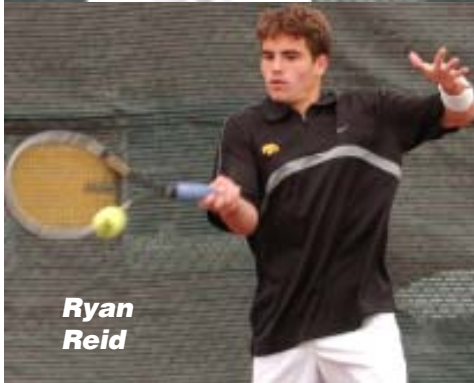

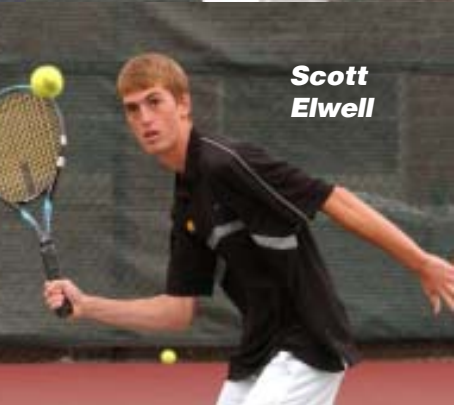

**This Week:** The Iowa men's tennis team will travel to East Lansing, MI, to compete in the Big Ten Tournament. The Hawkeyes, seeded 11th, will face sixth-seeded Indiana in the first round Thursday at 2 p.m. Competition is scheduled to take place at the MSU Tennis Facility. Admission is free.

**The Hoosiers:** Indiana, ranked 59th nationally, is 11-11 overall and finished the conference season 5-5 after losses at Purdue and top-ranked Illinois. Junior Jakub Praibis, ranked 62nd nationally, junior Ryan Recht and sophomore Neil Kenner lead the Hoosiers in singles competition. Recht and sophomore John Stone are Indiana's top doubles team. Indiana is coached by Ken Hydingier.

**The Series:** Indiana leads the series over Iowa, 41-15. In their last meeting, the Hoosiers swept the Hawkeyes (7-0) in Bloomington on April 18.

**Tournament Information:** Defending Big Ten and national champion Illinois enters the tournament as the No. 1 seed. The Illini, ranked No. 1 nationally, have won the last eight regular season conference tournament titles and have won seven out of the last eight conference titles. Illinois currently holds a 57-match winning streak. Ohio State, ranked 20th, is the No. 2 seed. The Buckeyes are the only team to have interrupted Illinois' conference tournament streak with their win in 2001. Minnesota, ranked 35th, is the No. 3 seed. The Gophers have advanced to the championship match the last two tournaments. The following is a list of tournament match-ups. In the event of inclement weather, starting times are subject to change. Matches are played until a team wins four points. Once a team reaches four points, the remaining matches are abandoned. All times are Eastern.

**Hawkeyes Drop Final Two Conference Duals:** Iowa finished the season winless in conference play after losing to No. 20 Ohio State (7-0) and No. 63 Penn State (5-2). Iowa lost all three doubles matches and was swept in singles competition against the Buckeyes. The Hawkeyes also lost all three doubles matches against Penn State, but were able to claim two singles victories.

**Malempati Records First Win Over Ranked Opponent:** With freshman **Sebastian Delgado** unable to compete in singles competition against Penn State, sophomore **Chaitu Malempati** stepped up to Iowa's top position and recorded a victory over Malcolm Scatliffe, ranked 98th nationally. Scatliffe dominated the first set (6-0) but Malempati rallied to tie the match with a 7-5 sec-





ond-set victory. Malempati then jumped out to a convincing 5-0 lead in the third set, but Scatliffe fought back winning the next four games. Malempati prevailed winning the next game to claim his first career victory over a ranked opponent.

**Young Hawkeyes:** Youth and inexperience have been a factor for Iowa during the 2004 dual season. Of the nine players on the Iowa roster, only senior **Matis Jasicek** and sophomores **Chaitu Malempati** and **Johan Bergen** had previous Big Ten playing experience. The other six newcomers on the roster include sophomore transfer **Aaron Schachterle** and freshmen **Sebastian Delgado**, **Jonny Hoak**, **Walter Valarezo**, **Ryan Reid** and **Scott Elwell**.

