1 DE A.J. Epenesa was named B1G co-Defensive Player of the Week after recording career highs in tackles (5), sacks (2), and holding IA ST to 19 yards rushing in Week 2. Epenesa is tied for the B1G lead and second in the NCAA with 3 sacks. He is celebrating his 20th birthday on Saturday.

2 TE Noah Fant has 13 career TD receptions, tying Quinn Early and Mike Flagg for 10th all-time. The 13 TD receptions tie Flagg for most by a tight end in program history. Twelve of Fant's TD receptions have come from QB Nate Stanley over the Hawkeyes' last 14 games. His 13 career TDs have come from near and far, listed in chronological order: 5, 2, 27, 23, 7, 45, 25, 3, 6, 4, 69, 8, 1.

3 The Hawkeyes lead the B1G and rank second in the country in scoring defense (5.0). Iowa has allowed just 10 points in the first two weeks, fewer than any other team that has played at least 2 games. The Hawkeyes are 1 of just 4 teams to allow just 1 TD through 2 games.

4 QB Nate Stanley threw a 1-yard TD to TE Noah Fant in the season opener. It was Stanley's 27th career TD pass. He is three shy of tying Brad Banks for 10th all-time in program history. Stanley and Fant have connected for TDs 12 times over the last 14 games.

5 Iowa leads the B1G and ranks fifth in the country in total defense (199.5 ypg). The Hawkeyes have 9 sacks in the first 2 weeks, more than any other team in the B1G and tied for second in the country (ASU, 11). Iowa has allowed just 26 first downs, fewer than any other B1G team.

6 In the first 2 games of the season, 5 Hawkeye LBs - Djimon Colbert, Jack Hockaday, Amani Jones, Nick Niemann, Kristian Welch - have made their first career starts. The five LBs entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than Iowa's three starting linebackers in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).

7 QB Nate Stanley is 10-5 as Iowa's starter. He has won four straight, is 6-0 against nonconference teams, and owns a 7-2 record at Kinnick Stadium. He numbers at home include 18 TDs, 5 INTs, and 1,626 yards passing.

8 The Hawkeyes do not have a junior or senior at the running back position group. Sophomores Ivory Kelly-Martin, Mekhi Sargent, and Toren Young are the elder statesmen of the group. The trio has combined for 279 yards and three rushing TDs (one by each player).

9 In its last three regular season games, Iowa has outscored its opponents 82-7 in the second half (42-0 at Nebraska, 30-7 vs. Northern Illinois, 10-0 vs. Iowa State).

10 Iowa has won its last 6 games against nonconference teams. That includes two nonconference games (N. Illinois, Iowa St.) in 2018, a 3-0 start to the season against nonconference teams (Wyoming, Iowa St., N. Texas) in 2017, and a victory over Boston College at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl.

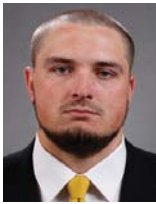

PAT GREEN TO PERFORM 'WAVE ON WAVE' IN KINNICK STADIUM

Three-time Grammy nominee Pat Green will perform during halftime of the Northern Iowa at Iowa football game in Kinnick Stadium on Sept. 15. Green joins the Hawkeye Marching Band and the Northern Iowa Panther Marching Band to perform "Wave on Wave," the anthem of the Iowa Wave to the University of Iowa Stead Family Children's Hospital. Green has sold more than two million albums and released a string of 15 hits on the Billboard Top Country Singles Chart.

The marching bands will have a traditional performance of one number before they join Green in "Wave on Wave." Green will perform from the stands near the south end zone with 50 members of each band. The combined remaining Hawkeye and Panther band members will create images on the field for the children to view during the performance.

HAWKEYE HISTORY

Iowa has played 1,234 games since beginning football in 1889. Iowa's overall record is 643-553-39 (.535). That includes a 402-219-16 (.643) record in home games, a 241-334-23 (.421) record in games away from Iowa City, a 324-374-25 (.465) mark in Big Ten games and a 286-184-15 (.607) record in Kinnick Stadium.

6 THROUGH THE AIR

QB Nate Stanley threw a 1-yard touchdown to TE Noah Fant in the season opener. It was Stanley's 27th career touchdown pass. He is three shy of tying Brad Banks for 10th all-time in program history. Stanley and Fant have connected for touchdowns 12 times over the last 14 games.

