Storylines

Up to Bat

Penn State returns to Big Ten baseball play when it travels to Iowa for a three-game series opening Friday with a doubleheader at 3:05 p.m. ET in Duane Banks Field. The original series schedule was altered due to the threat of inclement weather increasing throughout the weekend. The series is then slated to coonclude Saturday at 3:05 p.m. ET. The first and last games will be streamed on BTN Plus.

Biasi Leads Rotation

- RHP Sal Biasi leads the Nittany Lions with a 3.96 ERA and a career-high 69 strikeouts.
- His 69 strikeouts are the most by a Penn State pitcher since Johnny Walter (81) and Joe Kurrasch (78) in 2012.
- Biasi's 69 strikeouts rank third in the Big Ten and 56th in the nation, while his 11.87 strikeouts per nine innings rank second in the league and 26th nationally.
- Biasi is also among the leaders in WHIP (walks & hits per innings pitched), ranking third in the Big Ten at 1.09 (31 hits, 26 walks in 52.1 IP).

Hagenman Striking Out the Opposition

- Saturday starting RHP Justin Hagenman has seen a sophomore surge in strikeouts.
- During his Freshman All-America campaign last season, Hagenman struck out 39 in 82 innings, but this season he has struck out 57 in 59 1/3 innings so far.

Freshman Playing B1G, Especially on Sunday

- Rookie outfielder Braxton Giavedoni has adapted well to Big Ten play so far, ranking second on the team with a .302 average through the first 12 conference games.
- He has seen success in his last two Sunday Big Ten tilts, most recently hitting a walk-off base hit in the bottom of the ninth inning against Northwestern (4/23).
- He homered twice in the Sunday finale at Maryland (4/16).
- Giavedoni's .273 season batting average, .345 on-base percentage and .438 slugging percentage lead all healthy Nittany Lions.
- His 13 extra base hits on the year lead the team.

Midweek Break Upcoming

- Penn State will play six-straight Big Ten games, as there is no non-conference midweek game scheduled for next week due to exams.
- Penn State will return to midweek action May 9 & 10, playing at West Virginia on Tuesday and then against West Virginia again Wednesday in PNC Park.

First Varsity Sport

Baseball was Penn State's first varsity sport, playing its first games in 1875.

Five College World Series Appearances

Penn State has made five trips to the College World Series, placing as high as second in 1957. The Nittany Lions reached the CWS in 1952, 1957, 1959, 1963 and 1973. Penn State has reached the NCAA Tournament 19 times.

1996 Big Ten Champions

The 2016 season marked the 20th anniversary of Penn State's first Big Ten Championship.

Nittany Lions in Cuba

Penn State participated in a weeklong, fourgame tour of Cuba, Nov. 21-28, 2015. The Nittany Lions went 1-3 in the "Cuba Baseball Friendship Tournament." The Lions played against teams from Cuba's top "professional" league, the National Series, becoming the first United States team to play multiple teams from the league and the first to earn a victory.

The team also participated in lectures about Cuban baseball, Jose Marti and the history of Cuban sports and U.S. relations.

Penn State first played Industriales in Havana's Estadio Latinamericano, falling 2-1. With the game, Penn State became the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division I baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba.

Penn State next played Ciego de Avila, the league's defending champion. Starting pitcher Victor Garcia had pitched for Cuba in the 2009 World Baseball Classic, and the Lions were defeated, 2-0.

Penn State earned the first victory for a United States team at any level over a Cuban National Series team in game three, defeating Mayabeque, 9-3.

Nittany Lions in the Pros

According to Baseball-Almanac.com, 27 Nittany Lions have gone on to play Major League Baseball. A total of 74 have been drafted. Most recently, junior third baseman Jim Haley and senior closer Jack Anderson became the first baseball student-athletes drafted out of Penn State since 2012. The Tampa Bay Rays selected Haley in the 19th round with the 570th overall pick, while Anderson was tabbed by the Seattle Mariners in the 23rd round with the 687th pick.

Program Notes Did vou know?

O.J. McDuffie is mostly known for his stellar career on the gridiron for Penn State and in the NFL, but he also played baseball in 1990. He stole 20 bases (t-3rd, single season-school history) on 21 attempts (96 percent clip), hit .336 and had a .969 fielding percentage. He was drafted by the California Angels in the 41st round of the 1991 MLB June Amateur Draft.

Medlar Field at Lubrano Park

Situated in the shadow of Beaver Stadium, the facility -- completed in June of 2006 -- is arguably one of the premier collegiate stadiums in the country.

The ballpark's signature is the breathtaking view of legendary Mt. Nittany, a local landmark that is near and dear to the heart of every Penn Stater. With the stadium opening to the east, spectators can peer unencumbered down the Nittany Valley for miles and on a clear day Tussey Mountain Ski Resort can be seen from 10 miles away.

