The Setting • Iowa (16-10, 9-6) will host Indiana (15-11, 9-6) Sunday in a game that will determine who will finish fifth in the Big Ten standings and receive a first round bye in next week's Big Ten Tournament. The regular season finale will tip-off at 12:06 p.m. at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500). Tickets are \$7 for adults, \$5 for youths and University students are admitted free with student I.D. Iowa has won nine-straight games over Indiana at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

On the Tube • Sunday's game will be televised to a regional cable audience on Comcast SportsNet Chicago. Dave Eanet, June Olkowski and Chris Boden will call the action.

On the Radio • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines and WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids.

The game can also be heard live over the Internet at <u>www.hawkeyesports.com</u>. Just click "Hawkeye All-Access" at the top right of the page. "Hawkeye All-Access" is a subscription service.

Sunday's contest can also be heard on XM Satellite Radio, channel 199.

Iowa History • Iowa has played 905 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 553-352 (.611). That includes a 276-131 (.678) mark in Big Ten games and a 248-61 (.803) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

On This Date • Iowa is 4-2 in games played on Feb. 26, including winning two of the last three. Sunday will be Iowa's first meeting vs. Indiana on Feb. 26.

Giant Killers • Iowa has recorded two victories over top-ten opponents this season (No. 9 Michigan State 75-64 and No. 8 Purdue 77-71, ot). The last time the Hawkeyes recorded two wins against top-ten teams in the same season was Head Coach Lisa Bluder's first season on the Hawkeye sidelines (2000-01). Iowa picked up two victories over Purdue that year, first when it was ranked fifth (96-87 at Iowa City) and second when the Boilermakers were ranked seventh (75-70 at Grand Rapids).

Gold on the Road • lowa will wear its gold uniforms in all road games this year after it had its black uniforms shrunk at the Odwalla Classic, Nov. 25-26. After the Hawkeyes played nationally-ranked Oklahoma on Nov. 25, the San Francisco Athletic Department, who hosted the tournament, accidentally overheated lowa's road uniforms while washing the uniforms for the lowa's consolation game vs. Rider.

Crystal Smith Nets Career Point No. 1,000 • Crystal Smith became the 22nd Iowa player to amass 1,000 career points when the senior netted 26 points vs. No. 8 Ohio State on Jan. 12 to eclipse the 1,000-point plateau. Smith currently ranks 15th in Hawkeye career scoring (1,151), 1,014 of which came the last 59 games (17.2 ppg). She also ranks fifth in career triples (111) and steals (206).

Smith averaged 1.1 points per game in 21 games her freshman year, followed by a 3.9 scoring average in 29 contests her sophomore season and 16.8 ppg her junior year. Smith currently averages 17.6 ppg through 26 games in her senior campaign. Smith's scoring average ranks second in the Big Ten. She has led lowa in scoring 15 times this season.

Reedy Set Go • Tiffany Reedy played the best basketball of her career at No. 7 Ohio State and No. 14 Michigan State. Reedy scored 36 points, bolstered by 10-16 shooting behind the arc on the two-game road trip. She posted personal bests in scoring (20), field goals made (7) and attempted (13), 3-pointers made (6) and attempted (11) and matched career bests in blocks (2) and minutes (38) in the two-point loss at No. 14 Michigan State. Her new career high in scoring bests her previous best (18) established in her first game vs. IUPUI -- a span of 117 games. The native of Dysart, IA, ranks fourth in team scoring (7.3) and steals (22) and third in rebounding (4.0). She ranks third in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.415).

Scouting Indiana • Indiana fell into a fifth-place tie with Iowa after a 65-58 setback at No. 21 Minnesota Thursday night. The Hoosiers will play their third-straight road contest to end the regular season Sunday at Iowa. Indiana upset ninth-ranked Purdue (63-61) in an overtime thriller last Sunday in West Lafayette.

Indiana is led by senior Cyndi Valentin. The guard was earned co-Big Ten Player of the Week honors for the second-straight week after notching a team-high 25 points, including a deep 3-pointer with five seconds in regulation to send the game at Purdue into overtime at 55-55. In overtime, Valentin came up big for the Hoosiers, scoring six of Indiana's eight points. She ranks second in Big Ten scoring (17.6).

Forward Jenny DeMuth is in her final season as a Hoosier after red-shirting last year due to injury. The senior ranks 12th in Big Ten scoring (13.7) and fourth in rebounding (7.4).

Indiana ranks second in field goal percentage defense (.387), 3-point field goal percentage defense (.300), rebounds allowed (32.5) and third in scoring defense (58.4).

The Hoosiers are coached by Sharon Versyp, who is in her sixth year (113-62, .646) as a head coach and her first season (15-11, .577) with Indiana.

All-Time Series Record • Sunday will mark the 47th meeting between Iowa and Indiana. The Hawkeyes boast a 35-13 advantage over the Hoosiers. Iowa has dominated Indiana at Iowa City, leading the series 19-3, including winning the last nine at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. Indiana snapped a fourgame losing skid to Iowa with a 65-53 triumph in Bloomington on Dec. 29.

Iowa, Indiana Fast Breaks • Sunday's game has huge implications regarding conference tournament seeding and NCAA Tournament hopes for Iowa and Indiana.

