Iowa is one game out of sixth and two out of third place in the conference standings. This weekend the Hawkeyes will travel to University Park, PA, to take on sixth-place Penn State in a three-game series which will be broadcasted live on the Big Ten Network (HD). The first game is slated for Friday at 6:05 p.m. (CDT) This is Iowa's final Big Ten series on the road this season.

ON THE NET:

Iowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be posting the stats.

ON THE RADIO:

Hawkeye fans can catch this weekend's games on AM-800 KXIC. The Voice of the Hawkeyes, Brent Balbinot will handle the play-by-play, while Ray Gilmore will provide expert analysis. The three-game Penn State series will be broadcast on the radio and online.

ON THE TUBE:

Hawkeye fans can watch this weekend's three-game series on the Big Ten Network. Steve will provide the play-by-play, while Scott Pose provides the color commentary.

SCOUTING PENN STATE:

Penn State is currently 20-23 and 7-8 in the conference after sweeping Michigan State last weekend. The Nittany Lions are currently tied for sixth place in the conference standings.

Offensively, PSU is led by Ben Heath. He leads the team in hits (64), doubles (14), homers (17), RBI (53), slugging percentage (.772), walks (24), sacrifice flies (4) and on base percentage (.457).

The Nittany Lion pitching staff is led by reliever David Lutz. Lutz, who is the reigning Big Ten Pitcher of the Week, has a team-low 3.04 ERA, a team-best four wins and team-high 29 appearances with 56.1 innings pitched.

HIPPEN TOSSES A GEM:

Jarred Hippen threw his third complete game of the season and earned his team-best fourth win last Saturday in game one of a double-header against Minnesota.

Coming off a complete game in Ann Arbor the previous Friday, the lefty allowed only four runs, three earned, on 10 hits with seven strikeouts and issued no walks.

All three complete games have been in conference play and all have resulted in a win. In his last complete game the Rock Falls, IL, native, allowed only two runs, one earned, scattered six hits and struck out five en route to his third win in a 5-2 victory at Michigan.

Hippen's first career complete game was in the Big Ten opener at Michigan State. He allowed three runs off seven hits and striking out two. The last Hawkeye to throw a complete nine was Nate Johnson in 2004.

EARLY LEADS = WINS:

In Big Ten contests, the Hawkeyes have had an early lead in four of their six conference wins. Iowa plays well when playing with the lead. In fact, in all games played this season, the Hawkeyes are 15-2 when leading after six.

FIRST FRAME:

The Hawkeyes are successful in the first inning, having scored 47 (to their opponents 30) in the first frame this season. Against Coe, Tuesday evening, the Hawkeyes plated five runs in the first.

HAWKEYES SWING IT:

Mike McQuillan is currently on a nine-game hit streak. The sophomore also leads the Hawkeyes with 18 multi-hit games, followed by Kurtis Muller (17), Zach McCool (15) and Ryan Durant (15).

Durant leads the way with 10 multi-RBI games and McCool has collected eight.

DERMODY GETS FIRST 'W':

After retiring the first batter of the game, Iowa starter **Matt Dermody** allowed the next five Coe hitters to reach base surrendering three first-inning runs on three hits, a walk and a hit-by-pitch. The inning featured a Ryan Velvick two-RBI single up the middle.

Dermody, however, earned his first career victory and settled down after the first inning, going five innings and scattering seven hits and allowing three runs.

IOWA GETS MIDWEEK WIN:

Iowa scored 13 runs in the first two innings and cruised to a 16-6 triumph over Coe College Tuesday night in the Corridor Classic played in front of 964 fans at Perfect Game Field at Veterans Memorial Stadium. The 16 runs are the most by Iowa since its 19-11 season-opening victory over Illinois State in Clarksville, TN.

Zach McCool, Mike McQuillan, Phil Keppler, Chett Zeise, Ryan Durant and Sean Flanagan paced the Hawkeyes offensively. McCool and Durant both went a perfect 3-for-3, while Durant added three RBI and McCool two runs scored. McQuillan went 3-for-4 with two runs and one RBI. Keppler had a hit, walk, two RBI and two runs scored. Zeise collected a game-high four RBI on three hits, including a home run and sacrifice fly, while Flanagan had a hit, walk, two RBI and a run.

Iowa equaled a season-high in home runs in a game with four: **Trevor Willis, Mike Corbeil** and Durant each had solo blasts, while Zeise had a three-run shot.

