#### THE MATCH-UP

**HAWKEYES** 

- lowa and Penn State will play a three-game series April 19-21 at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park in University Park, Pa. The series will open Friday at 5:05 p.m. (CT), followed by a 1:05 p.m. (CT) Saturday game and an 11:05 a.m. (CT) Sunday contest.
- The Hawkeyes resume Big Ten play after playing five straight nonconference games. lowa is 2-7 in conference play, while Penn State is 0-9.
- Medlar Field at Lubrano Park stretches 325 down the left field line, 399 to center field, and 320 feet down the right field line. The Hawkeyes are 3-8 all-time at the facility since it was built in 2006, last playing at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park in 2010.
- lowa is 3-4 in away games this season. The Nittany Lions are 3-6 at home this season.


#### **THE RADIO**

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31.

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. Iowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his Iowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. Iowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

#### THE SERIES

- Penn State leads the all-time series between the teams, 36-27.
- The Nittany Lions won 2-of-3 last season in lowa City, taking the first two games. Pitcher Sasha Kuebel led the Hawkeyes to a 4-2 win in the series finale, allowing two runs on seven hits in 7 1/3 innings on the mound. Jake Yacinich led the Hawkeyes offensively, going 2-of-4 with two runs and an RBI.
- Iowa and Penn State last met in University Park in 2010. The Hawkeyes won 2-of-3 games, winning the final two games of a three-game set.

#### **SCOUTING PENN STATE**

Penn State enters the weekend with an 8-24 overall record and an 0-9 mark in Big Ten play. The Nittany Lions won their last game, defeating Bucknell, 7-6, in 12 innings on Wednesday.

The Nittany Lions, who hit .250 as a team, are led offensively by sophomore J.C. Coban. Coban paces the team in batting average (.301), slugging percentage (.381), hits (34), home runs (2), and total bases (43). Senior Luis Montesinos leads the squad with 18 RBIs. Coban (2-for-5) and Montesinos (3-for-5) tallied five of Penn State's 11 hits Wednesday against Bucknell.

Righthanders T.J. Jann and Steven Hill will start for the Nittany Lions on Friday and Saturday. Penn State has not yet announced its Sunday starter. Jann has made eight appearances this season, making five starts. He owns a 1-4 record with a 3.79 ERA over 35 2/3 innings. Hill has made eight appearances, all starts, going 1-6 with a 3.65 ERA over 56 2/3 innings. Hill threw a no-hitter against the Hawkeyes last season in a 2-0 win on April 21, facing just two batters over the minimum en route to recording the first no-hitter by a Penn State pitcher since 1995.

Penn State in coached by Robbie Wine, who is in his ninth year at the helm of the program.

#### HAWKEYES DOWN UNO IN PAPILLION

lowa defeated Nebraska-Omaha, 3-0, on Tuesday at Werner Park in Papillion, Neb. It was the Hawkeyes' first shutout of the season, as their last came March 31, 2012, in a 4-0 win at Indiana. Freshman Calvin Mathews and sophomore Taylor Kaufman combined to pitch the shutout, as Mathews threw five innings to pick up the win and Kaufman collected the save after pitching four innings. Sophomore Kris Goodman played a part in all three Hawkeye runs, going 2-for-4 at the plate with a run scored and two RBIs.

#### **TURNING 2**

The Hawkeyes have turned 34 double plays through 31 games this season, ranking 39th nationally. Iowa ranks 13th in double plays per game (1.1). The Hawkeyes last double play sealed a victory, as they turned a 4-6-3 double play with one out in the bottom of the ninth inning April 7 against Nebraska to secure a 6-5 win.

#### OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 59 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. lowa leads second place Indiana by 12, as the Hoosiers have been plunked 47 times this season. The 59 hit-by-pitches rank tied for 14th nationally.

Three Hawkeyes -- senior Keith Brand, junior Taylor Zeutenhorst and sophomore Kris Goodman -- rank in the top-eight in the Big Ten in hit-by-pitches. Brand has been hit three times in a game on three occasions (UALR, Maine, UNO) en route to getting plunked a team-high 14 times, ranking second in the conference. Zeutenhorst and Goodman have been hit eight times, placing them tied for eighth in the Big Ten.

lowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season.