Stanley threw 26 touchdowns last year, one shy of tying the single-season record held by Chuck Long (27, 1985). Of those 26 touchdown passes, TE Noah Fant caught a team-high 11 touchdown passes last year, followed by WR Nick Easley (4). In total, 20 of Stanley's 26 touchdown targets return in 2018. TE T.J. Hockenson caught three touchdowns from Stanley in 2017, and WR Ihmir Smith-Marsette pulled in two touchdown receptions.

DOWN, DOWN, DOWN IN FRONT

The Hawkeyes have nine sacks in the first two weeks of the season, more than any other team in the Big Ten and tied for second in the country (Arizona State, 11).

DE A.J. Epenesa leads the team with three sacks. He is tied for the Big Ten lead and is second in the NCAA. Epenesa is one of six Hawkeyes with sacks. DE Parker Hesse has two, and DE Anthony Nelson, DT Matt Nelson, LB Nick Niemann, and LB Kristian Welch each have one.

NO POINTS FOR YOU

The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten and rank second in the country in scoring defense (5.0). Iowa has allowed just 10 points in the first two weeks of the season, fewer than any other team that has played at least two games. The Hawkeyes are one of just four teams to allow just one touchdown through two games.

In its last three regular season games, Iowa has outscored its opponents 82-7 in the second half (42-0 at Nebraska, 30-7 vs. Northern Illinois, 10-0 vs. Iowa State).

NO YARDS FOR YOU

Iowa leads the Big Ten and ranks fifth in the country in total defense (199.5 yards per game). Iowa is third in the Big Ten in rushing defense (62.5) and fourth passing defense (139.5). The Hawkeyes limited Iowa State to just 19 yards rushing in Week 2. It ties for the fifth fewest rushing yards allowed under Ferentz.

Iowa has allowed just 26 first downs, fewer than any other Big Ten team.



HEAD COACH KIRK FERENTZ

Kirk Ferentz (pronounced FAIR-rintz, rhymes with parents) is in his 20th season as head coach at Iowa. He is the dean of NCAA Division I football coaches and is Iowa's all-time winningest coach, surpassing Hayden Fry earlier this year. His contract runs through the 2025 season.



- Named Big Ten Coach of the Year for the fourth time in his career (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015). Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year awards.
- Guided Iowa to Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, and the Big Ten West Division title in 2015.
- Named Woody Hayes, Eddie Robinson, and Bobby Dodd Coach of the Year in 2015. Was a finalist for the Maxwell Football Club, Paul "Bear" Bryant Coach of the Year award.
- Ferentz is fifth all-time with 145 overall wins as a member of the Big Ten Conference. He has 86 Big Ten wins, which ranks sixth all-time.
- Named the 2002 Associated Press and Walter Camp National Coach of the Year and AFCA Regional Coach of the Year.
- Iowa has made two BCS bowl appearances, including a 24-14 win in the 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl, and one CFP Bowl (2016).
- Iowa has played in 10 January bowl games with four January bowl victories (2004 Outback Bowl, 2005 Capital One Bowl, 2009 Outback Bowl and 2010 FedEx Orange Bowl).
- Iowa has posted a 136-76 (.641) overall mark and a 82-54 (.603) Big Ten record since 2001. Ferentz has placed in the top one-half of the conference 12 times, including Big Ten titles in 2002 and 2004, a second-place finish in 2009, and a West Division title in 2015.
- At Iowa, Ferentz holds an overall record of 145-97 (.599) and an 86-68 (.558) mark in Big Ten games. He is Iowa's all-time winningest football coach with 145 wins. In 22 seasons as a college head coach, he holds a career mark of 157-118 (.560).
- The only Division I head coach to coach three sons at the same college. Brian, an assistant coach since 2012 and Iowa's offensive coordinator, was a Hawkeye letterman from 2003-05. James was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line before graduating in May, 2013. Steven was a senior offensive lineman in 2016.

FERENTZ BECOMES IOWA'S ALL-TIME WINNINGEST COACH, MOVES UP BIG TEN CHARTS

Head coach Kirk Ferentz (145-97) became Iowa's all-time winningest coach on Sept. 1, 2018. The Hawkeyes defeated Northern Illinois, 33-7. It was Ferentz's 144th win as Iowa's head coach, one more than his predecessor, Hayden Fry (143-89-6). Fry coached Iowa for 20 years (1979-98). Ferentz is in his 20th season.

