Series Record: Iowa leads Rutgers 3-2,

First Meeting with West Virginia and Villanova.



THE SETTING:

Iowa will leave the snow behind and fly down to Florida to compete in the second annual Big Ten/Big East Challenge. The Hawkeyes will face three Big East opponents on the road trip; Rutgers Friday (9 a.m.), West Virginia Saturday (noon) and Villanova Sunday (noon). The games will all take place in former major league spring training venues: Al Lang Stadium, Naimoli Complex and Jack Russell Stadium. The Black and Gold went 1-2 last season at the challenge.

Iowa baseball fans can follow the Hawkeyes, as live stats will be available on hawkeyesports.com. Just click on the Gametracker link found on both the front page and the baseball schedule page. Whistlin' Ray Gilmore enters his 33rd season with the Hawkeye baseball program and will be entering the stats.

Hawkeye fans can watch the game on collegebaseball360.com, the fastest growing college baseball website on the internet. The Iowa vs. Rutgers showdown will be the first of nine contests shown on the website.

SCOUTING RUTGERS:

The Scarlet Knights started 2010 dropping three on the road to No. 16 Miami.

The Scarlet Knight's top offensive producers from 2009, Michael Lang and Jaren Matthews went a combined 3-for-33. Thus far, Rutgers' offense has been led by DH Pat Biserta. Biserta went 4-for-12 with two bombs, four RBI and three runs scored.

Rutgers starter, Willie Beard, got a no decision after pitching five complete innings and allow five earned runs. The other two starters for the Scarlet Knights compiled an 8.31 ERA.

SCOUTING WEST VIRGINIA:

The Mountaineers dropped three last weekend. West Virginia lost to No. 12 Coastal Carolina, Kentucky and Virginia Tech. The three teams combined to outscore the Mountaineers, 24-5.

West Virginia was led by Grant Buckner. The right fielder went 5-for-12 with two RBI, a stolen base and a .667 slugging percentage. The team combined to hit .214. Preseason all-American Jedd Gyorko did well in the first game, going 2-for-4 with a homer and two RBI.

The Mountaineer pitching staff amassed a 8.28 ERA, with only three pitchers keeping their average under three. Opponents hit .365 off them.

SCOUTING VILLANOVA:

Villanova got off to a good start on the road. The Wildcats swept Norfolk State, 3-0.

Villanova outscored its opponents, 30-6. The Wildcat pitching staff dominated, not allowing one earned run in the three-game series and striking out 32.

Besides excelling on the mound, Villanova tore up the base paths going a perfect 14-for-14. The Wildcat offense was also patient, drawing 21 free passes and batting .357 as a team with a .462 on-base percentage in the series.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

The Iowa offense had a stellar opening weekend, especially when compared to other Big Ten teams.

The Hawkeyes rank first in batting average (.381), slugging percentage (.619) and in the top three in on base percentage (.469), runs scored (27), RBI (24), doubles (6), triples (1), home runs (4) and stolen bases (5).

'Q' GOES BIG:

The sophomore second baseman brought offense to Clarksville, TN. **Mike McQuillan** went 6-for-12 in the two-game series. Driving in a team-best seven runs, slugging a monstrous 1.083% and going yard twice-- including his first career grand slam.

MULLER DELIVERS:

After a 2009 season of lingering injuries, junior outfielder **Kurtis Muller** was back to his old self this summer. He continued to deliver in Iowa's season opening tournament.

Muller went 5-for-11 with a team-best two doubles and a triple. He also played tough defense, making six putouts (only second to first baseman, **Sean Flanagan**).

BIG TEN GAME HIGHS:

The Hawkeyes four home runs in the win over Illinois State ties with Michigan in the most home runs hit in a game this season.

The Black and Gold also hold the conference's game-high in total bases-- with 35.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** entered the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. With a stellar offensive showing this weekend, Muller continued on to a 14-game streak.

Other Hawkeyes on a roll from a year ago who continued are: **Chett Zeise** (5) and **Dallas Burke** (4).

SWINGIN' FOR THE FENCES:

The Iowa offense started the season with a bang, or perhaps more a ding. Three different Hawkeyes connected with the sweet part of the bat for home run.

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** connected twice, first for a two-run shot and second with his first career grand slam. Fellow sophomores **Chett Zeise** and **Sean Flanagan** both connected for three-run bombs.

Four home runs is the most team total since Iowa blasted five at Tennessee Martin in 2009.

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead Iowa to victory over Illinois State Saturday. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying with Coley Crank from Michigan.)

LEE GETS SAVE # 1:

New Hawkeye closer **Kevin Lee** picked up his first career save against Illinois State. Lee went one and on-third innings allowing no runs on one hit.

WALK ON DOWN:

The Hawkeye offense was patient at the plate against Illinois State. The team combined for seven base on balls. That ties the 2009 season's game high against Tennessee Martin and Coe College.

