top-50 list.

Illinois State was tabbed as a preseason co-favorite in the Missouri Valley Conference along with Southern Illinois after posting a 32-20 record and advancing to the NCAA Regionals in 2010. The Redbirds return six starters and 11 letterwinners this season.

SERIES NOTES

- The Hawkeyes are a combined 38-17 against the five opponents at the Black & Red Showcase.
- Iowa is 34-17 all-time against Illinois State, 2-0 against Georgia, 1-1 against Maryland and 1-0 against East Carolina. Friday's season opener against Lipscomb will be the first meeting between the two schools.
- Iowa head coach Marla Looper is familiar with East Carolina. The Pirates knocked Looper and the Texas Longhorns out of the NCAA Austin Regional last season by the count of 1-0.

TWO-TIME ALL-BIG TEN SELECTION RETURNS

Two-time all-Big Ten selection Liz Watkins returns behind the plate for her junior season in Black and Gold. Last season, Watkins was a second team all-Big Ten selection after batting .328 with seven doubles, five triples, five home runs and 26 RBI. As a freshman, Watkins was a third team all-Big Ten honoree, hitting .331 with nine jacks and 45 RBI.

HEAD COACH MARLA LOOPER



Marla Looper is in her first season as head coach at the University of Iowa.

Looper comes to Iowa after serving as an assistant coach at the University of Texas for the past 11 seasons (1999-2010). Looper helped lead the Longhorns to three College World Series appearances (2003, 2005 and 2006) and nine NCAA Tournament berths. She also helped guide Texas to back-to-back Big 12 regular season and tournament championships in 2002 and 2003 along with regular season championships in 2006 and 2010.

Looper served as Texas' pitching coach from 1999-2005 and mentored softball great Cat Osterman to the USA National Player of the Year Award in 2003, 2005 and 2006. Texas' pitching staff led the nation in earned run average in three of Looper's final four years as pitching coach, while Osterman led the country in 2003 and 2006 in both earned run average and strikeouts per seven innings. In

2006, Osterman set an NCAA record with a 15.4 strikeouts per seven innings mark and also led the nation as a freshman in 2002 with 12.7 strikeouts per seven innings. Osterman won a gold medal in the 2004 Olympic Games in Athens, Greece.

As an assistant at Texas, Looper was a part of a staff that was named the National Fastpitch Coaches Association (NFCA) Coaching Staff of the Year in 2002-03 and the Speedline/NFCA Midwest Regional Coaching Staff of the Year in 2005-06.

Looper held numerous responsibilities in her 11 years in Austin. In addition to her pitching coach duties from 1999-2005, Looper was also in charge of daily workouts and game decisions and assisted with both the offense and defense. From 2006-10, she took over Texas' defense and was the offensive first base coach.

Looper was an assistant coach at the University of Kansas from 1996-99, where she served as recruiting coordinator and pitcher/catcher coach. She helped the Jayhawks to the NCAA Tournament in 1997 and 1999.

Prior to her stint in Lawrence, Looper was a pitcher/catcher coach at Iowa State from 1995-96.

Looper graduated from Florida State in 1995 with a bachelor's degree in nutrition and fitness. She was a pitching standout for the Seminoles, earning All-American honors as a junior in 1993. She led Florida State to the 1993 Women's College World Series and an NCAA Tournament appearance in 1994. Looper earned NCAA Regional All-Tournament honors and All-Atlantic Coast Conference honors in each of her two seasons at Florida State.

Looper's career earned run average of 0.78 at Florida State still stands as fifth best in Seminole history. Additionally, she led the 1993 and 1994 FSU squads in appearances, innings pitched, wins, strikeouts and ERA. In 2003, she was named one of the ACC's Top 50 softball players in conference history.

Prior to her two years in Tallahassee, Looper played at Crowder College in Neosho, MO, where she was selected as a National Junior College All-American as a freshman and sophomore and the National Junior College Athletic Association (NJCAA) Tournament's most valuable player during her sophomore season. Looper helped Crowder to a runner-up finish in the NJCAA Tournament in both 1991 and 1992. Looper was inducted into the NJCAA Hall of Fame in 2006.

MOVIN' ON UP

A pair of Hawkeyes enter the season among the career statistical leaders in school history. Junior Liz Watkins is tied for 13th with 14 career home runs. Senior Chelsey Carmody is tied for 15th with 95 career runs scored, while sitting just outside the top 10 in career triples with nine.

CARMODY BACK TO ANCHOR INFIELD

Senior Chelsey Carmody returns to anchor the infield for the Hawkeyes after starting 47-of-48 games during her junior season. The Missouri native made 34 starts at shortstop a season ago, finishing with a .327 batting average with a team-best 51 hits, seven home runs and 32 RBI.

IN THE CIRCLE

Sophomore Chelsea Lyon returns as the most experienced pitcher on the Hawkeye staff after appearing in 29 games as a true freshman. The Broken Arrow, Okla., native posted nine victories with a 2.95 earned run average. She struck out 48 batters in 102.0 innings.

Freshman Kayla Massey joins the collegiate ranks after earning ESPN Third Team All-American honors as a senior at Trabuco Hills High School. The California native posted a 0.32 ERA in 2010 and struck out a school record 250 batters in 2010.