Ferentz's 145 wins in all games coached as a member of the Big Ten Conference rank fifth in league history. Iowa has at least eight wins in three straight seasons and owns a 29-12 mark from 2015-17.

Ferentz has 86 Big Ten wins as Iowa's head coach. The 86 conference wins rank sixth among the conference's all-time winningest coaches in Big Ten games.

Both Ferentz (145, 86) and Fry (143, 96) rank in the top six in overall wins and Big Ten wins. Only Iowa and Michigan have two coaches ranked in the top 10 of both win categories (Bo Schembechler 194, 143; and Lloyd Carr 122, 81).

Iowa is the only school in the country to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

FERENTZ TOPS IN LONGEVITY

Kirk Ferentz is in his 20th season as Iowa's head football coach. He is the longest tenured active head coach in college football. Ferentz was named Iowa head coach on Dec. 2, 1998. Gary Patterson of TCU is No. 2 in coaching tenure. Patterson's first year with the Horned Frogs was 2001. Among Big Ten coaches, only Pat Fitzgerald (2006) and Mark Dantonio (2007) have been at their current schools for 10 seasons or more. Iowa is the only school to have just two head football coaches since 1979.

Defensive coordinator Phil Parker and strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle are also in their 20th seasons on Iowa's staff. Defensive line coach Reese Morgan joined the staff in 1999 and is in his 19th season. Quarterbacks coach Ken O'Keefe was on Ferentz's original coaching staff before he left for the NFL following the 2011 season. He returned to Iowa in 2017 to coach Iowa's quarterbacks.

Ferentz is the only Division I coach to coach three sons. Brian Ferentz, a former Hawkeye letterman and captain (2003-05), is in his seventh season on Iowa's coaching staff. James Ferentz was a three-year starter on the Hawkeye offensive line and a team captain before graduating in 2013. Steven was an offensive lineman and letterwinner in 2015 and 2016.

FILLING HOLES IN TAKEAWAYS

Iowa had one interception in its 33-7 win against Northern Illinois Week 1 (Amani Hooker). The Hawkeyes led the nation with 21 interceptions in 2017. The Hawkeyes return nine of the 21 thefts, led by safeties Jake Gervase (3) and Hooker (2). Returners DE Parker Hesse, S Geno Stone, LB Kristian Welch, and DL Brady Reiff also recorded interceptions last season. Iowa lost the nation's leader in interceptions, Josh Jackson (8), and Big Ten Defensive Player of the Year, Josey Jewell (2), to the NFL. Both players were consensus All-Americans.

Iowa has at least one interception return for a touchdown in each of the last 10 seasons, and 15 of the last 17 seasons.

BIG TEN PERFECTION

University of Iowa head coach Kirk Ferentz has twice navigated the Big Ten regular season schedule with an undefeated record. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2002 and shared the Big Ten championship with Ohio State. The Hawkeyes were 8-0 in 2015, winning the Big Ten West Division title. Since 1954, when the conference schedule expanded to seven games, only six Big Ten coaches, including Ferentz, have multiple undefeated Big Ten seasons.

FOSTER INHERITS FRESH LEGS

Running backs coach Derrick Foster is in his first season on Iowa's staff in charge of a position group that graduated 75 percent of its rushing yards in 2017, and entered 2018 with one combined career start (Toren Young).

RB Ivory Kelly-Martin made his first career-start and had a team and career-high 16 carries for 62 yards and one touchdown in Week 1. He missed Week 2 with an injury.

Young got the start Week 2, the second of his career, and rushed for a team and game-high 68 yards on a career-high 21 carries.

Sargent rushed 12 times Week 1, and 11 times Week 2. He has 23 carries for 65 yards. Both totals rank second on the team behind Young (29-152).

The committee has combined for three rushing touchdowns, one each by Kelly-Martin (2), Sargent (2), and Young (6).

The Hawkeye do not have a junior or senior among the position group. Sophomores Kelly-Martin, Sargent, and Young are the elder statesmen of the group. Henry Geil is a true freshman (5 carries, 13 yards).

Iowa graduated running backs Akrum Wadley (1,109 yards) and James Butler (396 yards) in 2017. The duo combined for 1,505 rushing yards in 2017.

IN THE RANKINGS

Two of Iowa's 2018 opponents are ranked in the top 10 of the AP preseason poll. The Hawkeyes host No. 6 Wisconsin Sept. 22, and travel to No. 11 Penn State Oct. 27.