 Sunday's game features two of the league's premier players in Iowa's Crystal Smith and Indiana's Cyndi Valentin. Both Smith and Valentin enter Sunday's game tied for second in Big Ten scoring, each scoring exactly 458 points through 25 games.

 Iowa rookie Megan Skouby started her first career game at Indiana on Dec. 29, after starting center Stacy Schlapkohl tore her ACL in the Hawkeyes' final non-conference game vs. Creighton on Dec. 23. Skouby got into early foul trouble and only played 19 minutes, but did post 10 points and seven rebounds.

• Seven of Iowa's ten losses this season have come to ranked opponents. The three losses to unranked foes came on the road at Iowa State, Indiana and Penn State. Iowa is 10-3 in home games this season, with its three defeats coming to No. 6 Rutgers, No. 8 Ohio State and No. 12 Minnesota.

• Iowa's Krista VandeVenter collected three steals at Illinois to raise her season total to 57. The 57 thefts is a new Iowa single-season record for a sophomore, besting Toni Foster's 56 established in 1990-91.

• Iowa was out-rebounded in its ten losses. The Hawkeyes boast a 14-2 record when holding opponents to 69 points or less and are 14-1 when having a higher field goal percentage than their foes.

• Iowa is shooting at a blistering 84.2 percent clip at the foul line in the final five minutes of its 15 conference games. The Hawkeyes have converted 64 of their 76 free throw attempts down the stretch.

• Hawkeye senior Tiffany Reedy has a higher shooting percentage from 3-point range than inside the arc. Reedy is shooting 41.5 percent (34-82) from behind the arc and 36.9 percent (31-84) from two-point range.

Iowa freshman Megan Skouby ranks third in conference games only scoring, averaging 16.6 points.
 She is the highest ranking freshman in scoring, since Penn State's Kelly Mazzante ranked first in 2000-01, averaging 19.7 points.

 Four teams have already solidified seeds in next week's Big Ten Tournament in Indianapolis. Ohio State will be seeded first, Purdue will be seeded second, Northwestern will be 10th and Michigan will be 11th.

lowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

RPI Ratings • lowa ranks 60th, while Indiana ranks 52nd in the RPI ratings published on <u>www.collegerpi.com</u>. All ten lowa losses came to opponents with an RPI of 99 or better, including four in the top 10.

Last Meeting • lowa opened the Big Ten season with a 65-53 loss to Indiana at Assembly Hall. Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 14 points, while Krista VandeVenter grabbed eight rebounds in the loss.

After a back-and-forth first half, Indiana used a 14-0 run in the final 6:47 of the half to gain a 27-16 advantage. Wendy Ausdemore nailed a 3-pointer as time expired to cut the halftime deficit to 27-19. Ausdemore's triple was lowa's first bucket in the half since the 7:05 minute mark.

Megan Skouby, who started her first career game at center, was whistled for two quick fouls in the first two minutes, spending the remaining 18 minutes of the period on the bench.

The Hoosiers opened up their biggest lead at 16 points with 13:53 left, using an 8-0 run capped by a 3-point play by Jenny DeMuth. Iowa cut the lead to six at the 7:28 mark with a 9-0 run, all of which were 3-point baskets. Lindsey Nyenhuis drained her first basket of the game and back-to-back treys by Smith cut the Hoosier lead to 43-36.

Indiana fought back and gained a nine point lead with 1:58 left, but a 3-point play by Smith cut the Hoosier advantage to six once again. This was the closest lowa would come to gaining a lead as the Hoosiers sunk six free throws down the stretch to secure the victory.

Skouby recorded 10 points and two blocks in only 19 minutes of action, while VandeVenter played the entire 40 minutes. Kristi Smith added six assists for the Hawkeyes.

Indiana was led by Cyndi Valentin who scored a game-high 20 points. Jenny DeMuth notched a double-double 13 points and 10 rebounds, while Angela Hawkins scored 12 for the Hoosiers. Indiana outscored Iowa 28-18 in the paint, while outrebounding the Hawkeyes 41-31.

Last Time Out • Crystal Smith scored a game-high 23 points to lead lowa to a 71-60 victory over Illinois at Assembly Hall. The win is lowa's six-straight over the Fighting Illini, including winning the last three at Assembly Hall.

lowa nearly took an eight-point advantage into the half, but Illinois freshman Lori Bjork drained an off balance 3-pointer at the buzzer to trim the Hawkeye advantage to five (40-35). Iowa improved to 12-2 when leading at the break.

Illinois scored the second half's first four points to cut Iowa's advantage to one (40-39). The Hawkeyes countered by scoring the next 10 points to rebuild their lead to 11 (50-39) with 14:03 left. Later in the half, the Fighting Illini fought back with a 10-2 run to cut their deficit to six points (56-50) with 8:01 remaining. However, Iowa maintained its advantage and held on for the 11-point victory.

Skouby contributed 18 points, six rebounds and two blocks for the Hawkeyes. Freshman reserve Wendy Ausdemore scored double figures for the fifth time this season, netting 14 points. Iowa improves to 11-3 when Ausdemore scores seven points or more.

lowa did a good job coveting the basketball and feeding its post, as the Hawkeyes out-scored Illinois 22-6 in the paint and posted a season-low 10 turnovers. Iowa also converted 14 Illinois turnovers into 19 points; out-scoring the Fighting Illini 19-2 in points off turnovers.

