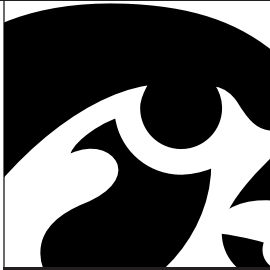

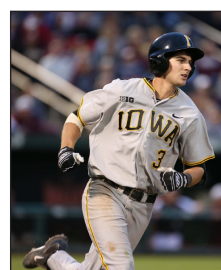

LEADING OFF

- The Hawkeyes are fifth in the Big Ten Conference with a 3.53 team ERA through the first two weekends of the season. Iowa is limiting opposing hitters to a .237 average over six games.
- Iowa scored 15 runs on 19 hits in a 15-3 victory over Chicago State on Feb. 28 in Port Charlotte, Florida. The 15 runs and 19 hits are the most by a Big Ten team this season.
- Senior Tyler Peyton is riding a four-game hitting streak, and senior Daniel Aaron Moriel has reached in eight consecutive games dating back to last season.
- Iowa returns 20 letterwinners, four positional starters, 2/3 of its starting rotation, and 10 total pitchers in 2016. Among the returnees is All-Big Ten selections Tyler Peyton, Calvin Mathews, and Nick Roscetti.
- Seniors Calvin Mathews, Tyler Peyton, and Nick Roscetti are Iowa's Big Ten Players to Watch. All three are returning All-Big Ten selections.
- Season tickets for the 2016 Iowa baseball home schedule are available for purchase through hawkeyesports.com. Iowa plays 24 home games at Duane Banks Field.

UI head coach Rick Heller is in his third season leading the Hawkeye baseball program.

Heller, an Eldon, Iowa, native, has been head coach at four institutions -- Iowa (2014-present), Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99) -- leading all four schools to NCAA postseason play. He is one of nine coaches all-time and one of five active coaches to lead three different Division I programs to NCAA Regional play.

Heller is the winningest coach in his first two seasons in Iowa history, posting a 71-41 record, and he is one of two UI head coaches to lead the program to the NCAA Tournament. In 28 seasons as a head coach, Heller owns a career record of 761-606-4.

The Hawkeyes had a breakthrough season in Heller's second season in Iowa City, going 41-18 with the 41 victories being the second-most all-time and just the fourth 40-win season in program history. Iowa earned the school's first NCAA Regional berth since 1990, where it went 2-2 at the Springfield Regional for the program's first NCAA Tournament win since 1972.

The Hawkeyes rolled to a 15-5 start and won its first 11 series of the season, including a school-record eight consecutive Big Ten series wins dating back to the 2014 season. Iowa swept No. 19 Indiana to open Big Ten play to catapult the Hawkeyes into the national rankings for the first time in 25 years. Iowa climbed to as high as No. 13 before finishing the year 20th by Collegiate Baseball, 25th by Baseball America, and 28th by the NCBWA -- the program's first appearance in the final rankings in school history.

Heller guided Iowa to a Big Ten runner-up (three games ahead of the third place finisher) finish in a year where the league was at its all-time best with a record five NCAA Regional participants. Iowa went 19-5 in conference play for a .792 winning percentage -- the best winning percentage by a second place team since the Big Ten returned to single division play in 1988.

In NCAA Regional play, Heller led the Hawkeyes to a pair of wins over Oregon in Springfield, Missouri, and lost two games to No. 8 national seed Missouri State by a combined three runs. Senior reliever Nick Hibbing was tabbed as the Springfield Regional's Most Outstanding Player and was named to the all-tournament team.

Under Heller's watch, Iowa had a pair of players earn three All-America distinctions, had a school-record six All-Big Ten selections, and a semifinalist for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award.

THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa baseball team travels to Carbondale, Illinois, for a three-game series at Southern Illinois on March 4-6 at Richard "Itchy" Jones Stadium. Friday's series opener starts a 3 p.m. (CT) followed by 2 p.m. and 1 p.m. starts Saturday and Sunday.

GAME COVERAGE

- Iowa's live audio stream of the three games will be available on Hawkeye All-Access. Zach Mackey will be on the call. Steve Duncan or Ray Gilmore will provide color commentary.