HOME RUN FEVER:

The Hawkeyes had been on a home run drought until **Trevor Willis** connected with a 'no doubter' in Ann Arbor two weekends ago. That bomb ended a nearly month-long drought for the Hawkeyes.

Since then, Iowa has launched eight bombs in its last four games. Willis and **Mike McQuillan** have collected two. While **Mike Corbeil, Ryan Durant, Zach McCool** and **Chett Zeise** have all registered one.

McQuillan, Durant, Flanagan and Willis all share the team lead with three big flies each.

McCOOL DOMINATES BIG TEN:

Zach McCool has had stellar performances in Big Ten play this season.

In conference play, the junior is ranked in the top 10 amongst other Big Ten players in the following statistical categories: stolen bases (2nd), on base percentage (3rd), sacrifice bunts (3rd) and batting average (4th).

3 THINGS TO WATCH THIS WEEK

1. **Jarred Hippen** has been in a groove on the bump for the Hawkeyes. The southpaw has thrown three complete games this season, and two-straight now in Big Ten play.

2. **Mike McQuillan** is on a season-high nine-game hit streak. On Tuesday, he went 3-for-4.

3. The Hawkeyes have connected with eight homers in the past four games. Which is nearly half of their 19 this season.

DURANT SOLID IN BIG TEN:

Iowa's cleanup hitter, **Ryan Durant** has hit a solid .345 in conference play. He leads the team with nine doubles, 16 RBI and is second (to Zach McCool) with a .500 slugging percentage. Six of his 16 RBI have come with two outs.

Durant ranks in the Big Ten, in conference games only, in doubles (1st), sacrifice flies (3rd) and sacrifice bunts (3rd.).

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

When compared to the conference's best in overall games several Hawkeyes rank in the top 10.

Kurtis Muller is tied for first in fielding percentage and ranks in stolen bases (5th). **Ryan Durant** is tied for third in sacrifice flies and **Zach McCool** ranks second in sacrifice bunts.

Ace **Jarred Hippen** ranks in batters struck out looking (1st), innings pitched (2nd), ERA (7th) and batters struck out (9th), **Kevin Lee** ranks second in saves and **Patrick Schatz** ranks third in appearances.

ALL-TIME SERIES:

Penn State leads the all-time series between the two schools, 32-22.

The Nittany Lions took the series last year at Duane Banks Field, snagging wins in two contests. The Hawkeyes, however, won the series finale, 5-3.

Starter **Jarred Hippen** went seven and one-third innings and earned the victory. He allowed only three runs, one earned, on four hits with six strikeouts. Hippen's teammates helped the freshman southpaw with their defense, registering three double plays the first three innings.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Three Hawkeyes were drafted in the Major League Baseball's 2009 First-Year Player Draft. Right-handed fireballer **Steve Turnbull**, lefty relief pitcher **Kyle Heim** and closer **Mike Schurz** all signed contracts in June. Three-time all-Big Ten selection **Justin Toole** later signed a free agent contract.

Other draftees included current Iowa freshmen: **Matt Dermody** and **Dan Sheppard**.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

Iowa has done a very good job this season winning the games where it has had the lead late. The Hawkeyes are a perfect 17-0 when leading after eight innings, 16-2 when leading after seven and 15-2 when maintaining the advantage after six frames.

CORBEIL GETS AFTER IT:

Freshman **Mike Corbeil** has made himself a regular in the Iowa lineup in recent games. The left-handed hitter is currently hitting .348 in conference play, including a double, three walks and a sacrifice fly.

SITUATIONALLY SPEAKING:

Lefty **Dallas Burke** is hitting a solid .346 against southpaw pitchers. While **Mike McQuillan** is hitting .396 off of rightys.

Kurtis Muller is cool under pressure, hitting .438 with two outs. **Zach McCool** leads the team with 13 two-out RBI with **Ryan Durant** right behind him with 12.

Zach Robertson has been dominant against lefties, who are hitting a mere .093 against him. Opponents are hitting .128 with two outs against **Nick Brown** and **Jarred Hippen** leads the pitching staff with seven batters who have grounded into double plays.