Three Illinois players tallied double figures to lead the Fighting Illini. Lori Bjork and Erin Wigley each netted 15 points, while Janelle Hughes added 14. Danyel Crutcher pulled down a game-high 11 rebounds.

A Crystal Smith free throw at the 3:49 mark of the first stanza, marked her 1,000th combined point the last two years.

lowa's win snapped a three-game road losing skid for lowa. The Hawkeyes' last triumph away from lowa City came at Wisconsin (68-59) on Jan. 19. lowa also picked up its ninth conference win, besting last year's total of eight.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of lowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 468-211 (.689), including a 112-69 (.619) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach

of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Saved By The Bell • The Iowa Women's Basketball Team got a thrill last Thursday as they received a message from one of the stars of the cult sitcom *Saved By The Bell*, Dennis Haskins (Mr. Belding).

ESPN analyst Nancy Lieberman, who is good friends with the actor, was calling the game for ESPNU and after she found out that the team staged a "Saved By The Bell" theme party and were such big fans, she tried to put the team in touch with Haskins. Iowa's Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert left a message with the actor after its afternoon shoot-around. After the game, Lieberman played back a message in front of all the Hawkeyes that Haskins left for the team on her cell phone.

DE-FENSE! • Iowa's perimeter defense has been stellar through 26 games. The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten 3-point field goal defense (.286). Last season Iowa ranked 10th in the league in 3-point field goal defense (.361).

In the Rankings • lowa ranks sixth in the nation in free throw percentage, 13th in assists, 18th in field goal percentage and 23rd in scoring and fewest fouls through games played Feb. 20.

Another First • lowa never had a regulation lead in its thrilling 77-71 victory over Purdue on Feb. 2. The Hawkeyes' first lead came one minute into overtime. It is believed to be the first time in lowa women's basketball history that the Hawkeyes won a game without holding the lead in regulation.

Skouby Trying to Join Elite List • Megan Skouby is lowa's scoring leader in conference games only, averaging 16.6 points. Only two other freshman Hawkeyes have ever finished the season leading the team in scoring in league games only (Lisa Becker, 1984 and Tiffany Gooden, 1995). She enters the last regular season game 13 points ahead of Crystal Smith.

Skouby's 363 overall points ranks fourth in Iowa freshman single-season scoring, just one point from Cindy Haugejorde's 364 established in 1976-77 for third.

Skouby Leads Big Ten Freshmen • Megan Skouby has raised her game to a new level since taking over the starting center position for injured sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl. Skouby, who is the Big Ten freshmen scoring leader, averages 16.6 points, 5.8 rebounds and 1.73 blocks in conference play. The 6-6 standout ranks 11th in overall scoring (14.0) in the Big Ten, fourth in blocks (1.69) and field goal percentage (.550). She ranks third in conference scoring (16.6), fourth in blocks (1.73) and 13th in rebounding (5.8).

Skouby has led Iowa in scoring eight of the last 16 contests, including five of the last ten. She has posted 20 points or more five times this year. The native of Mentor, OH, has netted double figures 13 consecutive games -- a streak that ranks third-best in the Big Ten.

Skouby Quickly Climbed Freshman Chart • Megan Skouby has rejected 44 shots. She blocked a career-high five shots at Michigan on Jan. 5 to surpass Jennie Lillis for second place on Iowa's freshman single season blocking list. Tangela Smith holds Iowa's freshman mark with 73 blocks.

Kristi Smith Matures Into Starting Role • Hawkeye freshman Kristi Smith has done a fantastic job directing the Iowa offense since taking over the starting role. In Big Ten play, Smith averages 7.3 points, 3.13 assists and 1.07 steals. Smith dished out a personal-best eight assists at No. 7 Ohio State. She ranks 13th in Big Ten assists in league games only.

Cashing in at the Free Throw Line • Freshman Wendy Ausdemore became the first Hawkeye to start the season making her first 19 free throw attempts. She has made 34-36 (.944) from the charity stripe this season.

Senior Crystal Smith made her first 18 attempts from the foul line in lowa's first three conference contests, including draining all 11 attempts vs. Illinois. Smith's 11-11 performance tied a school and arena record for free throw percentage in a game. She is shooting a blistering 92.1 percent (58-63) from the free throw line in conference games, which is tops in the Big Ten.

Big Ten Rankings • lowa ranks first in 3-point field goal percentage defense (.286), free throw percentage (.760) and scoring offense (73.0), second in field goal percentage (.458), assists (17.19), assist/turnover ratio (+1.03), 3-pointers made (4.96) and third in 3-point field goal percentage (.365).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in league steals (2.42) and scoring (17.6), fifth in free throw percentage (.852), eighth in 3-pointers made (1.73) and ninth in assists (3.38). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks fourth in blocks (1.69) and field goal percentage (.550). Sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks second in rebounding (8.5) and defensive rebounds (6.12), sixth in steals (2.19) and 15th in blocks (0.69).

Dishing the Rock • lowa ranks second in Big Ten assists, dishing the ball 17.19 times per game. Three Hawkeyes average 2.85 assists or better: Crystal Smith (3.38), Krista VandeVenter (3.0) and Kristi Smith (2.85).