NOTABLES

- After hitting .144 during the opening three-game series at Dallas Baptist, the Hawkeyes rebounded to hit .321 as a team during the Snowbird Classic.
- Senior right-handed pitcher Tyler Peyton will not pitch this weekend due to forearm tightness. C.J. Eldred will make his first career Friday start.
- Iowa's bats awoke in the finale in Florida, scoring a season-high 15 runs on 19 hits. Eleven different Hawkeyes tallied a hit, nine had an RBI, and nine scored a run.
- The Hawkeyes' 15 runs were the most since the 2014 season when Iowa scored 17 in a 17-5 victory at Purdue.
- Iowa had six doubles against the Cougars -- tied for the most in a single game in the Big Ten this season.
- The Hawkeyes were hitting .181 as a team following its 4-1 victory over Dartmouth on Feb. 27. Iowa's average rose 60 points courtesy of the 19 hit game against Chicago State.
- Freshman Luke Farley made the most of his first career start, finishing 2-for-3 with two runs and three RBIs against Chicago State. Farley earned the start as Iowa's designated hitter.
- Senior Joel Booker is 3-for-3 on the base paths in 2016, already 1/3 of the way to his 2015 total. The outfielder was 9-for-14 in stolen base attempts last season.

SOUTHERN ILLINOIS NOTABLES

- The Salukis are 5-3 overall and 4-0 in home games this season. Southern Illinois rallied for a 6-5 victory over SEMO on Wednesday night. Logan Blackfan finished 2-for-5 with five RBIs

in the game, including a walk-off sacrifice fly in the bottom of the ninth inning.

- Southern Illinois swept a three-game series over Western Illinois from Feb. 26-28 in Carbondale. The Salukis out-scored the Leathernecks, 22-1, and posted back-to-back 9-0 shutouts in games two and three.
- Five SIU players are hitting above .300 and the Salukis have a .271 team batting average with 24 extra base hits and 39 RBIs. SIU averages 5.3 runs per game.
- Dyllin Mucha leads SIU with a .500 batting average, while Logan Blackfan is hitting .387 with 12 hits, five doubles, and a team-high 10 RBIs. Connor Kopach has a team-best seven runs.
- SIU will pitch junior LHP Joey Marciano (1-1, 2.61 ERA) on Friday, junior RHP Chad Whitmer (1-0, 0.64 ERA) on Saturday, and sophomore RHP Michael Baird (1-1, 1.64 ERA) on Sunday.
- The Salukis were picked to finish eighth in the eight-team Missouri Valley Conference, garnering 13 points. Southern Illinois, who went 12-46 last season and 6-15 in MVC play, has 24 returning letterwinners in 2016.

SERIES RECORD

- Iowa leads the all-time series over Southern Illinois, 5-4.
- It is the first meeting between the two schools since the 2009 season when the Salukis were victorious, 8-3, at the Stetson Invitational in DeLand, Fla. The Hawkeyes' last win over SIU came in 2006 by the score of 15-9 in San Antonio at the Notre Dame Tournament.

SENIORS LEAD CHARGE

Seniors Nick Roscetti and Joel Booker had career days in Iowa's 15-3 victory over Chicago State, posting the first four-hit games of their careers. Roscetti finished 4-for-6 with three doubles, three runs, and two RBIs, while Booker was 4-for-5 with two RBIs. Roscetti had six doubles in 2015 and 12 in his career leading into the 2016 season.

The duo is leading the team with a .333 batting average through six games. Roscetti has a team-high six runs, four RBIs, and three multi-hit games.

ELDRED EARNS NO. 1

Sophomore C.J. Eldred pitched the Hawkeyes to a 4-1 victory over Dartmouth in the first start of his collegiate career. The right-hander



allowed one run on four hits over five innings, fanning five. Eldred is 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA in two appearances, allowing three runs (two earned) on six hits over nine innings.

