### **LEADING OFF**

**HAWKEYES** 

- lowa is off to a 9-1 start, the best start for the program since 1940 when the Hawkeyes started 10-0-
- 1. The team is winners of seven-straight, the longest streak since winning 12-straight in 2007.
- UI head coach Rick Heller is a single win shy of No. 700 for his career. He is 39th in the NCAA in winningest active coaches with 699 victories in 26-plus seasons.
- The Hawkeyes are receiving votes in the National Collegiate Baseball Writers Association (NCBWA) rankings that were released on March 3. Iowa is 1-of-3 Big Ten teams in the poll along with Indiana (26) and Illinois (RV). Kansas State is also receiving votes.
- Junior Jake Mangler has hit safely in all 10 games for the Hawkeyes this season, matching the longest hitting streak of his career. The second baseman has six multi-hit games and three multi-RBI games this season.
- lowa ranks eighth nationally, scoring nine runs per game. The 90 total runs are 11th-most and lead the Big Ten. The Hawkeyes rank in the top two in 12-of-14 categories, as they lead the conference in batting average (.308), slugging percentage (.431), on-base percentage (.407), RBIs (75), doubles (23) and home runs (6).
- Senior Taylor Zeutenhorst was named the Big Ten Player of the Week on Feb. 24 after hitting .412 with six runs and four RBIs in leading lowa to a 4-0 record at the Snowbird Baseball Classic.
- Single game tickets for lowa's home slate will go on sale March 10. Season tickets are also available for purchase on hawkeyesports.com.

Rick Heller was named the 20th head coach in University of Iowa baseball history on July 12, 2013. Heller joined the Hawkeyes after serving as head coach at Indiana State the last four seasons.

Heller, a native of Eldon, Iowa, has been head coach at three institutions -- Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99) -- leading all three schools to NCAA postseason play. He led Indiana State to its first outright Missouri Valley Conference title in 2012. He led Northern Iowa to the 2001 MVC title and into the NCAA Tournament, the first regional appearance for the Panthers since becoming a Division I program in 1981. In 26-plus seasons as a head coach, Heller holds a career mark of 699-566-4.

Heller led the Sycamores to their first outright Missouri Valley Conference championship in school history and back to the NCAA Tournament for the first time since 1995 during the record-setting 2012 season. Indiana State finished 41-19, including a 14-7 record in conference play to claim the regular season crown and earn an at-large bid into the NCAA Tournament. The 41 wins were the most for the program since 1991.

During his tenure at Northern lowa, Heller's teams won 270 games, including the 2001 Missouri Valley Conference championship and NCAA Regional Berth. While building the Panthers into an annual contender, Heller coached three MVC Most Valuable Players, one MVC Pitcher of the Year and helped put 22 players in professional baseball.

While at UNI, Heller's teams broke a total of 57 team or individual records, including setting team records for hits, runs batted in, doubles and extra base hits during the 2001 season. Heller led the Panthers to four MVC tournaments, winning the championship in 2001. All-American Ryan Brunner claimed the league MVP award and All-American Nic Ungs was named Pitcher of the Year.

The Panthers recorded back-to-back 30-plus win seasons in 2001 and 2002 for the first time in school history and set the school single-season record with 35 wins in 2001. Before taking over the Northern lowa program prior to the 2000 season, Heller spent 12 years as a head coach at Upper lowa University, a Division III institution. While at Upper lowa, Heller recorded a 291-194-3 overall record and was named the lowa Conference Coach of the Year four times.

### SCOUTING KANSAS STATE

- The Wildcats opened the season with fivestraight losses before winning 4-of-6 games to improve to 4-7 this season. Last weekend, Kansas State went 3-0, taking two games from Grand Canyon before downing Missouri State.
- Wildcat second baseman Ross Kivet was named Big 12 Player of the Week on March 3. He hit .500 in K-State's 3-0 weekend, and moved into the top-10 in school history in career base hits. Kivet was the 2013 Big 12 Player of the Year and was an All-America honoree by three different entities. He was selected in the 10th round of the 2013 MLB Draft by the Cleveland Indians, but did not sign.
- The Wildcats are hitting .254 as a team with 20 extra base hits. Three K-State players are hitting above .300 with Austin Fisher pacing the team with a .463 average with a team-high 17 hits. Clayton Dalrymple (.417) and Lance Miles (.313) are also above .300. R.J. Santigate has a team-best seven RBIs, while Shane Conlon has scored 11 runs.
- Kansas State has a 4.63 team ERA over 93 1/3 innings. The Wildcats have 52 strikeouts to 34 walks and have allowed 59 runs (48 earned). lowa will face sophomore right-hander Levi MaVorhis (1-1, 3.93 ERA) Friday, senior lefty Jared Moore (2-1, 3.63 ERA) Saturday and sophomore southpaw Landon Busch (1-1, 3.18 ERA) in the finale.