Smith Ranks Second in Big Ten in Scoring • Senior Crystal Smith ranks second in Big Ten scoring (17.6); Ohio State's Jessica Davenport (19.2) ranks first. Smith has led Iowa in scoring in 15 of Iowa's 26 contests.

Smith and Indiana State's Melanie Boeglin scored an NCAA singlegame-high 46 points. Both amassed their scoring totals in double overtime as Smith recorded 46 points at Louisiana Tech, while Boeglin tallied 46 at Drake.

Vandy is Dandy • Sophomore Krista VandeVenter is one of the top allaround threats in the Big Ten. VandeVenter, who has started every game (59) as a Hawkeye, ranks third in Big Ten rebounding (8.5), sixth in steals (2.19) and 15th in blocks (0.69). She has led the Hawkeyes in rebounding 19 times this season. The 6-2 forward has recorded three double-doubles (lowa State, Minnesota and Northwestern) this season and six in her career.

VandeVenter fouled out of her first career game at Ohio State Feb. 12.

Movin' On Up • Senior Crystal Smith (206) ranks fifth on Iowa's career steals chart, 16 thefts from tying Steph Schueler (222) for fourth. Smith also (1,152) ranks 15th in career scoring at Iowa, eight points from Tia Jackson (1,160) for 14th. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter (472) is 10 rebounds from matching all-American Michelle Edwards (482) for 17th in career rebounds.

Triple Play • Tiffany Reedy made 19 triples in each of her first three seasons. The senior drained a personal-best six 3-pointers at Michigan State to raise her total to 31, which is a new single-season best. She is shooting at a 41.5 percent clip from behind the arc, which ranks third in the Big Ten.

lowa ranks third in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.365) after ranking fourth last year (.343). The Hawkeyes shot a Big Ten-season-best 69.2% (9-13) from behind the arc at Northwestern on Jan. 15. Iowa also converted 53.3% (8-15) from 3-point range at Ohio State on Feb. 12. The Hawkeyes rank second in Big Ten 3-pointers made (4.96).

Underclassmen Start for Hawkeyes • Iowa's starting lineup includes two freshmen (Kristi Smith and Megan Skouby) and one sophomore (Krista VandeVenter). The last time Iowa had two freshmen starters was during the 1998-99 campaign (Lindsey Meder and Leah Magner).

VandeVenter started all 59 games as a Hawkeye, including all 26 this season. The power forward ranks third in team scoring (8.8) and first in rebounding (8.5). She has pulled down 472 rebounds and is only ten rebounds from equaling all-American Michelle Edwards (482) for 17th on Iowa's career rebounding chart.

Smith started the last 18 games at point guard for Iowa. The native of Thornton, CO, ranks sixth in team scoring (6.8) and third in assists (2.85).

Skouby will start her 16th contest Sunday. The 6-6 center ranks second in team scoring (14.0), first in blocks (1.69) and field goal percentage (.550) and second in rebounding (4.9).

lowa is one of two Big Ten teams with two or more freshmen starters. Michigan starts three, while lowa starts two.

Home, Away Comparisons • In 13 home games, Iowa has out-scored its opponents 968-817 (+11.6 margin), shooting 47.0 percent from the field and holding opponents to a 41.1 shooting percentage. Iowa also has posted 231 assists to its opponents' 152 and attempted 113 more free throws (288-175). Iowa has converted 75.7 percent of its free throw attempts at home.

In 13 games away from Iowa City, Iowa has out-scored its opponents 931-880 (+3.9 margin). Iowa has a better 3-point shooting percentage on the road (40.3%) than at Carver-Hawkeye Arena (31.6%). Here are the home and away comparisons:

High Octane • lowa, who ranks first in Big Ten scoring offense (73.0), has scored 80 points or more in seven times. The Hawkeyes are 13-3 when scoring 70 points or more; the three losses came in double overtime at Louisiana Tech (95-91), at No. 7 Ohio State (88-77) and No. 14 Michigan State (73-71).

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class (Megan Skouby, Wendy Ausdemore, Kristi Smith, Nicole VanderPol and Lindsey Nyenhuis) are averaging 30.5 ppg through 26 games. The trio of Ausdemore, Skouby and Smith tallied a freshmen season-best 57 points vs. No. 8 Purdue on Feb. 2.

Skouby ranks second in team scoring (14.0) and second in rebounding (4.9), while Ausdemore (6.9) ranks fifth and Smith (6.8) sixth in scoring. Smith also ranks third in assists (2.85).

Five Spot • Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Nov. 28, broke or tied five school records during Thanksgiving week.

The senior broke school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in Iowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Haughton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

Making the List • lowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in lowa history.

lowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USCs Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.



All-Tournament Selections • Senior Crystal Smith and sophomore Krista VandeVenter were named to the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge All-Tournament team. Smith also garnered Odwalla Classic All-Tournament accolades for her efforts Nov. 25-26 in San Francisco, CA.

Attendance Rankings • lowa ranks 26th (3,856) nationally in the women's basketball attendance rankings released Feb. 20.

Iowa Ties Arena Mark • Iowa's 55 second-half points scored in its 84-65 triumph over Illinois on Jan. 1, matched the Carver-Hawkeye Arena record for most points in a second half. The Hawkeyes also scored 55 vs. Western Illinois on Nov. 25, 2000.