BUILDING A BULLPEN

- The Hawkeyes have three relievers -- sophomore Nick Allgeyer, senior Tyler Radtke, and freshman Zach Daniels -- that have yet to allow a run in 2016 in two appearances apiece.
- Allgeyer tossed a career-high four innings, allowing one hit and striking out four against Dartmouth on Feb. 27 to earn his first save of the season (third of career). He has allowed one hit over five innings and fanned five.
- Radtke has allowed three hits in three innings, fanning four, and Daniels has allowed two hits in 2 2/3 innings, fanning two.
- Iowa's bullpen, collectively, has a 2.63 ERA over 27 1/3 innings, and is holding opposing batters to a .212 batting average.

WEEK 3; 3 DIFFERENT ROTATIONS

- After having stability and running out the same starting rotation for the duration of the 2015 season, Iowa is on the opposite end of the spectrum early in 2016. The Hawkeyes will be using their third different starting rotation this weekend in Carbondale.
- Sophomore C.J. Eldred will make his second start of the season and his first Friday night start. He is 1-0 with a 2.00 ERA.
 - Redshirt junior Ryan Erickson will make his first collegiate start after pitching out of the bullpen during Iowa's first weekends. He is 0-0 with a 6.00 ERA, allowing nine runs (four earned) on nine hits over six innings.
 - Senior Calvin Mathews will make his third start, but he hasn't gone past the fourth inning in 2016. The right-hander is 0-0 with a 2.25 ERA, allowing three runs (two earned) on eight hits in eight innings in two no-decisions.

SENIOR TYLER PEYTON...

- logged a quality start at Dallas Baptist, going 6 1/3 innings, scattering two hits, and striking out six. Both runs were unearned, as he took the loss.
- will not pitch at Southern Illinois due to forearm tightness. Peyton went just three innings in his last start against Indiana State, where he was tagged with his second loss.
- is 12-7 in his Iowa career with a 3.89 ERA in

32 starts. Peyton has 15 quality starts and has pitched into the seventh inning 14 times in his career.

- has logged 180 1/3 innings in two-plus seasons, where he has 126 strikeouts to 59 walks.
- earned third-team All-America honors by D1Baseball.com and the USBWA as a junior.
- has the best change-up in the Big Ten Conference according to Baseball America.

SENIOR CALVIN MATHEWS...

- is 10-11 with a 3.06 ERA in 41 appearances (37 starts). He has logged 194 1/3 innings, allowing 168 hits, striking out 134 strikeouts to 60 walks.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Jimmy Frankos, Calvin Mathews, Tyler Radtke, and Nick Roscetti are the team captains for the 2016 season. Radtke is in his second season as team captain.

B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH

Seniors Calvin Mathews, Tyler Peyton, and Nick Roscetti have been named to the Big Ten Players to Watch List for the 2016 season. All three players are returning All-Big Ten selections; Mathews was a second-team honoree in 2015; Peyton and Roscetti were third-team selections.

PRESEASON PROGNOSTICATIONS

- The Hawkeyes have been selected to finish fourth in the Big Ten Conference in a vote of the league's 13 head coaches. Michigan was tabbed as the league favorite, followed by Maryland and Indiana.
- Iowa was also picked to finish second in the conference by Collegiate Baseball and fourth by D1Baseball.com and Perfect Game.
- D1Baseball.com and College Sports Madness have Iowa playing in its second straight NCAA Regional in 2016.

RETURNEES BY THE NUMBERS

- Iowa returns 51.5 percent of its RBIs (135 of 262), 46.4 percent of its runs (136 of 293), 45.1 percent of its hits (243 of 539) and 42.9 percent of its doubles (36 of 84). The Hawkeyes also have six (of 14) home runs returning to the lineup.
- On the pitching front, Iowa returns weekend starters Tyler Peyton (7-4, 3.03 ERA) and Calvin Mathews (5-3, 2.45 ERA) and 11-of-19

saves from 2015. The Hawkeyes have 61 percent of their wins (25 of 41), 69 percent of their innings pitched (371 of 537.1), and 66.2 percent of the strikeouts (247 of 373) back.

MR. EVERYTHING RETURNS

Senior Tyler Peyton returns as Iowa's Most Valuable Player as a two-way player. The Grimes, Iowa, native is the team's Friday night starter, where he went 7-4 with a 3.03 ERA as a junior, logging 95 innings. Peyton also is the team's top hitter, batting .337 with 31 runs and 31 RBIs in the three spot in the order last season. He was a semifinalist for the John Olerud Two-Way Player of the Year Award in 2015 and earned third-team All-America honors from D1Baseball.com and the NCBWA.

