Swing the Stick Petty

Luke Pettersen leads the team with an .889 batting average after going 8-9 in the first series. He post-

ed a career best back-to-back four hit games.

Lead the Way

The Gophers return eight seniors this season, five pitchers and three position players. Cody Campbell, Brian Glowicki, Tim Shannon, Toby Anderson and Tyler Hanson all have experience on the bump while Troy Traxler, Matt Stemper, and Jordan Smith have had many at bats for the Maroon and Gold.

Lefties Galore

Minnesota boasts 18 left-handed hitters on its roster this season. This is the second most in Power Five schools only behind Arkansas who has 19. The potential starting lineup could feature eight lefties.

About Iowa

The Hawkeyes are 4-3 this season after losing two games to South Florida then defeating Loras College. Iowa played in the Hoover Classic, splitting two games with Alabama State and winning their last one versus Morehead state. Their game against Cornell College on Tuesday was canceled. Mason McCoy leads the team with a .407 batting average along with one home run, seven RBIs and two stolen bases. Iowa's top starter is Nick Gallagher who 1-0 with a 1.93 ERA and 11 strikeouts in 14.0 innings.

About Hawaii

The Rainbow Warriors come to Minneapolis after posting a 3-4 record to begin the season. Josh Rojas leads the team with a .250 batting average while Brendan Hormung has a 1.20 ERA. Hawaii and Minnesota will play a game on Thursday night before the tournament.

About Oral Roberts

The Golden Eagles are off to a hot start to the season, posting a 7-1 record. They started off with a three-game sweep of Little Rock then fell to Missouri State. Oral Roberts bounced back with a three-game sweep at Alabama then defeated Kansas 12-1 Thursday. Noah Cummings leads the Golden Eagles with a .469 batting average along with four home runs and 13 RBIs. As a team, Oral Roberts has hit nine home runs so far this season. Josh McMinn leads the starters with a 1.50 ERA. He is 1-0 in two starts and has struck out nine batters.

Drafted

Minnesota had four players drafted in the 2016 MLB Draft. Dalton Sawyer was drafted in the ninth round by the Oakland Athletics and posted a 0-3 record with a 3,38 ERA and 26 strikeouts. Matt Fiedler was also taken in the ninth round. He had a .325 AVG with four home runs, 31 RBIs and eight stolen bases for the Johnson City Cardinals, the rookie ball team for the St. Louis Cardinals. The Cardinals ended up winning the Appalachian League championship. Austin Athmann was picked in the 14th round by the Detroit Tigers and was assigned their class A short season team, the Connecticut Tigers. He had a .276 AVG with two home runs, 17 RBIs and 24 runs scored. The final Gopher to be picked was Jordan Jess who was selected in the 31st round by the Pittsburgh Pirates. He posted a 2-2 record out of the bullpen for the Bristol Pirates where he collected seven saves and 27 strikeouts in 24.2 innings pitched.

Back at the Helm

Head coach John Anderson is back for his 35th season as the lead-man for the Minnesota baseball program. Through the three-plus decades of being in charge, Anderson has amassed 1,208 wins - which is the highest win total in Big Ten and

program history. His win total currently sits in the top-30 all-time among collegiate head coaches.

Consistent Staff

Minnesota has one of the longest-tenured staffs in the country as the group has stayed together for 17 seasons. Assistant head coach Rob Fornasiere has been with Anderson for 32 years which is the longest tenured pair of coaches in the nation.

Newe Faces

The coaching staff brought in eight freshman and one transfer this offseason. Eli Wilson, Sam Bridges, Nolan Burchill, Jack Wassel, Brett Schulze, Gabe Knowles, Alex Farley and Drew Hmielewski look to make their impact on the program as freshmen. Jackson Rose comes to Minnesota from Barton Community College in Great Bend, Kan. The junior RHP made 12 appearances and started 11 games then finished with a 4-4 record and recorded 52 strikeouts in 44.1 innings pitched. Rose looks to come out of the bullpen this season for the Gophers.

Minnesota Heavy

The 2017 roster is highlighted by 60 percent of the players from inside the boarders of the state of Minnesota. Twenty-one players feature the highest number, with Wisconsin and Illinois close behind with three and four, respectively.

Another Year at Siebert

Siebert Field, which has been Minnesota baseball's home for the past three seasons after being built in 2013. The Gophers posted a 13-6 home record last season.

Dairy Queen Classic

After a four-year hiatus the Dairy Queen classic returns to Minneapolis as the tournament will take place in U.S. Bank Stadium. The return of the tournament also marks the 12th year that Dairy Queen has been the title sponsor which started in the Hubert H. Humphrey Metrodome. The Dairy Queen Classic has had 145 Major League players participate in the tournament and was one of the first televised regular-season college baseball games on ESPN in 1989.
