THE MATCH-UP

The University of Iowa soccer team heads to Ames, Iowa, to face Iowa State in the first Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup of the season Friday night. The game will begin at 7:30 p.m. (CT) at the Cyclone Sports Complex. The Hawkeyes follow with a road trip to Fort Collins, Colorado, facing Colorado State at 'The Lagoon' on Sunday at 2:30 p.m. (CT).

QUICK HITTERS

- Iowa has opened the season with a 4-0 start for the fourth-straight season. The Hawkeyes shutout their first three opponents before surrendering a pair of goals Sept. 1 against Butler. The three shutouts are tied for the Big Ten lead.
- Iowa is one of five teams remaining unbeaten in the Big Ten Conference, along with Wisconsin, Michigan State, Penn State, and Rutgers.
- The Hawkeyes have won 30-straight regular season nonconference games. Iowa went 8-0 in nonleague games in 2011 and 2013 and 9-0 in 2012.
- Iowa is out-shooting its opponents, 76-39, in four games this season, which includes a 39-14 advantage in shots on goal.
- Senior goalkeeper Kiley Beck is tied for the Big Ten lead with three shutouts. She is also tops in the conference in goals against average (0.00) and save percentage (1.000).
- Senior Cloe Lacasse is second in the Big Ten in goals (5) and points (11). Lacasse has scored at least one goal in each of the last three contests.

SCOUTING IOWA STATE

The Cyclones (2-2) enter Friday's Iowa Corn Cy-Hawk Series matchup having defeated Mississippi State and Saint Louis. Head coach Tony Minatta is in his first season at Iowa State where he leads a Big 12 squad that returns six starters from a team that finished 9-9-2 overall last year. The Cyclones have scored eight goals through four games this season, with sophomores Koree Willer and Adalie Schmidt posting two each.





HEAD COACH DAVE DIIANI

Dave DiIanni was named the fifth head coach in University of Iowa soccer history on May 17, 2014. DiIanni spent the past 11 seasons as head coach at Grand Valley State.

DiIanni, a native of Ontario, Canada, has amassed a 221-18-18 (.895) record and has guided the Lakers to three NCAA Division II national championships, nine consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference (GLIAC) titles, seven Final Four appearances in the last eight seasons, 11-straight NCAA Tournament berths and coached 21 All-Americans.

DiIanni's .895 winning percentage is the tops in NCAA Division II and the third-highest amongst all coaches in any division.

In 2013, DiIanni guided Grand Valley State to its third national title in five seasons and was named the National Soccer Coaches Association of America (NSCAA) Coach of the Year for a third time. The Lakers scored the second-most goals in program history (88), matched a program-high with 21 shutouts en route to winning the most games in school history. The team finished 24-0-1, claiming both the GLIAC regular season and tournament titles.

The Lakers opened the season with 13-straight shutouts, which matched the second-longest streak in Division II history, and five student-athletes garnered All-America recognition at season's end.

DiIanni led the Lakers to a 22-0-4 record in 2009 en route to his first national championship before winning a second-straight title in 2010. He was honored as the CaptainU Division II Women's Soccer Coach of the Year in 2009, and he coached the Division II National Player of the Year honoree in each season (Irie Dennis, 2009; Jenna Wenglinski, 2010).

DiIanni took over the Laker program in 2003 and swiftly guided Grand Valley State to a then-school best record of 17-2-2 to earn the program's first-ever NCAA Tournament berth. In year three, DiIanni led the Lakers to their first conference and NCAA Great Lakes Regional Championship, finishing 19-3 overall, and his team finished eighth in the national poll.

By year four, DiIanni led Grand Valley State to the school's first NCAA Division II National Championship game, finishing 19-2-1 overall. A year later, the Lakers made a second-straight NCAA Final Four appearance, posting a 17-0-0 mark in the regular season before finishing 21-1-1 overall.

