### THE SETTING

The Iowa women's basketball team will host Missouri Western in its second exhibition Thursday. Tip-off is slated for 7:05 p.m. at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

Tickets are \$3 for adults, while UI students and children 18-years-and-under will be admitted free.

### TICKETS

Season ticket prices remain the same for the 2007-08 women's basketball season. A reserved general public seat is \$70. Season tickets for UI faculty and fans 55 and over are \$56.

### ON THE RADIO

Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call Thursday night's exhibition for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the contest on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City. Balbinot enters his fourth season as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Till enters her third providing analysis.

### PROMOTIONS

During the second half of every home game, one lucky Hawkeye fan will win an iPod Shuffle, while another will win an iTunes gift card during "Big Ten SuperFan T-Shirt Toss". Each winner will be included in a final drawing at Iowa's home finale vs. Northwestern (Feb. 28) for an all-expenses-paid trip for two to the Big Ten Women's Basketball Tournament in Indianapolis (March 6-10).

### GAME TIME CHANGES

There are three game time changes for Iowa home games due to the contests being televised on KCRG in eastern Iowa. Hawkeye games vs. Detroit (Dec. 2) and Wisconsin (Jan. 13) have moved to 1 p.m. and 3 p.m., respectively. On Dec. 9, the game (KCRG Hawkeye Challenge championship or consolation) involving Iowa will be played at noon.

### IOWA HISTORY

Iowa has played 938 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, Iowa's record is 568-370 (.605). That includes a 283-141 (.667) mark in Big Ten games and a 259-78 (.769) record in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

### SCOUTING MISSOURI WESTERN

Missouri Western is coming off the second best season in school history. The Griffons finished with a 30-4 record and won the MIAA regular season championship. Only four players, including senior starters Jill Johnson, who hails from Rockwell City, IA, and Yanique Javois return from last year's squad. Johnson was a second team all-MIAA honoree, averaging 14.2 points and 8.0 rebounds in 2006-07. Javois was an all-MIAA defensive team award winner, averaging 10.3 points and 3.0 rebounds a year ago.

Missouri Western is ranked 17th in the USA Today/ESPN Division II preseason poll.

The Griffons lost their exhibition opener last Saturday at Oral Roberts, 92-63. Missouri Western shot 22-53 (.415) from the field, including 5-10 (.500) from 3-point range. The Golden Eagles outrebounded the Griffons 52-26. Three Griffons scored double figures in defeat, Johnson (17), Tierra Ford (14) and Lauren Nolke (11).

Lynn Plett enters his first season as Missouri Western's head coach.

## HAWKEYES CRUISE IN EXHIBITION OPENER

The Hawkeyes cruised to a 73-51 victory over Nebraska-Omaha last Friday night in Iowa City. All 13 Hawkeyes netted at least two points and grabbed two rebounds or more.

Iowa built a 20-point cushion (24-4) 10:30 into the contest and never looked back. The Hawkeyes, who ranked third in the country in 3-pointers a year ago, drained their first five attempts from behind the arc. For the game, Iowa finished shooting 50 percent (8-16) from 3-point distance.

Leading the Hawkeyes were junior starters Wendy Ausdemore and Kristi Smith. Ausdemore netted 10 points in only 19 minutes of action, while Smith contributed nine points in 22 minutes. Junior Lindsey Nyenhuis added eight points in 13 minutes off the bench.

## PRE-SEASON RANKINGS

Iowa has been picked to finish fifth in the Big Ten by a selected media panel and seventh by the league coaches. Ohio State, a team that has won outright or shared the last three regular season conference titles, is picked to win its fourth straight. Wisconsin senior Jolene Anderson was selected as the pre-season Player of the Year by both voting groups.

## WHAT TO WATCH FOR

• Megan Skouby (84) is only two blocks from matching fifth-place Cathy Marx's total of 86 on Iowa's career blocks list. Also, Johanna Solverson (802) is only seven points from equaling 28th-place Laurie Aaron's total of 809 on the Hawkeyes' career scoring chart.

## TELEVISION SCHEDULE

Eight Hawkeye regular season games will be televised live on the Big Ten Network, including three road games and the Big Ten/ACC Challenge vs. Georgia Tech in Iowa City. Additionally, up to four Iowa home contests will be televised locally on KCRG-TV9 and its road game at in-state rival Iowa State (Dec. 2) will be aired on Mediacom's local connections channel.