• The Wildcats won a school-record 45 games in 2013 and advanced to the Super Regionals, where they fell in three games to No. 3 Oregon State in the Corvallis Super Regional. K-State also won its first conference championship in 80 years.

### **THE SERIES**

- Kansas State leads the all-time series over lowa, 9-7. The Wildcats won 2-of-3 games in lowa City last season.
- The Hawkeyes won the opener, 6-1, behind the pitching of Matt Dermody and Nick Hibbing. The two combined to limit K-State to seven hits and a single run.
- The Wildcats responded with 17 hits and 11 runs in a 11-4 victory in game two before winning the rubber game of the series, 5-3.

### **BEST START IN 74 YEARS**

With its 9-1 record, lowa is off to its best start since the 1940 season. The Hawkeyes opened that season 10-0-1 before finishing 20-3-

### **HELLER 1 WIN FROM 700**

First-year head coach Rick Heller is a single victory shy of reaching 700 in his 26-plus year coaching career. Heller is 39th among winningest active head coaches in the NCAA.

### **QUICK HITTERS**

- The Hawkeyes have had at least 10 hits in five straight games and in 7-of-10 contests this season. Iowa had a season-high 17 hits Feb. 22 against Ball State.
- lowa has won seven-straight games for the first time since the 2007 season when it was victorious in 12-straight contests.
- Junior Nick Day is hitting .571 (12-of-21) with five runs and five RBIs over his last five games. Day had four-straight multi-hit games, including three three-hit games during the stretch.
- The Hawkeyes rank eighth nationally in runs per game (9.0), 23rd in batting average (.308), 32nd in doubles (23) and 25th in on-base percentage (.407) and steals (20).
- lowa ranks in the top-two in Big Ten in 12of-14 offensive categories, including being the top team in batting average (.308), slugging percentage (.431), on-base percentage (.407), runs (90), RBIs (75), doubles (23), home runs (6), total bases (158), walks (52) and steals





(20).

- Junior Andrew Hedrick and sophomore Tyler Peyton are one off the Big Ten lead in wins with two. Hedrick is 2-0 with a 2.87 ERA, Peyton is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA.
- Junior Eric Toole hit .538 (7-of-13) with five RBIs at the Stetson Invitational. He had at least two hits in all three games and went 3-for-5 with a career-high three RBIs in Iowa's 13-12 win against Maine.
- Junior Jake Mangler has hit safely in all 10 games this season and is second on the team with a .405 batting average. Mangler's 17 hits are second-most in the Big Ten, and the junior has six multi-hit games. He had a career-high four RBIs in Iowa's 8-2 win over Furman, giving him a Big Ten-best 11 RBIs this season. (He had 18 RBIs all of last season). Mangler had the game-winning RBI single in Iowa's 13-12 come-from-behind victory over Maine on March 1.
- Juniors Eric Toole and Kris Goodman have reached base safely in eight-straight contests. Toole has reached safely in 9-of-10 games this season and in 24-of-25 games dating back to last season.
- Three Hawkeyes rank in the top-six in the Big Ten in batting average. Junior Jake Yacinich is tied for third (.412), Manger is fifth (.405) and Day is sixth (.387).

### STRONG STARTS

- lowa's starting pitchers have gone at least six innings in five of the last six games. The Hawkeye starters have four quality starts in 10 games this season (Tyler Peyton 2, Calvin Mathews 1, Andrew Hedrick 1).
- Sophomore Tyler Peyton is 2-0 with a 1.80 ERA over his last two starts, allowing three runs on 10 hits in 15 innings. He has 10 strikeouts to five walks. Peyton is second in the Big Ten in innings pitched (20).
- Friday night starter Calvin Mathews is 1-0 with a 1.38 ERA over his past two starts. He went a career-long 7 1/3 innings, scattering five hits and allowing an unearned run Feb. 28 in a 5-1 victory over Stetson. Mathews had a career-high eight strikeouts at Austin Peay in his first start of the season.
- Junior Andrew Hedrick will move into the Saturday slot in the weekend rotation. Hedrick has started one game for the Hawkeyes this season -- pitching 6 2/3 scoreless innings in a 2-0 win over St. Bonaventure. He scattered four hits and struck out a career-high seven batters.

### **TWO-WAY TYLER**

Sophomore Tyler Peyton is thriving as a twoway player for the Hawkeyes. The Grimes, lowa, is the team's starting first baseman when he's not on the mound. Peyton is tied for the or the team lead with a .412 batting average, collecting seven hits in 17 at-bats. He went 2-for-4 with two runs in lowa's 13-12 win over Maine on March 1. As the Sunday starter, Peyton is 2-0 with a 2.70 ERA over 20 innings. He has 14 strikeouts in three starts.

