## HISTORICAL HAWKEYES

The Hawkeyes opened the 2009 campaign with six straight wins to become just the third lowa team to open the volleyball season 6-0 (1978, 1988). No team in program history has started the season 7-0.

## **MEISTER EARNS BIG TEN HONORS**

Junior libero **Christina Meister** was named Big Ten Defensive Player of the Week after her performance at last week's Green Bay Classic. Meister tied a school-record with 36 digs vs. Central Michigan to become the first Hawkeye to earn a Big Ten weekly honor since 2006 when her sister, Melanie Meister, took home the award on offense. Meister leads the Big Ten with an average of 5.19 digs per set.





# Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series

The Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series is in its sixth season in 2009-10. Iowa holds a 3-2 advantage in the in-state competition against Iowa State that began in 2004-05. The Hawkeyes captured the Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series a year ago by a 21-4 margin.

Last season, Iowa captured victories in football, women's soccer, women's cross country, men's basketball, women's basketball, wrestling, women's gymnastics (twice) and softball. The Cyclones recorded wins in volleyball and men's cross country.

Along with the series win a year ago, Iowa captured the inaugural Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series (13-8) in 2004-05 and won again in 2006-07 (13-8). Iowa State won the competition in 2005-06 (13-8) and 2007-08 (18-9).

The 13-event series awards two points (except football, which is worth three) to the winning school in each head-to-head match-up between the two institutions. Additionally, two points are awarded to an institution if the graduation rate of its student-athletes is greater than the national average as reported each fall by the NCAA. Women's tennis has been added to the competition for the first time in 2009-10.

A commemorative Hy-Vee Cy-Hawk Series Cup, which stands 31 inches tall and weighs 19 pounds, is displayed on the winning team's campus for an entire year after a victory. Replica cups are also presented as "traveling trophies" for individual victorious teams in the head-to-head competition.

Two points for an institution if the student-athlete graduation rate for all student-athletes is greater than the national average for all student-athletes, according to the annual graduation rate report issued each September/October by the NCAA.

#### CY-HAWK OPENER

Friday's contest with Iowa State will kickoff the 2009-10 Cy-Hawk Series. Since its inagurual year in 2004-05, the winner of the first series event has gone on to win the overall series three times. Iowa State has won all three volleyball meetings since the conception of the Cy-Hawk Series.

## **HAWKEYE HONORS**

Junior setter Mara Hilgenberg was named MVP of the Country Inn and Suites Classic last weekend. The Lake Forest, IL, native set a career-high with 47 assists vs. South Dakota State en route to lowa's tournament championship. Junior outside hitter Aimee Huffman and senior libero Christina Meister also earned all-tournament honors. Huffman added 34 kills and 26 digs in the Classic, while Meister collected 75 digs, including a career-high 36 in Iowa's win over Central Michigan, tying an Iowa record.

Huffman was named MVP of the Loyola Invitational in Iowa's weekend opener, Aug. 28-29. The Poth, TX native totaled 29 kills, 19 digs, 10 blocks and seven assists in the three-game tournament sweep. Junior **Becky Walters** earned all-tournament accolades after a dominating weekend at the net and service line. Walters matched a career high with seven blocks vs. Eastern Kentucky and served a career-best four aces vs. Marquette.

# **DEFENSIVE CHARGE**

lowa has remained undefeated through six matches due in large part to its defense. The Hawkeyes rank number one in the conference in digs, averaging 18.2 per game. The senior duo of **Christina Meister** and **Megan Schipper** have led the defensive efforts. Meister's 5.8 digs/game lead the Big Ten, while Schipper's 3.7 average ranks eighth.

# **BIG TEN LEADERS**

Three Hawkeyes sit atop the conference in five individual match categories. Junior setter **Mara Hilgenberg** leads the Big Ten in three-set assists (45) and four-set assists (t-47). Senior **Christina Meister** leads the conference in three-set digs (t-19) and four-set digs (36), while **Megan Schipper** leads the Big Ten in match service aces (7 vs. South Dakota State).

