The series continues Saturday afternoon (May 2) at 4:30 p.m. That game will be televised on the Big Ten Network with **Matt Shepard** and **Danan Hughes** on the call. The series concludes Sunday afternoon (May 3) at 1 p.m. Michigan is coming off taking 2-of-3 games at Minnesota last weekend.

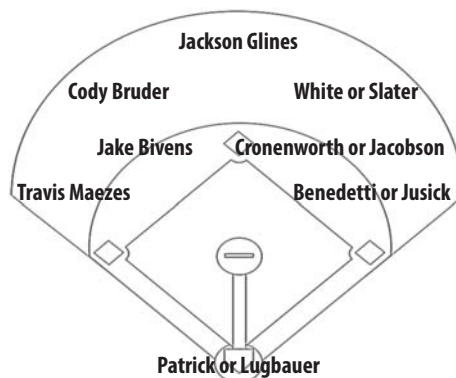
PITCHING STAFF FANS GOPHER HITTERS -- The Michigan pitching staff struck out 38 batters in the three-game series at Minnesota (April 25-26). Sophomore **Brett Adcock** had 11 strikeouts in eight innings of work on Sunday. Juniors **Jacob Cronenworth** and **Evan Hill** combined to strike out 14 Gophers in the first game of Saturday's doubleheader. Freshman **Ryan Nutof** had six strikeouts in 5.1 innings while classmate **Bryan Pall** had four punchouts in 1.2 innings in the doubleheader nightcap. Michigan now has 350 strikeouts on the season, which is third in the Big Ten.

The 2015 Big Ten Baseball Tournament will be held May 19-24 at Target Field in Minneapolis, Minn. The tournament bracket is set to be announced on the evening of Saturday, May 16, which is the final scheduled day of regular-season competition.

WOLVERINE NOTES

SCOUTING IOWA -- The Hawkeyes (31-11, 13-2 Big Ten) are coming off a 4-3, 18-inning win over Sacramento State on Tuesday (April 28). John Barrett had the game-winning RBI with a sacrifice fly in the bottom of the 18th. Tyler Peyton leads Iowa with a .354 batting average while Jake Mangler has 31 RBI. On the mound, the Hawkeyes have a team 2.70 ERA with Calvin Mathews sporting a 1.98 ERA and Peyton adding 55 strikeouts.

BIG TEN LEADERS -- The Wolverines lead the Big Ten in batting average (.301), on-base percentage (.386) and hits (454) and are tied for the lead in doubles (94) heading into this weekend's games. On the mound, U-M is seventh in ERA (3.48) and is third in strikeouts (350). Senior **Jackson Glines** and sophomore **Carmen Benedetti** are 1-4 in the league in batting average. Glines is hitting .380 while Benedetti is at .364. Junior **Jacob Cronenworth** leads the league in hits (62) and is tied for second in runs scored with 46. Benedetti leads the Big Ten with 45 RBI while Glines has a conference-best .473 on-base percentage. Sophomore **Brett Adcock** is third in strikeouts (64).

BIVENS NAMED BIG FROSH OF THE WEEK

-- Freshman infielder **Jake Bivens** was named the Big Ten Freshman of the Week on April 27. Bivens hit .462 with a pair of game-winning runs batted in last week as the Maize and Blue went 3-1, including a series win at Minnesota. The Battle Creek, Michigan, native excelled Sunday (April 26), going 4-for-4 with two runs scored, two RBI, two stolen bases and a sacrifice fly. His run-scoring single in the seventh broke a 3-3 tie. Bivens also had two hits, drove in the game-winning run with a squeeze bunt, and scored a run in the 4-2 win Saturday (April 25). In the 10-4 win over Oakland on Tuesday (April 21), he drove in a run and scored twice.

CRONENWORTH HAVING A BLAST

-- Junior **Jacob Cronenworth** belted Michigan's team leading fifth home run, a shot to straightaway centerfield, in the second inning of U-M's 7-0 win over Purdue on April 18. It was part of a 4-for-5 day as he scored three runs and drove in a pair. Cronenworth also struck out seven in the series opener, a 9-3 win for the Maize and Blue.

GLINES WEARING OUT WALLS

-- Senior **Jackson Glines** has 16 extra-base hits this season with five of those (four doubles and a triple) coming in the weekend series against Purdue (April 17-18). He was 3-for-4 with a double and a triple in the 7-0 win in game one on Saturday. He then had a pair of doubles in the 7-5 win in Saturday's nightcap. Glines is hitting .380 on the season, which leads the Big Ten.