Seating capacity for Medlar Field is 5,406 and 20 luxury suites allow area companies to treat clients and friends to an unmatched baseball experience. A party deck along the right field line provides a good place for friends to gather and the picnic pavilion beyond the left field fence is perfect for birthday parties and group outings.

Much like the rest of the park, the dimensions of the playing field are unique as well. A relatively short 325 feet to the left field pole stretches out to the deepest part of the park, the 410 foot nook in left center field. Straightaway center is 399 feet and the 320 foot right field fence is made more daunting with an 18.55 feet high wall, which commemorates the year Penn State was founded.

A 2,500 square foot press box can accommodate traveling and local media and has private broadcast booths for up to three radio teams. A large video scoreboard towers above the left field wall capable of providing up to the minute stats and video replays.

The stadium is named for 1982 Penn State graduate Anthony Lubrano and former Nittany Lion Head Coach Charles "Chuck" Medlar. Lubrano chose to honor Coach Medlar with a generous financial gift toward the realization of the long-discussed project. Coach Medlar served at the helm of the Penn State program for 19 years and guided the Lions to two College World Series appearances.

Team No. 129

Penn State is playing its 129th baseball season in program history, but will honor its previous 128 teams this season, mounting a No. 128 jersey in the dugout each game.

Series Notes

All-Time vs. Iowa

Penn State is 39-30 all time against Iowa. The Nittany Lions will play at Iowa for the first time since 2012, where they hold a 17-14 record and won two of three the last time they visited. The Nittany Lions concluded the 2016 season by hosting Iowa. The Hawkeyes claimed the first two games to bounce Penn State from contention for the final berth in the Big Ten Tournament.

Head Coach Rick Heller

Rick Heller was named the Hawkeye head coach before the 2014 season. In 2015, he led the Hawkeyes to an at-large bid in the NCAA Regional field and guided lowa to its first tournament game win since 1972. Heller previously led Indiana State and Northern lowa to the NCAA Regional and is one of five active coaches to lead three different Division I teams to regional play.

Scouting Iowa

The Hawkeyes are 24-15 this season with a 6-6 mark in the Big Ten, owning 2-1 series wins over Purdue and Nebraska and 1-2 series losses to Northwestern and Rutgers. A strong defensive team with a .977 fielding percentage, lowa is one of the most proficient teams in the NCAA in turning double plays, averaging 1.15 per game to rank third and lead the Big Ten. Offensively, lowa brings power with a .432 slugging percentage that ranks second in the Big Ten. Jake Adams leads the Big Ten with 15 home runs, while Robert Neustrom and Mason McCoy are tied for the Big Ten lead in doubles with 13 each. Neustrom and Adams also both rank in the conference top-10 in batting with averages of .358 (3rd) and .344 (7th), respectively, and they sit two-three in RBIs as Adams has 48 and Neustrom has 40. RHP Nick Gallager leads the Hawkeyes on the mound with a 2.60 ERA.

Last Series

May 19, 2016

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. – Three unearned runs in the second proved to be enough for Iowa, as the Hawkeyes held on to defeat Penn State, 3-2, at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park.

LHP Nick Hedge threw 6 2/3 innings for the Nittany Lions, allowing the three unearned runs on six hits and two walks with five strikeouts to match his season-high. Aside from the second inning he was largely dominant, and RHP Jack Anderson was perfect in relief over the final 2 1/3.

lowa scored the runs in the second after a one-out error. Hedge surrendered a single and then back-to-back walks to bring in the first run. A fielder's choice hit into by second baseman Zach Daniels and an RBI-single by first baseman Tyler Peyton plated the next two runs, respectively.

The Nittany Lions got on the scoreboard in the fourth on a groundout by centerfielder James Coates. Left fielder Greg Guers and designated hitter Tyler Kendall both singled to lead-off the inning and were sacrificed into scoring position by first baseman Willie Burger.

The senior tandem of Guers and Kendall accounted for five of Penn State's eight hits. Guers singled in his first two at-bats for a six at-bat hit streak after going 4-for-4 at Nebraska Sunday. Kendall went 3-for-4 with an RBI for his fourth multi-hit game in his last five games.

Kendall drove in a run in the eighth inning with a single to center after an error allowed a runner in scoring position. However, Daniels took the mound for the final 1 1/3 innings and was perfect to earn the save.

The Hawkeyes were also stellar defensively in the outfield. Robert Neustrom made a diving catch in right field on a well-hit ball by Kendall to prevent a first inning run, and Joel Booker tracked down a deep fly to the left gap to prevent another run from scoring in the fourth.

May 20, 2016

UNIVERSITY PARK, Pa. - On Penn State's Senior Day it was a freshman that ended up being the hero, as **Connor Klemann** clinched a winning season with a walk-off, RBI-single in the bottom of the 12th inning to defeat Iowa, 5-4 in Big Ten baseball action Friday at Medlar Field at Lubrano Park.