# SCHIPPER ACROSS THE BOARD

Senior **Megan Schipper** is the only Big Ten player to rank among the top 10 in points (4th, 4.55/game), kills (8th, 3.62/game), service aces (4th, 0.52/game) and digs (8th, 3.71/game). The Hawkeye captain served a career-best seven aces in Iowa's 3-1 win over South Dakota State.

# **IOWA STATE (game one)**

The Cyclones are members of the Big 12 and led by fourth-year Head Coach Christy Johnson-Lynch and junior OH Victoria Henson, who earned all-tournament honors at the Diet Coke Classic last week in Minneapolis. Iowa leads the all-time series, 21-19. The Cyclones have won the last four meetings, including last year's 3-0 win at Ames. Iowa last beat the Cyclones, 3-0, in 1997.

# **NORTHERN COLORADO (game two)**

The Bears are members of the Big Sky Conference and led by Head Coach Lyndsey Benson and senior MB Taylor Smith, who earned conference POTW honors after leading UNC to a 3-1 start at the North Texas Mean Green Volleyball Classic. The Hawkeyes lead the all-time series, 1-0, having defeated the Bears, 3-1, in 2007.

# DRAKE (game three)

The Bulldogs are members of the Missouri Valley Conference and led by second-year Head Coach Phil McDaniel and junior libero Alana Wittenburg, MVP of last week's Hampton Inn Drake Invitational. Iowa leads the all-time series, 21-11-1, and has won the last four meetings.

## HAWKEYE CAPTAINS

Senior outside hitter **Megan Schipper** and junior setter **Mara Hilgenberg** are Iowa's team captains for the 2009 season. In 2008, Schipper ranked among the team leaders in kills, service aces, digs and total blocks. Hilgenberg is the Hawkeyes' top returner in assists and is a third generation Hawkeye captain. Her great-uncle Wally and her uncle Jim were football team captains in 1963 and 1977, respectively.

# SECOND GENERATION

**Mara Hilgenberg**'s father Jay and **Emma Krieger Kittle**'s father Bruce played football together at Iowa from 1977-1980. Jay was a four-time letterwinner and went on to win Super Bowl XX with the 1985 Chicago Bears. Bruce used a redshirt in 1980 and came back as a team captain for Hayden Fry's 1981 Big Ten Championship team.

# **HAWKEYE SCHEDULE**

Iowa opened the season with two three-game road trips and will continue to pound the pavement with a three-game road tilt following this weekend's Hawkeye Challenge. To kick off 2009, the Hawkeyes play 11 of their first 14 matches away from home. Eleven of Iowa's 32 contests are against 2008 NCAA Tournament qualifiers. They include Iowa State, Minnesota (2), Penn State (2), Michigan (2), Purdue (2) and Illinois (2).

# Bump, Set, BLOCK!

The Iowa defense dominated the net in the opening weekend at the Loyola Invitational. The Hawkeyes outblocked their opponents 35-16 in the season's first tournament competition. Three Hawkeyes recorded double-digit block totals in the tournament, with MB **Becky Walters** leading the way with 15. Senior OH **Megan Schipper** and junior OH **Aimee Huffman** recorded 10 blocks each and junior MB **Katie Kennedy** came off the bench to contribute eight blocks.



# **Head Coach Sharon Dingman**



Sharon Dingman was hired as the eighth coach in Iowa volleyball history March 21, 2008.

The second-year head Hawkeye owns a career record of 356-230 (18 years) after leading lowa to its most successful campaign in eight seasons in 2008. The Hawkeyes' 14 overall victories and six conference wins were the most by an lowa Volleyball team

since 2000.

Dingman also reached a personal milestone in her inagural Hawkeye season, recording career victory No. 350 November 14 in a five-set victory over Northwestern.

Iowa re-established a home-court advantage in Dingman's first season, posting its first winning season at North Carver since 1998 and setting a program attendance record.

Dingman came to Iowa after serving as head coach at Illinois State from 2000-07, where she compiled a 147-98 record. In 2007, Dingman led the Redbirds to their first at-large berth into the NCAA Tournament since 1997. Illinois State reached the championship match of the Missouri Valley Conference Tournament and finished with a 21-12 overall record.

