THE SETTING

The lowa Hawkeyes (18-8, 11-4) travel to Columbus, OH, to face #20 Ohio State (19-6, 10-4) Thursday. Tip-off is scheduled for 6:05 p.m. (CST) at Value City Arena. Thursday will be Iowa's second first-place showdown in as many weeks and third-straight game against an upper division conference opponent. The Hawkeyes have won nine of its last 10, while the Buckeyes have won three of their last four. Iowa has defeated every Big Ten team at least once this season except Ohio State.

ON THE RADIO

Brent Balbinot and Shelley Till will call Thursday night's game for the Hawkeye Radio Network. Hawkeye fans can listen to the contest on WHO 1040-AM in Des Moines, WMT 600-AM in Cedar Rapids and KXIC 800-AM in Iowa City. Balbinot is in his fourth season as Iowa's play-by-play voice, while Till is in her third providing analysis.

IOWA HISTORY

lowa has played 964 games since beginning basketball in 1974. Overall, lowa's record is 586-378 (.608). That includes a 294-145 (.670) mark in Big Ten contests and 271-81 (.770) in Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

STREAK SNAPPED

lowa had its eight-game winning streak snapped at Purdue last Thursday night. The streak is the longest by any Big Ten team this year, besting six-game winning streaks by Ohio State and Minnesota earlier this season. The eight-game winning streak is the longest under Coach Lisa Bluder, during Big Ten play. Iowa's 2000-01 squad strung together six-straight in Bluder's first season on the sidelines.

BLUDER CAPTURES WIN NO. 500

Head Coach Lisa Bluder, the dean of Big Ten coaches captured her 500th career win last Sunday at Penn State. Bluder becomes the 35th Division I head coach to amass 500 career victories.

ALL-TIME SERIES

Thursday will be the 49th meeting between Iowa and Ohio State, with the series tied 24-24. Ohio State owns a 15-7 edge in games played at Columbus. The Buckeyes have won all seven meetings against the Hawkeyes in Value City Arena.

The Buckeyes have won the last nine in the series and 10 of the last 11. Ohio State defeated the Hawkeyes (73-65) in Iowa City earlier this season. Iowa's last victory over Ohio State came on Jan. 20, 2002, in Iowa City, when the Hawkeyes won 70-65.

SCOUTING OHIO STATE

Ohio State is the only Big Ten team ranked in both major polls. The Buckeyes rank 22nd in the ESPN/ USA Today poll and 20th by the Associated Press.

The Buckeyes avenged their one-point (68-67) loss at Purdue on Feb. 7 with a 72-56 triumph over the Boilermakers Monday night at Value City Arena. All five Buckeye starters reached double figures. Senior Marscilla Packer led all scorers with 18 points. Freshman Jantel Lavender contributed 13 points and posted game highs in rebounds (9) and assists (6). The Buckeyes out-rebounded Purdue by 11 (36-25) and scored 40 of their 72 points in the paint.

Lavender ranks third in league scoring (17.4), second in rebounding (9.7) and third in field goal percentage (.523). Lavender, who is the second-leading freshman scorer and third-leading freshman rebounder in the country, has amassed 10 double-doubles this season, which rank third amongst Division I freshmen. Packer ranks seventh in conference scoring (14.8) and first in 3-pointers made (2.68). Ashlee Trebilcock, who scored a career-high 25 points at Iowa on Jan. 6, ranks third in team scoring (10.4) and second in triples made (1.48).

Ohio State has won 74-straight home games against non-ranked opponents. The Buckeyes have amassed a staggering 63-3 home record and a 56-2 record at Value City Arena (7-1 at St. John Arena) over the past three-plus seasons. The Buckeyes are 14-1 at home this season, with the only blemish coming vs. then-No. 24 Auburn (67-58) on Nov. 25.

The Buckeyes rank in the top three in 13 Big Ten statistical categories, including leading the conference in six categories (scoring offense, 72.1; scoring margin, +13.4; field goal percentage, .475; assists, 16.32; assist/turnover ratio, 1.04; defensive rebounding, 25.92).

Jim Foster is in his sixth season (149-38, .797) as Ohio State's head coach and 30th year (653-263, .713) as a head coach.

The Ohio State Buckeyes used inside scoring and full-court pressure to sneak out of Carver-Hawkeye Arena with a 73-65 victory on Jan. 6.