Young Guns • lowa is tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes are tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

Century Club • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder reached another milestone on Dec. 3, as Bluder collected her 100th victory as Iowa Head Coach in Iowa's 79-57 triumph over Vermont on Dec. 3. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 112-69 (.619) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • Iowa's roster features six players from the state of Iowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also have four players from Illinois (Jenee Graham, Morgan Kasperek, Lindsay Richards, Johanna Solverson). Iowa's 15-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Hawkeyes Pen Quoie • lowa signed Woodbury, MN, native Zoraa Quoie to a National Letter of Intent last fall. She was an all-conference and honorable mention all-state selection her junior year. Quoie averaged 10.6 ppg and just fewer than four steals per game on a team that won its conference and finished 25-3 last season. Her Woodbury High School team also captured a league title and finished third at the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore year. Quoie was a reserve her sophomore year, but started last season. She was also an all-state sprinter on the track team her freshman year.

Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series • lowa State leads the second annual Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series 11-4. lowa State has recorded victories in women's soccer (2-1), football (23-3), women's basketball (77-61), men's basketball (72-60) and women's gymnastics (195.7-193.375). lowa's two wins came in wrestling (20-15) and women's swimming and diving (156-144).

Big Ten Tournament Tickets on Sale • All-session tickets for the 2006 Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament presented by Xbox Live are \$55. Tickets can be purchased at the Conseco Fieldhouse box office, Tick-etmaster outlets, www.ticketmaster.com or by calling Ticketmaster at (317) 239-5151.

The tournament returns to Indianapolis for the 11th time in 12 years and has attracted more than 30,000 fans for each of the last four events. Just two years ago, the Big Ten set a pair of attendance records when the 2004 championship game was played in front of a single-session record of 9,417 fans, which established an overall tournament record of 37,635 spectators. In the past 11 years of Big Ten Tournament play, the conference has welcomed more than 314,000 fans. Five different league representatives have become tournament champions. Purdue leads all teams with five titles followed by two championships for both Iowa and Penn State and a single title for Indiana and Michigan State.

Game 1 Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42 Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Iowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. lowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of lowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight Iowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, Iowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista VandeVenter and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

lowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes.

lowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With lowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is Iowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

RUSTON, LA - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast Iowa 95-91 in a doible overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled lowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

lowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and outscore the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight lowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, lowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given lowa the win at the end of regulation. SAN FRANCISCO, CA - - Oklahoma's Paris twins combined for 44 points and 21 rebounds to propel the 22nd-ranked Sooners to an 85-68 victory over Iowa in the first round of the Odwalla Classic in War Memorial Gym.

lowa opened the game with an 18-11 advantage, but Oklahoma closed the half on a 32-11 run to take a commanding 43-29 lead into half. Sooner junior Erin Higgins, who was 1-6 from 3-point range in last year's contest against the Hawkeyes in the Bahamas, scored all of her 14 points in the first half on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Courtney Paris posted her third double-double of the season (30 points, 14 rebounds), while her sister Ashley collected 14 points and seven rebounds en route to victory in front of their hometown family and friends.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring Iowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista VandeVenter tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

lowa's underclassmen scored 44 of the Hawkeyes' 68 points, including 27 from freshmen.

lowa converted a season-best 89.5 percent (17-19) from the free throw line. Conversely, the Hawkeyes shot a season-low 38.3 percent (23-60) from the field. Oklahoma's win was its first victory over lowa in three tries.

lowa will face Rider for the first time in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic.

Game 4 Iowa 88, Rider 41 Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - The lowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lobsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced lowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

lowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

Game 6 Iowa 79, Vermont Dec. 3, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY (AP) -- Crystal Smith scored 26 points to lead lowa to a 79-57 victory over Vermont in the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge, setting up a sentimental title game against No. 6 Rutgers.

For the first time since leaving lowa in 1995, Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer will coach against the Hawkeyes, a program she turned into a national powerhouse during her 12-year tenure in lowa City.

After taking the lowa job in 1983, Stringer won a school-best 269 games, guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten titles and nine straight NCAA appearances before leaving to take the job at Rutgers.

The Scarlet Knights advanced to the championship game by beating San Jose State 76-64, behind 26 points from all-American guard Cappie Pondexter.

But it was Smith who ensured lowa a spot in the marquee matchup.

Five minutes into the second half, a fast-break layup by Vermont's Alexis Castro made the score 44-40, the closest margin since the game's opening minutes.

Then Smith took charge, scoring 10 points over the next nine minutes in a 20-10 lowa run.

A 3-pointer by Wendy Ausdemore put Iowa up 47-40 at the 13:44 mark, and Smith's 3-pointer with 7:56 left stretched the lead to 15 points and put the game out of reach. Smith, last week's Big Ten Player of the Week, also had three assists and six steals.

Stacy Schlapkohl added 12 points and seven rebounds for Iowa. The Hawkeyes also shot 46 percent and won praise from coach Lisa Bluder, who stressed all week the need to focus first on Vermont.

Ashleigh Cuncic led the Catamounts (2-4) with 17 points. Sy Janousek added 11 points, but Vermont shot just 32 percent and was outscored in the paint 24-8.

