Series Record: First Meeting



The Setting • Iowa (2-2) returns from the West Coast to host UW-Green Bay (3-1) Wednesday. Tip-off is slated for 5:35 p.m. in Carver-Hawkeye Arena (15,500).

On the Radio • Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call the action for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the game on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City.

The game can also be heard live over the Internet at www.hawkeyesports.com and clicking on "Hawkeye All-Access" at the top right of the page. "Hawkeye All-Access" is a subscription service.

Iowa History • Iowa has played 883 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 539-344 (.610). That includes a 267-125 (.681) mark in Big Ten games and a 239-58 (.805) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Iowa will play game No. 300 in Carver-Hawkeye Arena Saturday, December 4. The Hawkeyes potentially can play nationally-ranked Rutgers that game. The Scarlet Knights are coached by former Iowa Head Coach C. Vivian Stringer.

Number of the Week -- 5 • Crystal Smith, who was named Big Ten Player of the Week, established or tied five school records last week. The senior set school records for points (46) and free throws attempted (19) in a game and equaled school records in free throws made (15) and 3-pointers attempted (14) in a contest in Iowa's 95-91 double overtime setback at Louisiana Tech on Nov. 22. The native of Houghton, LA, also matched the school record for field goal percentage in a game (9-9, 1.000) in the Hawkeyes' 88-41 rout over Rider on Nov. 26.

In the three games, Smith averaged 28.3 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 2.7 steals per game. She finished the week 26-of-55 (.473) from the field, 10-of-25 (.400) from the perimeter and 23-of-28 (.821) at the line.

Movin' On Up • Senior Crystal Smith (151) is only six steals from tying Johanna Solverson (157) for 12th on Iowa's career steals chart. Smith (790) is also only 12 points from matching Solverson (802) for 28th in career scoring at Iowa.

On This Date • Iowa is 3-5 in games played on November 30, including winning its last two.

Scouting UW-Green Bay • UW-Green Bay (3-1) enters Wednesday's game on a three-game winning streak, having defeated Northern Illinois (73-67, OT), Pacific (56-41) and Vermont (62-52).

The Phoenix topped Pacific and Vermont to win the Oneida Casino Holiday Tournament last weekend in Green Bay. Nicole Soulis and Natalie Berglin were named to the all-tournament team, with Soulis named Most Valuable Player. Soulis posted a double-double (26 points, 11 rebounds), while Berglin added 16 points and five assists in the championship game triumph over the Catamounts, who Iowa plays Friday.

The duo of Soulis and Berglin lead the team in scoring, both averaging 16.3 ppg. Soulis also ranks first on the squad in rebounding (7.5), while Berglin also leads the team in steals (2.75).

The Phoenix return eight letterwinners, but only one starter from last year's 27-4 team that won the Horizon League and advanced to the first round of the NCAA Tournament.

Kevin Borseth is in his 19th year as a collegiate head coach (392-149, .725), and his eighth with UWGB (167-52, .763).

UW-Green Bay Tip-Ins • Wednesday's game starts a four-game road trip for the Phoenix. Following Wednesday's contest in Iowa City, UW-Green Bay travels to Oakland (MI) (Dec. 3), Illinois State (Dec. 8) and DePaul (Dec. 10). In fact, seven of its next eight games are on the road.

Ten of UW-Green Bay's 13 players on its roster hail from Wisconsin. The other three are natives of Illinois, Indiana and Florida.

The Phoenix have won six-straight Horizon League regular season titles and have recorded four-consecutive NCAA Tournament appearances.

Like Iowa, UW-Green Bay have five freshmen on this year's roster.

All-Time Series Record

Wednesday will be the first meeting between Iowa and UW-Green Bay. Iowa is 6-1 all-time against current members of the Horizon League (Butler, 2-0; UW-Milwaukee, 2-0; Illinois-Chicago, 1-1; Wright State, 1-0).

Common Opponents • Iowa and UW-Green Bay play two common opponents: UW-Milwaukee and Vermont. The Hawkeyes topped the Panthers 81-41 in the season opener on Nov. 20. The Phoenix will play twice in February during conference play. UW-Green Bay defeated Vermont 62-52 in the championship game of the Oneida Casino Holiday Tournament. Iowa will face the Catamounts Friday in the first round of the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge.

