LEADING OFF

- The Hawkeyes are in the midst of playing seven games in a nine day span during spring break. Iowa split a four-game series at Houston Baptist from March 14-17, winning the final two contests.
- Iowa ranks in the top 10 in the nation in pitching and defense. The Hawkeyes' 1.98 team ERA is seventh-best in the country, while the team's .982 fielding percentage ranks ninth.
- The Hawkeyes lead the Big Ten in fielding percentage and are second in the conference to Illinois in ERA. Offensively, Iowa has the eighth-best team batting average at .258.
- Juniors Tyler Peyton and Joel Booker both rank among the top-12 in the Big Ten in batting average at .356 and .349, respectively. Booker has a team-best seven multi-hit games.
- Iowa is active on the base paths, ranking second in the Big Ten with 27 steals and leading the conference with 37 attempts. Senior Eric Toole paces the league with 10 steals in 12 attempts.
- Toole has reached base safely in 15 consecutive games, which includes an eight-game hitting streak. Senior Jake Mangler has reached safely in 12-straight contests, and junior Tyler Peyton has a seven-game hitting streak.
- Junior Joel Booker is hitting .425 (17-of-40) over his last 10 games with seven RBIs. The outfielder has six multi-hit games during the stretch.
- Iowa's starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 1.90 ERA this season, allowing 19 runs (15 earned) over 71 innings. The Hawkeyes have used the same rotation for the duration of the season.

Rick Heller is entering his second season as head coach of the University of Iowa baseball program. Heller was tabbed as the 20th head coach program history July 12, 2013, after serving as head coach at Indiana State from 2010-13.

Heller, a native of Eldon, Iowa, has been head coach at four institutions -- Iowa (2014-present), Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99) -- leading his first three schools to NCAA postseason play. He led Indiana State to its first outright Missouri Valley Conference title in 2012. He led Northern Iowa to the 2001 MVC title and into the NCAA Tournament, the first regional appearance for the Panthers since becoming a Division I program in 1981. In 27 seasons as a head coach, Heller holds a career mark of 720-588-4.

In his first season in Iowa City, Heller helped guide the Hawkeyes to a 9-1 start -- the program's best start since 1940 -- a Big Ten Tournament berth and conference tournament win. Iowa finished the year with a 30-23 record for just the third 30-win season since 1993. The 30 victories are the most by a first-year coach in Iowa history.

Heller won his 700th career game in a 13-1 rout of Georgetown on March 15 at the Snowbird Classic in Florida. The Hawkeyes also took 2-of-3 games from Nebraska to open the Big Ten regular season -- Iowa's first conference-opening series win since 1998 and took 2-of-3 games against Minnesota for the first time since 2005.

Under Heller's direction, Iowa became one of the most potent offensive teams in the Big Ten in 2014. The Hawkeyes led the conference in four offensive categories (batting average, hits, runs and on-base percentage) and ranked second in four more (slugging percentage, RBIs, home runs and total bases). Iowa finished with 23 home runs -- a season after the team had two long balls in 49 contests.

Heller coached five student-athletes to All-Big Ten recognition, the most for the program since 2007. Junior shortstop Jake Yacinich garnered first-team All-Big Ten honors after ranking second in the league in batting average and steals. He was the first Iowa first-teamer since 2009.

The University of Iowa baseball team closes out spring break with a three-game weekend series from March 20-22 at Big 12 foe Kansas at Hogle Ballpark. Friday's game is set for a 6 p.m. (CT) start, Saturday begins at 2 p.m., and Sunday's finale at 1 p.m. All three games will be streamed on ESPN3.

GAME COVERAGE

Zach Mackey will provide play-by-play and Ray Gilmore will serve as the color commentator for the Kansas series via the subscription-based service Hawkeye All-Access on hawkeyesports.com. Fans can also follow every game with live stats (GameTracker) on hawkeyesports.com and live updates are also available on Twitter: @UIBaseball.

All three games of the Iowa-Kansas series will be broadcast on ESPN3 (watchespn.com). Steven Davis will handle the play-by-play, while Scott Heitshusen will be the color analyst.

QUICK HITTERS

- Four players -- Eric Toole (CF), Jake Mangler (2B), Kris Goodman (OF/3B) and Joel Booker (RF) -- have started every game for the Hawkeyes.
- Senior Jake Mangler posted a .474 (9-of-19) batting average in the four-game series at Houston Baptist with multi-hit games in three of the four contests, including a 4-for-5, two RBI performance in game three. The four hits were a career best.
- Junior Nick Roscetti returned to the Hawkeye lineup as a defensive replacement in the first game at Houston Baptist after missing three-straight contests because of injury. He started the final three games, finishing 2-for-4 with an RBI and double in the finale.
- Freshman Nick Allgeyer posted his second career win in just his third career outing in the series finale at Houston Baptist, throwing two innings, allowing one run on two hits. The southpaw is 2-0 with a 2.25 ERA this season.
- Sophomore Corbin Woods and junior John Barrett came through in pinch-hit opportunities at Houston Baptist. Woods tallied his first hit as a Hawkeye, while Barrett delivered a two-run single for his first career RBIs.
- Freshman Austin Guzzo has thrown out five of seven would-be base steals for a 71.4 caught-stealing percentage -- the third-best percentage nationally.