Kristi Smith had a strong performance scoring 20 points on 7-14 shooting, including 3-6 behind the arc. But it was the Buckeye's Ashlee Trebilcock who had a career-high 25 points coming on 9-14 shooting.

Ohio State came out firing using inside scoring and layups to take a 15-4 lead during the first five minutes of play. Smith single-handedly brought the Hawkeyes back scoring 10 straight points, including three free throws and a three-point basket to cut the Buckeye lead to 22-16. Smith finished the half with 17 of lowa's 29 points and shot 6-of-8 from the field.

Jenee Graham then made two free-throws to trim the lead to 22-18, the narrowest of the first half. But

2007-08 Captains

Iowa captains this season are seniors Johanna Solverson and Abby Emmert.

Ohio State continued its pressure and hot shooting to increase the lead. The Buckeyes shot 61.3-percent for the half making 19-31 from the field, ending the first half on a 24-11 run increasing their lead 46-29.

lowa used a 10-2 run during the first four minutes of the second half fueled by a 3-point basket by Smith to cut the Buckeye lead to 50-39. The Hawkeyes and the Buckeyes then traded baskets until Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore and Johanna Solverson began to heat up. Ausdemore scored all of her 10 points in the second half, including two three-pointers while Solverson chipped in six points on three lay-ins to cut the Ohio State lead to four with 3:18 to go in the game.

Ohio State then stiffened up its defense and started feeding the ball inside, resulting in Iowa fouls and made free throws for the Buckeyes as they maintained their lead.

lowa's Megan Skouby added four-straight points and Ausdemore added two more to cut the Ohio State lead to 69-65 but four-straight free-throws by Ohio State's Marscilla Packer sealed the game for the Buckeyes 73-65.

IOWA. OHIO STATE NOTES

• Thursday's game features two of the conference's top 3-point shooting threats, Iowa's Wendy Ausdemore and Ohio State's Marscilla Packer. Ausdemore ranks first in Big Ten 3-point accuracy (.444) and second in triples made (2.42), while Packer ranks first in treys made (2.68) and second in accuracy (.438).

• Iowa won a total of six conference games last season (6-10). The Hawkeyes are 11-4 after 15 games this year.

• Kristi Smith is one of only three Big Ten players to lead her team in scoring and assists (Minnesota's Emily Fox and Indiana's Jamie Braun).

• Iowa has had seven players lead the team in scoring at least once during the season (Kristi Smith, Wendy Ausdemore, Megan Skouby, Johanna Solverson, Krista VandeVenter, Stacy Schlapkohl and Lindsey Nyenhuis).

• Iowa's Johanna Solverson averaged 6.3 assists per game the last six contests. She ranks fourth in Iowa career assists (369) and is 18 dimes from tying Franthea Price for third (387).

• Iowa has three players average double figures vs. Ohio State in their career: Megan Skouby (14.0), Kristi Smith (13.0) and Johanna Solverson (10.6). Smith also averages 4.6 assists against the Buckeyes.

• Megan Skouby is the only Hawkeye that hails from Ohio (Mentor). In fact, her grandfather played basketball for the Buckeyes. Shante Jones (Dayton) will join the Hawkeye roster next fall.

· Iowa boasts an 12-3 record in home games, including 7-1 in Big Ten play.

• The Hawkeyes have defeated every Big Ten team at least once this season, except Ohio State.

• Iowa is 18-2 when scoring 60 points or more and 16-1 when having a higher field goal percentage than the opposition.

· Iowa has held 12 opponents to 58 points or less this season (10-2).

• Kristi Smith has netted 15 points, or more, a team-best 10 times this year. She has topped 20 points three times this season.

• Iowa has begun playing its final 10 regular season games, a stat the NCAA Committee looks at when determining at-large berths for the NCAA Championship. The Hawkeyes are 6-1 in this final stretch.

• Iowa has two wins over top-40 RPI rated teams (Minnesota, 28 and Purdue, 36). Iowa ranks 43rd in the latest ratings, while Minnesota is 28th. The Golden Gophers have played the 25th-best strength of schedule in the country, while the Hawkeyes have played the 48th toughest schedule.

• Iowa is 118-15 when leading at the half in eight years under Coach Bluder. The Hawkeyes have led at half in 12 of their 15 conference games this year. Iowa is 99-20 when holding opponents to 69 points or less, including a 44-4 mark when opponents score 59 points or less.