• Peyton bypassed the 2015 Major League Baseball Draft to return to Iowa City. He turned down seventh round talk and returned after being selected in the 33rd round by the Cincinnati Reds.

MCCOY STEPS IN AT 2B

Junior college transfer Mason McCoy is set to start the year as Iowa's every day second baseman. The two-time All-American at Illinois Central College had a breakout summer in the Northwoods League, breaking league single-season records in hits (112), runs (80), and total bases (168). The Washington, Illinois, native was the Northwoods League MVP, La Crosse Loggers MVP, an NWL All-Star, and a Postseason All-Star.

THE FORMULA - PITCHING & DEFENSE

• Iowa won with its pitching and defense in 2015 and it's the equation UI head coach Rick Heller is counting on again this season. The Hawkeye pitching staff shattered the school record with a 2.95 ERA over 59 games. The previous record was

3.63 in 1971.

- The team finished 10th in the nation in hits allowed per nine innings (7.69) and 16th in ERA last season.
- Iowa was 11th nationally (and second in the Big Ten) in fielding percentage with a .978 clip. Iowa committed 50 errors in 59 games and turned 51 double plays.

HAWKEYE LEGACY JOINS ROSTER

Sophomore C.J. Eldred is eligible to pitch for the Hawkeyes after sitting out the 2015 season after transferring from Indiana. Eldred is the son of former Iowa pitcher, first-round MLB Draft pick, and Major Leaguer Cal Eldred.

HOME COOKIN'

The Hawkeyes went 17-3 at Duane Banks Field in 2015 -- the most home victories since 1996. The success stems, in part, to the game day atmosphere, where nearly 18,000 fans supported the team throughout the season. The Hawkeyes averaged nearly 1,000 fans per home contest and had two crowds of 2,400-plus during Big Ten Conference play.

NEW FACES ON THE ROSTER

Iowa's freshmen class is a collection of talent that was the highest-rated recruiting class in the Big Ten Conference. Several players are contending for playing time.

- Robert Neustrom (Sioux City, Iowa) is battling for a starting outfield position. Neustrom was a the Iowa Gatorade Player of the Year as a senior. He was named the No. 2 impact freshman in the Big Ten by D1baseball.com.

- The pitching-heavy class gives Iowa's pitching staff depth with Cole McDonald (New Hampton, Iowa), Sam Lizarraga (Cedar Rapids, Iowa), Shane Ritter (Plainfield, Illinois), and Kyle Shimp (Yorkville, Ill.).
- Infielder Daniel Perry was the highest drafted recruit in the Big Ten Conference in 2015. The infielder was injured throughout the fall.

#HELLERBALL

- UI head coach Rick Heller is one of nine coaches all-time (one of four active) to lead three different NCAA Division I teams to regional play.
- The Hawkeyes finished the 2015 season ranked No. 20 by Collegiate Baseball, 25th by Baseball America, and 28th by the NCBWA. It was the program's first end of season rankings in school history.
- Iowa finished as the runner-up in Big Ten play, winning 19 games during the regular season -- the most for the program since 1990.
- The Hawkeyes won 41 games -- the second-most in a single season in school history. It was Iowa's fourth 40-win season in program history.
- Heller is the winningest coach in his first two seasons in program history, winning 71 games. Iowa has posted back-to-back 30 win seasons for the first time since 1989 and 1990.

- The Hawkeyes roster includes players ranging from California to North Carolina to Canada.
- Iowa boasts three sets of high school teammates on the 2016 roster: Calvin Mathews and Josh Martsching -- Davis County High School in Bloomfield, Iowa; Tyler Peyton and Cole Baker -- Dallas Center-Grimes High School in Grimes, Iowa; Zach Daniels and Sam Lizarraga -- Cedar Rapids Kennedy High School in Cedar Rapids, Iowa. Tyler Peyton and Luke Vandermaten were also teammates at Iowa Central Community College in 2014.
- The Hawkeyes have 20 letterwinners, four positional starters, 2/3 of their starting rotation, and 10 total pitchers returning in 2016.
