THE SETTING:

Due to rain, lowa will return to conference play looking to improve its sixth place standing in the Big Ten having had four days without a game. The Hawkeyes host Illinois in a three-game series Friday-Sunday. Game one is set for Friday at 6:05 p.m. at Duane Banks Field. Tickets are \$3 for adults and free for UI students and youths. This will be the first league competition between the two teams since 2007, where lowa won three of four in lowa City.

SCOUTING ILLINOIS:

Illinois is 12-11 and part of the five-way tie for first place in the Big Ten with a 2-1 record after taking two-of-three from Penn State last week.

The Illini are led, offensively, by sophomore outfielder Willie Argo. Argo leads the team with a .415 batting average, a .510 on base percentage as well as 16 walks and 18 stolen bases. As a team, Illinois is hitting .321 and have stolen 57 bases.

Friday night starter Will Strack has a 5.74 ERA and a 1-1 record with six starts. The righty has thrown 31.1 innings and struck out 24, to lead the team.

'Q' GETS GOING:

After getting banged up a bit in Texas **Mike McQuillan** is starting to get back in the groove of things, offensively.

McQuillan is hitting the second-highest average on the team (.344). In lowa's past five games, the sophomore has gone 12-for-22 with seven runs scored and above a .500 slugging percentage.

BIG TEN OPENER VICTORY:

With a gem of a pitching performance from **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa picked up its first conference-opening win since a 9-5 triumph over Michigan in 2003.

Besides that, Iowa had won six of its last seven games and snapped Michigan State's 11-game win streak.

TOSSING A COMPLETE ONE:

Southpaw **Jarred Hippen** went the extra mile Friday against Michigan State. The starter tossed a complete game, the first of his career and earned the win.

Hippen allowed three runs off seven hits and striking out two. The last Hawkeye to throw a complete nine was Nate Johnson in 2004.

SLUGGING A SCHOOL RECORD:

Junior **Zach McCool** went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for lowa in its series finale against the Spartans on Sunday. McCool's five hits ties a single-game school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

McCOOL SWINGS IT:

Zach McCool had a stellar series against Michigan State. The junior played in two games, starting one. He went 7-for-8 with three runs scored, two RBI, a stolen base and three doubles.

MOTHER NATURE CALLS IT:

Rain postponed and cancelled both of lowa's midweek contests. The Hawkeyes were scheduled to host Western Illinois Tuesday. However, due to rain, the fourth of five games against the Leathernecks was postponed and will be rescheduled.

lowa was also set to take on the lowa Cubs in an exhibition game Wednesday at Principal Park. Unfortunately, the game was cancelled due to rain and will not be rescheduled.

MULLER IS SIDELINED:

Junior leadoff hitter **Kurtis Muller** has been sidelined with a hamstring injury he sustained in the two-game series against South Dakota State. It is hopeful he will play this weekend.

Muller leads the Hawkeye offense in batting average (.407), runs (20), hits (33), doubles (7), triples (2), total bases (44), slugging percentage (.543), walks (11), on base percentage (.489), stolen bases (15) and fielding percentage (1.000).

TAKING ONE FROM MSU:

lowa went 2-1 in East Lansing, MI last weekend in its Big Ten opening series. The Hawkeyes took game one, 5-3. But were outslugged the remaining two games, losing 16-2 and 26-11.

Leading Iowa, offensively, were Ryan Durant, Mike McQuillan and Zach McCool. The trio combined to go 20-for-33 with 10 runs scored, seven doubles and 10 RBI. McCool slugged a whopping 1.250 on the weekend. Iowa pitching staff was led by starter Jarred Hippen's complete game.

STREAKING HAWKEYES:

Kurtis Muller leads the Hawkeyes with a nine-game hitting streak intact. The last game Muller played in was the series finale against South Dakota State. Mike McQuillan is on a season-long six game hitting streak while Ryan Durant picked up a hit in all three games against MSU to be on a current three-game string.

Muller and McQuillan lead lowa with 11 multi-hit games and Durant has a team-best five multi-RBI games.

THREE-GAME SWEEP:

The Hawkeyes swept Western Illinois in three in their home opening series last weekend. With two come from behind ninth inning thrillers the Hawkeyes got their first sweep since 2007. (Iowa swept Indiana in a three-game home series.)

In the series, **Kurtis Muller** went a stellar 5-for-11 with five runs scored, three RBI and a perfect 6-for-6 on the base path.

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

- **1. Jarred Hippen** has had four consecutive quality starts for the Hawkeyes and is fresh off his first career complete game.
- **2.** Look for pitcher **Nick Brown** to return into the Big Ten pitching rotation. As a freshman, Brown pitched every Big Ten weekend but two due to injury.
- **3. Mike McQuillan** is on a six-game hitting streak. The sophomore has hit over .500 the last five games.

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

Kurtis Muller and several Hawkeyes making a splash in conference statistics. Muller ranks in the top ten in; batting average (6th), on base percentage (5th) and stolen bases (5th). **Sean Flanagan** and **Ryan Durant** rank fourth in hit by pitches.

Jarred Hippen ranks in the top ten in the following statistical categories: ERA (6th), opposing batting average (10th), innings pitched (2nd), batters struck out looking (1st) and games started (2nd).

Phil Schreiber ranks econd in starts. **Kevin Lee** ranks first in saves and eighth in games finished.

Kurt Lee ranks fifth in assists while **Kurtis Muller** are tied for first in fielding percentage (1.000).

JACOBS LEADS BULLPEN:

Michael Jacobs has been effective in the bullpen this season. The reliever leads lowa's pitchers from the pen.

Jacobs has the second lowest ERA (4.40) and is tied for most appearances (11).

ALL-TIME SERIES:

lowa trails the all-time series with Illinois, 119-79-2. The last time the two teams faced was at the 2009 Big Ten/Big East Challenge in a non-conference match-up.

Illinois defeated the Hawkeyes, 8-3. **Michael Jacobs** and **Jarred Hippen** had solid outings on the hill. The Hawkeye duo allowed only two walks and three earned Illini runs. Jacobs received the hard-luck loss tonight after throwing five solid innings, allowing only one earned run.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



DAHM AT IOWA

In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the lowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections,

including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, lowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.



THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach Ryan Brownlee and coach Chris Maliszewski, along with volunteer coach Zach Dillon.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted: two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008. Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. lowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, lowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeves' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks then the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer. Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin"" Ray Gilmore, who serves as lowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

lowa Inks Recruits

lowa Head Baseball Coach Jack Dahm has announced that Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski and Taylor Zeutenhorst have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler and Aaron Smit intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.

Lala, a native of Marion, IA, is a right-handed pitcher from Kirkwood Community College. Lala appeared in 18 games. He amassed 45 strikeouts in 40.1 innings of work and finished the year with a 4.86 ERA.

Mangler, from Clinton, IA, will be a utility player for the Hawkeyes. He led Clinton HS to one of their best football seasons in history this fall, playing both sides of the ball.

Niedbalski, a native of Ballwin, MO, is an infielder. He earned four letters in hockey and baseball at DeSmet HS. Niedbalski led his fifth-seeded HS team to a district championship last spring batting .500 with five RBI over the three-game tournament. In 2009, he hit .362 with 18 RBI and 13 extra base hits.

Smit, from Wellman, IA, is a lanky left-handed pitcher from Mid Prairie HS. His junior season, he was named first team all-conference, second team all-district academic and an excellent student. Smit was named to the gold honor roll this year. In 2009, he appeared in 16 games with a 8-2 record and five saves. Smit compiled a 2.86 ERA with 88 strikeouts.
