HAWKEYES THE MATCHUP

- The Hawkeyes travel to Port Charlotte, Fla., to play in the Snowbird Classic on March 8-10.
- lowa opens the weekend at 10 a.m. on Friday against Maine (6-7), before playing Georgetown (5-4) at 2 p.m. on Saturday, and West Virginia (5-6) at 10 a.m. on Sunday. All times are Central.
- All three games will be played at North Charlotte Regional Park.
- This weekend will mark the Hawkeyes first trip to Florida this season. Iowa played 10 games in the state in 2012, playing seven games in Winter Haven, two in St. Petersburg, and one in Clearwater.

THE SERIES

The Hawkeyes have faced Maine, Georgetown, and West Virginia previously in program history. Iowa's last meeting against all three clubs took place in the state of Florida.

- lowa is 3-7 all-time against Maine. The Hawkeyes and Black Bears last met in 2004, playing two games in DeLand, Fla., on March 13-14. The two teams split the contests, with the Hawkeyes winning the first game 5-3.
- The Hawkeyes have played Georgetown twice in program history, meeting both times in Florida. lowa defeated the Hoyas, 4-2, on Feb. 22, 2009, in St. Petersburg, Fla., at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge in the first meeting, while Georgetown won the second meeting, 6-1, last season at the RussMatt Central Florida Invitational hosted in Winter Haven, Fla.
- lowa played West Virginia for the first time in program history last season, falling 4-3 in the final game of the Big Ten/Big East Challenge in St. Petersburg, Fla. West Virginia is now a member of the Big 12 Conference.

In nine years as the University of Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the UI baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excelence

Since taking over the Hawkeyes in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the lowa program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years. Dahm has guided the team to 30 or more wins two of the last six seasons

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21 in a victory over Western Illinois. Also in 2009, Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23 and notched his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories. In 2012, Dahm earned his 200th victory at Iowa as the Hawkeyes won at Indiana (4-0) on March 31.

In Dahm's 19 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, nine freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his nine years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 35 All-Big Ten selections, including eight first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Three Hawkeyes garnered all-league honors in 2012. Senior Phil Keppler earned second team All-Big Ten laurels along with freshman starting pitcher Sasha Kuebel. Kuebel and fellow left-handed pitcher Taylor Kaufman were named to the Big Ten's all-freshman squad. Kuebel was also named a Louisville Slugger Freshman All-American after finishing 6-0 with a 2.67 ERA.

The Hawkeyes finished a game out of a four-way tie for sixth place and the final spot in the Big Ten Tournament in 2012. Iowa closed the season strong, taking 2-of-3 from No. 13 Purdue. The Hawkeyes were the only team all season to win a conference series against the Boilermakers. Iowa defeated Purdue in back-to-back games, earning its first win over a ranked foe since downing No. 25 Louisville in 2009.

While 11 freshmen saw action in 2012, Dahm coached two Hawkeye seniors to the top of the record books. Mike McQuillan closed his career first in singles (196) and second in hits (242). Jarred Hippen, a two-time second team All-Big Ten selection under Dahm, owns the lowa record for innings pitched (351.2) and ranks second in strikeouts behind Allen Rath with 244.

In the classroom, Dahm's teams have had success, as well. lowa's baseball team boasted an NCAA Graduation Success Rate of 95, which is 25 points above the national average for NCAA Division I baseball programs. During his lowa tenure, the head coach has seen 75 players named academic All-Big Ten, including a team-record 12 players in 2011. lowa had eight student-athletes recognized in 2010 and seven in 2012. That is the best nine-year total in the history of the program. Additionally, shortstop Kurt Lee was named Academic All-District first team in 2011.

SCOUTING MAINE

Maine is currently 6-7 on the season, winning six of its last eight games.

Troy Black, Michael Fransoso, and Colin Gay spearhead the Black Bears' offense. Black leads the team with a .395 batting average, while Fransoso and Gay share the team lead with 18 hits. Fransoso also paces the team in RBIs (13).

Eighth-year head coach Steve Trimper and Maine will take on Western Michigan on Wednesday and Georgetown on Thursday before facing the Hawkeyes.

SCOUTING GEORGETOWN

Georgetown owns a 5-4 record, playing all nine games away from home.

The Hoyas feature five players that are hitting at a .300 clip or better this season. Justin Leeson leads Georgetown with a .448 batting average and 13 hits.

Georgetown is coached by Pete Wilk, who is in his 14th season as head coach. The Hoyas are scheduled to play three more games prior to playing lowa on Saturday.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA

West Virginia is 5-6 this season, playing all 11 games away from home.

