SCOUTING KANSAS:

The Jayhawks are 4-2 after a loss Tuesday night to Arkansas.

Leading Kansas in the loss, offensively, was clean up hitter Jimmy Waters. Waters went 2-for-4 with a double, homer and two RBI. This season the left fielder leads the Jayhawks in home runs (1), runs scored (8), hits (6), walks (9) and on base percentage (.600).

Kansas' pitching staff is solid with a 4.25 team ERA. The Jayhawks are led by starting senior Carmeron Selik. Selik boasts a .68 ERA with two wins in 13.1 innings pitched with 10 strikeouts. Reliever Brett Bochy has the Jayhawks lone save amassing four innings in two appearances and striking out eight.

STACKING UP IN THE BIG TEN:

The Iowa offense continued to tear it up at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge, especially when compared to other Big Ten teams.

The Hawkeyes rank first in Big Ten batting average (.366), slugging percentage (.560), triples (4), sacrifice flies (4) and sacrifice bunts (4). They rank in the top three in: on base percentage (2nd, .429), runs scored (2nd, 49), hits (2nd, 70), home runs (2nd, 6), total bases (2nd, 107) and stolen bases (3rd, 9)

The pitching staff also stacks up in the conference, they rank in the top four in: saves (1st, 2), wins (3rd, 3), hits allowed (4th, 49) and home runs allowed (1st, 0).

The lowa defense ranks fourth in the conference in double plays (5).

BIG TEN GAME HIGHS:

The Hawkeyes racked up two more conference game highs over the weekend against West Virginia. Iowa laced two triples (off the bats of Trevor Willis and Mike McQuillan) and also collected two sacrifice flies (by Ryan Durant and Sean Flanagan).

lowa also hold Big Ten game highs in home runs (6) and total bases.

Four home runs in the win over Illinois State ties with Michigan and Northwestern.

Total bases, with 35, against Illinois State.

DURANT DELIVERS:

The senior outfielder had a stellar weekend in Florida. **Ryan Durant** went 6-for-11 with a double, two-run homer, six RBI, a walk and two sacrifice flies to lead lowa. He hit a whopping .909 slugging percentage, as well, from the clean-up spot.

MULLER CONTINUES:

After a 2009 season of lingering injuries, junior outfielder **Kurtis Muller** was back to his old self this summer. He continued to deliver in lowa's second weekend.

Muller went 5-for-10 with three runs scored, a stolen base and two RBI. On the year, Muller is hitting .476 with a team-best seven runs scored, two doubles and one triple.

WILLIS GETS HOT:

Junior **Trevor Willis** led lowa in batting average over the weekend (.556) going 5-for-9 with 1.000 slugging percentage. He hit two doubles, walked and laid down a sac bunt.

LEE 'SAVES' ANOTHER ONE:

New Hawkeye closer **Kevin Lee** picked up his second career save against Rutgers, picking up the 27th out by-way of a ground out.

Lee recorded his first against Illinois State. He went one and on-third innings allowing no runs on one hit.

ALL-TOURNAMENT TEAM:

With a 2-1 record, lowa had several quality performances this weekend in Florida. Sophomore pitcher **Jarred Hippen** and senior outfielder **Ryan Durant**, however, were the two Hawkeyes to earn second team all-tournament honors by collegebase-ball360.com.

Hippen got his first win of the season, by-way of an eight and two-third innings performance with eight Ks and only one walk. Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, homer and six RBI.

HAWKEYES ARE STREAKIN':

Junior **Kurtis Muller** entered the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. With hot bat so far this season, Muller continued on to a 16-game streak.

Other Hawkeyes on a roll from a year ago who continued are: **Chett Zeise** (6). **Ryan Durant** and **Mike McQuillan** both have a five-game hitting streak, after recording a hit in each of lowa's games this season.

OFFENSIVE RANKINGS:

When compared among Big Ten/Big East players last weekend, **Trevor Willis**' offensive performance ranked sixth, **Ryan Durant**'s ranked 11th and **Kurtis Muller**'s ranked12th of all athletes who participated in at least two games and compiled at least seven at-bats.

- 1. Junior **Kurtis Muller** entered the 2010 season with a 12-game hitting streak intact. After going 5-for-10 last weekend, he is now currently on a 16-game hitstreak.
- **2.** Look for lowa's starters to continue their streak of quality starts. The rotation is currently on a three-game streak of five or more inning performances.
- **3.** Watch for the long ball. The Hawkeyes have hit six homers in five games so far. (lowa hit 40 in 2009).

IN IT FOR THE LONG HAUL:

Sophomore **Jarred Hippen** had a long day in his win against Rutgers Friday. The lefty went eight and two-third innings, which was both a career best and a conference season-best. (The last time a Hawkeye went eight and two-third innings was **Nick Brown** against Indiana Apr. 10, 2009).