NUTOF GETS CAREER HIGH IN PURDUE SHUTOUT

-- Freshman **Ryan Nutof** pitched a career-high 7.2 innings and allowed just two hits and no runs with five strikeouts and two walks in a 7-0 win over Purdue on April 18. At one point, Nutof retired 13 Boilermakers in a row and allowed just two runners to reach second base. Nutof has pitched into the eighth inning in both home games he has pitched this season. Nutof was named the co-Freshman of the Week for the second time this season after that outing.

MAEZES RETURNS FROM INJURY WITH A VENGEANCE

-- Junior **Travis Maezes** is hitting

.358 (24-for-67) with 13 runs scored, six doubles and 14 RBI since returning from injury on April 1. He was 3-for-4 with four RBI and a run scored in Michigan's 8-3 win over Penn State on April 12. On the year, Maezes is hitting .337 with eight doubles and 24 RBI in 31 games played.

BENEDETTI EXCELS IN INDIANA SERIES

-- Sophomore **Carmen Benedetti** belted a pair of home runs, was 7-of-13 (.538) on the weekend and had a 1.077 slugging percentage in the three-game series at Indiana on April 4-5. In addition to his prowess at the plate, Benedetti pitched two innings on the mound against the Hoosiers, striking out three and allowing a hit and an unearned run.

SLATER DRIVES IN SIX WITH PAIR OF HOME RUNS

-- Sophomore **Johnny Slater** set a career high with six RBI as he belted a pair of home runs in Michigan's 18-4 win over Eastern Michigan on Tuesday afternoon (April 7). Slater's first home run came in the sixth inning to give Michigan a 13-4 lead. His second three-run blast happened in the very next inning. Both home runs were to rightfield and his six RBI in a single game ties him for the single-game lead with Carmen Benedetti, who drove in six against Toledo on March 7.

BENEDETTI DOES IT ALL IN PURDUE FINALE

-- Sophomore **Carmen Benedetti** excelled at the plate and on the mound in Michigan's 7-5 win over Purdue on April 18. He went 3-for-5 with four RBI at the plate. Benedetti's run-scoring double in the first got the Wolverines on the board. He then doubled in the third to score **Jackson Glines**. His groundout in the fifth scored a run and a double in the seventh scored **Travis Maezes**. Then with runners on first and second and one out for Purdue in the ninth, Benedetti came in to pitch and struck out the final two Boilermakers to earn his first career save. In the series, he was 8-for-13 with three doubles and six RBI. He also made two appearances on the mound in Saturday's doubleheader. The performance helped Benedetti earned Big Ten Player of the Week honors.

BIG INNINGS HELP U-M TAKE SERIES FROM MARYLAND

-- Michigan scored 18 runs in three games in the series win over Maryland on March 28-29. Thirteen of those runs occurred in two innings. Michigan plated eight runs in the fifth inning of the 10-1 win on March 28. The Wolverines sent 13 men to the plate, the first seven reaching safely, and belted seven hits in the frame. On March 29, U-M scored five runs in the first inning in the 5-2 win. The Wolverines sent nine men to the plate in that inning and had five hits, the biggest one a three-run double from senior **Kyle Jusick**.

GLINES RAKES IN SEASON'S FIRST MONTH

-- Senior **Jackson Glines** has maintained impressive offensive numbers in the season's first six weeks. The Coarsegold, California, native leads the team in batting average (.368) and on-base percentage (.477). Glines went 6-for-13 with a double, a triple and a run scored at Nebraska (March 20-22). He was named the Big Ten Player of the Week on March 2 after going 8-for-13 (.615) at the plate in a four-game set against Siena. On the year, Glines has 18 multi-hit games and started the season with a 12-game hitting streak.

Erik Bakich Head Coach

3rd Season at Michigan - 86-73-1 (5th Season as a Head Coach)

Erik Bakich enters his third season as head coach of the University of Michigan baseball program in 2015. Bakich was announced as the 19th head coach in the history of Michigan baseball on June 27, 2012.

The 2014 edition of the Michigan baseball team won 30 games and finished in a tie for fourth place in the Big Ten Conference. U-M also advanced to the semifinals of the Big Ten Tournament, winning a pair of games in that tournament for the first time since 2008. Bakich coached a pair of All-Big Ten honorees (Jackson Glines - 2nd, Travis Maezes - 3rd) and four Academic All-Big Ten selections. Juniors James Bourque and Trent Szkutnik were both picked in the 2014 MLB First-Year Player Draft and freshman Brett Adcock and Carmen Benedetti were named to both the Big Ten All-Freshman and the Louisville Slugger Freshman All-America teams.