• Kristi Smith collected seven assists four times this year (Dartmouth, Mississippi State, Western Illinois and Minnesota). Johanna Solverson has led the team in assists a team-best 12 times, including eight of the last nine games.

 Iowa played five non-conference games against teams from a major conference: SEC (Mississippi State), Pac-10 (Arizona State), ACC (Georgia Tech), Big XII (Iowa State) and MWC (Wyoming).

Head Coach Lisa Bluder

Lisa Bluder (pronounced BLUE-dir) is in her eighth season as head coach at the University of lowa and her 24th season as a college head coach. Bluder, 46, has a career record of 501-237 (.679), including a 145-95 (.604) record at lowa, a 187-106 (.638) record in 10 seasons (1990-2000) at Drake and a six-year mark (1984-90) of 169-36 (.824) at St. Ambrose. Bluder is lowa's second all-time winningest coach and trails only C. Vivian Stringer. She has guided the Hawkeyes to six post-season



tournaments (4 NCAA, 2 WNIT) and four upper-division finishes in the Big Ten Conference.

In her first season with the Hawkeyes, Bluder transformed a struggling program into a 21-game winner. Iowa finished second in the Big Ten, won the conference tournament and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament. Bluder became Iowa's third coach to be named Big Ten Coach of the Year. She was also honored as the College Coach of the Year by the *Women's Basketball News Service* and was named the WBCA District 6 Coach of the Year. Iowa's 2001-02 squad finished fourth in the Big Ten and advanced to the second round of the NCAA Tournament for the second consecutive year. In 2003, Bluder guided the Hawkeyes to its first-ever WNIT appearance. Iowa, which had nine underclassmen on its roster, advanced to the quarterfinals before falling to Creighton. In 2004-05, Iowa finished 23-10, starting the year 13-0 and were the last Division I undefeated team standing. In 2005-06, Bluder mentored a team plagued by injuries to a fifth-place Big Ten finish and an NCAA Tournament berth.

In her 10 years at Drake, Bluder brought great success and tradition to the Bulldog program and established herself as one of the top coaches in the country. She led Drake to five 20-plus win seasons in the last six years, including five post-season appearances. She guided the Bulldogs to eight Missouri Valley Conference Tournament appearances, reaching the semifinals six times and winning the tournament four times. Bluder was also named the Conference Coach of the Year three times as Drake.

Bluder began her coaching career at St. Ambrose, where she coached six successful seasons building the Bees into a NAIA powerhouse. During her tenure at St. Ambrose, Bluder guided the Bees to four straight national tournaments, including two consecutive Final Four appearances. The 1990 St. Ambrose team was ranked No. 1 and Bluder was named the NAIA Converse Coach of the Year.

A graduate of Linn-Mar High School in Marion, IA, Bluder was a three-year starter at Northern Iowa. She graduated from UNI in 1983 with a bachelor's degree in marketing.

Bluder and her husband David have two daughters, Hannah (10) and Emma (7) and one son, David (5).

IOWA ALONE IN FIRST

Iowa (11-4) is a half game ahead of Ohio State (10-4) in the Big Ten standings. This is the latest, in a single-season, the Hawkeyes have been in first place under Coach Bluder. The last time Iowa was in first place this late in the season was 1998, when the Black and Gold last won a regular season title. Below are the Big Ten leaders' final stretch of games:

lowa made seven of its first eight 3-point attempts en route to a 72-69 triumph over Minnesota Sunday on "Think Pink Day" at Carver-Hawkeye Arena.

The Hawkeyes led by as many as 15 points in the first half and led by 10 at intermission. The Gophers mounted a comeback and took their first lead of the game (58-57) with 6:14 remaining. The last six minutes featured three ties and four lead changes. Hawkeye senior, and Minnesota native, Krista VandeVenter scored four of her six points in the final three minutes to help propel lowa to victory.

Wendy Ausdemore and Johanna Solverson combined for 42 of Iowa's 72 points. Ausdemore led all scorers with 22 points, while Solverson contributed 20 points and a team-high six assists. Ausdemore drained 6-10 (.600) from 3-point range, including 5-7 (.714) in the first half. Wendy Ausdemore and Krista VandeVenter were named to the 2008 *ESPN The Magazine* Academic all-District third team, Feb. 7.