The 4 hour, 27 minute game, Penn State's longest of the season, capped a doubleheader. Iowa won the day's first game though, 8-0, to clinch the series and a crucial head-to-head tiebreaker over Penn

State, which also finished 12-12 in Big Ten play. Accordingly, Penn State did not qualify for the Big Ten tournament.

In game one, Iowa RHP Tyler Peyton limited Penn State to just three hits, throwing a complete game shutout. Catcher Daniel Aaron Moriel led five Hawkeyes with two-hit games, as he also drove in three runs.

lowa got on the board with an unearned run in the fourth inning on a sacrifice fly by Moriel with the bases loaded. The Hawkeyes then added two more runs in the sixth inning, as Moriel drove in one from third on a ground out and then another run came across on an error on the next play.

Shortstop Nick Roscetti, who also went 2-for-5, drove in a run in the seventh. The Hawkeyes then added four runs in the ninth.

Game two did not appear to be going in Penn State's favor, as the Hawkeyes tallied four runs in the first three innings. The Lions answered in the bottom of the third though, as senior Greg Guers roped an RBI-single to left field. Guers went a team-best 3-for-6 in his final game,

The score would remain the same until the seventh when freshman right fielder **Jordan Bowersox** delivered with a single to left with runners on second and third and two outs to make it a 4-3 game.

Senior James Coates drew a lead-off walk in the eighth, was sacrificed to second and scored the tying on a single up the middle by shortstop **Conlin Hughes**.

lowa loaded the bases with one out in the top of the 12th inning, but Penn State worked out of the jam as LHP **Taylor Lehman** earned a strikeout and a groundout. Lehman pitched the final five innings, striking out four and allowing three hits and three walks. RHP **Nick Distasio** had pitched the previous 4 2/3, striking out four and allowing just two hits after entering in the third inning, giving Penn State a total of 9 2/3 innings of scoreless relief.

Bowersox led the bottom half off with a single just off the third baseman's glove. A sacrifice bunt moved him to second and a wild pitch moved him to third. Iowa brought in a fifth infielder, but Klemann found a hole anyways, roping a single between the third baseman and shortstop.

Injury Bug Bites Offense

- Five of Penn State's nine Opening Day starting position players have missed multiple games due to injury. The quintet has missed a combined 74 man-games.
- Leading hitter and outfielder Jordan Bowersox has been out of the lineup since Apr. 15. Bowersox leads the team with a .333 batting average, .418 on-base percentage, .480 slugging percentage and nine stolen bases, and is tied for second on the team with three home runs and seven doubles, and is also second with 18 RBIs.
- Freshman centerfielder Mason Nadeau was mostly out of action for over a month, but has been a big part of Penn State's offense since his return off the bench against Pitt (4/18). Nadeau has been the team's best hitter and best at getting on-base over the last five games, going 7-for-17 (.412) with a .545 onbase percentage. He also has his first career home run, three RBIs, four walks and a stolen base. For the year, Nadeau is batting .365 with 10 RBIs in 19 starts and 20 games.
- Freshman shortstop Joe Weisenseel missed the Michigan series and has not played since the opening game of the Ohio State series (4/8). Weisenseel managed just four hits in his first 17 games, but was just starting to heat up with eight hits in his last six games, batting .500 (8-for-16).
- Senior outfielder Nick Riotto played in just two games in the opening month of the season after running full speed into a wall in the season opener at TCU. He led Penn State with a .405 on base percentage in 2016 and batted .307.
- Sophomore infielder Connor Klemann has been out since the end of February and will miss the remainder of the season. He batted .260 in 28 games in a freshman season that was also limited by injury.
- Additionally, senior catcher Alex Malinsky missed the first month of the season recovering from an injury suffered in preseason training.

Power Bump

- · Penn State has already surpassed its 2016 season total for home runs with 21 for its most since the 2012 team hit 38.
- 18 of the 21 home runs hit this season have come on the road.
- Its 10 home runs in the first 14 games of the season were its most since at least 2002.

New Power Sources

- Nine different Nittany Lions, one more than last year, have combined for 20 home runs, already surpassing last season's total.
- Five hit their first career home runs, including three sophomores - Conlin Hughes, Jordan Bowersox and Keith Leavitt - and two freshmen - Braxton Giavedoni and Mason Nadeau.
- Christian Helsel hit a grand slam against Pacific (3/5) after going homer-less in 2016. He hit one home run in 2015 but has three this season.
- Willie Burger hit just one home run as a freshman, but hit two in the third game of the season at No. 1 TCU (2/19) and has added two since.
- · Nick Riotto has one home run after hitting two last season. He is the only Nittany Lion returning with multiple home runs hit the season prior.
- Burger is the team power leader with a career-high four home runs and 22 RBIs.