Last Time Out • Iowa split a pair of games on the West Coast last weekend, falling to No. 22 Oklahoma (85-68) Friday, then rebounding to defeat Rider (88-41) Saturday in the Odwalla Classic in San Francisco, CA.

Iowa broke open the consolation game against Rider, scoring the first 21 points of the second half and out-scoring the Broncs 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza. The Hawkeyes led by as many as 50 points in the second period.

Senior Crystal Smith paced Iowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

Iowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to Iowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista VandeVenter collected five.

Iowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains for the season are seniors Morgan Kasperek, Tiffany Reedy and Crystal Smith.

Countdown to 100 • Iowa Head Women's Basketball Coach Lisa Bluder is only two victories from notching her 100th on the Iowa sidelines. Bluder, who is the second all-time winningest Iowa coach, boasts a 98-61 (.616) record in six years mentoring the Hawkeyes.

Night and Day • Iowa converted a season-low 65.0 percent (26-40) from the free throw line in its double overtime loss at Louisiana Tech. The Hawkeyes rebounded at the foul line in their next two contests at the Odwalla Classic, converting a combined 89.3 percent (25-28).

More on Smith's Records • Crystal Smith's 46 points bested Cindy Haugejorde's 44-point effort vs. Luther College on Jan. 12, 1977. In addition, the 46 points is the second-most scored in a single game in Big Ten history. Illinois' Kendra Gantt and Penn State's Kelly Mazzante both netted 49 points. The 46 points are the most ever scored by a Louisiana Tech opponent, besting the previous record of 43 points scored by USC's Cheryl Miller, and was one point from a Thomas Assembly Center record.

Smith's 19 free throws attempted topped the previous school record held by Nadine Domond and Amy Herrig. Domond attempted 16 foul shots vs. UCSB on Nov. 25, 1995, while Herrig attempted 16 free throws vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 19 free throws attempted ranks eighth in Big Ten annals with five others.

Smith's 15 free throws made equaled Amy Herrig's school record of 15 established vs. Nebraska on Dec. 8, 1996. The 15 foul shots made ranks seventh in league history with eight others.

Smith's 14 three-pointers attempted equals the school record previously set by Lindsey Meder twice before. Meder attempted 14 at Colorado on Dec. 2, 2001 and vs. Ohio State on Jan. 3, 2002.

Smith's perfect 9-9 (1.000) shooting performance from the field matched Jamie Cavey's record of 9-9 (1.000) vs. Marquette on March 23, 2003. All of Cavey's field goals were two-point baskets, while four of Smith's five were from behind the arc.

Big Ten Rankings • Iowa ranks first in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.400), second in steals (13.75), scoring offense (82.2), 3-point field goals made (5.5) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.246) and third in blocked shots (5.25), assists (19.5), scoring margin (+16.5), field goal percentage (.500), free throw percentage (.750) and field goal percentage defense (.363).

Senior Crystal Smith ranks first in league scoring (24.0) and second in 3-point field goals made (2.75). Freshman Megan Skouby ranks second in blocked shots (2.25), while sophomore Krista VandeVenter ranks fourth in rebounding (8.3).

Making the List • Iowa has recorded two victories by 40 points or more this season. The Hawkeyes posted a 40-point triumph (82-42) over UW-Milwaukee on Nov. 20. The 40-point win ranks as the 15th-largest margin of victory in school history. Iowa registered a 47-point victory (88-41) over Rider on Nov. 26. The 47-point win ranks as the ninth-largest margin of victory in Iowa history.

Iowa has posted six wins of 40 points or more under Coach Bluder (48 – UT-Pan American, 2001; 47 -- Rider; 45 – Western Illinois, 2000; 43 – Creighton, 2002; 40 – Northwestern, 2001; 40 -- UW-Milwaukee, 2005).

Home Sweet Home • Four of Iowa's next five games will be at Carver-Hawkeye Arena. In fact, the Hawkeyes will not leave the state of Iowa until its conference opener at Indiana on December 29.