The victory also capped an emotional weekend for Rutgers coach C. Vivian Stringer, who coached against her old team for the first time since leaving Iowa City to take the Scarlet Knights' job.

Pondexter, who scored 26 points in the tournament's opening round, was voted MVP. But Rutgers also relied on its size and strength inside to wear down the Hawkeyes inside and cut short each rally.

Seven of Pondexter's points came at key moments late in the game.

After Iowa pulled to 46-44 on a short jumper by Krista VandeVenter, Pondexter answered with a long 3-pointer.

In the final minute with Rutgers leading by four, Pondexter milked the clock on all alone on the perimeter before driving an Iowa defender into the paint and swishing a short jumper.

Five times lowa crept within two points in the second half, only to see Rutgers, which never trailed in the game, respond and stretch their lead by controlling the boards.

Led by Mariota Theodoris' 16 rebounds, Rutgers outrebounded lowa 40-31, including 17-8 on the offensive end, outscored lowa 28-16 on points in the paint and blocked six shots.

Crystal Smith led the Hawkeyes with 17 points. Vande Venter topped her season best with 15 points and had six rebounds. The Hawkeyes shot 38 percent from the floor and 79 percent from the free throw line.

Stringer was cheered loudly as she strolled out of the locker room and along the sidelines, shaking hands with friends and university officials, during warmups and pregame introductions.

Game 8 Iowa State 77, Iowa 61 Dec. 8, 2005, Hilton Coliseum

AMES, IA - - The Iowa State women's basketball team defeated Iowa 77-61 at Hilton Coliseum. The Ioss was Iowa's fifth-straight in Ames and increases Iowa State's lead in the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series to 7-2.

lowa freshman Megan Skouby made a 10-foot jumper with 7:00 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes a 25-24 advantage. The Cyclones responded in a big way, scoring 13 of the final 15 points to take a 37-27 lead into half. Iowa only made only three of its last 18 field goal attempts in the first period.

lowa State opened the second half on an 8-0 run to stretch its lead to 18 (45-27). The Cyclones led 51-33 with 15:32 left before lowa went on a 15-3 run to trim the deficit to six (54-48) with 9:51 remaining, but that was as close as the Hawkeyes would get.

lowa State played only six players. All five starters scored double figures, including junior guard Lyndsey Medders, who posted game highs in points (20) and assists (14). Three Cyclones pulled down double digit rebounds (Brittany Wilkins, 13; Nicky Wieben, 12; Megan Ronhovde, 11).

lowa was led by Tiffany Reedy, Crystal Smith and Krista VandeVenter. Reedy scored 11 of her 13 points in the first 12:13 of the first half. The 13 points matched a season high. Smith also tallied 13 points and grabbed four rebounds. VandeVenter netted all 12 of her points in the second period. She also equaled a career high with 14 rebounds, collecting her fourth career double-double.

After failing to make any 3-pointers in its last game for the first time in 217 games, lowa converted 7-23 (.304) from behind the arc.

All 16 Hawkeye bench points came from freshmen. Skouby scored eight points on 4-7 shooting from the field, while Kristi Smith contributed six points and Wendy Ausdemore added two. Ausdemore also corralled a season-high five rebounds.

The game featured four ties and three lead changes.

IOWA CITY - Iowa returned to action after a 10-day layoff and cruised to a 92-72 victory over Drake in front of a season-high 5,556 fans at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

lowa dominated the undersized Drake squad, out-scoring the Bulldogs 44-32 in the paint. Hawkeye post players Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Megan Skouby combined for 47 points and 17 rebounds. The trio shot at a 77.8 percent clip (21-27) from the floor and 83.3 percent (5-6) from the foul line.

Skouby netted a career-high 19 points (9-11 FG, 1-2 FT). Skouby scored 15 of her 19 points in the second half, as the freshman only played four minutes in the first half after being whistled for two quick fouls.

VandeVenter scored 10 of her 14 points in the first half. The sophomore also corralled seven rebounds, dished out four assists, blocked one shot and matched a career high with four steals.

Schlapkohl contributed 12 of her 14 points in the first half. The native of Durant, IA, also grabbed a career-high eight rebounds and collected two assists.

Receiving her first collegiate start today was freshman Kristi Smith. She directed the Hawkeye offense for 25 minutes, scoring four points, dishing out four assists and pulling down two rebounds. Iowa's other Smith, Crystal, added a game-high 21 points (10-14 FG) and also collected four assists and four steals.

Drake, who lost for the fifth time in six tries, was led by Jill Martin. Martin tallied 17 points and grabbed a game-high 14 rebounds.

lowa started the game on fire, sinking 12 of its first 16 shots from the floor and claiming a 16-point advantage (28-12) by the second media timeout of the first period. Iowa went into the locker room with a comfortable 45-29 lead. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 60.6 percent (20-33) from the field in the first stanza.

The 92 points are the most yielded by a Drake team since the Bulldogs surrendered 90 against Iowa State on Dec. 5, 2001.

CEDAR FALLS, IA - - Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith poured in a game-high 22 points, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter grabbed a game-high 13 rebounds as the lowa Hawkeye women's basketball team downed the Northern Iowa Panthers for the 10th-straight time 65-54 at the UNI Dome.

lowa had a nine-point halftime cushion, but Northern lowa came out of the locker room on fire. The Panthers scored the first nine points of the second stanza to even the contest at 31 with 15:53 remaining. The Hawkeyes answered with a 12-4 run the next four minutes to rebuild their lead back to eight (43-35) with 11:20 left.