Youth Movement

- The average Nittany Lion starter this season is a sophomore, as the average class year (Freshman = 1 ... Senior = 4) across all 10 positions through 40 games is 2.12. On the mound the Lions are averaging 2.18 years of experience as compared to 2.13 at the plate.
- For the 2016 season, the Lions averaged 2.25 years in the starting lineup with a youthful 1.96 on the mound and a deceptive 2.49 at the dish as the Lions started two to five freshmen per game.
- Penn State only has three upperclassman position players on the roster.
- A total of 11 Nittany Lions have made their debuts this season.

Walk-Off X2

- After earning a 2-1 win in the bottom of the ninth against Northwestern (4/23), Penn State now has two walk-off wins on the season.
- Freshman right fielder Braxton Giavedoni drove in the winning run over Northwestern with a base-hit to left field with the bases loaded.
- The Nittany Lions previously walked-off Bucknell on Mar. 21, as an error allowed the winning run to score in the bottom of the 10th inning.

Malinsky Leads Diamond Lions at Nittanys

- Senior catcher Alex Malinsky collected multiple honors at "The Nittanys."
- · Malinsky was a recipient of the "True Grit" award for bouncing back after suffering a serious injury during this past winter's training season.
- · He was also recognized for his academic achievement of owning the team's highest GPA.

Cat Fight

- The Nittany Lions hosted the Panthers (Pitt), Wildcats (Northwestern) and the Leopards (Lafayette) during their last homestand.
- Penn State is 6-7 so far this season against its fellow big cat schools. The Nittany Lions have played the Pacific Tigers (2-1), Columbia Lions (2-2), Pitt Panthers (0-2), Northwestern Wildcats (1-2) and Lafayette Leopards (1-0).
- Penn State also has a home game against the Villanova Wildcats upcoming (May 16).

All-Around the Infield

- Christian Helsel has drawn starts at three infield positions this season.
- He has started the last 10 games at second base after starting 31 at third base and eight at first base.
- Helsel currently owns a career-best .965 fielding percentage.

Helsel Heats Up

- Senior infielder Christian Helsel has five multi-hit games in the past month, including three three-hit games with the most recent coming against Northwestern (4/23).
- His three home runs and 17 RBIs on the year are both career highs.

Penn State to Play at PNC Park

- · Penn State has rescheduled its previously postponed contest against West Virginia with a twist, as the game will now be played at PNC Park on Wednesday, May 10 at 7 p.m., the Pittsburgh Pirates announced.
- The Pirates are hosting a make-up of the contest originally scheduled for Wednesday, March 22 that was to be played at Penn

State's Medlar Field at Lubrano Park, but was postponed due to weather. However, the Nittany Lions will be yielding little in the way of home field advantage, as Medlar Field shares the same field dimensions as PNC Park.

- It will be Penn State's first time playing at PNC Park and its first game in a Major League ballpark since May 5, 2012 when it played Minnesota at Target Field, home of the Minnesota Twins. The three-game series also included two games in the Twins' former home, the Metrodome.
- The May 10 matchup at PNC Park will complete the two-game series between the Mountaineers and Nittany Lions. Game one is scheduled for a 6:30 p.m. first pitch on Tuesday, May 9 at Monongalia County Ballpark in Morgantown, W.Va.

Home Sweet Home

- The Nittany Lions are in their 11th season in Medlar Field at Lubrano Park, where they hold a 140-93 all-time record and are off to a 8-8 start this season.
- In 2016, Penn State won a facility record 10 consecutive games en route to totaling 15 wins, its most since 2008.
- The Lions enjoyed their seventh winning mark in the park and hosted two of the 11 largest crowds in program history.

<u>At Maryland (4/14-16)</u> Going the Distance

- RHP Sal Biasi carried a one-hitter into the ninth against Maryland, but home runs on back-to-back pitches with one out gave Maryland a 2-1 victory over the Nittany Lions.
- Biasi finished with the first complete game for Penn State since 2014, going a careerhigh 8 1/3 innings and yielding the two runs on three hits and a walk with six strikeouts.

Bucknell (4/11)

Beginners' Luck

- Five of Penn State's wins have come with first-time starting pitchers.
- Most recently, junior RHP Jake Pilewicz made his first career start against Bucknell (4/11) and went five innings, only surrenduring two runs on seven hits and three walks.
- Junior RHP **Schuyler Bates** earned his first career win in his first start against Cornell (3/29). Bates put together a five-inning, three-strikeout effort, allowing just two hits and two walks and retiring the sides in the third, fourth and fifth innings.
- Penn State also prevailed in the starting debuts of RHP Myles Gayman, RHP Cole Bartels and RHP Eric Mock.

At Pitt (4/4)

Back-to-Back Again

- Penn State slugged back-to-back home runs twice in a span of three games.
- Christian Helsel and Willie Burger went deep consecutively at No. 22 Michigan (4/1) in the fourth inning, and then Helsel followed a Jordan Bowersox homer with one of his own at Pitt (4/4) in the fifth inning.