## CHALLENGING SCHEDULE

The Hawkeyes could play 22 of 29 regular season games against teams that competed in 2007 post-season tournaments, including seven that participated in the NCAA Tournament. Iowa will play 18 games (two exhibitions) inside Carver-Hawkeye Arena, the most regular season home contests in school history. Iowa will only leave the state twice the first two months of the season (at the Caribbean Challenge in Cancun, Mexico, November 22-23 and at Michigan, December 30). Additionally, Iowa will have a 12-day layoff between games in mid-December (Dec. 9-22).

Four of Iowa's opponents this season are ranked in pre-season publications (Arizona State, Michigan State, Ohio State and Wisconsin). Arizona State (12), Ohio State (16), Michigan State (18) and Purdue (20) are ranked in the USA Today/ESPN Pre-season poll.

## SILVER ANNIVERSARY

Iowa will honor and celebrate the 1992-93 team that posted a 27-4 overall record, captured first place in the Big Ten with a 16-2 mark and advanced to the Final Four in Atlanta. The team will be recognized at halftime of the February 17th game vs. Minnesota.

## IOWA CAPTAINS

Iowa captains this season are seniors Johanna Solverson and Abby Emmert.

### HAWKEYES RETURN THREE ALL-BIG TEN PERFORMERS

Iowa returns third team all-Big Ten performers Wendy Ausdemore and Kristi Smith and honorable mention honoree Megan Skouby from a year ago. All three juniors averaged double figures last season to lead the Black and Gold. Smith averaged a team-best 13.4 points, followed by Skouby (13.2) and Ausdemore (12.7).

### SOLVERSON RETURNS FOR SIXTH SEASON

Johanna Solverson has been granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing the last two seasons due to consecutive ACL tears in her right knee. The 6-2 small forward played in all but one game her first three seasons. One of Iowa's most versatile players, she boasts a career average of 8.5 points, 4.3 rebounds, 3.0 assists and 1.67 steals in 94 games.

Solverson becomes only the second Iowa women's basketball player to receive a sixth year from the NCAA. Simone Edwards (1993-97) received a sixth year after suffering two season-ending knee injuries. Edwards played two full seasons and a partial third with the Hawkeyes after transferring to Iowa from Seminole Junior College.

### IN THE 2006-07 RANKINGS

Last season, Iowa ranked second in the country in 3-point field goal percentage (.402), fifth in free throw percentage (.788) and 23rd in assists (16.0). Individually, Wendy Ausdemore ranked 14th in the nation in 3-point field goal percentage (.416) and Kristi Smith ranked 21st in free throw percentage (.858).

### FRESH FACES

Iowa adds two freshmen and one sophomore transfer to its roster this season. After transferring to Iowa from Kansas State and not competing in games last season, JoAnn Hamlin (Douglass, KS) is a welcome addition. Also added to the mix are freshmen Kachine Alexander (Minneapolis, MN) and Kelsey Cermak (Norwalk, IA).

### HAMLIN RETURNS TO GAME COMPETITION

After sitting out last season due to transfer rules, sophomore JoAnn Hamlin is ready to hit the hardwood.

As a freshman at Kansas State in 2005-06, Hamlin started 31-of-33 games, averaging 10.0 points and 4.6 rebounds.

In three exhibition contests against the Greek National Team this past May, Hamlin averaged 10.3 points and 5.0 rebounds.

## Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her eighth season as head coach at the University of Iowa and her 24th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 44, has a career record of 483-229 (.678), including a 127-87 (.593) record at Iowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is Iowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to six post-season tournaments (4 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and four upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.



In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the Women's Basketball News Service and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (10) and Emma (7) and one son, David (5).

### HOME GROWN HAWKEYES

Iowa's roster features five players from the state of Iowa (Wendy Ausdemore, Kelsey Cermak, Abby Emmert, Stacy Schlapkohl and Nicole VanderPol). The Hawkeyes also have two players from Illinois (Jeneé Graham and Johanna Solverson) and Minnesota (Kachine Alexander and Krista VandeVenter). Iowa's 12-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Kansas (JoAnn Hamlin), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

### BLOGGING