SCOUTING KANSAS

- The Jayhawks -- a 2014 NCAA Tournament qualifier -- bring an 8-12 record into the weekend.

Kansas took 2-of-3 games from Big Ten foe Michigan last weekend in Lawrence, winning 6-5 in the opener and 8-4 in the finale. KU lost game two, 4-2.

- Kansas is hitting .283 as a team with three regulars hitting over .300. Connor McKay is leading the team with a .351 batting average with 11 extra base hits, Colby Wright has a .338 average with a team-best 16 runs, and Michael Tinsley is hitting .313 with eight doubles, two home runs and a team-best 15 RBIs. Blair Beck sits at .299 with five home runs and 14 RBIs.
- On the mound, Kansas has a 5.97 team ERA over 20 games, giving up an average of 6.3 runs per contest. All four Jayhawk starters have ERAs over 5.00, and the pitching staff has a .308 batting average against. Kansas has been solid at the back end of its bullpen with Stephen Villines racking up five saves and posting a 1-0 record with a 2.81 ERA in nine appearances.
- Kansas will start junior LHP Ben Krauth (3-2, 6.23 ERA) on Friday and sophomore RHP Sean Rackoski (0-2, 6.65 ERA) on Saturday. Sunday's starter is TBA.
- The Jayhawks have struggled defensively, committing 28 errors to post a .963 fielding percentage. Kansas is averaging 1.4 errors per game this season.

THE SERIES

- Kansas leads the all-time series over Iowa, 17-10. The Hawkeyes swept a two-game series in Iowa City last season, winning 5-3 and 12-7 on April 8-9.
- Blake Hickman made his first career start in the opening game, throwing 2 1/3 innings and allowing two runs. Sasha Kuebel earned the win with 5 2/3 innings in relief, scattering eight hits, striking out six, and allowing one run. Tyler Radtke pitched the ninth for his first career save. Eric Toole, Jake Mangler, and Dan Potempa had five of Iowa's 10 hits, and Potempa had four RBIs.
- Iowa pounded out 18 hits in the 12-7 victory in game two with six different Hawkeyes posting multi-hit games. Toole finished 4-for-5 with a career high five RBIs, while Mangler was 2-for-5 with three RBIs. Jake Reinhardt earned the win, throwing two innings of three-hit ball in relief.

IOWA PITCHING SHINES

- The Hawkeyes allowed one earned run or fewer in 9-of-16 games this season.
- Iowa is second in the Big Ten in ERA (1.98), opposing batting average (.210), and saves (6). The Hawkeyes have allowed the fewest hits (109), runs (45) and earned runs (32) in the conference.
- All three Iowa starters -- Calvin Mathews (second, 0.42), Blake Hickman (11th, 2.39) and Tyler Peyton (13th, 2.82) -- rank in the top-13 in



the Big Ten ERA.

- The Hawkeyes' starting pitchers are 6-2 with a 1.90 ERA over 71 innings, giving up 19 runs (15 earned) and striking out 51.

- The UI bullpen is 6-2 with a 2.05 ERA with six saves -- the second-most in the Big Ten lead. Iowa's relievers are holding batters to a .181 average and have 51 strikeouts.

- Junior reliever Connor Grant is 1-1 with a 3.60 ERA with two saves. He is holding opposing hitters to a .128 batting average, giving up six hits in 15 innings.

- Junior southpaw Ryan Erickson is 1-0 with a 1.72 ERA with one save and has 16 strikeouts to six walks. He has struck out at least two batters in each of his five appearances, including five in two innings against Cincinnati on Feb. 27. He threw a season-high 4 2/3 innings at Houston Baptist on March 14.

- Junior Luke Vandermaten has yet to allow a run in a team-high seven appearances in 2015. The right-hander has two strikeouts in 10 innings, but has issued five walks.

- Five pitchers combined to shutout Cincinnati, 5-0, in 13 innings on March 1. The five-some scattered seven hits and struck out 12. It was Iowa's first shutout since Feb. 21, 2014 -- a 2-0 victory over St. Bonaventure.

OFFENSIVE TIDBITS

- Junior Joel Booker has hits in 13-of-16 games this season, which includes a team-high seven multi-hit games. The right fielder drove in a career-high four runs in the series finale at Middle Tennessee State, and is tied for the team-high with 10 RBIs.

- Booker is hitting a team-best .425 (17-of-40) over his last 10 games with a .525 slugging and .465 on-base percentage. Six of his seven multi-hit games have come during the stretch.

- Seniors Eric Toole has reached base safely in 15-straight games, which includes a current eight-game hitting streak.

