LSU FOOTBALL POSTGAME NOTES

Outback Bowl: Iowa vs. #14 LSU

January 1, 2014 – Raymond James Stadium (Tampa, Fla.)

Team

1. LSU's game captains were 80 Jarvis Landry, 8 Zach Mettenberger, 18 Lamin Barrow and 82 James Wright.
2. Iowa won the toss and deferred its option to the second half. LSU has lost the toss eight times during the 2013 season.
3. True freshman quarterback Anthony Jennings and sophomore defensive tackle Quentin Thomas started their first games as LSU Tigers on Wednesday versus Iowa. LSU has had 18 first-time starters this season. Jennings is the fifth true freshman to crack the starting lineup in 2013.
4. LSU's defense has held the opponent without a score on 10 of its 13 opening drives this season. The Tigers have recorded four three-and-outs.
5. LSU's offense has scored on seven of its 13 opening drives of the season. Six of the seven scores have resulted in touchdowns.
6. LSU improved to 40-4 under Les Miles when producing a 100-yard rusher, and it marked the first time under Miles that LSU produced a 200-yard rusher as Jeremy Hill ran for 216 yards against Iowa.
7. Under Les Miles, LSU is now 41-2 against non-conference opponents, 11-4 in neutral site games and 6-3 in bowl games.
8. LSU is now 23-21-1 in 45 bowl game appearances, including a 1-1 record in the Outback Bowl, and LSU is 1-1 against Iowa.
9. With the win, LSU is 10-3 this season, marking the fourth-straight year the Tigers have won double-digit games which is a school record. The previous best was three straight seasons with 11 wins in 2005, 11 in 2006 and 12 in 2007 also under Les Miles.
10. The Tigers' first-half shutout in Wednesday's Outback Bowl vs. Iowa was LSU's first shutout in the first half of a bowl game since the 1963 Bluebonnet Bowl versus Baylor.
11. This game marked the 15th time LSU has played on a Wednesday, and with the win LSU is now 9-5-1.

12. RB Jeremy Hill was named the MVP of the Outback Bowl after he carried the ball 28 times for 216 yards and two touchdowns. The yard total is a career high, surpassing the 184 he had against Auburn this season. He has rushed for a touchdown in 10 of his 12 games this season and he recorded his 15th rushing touchdown of the year with a 14-yard score at the 7:23 mark of the second quarter. He added his 16th rushing TD of the season on a 37-yard scamper with 2:02 left in the game.
 - a. Hill's 16 rushing TDs rank fourth on LSU's single-season list, and his 28 career rushing TDs are good enough for seventh place on LSU's career list.
 - b. Hill's 216 rushing yards are: 1) the most in a game by an LSU player since Alley Broussard set the school record with 250 yards against Ole Miss on Nov. 20, 2004. 2) the third-most in Outback Bowl history. 3) the third-most in a bowl game in LSU history behind Kevin Faulk (234 yards vs. Michigan State, 1995 Independence Bowl) and Rondell Mealey (222 yards vs. Notre Dame, 1997 Independence Bowl). 4) the eighth-most in a single game in school history.
 - c. Hill's 216 rushing yards on Wednesday gives him 1,401 yards for the season. He now ranks No. 2 on LSU's all-time single-season list with his 1,401 rushing yards in 2013, surpassing Dalton Hilliard (1,268; 1984), Kevin Faulk (1,279; 1998) and Faulk again (1,282; 1996). Hill finished only behind Charles Alexander who had 1,686 yards in 1977.
 - d. Hill's 216 rushing yards was his first 200-yard rushing game of the season, seventh 100-yard rushing game of the season and 11th 100-yard rushing game of his career. He is the fourth player to accumulate 11 career 100-yard rushing games, and he is tied for first place on the school single-season list for 100-yard games. The other LSU players with seven 100-yard games in one season are Kevin Faulk (1996), Charles Alexander (1977) and Steve Van Buren (1943).
13. Senior WR James Wright recovered a muffed punt early in the second quarter, his second special teams recovery this season. He forced and recovered a fumble on a kickoff against TCU in the Cowboys Classic on Aug. 31.
14. True freshman CB Tre'Davious White recorded his second interception of the season with 11:52 remaining in the second quarter. The interception led to an LSU scoring drive capped by Jeremy Hill's 14-yard TD run.
15. P Jamie Keehn finished with a career-high 10 punts for a 46.9-yard average, a long of 56 and four downed inside the Iowa 20.
16. QB Anthony Jennings scored his second rushing TD of the season on a three-yard scoring run with 10:59 remaining in the first quarter. His first rushing TD of the year was a one-yard QB sneak against Florida on October 12. Jennings finished the game 7-of-19 passing for 82 yards in his first career start.
17. LB D.J. Welter recorded his second career sack with 2:57 remaining in the second quarter. His first sack came on Sept. 14 of this season vs. Kent State in Tiger Stadium.
18. WR Odell Beckham Jr. extended his streak of consecutive games with at least one reception to 27 after he finished with two catches for 35 yards. He has also caught at least one pass in 38 of 40 career games played.
 - a. With his 93 total yards this afternoon (35 receiving, 19 punt return, 39 kickoff return), Beckham Jr. improved his single-season school record to 2,315 yards in 2013. He finished the season ranked second on the SEC's single-season list for all-purpose yardage with his 2,315 yards only trailing Randall Cobb (Kentucky, 2010) 2,396 yards.
 - b. Beckham Jr. moved up to No. 3 on LSU's all-time single-season list for receiving yards with 1,152 yards on the year. Jarvis Landry finished the year ranked third in LSU single-season receiving yards with 1,193.
19. DE Danielle Hunter recorded his third sack of the season early in the third quarter – he also recorded a solo sack this season vs. Texas A&M and half-sacks against Ole Miss and TCU.
20. S Craig Loston recorded his third interception of the season with 5:04 left in the fourth quarter. It is his seventh career interception.

