Lisa Bluder, the head women's basketball coach at The University of Iowa and dean of Big Ten coaches, can be defined by many words, but no two ring more true than the words *passion* and *success*.

During her tenure, the Hawkeyes have advanced to seven post-season appearances. She is the second winningest coach in Iowa women's basketball history and was named Big Ten and WBCA Regional Coach of the Year twice (2001, 2008). The Hawkeyes were Big Ten Champions in 2008 and Big Ten Tournament Champions in 2001.

Five Hawkeyes earned Big Ten honors during the 2009 season. Kristi Smith was named to the first team for the second consecutive year, Kachine Alexander to the Second Team, Wendy Audemore to the Third Team, and Megan Skouby was selected as Honorable Mention. Kamille Wahlin was named to the All-Freshman Team.

In addition, seven of Bluder's Hawkeyes have played professional basketball. Cara Consuegra, Lindsey Meder and Crystal Smith all had stints in the WNBA. Jamie Cavey has played in Portugal and Greece, while Johnanna Solverson, Kristi Smith, and Megan Skouby are currently playing professionally overseas. There have been 36 Hawkeyes who have earned academic all-Big Ten honors and one academic All-American.

Aside from basketball success, one of the most gratifying aspects of Coach Bluder's job is developing her players into leaders and role models. Coach Bluder's teams are always very active in the community and enjoy being involved in community activities. Coach Bluder loves the family atmosphere and rich tradition that comes with coaching at The University of Iowa. She has truly developed a program that demonstrates great *passion* and *success* in all aspects.

General information

Check-in

The check-in time for the **Basketball Camp** is 10:00-noon on Friday at the Main Deck, Fieldhouse. The first session will begin at 1:30 p.m.

Housing for residents

Residents are participants who are living in one of the residence halls during camp. There are two campers per room. Room assignments will be made in advance. If you have a roommate preference, write the name of that person on your application form in the designated area. Bedding, which includes sheets, pillow, pillowcase, and blanket, is provided. Meals are served in University dining facilities. Trainers and medical personnel are available 24 hours a day.

Commuter plan

Commuters are participants who attend sessions during the day and stay off-campus at night. Lunch and dinner are included in the commuter fee.

Orientation

After registration a brief orientation session will be held explaining Sports Camp rules and regulations. All campers must comply with the rules. Any serious violations or abuses will result in immediate dismissal from camp without refund.

Items to bring to camp

Participants must furnish their own towels and toiletry items. It is a good idea to bring extra spending money for soft drinks, snacks, video games, and the Hawk Shop. The camp administration will not cash personal checks. When not in a sports session, dress is casual, so bring along your favorite jeans, shorts, summer shirts, and a swimsuit. You may wish to bring an alarm clock and a small fan.

Facilities

You will be participating in the finest facilities in the Midwest. Carver-Hawkeye Arena, home of the Hawkeyes, the Iowa Field House, and the Recreation Building all provide excellent indoor facilities with 20 full courts.

Important for parents

We invite parents to attend any camp session, especially our **Basketball Camp** final session and awards ceremony on Sunday afternoon. Campers will progress at 4:15 p.m. to Carver-Hawkeye Arena for the awards ceremony and closing of camp at approximately 5:00 p.m.

Health and insurance

Costs for the treatment of injuries and hospitalization for illness or injuries incurred during the Sports Camps will be the responsibility of the parent or guardian of the participant.

Costs and cancellations

The fee per session is all-inclusive; there are no extra charges. The full tuition is due no later than May 15, 2010. Your fee **less the deposit** will be refunded without questions if you cancel your enrollment prior to June 1, 2010. Campers who must leave during the week due to illness or injury will receive a prorated refund. Written requests for refunds should be sent to the Sports Camps office, 203 Field House, University of Iowa, Iowa City, IA 52242. Requests must be made prior to August 15, 2010. No refund will be given to campers who voluntarily leave camp or who are sent home for disciplinary reasons.