Ausdemore boasts a 3.67 cumulative GPA and is majoring in business. The junior ranks second in team scoring (11.4), second in Big Ten 3-point field goal percentage (.432) and second in 3-pointers made (2.28). Ausdemore, who was recognized on the all-district second team a year ago, ranks third in lowa career 3-pointers (139). The native of Neola, IA, has netted double figures in 18 of Iowa's 25 games this season, including the last eight.

VandeVenter has a 3.52 cumulative GPA and is majoring in integrative physiology. The senior has started 104 of 110 career games, averaging 7.3 points and 6.9 rebounds. She ranks seventh in Iowa career rebounding (757).

Iowa and Minnesota were the only Big Ten teams with at least two student-athletes honored.

CLEANING THE GLASS

Since Big Ten Conference play began, Iowa ranks second in rebounds allowed (33.7) and rebounding margin (+3.7), third in rebounding (37.3) and fourth in offensive rebounding (13.07).

lowa boasted a +7.6 rebounding margin in its last five victories. Iowa boasted a +18 rebounding edge (49-34) at Northwestern, +18 (44-26) vs. Indiana, +13 (43-30) vs. Michigan State and +5 (29-24) at Penn State. The Hawkeyes out-rebounded seven opponents the eight-game winning streak. Iowa was outrebounded by five (38-33) in its loss at Purdue and by 13 in a victory over Minnesota (45-32).

lowa's leading rebounders are Jenee Graham and Krista VandeVenter, both averaging five rebounds per contest. In fact, Iowa has four players (Graham, VandeVenter, Wendy Ausdemore and Johanna Solverson) who average better than 4.1 boards per contest.

IMPROVED DEFENSE

Last season lowa ranked last in Big Ten scoring defense (71.7) and field goal percentage defense (.447). Through 26 games this year, lowa ranks first in conference field goal percentage defense (.379) and 3-point field goal percentage defense (.295) and fourth in scoring defense (59.7).

SMITH AND SOLVERSON'S NUMBERS RISE DURING BIG TEN PLAY

Point guard Kristi Smith and small forward Johanna Solverson's numbers have improved since conference play.

Smith averaged 11 points and 3.2 assists in Iowa's 11 non-conference games. In 15 Big Ten games, she is averaging 14.5 points and 3.1 assists. Furthermore, she is averaging 14.8 points and 3.2 assists the last 13 games.

Solverson, a team co-captain, averaged 5.8 points and 1.8 assists during non-league play and 11.9 points and 4.3 assists during conference action. In Iowa's last 13 games, she averaged 12.2 points, 5.4 rebounds and 4.5 assists. She is Iowa's assists leader during conference play.

lowa has been very accurate shooting the ball behind the arc this season. The Hawkeyes rank third in the Big Ten, shooting 38.5 percent (153-397) from 3-point range. Three Hawkeyes have combined for 132 of their 153 triples (Wendy Ausdemore, 63; Kristi Smith, 39; Johanna Solverson, 32). Iowa has shot 40 percent or better from 3-point range 12 times this year, including a season-best 62.5 percent (10-16) against Northern Illinois. Iowa was 10-20 (.500) vs. Indiana and 10-18 (.556) vs. Minnesota. Last season, Iowa ranked third nationally in 3-point shooting percentage (157-391, .402).

Ausdemore ranks second in 3-pointers made by an Iowa junior (63). Lindsey Meder ranks first for Hawkeye juniors with 68, established during the 2000-01 season. Ausdemore's 3-point percentage (.444) ranks 18th in the country. She has attempted the fifth-most triples amongst the nation's leaders.

Johanna Solverson was named co-Player of the Week with Purdue's Fah-Kara Malone on Feb. 11.

Solverson took home the first weekly honor of her career after helping the Hawkeyes claim sole possession of first place in the conference with wins over Michigan State and Penn State.

The sixth-year senior netted her 1,000th career point with 18 against the Spartans, also adding a season-high eight assists. Against the Lady Lions, the forward scored 16 points, including Iowa's first seven, and also pulled down a game-high seven rebounds in just 24 minutes on the court. For the week, Solverson averaged 17 points, 6.5 rebounds and six assists per game while shooting .609 from the floor and .500 from 3-point territory.

The native of Lake Zurich, IL, is one of only two Hawkeyes to ever amass over 1,000 career points, 500 rebounds, 350 assists and 175 steals (Franthea Price).