On John Lowdermilk's interception return for a touchdown later reviewed and placed at the one yard line:

"It was a great play, first of all. When you get in a game like that, a defensive ball game, you're looking for a spark anywhere, it would be him. Jordan Cotton certainly gave us a spark on the kick return. We were hoping obviously it was a touchdown. It didn't work out that way, but that's part of the deal too. That's a good play by Johnny."

On LSU running back Jeremy Hill compared to Big Ten backs:

"He's a very good back, obviously. The first guy that comes to mind for me is the running back at Ohio State. He's awfully good too. They're both excellent; I don't want to pick one over the other. But if you were picking one, you'd be happy to have either one, I can tell you that."

On LSU's power running game:

"That's who they are. When they run the ball they're not a finesse team at all. They've got several different schemes that they utilize. They run them well. They're a well-conceived offense. They execute well and they have good players. Obviously they had a new quarterback out there but we had a lot of respect for him, certainly. He played a good game."

On the legacy of the three Iowa senior linebackers:

"We've had a lot of good players through the last 15 years, longer than that certainly. These three guys have just done an outstanding job. They're all very different stories, although they all played as true freshmen. All different stories, but they've all just had tremendous careers and all three of those guys to me are a big part of us being here today. Certainly those three guys are at the head of the class."

On how his team responded in the second half:

"That's who they are. I don't say it in an arrogant way. We wanted to win today, there's no question about that. I'll tell you, we're all disappointed. But the bottom line is they deserved to win. They made the plays you have to make to get it done, credit to them on that. To be around this football team, to coach them, to go to the practice field every day with those guys, weight room, wherever they've been, it's been a really great group of guys to work with. The guys have played hard, competed hard each and every step. That's where it all starts. Everything you do in life starts with that and working hard. We came up short today, but I'm extremely proud of these guys. It's been a lot of fun to be around them on a daily basis. It's been a great 13 months."

he did, but I kind of wish that (Jarvis) Landry, and (Odell) Beckham and (Alfred) Blue and some of these other guys had big games too.”

On the effectiveness of the LSU running game:

“Again, we hit a couple of things that we knew were going to be good early on in the game and pressed them, stayed with them. J. Hill made some nice cuts early on and we take a very significant lead. Late in the game it’s cover zero and if you make a guy miss it’s a big gain. If you can put two defenders behind one blocker it’s a huge game. J. Hill knew that. He’s one of those backs that, if you give him the opportunity to close out a game, he knows what to do. He made some nice cuts. When you give him that spot, that opportunity at extending the play, he can score, and he did.”

On underclassmen that may leave early for the NFL:

“I’m sure I’m going to be excited. I can tell you this; there is a point in time where the decision is a personal one and one that you take a mom or dad, a family, you sit down and kind of map it out. You find out what goals you have and what benefits you best, and it’s not the coach’s decision. I have to be honest with you, I give them everything I’ve got and I generally give an opinion. I am very fortunate to represent quality men who give me everything I ask them for. I promise you this, I looked on the field and every guy just gave 100 percent effort and contact at risk of injury. For me, if they decide it’s their last one, I’m going to support them and love them and go to recruiting.”

On what his next step is:

I'm going to enjoy a little time off here. I have the Senior Bowl coming up, but I'm going to enjoy a couple days with my family. I'm going to worry about that later; that's the next step. I'll probably work out with the Iowa coaches when school starts up. But for the Senior Bowl, there won't be anybody from Iowa so I'll probably go somewhere down south and train there.

On whether he could sense the LSU player running him down on the kickoff return:

I thought I had it all the way, but then I heard the guy behind me and I knew he had an angle on me. All of a sudden he dove at me and I tried to extend for the pylon but I was out of bounds before I did that. But we needed a spark right then and I did that.

On what the mentality was going into that kick off with it being a two score game:

This game is not over yet. We've been down and we've been at this point before. That's the way Iowa football is; we keep fighting until the clock says zeroes. It just shows the leadership that we have from our seniors and all of the guys that put in the extra work. We're just dedicated.

On what he will remember about this football team:

What I'll remember are all of the great friends that I have made during the last five years. Being from Iowa and being around these guys; they are just like brothers to me.

On whether he'll remember this kickoff return more than his kickoff return for a touchdown at Penn State:

This one I'll remember more. This is the first bowl game that I have actually got to contribute in. And being able to go out with a huge kickoff return and giving our team momentum was great.