Northern Iowa continued to fight back and trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to six with 2:15 remaining, but back-to-back triples by Hawkeyes Tiffany Reedy and Abby Emmert helped seal Iowa's second-straight win over a Missouri Valley Conference opponent. Iowa converted 4-6 from the foul line the final minute to secure the 11-point victory.

Smith scored 13 of her 22 points in the first half, including netting Iowa's final first half points. The native of Haughton, LA, attempted and made Iowa's first 3-pointer of the game at the 15:40 mark of the second half to halt a 9-0 Northern Iowa scoring run. Smith has tallied 20 points or more five times already this season.

Northern Iowa limited Hawkeye starters Krista VandeVenter and Stacy Schlapkohl to a combined three points on 0-8 shooting from the field and 3-5 from the foul line. However, Iowa's bench stepped up to fill the scoring void as the Hawkeye reserves out-scored the Panthers 24-8. Freshman Megan Skouby scored eight, while freshman Wendy Ausdemore and sophomore Abby Emmert each added seven.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed seven of her 10 points in the second half and also corralled five rebounds.

Game 13 Iowa 84, Illinois 65 Jan. 1, 2006, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - A big second half lifted lowa to an 84-65 victory over Illinois inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win is Iowa's fifth-straight over the Fighting Illini. A crowd of 3,439 watched Iowa's first-ever New Year's Day game.

Crystal Smith ignited the Hawkeye offense, scoring a game-high 27 points on 7-13 shooting from the field and a perfect 11-11 from the foul line. Smith tallied 19 of her 27 points in the second period. Smith also collected seven rebounds, four steals and two assists.

Smith's perfect 11-11 shooting performance from the charity stripe tied a school record for free throw percentage in a game.

Krista VandeVenter had another big game for the Hawkeyes, scoring all 13 of her points in the second period and also posting game bests in rebounding (7) and assists (6). The six assists matched a career high for Vande-Venter. Nicole VanderPol added four points and four rebounds.

Illinois started the game on fire, draining seven of its 12 field goal attempts in the first six minutes to grab a commanding 17-2 advantage. The Hawkeyes started the contest ice-cold from the floor, missing six of their first seven field goal attempts. Iowa regained its shooting touch later in the half, as a Wendy Ausdemore 3-pointer capped an Iowa 11-0 run to tie the contest at 23 with 3:59 left. Ausdemore netted 11 of her career-high 14 points in the first stanza.

lowa silenced Illinois starter Janelle Hughes for the first 17 minutes, but the senior scored the Fighting Illini's final nine points on four-straight possessions of the half to propel Illinois to a six-point (34-29) halftime advantage.

Crystal Smith sparked a 17-2 scoring run in the second half to help give the Hawkeyes a 55-45 advantage with 11:30 left in the game. Smith scored nine of the 17 points during the scoring run.

Illinois' Erin Wigley and Hughes each scored 20 points to lead Illinois. Audrey Tabon pulled down seven rebounds to lead the Fighting Illini.

Game 14 Iowa 77, Michigan 63 Jan. 5, 2006, Crisler Arena

ANN ARBOR, MI - - Four Hawkeye starters scored in double figures as the Iowa Hawkeyes won its sixth-straight game over Michigan 77-63 inside Crisler Arena.

Megan Skouby had a career night as the 6-6 center posted career bests in points (20), rebounds (8) and blocks (5). Krista VandeVenter, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith each contributed 13 points en route to victory. In addition to her 13 points, Smith collected seven rebounds, four steals and a career-high nine assists.

lowa's frontcourt duo of Megan Skouby (7) and Krista VandeVenter (7) scored 15 of lowa's 17 points as the Hawkeyes jumped out to a 17-10 advantage in the first eight minutes and would never look back.

The Hawkeyes built their lead to 10 by half (42-32), but Michigan opened the second period on a 10-3 run to trim Iowa's advantage to three (45-42) with 16:46 left. Iowa's lead swelled back to nine (53-44) after an 8-2 run with 11:20 remaining. The Wolverines tried to mount one last comeback in the final minutes, but Iowa drained three 3-pointers in the final three minutes to secure the victory.

lowa's aggressive play generated 11 more free throw attempts than Michigan. The Hawkeyes made 16-20 (.800) from the foul line, while the Wolverines only made nine trips to the charity stripe - making eight (.889).

lowa only attempted two triples in the first half - missing both, but found its shooting touch in the second stanza, sinking 5-9.

Michigan were led by reserves Ta'Shia Walker and Katie Dierdorf. Walker netted a game-high 24 points and grabbed eight rebounds, while Dierdorf added 10 points and four rebounds.

Through 14 games, Iowa has not allowed an opponent to shoot 50 percent or better from the field or 40 percent or better from 3-point range. Iowa's defense held the Wolverines to 37.9 percent (25-66) from the field and 35.7 percent (5-14) from behind the arc. Iowa converted 49.1 percent (28-57) of its field goals, including 45.5 percent (5-11) from 3-point range.