The Mountaineers have three players that hit .409 or better -- Jacob Rice (.424), Ryan Tuntland (.414), and Bobby Boyd (.404). Rice has driven in a team-best eight runs and is tied with Boyd for the team-lead in hits (18).

Senior Dan Dierdorff will start for West Virginia on Sunday. The righthander is 1-2 with a 7.43 ERA in three starts this season.

Head coach Randy Mazey is in his first season at the helm of the WVU program. Manzey and the Mountaineers play Thursday, Friday, and Saturday in Florida.

DAHM COLLECTS 500TH WIN

lowa head coach Jack Dahm won his 500th career game as a collegiate coach in the Hawkeyes 7-3 triumph over Western Illinois on March 2.

Dahm, who is in his 20th season as a head coach, won 283 games at Creighton from 1994-2003 and has won 217 games at lowa, beginning in 2004. His 217 wins at lowa rank third in program history, trailing Duane Banks (810 wins) and Otto Voqel (440 wins).

1-RUN GAMES UNDER DAHM

During Jack Dahm's 10-year tenure at lowa, the Hawkeyes have played 123 one-run games. Iowa is 57-66 in such contests. The Hawkeyes went 10-7 in one-run games in 2012, winning their final five.

HAWKEYES PLAY 4 IN ARKANSAS

The Hawkeyes went 1-3 last weekend in Little Rock, Ark. Iowa opened the weekend against UALR, suffering a 5-2 setback on March 1. The Hawkeyes bounced back to defeat Western Illinois, 7-3, in the first game of a Saturday doubleheader, but fell in the second game, losing 9-3 in a rematch with UALR. The Hawkeyes closed

the weekend Sunday against Wichita State, falling 5-3.

TOOLE THE THIEF

Sophomore Eric Toole is a perfect 6-of-6 in stolen base attempts this season. Toole's six swipes are a team-best, and place him tied for second among Big Ten athletes. The Council Bluffs, lowa, native stole seven bases in 2012, ranking fourth on the team.

ACTIVE STREAKS

Sophomores Eric Toole and Taylor Kaufman are both currently riding career-best reached base streaks. Toole has reached base safely in nine straight games, while Kaufman's streak sits at eight games.

In addition, Toole has hit safely in six straight games, which is also a career-high.

B1G WINS LEADER

Senior Matt Dermody is one of 11 Big Ten pitchers tied for the conference lead with two wins. Dermody in 2-0 in three starts this season, picking up wins against Western Illinois (March 2) and Austin Peay (Feb. 16). The Norwalk, Iowa, native owns a 3.00 ERA over 18 innings.

"K"UEBEL

Sophomore pitcher Sasha Kuebel is one of the Big Ten's best strikeout pitchers, ranking in the top-10 in the Big Ten in two categories. The St. Louis native is tied for first in batters struck out looking (7) and ranks ninth in total strikeouts (13). Both marks lead the team.

SANDQUIST SHINES OUT OF BULLPEN

Senior Ricky Sandquist has been the Hawkeyes most consistent pitcher out of the bullpen this season. Sandquist has not allowed an earned run in four appearances, throwing 12.0 innings. The Fort Dodge, lowa, native made two appearances during the Hawkeyes' recent four-game trip to Little Rock, Ark., throwing seven innings without allowing an earned run. Sandquist collected his first win of the season March 24 at Texas A&M Corpus Christi after tossing three innings.

THE CLOSER

Senior Andrew Hanse has finished four games on the mound this season, ranking tied for second in the Big Ten. Hanse has tossed 7.1 innings in four appearances, posting a 1.23 ERA and five strikeouts. The Marion, Iowa, native picked up his first save after throwing a perfect ninth inning on Feb. 24 against Texas A&M Corpus Christi.

HIBBING WITH THE SAVE

Sophomore Nick Hibbing earned his first save of the season against Western Illinois on March 2, throwing two scoreless innings in relief of starter Matt Dermody. The Lindenhurst, Ill., native has made two appearances the season, throwing three scoreless innings with four strikeouts.

GOOD(MAN) HITTING

Sophomore Kris Goodman has been one of the





Hawkeyes top offensive threats this season, leading the team in batting average (.400), slugging percentage (.400), hits (14), runs scored (7), and total bases (16). His 14 hits are tied for fourth in the Big Ten, while his .400 batting average ranks sixth in the conference. The Apple Valley, Minn., native opened the year with a career-best eightgame hitting streak.

YACINICH AT THE PLATE

Sophomore Jake Yacinich has recorded a teambest five multi-hit games this season, including a career-best three hits against Western Illinois on March 2. Yacinich has tallied 14 hits, ranking second on the team and tied for seventh in the Big Ten.