**Tough Competition:** Of Iowa's 19 opponents during the dual season, 11 are currently ranked, including nine Big Ten teams. The Hawkeyes best results against ranked opponents have come in 5-2 losses to No. 35 Minnesota, No. 42 Northwestern and No. 63 Penn State.

**Doubles Woes Continue:** Iowa has claimed the doubles point in only three of its 19 matches this season. Two of those points contributed to dual wins.

**Delgado Leads Singles:** After competing the first half of the season at No. 2 singles, **Sebastian Delgado** has stepped into the top position. He currently leads the team with five singles victories. In only his third match at No. 1 singles, Delgado posted a straight-set victory over Northwestern's Tommy Hanus. Delgado is the only Hawkeye to receive Big Ten Player of the Week honors. He received conference accolades February 23 after going undefeated at No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles in Iowa wins over Marquette and Indiana State. Delgado is also teamed with **Walter Valarezo** as Iowa's top doubles team.

**Malempati Enters Tournament on High:** After starting the season 1-14, **Chaitu Malempati** has won two of his last four matches. Malempati enters the tournament coming off a win over Penn State's Malcolm Scatliffe. He has also defeated Wisconsin's David Hippee in dual competition. Malempati is currently teamed with **Jonny Hoak** at No. 2 doubles.

**Valarezo Records Big Win Over Wisconsin:** **Walter Valarezo** has been a steady contributor for the Hawkeyes competing in every dual this season. He has played at the No. 2 thru No. 5 singles positions and all three doubles positions. He is currently teamed with **Sebastian Delgado** at Iowa's top position. Valarezo's biggest win of the season came in a thrilling three-set victory over Wisconsin's Scott Green.

**Hoak Best Against Conference Foes:** **Jonny Hoak** leads the Hawkeyes with three singles victories in Big Ten competition, including two at the No. 3 position. Hoak has defeated Minnesota's Andres Osorio, Wisconsin's Tom Bagnato and most recently Penn State's Clint Keithley. Hoak has also competed

at both the No. 2 and No. 3 doubles positions. He currently competes at No. 2 doubles with **Chaitu Malempati**.

**Schachterle Leads in Overall Wins:** **Aaron Schachterle** leads the Hawkeyes with nine singles victories during the fall and spring seasons combined. He has competed during the dual season at the No. 4, No. 5 and No. 6 positions and has recorded four dual victories. He posted three consecutive victories in Iowa wins over DePaul, Marquette and Indiana State. Schachterle is currently teamed with **Matis Jasicek** at No. 3 doubles. The duo's biggest victory of the season came in a win over Illinois' Michael Calkins and Evan Zeder.

**Jasicek Steps Up in Senior Campaign:** After battling through injuries earlier in his career, **Matis Jasicek** has been a solid contributor for the Hawkeyes in both singles and doubles competition. His most important singles victory of the year came in a win over Northwestern's Justin Hoeveler. Jasicek is currently teamed with **Aaron Schachterle** at No. 3 doubles.

**Head Coach: Steve Houghton**, the dean of Big Ten tennis coaches, is in his 23rd season as head coach of the Hawkeyes. Houghton has a career record of 261-259 (.502). He became the winningest coach in Iowa tennis history in 1992 and is a member of the Iowa Tennis Hall of Fame. He has coached 15 players to 29 all-Big Ten selections including Tyler Cleveland, who became the first men's player in Big Ten history to be named Big Ten Player of the Year twice. Four of Houghton's athletes have also been selected Big Ten Sportsman of the Year.

**Quoting Houghton:** "Playing in the Big Ten Tournament is like starting a new season. I hope we can play our best tennis of the season and pull off a couple of upsets."







# Iowa Head Coach Steve Houghton



## Steve Houghton

**Head Coach**  
**23rd-year at Iowa**

Steve Houghton, the dean of Big Ten coaches, is in his 23rd year as head coach of the Hawkeyes. He has compiled a career record of 261-259

This year Houghton has dealt with injuries, youth and inexperience as the Hawkeyes finished the dual season 3-16. He guided freshman Sebastian Delgado to his first Big Ten Player of the Week honors.