Besides that, Hippen was one strikeout from his personal best (9, Michigan) and one from tying the Big Ten's game-high.

QUALITY STARTS:

The Hawkeyes got three quality starts out of their pitchers at the Big Ten/Big East Challenge. Friday starter **Jarred Hippen** went eight and two-third innings. Saturday starter **Phil Schrieber** went five innings and Sunday starter **Zach Robertson** went five and one-third innings. The three pitchers recorded two wins and a no-decision.







ALL-TIME SERIES NOTES:

lowa trails the all-time series against Kansas, 11-7. The last time the two schools faced, Kansas won 9-3 on April 8, 2009 in Iowa City.

In the loss, **Nick Brown** led the team at DH, going 2-for-4 with a run scored and six Hawkeyes recorded a hit.

BY THE NUMBERS:

- ➤lowa has not lost a game so far this season when leading after the third inning.
- ➤ The Hawkeyes have outscored their opponents, 49-38, this season.
- ➤ lowa has out-hit all five opponents it has faced.
- As a team, the Black and Gold are hitting .397 with two outs, that includes 19 two-out RBI.
- > The pitching staff hasn't allowed one round tripper this season, and lefties are hitting a mere .213 against them.

2009 IOWA DRAFT PICKS:

Head Coach Jack Dahm



In six years as Iowa's head baseball coach, Jack Dahm has established the Hawkeyes as Big Ten contenders and is ready to lead the Iowa baseball program to new heights with his commitment to excellence.

Since taking over the lowa baseball team in July of 2003, Dahm has sparked resurgence in the Hawkeye program, having success Hawkeye fans hadn't seen in years.

In Dahm's 16 years as a head coach, he has produced 24 first team all-conference performers, eight freshmen All-Americans and two All-Americans. In his six years at lowa, Dahm has coached 24 all-Big Ten selections,

including eight first teamers. Iowa had only four first team selections in the previous 14 years before his arrival in Iowa City.

Last season, lowa went 16-35, but was decimated by injuries, which gave several young players opportunities and experience. Three Hawkeyes received all-conference honors. Ryan Durant received first team laurels, while Justin Toole was named third team all-Big Ten for the third consecutive year. Freshman Dallas Burke was named a unanimous choice to the conference's all-freshman team after seeing significant time on the field.

Five Hawkeyes were drafted in 2009, including two incoming recruits. Relievers Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz were all picked up, as well as Matthew Dermody and Dan Sheppard. Additionally, Justin Toole signed a free agent contract with the Cleveland Indians. Thirty-four of Dahm's players have been selected in the MLB Draft, while four have gone on to play in the major leagues.

In 2009, Coach Dahm surpassed Dick Schultz for the third-most victorious coach in Iowa history at Duane Banks Field on March 21st in a 9-4 victory over Western Illinois. Dahm picked up his 400th win as a Division I coach at Northern Iowa on April 23. He also picked up his 124th victory as an Iowa head coach against Ohio State on May 16, which surpassed Scott Broghamer (1998-03) for fourth in Iowa coaching victories.

The 42-year old Dahm and his wife, Lynn, have been married for 16 years. The couple has three children - sons Casey and Tyler and daughter Lyndsey. He was born January 19, 1967 in Skokie, Illinois.

SANDQUIST SHUTS IT DOWN:

Freshman righty **Ricky Sandquist** got his first action as a Hawkeye Sunday, pitching the final inning in the 11-2 victory over the previously undefeated Villanova. Sandquist struck out two in his first outing.

LEE CONTRIBUTES:

Junior transfer **Kurtis Lee** came up big in Florida for the Hawkeyes. The shortstop played flawless defense in lowa's 6-3 victory over Rutgers. Lee knocked in a total of six runs with a double, sacrifice fly and sac bunt over the weekend. The nine-hole hitter has four two-out RBI this season, a team best.

PITCHING STAFF:

The Hawkeye bullpen featured five pitching that threw for 6.2 innings combined, allowing only one earned run and striking out seven.

Zach Kenyon went two and two-third innings allowing no runs on three hits. Patrick Schatz went one and two-third innings allowing no earned runs on three hits, Ricky Sandquist went one inning, allowing no runs with two strikeouts and Kevin Lee went one out to earn a save.

WEEKEND RECAP:

The Hawkeyes went 2-1 at the second annual Big Ten/Big East Challenge.

The Hawkeyes defeated Rutgers Friday, 6-3. Sophomore southpaw Jarred Hippen threw a gem, going eight and two-third innings. Hippen notched his first win of the season, allowed only one walk. Closer **Kevin Lee** earned the 27th out for the Hawkeyes and recorded his second save of the year.

lowa lost, 9-5, Saturday to West Virginia. The Hawkeyes scored the first four runs, but the Mountaineers rallied, scoring nine times in their last six at-bats.