Iowa's 13-person roster also features players from Colorado (Kristi Smith), Kansas (JoAnn Hamlin), Michigan (Lindsey Nyenhuis) and Ohio (Megan Skouby).

HAWKEYES PEN FIVE TO NATIONAL LETTER OF INTENT

Hannah Draxten, Shante Jones, Kelly Krei, Tia Mays and Kamille Wahlin have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa.

"This is a large balanced class that covers every position," said Head Coach Lisa Bluder.

Draxten, a 6-0 wing player, has been a varsity starter since eighth grade, starting in 104 consecutive games for Fergus Falls High School in Minnesota. She has been the team's leading scorer all four years. A two-year team captain, Draxten holds the all-time Fergus Falls High School records (boys and girls) for scoring (1,830) and rebounding (755). She has averaged 17.6 points and 7.3 rebounds over her career. Draxten is a two-time Class 3A first team all-state and all-conference honoree.

Wahlin, a native of Crookston, MN, is a 5-8 left-handed point guard who averaged 19.9 points for her Crookston High School basketball team that went 24-3 a year ago. A third-year captain, she boasts career averages of 16.5 ppg, 4.8 apg and 3.0 spg. Wahlin established school records in scoring, assists, steals and field goals. Her team finished second in the Minnesota state tournament her sophomore campaign, where she was recognized on the all-tournament squad. She was tabbed Minnesota Coaches Association All-State and was her team's MVP the last two seasons. Wahlin sank 47 consecutive free throws last year. Wahlin played on the same AAU team (North Tartan Larson) as Draxten last summer.

Krei, a native of Iowa City, has averaged 17.9 points, 8.5 rebounds, 2.5 steals and 2.1 assists the last three years for City High. A two-time captain, she was a first team all-state honoree her freshman and junior years and was a second team selection as a sophomore. Krei is a three-time first team all-conference, all-district and all-area honoree. The 6-2 forward was named the 2007 Mississippi Valley Conference Player of the Year in basketball and track.

Mays, a native of Des Moines, is a four-year starter for Des Moines East High School. She was a pre-season *Street & Smith's* honorable mention all-American in 2006. Last season as a junior, she was an all-state, all-conference and all-district performer. A second-year captain, she helped lead her team to a school-best 19-5 record and a berth to the Girls State Tournament. A 6-1 forward, she led the Lady Scarlets in points (15 ppg), rebounds (10 rpg), blocks (4 bpg) and field goal percentage (63%).

Jones is a 5-9 guard/forward from Dayton, OH. Jones played her first two years at Stivers School for the Arts and competed for Carroll High School last season. She averaged 17.8 points her junior year and was tabbed first team all-league and second team all-conference, all-district and all-southwest. Jones was named MVP of Carroll High School her junior season. She was selected first team all-league, all-conference and all-district her sophomore campaign. Jones was the highest scorer in the area her sophomore year (28.0 ppg) and named Stivers High School MVP.

SOLVERSON RETURNS FOR SIXTH SEASON

Johanna Solverson was granted a sixth year of eligibility by the NCAA after missing the last two seasons due to consecutive ACL tears in her right knee. Solverson has played with 27 different players during her six years at Iowa.

The 6-2 small forward played in all but one game her first three seasons. One of Iowa's most versatile players, she boasts a career average of 8.7 points, 4.4 rebounds, 3.1 assists and 1.6 steals in 120 games.

Solverson is only the second lowa women's basketball player to receive a sixth year from the NCAA. Simone Edwards (1993-97) received a sixth year after suffering two season-ending knee injuries. Edwards played two full seasons and a partial third with the Hawkeyes after transferring to lowa from Seminole Junior College.

The UI has been selected by the NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Committee to serve as one of 16 first and second round hosts for the 2009 NCAA Division I Women's Basketball Championship. "We are thrilled to have the opportunity to host the first and second rounds of the NCAA Championship in 2009," said Iowa Head Coach Lisa Bluder. "It has been a long time since Iowa has hosted the NCAA Championship and we are excited to bring the competition and atmosphere back to Carver Hawkeye Arena!"

The UI first hosted a NCAA Championship site in 1986. Carver-Hawkeye Arena has hosted NCAA Women's Championship games 11 years (1986-90, 92-94, 96-98). The last time lowa City hosted a first and second round site was in 1998.