In-State Opponent Winning Streak Ends

- Penn State saw its winning streak against Pennsylvania schools end at 13 with a 3-2 loss at Pitt (4/4).
- It was the first loss in the last five meetings with Pitt and the first loss to a Pennsylvania school since dropping one of four at Bucknell in 2014.

<u>At Michigan (3/31-4/2)</u> Scholly Takes the Mound

- Penn State senior **Tim Scholly** has already pitched more this season than he had in his previous three years combined (counting the 2015 season he missed due to injury).
- Scholly has four appearances this season and worked three scoreless innings in games at UC Davis (3/8), at Sacramento State (3/10) and at Delaware (3/18).

- Penn State's first foray into extra innings in 2017 was a successful one, as the Nittany Lions defeated Bucknell (3/21) in the bottom of the 10th.
- It has won its last three extra inning games.

<u>At Sacramento State (3/9-11)</u> Lions Find Ways to Score Against Tough Pitching, Get Tough Pitching

- Sacramento State RHP Justin Dillon had thrown a no-hitter and limited No. 11 Washington to a hit and walk in his previous two outings before facing the Nittany Lions (3/9), and he ranked second in the nation with a 0.18 WHIP entering the game with just two hits, two walks and a run allowed in 22.0 innings to go along with 25 strikeouts. However, Nick Riotto and Jordan Bowersox both managed home runs as Dillon surrendered three hits – all for extra bases – a walk and three runs to the Nittany Lions over seven innings.
- RHP **Sal Biasi** and RHP **Nick Distasio** combined to hold Sacramento State to four hits, as Penn State earned a 4-2 victory in the series opener.
- In a season-high 5 2/3 innings pitched, Biasi struck out a career-high nine, surrendering two runs on three hits and three walks

Decisions for Distasio

- RHP **Nick Distasio** earned decisions in four straight appearances, totaling three saves and a win.
- Distasio earned the final two outs vs. Xavier (2/24) for his first career save and then pitched 3 1/3 innings in the series finale (2/26) to earn the win.
- Including the Xavier win, he had three appearances for 3 1/3 innings. He earned 3 1/3 inning saves at Pacific (3/4) in an 11-4 victory and at Sacramento State (3/9) in a 4-2 victory.

Burger Factors in on Five Runs

- Willie Burger factored in on five of the six runs scored by Penn State in the series finale victory over Sacramento State (3/11).
- Burger went 3-for-5, a triple shy of the cycle, with a three-run home run helping him total four RBIs and two runs on the day.
- Burger drove in the first run in the top of the first inning, hit a three-run home run in the third, and doubled and scored in the ninth.

Two Two-Hitters

- Penn State pitching has combined to earn two, two-hit or less games in the same season for the first time since 2007.
- In 2007, the Lions limited Central Connecticut State to two hits on Mar. 23 and

Northwestern to one hit on Apr. 21.

- This season, the Lions have held No. 1 TCU (2/17) and Sacramento State (3/11) to two hits each.
- Most recently, RHP **Cole Bartels** surrendered two hits in the first 3 2/3 innings against Sac State, but the bullpen held the Hornets hitless over the final 5 1/3 innings.
- RHP Dakota Forsyth was able to induce a pop-up to get out of the fourth, and then he pitched the next two innings. RHP Eric Mock allowed just a walk over 1 2/3 innings and LHP Taylor Lehman was perfect in getting the final four outs.
- The two hits allowed at TCU were the fewest allowed by the Lions since Mar. 29, 2015 against Central Connecticut State (two hits), and the fewest allowed on the road since Apr. 5, 2014 at Purdue (one hit).

Homecoming for Coach

- Penn State head coach Rob Cooper returned to his native Sacramento due to Penn State's week-long spring break trip in California.
- He graduated from El Camino High School and also played at Sacramento City College in the early 1990's and was an assistant coach their from 1999-2003.
- Many friends and family members supported the team throughout the week. They were dubbed "Cooper's Town West."

At Pacific (3/4-6)

- Grand Slam
 Senior Christian Helsel hit Penn State's first grand slam since Louie Picconi hit one on April 24, 2010 at Ohio State.
 - Helsel's slam came with two outs in the ninth.

Double-Digit Runs

- Penn State won the first two games against Pacific scoring 11 runs in each.
- It marked the first time since 2014 that Penn State scored double-digit runs in back-toback games. The Lions scored 10 in a win over Northwestern (3/29) and 15 in a win over Youngstown State (4/1) in 2014.
- Penn State last completed the feat against the same team in 2010 against Michigan State scoring 18 and 22 runs in back-toback games.
- Penn State last completed the feat on the road also in 2010, scoring 18 and 14 runs at Ohio State.