#### **B1G WINS LEADER**

Senior pitcher Matt Dermody is tied for first in the Big Ten with six wins. Dermody is 6-1 in nine starts this season, picking up wins against Austin Peay (Feb. 16), Western Illinois (March 2), Georgetown (March 9), Nebraska-Omaha (March 17), Northwestern (March 23), and Kansas State (April 12). The Norwalk, Iowa, native has thrown 57 1/3 innings, the eighth-most among Big Ten pitchers, and leads the team with 39 strikeouts. His 39 strikeouts are tied for ninth in the conference.

Dermody's six wins set a career-high, besting the four wins he recorded during his sophomore season. lowa has won seven of the nine games in which Dermody has started, as he has allowed two runs or less in six of the nine starts.

Dermody recorded his third career complete game March 23 against Northwestern. The 6-foot-5 lefthander allowed one unearned run and struck out five, scattering seven hits.

#### NO STRANGER TO THE BIG TEN

Senior Matt Dermody has made 20 career Big Ten starts, including Big Ten Tournament play, ranking third among active Big Ten pitchers. Dermody trails Penn State's Steven Hill and Illinois' Kevin Johnson, who have both made 27 career Big Ten starts. The





Norwalk, Iowa, native has made three Big Ten starts in 2013 after starting eight Big Ten contests in 2011 and 2012.

#### A SPARK OFF THE BENCH

Sophomore Anthony Torres provided a spark off the Iowa bench April 13 against Kansas State. Torres entered the contest in the top of the fourth inning, going 2-for-3 with two RBIs and a triple. It was the first triple and multi-RBI game of his collegiate career.

Torres has started the Hawkeyes' last two games at third base, recording another multi-hit game April 16 against Nebraska-Omaha.

#### **ROSCETTI ROLLING**

Freshman Nick Roscetti has recorded a hit in six straight games, going 8-for-20 (.400) at the plate over the stretch. Roscetti's best game of the streak was on April 9 against Kansas. The Sherman, Ill., went 3-for-5 against the Jayhawks, his highest hit total of the season. Roscetti has played in 20 games, hitting .311 at the plate with 14 hits and three RBIs.

#### **SOPHOMORES DRIVING IN RUNS**

Sophomores Taylor Kaufman and Jake Yacinich are tied for the team lead with 17 RBIs. Kaufman has a team-high five multi-RBI games this season, while Yacinich is hitting a team-high .378 (14-of-37) with runners in scoring position.

#### STRONG DEFENSE BEHIND THE PLATE

Catchers Keith Brand and Dan Sheppard have combined to throw out 15 baserunners this season. Brand, a junior, has caught nine baserunners stealing this season, ranking fourth in the Big Ten. Sheppard, a senior, has caught six base runners attempting to steal this season. The mark is tied for 12th in the conference.

#### **HIBBING WITH THE SAVE**

Sophomore Nick Hibbing leads the Hawkeyes and is tied for eighth in the Big Ten with three saves. Hibbing earned his first save against Western Illinois on March 2, throwing two scoreless innings in relief of starter Matt Dermody. The Lindenhurst, III., native's second save came March 10 against West Virginia, as he pitched the 12th inning and induced a game-ending double play. Hibbing collected his third save April 12 against Kansas State, tossing three scoreless innings.

#### THE THIEF

Sophomore Eric Toole is 13-of-15 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's 13 swipes are a team-best and are four off the Big Ten lead, placing him tied for fourth among

Big Ten athletes. His 13 steals rank 55th nationally. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native has stolen six bases during Big Ten play (nine games), ranking second in the conference.

#### THE HUMAN MAGNET

Junior Keith Brand has been prone to getting plunked by opposing pitchers this season. The Northbrook, III., native has been hit by 14 pitches, the second-most of any Big Ten athlete and the 15th-highest total nationally. Brand ranks fourth nationally in hit-by-pitches per game.

The 14 hit-by-pitches is the sixth-highest season total in program history, tying Kurtis Muller (2008) and Kevin Hoef (2007). Hoef holds the single season and career hitby-pitch record, as he was plunked 20 times in 2008 and 62 times over his Hawkeye career (2006-09).

#### **GOODMAN HITTING EVERYBODY**

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been raking against left and right handed pitching this year. The Apple Valley, Minn., native is batting .348 (31-of-89) against righthanders and .333 (11-of-33) against southpaws.