THE SERIES

Iowa leads the all-time series 16-1. Ten of the 14 meetings occurred before 1915. The Hawkeyes hold a perfect 16-0 advantage in games played in Iowa City. UNI's only victory came in 1898 at Cedar Falls (11-5) in the first meeting between the two teams. The team's last met in the 2014 season-opener, a 31-23 Iowa victory. The 23 points scored by UNI marked the most points the Panthers have scored against Iowa. The Hawkeyes average 36.1 points per game in the series. Here are the results:

LAST MEETING – Aug. 30, 2014 (Iowa City, Iowa)

Iowa posted a 31-23 victory over Northern Iowa in Kinnick Stadium in the 2014 season opener.

The Hawkeyes rushed 36 times for 151 yards and totaled 250 yards passing. QB Jake Rudock completed 31 of his 41 pass attempts to 13 different targets. Seven Hawkeyes accounted for the 151 yards rushing, led by WR Tevaun Smith's 35 yards.

Defensively, the Hawkeyes amassed nine tackles for loss, including five sacks, and held the Panthers to 25 yards rushing on 25 carries (1.0 average).

Iowa scored first on a LeShun Daniels, Jr. 13-yard scoring run to cap a 41-yard drive on its opening possession. The opening drive was set up by a 50-yard return on the opening kick by RB Mark Weisman.

UNI answered with 10-straight points to take a 10-7 advantage. Michael Schmadeke converted a 36-yard field goal, followed by a Kevin Vereen 23-yard TD reception. Weisman crossed the goal line from 1-yard out to reclaim the lead with 5:03 left in the second quarter.

The teams exchanged field goals before the end of the half.

Iowa stretched its lead to 24-13 on a 6-yard scoring strike from Rudock to Smith with 10:13 left in the third period.

UNI answered with a 70-yard pass play from QB Sawyer Kollmorgen to RB David Johnson. Schmadeke's third field goal trimmed the Hawkeye advantage to 24-23 with 12:42 left in the fourth quarter.

WR Damond Powell caught a 12-yard touchdown pass from Rudock to stretch Iowa's lead to eight points.

WR Kevonte Martin-Manley caught a game-high eight passes for 62 yards, while TE Jake Duzey caught a personal-best seven passes for 34 yards.

DT Louis Trinca-Pasat recorded career bests in tackles (10), tackles for loss (3) and sacks (1.5). DB Jordan Lomax also posted a career high in tackles (9). LB Bo Bower and CB Greg Mabin each had their first career interception.

NEW FACES IN THE CROWD

In the first two games of the season, five different Hawkeye linebackers have made their first career starts.

Week 1 starting linebackers Amani Jones, Kristian Welch, and Nick Niemann started for the first time in their careers in Iowa's 33-7 win over Northern Illinois.

Niemann started Week 2 alongside Jack Hockaday and Djimon Colbert in Iowa's 13-3 win over Iowa State.

The 2018 season is the first in Kirk Ferentz's 20 years that the Hawkeyes opened the season without a linebacker with a single career start.

The five linebackers entered the season with a combined 40 career tackles, 832 fewer career tackles than Iowa's three starting linebackers in 2017 (Josey Jewell 437; Bo Bower, 234; Ben Niemann, 201).

The last time Ferentz had this little starting experience at the linebacker position was in 2014. That year, Quinton Alston, Bo Bower, and Reggie Spearman were Iowa's starting linebackers in the season opener. Only Alston had a previous career start (2012 at Michigan).

In Ferentz's first season in 1999, the opening day starting linebackers -- LeVar Woods, Aaron Kampman, and Derrick Davison -- had two career starts combined. Both starts belonged to Kampman, who started the final two games in 1998. **TIGERHAWK ADDED TO**

WATER TOWER

For the second time in as many years, a Tigerhawk has found a home at Kinnick Stadium. In June 2018, a Tigerhawk logo and block IOWA lettering were added to the water tower that sits outside the northeast corner of Kinnick Stadium.

The Tigerhawk faces southwest, overlooking Kinnick Stadium, and stretches 24 feet wide and measures 15 feet, 5.75 inches in height. The block IOWA lettering is on the northwest side of the water tower and measures 24 feet by 9 1/8 feet. The height of the water tower tank is 70 feet.

The images were added one year after a Tigerhawk logo was placed at midfield at Kinnick Stadium.

YOUR ATTENTION PLEASE

TE Noah Fant has 13 career touchdown receptions, tying Quinn Early and Mike Flagg for 10th all-time in program history. The 13 touchdowns receptions tie Flagg for most by a tight end in program history.

