LEADING OFF

• The Hawkeyes are picked to finish fifth in the Big Ten by Perfect Game, sixth by D1 Baseball, and sixth by Baseball America in 2019.

• Three Hawkeyes -- seniors Cole McDonald and Chris Whelan and sophomore Jack Dreyer -- were selected to the Big Ten Preseason Honors list.

• Two new faces -- hitting coach Robin Lund and volunteer pitching coach Tom Gorzelanny -- joined the Hawkeye coaching staff in January. Gorzelanny is a 12-year MLB veteran.

• With 15 newcomers, the Hawkeyes will need to replace three first-team All-Big Ten selections (Nick Allgeyer, Tyler Cropley, and Robert Neustrom. Chris Whelan (third team) is Iowa's only All-Big Ten selection returning.

• The Hawkeyes will play 28 games at Duane Banks Field during the 2019 season. Last season, Iowa went 20-6 at home, improving to 72-20 in Iowa City since the start of the 2015 season.

• Last season, Iowa's pitching staff set a new school record for the third straight year, striking out 499 batters in 53 games (9.5 strikeouts per nine innings), which led the Big Ten and ranked 18th nationally.

Iowa has won 143 games since the start of the 2015 season, the best four-year stretch in school history. The Hawkeyes have won 173 games in the Rick Heller era (2014-present), which is the third-best five-year stretch all-time. The Hawkeyes won 178 games from 1981-85 and 175 from 1977-1981 under Duane Banks.
After the Diamond 9 Sunshine State Classic Series, the Hawkeyes will travel to Honolulu, Hawaii, for a four-game series against Hawaii, followed by a three-game series against Oklahoma State in Stillwater, Oklahoma.

ABOUT HEAD COACH RICK HELLER

Rick Heller has turned the University of Iowa baseball program into a perennial Big Ten Conference and NCAA contender in his first five seasons as the Hawkeyes' head coach.

Heller has injected new life into the lowa program, leading the Hawkeyes to the best four-year stretch in program history, winning 173 games, advancing to two NCAA Regionals, and claiming the first Big Ten Tournament title in program history. It was lowa's first conference title since winning the regular season crown in 1990.

Under Heller's watch, Iowa has advanced to the postseason in five consecutive years for the first time in program history, he has coached six All-Americans and at least one first-team All-Big Ten selection each season, and Iowa has had 20 Major League Baseball Draft picks in five seasons -- the most in a five-year stretch all-time.

Heller has also given the Hawkeyes an international flavor, taking the team to the Dominican Republic in 2016 and Taipei, Taiwan, as the United States representative at the 2017 World University Games. Heller led USA to a silver medal, as the team became the first American squad to medal in Universiade history.

The Eldon, Iowa, native became the 20th head coach in program history in 2013 -- his fourth stop as a collegiate head coach. He has enjoyed stints at Iowa (2014-present), Indiana State (2009-13), Northern Iowa (1999-2009), and Upper Iowa (1987-99), leading all four schools to NCAA postseason play. He is one of nine coaches all-time and one of five active coaches to lead three different Division I programs to NCAA Regional play.

Heller guided lowa to an at-large berth into NCAA Regional play in 2015 -- a first for the program since 1990 -- and the team posted the school's first NCAA Tournament win since 1972. It wasn't a fluke; in the two seasons since, lowa was runner-up at the 2016

Big Ten Tournament before claiming the program's first tournament title in 2017 to lock up the school's second NCAA Regional appearance in three seasons.

lowa made just three NCAA Tournament appearances in its history prior to Heller's arrival.

Heller led Indiana State to its first outright Missouri Valley Conference title in 2012, and Northern Iowa to the MVC title and into the NCAA Tournament in 2001, the first and only regional appearance for the Panthers as a Division I program.

On the recruiting trail, Heller has turned the Hawkeyes into a major player on the national recruiting scene by keeping the best in-state players at home. Iowa had the top-rated class in the Big Ten -- and 18th-best nationally -- in 2015, and the 2016 class was ranked third in the league.

In 31 seasons as a head coach, Heller owns a career record of 863-674-4. He is one of two lowa head coaches to lead the program to the NCAA Tournament.