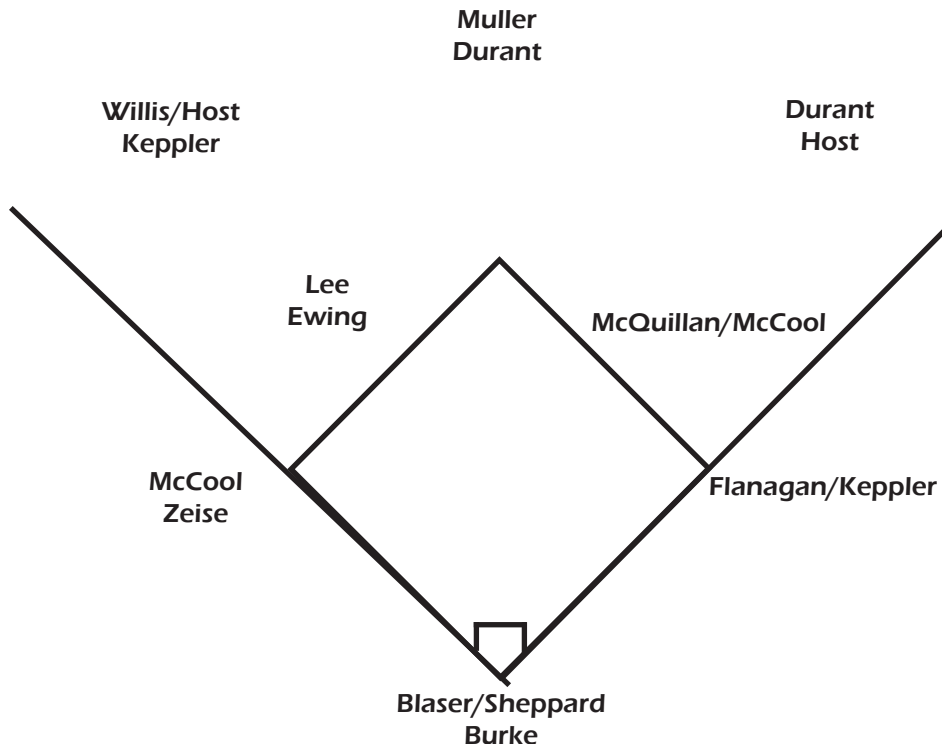

FINISHING AT HOME:

Iowa will play its final seven games in the state of Iowa, including six Big Ten games.

The Hawkeyes will host Ohio State in a three-game series next weekend (May 14-16) and Purdue the following week (May 20-22). The Hawkeyes boast a 10-5 home record.

Iowa has only one non-conference game remaining, vs. Western Illinois, played at a neutral site in Davenport, Iowa.

IOWA TAKES SERIES:

On the shoulders of another strong pitching performance by pitching ace **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa beat Michigan, 5-2, in game one. Iowa's victory snapped an eight-game losing skid at Michigan. The Hawkeyes' last win in Ann Arbor came on April 10, 2005.

The Hawkeyes won game two at Michigan, 5-3, to sweep Friday's doubleheader. The win marked the first time Iowa swept a doubleheader since at Indiana on April 12, 2008.

The Black and Gold dropped the finale of a three-game series, 7-5, to Michigan Saturday afternoon. Despite the loss, Iowa won the series having picked up two wins in the twinbill at Ray Fisher Stadium Friday. The game featured 26 hits between both teams.

RECORD BREAKING McCool:

Junior **Zach McCool** tied yet another school record. McCool laced two consecutive triples in Iowa's victory over Western Illinois Tuesday. The last time that was done was in 1999 by Brian Burks.

McCool tied another individual-game record earlier in the season. He went 5-for-6 from the leadoff spot for Iowa in its series finale against the Spartans. McCool's five hits ties a single-game school record, last achieved by former Hawkeye standout, Justin Toole, in 2008.

BIG TEN OPENER VICTORY:

With a gem of a pitching performance from **Jarred Hippen**, Iowa picked up its first conference-opening win since a 9-5 triumph over Michigan in 2003.

Besides that, Iowa had won six of its last seven games and snapped Michigan State's 11-game win streak.

THE UNITY COUNCIL:

Senior **Michael Jacobs**, red shirt junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Kurtis Muller**, sophomore **Patrick Brennan** and freshman **Dan Sheppard**.

With a 2-1 record, Iowa had several quality performances in Florida (Feb. 26-28). Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebaseball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the year, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying two other Big Ten players.)

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

For the first time, season tickets are available for purchase. Fans can reserve their own chair backs for the 2010 season by calling the UI Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-IA-HAWKS.

Besides that, in 2009, the Recreation Building underwent a complete makeover. Improvements included: a new locker room, lounge, training room and weight room.

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