### **POWER SURGE**

After hitting two home runs the entire 2013 season, lowa has hit six home runs in 10 games this season. The Hawkeyes connected on three long balls in taking 2-of-3 games during its opening weekend at Austin Peay before following with three home runs in the perfect 4-0 weekend at the Snowbird Baseball Classic.

The home run total leads the Big Ten and ranks 41st nationally.

### **RUNS, RUNS & MORE RUNS**

- lowa has scored 10 or more runs four times this season, including a season-high 16 in a victory over Ball State. The Hawkeyes hit the 10-run barrier three times the entire 2013 season
- The Hawkeyes have the top three run scorers -- Blake Hickman (13), Taylor Zeutenhorst (12) and Kris Goodman (11) -- in the Big Ten.
- lowa scored 11 and 15 runs in consecutive victories at Austin Peay on the opening weekend of the 2014 season. It was the first time scoring 10 or more runs in two-straight games since April 20 and April 23, 2011, putting 14 and 13 runs on the board in victories over Western Illinois and Michigan.
- lowa scored 10 runs in the second inning alone of the second game of the Feb. 15 doubleheader at Austin Peay. The Hawkeyes last had a double-digit inning on April 3, 2011, in a 19-7 victory over Michigan State.
- lowa has outscored its opponents 48-21 over the final four innings.

### RUNNIN' WILD

Nine different Hawkeyes have swiped at least one base during the 2014 season. Iowa's 20 steals are leading the Big Ten and rank 20th nationally. Junior Jake Yacinich has a leaguebest seven steals in eight attempts, a total that is 17th in the country. Four different players have at least two steals.

The Hawkeyes average 7.8 strikeouts per game, giving the team 78 Ks -- the second most in the Big Ten. Sophomore Calvin Mathews ranks sixth in the Big Ten with 15 strikeouts, while sophomore Tyler Peyton is tied for eighth with 14 punch outs.

### **B1G PLAYER OF THE WEEK**

Senior Taylor Zeutenhorst has tabbed as the Big Ten Player of the Week on Feb. 21 after hitting .412, slugging .765 and reaching at a .500 clip. The outfielder tied a career-high with four hits, going 4-of-6, which included a two-run home run in lowa's 16-6 win over Ball State. Zeutenhorst is lowa's first Player of the Week honoree since 2012.

Juniors -- Eric Toole, Sasha Kuebel and Jake Yacinich -- have been named to the Big Ten Watch List.

Toole paced the Hawkeyes with a .337 batting average, 59 hits and 32 runs scored in 2013. He also tied for fifth in the Big Ten with 22 steals. Yacinich batted .286 and tied for the team lead with 24 RBIs, and Kuebel won a pair of games and posted a 5.13

## **TOOLE EARNS PRESEASON HONOR**

Junior Eric Toole was named a preseason first-team all-conference selection by College Sports Madness. Toole was a second-team All-Big Ten selection in 2013 after leading the Hawkeyes in batting average (.337), runs (32), hits (59), total bases (67 and steals (22).

### HICKMAN NAMED TO PG's TOP-100 LIST

Sophomore Blake Hickman has been named to Perfect Game's top-100 list for the sophomore class. The catcher/right-handed pitcher is ranked No. 51 in the nation. He is 1-of-3 Big Ten players in the top-51 and six in the top-100.

### **RETURNEES - BY THE NUMBERS**

lowa's offense returns nearly intact from the 2013 season with 98 percent of the runs (1,652-of-1,684), 95 percent of the steals (57-of-60), 88 percent of the triples (7-of-8), 84 percent of the hits (374-of-443) and 81 percent of the RBIs (155-of-199) and doubles (43-of-53) returning.

On the mound, the Hawkeves return hurlers who accounted for 11 of the 22 wins and tossed 256 2/3 of the 447 innings.

### A NEW ERA

The Rick Heller era began in July, 2013, when Heller was tabbed as the 20th coach in Iowa baseball history. The Eldon, Iowa, native has been head coach at three institutions -- Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009) and Upper Iowa (1987-99)

-- leading all three schools to NCAA postseason play. Heller added Scott Brickman and Marty Sutherland to his staff as assistant coaches. Brickman, the pitching coach, spent the past four seasons as head coach at NCAA Division II Belmont Abbey University, while Sutherland, the hitting coach/recruiting coordinator, was an assistant high school coach and hitting/fielding instructor. The three were together on the coaching staff at Northern Iowa in 2008 and 2009.

Heller also brought back a pair of UI baseball alums in Jim Magrane and Matt Wooldrick. Magrane will serve as the volunteer assistant coach, while Wooldrik will be the director of baseball operations.