Twelve of Fant's touchdown receptions have come from QB Nate Stanley over the Hawkeyes' last 15 games. His first career touchdown reception came from QB C.J. Beathard (5 yards, at Purdue on Oct. 15, 2016).

His 13 career touchdowns have come from near and far, listed in chronological order: 5, 2, 27, 23, 7, 45, 25, 3, 6, 4, 69, 8, 1.

Fant was one of 10 conference players named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors List. He had 30 receptions last season, including a team-high 11 touchdowns, tied for most in the country among FBS tight ends and the most by a Hawkeye since Marvin McNutt caught 12 touchdown passes in 2012. Fant led Iowa and all FBS tight ends with 16.5 yards per catch in 2017.

IOWA LEADERSHIP GROUP

The University of Iowa football program has 12 players among its 2018 Leadership Group. The group includes six seniors, five juniors, and one sophomore. The Leadership Group votes on the weekly game day captains, is involved in team decision-making throughout the season, and provides feedback to the head coach. Players were selected by team vote.

The group consists of seniors WR Nick Easley, DB Jake Gervase, DE Parker Hesse, LB Aaron Mends, DL Matt Nelson, and OL Keegan Renders, juniors DB Amani Hooker, LB Amani Jones, DL Anthony Nelson, FB Brady Ross, and QB Nate Stanley, and sophomore RB Toren Young.

BIG TEN BOWL GAMES SINCE 2001

The Hawkeyes have been bowl eligible 16 times in the last 17 seasons. Iowa has posted a 7-8 bowl record under head coach Kirk Ferentz, most recently defeating Boston College, 27-20, at the 2017 Pinstripe Bowl. Since the 2001 season, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have won more bowl games (including the FBS championship game), than Iowa. BACK ON CAMPUS

Four former players are on the University of Iowa football staff in 2018. Brian Ferentz, a three-year letterman from 2003-05, is in his seventh year on staff, his second as offensive coordinator.

LeVar Woods, a three-year letterman from 1998-2000, enters his 11th year on the Iowa staff. Woods was named Special Teams Coordinator in 2017. He coached tight ends from 2015-17 and linebackers from 2012-14. He rejoined the program as an administrative assistant in 2008.

Kelvin Bell joined the Iowa program as a defensive lineman in 2000, but had his career cut short due to injury. He returned to the program as a graduate assistant and served as director of on-campus recruiting from 2012-13, before being named recruiting coordinator and defensive assistant coach in February, 2016.

Broderick Binns, a four-year letterman from 2008-11, was named director of player development in April, 2016. Binns previously served as a graduate assistant in 2014 and 2015, working with Hawkeye special teams.

HAWKEYE LEGACIES

Iowa has six players on its roster whose father played for the Hawkeyes: TE Drew Cook (Marv in 1985-88), DL A.J. Epenesa (Epenesa in 1997), WR Henry Marchese (John in 1985), DE Anthony Nelson and DE Nathan Nelson (Jeff in 1990-92), and QB Ryan Schmidt (Rick 1984-85).

Iowa has four sets of the brothers on the team: DL Jack Kallenberger and OL Mark Kallenberger, DL Anthony Nelson and DL Nathan Nelson, OL Landan Paulsen and OL Levi Paulsen, and TE Ben Subbert and LS Jackson Subbert.

Iowa has two players whose brothers played at Iowa: LB Nick Niemann (Ben in 2014-17) and DL Brady Reiff (Riley in 2008-11). Both older brothers are currently playing in the NFL.

LS Austin Spiewak is the grandson of Gary Grouwinkel, who played for Iowa in the 1957 and 1959 Rose Bowl Games.

OL Trey Winters is the son of James Winters, a former All-Big Ten basketball player who led the Hawkeyes in scoring in 1994.

LB Dillon Doyle is the son of head strength and conditioning coach Chris Doyle.