DiIanni joined Grand Valley State after a seven-year run as head coach of the Jackson Lumen Christi High School women's soccer team. He also spent three years as an assistant coach at Hillsdale College, where he helped begin the men's and women's soccer programs.

DiIanni has spent seven years working with the Olympic Development Program in Michigan, training and developing the highest level of soccer in the state. He coached the team to four Region 2 and four ODP national championships.

DiIanni, a USSF B-licensed coach, earned his associate's degree from Seneca College in 1993 and his bachelor's degree from Spring Arbor University in 1997. He and his wife, Kristy, have two daughters, Karissa (11) and Kelsey (7).

IOWA STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

The Hawkeyes have won the last six meetings in the series with Iowa State, pushing its advantage to 9-5-2 all-time. Iowa has shut out the Cyclones on six different occasions, including a 3-0 victory last season in Iowa City.

SCOUTING COLORADO STATE

Second-year head coach Bill Hempen and Colorado State (1-1) knocked off Northern Colorado on Aug. 28, 1-0. It was Rams' first home victory in its two-year program history. In two games, junior Gianna Bertana has scored the lone goal for the Rams. CSU finished 2-13-3 overall last season.

COLORADO STATE VS. IOWA -- THE SERIES

Sunday's contest marks the first meeting between the two schools.

GOING HOME

Iowa will have a pair of players returning to their hometowns this weekend. Freshman Katharine Woodruff returns to Ames, Iowa, when the Hawkeyes face Iowa State, while junior Hannah Clark heads home Sunday when Iowa faces Colorado State in Fort Collins.

LAST GAME

The Hawkeyes held off a late push from Butler to earn a 3-2 victory on Sept. 1 at the Iowa Soccer Complex. Seniors Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert and freshman Aubree Larson each scored goals to help Iowa pick up its fourth-straight victory.

CLOE LACASSE...

- has scored in three-straight contests for the Hawkeyes, including a pair of two-goal games -- the seventh and eighth of her UI career.
- moved into second place in school history in goals and points in Iowa's 3-0 win over Fresno State. Lacasse currently has 36 goals and 93 points for her career.
- has five goals and one assist for 11 points in 2014. As a junior, she had six goals and seven assists in 23 games.
- is second in the Big Ten in goals (5), points (11), and shots (23).
- is in a six-way tie for second nationally in goals scored.

BECK SHINES IN GOAL

After playing five games total in her first

three seasons, senior Kiley Beck has posted three shutouts in Iowa's first four contests. Beck has a spotless 0.00 goals against average and a 1.000 saves percentage in 330:24 minutes, where she has made nine saves.

- Beck posted her first career shutout and victory in her first career start in the season-opening double overtime victory at Northern Iowa on Aug. 23. She followed with her second and third shutout, leading Iowa to wins over Illinois Chicago and Fresno State.

NEWCOMERS SHINE

- Freshman Katharine Woodruff got the Hawkeyes on the scoreboard in 2014 when she netted the game-winning goal in the 1-0 double-overtime win at Northern Iowa on Sept. 22.

- Freshman Aubree Larson tallied a pair of assists in Iowa's 4-0 win at Illinois-Chicago on Aug. 24, and she has scored goals in consecutive games, putting her in a tie for second on the team.

- Natalie Krygier, a transfer from Connecticut, leads the team with three assists. The sophomore registered a pair of assists in Iowa's 3-0 victory over Fresno State on Aug. 29.

BROWN: A CONSTANT

Senior Caitlin Brown is the only Iowa player to log every minute of game action this season. The defender has played every minute for the past 39 games dating back to the 2012 season -- a streak of 3,629 minutes.

IOWA NINTH IN REGIONAL RANKINGS

Iowa fell to ninth in the latest Great Lakes Region poll, released by the NSCAA on Sept. 2. The Hawkeyes debuted in the rankings at No. 7. Big Ten schools occupy the top nine spots in the 10-team rankings.