Last season Houghton led his Hawkeye squad to a sixth-place tie in conference play. Houghton once again coached seniors Stuart Waters, Hunter Skogman and Pete Rose to strong seasons. While playing at Iowa's top position in both singles and doubles competition, Waters earned his second consecutive all-Big Ten honor. He also helped guide along Iowa's youth with freshmen Johan Bergenias, Chaitu Malempati and Parker Ross making key singles contributions. Iowa entered the tournament having won two of its last three conference matches over ranked opponents.

In 2002 Houghton led the Hawkeyes to a 12-10 record overall and a 4-6 Big Ten record. Iowa was ranked as high as 57th and recorded key wins over Northwestern, Penn State and Nebraska. The Hawkeyes also came close to knocking off Ohio State, losing 4-3 after Pete Rose was forced to retire in the game deciding match. Houghton coached Rose and Stuart Waters to their best career records and Hunter Skogman to his best career Big Ten record. In his first year playing at the No. 1 position, Waters posted a 14-7 dual record and was named Big Ten Player of the Week on Apr. 3. Rose compiled a 13-6 dual record and held a seven-match winning streak before retiring to Ohio State's Paul Warkentin. Skogman went 7-2 in Big Ten play.

In 2001 Houghton coached Tyler Cleveland to yet another remarkable season. Cleveland went 19-3 overall and recorded the best record in the Big Ten's No. 1 position at 8-2. Cleveland etched his name in the Big Ten record books as he became the first men's player to receive back-to-back Big Ten Player of the Year honors. He was also honored with the Region IV ITA Farnsworth Senior Player of the Year. Cleveland is considered one of the greatest players in Iowa tennis history.

Houghton's best season came in 1984 when Iowa won a school record 21 matches and two Hawkeyes earned all-Big Ten honors. The doubles team of Claes Ramel and Martin Aguirre qualified for nationals in 1989 and Houghton was named NCAA Region IV Coach of the Year. He has coached two Davis Cup players at Iowa. Bryan Crowley won the Rolex Region IV championship in 1995 and was ranked first in regional singles action, before falling to career-hampering injuries.

Not only are Houghton's players students of the game, as their recent victories attest, but they are also students in the classroom. Houghton's players have consistently maintained a grade point average above 3.0 (on a 4.0 scale). Last year Iowa had four players named to the academic

all-Big Ten Team: Johan Bergenias, David Freijd, Pete Rose and Stuart Waters.

Houghton also had a successful playing career at Iowa, lettering three years and winning the No. 5 singles championship at the Big Ten meet. His career Big Ten singles record was 21-6, and his career winning percentage of .727 (40-15) is the second best in Iowa history.

The Hawkeye coach was a member of the 1971 Iowa tennis team that recorded a 3.53 team GPA, the highest of any NCAA team in any sport that year. That team also qualified for the NCAA meet after a third place Big Ten finish. A member of the Iowa Tennis Hall of Fame, Houghton completed his sixth year as a member of the Region IV Ranking Committee. He is also involved with the Iowa City Tennis Association and has worked with the Iowa sports school's tennis program since its inception. He has also served on both the NCAA ranking and selection committees.

An Iowa City native, Houghton was a nationally ranked junior player at City High School. He earned his bachelor's (1971) and master's (1973) degrees from the University of Iowa.

Houghton was born Jan. 9, 1949. Steve and his wife, Leora, have four children: Cari, Jeff, Jon and Scott.

◆ Named Big Ten Player of the Week February 23 after going undefeated in No. 2 singles and No. 1 doubles competition in Iowa's wins over Marquette and Indiana State. He defeated Marquette's Egis Vedrickas without losing a game in a 6-0, 6-0 victory.

◆ Leads the team with five dual victories.

◆ Holds a team-best five doubles wins, all at the No. 1 position.

◆ In only his third match as Iowa's top singles player, posted a 6-4, 6-2 win over Northwestern's Tommy Hanus.

◆ Played No. 2 singles earlier this season, posting a 4-6 record.

◆ Claimed Iowa's only point against Purdue after rallying from a first-set loss to defeat Troy Havens at No. 2 singles.

◆ One of two freshman from Guayaquil, Ecuador on the 2003-04 roster.

◆ Missed half of the fall season recovering from an appendectomy.