The Black and Gold trampled Villanova, 11-2, Sunday afternoon. The Hawkeyes led the entire game, scoring in five innings and keeping the Wildcats scoreless in eight.

Southpaw **Zach Robertson** got his second win of the year, going a quality five and one-third innings and allowing only two runs on six hits with six strike outs.

The Hawkeye offense smashed 16 hits, one shy of its season record (17, against Illinois State). In the offensive explosion 10 batters reached base, eight crossed the plate and four recorded extra base hits--two of which were round trippers.

Ryan Durant went 6-for-11 with a double, home run, two sacrifice flies and six RBI. **Trevor Willis** 5-for-9 with two doubles and a triple.



WHERE THE HAWKEYES RANK:

The Hawkeyes are making a splash in individual Big Ten rankings. Iowa players that rank in the top five include: Mike McQuillan in hits (4th) and home runs (4th); Trevor Willis in sacrifice bunts (1st). Kurtis Muller in runs scored (3rd) and hits (4th); Ryan Durant in sacrifice flies (1st) and Sean Flanagan hit-by-pitches (2nd) and fielding double plays (4th).

Jarred Hippen in innings pitched (5th); Zach Robertson in wins (1st) and Kevin Lee in saves (1st).

RBI ALERT:

Sophomore **Mike McQuillan** drove in seven RBI to lead lowa to victory over Illinois State Feb. 22. The RBI total is the most since Dallas Burke drove in six against Minnesota on May 2, 2009. Seven RBI also ties for the conference's game-high this year. (Tying with Coley Crank from Michigan)

INFIELD HAS NEW LOOK:

With former starters **Kevin Hoef**, **Justin Toole**, **TJ Cataldo** and **Wes Freie** out of the picture, the Hawkeyes have a lot of new faces in the infield. The only positive to lowa's plague of injuries a year ago, is that every 2010 starter in the infield has game experience.

Chett Zeise will take over as lowa's starting third baseman this spring, and junior transfer, Kurtis Lee, will take over at shortstop. Mike McQuillan will continue in the starting second baseman role, while Sean Flanagan will play at first.

THE UNITY COUNCIL:

Senior Michael Jacobs, red shirt junior Tyson Blaser, junior Kurtis Muller, sophomore Patrick Brennan and freshman Dan Sheppard.

DURANT NAMED MVP

Senior **Ryan Durant** was honored as the team's co-MVP Monday, Feb. 15 at the team's first annual Steak Fry.

In 2009, Durant was named first team all-conference after leading the lowa team in batting average (.370), games played (49), at bats (181), multi-hit games (23) and ranked in the top five in several other categories.

Durant shared the honor with former Hawkeye **Justin Toole**.

BLASER REDSHIRTS:

Redshirt junior, **Tyson Blaser**, has been MIA in the Hawkeye lineup essentially the past two seasons due to injuries and will start the 2010 campaign healthy after having seasonending surgery on his right thumb last April. Blaser took a medical redshirt.

RETURNING DEPTH:

The infield returns: Tyson Blaser, Dallas Burke, Andrew Ewing, Sean Flanagan, Zach McCool, Mike McQuillan and Chett Zeise.

The pitching staff also returns with a lot of depth, including: Nick Brown, Jarred Hippen, Michael Jacobs, Zach Kenyon, Kevin Lee, Zach Robertson, Patrick Schatz and Phil Schreiber.

DUANE BANKS FIELD:

Every year the UI Athletics Department continues to upgrade Duane Banks Field. This year's primary addition is 500 new chair back seating behind home plate.

For the first time, season tickets are available for purchase. Fans can reserve their own chair backs for the 2010 season by calling the UI Athletic Ticket Office at 1-800-IA-HAWKS.

Besides that, in 2009, the Recreation Building underwent a complete makeover. Improvements included: a new locker room, lounge, training room and weight room.

DERMODY MAKES HISTORY:

In June, **Matt Dermody** was drafted by the Pittsburgh Pirates, five days later, the Norwalk, IA, native, was making national news on the mound.

The left-handed pitcher threw a perfect six-inning game in a 10-0 win. Not only was it a perfect game, but Dermody struck out all 18 batters he faced, a first for an lowa high school athlete. Additionally, he helped out offensively, hitting a home run.

His efforts made ESPNs "SportsCenter," among other national publications.

IOWA NATIVE VOLUNTEERS:

Zach Dillon is in his first season as a volunteer coach at the University of Iowa.

Dillon, a native of Urbandale, IA, attended Baylor University and was subsequently selected by the Baltimore Orioles in the 20th Round (595th overall) of the 2006 amateur entry draft as a catcher. His honors include 2005 ABCA second team all-Midwest Region selection, 2005 first team all-Big 12 Conference honoree and a nine time Big 12 Conference Commissioner's Honor Roll recipient.