The West Des Moines, Iowa, native has delivered a team-best six RBIs, hitting in the No. 2 spot three times and the No. 3 hole seven

Yacinich hit safely in the Hawkeyes first five games this season, tying a career-best hitting streak.

OUCH!

The Hawkeyes have been hit by 22 pitches this season, the most of any Big Ten team. Senior Keith Brand and sophomore Jake Yacinich have both been plunked four times, leading the team and ranking second in the Big Ten.

lowa was hit by a pitch seven times March 1 against Arkansas-Little Rock, the most a Big Ten club has been hit in a game this season. Brand accounted for three of the seven hit by pitches.

SACRIFICING YOURSELF

lowa has laid down a Big Ten-best 10 sacrifice bunts this season. Sophomore Eric Toole has delivered four of the sacrifices, leading the team and the conference.

DON'T RUN ON SHEPPARD

Senior Dan Sheppard has caught five baserunners attempting to steal this season. The mark is second in the conference. Sheppard threw out four baserunners in lowa's season-opening series at Austin Peay (Feb. 15-17).

BULLPEN DOES ITS JOB

The lowa bullpen has been stellar this year, allowing eight earned run in 38 innings and collecting two of the team's four wins.

Three relievers -- senior Rick Sandquist and sophomores Nick Hibbing and Ryan Rumpf -- have not allowed an earned run this season, while senior Andrew Hanse has allowed one run in 7.1 innings.

The Hawkeye bullpen allowed seven runs in 18.2 innings during Hawkeyes' recent fourgame trip to Little Rock, Ark.

Hanse, Sandquist, and sophomore Taylor Kaufman allowed one earned run in nine innings at the Kleberg Bank College Classic on Feb. 22-24, as Kaufman (New Mexico) and Sandguist (Texas A&M Corpus Christi) both picked up wins.

The bullpen did not allow an earned run in

the Hawkeyes' three-game series at Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Hanse, Sandguist, Kaufman, Hibbing, sophomore Andrew Hedrick, and freshman Josh Martsching combined to pitch 10.1 innings without allowing an earned run out of the bullpen against the Governors.

STINGY PITCHING STAFF

The lowa pitching staff has been among the best in the Big Ten so far this season, ranking in the top-five in six statistical categories. The Hawkeyes rank third in ERA (3.00), earned runs allowed (29), and opposing batting average (.255), fourth in runs allowed (40) and walks allowed (34), and fifth in hits allowed (84).

HAWKEYE DEBUTS

Seven Hawkeye newcomers made their lowa debuts this season.

Five newcomers made their debut during a three-game series at Austin Peay. Freshman Blake Hickman made his collegiate debut Feb. 15,. Junior Trevor Kenyon, a junior college transfer, and freshmen Nick Roscetti and Josh Martsching saw their first action as a Hawkeye on Feb. 16. Freshman Calvin Mathews made his debut on Feb. 17, starting on the mound.

Freshmen Devin Pickett and Jimmy Frankos made their debuts March 2 at Arkansas-Little Rock, entering the contest off the bench.

KLEBERG CLASSIC ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM

Three Hawkeyes -- sophomores Taylor Kaufman, Kris Goodman and Sasha Kuebel -- were named to the Kleberg Bank College Classic All-Tournament team. Kaufman hit .545 with six hits and two RBIs, Goodman had six hits and an RBI, and Kuebel limited Oklahoma to two runs on eight hits over eight innings in the opener.

BRAND STEPS UP IN 1ST START

Junior Keith Brand earned his first start of the season Feb. 24 at Texas A&M Corpus Christi, serving as the Hawkeyes' designated hitter. Brand responded by delivering a double in the top of the eighth that plated the game-winning run.

A PAIR OF FIRSTS

Sophomore Nick Day has notched the first home run and multi-hit game of his collegiate career

Day's posted his first multi-hit game Feb. 23 against New Mexico, going 2-for-4 against the Lobos.

Day hit his first home run Feb. 17 at Austin Peay. The Solon, Iowa, native led off the fourth inning by hitting a solo blast over the left field

SHEPPARD OPENS SEASON IN STYLE

Senior Dan Sheppard was impressive in the Hawkeyes season-opening series against Austin Peay on Feb. 15-17. Sheppard hit .364 (4-of-11) and batted in a team-best four runs in the threegame set, including a 3-of-4, four RBI game on Feb. 16. Sheppard's three hits in a game tied a career-best, while his four RBIs set a new

career-high. His four RBIs were the most by any Big Ten athlete during the opening weekend of play.

A LINEUP FULL OF YOUTH