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her sixth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 22nd season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 454-203 (.691), including a 98-61 (.616) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to five post-season tournaments (3 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and three upper division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. Last season Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (8) and Emma (5) and one son, David (3).

Freshmen Step Up • Iowa's freshmen class averaged 30.5 ppg, 6.0 apg and 9.0 rpg in its two games at the Odwalla Classic.

High Octane • Iowa, who ranks second in Big Ten scoring offense, has scored 80 points or more in three of its first four games.

Injured Hawkeyes • Two players expected to start this year suffered season-ending ACL injuries over the summer. Point guard Lindsay Richards sustained her third ACL injury in as many years on her right knee in June playing a "pick-up" game in Pinehurst, North Carolina while serving as an intern for the PGA U.S. Open Golf Tournament. Like Richards, small forward Johanna Solverson sustained her ACL injury while playing a "pick-up" game. Solverson suffered the injury while playing a game at a DePaul Sports Camp in July. The Chicago area native has been a camp instructor at the DePaul the last two summers.

Raining Threes • Iowa has made at least one 3-pointer in 214-consecutive contests. It is a streak that has occurred over a span of seven seasons. The last time the Hawkeyes did not make a 3-pointer was against Purdue in the Big Ten Tournament on March 1, 1998.

Day-to-Day • Freshman Lindsey Nyenhuis did not dress for Iowa's first four games due to a foot injury. The native of Grand Rapids, MI, is out indefinitely.

Young Guns • Iowa is tied for 15th in the nation with the most underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes are tied with 16 other schools, including Big Ten schools Northwestern and Illinois, with nine underclassmen on its roster. The Hawkeyes have four freshmen and five sophomores on its roster. Air Force (13) leads the nation, followed by New Orleans (12). Michigan is tied for seventh (10), while Penn State (8) and Wisconsin (8) are tied for 31st.

Vivian Returns To Iowa City • Former Iowa Head Coach C. Vivian Stringer will return to Carver-Hawkeye Arena for the KCRG-TV9 Hawkeye Challenge this weekend. It will mark her first appearance in the arena since coaching her last game on the Hawkeye sidelines in 1995.

Stringer, Iowa's all-time winningest coach (269 wins), coached 12 seasons in Iowa City and guided the Hawkeyes to six Big Ten regular season titles and nine-straight NCAA Tournament appearances. The Hall of Fame coach and the Hawkeyes advanced to three Elite Eight's and ultimately one Final Four in 1993.

Stringer and the Hawkeyes won 46-consecutive home games from 1986-90 and 41-straight Big Ten Conference contests between 1985-90 -- both league records.

Also making their return to Carver-Hawkeye Arena, Dec. 3-4 will be former Hawkeye teammates and all-Americans Michelle Edwards and Jolette Law. Edwards was named the 1988 National Player of the Year and is the only Hawkeye to have her jersey retired (No. 30). Law was a Kodak District all-American in 1990 and then went on to tour four years with the Harlem Globetrotters.

Fresh Faces • Iowa welcomes five talented freshmen to its 2005-06 roster. The Hawkeyes add two guards (Kristi Smith and Lindsey Nyenhuis), two forwards (Wendy Ausdemore and Nicole VanderPol) and one center (Megan Skouby). Smith is a 5-6 point guard, while Nyenhuis is a 5-7 shooting guard. Ausdemore is a 6-2 small forward, while VanderPol is a 6-1 power forward. Skouby is a 6-6 center and is the tallest Iowa women's basketball player in history.

Hawkeye Schedule • Iowa will play one of its most challenging schedules during Bluder's tenure. The Hawkeyes can potentially play 12 teams who played in the postseason last year, including 10 NCAA Tournament teams. Iowa is slated to play NCAA Tournament squads Penn State, Ohio State and Michigan State twice during the regular season, while it will also square off against Minnesota, Purdue, Iowa State, UW-Green Bay, Oklahoma and Louisiana Tech once. Iowa and Rutgers can potentially meet in the second round of the Hawkeye Challenge. The Hawkeyes will also face WNIT opponents Illinois (twice) and Creighton. Iowa will play its 900th game as a varsity sport on Feb. 2, 2006 vs. Purdue in Iowa City.