Dillon will work with the catchers, assist with hitters and take over as camp coordinator.

lowa junior Kurtis Muller will be writing a weekly blog for pingbaseball.com this season. Hawkeye fans will be able to link to his weekly blog through hawkeyesports.com.

Muller was recognized as a freshman all-American by Ping! in 2008. The native of Sun Prairie, WI, is a three-time Unity Council member and an ISAAC representative.

WHISTLIN' RAY:

Of all the members of the Hawkeye baseball program, the longest tenured is "Whistlin" Ray Gilmore, who serves as lowa's official scorekeeper. Gilmore started as a batboy in 1978, and has since served as manager, public address announcer and unofficial mascot for Iowa Baseball.

lowa's record since Gilmore joined the program is 874-820-3 (.516).

THE ASSISTANT COACHES:

Head Coach Jack Dahm is assisted by coach Ryan Brownlee and coach Chris Maliszewski, along with volunteer coach **Zach Dillon**.

Over the past nine seasons, Brownlee has had 21 players he coached or recruited drafted; two more signed free agent contracts. This past summer, Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim, Mike Schurz and recruits Matt Dermody and Dan Sheppard were drafted by major league teams. In six years of coaching summer collegiate leagues, he has seen 33 of his players sign pro contracts, including Khalil Green of the Padres and Kevin Cash of the Yankees, Joe Thatcher of the Padres, Dan Meyer of the Marlins and Luke Scott of the Astros.

In 2008, Brownlee's expertise on stealing bases and knowledge of hitting were essential in establishing team and individual records. lowa stole 138 bases, which are the most in a single-season by a Hawkeye team; the previous record of 127 was set by the 1981 team. The team total ranked third in the nation. On top of that, Iowa knocked out 436 singles for a new single-season record and wore 86 pitches to set a single-season team record in hit-by-pitches.

Maliszewski is in his second season as the Hawkeyes' pitching coach. In addition to his role as pitching coach, Maliszewski is also responsible for the team's travel arrangements and assists in the youth summer camps.

In his first season, the team's ERA in Big Ten play improved 1.45 points from 2008 to 2009. On top of that, Hawkeye pitchers recorded nearly 20 less walks then the season before and over 30 strikeouts more than in 2008.

Over the summer, Maliszewski had three Hawkeye relievers get drafted; Steve Turnbull, Kyle Heim and Mike Schurz, all of whom signed professional contracts.

lowa Head Baseball Coach Jack Dahm has announced that Kasey Carling, Patrick Lala, Bryan Niebalski and Taylor Zeutenhorst have signed National Letters of Intent to attend the University of Iowa and Kyle Haen, Jake Mangler and Aaron Smit intend to enroll and admit to the University of Iowa.

Carling, a native of Salem, UT, is a middle infielder who will be in the mix at shortstop. Carling lettered three years in baseball earning all-state, all-region and all-conference accolades his senior season. He also helped his Spanish Fork HS team win the state title in 2009. Carling was a NJCAA distinguished academic all-American last season with Salt Lake City Community College. He started every game at short stop and was named to the SWAC all-region team.

Haen, from Verona, WI, is an athletic outfielder that bats lefty. Haen was a National Honor Society and high honor roll athlete in high school. He started on the varsity baseball team since his freshman year, the team is 69-7 with him on the roster. In 2009, Haen helped lead his Madison Edgewood HS team to a division two state championship and was named first team all-conference, all-city and all-area. His junior campaign, he batted .359 with 29 RBI and a .554 slugging percentage.

Lala, a native of Marion, IA, is a right-handed pitcher from Kirkwood Community College. Lala appeared in 18 games. He amassed 45 strikeouts in 40.1 innings of work and finished the year with a 4.86 ERA.

Mangler, from Clinton, IA, will be a utility player for the Hawkeyes. He led Clinton HS to one of their best football seasons in history this fall, playing both sides of the ball.

Niedbalski, a native of Ballwin, MO, is an infielder. He earned four letters in hockey and baseball at DeSmet HS. Niedbalski led his fifth-seeded HS team to a district championship last spring batting .500 with five RBI over the three-game tournament. In 2009, he hit .362 with 18 RBI and 13 extra base hits.

Smit, from Wellman, IA, is a lanky left-handed pitcher from Mid Prairie HS. His junior season, he was named first team all-conference, second team all-district academic and an excellent student. Smit was named to the gold honor roll this year. In 2009, he appeared in 16 games with a 8-2 record and five saves. Smit compiled a 2.86 ERA with 88 strikeouts.

Zeutenhorst, a native of Sheldon, IA, is an athletic utility player. He has the ability to play on the left side of the field, as well as be a power arm on the mound.
