THIS WEEK -- The seventh-ranked University of Iowa men's gymnastics team will travel to Ann Arbor, MI, Friday and Saturday to compete in the Big Ten Championships. Team competition and all-around performances will start Friday at 7 p.m. Individual event finals will take place Saturday at 7 p.m. The conference championships will be held at Crisler Arena. All-session tickets are \$7 for adults and \$4 for students.

IOWA IN BIG TEN HISTORY -- The Hawkeyes have won the Big Ten title six times and have tied for first once. Two of those titles have come under Coach Tom Dunn. Iowa won their first title under Dunn in 1986. Iowa's most recent title came in 1998 when the Hawkeyes finished a perfect 8-0.

SCOUTING THE BIG TEN -- All six Big Ten teams are ranked in the top-10 nationally, including top-ranked Ohio State, No. 3 Illinois, No. 4 Penn State, No. 5 Michigan, No. 7 **IOWA**, and No. 10 Minnesota. Five of the nation's top ten all-arounders will be competing, including Penn State's Luis Vargas (No. 1), Illinois' Wesley Haagensen (No. 2), Minnesota's Guillermo Alvarez (No. 3), and Iowa's **Michael Reavis** (No. 6) and **Linas Gaveika** (No. 10). Big Ten athletes hold at least six top-ten spots on all individual events. Also, six Big Ten athletes hold No. 1 rankings on individual events, including the all-around.

IOWA VS. THE BIG TEN -- The Hawkeyes recorded a dual victory over Minnesota, but fell to Illinois and Michigan. Iowa opened the 2005 season with a fourth-place finish at the Windy City Invitational, behind Illinois, Ohio State and Michigan. Minnesota finished fifth.

LAST YEAR AT BIG TENS -- The Hawkeyes placed fourth at last year's Big Ten Championships with a team total of 216.8, advancing four gymnasts into the event finals. **Michael McNamara** took second on floor exercise with a score of 9.475. Senior **Eric Block** was second on parallel bars (8.925) and seventh on pommel horse (8.3). **Linas Gaveika** took fourth on pommel horse (9.2) and sixth on horizontal bar (8.7), while **Michael Reavis** tied for third on vault (9.4) and was fourth on horizontal bar (9.4).

IOWA IN THE RANKINGS -- In the latest GymInfo rankings (March 21), the Hawkeyes fell from sixth to seventh nationally. As a team, the Hawkeyes are ranked in the top 10 in all six individual events. The Hawkeyes are the fifth-ranked team on floor exercise, sixth on horizontal bar, ninth on both pommel horse and vault, and 10th on rings and parallel bars.

NATIONALLY-RANKED INDIVIDUALS -- Hawkeye junior **Michael Reavis** leads the Hawkeyes in the rankings. Reavis is fourth on floor exercise, fifth on vault, and sixth on both horizontal bar and the all-around. Senior **Linas Gaveika** is ranked ninth on horizontal bar, 10th in the all-around, and 14th on pommel horse. Junior **Michael McNamara** is eighth on floor exercise while senior **Kenny Lin** is 12th on rings. Sophomore **Matt Beiler** is tied for 18th on parallel bars.



Iowa Gymnastics Notes

HAWKS HIT THE RECORD BOOKS -- The 2005 Hawkeye squad smashed the record books, setting six individual and two team marks. On vault, Iowa posted a record 37.4 at the West Point Open. The Hawkeyes then set a rings record of 37.4 against Illinois. Junior **Michael Reavis** holds Iowa records on floor exercise (9.725), vault (9.7), and in the all-around (54.825). Senior **Kenny Lin** broke his previous record of 9.55 with a 9.7 performance on rings against Illinois. Sophomore **Matt Beiler** scored a record-breaking 9.4 on parallel bars against Oklahoma.

REAVIS SHINES FOR THE HAWKEYES -- Junior **Michael Reavis** had an impressive season. He is nationally ranked in three events and the all-around heading into the Big Ten Championships. He is currently fourth on floor exercise, fifth on vault, tied for sixth on horizontal bar and sixth in the all-around. He also holds three University of Iowa records, all of which he set this season. Against Oklahoma, Reavis scored a 9.725 on floor exercise and an all-around score of 54.825. He also holds the vault record of 9.7, which he set against Minnesota.

SENIORS SAY GOODBYE WITH A WIN -- Iowa sent its seniors out with a win in their final home meet, dominating the ninth-ranked Minnesota Golden Gophers 217.325-213.4. The Hawkeyes won four event titles, crowned three individual event champions, and broke two University of Iowa records. Senior **Kenny Lin** tied for second on rings with a score of 9.4. He also added a seventh place finish on parallel bars (8.5). **Linas Gaveika**, despite being injured, took fourth on pommel horse, tied for sixth on floor exercise, finished eighth on parallel bars and took fourth in the all-around. **Jason Dixon** also performed well in his last dual meet as a Hawkeye, taking fifth on rings. **Shawn Stone** tied for ninth on floor exercise.

BEILER CONSISTENT FOR THE HAWKEYES -- Despite a slow start, Iowa sophomore **Matt Beiler** has emerged as a consistent all-around competitor. He is currently ranked 18th nationally on parallel bars and holds the University of Iowa record in the event, scoring a 9.4 at Oklahoma. Beiler set a personal season best of 9.3 on rings at Illinois. He also set personal season bests on floor exercise (8.9) and horizontal bar (9.3) against Minnesota. He was crowned parallel bars champion against Minnesota and tied for first in the same event against Illinois-Chicago. He will be a Hawkeye to watch heading into the Big Ten Championships.