Season Notes Johnny Bench Award Watch List

- Sophomore catcher **Ryan Sloniger** was named to the 2017 Johnny Bench Award Watch List presented by BaseballSavings. com, the Greater Wichita Area Sports Commission announced.
- The award is given annually to the top catcher in NCAA Division I baseball. Sloniger is one of eighty-five catchers who was nominated for the award by their coach.
- The list will be updated to include other candidates until May 1, 2017. The watch list will then be narrowed down to the semifinalists, whom will be announced May 17, 2017.

Big Ten Players to Watch

- Junior RHP Sal Biasi, OF Nick Riotto and IF/C Willie Burger were tabbed as Big Ten Players to Watch.
- In his first season as a starter last season, Biasi led the team in strikeouts with 66 and

posted a 5-6 record over 13 starts and 14 appearances, totaling 67 1/3 innings. His 3.74 ERA ranked second among Penn State starters.

- Riotto enjoyed a breakout season in 2016 and led the team with a .405 on-base percentage and ranked second with 24 walks. He struck out just 14 times in 197 at-bats and batted .307 to rank fourth on the team.
- Burger was a unanimous pick to the Big Ten All-Freshman Team, was a Big Ten Player of the Week and a two-time Big Ten Freshman of the Week. He finished second on the team with 34 RBIs despite not appearing in 19 games.

Challenging Slate

- Penn State is competing against six teams coming off NCAA Tournament appearances in 2016, opening the season at TCU (Feb. 17-19) coming off its third-straight College World Series appearance and its fourth in the last six years. The Horned Frogs traveled from Fort Worth, Texas to Penn State for a three-game series last May.
- The Nittany Lions faced another NCAA tourney team the next weekend, hosting defending Big East Champion Xavier for a three-game series Feb. 24-26 at the USA Baseball National Training Center.
- Penn State is hosting a total of four reigning tournament teams, including defending America East Champion Binghamton (Mar. 28). The other three comprise three of Penn State's four home Big Ten series: conference champion Ohio State (Apr. 7-9), Minnesota (May 5-7) and Nebraska (May 18-20).

Helsel Wins "We Are" Award

- The first recipient of Penn State baseball's inaugural "We Are" Award was senior Christian Helsel. The award is given in recognition for best exemplifying what it means to be a Penn Stater with involvement in the community.
- It was presented at Penn State's fifth annual First Pitch Dinner, Jan. 20.
- Wyatt Shaffer, the youngest member of Penn State's team at just 13 years old, presented Helsel with the award. Wyatt joined the Nittany Lions in 2015 through Team IMPACT, an organization that helps children facing life threatening and chronic illnesses get drafted by local college teams.
- Writer and U.S. Marine Ryan Spaeder (@ theaceofspaeder), ESPN college baseball analyst Mike Rooney and head coach **Rob Cooper** all spoke at the dinner.

Top 50 Class Inked

- Penn State baseball received National Letters of Intent from seven signees on National Signing Day.
- The class, which will begin participation in the 2017-18 academic year, ranks 50th in the nation and fourth in the Big Ten according to leading baseball scouting service Perfect Game.
- The class includes four pitchers, one twoway player and two position players. Three
 Conor Larkin (Royersford, Pa.), Jeff Taylor (Pequea, Pa.) and Kyle Virbitsky (Media, Pa.) -- hail from Pennsylvania, while another three --Tyler Dearden (Lumberton, N.J), Ralph Gambino (Freehold, N.J.) and Tommy Gibson (Williamstown, N.J.) -- hail from New Jersey. Bailey Dees (Charlotte, N.C.) hails from North Carolina.
- The Nittany Lions will announce additional

members of the Class of 2021 later in the academic year.

Summer Success

- Connor Klemann was named to the Cal Ripken League All-Star team. He finished the year batting .275 with four home runs and tied for the team high of 24 RBIs. He helped the Baltimore Redbirds reach the league championship final.
- Willie Burger hit four home runs in 33 games to tie for eighth in the Cape Cod League, as his Falmouth Commodores posted the best regular season record before coming up short in the championship series.
- **Taylor Lehman** pitched 31 innings over 10 appearances for the Cotuit Kettleers in the Cape League, including two starts. He struck out 17 and posted a 3.19 ERA and 3-1 record.
- Christian Helsel played in a team-high 69 games for the Battle Creek Bombers in the Northwoods League. He batted .247 for the season with five home runs, 36 RBIs and 12 stolen bases.
- Nick Riotto batted .274 over 42 games with the North Adams SteepleCats in the New England League, and also drove in 13 runs and stole 13 bases.

- Penn State drew its eighth-largest crowd alltime at Medlar this season with 2,074 Apr. 22 against Northwestern.
- The Lions drew their largest crowd since 2010 to its doubleheader against No. 10 TCU, with a season-high 2,185 fans.
- Penn State drew 1,949 fans to its doubleheader against Maryland.
- Led by the relaunch of the student group "Cooper's Town," student season ticket sales soared 54% prior to the season.