NONCONFERENCE DOMINANCE

Iowa hasn't lost a regular season non-league game since the 2010 season. The Hawkeyes have compiled a 30-1 nonconference record during the stretch with the only blemish coming at No. 23 Notre Dame in last year's NCAA Tournament.

SENIOR EXPERIENCE

Senior Melanie Pickert has started all 68 games of her Iowa career, while fellow seniors Caitlin Brown and Cloe Lacasse have



started 67-of-68 games as Hawkeyes.

ANOTHER HAWKEYE GOES DOWN

The injury-bug continues to hit Iowa hard, as the Hawkeyes lost a fourth player to a season-ending knee injury.

Freshman Madeline Crowdy went down in the Sept. 1 home game against Butler. Iowa is also playing without returning starter Katie Nasenbenny and true freshmen forwards Rose Ripslinger and Jenna Kentgen.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Seniors Kiley Beck, Caitlin Brown, and Melanie Pickert have been voted team captains for the 2014 Iowa soccer team.

LACASSE HISTORICALLY SPEAKING

In three-plus years, junior Cloe Lacasse has made her mark on the Iowa soccer program.

The Sudbury, Ontario, native is currently second in career goals (36), points (93), shots (247), game-winning goals (11), and assists (21).

Lacasse led Iowa in goals scored, points, and shots taken in both the 2011 and 2012 seasons. She capped off her junior year by garnering second-team All-Big Ten selection and second-team NSCAA All-Great Lakes Region honors.

NEW FACE AT THE HELM

First-year head coach Dave Dilanni takes over the Hawkeyes' program after a successful run at Grand Valley State. Dilanni amassed a 221-18-18 record with the Lakers and guided the team to three NCAA Division II national championships and nine-consecutive Great Lakes Intercollegiate Athletics Conference titles.

Assistant coach Erica Demers joins the Hawkeye staff after spending the last nine years with Dilanni at Grand Valley State.

DIANNI IN GOOD COMPANY

In 11 seasons at Grand Valley State, head coach Dave Dilanni posted a 221-18-18 overall record for a .895 winning percentage. The mark was the third-best all-time in women's soccer history entering the 2014 season.

RETURN OF THE SCORING LEADERS

Iowa returns three of its top four scorers

from last year in seniors Melanie Pickert, Cloe Lacasse and sophomore Bri Toelle.

Pickert led the way with seven goals, Lacasse scored six goals last season, pushing her career total to 31, and Toelle added four goals in her first season as a Hawkeye.

3 HAWKEYES ON B1G PLAYERS TO WATCH LIST

Caitlin Brown, Cloe Lacasse, and Melanie Pickert were named to the Big Ten Players to Watch list.

RETURNING ALL-BIG TEN SELECTIONS

Cloe Lacasse and Melanie Pickert return for their senior seasons after earning second-team All-Big Ten honors a year ago. Sophomore Amanda Lulek was selected to the Big Ten All-Freshmen team last season.

HAWKEYES ON TV

The Hawkeyes' Sept. 25 home contest against Maryland will be broadcast live on BTN. The network will also televise the Big Ten Tournament from Nov. 5-9 in West Lafayette, Ind.

Iowa will also appear four times -- Illinois (Sept. 11), Northwestern (Sept. 13), Indiana (Oct. 17), and Purdue (Oct. 19) -- on BTN Plus (which can be accessed via www.btn2go.com).

B1G IN THE POLLS

Penn State, Michigan, and Wisconsin are ranked in the latest NSCAA Top 25 poll of the 2014 season. The Nittany Lions are ranked No. 8, the Wolverines came in at No. 10, and the Badgers were voted 19th. Ohio State, Nebraska, and Rutgers are all receiving votes.

Iowa opens Big Ten Conference play, hosting Illinois on Sept. 11 at the Iowa Soccer Complex beginning at 7 p.m. (CT).