IOWA CITY (AP) - I lowa scored 48 second half points en route to a 75-64 triumph over ninth-rated Michigan State inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena. The win was the Hawkeyes' first over a top-ten ranked team since defeating ninth-ranked Purdue 90-75 on Jan. 6, 2002 in Iowa City.

Freshman Megan Skouby scored a career-high 27 points, while Crystal Smith added 18 and VandeVenter 17 to lead the Hawkeyes. Skouby and Smith also pulled down eight rebounds each, while VandeVenter grabbed a team-best nine.

Skouby dominated the Spartans' zone defense with turnaround jumpers and hook shots, and finished 12-20 from the field. Her point total was the most by an lowa freshman since Tiffany Gooden scored 36 in the 1994-95 season.

lowa forced 21 turnovers and held Michigan State to 4-16 on 3-point attempts. The Hawkeyes turned the 21 Spartan miscues into 17 points.

Michigan State held a 29-27 halftime lead before Skouby sparked the Hawkeyes with 19 second-half points on 6-6 shooting.

The Hawkeyes had a 10-0 run early in the second half to build a 46-36 lead. The Spartans shaved Iowa's advantage to one (61-60) with 3:13, but Iowa closed the contest on a 14-3 run.

Liz Shimek led Michigan State with 16 points and 15 rebounds. Lindsay Bowen added 13 points.

Crystal Smith was scoreless through the first 12 minutes before helping Skouby in a second-half scoring barrage. Smith hit a jumper with 7:05 left in the first half to give the Hawkeyes their first lead at 20-19. She hit two others during a 10-2 run that padded lowa's lead to 22-19.

lowa's starters combined for 72 of its 75 points. The Hawkeyes outscored the Spartans 15-4 at the foull line. Michigan State attempted an lowa opponent season-low six free throws, just one game after converting 30-34 against nationally-rabked Rutgers.

lowa - which upset No. 9 Michigan State three days earlier - never got closer than 68-59 after that.

Davenport scored the Buckeyes' last nine points. She broke the game open with 11 straight points during a 15-1 run midway through the first half that gave the Buckeyes a 39-21 lead. Iowa was unable to stop Davenport from establishing position inside, and she took advantage with five baskets from inside 10 feet during a 3:33 span.

lowa recorded a season-low 13 turnovers in defeat, including only three by its guards. Abby Emmert came off the bench and directed the Hawkeye offense for most of the second half. The sophomore finished with seven points and three assists.

Game 16 Iowa 80, Northwestern 48 Jan. 15, 2006, Welsh-Ryan Arena

EVANSTON, IL - lowa built a 21-point first-half lead and cruised to an 80-48 triumph over Northwestern at Welsh-Ryan Arena. The win was lowa's largest conference win since recording a 40-point win over Northwestern on Jan. 25, 2001 in Evanston. The victory was also lowa's 10-straight over the Wildcats, all under Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Megan Skouby and Crystal Smith were Iowa's offensive catalysts today. Skouby netted a game-high 18 points (8-16 FG, 2-2 FT), marking the 11th time this year she has scored double figures. The Big Ten's leading freshman scorer, has tallied double digits four-straight contests and five of Iowa's six league games. Smith added 13 points in only 18 minutes of action.

Tiffany Reedy had a solid all-around game, converting 3-4 from 3-point range for nine points and collecting seven rebounds, four assists and three steals.

lowa had a better 3-point shooting percentage (.692, 9-13) than Northwestern did free throw percentage (.615, 8-13). Reedy and Lindsey Nyenhuis drained three triples each, Smith nailed two, while Abby Emmert made one.

Game 23 #7 Ohio State 88, Iowa 77 Feb. 12, 2006, Value City Arena

COLUMBUS, OH - - Ohio State won a battle between the conferences' top two scoring offenses as the seventh-ranked Buckeyes held on for an 88-77 win over lowa at Value City Arena.

Both teams started the game on fire as Ohio State made its first 11 field goal attempts (100%), while Iowa made eight of its first 11 (72.7%) in the first 7:30 of the game. The Buckeyes finished the game shooting a Big Ten-season-best 65.4% (34-52), including 53.8% (7-13) from 3-point range. Iowa shot the ball well too, but not good enough as the Hawkeyes made 56.3% (27-48) of their field goals, including 53.3% (8-15) from behind the arc.

lowa trailed 40-25 late in the first half, but closed the period on a 14-2 run to only trail by three (42-39) at the break. The Hawkeyes tied the game at 50-50 at the 15:41 mark, but the Buckeyes answered with an 18-6 run to build a 12-point advantage and never looked back.

Ohio State all-American Jessica Davenport netted a game-high 24 points, while senior transfer Debbie Merrill collected 15 points, nine rebounds and seven assists.

Hawkeye senior Crystal Smith, who struggled in Iowa's previous two games scoring a combined 10 points, erupted for 21 points and dished out four assists. Freshman Megan Skouby returned to her home state and scored 18 points in front of family and friends. Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 16 poits, bolstered by 4-5 shooting from behind the arc, while freshman Kristi Smith dished out a game-high eight assists.

The 77 points are the most points Ohio State has allowed this season, besting Oklahoma's 71 scored on Jan. 9.

The win extended Ohio State's home-conference winning streak to 15, dating back to a 57-54 loss to Purdue on Feb. 8, 2004.