In Bakich's first season in Ann Arbor, he guided the Maize and Blue to 29 wins and 14-10 record in the Big Ten, good for a tie for fifth place. That was a seven-game overall and a six-game conference improvement from 2012. Also, the Wolverines returned to the Big Ten Tournament for the first time since 2010. Bakich coached three All-Big Ten honorees (Michael O'Neill - 1st, Jacob Cronenworth - 2nd, Cole Martin - 3rd) and four Academic All-Big Ten selections. O'Neill also was an ABCA All-Mideast Region first team selection and a third round pick by the New York Yankees in the MLB First-Year Player Draft. A trio of freshmen (Cronenworth, Travis Maezes and Evan Hill) earned Big Ten All-Freshman team honors and were Louisville Slugger Freshman All-Americans.

Bakich (pronounced back-itch) comes to Ann Arbor after spending three years as the head coach at the University of Maryland. He led the Terrapins to a 32-24 record in 2012, which was a 15-win improvement from his first season in College Park. Maryland started the season by taking 2-of-3 games at UCLA, which went on to earn a No. 2 national seed and a berth in the College World Series. The Terps also enjoyed wins over Purdue, East Carolina and St. John's in the non-conference slate and North Carolina, Virginia, Miami, N.C. State and Florida State in Atlantic Coast Conference action. Maryland had a 3.21 team earned-run average, which was third in the ACC. Bakich also had four players drafted from the 2012 team in this year's MLB First-Year Player Draft, including Alfredo Rodriguez, who was picked in the 17th round by the Milwaukee Brewers.

Bakich, who is currently the youngest head baseball coach at a BCS school, had an initial recruiting class at Maryland in 2010 that was ranked in the top 25 by Baseball America. That marked the first time the Terps had a ranked recruiting class. Bakich followed it up with a 2011 class that received accolades from a number of publications and a 2012 class that was ranked in the top 25 by Perfect Game USA. In the last 11 years, he has coached 77 players that have been selected in the MLB Draft, including 25 in the first five rounds and nine first-round picks.

Bakich also had a hand in several improvements to facilities at Maryland. Included in these improvements are a 5,000-square-foot indoor hitting and pitching facility that was built next to Bob "Turtle" Smith Stadium, a new turf infield (added prior to the 2011 season) along with a brick backstop, a new outfield fence and warning track. A new scoreboard and upgrades to signage in the stadium and renovated locker rooms are other highlights of facility upgrades for Maryland's baseball program.

Bakich instituted the inaugural Maryland Baseball Leadoff Banquet in 2011, which featured keynote speaker Tommy Lasorda in its first season and Baltimore Orioles manager Buck Showalter in 2012.

Bakich was the assistant coach at Vanderbilt Uni-

versity from 2003-09, serving as the Commodores' recruiting coordinator as well as being the hitting coach and working with the outfielders. Under Bakich's assistance, Vanderbilt was 276-157 in his seven seasons in Nashville. That included a 54-win team in 2007 and two seasons of 40-plus wins (45 in 2004; 41 in 2008).

In his first year at Vandy, Bakich helped the Commodores reach the Southeastern Conference Tournament, something they had not done in eight years prior to his arrival. Vandy then advanced to a Super Regional in the 2004 season after winning the Charlottesville Regional.

While at Vanderbilt, Bakich recruited and coached David Price, who was the No. 1 overall pick in the 2007 draft and finished second in voting for the 2010 Cy Young Award as a member of the Tampa Bay Rays. Bakich also hauled in top-25 recruiting classes all seven years, including the top-ranked class in 2005 and the second-ranked class in 2008. From 2008-10, 22 Commodores that Bakich recruited were selected in the MLB First-Year Player Draft.

Bakich began his college coaching career as a volunteer assistant at Clemson in 2002. There, he worked with the Tigers' outfielders and infielders as well as assisted in Clemson's recruiting efforts. In Bakich's one season at Clemson, the Tigers went 54-17 and advanced to the College World Series.

Bakich had a successful career as a player prior to his coaching career. After transferring from San Jose City College in California, Bakich was a standout for East Carolina in 1999 and 2000. While there, the Pirates won back-to-back Colonial Athletic Association (CAA) championships and earned number-one seeds at NCAA Regionals both years. Bakich was named to the All-Baton Rouge Regional team as a third baseman after earning unanimous all-tournament honors at the Bell South Hurricane Classic in Miami, Fla., earlier in the 1999 season.

He finished his playing career at ECU with a .315 batting average, 14 home runs and 85 RBI. Bakich graduated from East Carolina in 2000 with a degree in exercise and sports science. Upon graduation, Bakich played professionally in the Independent Professional Baseball League until 2001. At the conclusion of his playing career, Bakich returned to East Carolina, where he served as an assistant strength and conditioning coach for one year.

Bakich and his wife, Jiffy, have two sons, Colt and Beau and a daughter, Tempie.

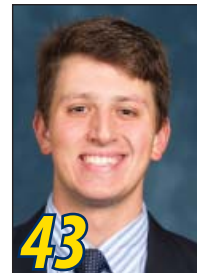