Illinois State produced winning seasons in seven of the eight seasons under Dingman and never finished lower than fifth in the Missouri Valley Conference. Dingman produced 21 all-Missouri Valley Conference selections, including Player of the Year, Libero of the Year and two Freshman of the Year honorees.

Redbird teams under Dingman were also strong in the classroom. Eleven players were named to the league's scholar-athlete squad in her eight seasons. In 2004, four volleyball student-athletes earned perfect 4.00 grade-point-averages and the team recorded a 3.32 GPA.

Dingman started her head coaching career in 1991 at Auburn, where she led the Tigers to a 22-13 record in her only season at the helm. Her 1991 squad become the first Auburn volleyball tem to receive votes in the national poll and Auburn's fourth place finish in the SEC that season marked the highest finish ever for Auburn at the time.

She then moved to Butler in 1992, where she served as head coach for eight seasons. Dingman led the Bulldogs to four 20 win seasons and three postseason tournaments, including an appearance in the NCAA Tournament in 1997 after capturing the Midwestern Collegiate Conference title. She was named MCC Coach of the Year in 1997 after compiling a 28-7 record.

Prior to becoming a head coach, Dingman spent seven seasons as an assistant coach at three Division I programs. After one season at Northern Michigan (1984), she assisted at Texas Tech for three seasons (1985-87). Dingman then spent three seasons at Kentucky (1988-90) and helped the Wildcats to an SEC Championship in 1988 along with three-straight regional finals appearances in the NCAA Tournament.

#### **ESKEW OUT**

Junior outside hitter **Megan Eskew** sustained a torn ACL during summer workouts and will miss the 2009 campaign. Eskew earned academic all-Big Ten honors in 2008 and was named MVP of the 2007 Hawkeye-Holiday Inn Challenge as a freshman.

# AMONG THE NATION'S BEST

The Big Ten is widely recognized as one of the nation's premier conferences. Penn State returns as the conference champion, winner of the last two NCAA Championships and ranked atop the 2009 AVCA Coaches Poll. Other Big Ten schools ranked in the top 25 include Michigan (7), Minnesota (9), Illinois (14) and Michigan State (18).

- The Big Ten led the nation in attendance in 2008 and has been the national leader on six occasions in the last 12 years, including three of the past five seasons.
- The Big Ten has sent three or more teams to NCAA regionals on 14 occasions, including each of the past seven years.
- Big Ten volleyball players have been named all-America by the AVCA over 100 times since 1984.
- The Big Ten accumulated 10 or more wins in each of the last six NCAA Championships.
- Big Ten teams have combined to reach the NCAA semifinals on 15 occasions.
- The Big Ten owns a .616 overall record in NCAA competition and has posted a record of .500 or better in each of the past 18 NCAA tournaments.

# **BIG IN '08**

lowa volleyball made significant strides and put together the most successful campaign in recent memory in 2008, including:

- six conference wins, most since 2000 (11)
- 14 overall wins, most since 2000 (15)
- seven-match win streak (fourth-longest streak in school history)

# **2009 Coaching Staff**

**Sharon Dingman** is in her second season as the head Hawkeye. She is joined by second-year assistant **Jason Allen** and newcomers **Ben Boldt** and **Curt Sivertsen**.

Allen is in his second season as a assistant coach at Iowa. Allen was also promoted to the team's recruiting coordinator following the 2008 season. Allen previously served as an assistant coach and recruiting coordinator at Sam Houston State University prior to serving as the 16U head coach for the Texas Tornados club program in 2007.

Boldt is in his first season as an assistant coach at Iowa. Boldt spent the last two seasons as an assistant coach at the University of Alabama. Prior to joining Alabama, Boldt served as a staff assistant for five seasons at the University of Nebraska. In his final season, the Cornhuskers finished 33-1 en route to the 2006 NCAA Championship.

Sivertsen is in his first season at Iowa after having served the last two years as head coach of the men's and women's programs at Missourii Valley College.

**Angie Boldt** is in her second season as the Director of Volleyball Operations. She came to Iowa City in 2008 after serving as the Director of Volleyball Operations at Alabama for two seasons.