PITCHING STAFF:

The Hawkeye bullpen threw for 10.1 innings allowing 10 earned runs and striking out seven.

Michael Jacobs, **Zach Kenyon** and **Kevin Lee** combined for five and two-third innings allowing no earned runs.

ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES:

Iowa leads the all-time series over Rutgers, 3-2. The last time the two teams faced off was in 2008 in an Iowa 16-14 victory.

Iowa scattered 14 hits in the win. Freshman **Kurtis Muller** had a big day at the plate going 3-for-4 with three RBIs and sophomore **Tyson Blaser** was 2-for-3 with a double and two RBIs in the Iowa win.

This is will be the first meeting in school history between the Hawkeyes and Big East foes, West Virginia and Villanova.

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the Iowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at Iowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections, including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, Iowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

WEEKEND RECAP:

The Hawkeyes split their season opener in Clarksville, TN, at Raymond C. Hand Park Saturday.

A late offensive explosion lifted Iowa to a 19-11 season-opening victory over Illinois State. The Hawkeyes scored all 19 runs in the final four innings, including posting a seven-spot in the top of the ninth.

Iowa blasted four home runs and also smacked five doubles en route to victory. All four round-trippers plated multiple runs: a grand slam, two three-run bombs and a two-run shot. Iowa pounded out 17 hits and Iowa's first five batters in the lineup each had two hits or more and had a collective total of 12 hits.

The Hawkeyes outhit Austin Peay in the night cap, but ultimately lost, 13-8.

Mike McQuillan went 6-for-12 with seven RBI, three runs scored, two home runs and a double to lead Iowa's offense in the team's first two games. **Kurtis Muller** went 5-for-11 with three RBI, two doubles, a triple and two walks. **Sean Flanagan** went 3-for-7 with four runs scored and one three-run home run.

All 11 Hawkeyes sent to the plate, reached base—including 10 recording one hit, and 10 scoring at least one run.

WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

Mike McQuillan made a splash in the Big Ten rankings. The sophomore ranks in the top ten in seven statistical categories: batting average (2nd), slugging percentage (3rd), on base percentage (10th), hits (6th), RBI (2nd), home runs (2nd) and total bases (4th).

Other Hawkeyes who made the top 10 are: **Kurtis Muller** in batting average (8th), slugging percentage (7th), RBI (9th), doubles (4th), triples (1st) and total bases (8th). **Sean Flanagan** in slugging percentage (5th), on base percentage (3rd) and hit by pitch (1st). **Kurt Lee** in runs scored (3rd), **Chett Zeise** in slugging percentage (9th) and **Trevor Willis** in sac bunts (1st).

INFIELD HAS NEW LOOK:

With former starters **Kevin Hoef**, **Justin Toole**, **TJ Cataldo** and **Wes Freie** out of the picture, the Hawkeyes have a lot of new faces in the infield. The only positive to Iowa's plague of injuries a year ago, is that every 2010 starter in the infield has game experience.

Chett Zeise will take over as Iowa's starting third baseman this spring, and junior transfer, **Kurtis Lee**, will take over at short-stop. **Mike McQuillan** will continue in the starting second baseman role, while **Sean Flanagan** will play at first.

