THIS WEEK

The University of Iowa soccer team opens the 2011 season on the road Friday against the DePaul Blue Demons at 4 p.m. at Wish Field in Chicago, Ill. Sunday afternoon, Iowa hosts Southeast Missouri State for the first home game of the season. The teams game will be held at the Iowa Soccer Complex, beginning at 1 p.m.

SCOUTING THE OPPONENTS

DePaul will build its defense on goalkeeper Claire Hanold. The junior played in 16 games for the Blue Demons last season, recording 62 saves and six shutouts.

Sophomore Natasa Radosavljevic will take on a lead scoring role after the team's top-three scorers from 2010 graduated. Radosavljevic found the net three times last season and competed in 21 games. Kelly Blumberg, Ashleigh Goddard and Michelle Scandora each scored two goals last season and return in 2011.

Head Coach Erin Chastain is in her fifth season at the helm of the Blue Demons women's soccer team. Chastain led the team to its first Big East conference championship in 2010.

Southeast Missouri State's attack will look to junior Courtney Luehmann, 2010's second leading scorer. Luehmann and Stephanie Palmer combined for nine goals last season.

Caitlin Schnorbach, one of two incoming goalkeepers, is from Edina, Minn. Schnorbach recorded 21 career shutouts and did not allow a single goal during her sophomore campaign.

Nicole Urban, a forward from Lisle, Ill., holds three school records, including career goals (105), goals in a single season (41) and points in a single season (101) following her career at Lisle High

School.

Caitlin Brown, a defender from Ann Arbor, Mich., is a two-time all-state selection and three-time all-Catholic and all-district honoree.

Marissa Hurt, a defender from Ankeny, Iowa., was a member of the Ankeny girl's soccer team that was a three-time conference champion.

Anne Marie Thomas, a defender from Kentworth, Ill., competed on the New Trier lacrosse team that posted a perfect 24-0 record.

Abby Zimmerman, a forward from Bettendorf, Iowa., was her high school team's leader in scoring and assists for three years.

Cloe Lacasse, a forward from Sudbury, Ontario., was named the Female Athlete of the Year by her high school and the city of Sudbury.

Jordan Rakas, a defender from Holt, Mich., was a four-time all-conference selection as well as her team's MVP and captain for two seasons.

Melanie Pickert, a defender from Canton, Mich., was a three-time all-state selection for her efforts on the Canton High School girl's soccer team.

Kiley Beck, one of two incoming goalkeepers, is from Rockford, Ill., where she posted a .952 goals against average following her junior year.
