This Week • The University of Iowa volleyball team returns home to host Ohio State and 20th-ranked Michigan this weekend. The Hawkeyes and Buckeyes will square off Friday at 7:30 p.m. Iowa and Michigan are scheduled to meet Saturday at 7 p.m.

Friday's match against Ohio State will serve as "Senior Night." Seniors **Kiley Fister, Emily Hiza, Laura Kremer** and **Catherine Smale** will be honored after the match.

Scouting Ohio State • The Ohio State Buckeyes are 11-17 overall and 2-14 in Big Ten play.

Katie Dull leads the team with 274 kills, while Kristen Dozier has a team-best .231 attack percentage. Kelli Barhorst has 80 total blocks (15 solo, 65 assists) to lead the team in that statistical category. Chelsea Noble has a team-high 276 digs and Betsy Hone has 624 assists.

Iowa trails, 9-46, in the all-time series.

Last Meeting • Iowa snapped an 18-match losing streak on the road in Big Ten play with a four set win at Ohio State Oct. 26. The win also broke a 39-match losing skid against the Buckeyes.

Senior **Catherine Smale** led the Hawkeyes with a double-double, recording 13 kills and 14 digs along with four service aces. Junior **Megan Schipper** had a solid all-around perormance with 10 kills, nine digs, two solo blocks and five block assists. Senior **Emily Hiza** chipped in a team-best 15 digs and also had three service aces. Senior **Kiley Fister** also had a double-double with 33 assists and 12 digs. Senior **Laura Kremer** had nine total blocks (two solo, seven assists).

Scouting Michigan • The 20th-ranked Michigan Wolverines are 22-6 overall and 10-6 in Big Ten play.

Juliana Paz leads the squad with 325 kills, while Beth Karpiak has a team-best .355 attack percentage and 83 total blocks. Lexi Zimmerman is the team's primary setter with 1,133 assists, and Kerry Hance has 282 digs.

Iowa trails, 23-37, in the all-time series.

Last Meeting • The Hawkeyes dropped a hard-fought, three-set match at then No. 20 ranked Michigan Oct. 24. Iowa fell by two points in both the first and third set.

Junior **Megan Schipper** led the teaam with 11 kills, while sophomore **Aimee Huffman** had 10 kills on 20 swings, with only one error (.450 attack percentage). Senior **Kiley Fister** had a team-high 30 assists and senior **Emily Hiza** added 11 digs. Sophomore **Katie Kennedy** chipped in six total blocks (one solo, five assists) and Schipper added four.

Dingman Reaches Milestone • Head Coach **Sharon Dingman** picked up career win No. 350, with Iowa's five-set victory at Northwestern Nov. 14.

Dingman tallied 22 wins in one year at Auburn, 167 wins in eight years at Butler, 147 wins in eight years at Illinois State and 14 wins so far in her first season at Iowa.

Smale in Impressive Company • Senior **Catherine Smale** is just the seventh player in school history to amass both 1,000 kills and 1,000 digs in a career. Smale currently has 1,269 kills and 1,029 digs.

Smale joins former Hawkeyes Jenny Rees, Kari Hamel, Jennifer Webb, Toni Zehr, Barb Willis and Ellen Mullarkey as the only players to reach that plateau.

Seeing Double • Three Hawkeyes have multiple double-double peformances this season.

Senior **Catherine Smale** has recorded nine double-doubles (kills and digs). Junior **Megan Schipper** has had eight double-doubles (kills and digs), and senior **Kiley Fister** has notched six (assists and digs).

Hiza Nearing Record • Senior libero **Emily Hiza** needs just 64 more digs to become Iowa's all-time leader in the statistical category.

Hiza currently has 1,867 digs and needs to average 16 digs per match in order to set the record. Former Hawkeye Janet Moylan holds the record at 1,931 digs from 1987-90.



Head Coach Sharon Dingman



Sharon Dingman was hired as the eighth coach in Iowa volleyball history March 21, 2008.

Dingman comes to Iowa after serving as head coach at Illinois State from 2000-07, where she compiled a 147-98 record. In 2007, Dingman led the Redbirds to their first at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament since 1997 after reaching the championship match

of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and finished with a 21-12 overall record.

Illinois State produced winning seasons in seven of the eight seasons under Dingman and never finished lower than fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference. The Redbirds also reached at least the semifinals of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament in six of her eight seasons. Dingman produced 21 all-Missouri Valley Conference selections, including Player of the Year, Libero of the Year and two Freshman of the Year honorees. Two players also garnered all-district and all-region honors.

Redbird teams under Dingman were also strong in the classroom. Eleven players were named to the league's scholarathlete squad in her eight seasons and in 2004, four volleyball student-athletes earned perfect 4.00 grade-point-averages and the team recorded a 3.32 GPA. In 2005, her volleyball team won the academic award for the highest GPA in the athletic department.

Dingman started her head coaching career in 1991 at Auburn, where she led the Tigers to a 22-13 record in her only season at the helm. Her 1991 squad become the first Auburn volleyball tem to receive votes in the national poll and Auburn's fourth place finish in the SEC that season marked the highest finish ever for Auburn at the time. Two studentathletes earned all-SEC honors, including Jenifer Kleyn, who was named the SEC Scholar-Athlete of the Year and was an NCAA post-graduate scholarship recipient who carried a 4.0 GPA.

She then moved to Butler in 1992, where she served as head coach for eight seasons. Dingman led the Bulldogs to four 20 win seasons and three postseason tournaments, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1997 after capturing the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. She was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1997 after compiling a 28-7 record. Dingman guided three student-athletes to MCC Player of the Year honors, seven to all-region accolades and five to "Top 100 Student" honors at Butler.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Dingman spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at three Division I programs. After one season at Northern Michigan (1984), she assisted at Texas Tech for three seasons (1985-87). Dingman then spent three seasons at Kentucky (1988-90) and helped the Wildcats to an SEC Championship in 1988 along with three-straight regional finals appearances in the NCAA Tournament. **Hawkeyes Rank High in Attendance** • Iowa currently ranks 36th nationally in attendance, averaging 1,022 fans per match. The Hawkeyes have drawn a total of 10,216 fans for their seven home matches.

In addition, three of the top five crowds in school history have been set this season. Iowa drew 1,746 fans against Michigan State Oct. 18, which is the second-largest in school history. The Hawkeyes drew 1,701 against Penn State Oct. 10, which ranks third in the record books. Carver-Hawkeye Arena also saw a crowd of 1,598 against Indiana Oct. 11, which is the fifth-largest crowd in school history.

Solid in the Classroom • Seniors **Emily Hiza** and **Kiley Fister** have been named *ESPN the Magazine* Academic all-District by the College Sports Information Directors of America (CoSIDA).

Hiza was named to the first team and will now appear on the ballot for Academic all-America consideration. She accries a 3.95 GPA with a double-major in marketing and finance.

Fister was a third team selection and has a 3.65 GPA in interdepartmental studies with a Spanish minor.
