SCOUTING RUTGERS

- The Scarlet Knights bring a 13-2-2 record into Wednesday's match, including a 6-2-2 mark in Big Ten play. Last weekend, Rutgers topped No. 19 Minnesota, 3-1.
- Rutgers has scored 25 goals in 17 games this season with Colby Ciarrocca leading the team with six goals, three assists, and 15 points. Samantha Valliant is tied for third in the league with three game-winning goals this season.
- The Scarlet Knights are outshooting opponents, 263-133, and outscoring opponents
- •Rutgers' Casey Murphy has started every game in goal, where she has posted a conference-leading 0.29 goals against average and 51 saves. Murphy also leads the Big Ten in save percentage (0.911) and shutouts (13).
- The Scarlet Knights are led by head coach Mike O'Neill, who is in his 15th season with the program.







HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANNI

Dave Dilanni is entering his second season as head coach for the University of Iowa women's soccer program. Dilanni was tabbed as the fifth coach in program history on May 17, 2014, coming to the UI following an 11-year head coaching stint at Grand Valley State.

Dilanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 235-25-19 (.876) career record and guided three Grand Valley State teams to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths, while coaching 21 All-Americans.

Dilanni's .895 winning percentage was tops in NCAA Division II history and his current .876 winning percentage is third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In his first season in lowa City, Dilanni led the Hawkeyes to a 14-7-1 overall and a 7-5-1 Big Ten record to notch the program's third top-five league finish since 2011. The seven Big Ten victories tied the program record for Big Ten wins in a single season and the 14 wins were the second-most in school history.

After entering the Big Ten Tournament as the No. 5 seed, lowa posted victories over No. 23 Rutgers and Northwestern to advance to the tournament championship game for a second straight season. Two seniors -- Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert -- capped their Hawkeye careers with first-team All-Big Ten and first-team all-region honors. They were the first pair in school history to earn first-team all-conference honors in the same season and the first two players to garner first-team all-region recognition.

The Hawkeyes finished 2014 with a school-record 14 shutouts in 22 games to rank 20th nationally with a .545 shutout percentage. lowa's defense also was in the top-35 in the country in saves percentage (31st, .838) and goals against average (35th, .754).

Academically, the Hawkeyes garnered the NSCAA Team Academic Award for an eighth straight season and nine soccer student-athletes garnered Academic All-Big Ten honors. Seniors Caitlin Brown and Emily Scott were also received Scholar All-Region recognition.

RUTGERS VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

- Iowa leads all-time series, 2-1.
- Last season, lowa and Rutgers split a pair of contests. The Hawkeyes fell 1-0 in lowa City during the regular season before defeating the Scarlet Knights, 1-0, in the quarterfinals of the Big Ten Tournament on Nov. 5.
- lowa hosted the first meeting in 2003, where the Hawkeyes defeated the Scarlet Knights, 2-1.

QUICK HITTERS

- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel had her first career two goal game against Nebraska on Oct. 23. Her second strike came just 23 seconds after a goal from Nebraska's Caroline Flynn to cut the deficit to 4-3.
- Stuenkel is tied for the team lead with five goals to go along with two assists. She notched her first game-winning goal in lowa's, 2-1, overtime victory over UNI.
- The Hawkeyes scored three goals against Nebraska on Oct. 23 -- the most in a Big Ten game this season. The Hawkeyes have registered a total of 189 shots and 20 goals in 17 games this season.
- Senior Hannah Clark made five saves against Illinois on Oct. 15 en route to her 36th career victory --- a new program record.
- Clark leads the Big Ten in saves (95), saves per game (5.59), and is ninth in save percentage (0.779).
- Junior Bri Toelle ranks third in the Big Ten in shots (73) and is third in shots per game (4.29).
- The Hawkeyes tallied seven shots against No. 14 Minnesota on Oct. 11 -- the most in a Big Ten game this season. The Hawkeyes have registered a total of 180 shots in 16 games this season.
- The Hawkeyes have used a different starting lineup in 16-of-17 contests. Four players -- Hannah Clark, Brooke Backes, Kyrie Seying and Amanda Lulek -- have started every game.
- •The Hawkeyes finished nonconference play with a 6-1 record. lowa is 36-2 in the nonconference during the last five seasons.