IOWA IN OVERTIME

Iowa holds a 7-5 record in overtime games. Iowa won its first overtime contest, defeating Penn State 26-23 on Nov. 4, 2000, in State College, Pa. The Hawkeyes are 3-4 in single overtime, 3-0 in double overtime and 1-1 in triple overtime. Iowa is 2-2 in overtime in Kinnick Stadium and 5-3 in overtime road games. IOWA PROGRAM NOTES

- The Hawkeyes have earned bowl eligibility in 16 of the last 17 seasons.
- Iowa is the only school to have two head football coaches since 1979. Hayden Fry took over prior to the 1979 season and coached through the 1998 season, posting a record of 143-89-6. Current coach Kirk Ferentz replaced Fry and is in his 20th season. Ferentz also served as Iowa's offensive line coach from 1981-89 under Fry.
- Iowa is one of 19 teams to have played in at least 15 bowl games since 2001.
- Iowa has appeared in 15 bowl games since 2001. Among Big Ten schools, only Ohio State and Wisconsin have appeared in more (16).
- Iowa played in the Big Ten title game for the first time in program history on Dec. 5, 2015. Iowa earned Big Ten Conference championships in 2002 and 2004 and placed second in 2009. Iowa (8-0, 2002; 8-0, 2015) is one of three Big Ten teams to post a perfect mark in conference play since 1998 (BCS era), joining Michigan State (1) and Ohio State (5).
- Iowa has ranked in the top 10 in the final Associated Press and CNN/USA Today coaches polls five times since 2002, including a ranking of seventh in both polls at the conclusion of the 2009 season. Iowa ranked eighth in 2002, 2003 and 2004. The Hawkeyes finished 2015 ranked ninth in the AP poll and 10th in the USA Today Coaches Poll. In the Big Ten, only Ohio State has more top 10 finishes since 2002.
- Since 1936 when the first AP poll was released, Iowa has appeared in the poll 313 times, the fifth highest total in the Big Ten (Ohio State, Michigan, Wisconsin, and MSU). Iowa has been the top-ranked team in the country 11 times.
- Iowa set a school record with 12 wins in 2015. The Hawkeyes won 11 games in 2002 (11-2), and 2009 (11-2). In 2009, Iowa started 9-0 and won 10 regular season games for just the fourth time in school history.
- Iowa won 10 or more games in three consecutive years (2002-04) for the first time in school history.
- Kirk Ferentz has been named Big Ten Coach of the Year four times (2002, 2004, 2009, 2015) and was named National Coach of the Year in 2002 and 2015. Only Michigan's Bo Schembechler (6) has more conference coach of the year honors. Iowa's Hayden Fry and Penn State's Joe Paterno both won the award three times.
- Iowa has had nine individual national award winners under head coach Kirk Ferentz. They include Brad Banks (2002 Davey O'Brien, Top Quarterback; 2002 Associated Press National Player of the Year); Dallas Clark (2002 Mackey, Top Tight End); Nate Kaeding (2002 Groza, Top Kicker); Robert Gallery (2003 Outland, Top Lineman); Shonn Greene (2008 Doak Walker, Top Running Back); Brandon Scherff (2014 Outland, Top Lineman), Desmond King (2015 Jim Thorpe), Josey Jewell (2017 Lott IMPACT).
- Iowa's offensive line earned the Joe Moore Award in 2016, an honor bestowed upon the top offensive line unit in the country.
- Iowa's football record in the 2000 decade was 80-45 (.640), a record that ranks as the best decade in Iowa football history, based on total wins. Iowa posted a record of 77-40-4 (.652) during the 1980's and the Hawkeyes were 62-53-2 (.538) in the 1990's. Iowa is 64-42 (.604) since 2010.