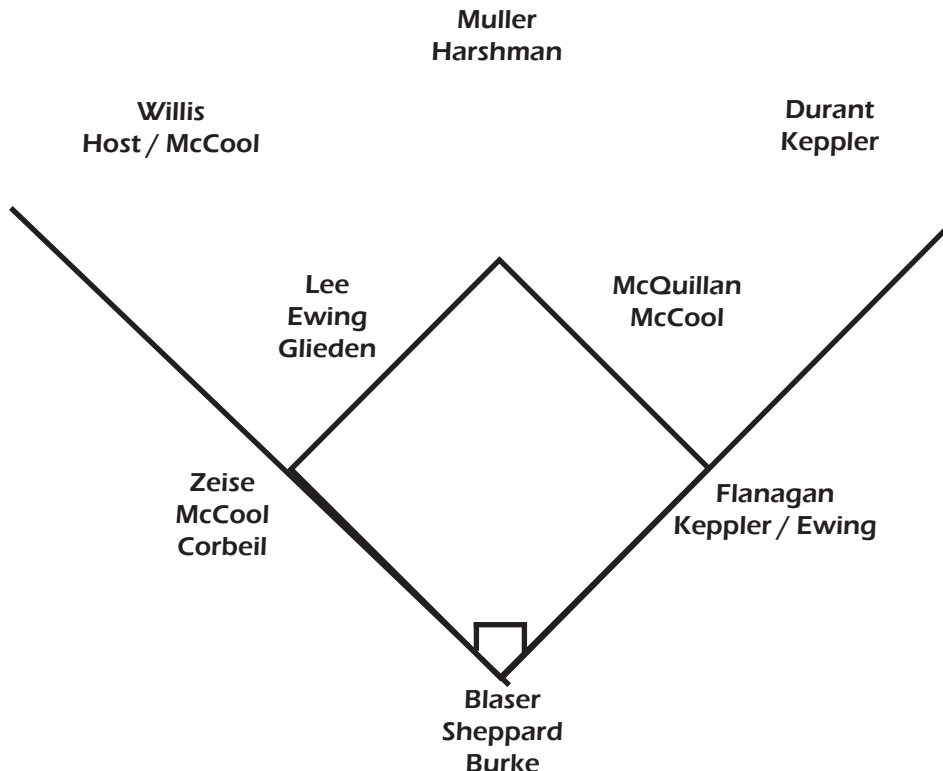

OVER AT SHORT:

Junior transfer **Kurtis Lee** comes to Iowa from Redding, CA, and will replace former Iowa standout **Justin Toole**. A unanimous all-Golden Valley Conference selection at shortstop, Lee was named best all-around player. Lee led Shasta with a .379 batting average, 41 runs scored, 24 walks and 17 steals. He had three hits in his Hawkeye debut last weekend.

THE UNITY COUNCIL:

Senior **Michael Jacobs**, red shirt junior **Tyson Blaser**, junior **Kurtis Muller**, sophomore **Patrick Brennan** and freshman **Dan Sheppard**.

DURANT NAMED MVP

Senior **Ryan Durant** was honored as the team's co-MVP Monday, Feb. 15 at the team's first annual Steak Fry.

In 2009, Durant was named first team all-conference after leading the Iowa team in batting average (.370), games played (49), at bats (181), multi-hit games (23) and ranked in the top five in several other categories.

Durant shared the honor with former Hawkeye **Justin Toole**.

RETURNING DEPTH:

Despite losing several key players from 2009, the Hawkeyes have a lot of experience returning. Returning lettermen in the outfield include: **Ryan Durant**, **Phil Keppler**, **Kurtis Muller**, **Jeff Pacha** and **Trevor Willis**.

The infield returns: **Tyson Blaser**, **Dallas Burke**, **Andrew Ewing**, **Sean Flanagan**, **Zach McCool**, **Mike McQuillan** and **Chett Zeise**.

The pitching staff also returns with a lot of depth, including: **Nick Brown**, **Jarred Hippen**, **Michael Jacobs**, **Zach Kenyon**, **Kevin Lee**, **Zach Robertson**, **Patrick Schatz** and **Phil Schreiber**.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

For the first time, season tickets are available for purchase. Fans can reserve their own chair backs for the 2010 season by calling the UI Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-IA-HAWKS.

Besides that, in 2009, the Recreation Building underwent a complete makeover. Improvements included: a new locker room, lounge, training room and weight room.

DERMODY MAKES HISTORY:

In June, **Matt Dermody** was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates, five days later, the Norwalk, IA, native, was making national news on the mound.

The left-handed pitcher threw a perfect six-inning game in a 10-0 win. Not only was it a perfect game, but Dermody struck out all 18 batters he faced, a first for an Iowa high school athlete. Additionally, he helped out offensively, hitting a home run.

His efforts made ESPN's "SportsCenter," among other national publications.

IOWA NATIVE VOLUNTEERS:

Zach Dillon is in his first season as a volunteer coach at the University of Iowa.

Dillon, a native of Urbandale, IA, attended Baylor University and was subsequently selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 20th Round (595th overall) of the 2006 amateur entry draft as a catcher. His honors include 2005 ABCA second team all-Midwest Region selection, 2005 first team all-Big 12 Conference honoree and a nine time Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient.

Dillon will work with the catchers, assist with hitters and take over as camp coordinator.

BLASER REDSHIRTS:

Redshirt junior, **Tyson Blaser**, has been MIA in the Hawkeye lineup essentially the past two seasons due to injuries and will start the 2010 campaign healthy after having season-ending surgery on his right thumb last April. Blaser took a medical redshirt.

LET THE BLOGGING BEGIN:

Iowa junior **Kurtis Muller** will be writing a weekly blog for pingbaseball.com this season. Hawkeye fans will be able to link to his weekly blog through hawkeyesports.com.

Muller was recognized as a freshman all-American by Ping! in 2008. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, is a three-time Unity Council member and an ISAAC representative.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin'" **Ray Gilmore**, who serves as Iowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

Iowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 872-819-3 (.516).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach **Jack Dahm** is assisted by coach **Ryan Brownlee** and coach **Chris Maliszewski**, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. Iowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks than the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

Iowa Head Baseball Coach **Jack Dahm** has announced that **Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski** and **Taylor Zeutenhorst** have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and **Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler** and **Aaron Smit** intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.