Iowa Big Ten Schedule • Iowa's Big Ten portion of its schedule includes single games with Penn State, Minnesota, Wisconsin and Purdue, with the Golden Gophers and Boilermakers playing in Iowa City. The Hawkeyes will play Big Ten favorites Michigan State and Ohio State in consecutive games twice this season. Iowa hosts the Spartans on Jan. 9 and the Buckeyes on Jan. 12. The Hawkeyes travel to Columbus on Feb. 12 and East Lansing on Feb. 16.

Home Grown Hawkeyes • Iowa's roster features six players from the state of Iowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Abby Emmert, Ebone Pope, Tiffany Reedy, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). Iowa's 15-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Louisiana (Crystal Smith), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis), Minnesota (Krista VandeVenter) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

Center of Attention • For the fifth time during Coach Bluder's Iowa tenure, the Hawkeyes started the season with a different center. Jamie Cavey started for the Hawkeyes the last two years. She became Iowa's first center to start consecutive seasons since Amy Herring (1997-99). Randi Peterson was Iowa's starter in 2000-01, followed by Beatrice Bullock (2001-02), Tracy Schrupp (2002-03) and Jamie Cavey (2003-05).

Iowa's two centers on its 2005-06 roster are sophomore Stacy Schlapkohl and freshman Megan Skouby.

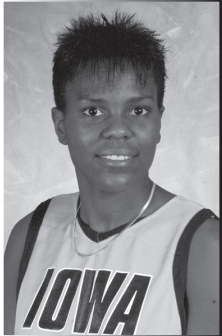

Game 1

Iowa 82, UW-Milwaukee 42

Nov. 20, 2005, Carver-Hawkeye Arena

IOWA CITY - - Iowa won its sixth-straight season opening game under Head Coach Lisa Bluder with an 82-42 rout over UW-Milwaukee in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes took a 15-point advantage into halftime and never looked back. Iowa shot 61.5 percent (16-26) from the field in the second half and 58.5 percent (31-53) for the game. A majority of Iowa's field goal attempts came from close range as the Hawkeyes out-scored the Panthers 42-18 in the paint.

All 12 Hawkeyes that played netted at least two points. Furthermore, 10 Hawkeyes collected at least one assist, while eight Iowa players recorded one steal or more. As a team, Iowa generated 21 assists and 17 steals. Jenee Graham registered a game-high six assists, while UW-Milwaukee accumulated a team total of seven assists.

A trio of Hawkeye post players paced the Hawkeyes in victory. Stacy Schlapkohl, Krista Vandeventer and Megan Skouby each scored 12 points each. The trio combined to shoot 15-23 (.652) from the field and 6-8 (.750) from the foul line.

Iowa finished the game strong, out-scoring UW-Milwaukee 23-6 in the final 12 minutes.

Iowa limited UW-Milwaukee to 15.6 percent (5-32) shooting from the field in the second half and 29.6 percent (16-54) for the game. Traci Edwards led the Panthers, recording a double-double (11 points, 11 rebounds).

With Iowa enjoying a large lead for most of the game, Bluder was able to rotate her entire bench and not allow a single Hawkeye to play more than 21 minutes.

The 40-point triumph is Iowa's largest season opening win since a 43-point victory (83-40) vs. Wyoming on Nov. 25, 1998 in the Hawaii Wahine Classic.

Game 2

Louisiana Tech 95, Iowa 91

Nov. 22, 2005, Thomas Assembly Center

RUSTON, LA - - Louisiana Tech overcame a 19-point second half deficit with seven minutes remaining in regulation to outlast Iowa 95-91 in a double overtime thriller at the Thomas Assembly Center.

The Lady Techsters spoiled Iowa senior Crystal Smith's homecoming, who was raised in nearby Haughton, LA, but not without a huge outing by Smith. Smith poured in a school-record 46 points, which is the most points by a Louisiana Tech opponent and was one point from an arena record. Smith also established a new school record for free throws attempted (19) and equaled the school record for foul shots made (15). She also set a career high with two blocked shots and matched a career best with eight rebounds.