Goodman leads the Hawkeyes in batting average (.344), on-base percentage (.437), hits (42), runs scored (24), and total bases (46). His 42 hits are tied for 10th in the Big Ten, while his .344 batting average is tied for 11th.

Goodman has tallied a team-high 11 multi-hit games, including seven three-hit efforts.

#### THE IRON MAN

Sophomore Kris Goodman is the only Hawkeye to start all 31 games this season, starting 14 games in left field, 14 in right field, and three in center field. Goodman made 22 starts as a freshman, starting 14 games in center field and seven in left. Classmates Jake Mangler and Taylor Kaufman have each started 29 contests, the second-most on the team.

#### A TOUGH OUT

Sophomore Jake Mangler has been a tough out for opposing pitchers. The Clinton, lowa, native ranks 27th nationally in the toughest to strike out category, which divides a players' plate appearances by his strikeouts. Mangler has struck out seven times in 116 at-bats, giving him a score of 16.6. Mangler is hitting .250 with 13 runs scored and 12 RBIs this season.

#### PROVIDING HELP IN THE FIELD

Sophomore Jake Mangler totaled eight fielding assists April 13 against Kansas State. Mangler became the first Hawkeye since Jason White on May 18, 2007, to record

eight or more assists in a contest. Mangler leads the team with 98 assists this season.

#### **SANDQUIST CONTINUES TO SHINE**

Senior Ricky Sandquist has been spectacular this season after making an adjustment to his pitching mechanics, going to a 3/4 arm slot.

Sandquist is 1-0 with a 1.50 ERA. The Fort Dodge, lowa, native has allowed two earned runs in seven relief appearances, holding opponents scoreless in seven of the eight outings. Sandquist collected his first save April 7 against Nebraska. inducing a 4-6-3 double play to end the game. He tallied his first win March 24 after tossing three innings against Texas A&M Corpus Christi. Sandquist has also made two starts, posting a 3.12 ERA over 8 2/3 innings.

#### **LEGGING OUT TRIPLES**

Junior Taylor Zeutenhorst has a team-high two triples this season, tallying three-baggers against West Virginia (March 10) and Nebraska-Omaha (March 18). The two triples are tied for the ninthmost among Big Ten athletes.

#### **IOWA IN EXTRA-INNINGS**

lowa is 2-1 in extra-inning games. The Hawkeyes won their first two contests that went into extras, downing New Mexico, 6-2, in 10 innings on Feb. 23 and defeating West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on March 10. Iowa fell to Northwestern, 2-1, in 13 innings on March 22. The Hawkeyes have outscored opponents 6-1 in extra-innings.

#### 1-RUN GAMES UNDER DAHM

During Jack Dahm's 10-year tenure at lowa, the Hawkeyes have played 127 one-run games. Iowa

#### KENYON'S NINE-GAME HIT STREAK

Junior Trevor Kenyon recorded a nine-game hitting streak from March 30-April 12, the longest streak by a Hawkeye this season. Kenyon hit .421 (16-of-38) over the stretch with five doubles, a triple, and 10 RBIs. The Davenport, Iowa, native posted two or more hits in six of the nine contests, including a season-high three hits April 6 against Nebraska.

#### **KAUFMAN REACHES BASE IN 22 STRAIGHT**

Sophomore Taylor Kaufman reached base safely in 22 consecutive games, setting a new career best. The streak began Feb. 17 at Austin Peay during the opening weekend of the 2013 season and ended April 9 against Kansas. Kaufman's streak was the longest by a Hawkeye since 2010 when Mike McOuillan ended the season with a 23-game reached base streak.

#### **DAHM COLLECTS 500TH WIN**

lowa head coach Jack Dahm won his 500th career game as a collegiate coach in the Hawkeyes 7-3 triumph over Western Illinois on March 2.

Dahm, who is in his 20th season as a head coach, currently has 509 career victories, winning 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and 226 games at lowa, beginning in 2004. His 226 wins at lowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Vogel (440 wins).

#### HAWKEYES SWEEP SNOWBIRD CLASSIC

The Hawkeyes posted a 3-0 record, defeating Maine, 9-2, on March 8, Georgetown, 7-2, on March 9, and West Virginia, 6-4, in 12 innings on Sunday. It is the first time lowa has won three games at a three day tournament since sweeping three games at the Austin Peay Tournament in 2006.