BIG PRESEASON HONORS

Seniors Cole McDonald and Chris Whelan and sophomore Jack Dreyer were named to the Big Ten Preseason Honors list.

AROUND THE HORN

 Senior second basemen and team captain Mitchell Boe is expected to bat leadoff this season after hitting .266 with a .352 on-base percentage last season.

 Senior Tanner Wetrich, who had 15 starts in left field last season, is lowa's starting shortstop. Junior Lorenzo Elion is Iowa's starting Iowa's third baseman after starting 37 games last season,

hitting .275 (39-of-142). Junior college transfer Austin Martin will get the first chance to replace All-American Tyler Cropley at catcher. Martin hit .309 with 32 RBIs at Southeastern CC last season.

• Junior college transfers Izaya Fullard, Tanner Padgett, and Zeb Adreon are in a position battle at first base.

PATROLLING THE OUTFIELD

 Senior Chris Whelan will anchor lowa's outfield and lineup in left field. A Big Ten preseason honoree, Whelan is expected to move into a runproducing role after hitting .308 with four home runs a season ago.

 Defensive specialist Justin Jenkins, who started 45 games in centerfield last season, will share time with Ben Norman in center field. Norman, who started 29 games in left field, is looking to bounce back from a sophomore slump. Sophomore and two-way player Trenton Wallace is expected to see time in right field.

ROTATION NOTES

 Senior RHP and team captain Cole McDonald will start against George Mason on Friday and anchor lowa's rotation. It will be McDonald's first Friday night start of his career. The New Hampton, Iowa, native made 11 starts last season, going 3-2 with a 3.23 ERA, while striking out 52 batters in 55 2/3 innings.

 Sophomore LHP Jack Dreyer will get the nod against Pittsburgh on Saturday. It will be the second weekend start of Dreyer's career. In his first career weekend start against No. 12 Oklahoma State, Dreyer earned the win, allowing one run on two hits over five innings with a career-high six strikeouts. The Johnston, Iowa, native went 5-2 in 14 appearances and four starts with a 3.69 ERA over 31 2/3 innings a season ago.

• Junior RHP Grant Judkins earned the third spot in the rotation and will face Marshall on Sunday. With six career starts, it will be Judkins first career weekend start on Sunday. Last season, he pitched 39 1/3 innings over 13 appearances, striking out 37 batters, while holding hitters to a .260 clip.

A LOOK A THE BULLPEN

After losing bullpen stalwarts, Zach Daniels and Nick Nelsen, from a season ago, Iowa has several options in a revamped bullpen.

 Junior RHP Grant Leonard made 21 relief appearances last season, striking out 23 batters in 21 1/3 innings.

 Junior LHP Kyle Shimp, who battled injury last season, could see action at the end of games.

 Sophomore RHP Ben Probst could be an option after striking out 21 batters in 20 2/3 innings as a freshman.

• Junior college transfer Trace Hoffman, who led the NJCAA with 13 saves last year, is poised for late-inning work.

• Jason Foster, a transfer from Wright State, could also lock down a relief role after recording a 3.20 ERA in 44 2/3 innings last season.

COACHING STAFF CHANGES

Iowa welcomed Robin Lund and Tom Gorzelanny to the Hawkeye coaching staff after Desi Druschel and Joe Migliaccio accepted positions within the New York Yankees organization. Lund, who served as the volunteer hitting coach for the Northern lowa softball program in 2018 and UNI's volunteer strength and conditioning coach under Heller in 2005-06, will replace Migliaccio as the team's hitting coach. Gorzelanny, who pitched for six MLB teams over a 12-year span, will replace Druschel as the team's volunteer pitching coach.

TEAM CAPTAINS

Three seniors -- Mitchell Boe, Cole McDonald, and Chris Whelan -- and redshirt junior Kyle Shimp were voted team captains in January. Shimp is a team captain for a second straight season.

Iowa's 13-9 Big Ten record placed them sixth in the conference standings to qualify for the Big Ten Tournament for a record fifth straight season. The Hawkeyes posted three series wins over ranked foes (at No. 22 Illinois, No. 7 Michigan, and No. 12 Oklahoma State) last season.