Iowa led 71-52 with 7:18 remaining in regulation, but turnovers and poor free throw shooting enabled the Lady Techsters to sneak back into the game and out-score the Hawkeyes 24-5 the final seven minutes of regulation. Louisiana Tech forced eight Iowa turnovers on its press and converted the eight miscues into 12 points. Additionally, Iowa was only 1-4 from the foul line, including missing two front ends of one-and-ones, in the final five minutes of regulation.

Smith missed a 10-foot jumper that would have given Iowa the win at the end of regulation. Conversely, Louisiana Tech's Eboni Mangum missed a short jumper at the end of the first overtime that would have given the Lady Techsters the victory. Louisiana Tech out-scored the Hawkeyes 8-4 in the sixth period to lift the Lady Techsters to victory.

Senior Tiffany Reedy contributed 10 points and seven rebounds, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer added five points, 11 rebounds, five assists, two blocks and two steals in defeat.

Iowa lost only its third game in its last 21 contests when leading at the half.

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - Oklahoma's Paris twins combined for 44 points and 21 rebounds to propel the 22nd-ranked Sooners to an 85-68 victory over Iowa in the first round of the Odwalla Classic in War Memorial Gym.

Iowa opened the game with an 18-11 advantage, but Oklahoma closed the half on a 32-11 run to take a commanding 43-29 lead into half. Sooner junior Erin Higgins, who was 1-6 from 3-point range in last year's contest against the Hawkeyes in the Bahamas, scored all of her 14 points in the first half on 4-5 shooting from behind the arc.

Courtney Paris posted her third double-double of the season (30 points, 14 rebounds), while her sister Ashley collected 14 points and seven rebounds en route to victory in front of their hometown family and friends.

The Sooners dominated the Hawkeyes in the post, out-scoring Iowa 48-16 in the paint and scoring 27 second chance points for the game.

Senior Crystal Smith paced the Hawkeyes with a team-high 15 points and a game-high five steals. Sophomore Krista Vandeventer tallied seven points and grabbed a team-high 11 rebounds. Freshman Megan Skouby netted all of her 11 points in the second half and also corralled six rebounds in defeat.

Iowa's underclassmen scored 44 of the Hawkeyes' 68 points, including 27 from freshmen.

Iowa converted a season-best 89.5 percent (17-19) from the free throw line. Conversely, the Hawkeyes shot a season-low 38.3 percent (23-60) from the field.

Iowa 88, Rider 41

Nov. 26, 2005, War Memorial Gym

SAN FRANCISCO, CA - The Iowa Hawkeyes led start-to-finish cruising to a lopsided 88-41 triumph over Rider in the consolation game of the Odwalla Classic. The 47-point victory ranks as the ninth-largest in school history.

Leading 35-19 at halftime, the Hawkeyes scored the first 21 points of the second half and out-scored Rider 29-2 in the first 10:30 of the second stanza.

Senior Crystal Smith paced Iowa, scoring a game-high 24 points and collecting five rebounds and four assists. Smith, who was named to the all-tournament team, equaled a school record for field goal percentage in a game, sinking all nine field goal attempts, including all four 3-pointers. She also drained both free throw attempts.

Iowa had five players in double figures for the first time this season. In addition to Smith, freshman Megan Skouby netted 11, while senior Tiffany Reedy, freshman Nicole VanderPol and senior Stacy Schlapkohl all contributed 10 points. The 10 points by VanderPol is a career high. Additionally, senior Morgan Kasperek led all rebounders for the first time in her career with six boards.

The Hawkeyes shot the ball extremely well, converting a season-best 63.2 percent (36-57) from the field and also drained 88.9 percent (8-9) from the charity stripe.

Nine Hawkeyes contributed to Iowa's season-high 30 assists. Sophomore Abby Emmert dished out a career-high seven assists, while sophomore Krista Vandeventer collected five.

Iowa was on fire in the second half, making its first six field goal attempts, including three-straight triples by Smith. The Hawkeyes shot a blistering 68.8 percent (22-32), including 70.0 percent (7-10) from 3-point range, in the second period.

Rider was led by Monica Welborn, who netted 13 points. Iowa's defense limited the Broncs to only 24.5 percent (13-53) from the field for the game.