The 2017 baseball season will be Rob Cooper's fourth as head coach of the Nittany Lion baseball program. Not shy about stating his ultimate goal of returning Penn State to Omaha in June, the Lions have made significant strides under his leadership.

Penn State is not only coming off its best season with Cooper at the helm, but perhaps its most unique in program history, as Cooper, no stranger to international baseball, led the Nittany Lions on a historic trip to Cuba in November 2015.

The rare, once-in-a-lifetime experience helped bring a young Penn State team together, and the Lions went on to earn their first winning record since 2012. The starting lineup included at least three freshmen in all but six games and five to six freshmen in 19 games, and took on nine eventual NCAA Tournament teams, including a three-game series at home against College World Series participant TCU. The Lions' 28 wins were a 10-win improvement over the previous season, and its 12 Big Ten wins doubled the 2015 total and was one more than the previous two seasons combined.

The season ended with a 12-inning, walk-off victory, giving Cooper 350 wins for his head coaching career.

Returning players continued to improve under Cooper's guidance to lead the youthful squad, and junior third baseman Jim Haley and senior closer Jack Anderson earned the ultimate honor of being drafted by Major League teams. Haley played all three seasons at Penn State under Cooper, while Anderson dramatically improved over his final three seasons to become Penn State's all-time leader in appearances and saves. Haley and Anderson became the eighth and ninth players, respectively, of Cooper's 12-year head coaching career to be drafted by Major League teams. During a successful nine-year stint as the head coach at Wright State, seven of the players he coached were drafted, including eventual Major Leaguer Joe Smith, and 12 more signed professional free agent contracts.

Haley and Anderson were the first drafted out of Penn State since 2012, and Anderson and senior outfielder Greg Guers became the program's first All-Big Ten picks also since 2012. Infielder Willie Burger and pitcher Justin Hagenman drew All-Big Ten Freshman recognition, while Hagenman also became Penn State's first Louisville Slugger All-American since 1997.

Although Cooper has proven himself to be a great head coach on the field, his strong belief in the first part of the term "student-athlete" is perhaps the top reason he has proven to be an excellent fit at Penn State. Even with state-of-the-art facilities, the chance to take on elite competition and a program history that includes five trips to the College World Series, Cooper cites the value of a Penn State degree as one of the top reasons to join his program. The last message to the team before departing the bus upon return from a road trip - no matter the hour - is often a stern reminder to be in class on time and take care of school work.

The trip to Cuba prior to the 2016 season is perhaps the best example of his commitment to developing truly educated men. The extensive planning for the trip began well before U.S. policy regarding travel to Cuba loosened, and playing baseball was a secondary aspect. Nonetheless, Penn State became the first NCAA Division I team to compete against a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. team at any level to defeat a Cuban National Series team, the first U.S. baseball team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties with Cuba, the second NCAA team to play in Cuba since restoration of diplomatic ties (Coastal Carolina men's basketball, August 2015) and the fifth NCAA Division L baseball team to compete in post-revolutionary Cuba. The harmony between academics and athletics was on full display, as multiple professors and a group of journalism students also joined the travel party.

In three years at Penn State, 30 of Cooper's student-athletes have earned Academic All-Big Ten honors, including Jack Anderson, who this past season became the first Nittany Lion in six years to be named to the CoSIDA Academic All-District team. As a military history buff, Cooper's speeches to the team often include historical references. He even arranged to have the team visit the headquarters of the Navy SEAL Team VI headquarters and speak with a pair of Navy SEALs - one a Penn State alum -

during a travel day on the team's 2015 spring break trip.

Cooper was selected as the 14th head baseball coach in Penn State history on August 9, 2013. He brought an accomplished resume that included three NCAA

tournament appearances as a head coach at Wright State and five more at various stops as an assistant coach, including two trips to the College World Series with Miami (Florida). Cooper was twice named the Horizon League Coach of the Year and guided Wright State to three league tournament championships and two regular season championships after the team suffered six losing seasons in the seven years before his arrival.

With Cooper seeking to complete yet another program turnaround, the Lions started making gains during his second season in Happy Valley in 2015. Penn State totaled 18 wins against a schedule ranking in the bottom third nationally during his inaugural campaign in 2014, but rose to the challenge the following season, matching the previous season's 18 wins despite playing a schedule that ranked in the upper third in difficulty and involved 10 games against top-25 opponents. The Nittany Lions rallied from a 7-0 deficit against No. 21 Indiana for their first win over a ranked opponent in three seasons and gave eighth-ranked Illinois its biggest scare during its record winning streak, battling for 15 innings. Penn State ultimately won one more conference game than the year before, despite the Big Ten enjoying arguably its most competitive season to date with a league-record five teams earning NCAA Tournament bids.