IOWA FOOTBALL AND THE NFL

- The Hawkeyes have had 170 former players in the NFL since 1999, Kirk Ferentz’s first year as head coach (66 draft picks/104 free agents).
- At least one Iowa Hawkeye has been selected in every NFL Draft since 1978. Iowa’s streak of 41 consecutive years with at least one selection ties as the seventh longest among all programs.
- DB Micah Hyde (Buffalo), DL Mike Daniels (Green Bay), and OL Brandon Scherff (Washington) were named to the 2018 NFL Pro Bowl.
- Over the past 16 years, 143-of-165 (89 percent) of Iowa’s senior starters have been drafted in the NFL or signed NFL free agent contracts.
- Over the past 11 years, Iowa has had 40 NFL Draft picks, tied for third most in the Big Ten -- Ohio State (63), Wisconsin (41), and Michigan (40). Since 2010, Iowa has had 33 players drafted in the NFL, tied for second most in the Big Ten – Ohio State (53), Penn State (33), and Wisconsin (33).
- Iowa has had four first round picks in the last nine NFL drafts -- OL Bryan Bulaga, 2010; DE Adrian Clayborn, 2011; OL Riley Reiff, 2012; OL Brandon Scherff, 2015.
- Iowa had six players drafted in the 2012 NFL Draft, which tied for the most in the Big Ten and tied for fourth in the country.
- Former Hawkeye Marshal Yanda (Baltimore OL) is a six-time Pro-Bowler (2011-16) and was named NFL All-Pro in 2012, 2013, 2014, 2015, and 2016.
- In NFL 2011 regular season statistics, former Hawkeye linebackers Chad Greenway (Minnesota) and Pat Angerer (Indianapolis) finished third and fourth, respectively, in tackles. Greenway was named to the Pro Bowl in 2012 and 2013.
- Three former Hawkeyes were involved in the 2012 Super Bowl. DB Tyler Sash played for the Super Bowl champion New York Giants, while LB Jeff Tarpinian was on the injured reserve roster of the New England Patriots. Former Iowa center Brian Ferentz, now is his sixth year on staff and first as Iowa’s offensive coordinator, was New England’s tight ends coach.
- Former Iowa DB Sean Considine and OL Marshal Yanda won Super Bowl rings with the 2012 Baltimore Ravens in the 2013 Super Bowl.
- Former Iowa LB James Morris (injured reserve) earned a Super Bowl ring with the New England Patriots in 2015. Former TE Tony Moeaki played for the Seattle Seahawks in the same game.
- Former center James Ferentz was a member of the 2016 Super Bowl champion Denver Broncos.
- Former DT Jonathan Babineaux played for the Atlanta Falcons in Super Bowl LI. Former DE Adrian Clayborn and former DB Charles Godfrey were on the Atlanta injured reserve roster.
- Former OL Cole Croston was on the New England Patriots roster in Super Bowl LII. Former C James Ferentz and WR Riley McCarron were on the Patriots practice squad.
- Entering the 2018 season, every Iowa senior starting tight end (12) under Kirk Ferentz has been drafted in the NFL or made an NFL team. The NFL has employed 14 Iowa tight ends since 1999 (9 drafted/5 free agents).
- All 11 members of Iowa’s starting defensive unit in 2008 were either drafted or signed to NFL free agent contracts following the draft.

ALL ABOARD TO KINNICK STADIUM!

The Hawkeye Express, the passenger train that transports fans from Coralville to Kinnick Stadium, is in its 15th season in 2018.

Adults can ride the train for \$15, round trip, while children (12-and-under) ride for free. Tickets can be purchased in advance at the UI Ticket Office or on game day (cash only on game day) at the Hawkeye Express depot located near the boarding ramp. The trip to Kinnick Stadium is approximately 10 minutes. Media credentials are accepted, as well.

Free parking is located in lots near the Comfort Suites and Coral Ridge Mall. Fans can begin boarding the train three hours prior to kickoff. Return trips begin at the start of the fourth period and run 90 minutes after the game.

The Hawkeye Express is owned by the Iowa Northern Railway Company and operates on the Iowa Interstate Railroad.

REINVENTING THE STADIUM WAVE

The University of Iowa football program received the prestigious 2017 Disney Sports Spirit Award after launching a heart-warming tradition at its home games last season that touched the lives of scores of young patients at the University's Stead Family Children's Hospital.

In a tradition that started at the 2017 season opener, fans inside Kinnick Stadium and patients and families inside the UI Stead Family Children's Hospital exchange waves at the end of the first quarter of each home game.

The UI Stead Family Children's Hospital opened in 2017. It is connected to the south end of the University of Iowa Hospitals and Clinics and overlooks Kinnick Stadium from the southeast grandstands. During Iowa football home games, patients and their families can watch the game from the top floor (Level 12), one of the highest vantage points in Iowa City.

HAWK TALK WITH KIRK FERENTZ

Head Coach Kirk Ferentz is featured on "Hawk Talk with Kirk Ferentz" each week during the regular season. The radio call-in show is hosted by Gary Dolphin, the play-by-play voice of the Iowa Hawkeyes. The show airs live each Wednesday at 6:30 p.m. from Carlos O'Kelly's in Iowa City. The first show is Aug. 29. There is no show during the Hawkeyes' by week (Wednesday, Sept. 26).

TROPHY GAMES

The Hawkeyes are 11-2 in their last 13 trophy games. Iowa has four trophy games on the schedule in 2018. Iowa defeated Iowa State, 13-3, to win the Cy-Hawk trophy for the fourth straight year. The Hawkeyes defend the Floyd of Rosedale trophy at Minnesota on Oct. 6, and the Heroes Trophy on Nov. 23 against Nebraska at Kinnick Stadium. Iowa will try to regain possession of the Heartland Trophy against Wisconsin on Sept. 22 at Kinnick Stadium.