CLARK MAKES HISTORY

Senior Hannah Clark has been in goal for 36 wins in her UI soccer career. Iowa's win over Illinois on Oct. 15 moved her past former Hawkeye Emily Moran as the winningest goalkeeper in program history. Clark is also the school record holder in career shutouts (26), and is third all-time with 311 saves.

HAWKEYES TALLY 1ST B1G VICTORY

lowa notched its first Big Ten win of the season with a 1-0 victory over Illinois on Oct. 15 at the Illinois Soccer Stadium. The win marks the Hawkeyes' sixth shutout of the season.

LAST GAME

lowa fell to Nebraska, 5-3, at the lowa Soccer Complex on Oct. 23. Sophomore Karly Stuenkel had a pair of goals in the contest, while senior Hannah Clark totaled five saves in 90 minutes of action.

HAWKEYES STEP UP

Eight different Hawkeyes have scored this season -- four of which have scored multiple goals.

Junior Bri Toelle and sophomore Karly Stuenkel lead the team with five goals each, freshman Alina Magruder has tallied three and senior Brooke Backes has notched two.

Junior Tory Harman and freshmen Jenna Kentgen, Hannah Kousheh and Hannah Brobst each have one.

TWO-GOAL GAMES

Freshman Alina Magruder and sophomore Karly Stuenkel have each scored two goals in a single contest this season.

Magruder tallied two on Aug. 23 against Nebraska Omaha, while Stuenkel notched two against Nebraska on Oct. 23.

RECORD-BREAKING CROWD

lowa had a school-record crowd of 1,847 fans in attendance during its Big Ten Conference home opener against Ohio State





on Sept. 25. The Hawkeyes have had two of the top three crowds in program history in 2015. A crowd of 1,314 -third-most all-time -- was in attendance Sept. 11 for the Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series game against lowa State.

GAME WINNERS

Five different Hawkeyes have scored game-winning goals this season. Bri Toelle has tallied two, while Brooke Backes, Tory Harman, Jenna Kengen, and Karly Stuenkel have each recorded one.

Toelle's two game winners currently rank ninth in the Big Ten.

TOELLE TIES PROGRAM RECORD

Junior Bri Toelle tied the school record for single game assists after notching three assists in lowa's 4-0 victory over Nebraska Omaha on Aug. 23. The total is the high water mark in the Big Ten this season.

Toelle shares the lowa school record with Morgan Showalter (Sept. 23, 2008) and Jenna Sorensen (Sept. 5, 1997).

QUICK STRIKES

- Sophomore Karly Stuenkel scored a career-high two goals against Nebraska on Oct. 23. Her second goal of the game came just 23 seconds after Nebraska's Caroline Flynn to cut the deficit to 4-3.
- Freshman Hannah Brobst notched her first career goal, minutes into her first game as a Hawkeye in Iowa's 3-0, win over UIC on Sept. 13.
- lowa scored two goals in the span of 1:39 seconds in its 2-1 win over Utah State.
- The Hawkeyes scored their third and fourth goals in a span of 29 seconds in their 4-0 win over Omaha on Aug. 23.

MAGRUDER NAMED B1G FRESHMAN OF THE WEEK

University of Iowa midfielder Alina Magruder was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on Aug. 25 after scoring a pair of goals in lowa's 4-0 victory over Omaha. The honor is the first of Magruder's career and she is the first Hawkeye freshman to earn the weekly conference honor since Hannah Clark on Oct. 8, 2012.

TEAM CAPTAIN

Senior Hannah Clark has been named lowa's team captain for the 2015 season. She is joined on Iowa's Leadership Council by senior Sarah Mazur, juniors Corey Burns and Amanda Lulek, and redshirt freshman Aubree Larson.

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Rutgers and Minnesota are ranked in the NSCAA Top 25 poll as of Oct. 20.

Penn State was voted No. 10, Rutgers is 12th and Minnesota sits at No. 19. Northwestern is receiving votes (3).