QUOTING HEAD COACH TOM DUNN -- "The team looks as good as it has all year. The week without competition or classes allowed us time to focus on some problem areas and generally polish things up. My only concern is a foot injury Michael Reavis sustained at Oklahoma. It could prevent him from competing on floor exercise and vault. I'm hopeful he will be ready to go by Friday."

Iowa Head Coach Tom Dunn



Tom Dunn
Head Coach
25 Years at Iowa

In his 24-year career as Iowa's head gymnastics coach, Dunn has elevated the program's status to one of a perennial national contender. With an Iowa record of 187 79 2, Dunn has led the Hawkeyes to 18 top-ten finishes in the NCAA Championships, and has competed in the national meet 18 of the past 21 seasons.

Iowa's performance in the Big Ten during Dunn's tenure as head coach has also been exceptional. In 21 of his 24 years, the Iowa coach has led his team to a top-four finish in the toughest gymnastics conference in the nation. The Hawkeyes won conference titles in 1986 and 1998, while placing second nine times under Dunn. In 1998, he was named Big Ten Coach of the Year and College Gymnastics Association Central Region Coach of the Year. Dunn also earned Big Ten co-Coach of the Year honors in 1997 and Midwest Regional Coach of the Year honors in 1986.

Dunn has helped 29 individuals to earn 58 all-America honors and 19 gymnasts win 31 Big Ten titles. There have been 98 academic all-Big Ten selections and 55 all-America scholar athletes in his 23 seasons as Iowa's head coach. Iowa has had more all-America scholar athletes than any other university since the award began following the 1989-90 season. The 2004 Hawkeyes finished 6th in the nation academically, while the 2003 Hawkeyes placed 4th. Dunn's 2000 team won the College Gymnastics Association National Academic Team Championship by nipping the College of William & Mary in team grade point average for the year 3.392 to 3.378.

Athletic standards have also been high during Dunn's tenure. Linas Gaveika became Iowa's 11th NCAA gymnastics champion when he won the horizontal bar title in 2003. In 2000, pommel horse national champion Don Jackson and the rest of the Hawkeyes set four new school records on their way to a third place NCAA finish. Former Hawkeye, Todd Strada, was named University of Iowa Male Athlete of the Year and Big Ten Male Gymnast of the Year in 1999, and ended his collegiate career with five all-America honors. The 1998 squad recorded the fourth undefeated and untied season in school history (8-0) and won Iowa's seventh Big Ten title. In 1995, seven-time all-American Jay Thornton became the first Hawkeye NCAA Champion since 1969 when he placed first in floor exercise. Thornton won the NCAA vault title in 1996, making him the only gymnast in Iowa history to win back-to-back national titles. Dunn began his head-coaching career at the University of Massachusetts in 1972, where he coached the Minutemen to a 27-8 dual mark in three seasons. His 25 year collegiate dual mark is 206-81-2.

He has also coached many Hawkeyes in international competitions. Most recently, Dunn and Linas Gaveika participated in the 26th Men's European Championships held last April in Ljubljana, Slovenia. Linas and Dunn also went to the 2003 World Championships in Anaheim, CA. Dunn also coached Shane de Freitas in the 2001 World Championships in Ghent, Belgium. In 1999, Dunn and de Freitas traveled to the Pan American games in Winnipeg, Canada, and the 34th World Championships in Tianjin, China.

As an administrator, he served a two year term as president of the National Association of Collegiate Gymnastics Coaches (1985-87). He was vice president of the U.S. Elite Coaches Association (1990-96) and chair of the Big Ten coaches group (1992-96). Dunn served as chair of the NCAA Men's Gymnastics Committee for three years (1996-99), and represented the NCAA on the U.S.A. Gymnastics Board of Directors during that time.

Dunn left U.Mass in 1975 and returned to his alma mater, Penn State, as an assistant coach. He was named co-Coach of the Year in 1976 when the Nittany Lions won the NCAA championship. He served as an assistant at Iowa for one season (1979-80) prior to his appointment as head coach. He led Iowa from the 39th place national rating he inherited to an NCAA berth in just four seasons.

His competitive career was as storied as his coaching career has been. At Penn State Dunn earned two all America honors and the NCAA parallel bars title in 1971. As a prep Dunn won two Indiana state all around titles.

Dunn gained an NCAA Post Graduate scholarship after earning academic honors at Penn State. He received both his B.S. and M.S. degrees from Penn State.

Dunn was born on July 6, 1949 in San Mateo, California. He and his wife, Deborah, have two daughters, Shannon and Jamie. Both Shannon and Jamie are University of Iowa students.

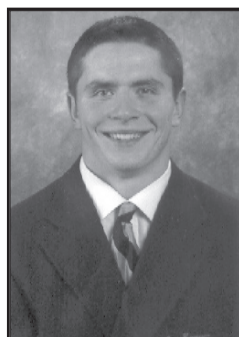

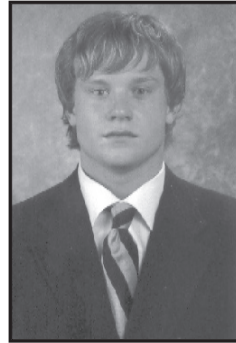