- Senior Jake Mangler is hitting .400 (18-of-45) with a team-high 10 RBIs over the last 10 games, a streak that corresponds with Mangler making the move to the No. 2 spot in the Iowa batting order. All six of Mangler's multi-hit games have come during the 10-game stretch and his average has climbed from .143 to .318.

- Mangler is hitting .381 (8-of-21) with runners in scoring position and has eight two-out RBIs. Senior Sean Moore (.375, 3-of-8), and junior Tyler Peyton (.357, 5-of-14) are both thriving with runners on base.

- Junior Tyler Peyton has hits in 11-of-13 games to post a team-best .356 batting average, and is currently riding a seven-game hitting streak.

IN THE BIG TEN...

- Juniors Tyler Peyton and Joel Booker rank 11th and 12th, respectively, in the Big Ten with a .356 and .349 batting average.

- Senior Eric Toole is leading the Big Ten with 10 steals in 12 attempts. The Hawkeyes are second in the conference with 27 steals.

- Iowa is second in the Big Ten with six saves with Tyler Radtke and Connor Grant being tied for sixth with two apiece.

Iowa has more than 500 career starts among four regulars. Seniors Eric Toole (148), Jake Manglers (138), Kris Goodman (132), and Nick Day (105) have combined to start 523 games in their Hawkeye careers. Mangler has started 53-straight games at second base.

JUNIOR TYLER PEYTON...

- shines as a two-way player for the Hawkeyes, going 2-1 with a 2.81 ERA with 21 strikeouts on the mound, while hitting a team-best .356 with seven RBIs. Peyton starts at first base when he is not pitching.

- has pitched five innings in four of his five starts, allowing one or fewer runs in his first four starts.

- posted wins over UALR (2/20) and at Middle Tennessee State (3/7). He struck out a season-high six in a no-decision in opener against Kansas State (2/13) and threw five shutout innings against Cincinnati (2/27).

- is 7-2 in his Iowa career with a 4.39 ERA in 19 starts. Peyton has five quality starts and has pitched into the seventh inning six times in his career.

JUNIOR BLAKE HICKMAN...

- is 2-1 with a 2.39 ERA in five starts. He has 17 strikeouts against 12 walks.

- has thrown at least six innings in each of his last three starts. Hickman went seven innings -- the longest outing of his career -- allowing four runs on seven hits in a loss at Houston Baptist.

- pitched six innings in victories over Cincinnati (2/28) and Middle Tennessee (3/7).

- notched his first win of season in 5-1 victory over Cincinnati. He was perfect through three innings, striking out 7-of-10 batters to start the game, and had a no-hitter through six innings. He tied a career-high with nine strikeouts in the contest.

- has a 4-3 career record with a 3.26 ERA over 60 2/3 innings in 22 appearances, including 10 starts. He has 51 strikeouts against 35 walks.

- is focusing solely on pitching for the first time in his baseball career. He transitioned to the mound midway through 2014 season.

- pitched in the Cape Cod League in the summer

- Junior Nick Hibbing has made 63 career appearances as a Hawkeye -- tied for the third-most in school history. Tim Gudex (81, 2004-07), Kurt Belger (76, 1993-97), and Brett Glendinning (63, 1993-96) are 1-2 in program history.
- Hibbing is also tied for sixth all-time with nine career saves.

RETURNEEES BY THE NUMBERS

Iowa's offense brings back the bulk of its lineup and overall production in 2015. The Hawkeye offense has 70 percent of their runs (236 of 337), 72.3 percent of hits (400 of 553), 75 percent of doubles (63 of 84), and 74.8 percent of the RBIs (226 of 302) returning. The roster has 13 of its 23 home runs returning. On the mound, Iowa returns hurlers who accounted for 76 percent of the wins (23 of 30), threw 78.4 percent of the innings (364 2/3 of 465), notched 78.9 percent of the strikeouts (266 of 337), and accounted for 8-of-9 saves.

ROSTER BREAKDOWN

- Of Iowa's 35-man roster, 23 are upperclassmen. The Hawkeyes roster features seven freshman, five sophomores, 14 juniors, and nine seniors.
- Iowa has 17 native Iowans on the 2015 roster -- the most of any state. Eleven players hail from Illinois.
- The Hawkeyes' roster includes players ranging from California to Florida to Canada to North Carolina.
- Iowa boasts three sets of high school teammates on the 2015 roster: Matt Allen and Tyler Radtke -- Stevenson High School in Lincolnshire, Ill.; Brandon Shulista and Nick Day -- Solon High School in Solon, Iowa; Josh Martsching and Calvin Mathews -- Davis County High School in Bloomfield, Iowa.
- Four current Hawkeyes -- Luke Vandermaten, Brandon Shulista, Tyler Peyton, and Dan Potempa -- played together at Iowa Central Community College in Fort Dodge, Iowa.
- The Hawkeyes return 17 letterwinners, seven positional starters plus the designated hitter, 2/3 of the starting rotation and nine total pitchers.
