Scouting Northwestern ● The Northwestern Wildcats are 8-17 overall and tied for 10th in the Big Ten with a 2-12 record.

Chelsy Hyser leads the team with 254 kills, while Sabel Moffett has a team-best .306 attack percentage and 102 total blocks. Elyse Glab is the team's primary setter with 900 assists, and Kate Nobilio had 446 digs.

Iowa trails 24-32-1 in the all-time series.

Last Meeting ● Iowa started Big Ten play with a 2-0 record for only the fifth time in school history after defeating Northwestern, 3-1 Sept. 27.

Sophomore Aimee Huffman recorded a career-high 20 kills with an impressive .444 attack percentage and also had seven digs and two block assists. Senior Catherine Smale collected her fifth double-double of the season with 14 kills and 16 digs, with senior Laura Kremer and junior Megan Schipper each finishing with 10 kills. Senior Kiley Fister put up a team-high 49 assists and senior libero Emily Hiza and 20 digs.

Scouting Wisconsin • The Wisconsin Badgers are 16-10 overall and tied for sixth place in the Big Ten with a 6-8 mark.

Brittney Dolgner leads the team with 308 kills, with Audra Jeffers leading the way with a .305 attack percentage and 106 total blocks. Nikki Klingsporn has a team-best 621 assists and Kim Kuzma has 415 digs.

Iowa trails, 18-39-1 in the all-time series.

Last Meeting • Iowa snapped a 26-match losing streak against Wisconsin, with a dominating, 3-0, upset win over the then-ranked No. 18 Badgers to open Big Ten play Sept. 26. The win was Head Coach **Sharon Dingman's** first Big Ten win and marked only the third time this decade that an lowa volleyball team opened the conference season with a victory.

Senior Catherine Smale led the Hawkeyes with 12 kills, while junior Megan Schipper chipped in six. Senior Laura Kremer and sophomore Aimee Huffman had five kills, while Kremer added eight total blocks. Senior Kiley Fister led the team with 19 assists. Senior libero Emily Hiza had a team-high 11 digs.

Hawkeyes Fall Short in Upset Bid • Iowa nearly pulled an upset over No. 16 Illinois last Friday, but eventually fell in four sets.

The Hawkeyes opened the match with a win, but couldn't hold on for the win. Senior **Catherine Smale** and junior **Megan Schipper** each had 16 kills in the loss. Schipper added 12 digs to record a double-double.

Close Against the Boilermakers • The Hawkeyes kept things close against No. 18 Purdue, but were defeated in three sets. Iowa dropped the first two sets by a total of four points before falling, 25-16, in the third and final frame.

Senior **Catherine Smale** had 10 kills, with senior **Laura Kremer** and junior **Megan Schipper** finishing with six. Freshman **Joanna Giampoli** came off the bench to give Iowa a spark, recording four kills and three total blocks.

Dingman Closing in on Milestone • Head Coach **Sharon Dingman** enters this weekend just one win away from career win No. 350.

Dingman tallied 22 wins in one year at Auburn, 167 wins in eight years at Butler, 147 wins in eight years at Illinois State and 13 wins so far in her first season at Iowa.

Hawkeyes Rank High in Attendance ● Iowa currently ranks 36th nationally in attendance, averaging 1,022 fans per match. The Hawkeyes have drawn a total of 10,216 fans for their seven home matches.

In addition, three of the top five crowds in school history have been set this season. Iowa drew 1,746 fans against Michigan State Oct. 18, which is the second-largest in school history. The Hawkeyes drew 1,701 against Penn State Oct. 10, which ranks third in the record books. Carver-Hawkeye Arena also saw a crowd of 1,598 against Indiana Oct. 11, which is the fifthlargest crowd in school history.



Head Coach Sharon Dingman



Sharon Dingman was hired as the eighth coach in Iowa volleyball history March 21, 2008.

Dingman comes to Iowa after serving as head coach at Illinois State from 2000-07, where she compiled a 147-98 record. In 2007, Dingman led the Redbirds to their first at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament since 1997 after reaching the championship match

of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and finished with a 21-12 overall record.

Illinois State produced winning seasons in seven of the eight seasons under Dingman and never finished lower than fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Redbirds also reached at least the semifinals of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament in six of her eight seasons. Dingman produced 21 all-Missouri Valley Conference selections, including Player of the Year, Libero of the Year and two Freshman of the Year honorees. Two players also garnered all-district and all-region honors.

Redbird teams under Dingman were also strong in the classroom. Eleven players were named to the league's scholarathlete squad in her eight seasons and in 2004, four volleyball student-athletes earned perfect 4.00 grade-point-averages and the team recorded a 3.32 GPA. In 2005, her volleyball team won the academic award for the highest GPA in the athletic department.

Dingman started her head coaching career in 1991 at Auburn, where she led the Tigers to a 22-13 record in her only season at the helm. Her 1991 squad become the first Auburn volleyball tem to receive votes in the national poll and Auburn's fourth place finish in the SEC that season marked the highest finish ever for Auburn at the time. Two student-athletes earned all-SEC honors, including Jenifer Kleyn, who was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was an NCAA post-graduate scholarship recipient who carried a 4.0 GPA.

She then moved to Butler in 1992, where she served as head coach for eight seasons. Dingman led the Bulldogs to four 20 win seasons and three postseason tournaments, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1997 after capturing the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. She was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1997 after compiling a 28-7 record. Dingman guided three student-athletes to MCC Player of the Year honors, seven to all-region accolades and five to "Top 100 Student" honors at Butler.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Dingman spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at three Division I programs. After one season at Northern Michigan (1984), she assisted at Texas Tech for three seasons (1985-87). Dingman then spent three seasons at Kentucky (1988-90) and helped the Wildcats to an SEC Championship in 1988 along with three-straight regional finals appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

Solid in the Classroom • Seniors **Emily Hiza** and **Kiley Fister** have been named *ESPN the Magazine* Academic all-District by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Hiza was named to the first team and will now appear on the ballot for Academic all-America consideration. She accries a 3.95 GPA with a double-major in marketing and finance.

Fister was a third team selection and has a 3.65 GPA in interdepartmental studies with a Spanish minor.

Hiza Nearing Record • Senior libero **Emily Hiza** needs just 92 more digs to become lowa's all-time leader in the statistical category.

Hiza currently has 1,839 digs and needs to average 15.3 digs per match in order to set the record. Former Hawkeye Janet Moylan holds the record at 1,931 digs from 1987-90.