A major part of Cooper's scheduling philosophy involves getting the Lions in "NCAA Regional environments" to prepare them for success beyond Memorial Day. The Lion's have certainly done that the past two seasons, travelling to traditional powers Texas A&M and South Carolina (twice), while hosting TCU. ACC and Big 12 schools have also dotted the Lions' slate, as the Big Ten as a whole has staked its ground as one of the premier baseball conferences in the country despite notions that Northern schools cannot be successful.

Shortly after Cooper accepted the Penn State head coaching position in 2014, the California native traveled to Taichung, Taiwan to serve as the head coach of USA Baseball's U18 National Team at the IBAF U18 World Cup. Cooper steered Team USA to an 8-1 record in World Cup play, including seven consecutive victories to win the gold medal.

Not long after the triumph in Taiwan, Cooper received one of the highest honors bestowed in the profession, as he was announced as the Rod Dedeaux USA Baseball Coach of the Year. With the honor, Cooper became just the 16th individual in the award's history to receive the accolade, joining the likes of Scott Brosius, Davey Johnson and Tommy Lasorda

Cooper was also a member of the coaching staff for the 2007 and 2009 USA College National teams. The 2007 team earned a silver medal at the Pan Am Games in Rio de Janeiro. Brazil. Fourteen of the 20 players on the 2007 team reached the Major Leagues, including 2013 All-Star Pedro Alvarez. Fourteen of the 22 members of the 2009 team have also reached the Major Leagues, including 2015 All-Stars Gerrit Cole and Yasmani Grandall

Cooper methodically built Wright State into a perennial contender in the Horizon League with seven 30-win seasons, two Horizon League regular-season titles, three Horizon League Tournament crowns and six Horizon League Championship game appearances. In nine seasons starting in 2005, Cooper accumulated a 286-230 record, including a pair of wins over No. 1-ranked opponents Virginia (3/5/10) and Georgia (3/24/09). He was named the Horizon League Coach of the Year in 2010 and 2011

Cooper saw 47 players earn all-conference accolades and 18 garner all-newcomer honors. He also produced five Horizon League Players of the Year, one Pitcher of the Year, three Relief Pitchers of the Year and two Newcomers of the Year

The 2011 season saw Cooper record his 200th coaching victory and earn the Horizon League Coach of the Year award for the second consecutive year. The Raiders won their secondstraight Horizon League regular season title with a 16-7 record, claimed the league tournament crown by winning three-straight games and advanced to the NCAA Regionals in College Station, Texas. In 2010, the Raiders won the Horizon League regular-season title with a mark of 17-6, the first regular-season conference crown for the program since the 1997 squad won the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. The 2009 Wright State Raiders compiled a 33-30 overall record and returned to the NCAA Tournament following a Horizon League Tournament championship.

At season's end in 2008, Cooper watched as a school and Horizon League-record three players were drafted during the 2008 Major League Baseball First Year Player Draft. In 2007, Wright State enjoyed one of the most prolific offensive seasons in school history as it broke three career records and 11 singleseason school records. Ross Oeder, now a Penn State assistant coach on Cooper's staff, was named the Horizon League Plaver of the Year and garnered second-team All-America Honors. The 2006 edition of the Raiders set six school records and posted the most season wins in five years. Cooper's squad defeated nationally-ranked TCU on the road, topped nationalpowerhouse Notre Dame in South Bend and was on the brink of an upset against eventual National Champion Oregon State in the NCAA Corvallis Regional.

Before arriving at Wright State, Cooper served as the hitting coach, recruiting coordinator and bench coach at Oral Roberts University. A perennial power of the Mid-Continent Conference (now Summit League), ORU advanced to the finals of the NCAA Austin Regional in 2004, beating TCU twice before falling to Texas, 7-3 and 7-5. The Golden Eagles finished with an overall mark of 50-11 in 2004 and had five players selected in the Major League Baseball draft, two honored as All-Americans by the ABCA and three named All-Americans by the College Baseball Insiders website.

Cooper began his coaching career at national power Miami, spending two seasons (1994-95) as a student/graduate assistant on the Hurricanes' staff. While at Miami, Cooper helped the Hurricanes to College World Series berths in 1994 and 1995. Cooper spent the 1996 season as an assistant and team academic coordinator at Wake Forest, then moved on to Tulane for the next two seasons, serving as the Green Wave's hitting coach. In 1997, the Green Wave won the Conference USA regular-season crown, and in 1998, they advanced to the NCAA Tournament. Cooper left Tulane following the 1998 season and returned to Sacramento City College, where he starred in the early 1990s before lettering at Miami in 1993.

Along with his college coaching experience, Cooper also was an associate scout for the Los Angeles Dodgers from 1990-92 and has been selected to four coaching stints with USA Baseball in 2000, 2007, 2009 and 2013.

Cooper earned his bachelor's degree in psychology from Miami in 1994 and a master's in sports sciences/administration from Miami in 1996. He is married to his wife, Maureen, and has two sons, Jake and Tyson.