GAME RECAP

Iowa scored the game's first 33 points en route to a 33-7 season opening victory over Northern Illinois inside Kinnick Stadium. The win was a historic one for Kirk Ferentz as the head coach, as he surpassed Hayden Fry as the program's all-time winningest coach with 144 career wins.

The Hawkeyes, leading 3-0 at halftime, broke the game open in the second half, scoring touchdowns on four of their six drives while also registering a defensive safety in the fourth quarter.

Three of Iowa's four touchdowns came on the ground, while QB Nate Stanley connected with TE Noah Fant for a 1-yard score for the game's first touchdown midway through the third quarter. Running backs Ivory Kelly-Martin (two yards) and Toren Young (six yards), and QB Peyton Mansell (one yard) accounted for Iowa's rushing touchdowns.

Young (84 yards), Kelly-Martin (62 yards), and Mekhi Sargent (40 yards) combined for 186 rushing yards. Stanley and Mansell combined to complete 13-of-25 passes for 143 yards, with eight of the 13 targets (104 yards) going to tight ends. T.J. Hockenson caught a team-best four balls for 64 yards, Fant had three receptions for 10 yards, while Nate Wieting had one catch for 30 yards.

Iowa's defense amassed eight tackles for loss, including five sacks, and two takeaways (one interception and one fumble recovery). Defensive end Parker Hesse equaled a career best with two sacks. All three Iowa linebackers started their first game, with each registering career bests in tackles: Kristian Welch (11), Amani Jones (6), and Nick Niemann (4). The Hawkeyes limited the Huskies to 65 second-half yards, with 64 of the yards gained coming on NIU's final drive of the game.

On special teams, punter Colten Rastetter averaged 53.8 yards on four punts, including a personal-best 69-yard punt, and Miguel Recinos made all four PAT's and his only field goal attempt (33 yards).

Iowa started an all-Iowa native offensive and defensive line (nine players), marking the first time under Ferentz that four Iowa natives started on the defensive line and the first time since 2016 (week 3) that five Iowa natives started on the offensive line.

GAME RECAP

Iowa retained possession of the Cy-Hawk Trophy as a result of a 13-3 win over Iowa State at a sold out Kinnick Stadium. The victory was the Hawkeyes' fourth straight in the series, their longest streak over their in-state rivals since winning 15 in a row from 1983-87.

After allowing a field goal on Iowa State's opening drive, Iowa's defense yielded only 122 total yards and no points on the Cyclones' remaining 10 possessions.

Iowa placekicker Miguel Recinos connected on field goals of 31 and 48 yards in the second and third quarters, respectively, to give the Hawkeyes a narrow 6-3 margin going into the fourth quarter. The 48-yard kick matched a career long for Recinos.

In the Hawkeyes' first possession of the fourth quarter, Iowa QB Nate Stanley threw a strike to WR Brandon Smith for 30 yards to the Iowa State 2-yard line, which led to a Mekhi Sargent 2-yard touchdown on the next play. It was the game's only touchdown. The scoring drive covered 83 yards in 13 plays, with Iowa converting three third downs on the touchdown drive.

Iowa allowed only 19 rushing yards on 25 attempts, which ties for the fifth fewest single-game total allowed in the Kirk Ferentz era. Iowa State's 188 total yards are its fewest in 52 games, since totaling 174 yards versus Baylor in 2013. Iowa's defense totaled four sacks, forced and recovered a fumble, and forced five three-and-outs.

Five Hawkeyes recorded career bests in tackles: DB Matt Hankins (8), LB Jack Hockaday (8), LB Nick Niemann (7), LB Djimon Colbert (5), and DE A.J. Epenesa (5). Two of Epenesa's tackles were sacks. He also forced a fumble and had one pass breakup. Epenesa's efforts earned the sophomore Big Ten co-Defensive Player of the Week accolades.

Stanley finished the contest completing 16-of-28 passes for 166 yards. RB Toren Young amassed a game-high 68 yards on a career-high 21 carries. TE T.J. Hockenson caught a game and career-best six passes for 33 yards.

Iowa State has managed just six points in its last two trips to Kinnick Stadium (one field goal in 2016 and one field goal in 2018).
